Cablevision, which has 28 Chicagoland franchises, including Niles, reported this past week it has a 43% penetration rate in its communities, about 10% under what it hoped for. This is the percentage of residential units which have contracted for the cable TV service in their áreas.

> Don Glasell, director of community relations for Cablevision, said the bad economy is partly responsible for the lower figure. He added, the demographics of the different areas also bear on the penetration percentage in the different areas. Glasell noted middle-class blue collar workers acquire the cable TV service much more than the poor, the wealthy and the elderly. It may well follow that southwest suburban communities may prove to be more lucrative areas than suburbs in the North Shore.

Competition from direct broadcast systems and low-levelsignal systems was unforeseen when Cablevision began wiring their areas in 1979.

A recent Supreme Court ruling allowing a New York State landlord compensation when cable TV is installed, is a further concern to the Cablevision Company. This ruling is in conflict with local ordinances in Cicero and Summit, which passed laws forbidding landlords from denying cable television in their buildings.



Health insurance supplements

by Jean Stokes, Counselor

There have been questions raised in the past several months about the many kinds of health insurance policies available to senior citizens and particularly, the numbers received through the mail. Most people are aware of the need for affordable coverage to supplement medicare. Unfortunately, many are not aware of the scams and high pressure tactics often used on the unsuspecting. Too often money is paid for specific coverage when broad coverage would be better. Too often, a person is not aware of the "pre-existing conditions" clause in a policy until a claim is filed. Too often a "Nursing Home" policy is bought without understanding fully the basis for that coverage. Too often a purchaser will be told that if the first year premium is prepaid at once, their premium would be less, only to discover later that the premium was considerably higher than other, with similar coverage.

These and other problems can be anticipated by reading the Department of Health and Human Services booklet, Guide to Health Insurance for People with Medicare, available for reading at the Niles Senior Center. It covers briefly not only what Medicare will pay, but gives you guidelines to help you determine what other coverage is best for you.

If you are presently thinking about whether you need additional insurance, you should consider the following: Financial situation - Can you afford more? Are you eligible for Medicaid?

Coverage - Don't buy more than you need but get the most for your money. Avoid specific illness policies. Pre-existing conditions - Make sure you understand what they

are and whether it affects you or your spouse. Duplicate coverage - If you are carrying several policies, be sure you are not paying twice for the same coverage.


Maximum benefits - Most policies have them. Be sure you ask and understand limitations. Right to review - Be sure you understand the cancellation policy. Reputable companies - Know quality of company and their

representatives. Outline of coverage - You should have documentation of what you are buying and time to review it.

Payment - Always pay by check or money order, payable to insurance company only. Policies - Should be delivered promptly

If you have any questions about the reputation of the company, its policies, or have other questions, you may call the State of Illinois Department of Insurance, 793-2429. This department oversees the licensing and responsible action of those companies selling insurance in the State of Illinois.

According to Kustra, Marcus' objection states that numerous Nimrod petitions were circulated by people who were not registered voters in the 28th District. However, when the petitions. were turned in, a registered voter signed as the circulator.

Kustra said this irregularity was confirmed when petition signers were contacted by phone over the weekend. Some signers, according to Kustra, said they had signed a petition being circulated by a woman, yet a man's name was signed as the cir-

Commenting on what he knew of the Nimrod petitions, Kustra said, "The whole petition process was done haphazardly and in violation of state laws."

Today's hearing will take place before the three member Cook County Election Board. Members of the board include Stanley Kusper, Cook County Circuit Court Clerk; Richard Daley, Cook County States Attorney and the Cook County Circuit Court.


