## Livestock auction raises money for students and SunTrust fund

SEBRING — Participants at the Junior Livestock Show & Sale expressed lots of love for the community and local students at the Thursday night auction at the Highlands County Fairgrounds.

Besides supporting students in their agricultural efforts, buyers of livestock also donated animals that they had purchased to be resold. When the animals were sold for the second time, the money was given to various organizations such as SunTrust

victims' families, Project Graduation, Andrew Stephens Memorial Fund, and Parker Williams Memorial Fund.

The money from the initial sale of the animal will be given to the student who raised the animal, but the money from the second sale was given to charity.

Thursday night began with a steak dinner at 5 p.m. for buyers, which was sponsored by the Highlands County Cattlemen and Cattlewomen Associations. The live auction followed at a little past 6 p.m.

The auction featured commercial heifers, market steers, grand and reserve champion citrus trees, and market goat and swine. Students from Highlands County 4-H and Future Farmers of America participated in the livestock event.

"The auction teaches kids responsibility, money management and business skills to help them become our next leaders," Carl McKettrick, a buyer from Arcadia Stockyard, said.

Families and friends packed the

stands to show their support for agricultural students. "I'm here to support Kinsey Bachman in her senior year with her hog," Amy Bachman, her aunt, said.

Her aunt held a bouquet of white, red, and purple flowers for her niece. A look around the stands showed that many families were following this tradition of honoring the female participants with bouquets.

Seniors were given a special call out by auctioneer Brian Trimble as he announced over the microphone, "Where are you going to school?" Some seniors responded that they were going to ABAC, or Abraham Baldwin Agricultural College, a state college of the University System of Georgia. Others mentioned starting their education at South Florida State College or entering the workforce.

The night also served as a time to remember two young teens who loved agriculture and the outdoors — Parker William, a 16-year-old from Avon Park

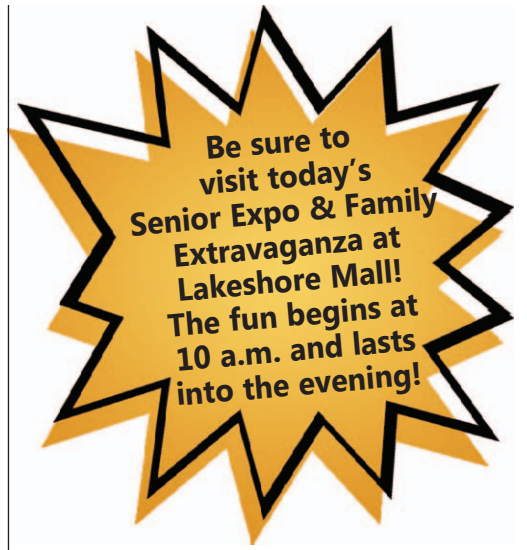
who died on May 20, 2018, and Andrew Stephens, a 14-year-old from Sebring who died on Nov. 10, 2018.

Trimble gave a special tribute to each young man as a friend showed a steer or heifer in each person's memory. Cash and Chance Smoak showed a Brangus cross in memory of Andrew Stephens. The steer sold for \$13 a pound and the proceeds will go to support the Andrew Stevens Memorial Fund. The goal of the fund is to support youth activities, along with education related to life choices teens face daily, Trimble said.

Stevens had already weighed in his steer for this year's show, and his lifelong friends, Cash and Chance Smoak, asked permission to continue the project in his honor.

Carli McWaters showed a steer in Parker Williams' honor. Trimble said, "[She] met Parker in eighth grade and like so many others depended on his smile and kind heart. Carli wanted

## AP to stop trucking solid waste to Okeechobee

AVON PARK — The city's solid waste will be staying closer to home after a cost analysis showed added costs negated the savings from trucking the trash to the Okeechobee landfill.

At Monday's City Council meeting, City Manager David Flowers said in 2014, based on the recommendation of the then city manager, the City Council decided the city's landfill waste would be taken to Okeechobee County instead of the Highlands County landfill.

The former city manager "convinced" the City Council that it was a cost saving measure, Flowers said.

He noted according to the cost analysis created in April 2014 as compared to the actual findings:

- Added mileage for using Okeechobee was 90 miles extra per round trip — the actual is 94 miles.
- Garbage trucks get 7 miles per gallon — it was not calculated as empty or full for mpg.
- Eight trips per week was the original stipulation — it is actually 14 trips per week, often three trips daily, which assumes 67,116 miles extra per year.
- Originally stipulated that Okeechobee was only \$20 per ton — it has been \$25 per ton since the contract was written. The Highlands tipping fee was \$45 per ton in 2014 and remains at \$45 per ton.
- Originally stated that no overtime would be needed — solid waste overtime expenditures increased after the Okeechobee agreement.
- There was no assumption in original documents for added repair/maintenance

## Payless shoes reported to close all stores

SEBRING — Payless ShoeSource Inc. will be closing all of its stores with plans to liquidate its inventory as it moves towards filing bankruptcy later this month, according to a report from Reuters.

Payless had been trying to locate a buyer for the sale of its company, but a deal has not

been struck with any promising investor. The company has made the decision to move toward liquidation, hoping for a buyer to come forth after it files for bankruptcy, Reuters reports.

The Payless store in Sebring's Lakeshore Mall has been in the mall since it opened in 1992.

Lakeshore Mall General Manager Jenny Cheek said she was busy preparing for the

Senior Expo & Family Extravaganza on Friday and had not heard the reports about Payless ShoeSource.

Payless closed 400 stores when it initially filed for bankruptcy in 2017.

With the pending bankruptcy, it is reported Payless will shutter approximately 2,300 stores.

Payless ShoeSource states it is the largest

specialty family footwear retailer in the Western Hemisphere, with nearly 3,600 stores in over 40 countries and in a variety of retail settings, in all 50 U.S. states, as well as in Puerto Rico, Guam, Saipan, the U.S. Virgin Islands, Canada, Central America, the Caribbean and South America.

Payless was founded in 1956, in Topeka,

## Smalley to play 'Music in the Park'

SEBRING — Florida's folk balladeer Brian Smalley is scheduled to play at Highlands Hammock State Park from 7-9 p.m. today. Smalley is an original songwriter whose high-energy acoustical guitar and soulful, earthy voice complement an unusual repertoire that includes history, Florida and himself.

His Civil War ballad, "Chickens Pigs," was named Best Florida Folk CD of 2013 by the Florida Times-Union. Inspired by the Florida Keys, he has written both moving and humorous meditations set in Key West.

