Sutker outdistances Marcus in state rep race

In a moderate voter turnout in Maine and Niles Township, Calvin Sutker outdistanced his opponent for state representative for the 56th district by about 1,600 votes. Unofficial returns as of Wednesday morning from the Cook

County Board of Elections showed Sutker with 15,196 to Marcus' 13,606. With 100 out of 152 precincts reporting at Maine Township Democratic headquarters in Niles, unofficial returns showed Sutker with 3,045 votes and Mar-

cus tallying 3,538. In another local contested race for Cook County board of commissioner seats, the slate of seven Democratic candidates were defeated by Republican incumbents. **Continued on Page 43**

Vets property tax exemption defeated

Voters went to the polls to make decisions on several referendums Tuesday. An amendment to the State Constitution on the Veteran's Property Tax Exemption appears to have failed with 142,970 "yes" votes and 143,534 "no" in unofficial returns.

An amendment to the State Constitution on denial of bail in special cases passed, with the electorate vote at 258,730 "yes" and 27,193 "no" votes in official returns by the Cook County Board of Elections. **Results on two local referen-** **Continued on Page 43**

Branch library hours to be cut back

Voters turn down library tax hike

Voters turned down Tuesday's Niles library district tax referendum to increase the rate from 15 cents to 25 cents per \$100 assessed valuation. With 60 of 82 precincts accounted for, 5,631 voters opposed the increase and 4,187 approved it. Library board president Harry Pestine told The Bugle Wednesday the result of Tuesday's vote will cause cutbacks at the branch library on Ballard Road,

limiting hours and generally downsizing the branch operation. Pestine emphasized this year's budget will not be affected by Tuesday's vote. But he did say planned increasing of book purchases of about \$250,000 next year would be cut-back by \$100,000. Pestine emphasized there would be no new tax referendum in the near future. He said while the loss was only 1,500 votes, (a **Continued on Page 43**)

In 1985 the Illinois General Assembly increased school funding. It coupled the increased funds with a new demand that the state's 4,000 schools be held accountable. This column is an abbreviated report of the 12 page document. In the coming weeks we will publish a more complete report comparing our local schools with other suburban, state and city of Chicago schools.

High Schools. Among all high schools in the state, Niles District 219 had the highest average teacher salary, \$45,712 and the highest average spending per pupil, \$3,357. Maine High District 207 was second in the state with an average teacher salary of \$39,990. It was fifth in the state for average spending per pupil, \$6,067. Niles High had 17.8 students per teacher and Maine had 20.3 students per teacher.

Neither high school district was in the top ten districts in ACT scores, American College Testing, measuring aptitude for college work. The top ten districts averaged 22.8% (New Trier) down to 22.0% for Libertyville with both districts having about 83% of their students participating in the tests. Niles North had a 21.2%, Maine South, 20.8%, Niles West, 20.1%, Maine East, 19.6% and Maine West, 19.5%. **Continued on Page 42**

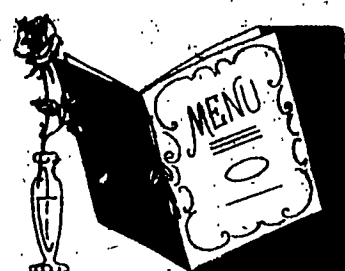
Maritime Folk Festival at Loyola