Known for playing old-time, flat-pick guitar, audiences may also notice regional influences on his music as he moved all over the country while growing up and absorbed many different musical styles.

Smalley's performance will be followed by three

other concerts in the Music in the Park series including the California Toe Jam Band (March 30), T.C. Carr & Bolts of Blue (April 13) and Rick Arnold (May 4).

# Sebring man facing drug, weapons charges

SEBRING — A Sebring man with a previous felony conviction was arrested on Wednesday and charged with possession of methamphetamine with the intent to sell.

Shawn Matthew Edmondson, 34, of Sebring, was arrested by the Highlands County Sheriff's Office Wednesday. Edmondson was charged with two counts of possession of a weapon by a convicted felon; one count of

possession of methamphetamine with the intent to sell, manufacture or deliver; and one count of possession of drug equipment.

A Sheriff's deputy was conducting patrol in the area of Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard and Lemon Avenue in Sebring and noticed a bicyclist fail to obey a stop sign while traveling east on

E.O. Douglas Avenue, the arrest report states.

The deputy recognized Edmondson, who had an active warrant from the Sheriff's Office for violation of probation. He was arrested based on the active warrant and placed in handcuffs.

After conducting a probable cause search, the deputy reportedly discovered the following items: a clear plastic bag with a green, leafy substance that field tested positive for the presence of tetrahydrocannabinol (THC); an

orange prescription pill bottle that had 4 grams of an off white crystal-like substance that field tested positive for methamphetamine; and two handguns. The deputy reportedly confirmed with dispatch that Edmondson was a convicted felon, and felons are not permitted to own weapons or ammunition.

A syringe with a brown liquid was also found in Edmondson's possession, the report states. The liquid reported field tested positive for methamphetamine.

# Three people from Avon Park accused of burglary

AVON PARK — Three teens from Avon Park have been accused of attempted burglary. One of the teens is a minor and details of this person's involvement have not been released.

Daniel Garcia, 18, of Avon Park, was arrested Wednesday by the Highlands County Sheriff's Office. Garcia was charged with attempted burglary of a dwelling while unarmed, possession of not more than 20 grams of marijuana and smuggling contraband into a detention facility.

Jean Houle, 18, of Avon Park was also arrested Wednesday by the Sheriff's Office. Houle was charged with attempted burglary of an occupied dwelling while unarmed.

The third teen involved is a minor, and an arrest report is not available for the individual.

On Wednesday at 8:16 a.m. a Sheriff's deputy was dispatched

in response to a burglary complaint. A translator assisted the deputy in gaining information from the victim, the arrest report states.

According to the victim, he heard noises coming from the front of his residence and noticed an Hispanic male standing at his front window, "and it appeared he was attempting to open the window."

The victim also mentioned he heard noises coming from the bedroom and bathroom. When he went to the bedroom, he reportedly saw a white female "attempting to take the screen off the window."

The victim also checked

out the noise coming from the bathroom and "observed an Hispanic male attempting to open the window," the report states. The victim reportedly yelled at the suspect attempting to open the bathroom window.

The three suspects allegedly walked behind his residence, and the victim told the deputy that he recognized all three of them since they were his neighbors, and he sees them almost daily.

The suspects were arrested and taken to jail. While at the jail, deputies reportedly found a burnt cigarette in Garcia's possession that field tested positive for marijuana.

# Windshield damage claims drive house debate

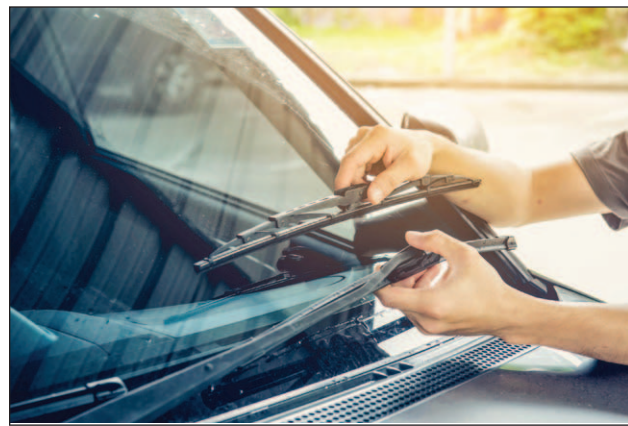
TALLAHASSEE — Supporters say the proposal could prevent shady insurance claims. Opponents say it would hurt small businesses.

But after a lengthy debate Wednesday, a House panel approved a bill (HB 323) that would prevent auto-glass shops from offering cash, gift cards and other incentives to motorists to attract windshield-repair work.

House Insurance & Banking Chairwoman Cyndi Stevenson, R-Saint Johns, pointed to concerns about "bad behavior" that can result from such incentives. That includes unnecessary insurance claims that could lead to higher premiums for motorists.

"I have been offered money to fix my windshield in a parking lot and be paid for my trouble, and my windshield is just fine," said Stevenson, whose panel voted 11-2 to approve the measure.

But some lawmakers and opponents of the bill argued it would hurt small windshield-repair businesses that compete with large corporations that have arrangements with insurance companies. Todd Palmer, a

co-owner of Mr. Auto Glass in the Tampa Bay area, said offering incentives is a way for small repair businesses to compete.

"To me, this bill looks like it is going to cause a monopoly in the market because the insurance companies will pick and choose winners and losers," said Rep. Ardian Zika, a Land O' Lakes Republican who voted against the measure. "As a believer in the free market and consumer choice ... I don't see a sufficient amount of consumer protection here where the consumer can choose."

The Insurance and Banking Subcommittee took up the issue amid

a broader battle in the Capitol about the insurance practice known as assignment of benefits. That practice involves policyholders signing over claims to contractors who then pursue payments from insurance companies.

Insurance companies are seeking changes in assignment of benefits because they say the current system is riddled with fraud and litigation, while contractors and plaintiffs' attorneys contend assignment of benefits help make sure claims are paid properly. The so-called AOB issue initially focused on residential water-damage claims, but it also includes

windshield-damage claims.

Rep. Richard Stark, a Weston Democrat who is sponsoring the windshield-repair bill, said Florida motorists who have comprehensive auto-insurance policies can get windshields replaced without paying deductibles. He said incentives are not allowed to entice policyholders to file other types of insurance claims.

"The goal of the bill is not to put people out of business," said Stark, an insurance broker. "The goal of the bill is to prevent people from offering cash to file a claim. I mean, we don't see it in any other part of the insurance field."

## Moving forward

Avon Park City Council is anxious to get the city's airport running like the municipal airport that it is supposed to be. Right now, it's basically a place for storage of private- or business-owned airplanes.

Pilots have voiced concern since 2017 that there is no fixed base operator to manage the aviation aspects of the city airport. Nor are there aviation support businesses being run out of the facility.

Instead, the building houses the city's Code Enforcement office and leases space to the Heartland Coalition for the Homeless, a 501c3 organization of which a council member is the executive director and the city's former attorney serves on the executive board.

A lot of work has already been done but still pilots complain they are unable to get basic services locally. They don't want to fly in to or from Avon Park without an FBO onsite and they deserve a place to get professional services at an airport.

The city spent more than \$140,000 in 2015 on a master plan for the airport to develop industrialization and commercialization that was moving to the airport for aviation-related businesses. Furthermore, the city spent \$4,800 with Amherst Consulting out of Maitland a year ago to develop a request for proposal for the search of an FBO. That work started two city managers ago and to date nothing has changed.

Mayor Garrett Anderson has requested an outline of what Amherst had done and what was requested of the firm. It was his understanding that Amherst was going to see if they could find an FBO, but was told they could not. However, he said the council had not received any report with suggestions to make improvements or what the circumstances were surrounding the inability to find an FBO.

Anderson said there were "unusual" things surrounding the search and he has every intention of finding out exactly what happened and how a new search can be done successfully. Government continually gets to fail, figure out that they failed, and then spend taxpayer money on the same thing.

In the past five years, more than \$2 million has been spent on improving the airport. The city stopped "trading off or bartering" for rental payments of hangars. Contamination and cleanup from improper mechanical work and fueling practices was costly, but necessary. With a new stormwater pump station, the runways no longer flood after a heavy rainfall.

Anderson said the airport concerns will be revisited. He wants a meeting between Amherst and the City Council to hear exactly what was done in the study and what the city should be doing to find an FBO.

The city seems to have a lot of trust in David Flowers, a hometown son, as the new city manager. The currently seated City Council also seems enthusiastic to see the city progress. Even the council member whose non-profit organization is leasing space in the airport structure realizes it's not the best fit and is looking to be out prior to the lease being up in July.

Flowers has his work cut out for him, but with the council's support behind him, he may find a way to get things moving at the airport. The current council seems determined that the city will find someone to provide FBO services ... with an urgency. There's another group of people who will anticipate a resolution to this matter – the group of pilots who serve on the airport's executive committee and those who lease the city's hangars.

When I moved from Florida the first time, I sold the car to a friend of mine. My mother wanted to know what the poor girl had done to me to deserve that.

Over time I've had my share of cars. Don and I together have owned a variety. We've had cars totaled in accidents. We had one car burn up in Texas (long story). We've managed to avoid lemons for the most part, even with Don's insistence that we stick to used cars when we buy.

Let me hasten to add that "used" does not mean "antique" – and we've wound up with good cars even without buying new. But there have been times I've

driven a rental that is much newer than my 2006 Toyota (my current vehicle) and it has been a sweet experience.

One advantage of buying used, of course, is the price is much more reasonable. And as long as you have a good mechanic to look it over and make sure there's no nasty surprises, more often than not you wind up with a good car that will get you from Point A to Point B with no hassles.

I recently read on cnn.com that more Americans are behind in their car payments than ever before. According to the article, more than seven million loans are overdue by at least 90 days in the fourth quarter, says the Federal Reserve.

While that is a fraction of total loans in the U.S. market – the total is about 89 million – it's a figure that's growing. People are having trouble

making their payments, despite an economy that's improving.

Maybe that's what drove a Winter Haven man to drive a car off a dealership lot, claiming to take it for a test drive. However, he has as of this column not returned with the car, thereby incurring a warrant for his arrest.

According to an article on www.theledger.com, The Winter Haven Police Department issued a press statement detailing the incident. It claims that J'Briel Scurry, 29, and another man came to a Buick GMC dealership looking for a car on February 2nd.

Scurry actually was filling out paperwork for a vehicle he'd just test drove when the sales associate assisting him began helping other customers. Scurry and his pal went back to the lot and then asked for the key to a 2015 white Buick Verano so they could look at it.

When no one was paying attention Scurry

drove the car away.

A short time later, someone noticed the vehicle and a dealership license tag were missing. The associate called Scurry, using the cell phone number provided on his paperwork. Scurry assured the associate that he was merely test driving the vehicle and would return it before the dealership closed.

That was the last anyone heard of Scurry. Subsequent calls to his cell phone went unanswered. A warrant was issued Monday for Scurry's arrest on charges of grand theft auto.

I wouldn't recommend this method to avoid car payments. If Scurry is caught he's going to have a lot more to worry about, though if he's convicted he won't need a car where he'll be going.

Hopefully you have a vehicle you can depend on and can afford the payments. And if you have a cool new car I can test drive, let me know. I promise I'll bring it back.

## Socialism has become a classification that no longer classifies

*"From each according to his ability, to each according to his needs!"*

— Karl Marx

Norman Thomas was not easily discouraged. Running for president in 1932, three years into the shattering, terrifying Depression, which seemed to many to be a systemic crisis of capitalism, Thomas, who had been the Socialist Party's candidate in 1928 and would be in 1936, 1940, 1944 and 1948, received, as this column previously noted, fewer votes (884,885) than Eugene Debs had won (913,693) as the party's candidate in 1920, when, thanks to the wartime hysteria President Woodrow Wilson had fomented, Debs was in jail.

In 1962, Michael Harrington, a founder of the Democratic Socialists of America (it succumbed to a familiar phenomenon: Two American socialists = three factions), published "The Other America." It supposedly kindled President John Kennedy's interest in poverty, which supposedly had not escaped his attention while campaigning in West Virginia's primary. Harrington, like "democratic socialist" Sen. Bernie Sanders today, thought socialism should be advanced through the Democratic Party.

Today, socialism has new, angrier advocates. Speaking well of it gives the speaker the frisson of being naughty and

the fun of provoking Republicans like those whose hosannas rattled the rafters when the president vowed that America would never become socialist. Socialism is, however, more frequently praised than defined because it has become a classification that no longer classifies. So, a president who promiscuously wields government power to influence the allocation of capital (e.g., bossing around Carrier even before he was inaugurated; using protectionism to pick industrial winners and losers) can preen as capitalism's defender against socialists who, like the Bolsheviks, would storm America's Winter Palace if America had one.

Time was, socialism meant thorough collectivism: state ownership of the means of production (including arable land), distribution and exchange. When this did not go swimmingly where it was first tried, Lenin said (in 1922) that socialism meant government ownership of the economy's "commanding heights" – big entities. After many subsequent dilutions, today's watery conceptions of socialism amount to this: almost everyone will be nice to almost everyone, using money taken from a few. This means having government distribute, according to its conception of equity, the wealth

produced by capitalism. This conception is shaped by muscular factions: the elderly, government employees unions, the steel industry, the sugar growers, and so on and on and on. Some wealth is distributed to the poor; most goes to the "neglected" middle class. Some neglect: The political class talks of little else.

Two-thirds of the federal budget (and 14 percent of GDP) goes to transfer payments, mostly to the non-poor. The U.S. economy's health care sector (about 18 percent of the economy) is larger than the economies of all but three nations, and is permeated by government money and mandates. Before the Affordable Care Act was enacted, 40 cents of every health care dollar was government's, 40 cents. The sturdy yeomanry who till America's soil? Last year's 529-page Agriculture Improvement Act will be administered by the Agriculture Department, which has about one employee for every 20 American farms.

Socialists favor a steeply progressive income tax, as did those who created today's: The top 1 percent pay 40 percent of taxes; the bottom 50 percent pay only 3 percent; 50 percent of households pay either no income tax or 10 percent or less of their income. Law professor Richard Epstein notes that in the last 35 years the fraction of total taxes paid by the lower 90 percent

has shrunk from more than 50 percent to about 35 percent.

In his volume in the Oxford History of the United States ("The Republic for Which It Stands," covering 1865-1896) Stanford's Richard White says that John Bates Clark, the leading economist of that era, said "true socialism" is "economic republicanism," which meant more cooperation and less individualism. Others saw socialism as "a system of social ethics." All was vagueness.

Today's angrier socialists rail, with specificity and some justification, against today's "rigged" system of government in the service of the strong. But as the Hoover Institution's John H. Cochrane (aka the Grumpy Economist) says, "If the central problem is rent-seeking, abuse of the power of the state, to deliver economic goods to the wealthy and politically powerful, how in the world is *more government* the answer?"

The "boldness" of today's explicit and implicit socialists – taxing the "rich" – is a perennial temptation of democracy: inciting the majority to attack an unpopular minority. This is socialism now: From each faction according to its vulnerability, to each faction according to its ability to confiscate.

—garbage truck maintenance costs increased after the Okeechobee agreement.

Flowers' cost report showed there was a presumed total savings over five years of \$580,000 (based on the landfill per ton tipping fees of \$25

at Okeechobee County and \$45 at Highlands County), but the increase in overtime and maintenance (not including the current year) resulted in a presumed total savings of \$316,333, which does not include the replacement of a garbage truck with a new truck at a cost of \$300,000.

Since it was by council approval to use the

Okeechobee landfill, Flowers said he sought council approval to take the city's solid waste to the Highlands County landfill.

Deputy Mayor Jim Barnard said, "It's a no brainer for me."

By a 4-0 vote council approved Flowers' suggestion. Councilwoman Brenda Gray was absent from the Monday council meeting.

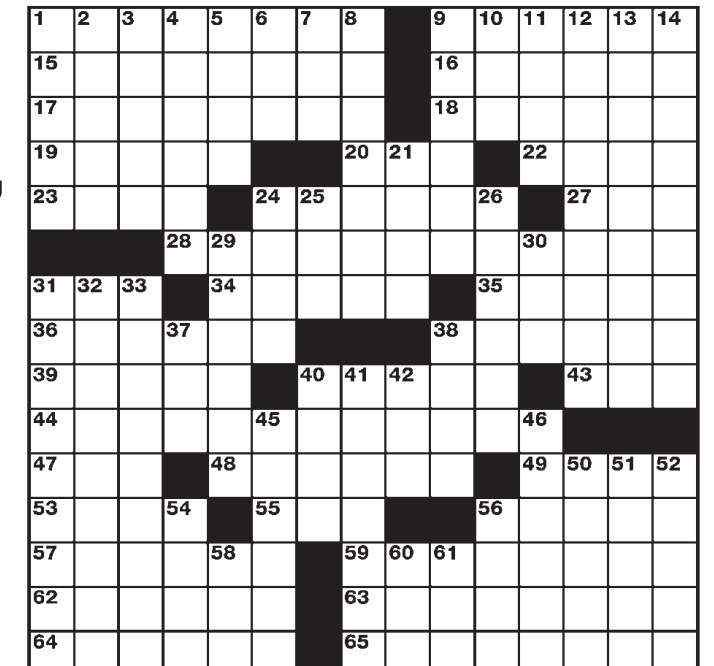

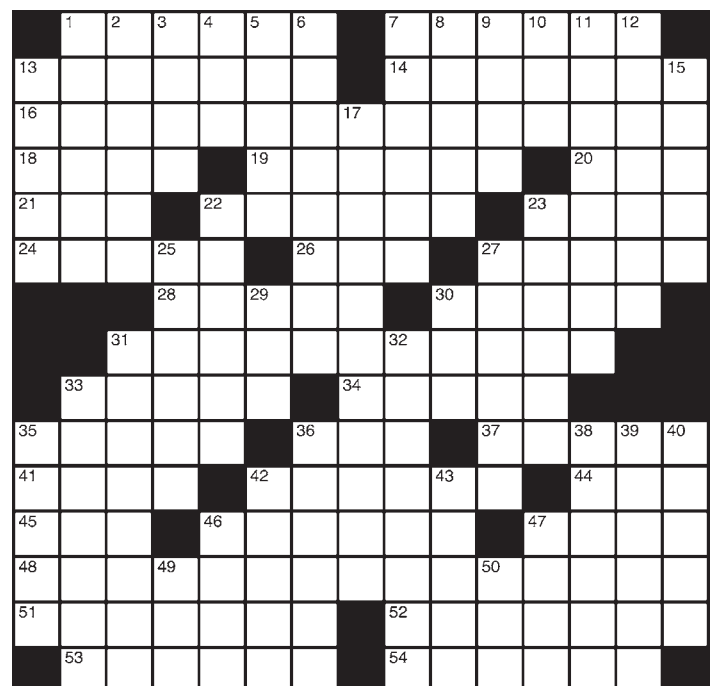

# Museum of the Arts featuring Mirabal

SEBRING — The Highlands Museum of the Arts has a new exhibit on display featuring the artwork of Mary Mirabal.

Five years ago, Mirabal decided it was time for a change and left the corporate world for a world full of color. Acrylic color, to be exact. Bold color. Her work is stunning, especially for a newly self-taught artist.

Creating artwork “makes my soul happy,” said Mirabal, as she spoke to guests at the recent artist’s reception at MOTA. The Tampa artist has her works on display at MOTA through March 29. Her work can also be seen in the Woodfield Fine Art Gallery in St. Petersburg.

She also has work on display in New Mexico,

a state she loves to visit, and where much of her artistic inspiration comes from, with lots of bright, earthy colors typical of the desert Southwest.

“I try to paint happy emotions into most of my work,” said Mirabal. With titles like “Dreaming” and “Blue Bird,” her work has an ethereal quality, riding

the line between modern abstract and impressionistic painting.

Though she tries to stay away from current events, the catastrophic wildfire that destroyed the town of Paradise, California, was only eased from her conscious by painting about it. The work, titled “Paradise Lost,” speaks to the tragedy of the event. It is a powerful piece of work, full of energy and yet also encouraging quiet reflection.

Mirabal often works on two or more pieces at the same time and doesn’t often have a title in mind until a piece is finished. She has a small home studio where she does her work.

“I can’t force it,” says Mirabal, who paints only when the inspiration hits her. Most work is canvas and paint, but she also textures some of her work using metal grating and other embossing materials.

In addition to her canvas art for sale, she also has wearable art: clothing based on her artwork available through VIDA ([shopvida.com/collections/mary-mirabal](http://shopvida.com/collections/mary-mirabal)).

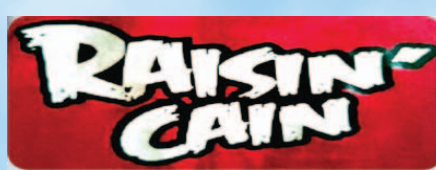

Hinton held the Raiders scoreless for the first four innings before giving up

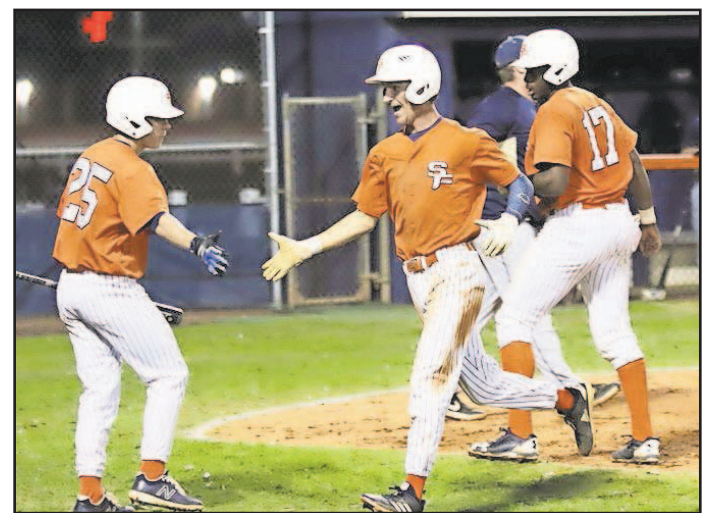

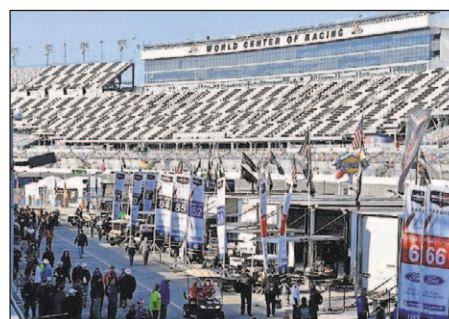

## The ultimate love letter

Love stories from World War II are part of Ken's and my heritage.

Both of our dads served in the Army at critical junctures ... Ken's dad at the Battle of the Bulge and my dad as a survivor of Pearl Harbor.

My dad prayed for the day the war would be over so he could marry and start a family. When he met my mom, they courted, fell in love, married and had two children. He wasn't of flowery speech or love notes, but his every action spoke of his love. He engraved "Love, Ceasar" on jewelry and wrote it on small note cards, but his greatest signature came in how he cared for his wife and family.

On the other hand, my mother-in-law met her husband-to-be through letters as pen pals while he served in the Army. A rich correspondence began.

Over that time, it became clear that these two would be more than pen pals once the war was over. They met, courted, fell in love and married, having five children.

It is heartwarming to see the neatly kept stack of letters from her soldier ... where his words flowed like a waterfall over the pages ... tied together with a ribbon and treasured by her all of these years.

There is a love letter that has withstood the ravages of time. Nothing has succeeded in keeping this letter from transforming the lives of those for whom its message was intended.

Let me quote a passage from this letter (as seen in Ephesians 3: 18, NLT). "And may you have the power to understand, as all God's people should, how wide, how long, how high and how deep his love is."

By now, you realize that this 'letter' is actually a book, the Bible. From its first words to the last, we see the scarlet thread of Jesus' love to his creation.

In Jeremiah 31: 3, NLT we read, "I have loved you, my people, with an everlasting love. With unfailing love I have drawn you to myself."

## Spreading joy through art

through his touchable art that both sighted people and people with limited vision can enjoy.

Talley, who lost his sight after suffering from meningitis when he was four years old, has an upbeat personality and strives to put a smile on other people's faces. He believes that some of the best ways to help people experience more joy is to make them laugh and make art more accessible for everyone.

Providing a better art experience for people with limited vision was a challenge, but he wanted people who are blind to be able to do more than just listen to others describe it to them.

"There was no art in town that I could touch," he said.

Instead of grumbling about the problem, Talley sought a solution

to fix it. "I like to help people feel better and be happy," he said.

He knew that people who could enjoy the world of arts and crafts would find joy in this creative outlet.

Talley adds texture, raised shapes and actual objects to

his three-dimensional art. This mixed media approach provides a visual and tactile feast for all people, regardless of their range of vision.

"My art is for people to touch," Talley said. "You can see a wax museum. You can tell us [people with limited vision] about it, but that's all we can do. We have to listen to people describe it to us."

Talley's art helps people who are blind enjoy art, and it helps people who are sighted understand the world from the perspective of someone who is blind.

Recently, Talley set up a table with his artwork on the Circle in downtown Sebring. A little girl, who was blind, reached out to touch his art. The mom said, "Don't touch."

However, Talley quickly responded, "That is for her to touch." He was thrilled that she could be a part of the artistic world without relying on others to interpret the art for her.

One of his canvases displays a beautiful beach scene, and the sand from the beach is added to that portion of the painted scene.

## Getting the most from that visit to the doctor

This time of year tends to bring on more illnesses. So it's especially important to pay attention if you have an elderly parent or other relative or friend who may need help facing the flu or other illnesses.

Influenza, for example, is a much more serious health issue than many of us realize. It's estimated that 80,000 Americans died of influenza last flu season, over 700,000 were hospitalized, and that the vast majority were elderly.

Of course, as we get older, it's not just the flu but a variety of health issues that can prompt a doctor visit, a visit that can often be stressful, anxiety-producing and confusing for someone older. You may even be aware that you, regardless of your age, face the same problems when visiting your doctor.

A doctor visit should be helpful and productive, and there are things you can do, for yourself or an elderly relative, to help minimize stress and maximize the help the doctor has to offer.

One starting point is being what a professional counselor would call "appropriately assertive." Rather than being intimidated by that white coat and stethoscope, you want to be able to speak up clearly and directly about the reasons for your visit. Establish a climate of mutual respect that acknowledges the doctor's busy schedule but also your need to get information.

It usually helps, prior to that office visit, to write out any questions that you'd like answered. That's especially true if you're going with someone older who may be nervous or forgetful about bringing up all the issues that need addressing.

Write down the doctor's answers and instructions, and don't be afraid to politely ask to have things restated if you haven't fully understood what was said.

Your goal is to get all the information you need and that's especially important if the patient is someone elderly who may forget or be confused about what doctor's diagnosis and advice. To make sure you've understood it yourself, take a moment to repeat what was said, and give the doctor the chance to correct or add to what you've heard.

Open communication between doctor and patient makes it easier for both to work as partners. Whether the visit is for yourself, or to help a senior close to you, building effective communication will result in less stress and confusion, and better care for the patient.

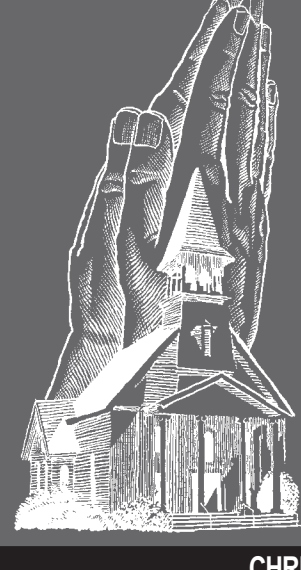

“I like Mr. Wynn’s teaching. He explains everything to us and makes it fun,” he said.

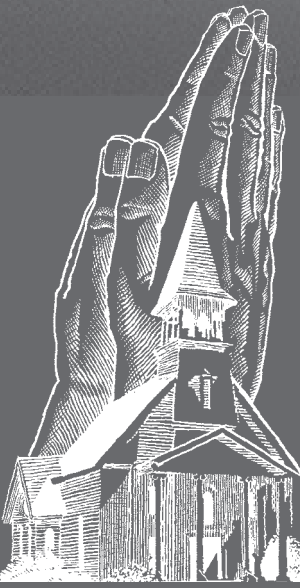

# The importance of knowing your family medical history

When visiting a physician for the first time, patients may notice an extensive section on family history on one of the requisite forms they fill out before meeting the doctor. Though it can be hard to remember family members' conditions, doctors have good reason to ask about their patients' family's medical histories.

Family medical histories can be vital to one's own health care. The National Center for Biotechnology Information states that family history might be one of the strongest influences on a person's risk for developing cancer, heart disease, stroke, diabetes, and more. While you cannot modify your

genetic makeup, knowing your family's medical history can help you take the steps necessary to protect yourself.

Family history reports can serve as warning signs for illnesses. These clues can help doctors prescribe certain screening tests at earlier ages to catch potential diseases

when they are most treatable. For example, the U.S. National Library of Medicine says that healthcare professionals may recommend more frequent screenings (such as mammography or colonoscopy) and screening at an earlier age for people at an increased risk of certain

cancers. Doctors may recommend biannual checkups to stay apprised of any changes in health that may signal a risk.

A thorough health care professional will record your family medical history and ask you to update it routinely in an effort to ensure you get the best, most effective care possible. You can help the process by having the information needed at the ready. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention suggests the following:

**Talk to family.** Make a list of close family members and discuss any conditions or issues they might have had and at what ages.

**Learn about chronic diseases.** Speak to your

relatives about chronic diseases like diabetes or high blood pressure, being sure to ask how severe such issues were and if any required hospitalization.

**Plot your ancestry.** Learn about your ancestry and if any medical issues are more common among people who share that ancestry.

**Record everything you learn.** Keep the information where it can be easily accessed and updated. For example, My Family Health Portrait is a free web-based tool to organize family health information and share it with doctors.

Family history plays a key role in how doctors will approach patients' treatment and preventive care.

Since Talley can not see the canvas, he receives some assistance from his collaborator, Sherry Norris. She helps him find stencil shapes and materials he can use in his artwork.

"All the ideas are Bobby's," Norris said. "But I help him by pulling out the materials he will need from his storage area and assisting him in figuring out techniques to create the piece he sees in his head."

Talley is a member of the Red Cane Club, a club for people with limited vision. After he brought in his art to some of the meetings, other people with limited vision became inspired to work on their own art. They are now planning get together and have an art show for the community.

When people visit with Talley, it's hard not to smile. His playful banter, jokes and beautiful art create an uplifting atmosphere that fills people's hearts with joy.

For those with limited vision, he is an inspiration to use their creativity to delve into the world of art and reap its rich rewards.

the military when they turn 16. Men serve three years and women two, right out of high school. After their service they can continue their higher education. He wondered, "Would it not be amazing if all American kids had to serve their country so they could really learn the greatness of being an American?"

Israeli draftees participate in a number of exams, both physical and mental, prior to being assigned to serve in an appropriate unit. Solomon was assigned to a unit that built hospitals in the field. However he mentioned that the Israel military also are often the first to

respond to emergencies and disasters throughout the world.

Women are treated as equals to the men in the Israeli military and are required to take on any and all tasks assigned to the men.

Jews living in Israel are required to serve, but Muslims and Christian residents can enlist. "It shows how open we are and how we get along. About 30 percent of the Muslims and Christians living in Israeli serve.

Questions were asked about the walls in Israel. Do they keep the country safe or not? Solomon said that many people tunnel in and thus the wall does not keep everyone out. But since there are so many veterans in the country, they account for much of the security as their

presence helps keep undesirables from harming good people.

Another guest asked Solomon how Israelis feel about President Trump moving the embassy from Tel Aviv to Jerusalem. "We are so thankful that he did that."

Rabbi David Nesenoff, one of the guests, said, "The wall really changed the dynamics in Israel, making it very safe."

Devlin, who has visited Israel, spoke that profiling is a positive in Israel unlike the U.S. "When I was there they asked me where I was from. I said Florida. They asked me follow up questions that only a person from Florida would know, thus having another way of keeping the country safe from those wanting to do

harm," she said.

Terry Doane was in the audience and said he had just returned from visiting Israel and spoke of how safe it is to travel there. ## Gunman kills 5 people, wounds 5 police at Illinois business

Cops responding to shooting met with hail of gunfire

AURORA, Ill. (AP) — An employee of a manufacturing company opened fire at its suburban Chicago plant Friday, killing five people and wounding five police officers before he was fatally shot, police said.

Aurora, Illinois, Police Chief Kristen Ziman told a news conference that the gunman was 45-year-old Gary Martin and said he was believed to be an employee at the Henry Pratt Co. — which makes valves for industrial purposes — in the city about 40 miles west of Chicago. She told reporters that officers arrived within four minutes of receiving reports of the shooting and were fired upon as soon as they entered the 29,000-square-foot manufacturing warehouse.

Police said they did not know the gunman's motive.

"May God bless the brave law enforcement officers who continue to run toward danger," Illinois Gov. J.B. Pritzker said at the news conference.

Hospitals reported treating at least seven patients from the shooting, though their conditions weren't released. Two of the officers were airlifted to trauma centers in Chicago, Ziman said. She said a sixth officer suffered a knee injury. Officials did not say the total number of people injured other than the police officers.

## Justices to decide if 2020 census can ask about citizenship

WASHINGTON — The Supreme Court will decide whether the 2020 census can include a question about citizenship that could affect the allocation of seats in the House of Representatives and the distribution of billions of dollars in federal money.

The justices agreed Friday to a speedy review of a lower court ruling that has so far blocked the Trump administration from adding the citizenship question to the census for the first time since 1950.

Both the administration and opponents of the question agreed the court should settle the matter quickly because census forms need to be printed soon.

Arguments will take place in late April.

## Many companies excused from steel tariff

Commerce Department approved exemption requests from 370 companies for up to 4.1 million tons of foreign steel

WASHINGTON — Despite President Donald Trump's tough talk on trade, his administration has granted hundreds of companies permission to import millions of tons of steel made in China, Japan and other countries without paying the hefty tariff he put in place to protect U.S. manufacturers and jobs, according to

an Associated Press analysis.

The waivers from the import tax show how pliable his protectionist policies can be. Trump has positioned himself as an "America First" trade warrior, using tariffs as a club against countries he's accused of playing unfairly. Although China has been the principal target of Trump's ire, he also has criticized Japan and American allies in Europe.

"I love tariffs, but I also love them to

negotiate," Trump said Friday during a Rose Garden news conference.

Behind the scenes, however, his Commerce Department approved tariff exemption requests from 370 companies for up to 4.1 million tons of foreign steel, with roughly 8 percent of the total coming from China and close to 30 percent from Japan, according to AP's review of thousands of

## 9/11 fund running out of money

NEW YORK — The compensation fund for victims of 9/11 is running out of money and will cut future payments by 50 to 70 percent, officials announced Friday.

September 11th Victim Compensation Fund special master Rupa Bhattacharyya said she was "painfully aware of the inequity of the situation" but stressed that awarding some funds for every valid claim would be preferable to sending some legitimate claimants away empty-handed. "I could not abide a plan that would at the

end of the day leave some claimants uncompensated," Bhattacharyya said.

Nearly 40,000 people have applied to the federal fund for people with illnesses potentially related to being at the World Trade Center site, the Pentagon or Shanksville, Pennsylvania, after the 2001 terror attacks there, and about 19,000 of those claims are pending. Nearly \$5 billion in benefits have been awarded out of the \$7.3 billion fund.

Bhattacharyya said fund officials estimate it would take another \$5 billion to pay pending claims and the claims that officials anticipate will be submitted before the fund's December

2020 deadline.

Absent that funding, officials determined that pending claims submitted by Feb. 1 would be paid at 50 percent of their prior value. Valid claims received after that date will be paid at just 30 percent.

Members of Congress responded to Friday's announcement by vowing to reauthorize the compensation fund.

"This is devastating news to the thousands of sick and injured 9/11 responders and survivors who were promised, and have been counting on, being fully compensated for the losses they have suffered," Democratic Reps.

Jerry Nadler and Carolyn Maloney and Republican Peter King said in a statement.

They said they would introduce legislation to make the compensation fund permanent and to compensate all legitimate claimants. "Our bill would restore any cuts to awards, ensure that future eligible recipients are fully compensated, and make the VCF program permanent," the lawmakers said.

The collapse of the trade center in 2001 sent a cloud of thick dust billowing over Lower

## Year in space put astronaut's disease defenses on alert

Identical twins: 1 spent nearly a year in space, 1 stayed Earth bound

WASHINGTON — Nearly a year in space put astronaut Scott Kelly's immune system on high alert and changed the activity of some of his genes compared to his Earth-bound identical twin, researchers said Friday.

Scientists don't know if the changes were good or bad but results from a unique NASA twins study are raising new questions for doctors as the space agency aims to send people to Mars.

Tests of the genetic doubles gave

scientists a never-before opportunity to track details of human biology, such as how an astronaut's genes turn on and off in space differently than at home. One puzzling change announced Friday at a science conference: Kelly's immune system was hyperactivated.

"It's as if the body is reacting to this alien environment sort of like you would a mysterious organism being inside you," said geneticist Christopher Mason of New York's Weill Cornell Medicine, who helped lead the study. He said doctors are now looking for that in other astronauts.

Since the beginning of space

exploration, NASA has studied the toll on astronauts' bodies, such as bone loss that requires exercise to counter. Typically they're in space about six months at a time. Kelly, who lived on the International Space Station, spent 340 days in space and set a U.S. record.

"I've never felt completely normal in space," the now-retired Kelly said in an email to The Associated Press, citing the usual congestion from shifting fluid, headaches and difficulty concentrating from extra carbon dioxide, and digestive complaints from microgravity.

# DeSantis wants to expand scholarships for private schools

Chairwoman of Florida Democratic Party says program would starve public schools of funding

ORLANDO, Fla. (AP) — Florida Gov. Ron DeSantis said Friday he wants to eliminate a waiting list for around 14,000 low-income students seeking to use a tax-payer funded scholarship program that lets them attend private schools.

DeSantis said at a news conference in Orlando that he would ask the Florida Legislature to create a new scholarship program similar to the existing Florida Tax Credit Scholarships.

The governor described the scholarship program as “a really great success for the state of Florida” and said 70 percent of the students in the current program are black or Hispanic.

An Urban Land Institute study in 2017 said low-income students in Florida who attended private schools using a credit scholarship program were more likely to go to college than their peers in public schools. Those findings stood in contrast with some of the recent studies of similar private school choice programs that produced mixed results.

“There are some people who say we shouldn't have this in Florida. I say, just look at the results,” DeSantis said.

The chairwoman of the Florida Democratic Party said the proposed new scholarship program would starve public schools of funding and “funnel tax dollars into the hand of unaccountable special interests.”

DeSantis' announcement is the latest expansion of Florida's taxpayer-funded support for private schools in the two decades that Republicans have controlled the Governor's Mansion.

“With today's announcement, it's clear that Ron DeSantis intends to govern just as the Republican Party of Florida has governed for decades, by selling out Florida's families and children to corporate special interests,” said Terrie Rizzo, chair of the Florida Democratic Party.

DeSantis said he believe his proposal could stand up to any legal challenge brought by opponents of the tax-payer-funded private school choice programs.

### Appellate panel rejects appeal, 3 months after ballot recounts

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) — Three months after the races for Florida governor and U.S. Senate were decided in recounts, a federal appellate court panel has denied an appeal of a ruling over signatures on mail-in ballots.

A U.S. District Court of Appeals panel in Atlanta on Friday denied a request for a stay filed by the National Republican Senate Committee last November in the heat of the Florida recount.

At issue were 4,000 ballots that were rejected because signatures on mail-in ballots didn't match signatures elections supervisors have on file for the voters.

During the recount, Democratic critics said there was no way for voters whose ballots were thrown out to fix them, and a federal judge gave the voters a few days to verify their identities.

The Republican committee appealed that decision.

### Governor's order reveals probe into lawmaker

BOCA RATON, Fla. (AP) — An executive order issued by Florida's governor shows that a South Florida lawmaker is being investigated for petit theft, trespassing and criminal mischief.

The investigation into Democratic Florida Rep. Emily Slosberg came to light Friday after the order was posted on Republican Gov. Ron DeSantis' website.

The order requests that the investigation be transferred from the prosecutor's office in West Palm Beach to the one in Fort Lauderdale. It says State Attorney David Aronberg asked for the transfer since he has a close working relationship with Slosberg and wanted to avoid a conflict of interest.

When asked about the investigation on Friday, Slosberg told the South Florida Sun Sentinel that she was shocked by the allegations and denied any wrongdoing.

### Florida Keys might get new artificial reef

MARATHON, Fla. (AP) — Another marquee ship scuttling to create an artificial reef may be destined for the Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary.

Marathon city officials began planning to file for permits Wednesday with the sanctuary, Army Corps of Engineers and other agencies to execute a signature artificial reef project off Marathon.

The Marathon City Council voted Tuesday to support the permit application process. The vessel and exact site have yet to be identified, and the endeavor, if permitted and funded, is likely to take several years.

The 524-foot Vandenberg was scuttled almost 10 years ago off Key West. The 510-foot Spiegel Grove was positioned off Key Largo in 2001. In between the two regions, other ships have been sunk, but there has never been a major artificial reef project off Marathon.

### Officers disciplined for misusing driver license database

ORLANDO, Fla. (AP) — Officials say 12 Florida police officers have been

disciplined for misusing a driver license database.

The Orlando Sentinel reports Orlando police internal affairs investigators found the officers were using the Driver and Vehicle Information Database for personal purposes. The database allows law enforcement officers to look up personal details about drivers. A police spokesman noted that most of the violations were officers viewing information about themselves or family members.

The reports were released this week in response to a public records request. All 12 officers waived their rights to a full investigation and declined to contest their violations. Nine of the 12 officers received eight-hour suspensions without pay, while the other three had been disciplined previously by supervisors.

Officials say the violations show officers need more training on the system.

### 2 dead, 2 wounded from shooting at basketball court

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. (AP) — Authorities says two people were killed and two others were wounded from a gun fight at an outdoor basketball court in Florida.

The Jacksonville Sheriff's Office tweeted Friday that multiple people started shooting at each other Thursday night at a basketball court in a city park.

Lt. Ellis Burns tells The Florida Times-Union that possibly a dozen bullets were fired.

The sheriff's office says there's no reason to believe the shooting was gang-related.

### Passenger faces charge for bomb joke at airport

FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. (AP) — Passengers on an Air Canada plane had to disembark and a terminal was closed at a South Florida airport after a woman made a joke that a piece luggage might have a bomb.

Authorities say Nathalie Tremblay made the joke Tuesday after a flight attendant had asked passengers who was the owner of an unclaimed bag that wouldn't fit into an overhead bin.

The South Florida Sun Sentinel says the flight attendant was alarmed by Tremblay's response, reported it to the flight's captain and passengers were forced to disembark from the flight at Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport.

Tremblay faces a charge of making a false report. At first, she told investigators she had said she hoped there wasn't a bomb. But she later apologized for making a “stupid joke.”

### Key West bar brawl leads to criminal charges

KEY WEST, Fla. (AP) — It might sound like something out of a Jimmy Buffett song, but a woman was arrested for smashing a beer bottle over the head of another woman who she believed had grabbed her boyfriend in a Key West, Florida bar.

Monroe County Sheriff's deputies said Friday that 42-year-old Sally Amato became upset when she mistakenly thought the woman had grabbed Amato's boyfriend in the crotch.

Amato is faces charges of aggravated battery with a deadly weapon.

## Vice President Mike Pence makes his 1st Auschwitz visit

‘It seems to me to be a scene of unspeakable tragedy, reminding us what tyranny is capable of’

WARSAW, Poland — U.S. Vice President Mike Pence visited the memorial site of Auschwitz on Friday along with the Polish president and Jared Kushner, the son-in-law of President Donald Trump, viewing a train car, crematoriums and the hair of victims that make it such a powerful testament to the evil that befell Europe in the last century.

It was the first visit for Pence, a conservative Christian, to the site where German forces murdered 1.1 million people, most of them Jews but also Poles, Roma and others, during the Nazis' occupation of Eastern Europe during World War II.

Pence and his wife Karen were joined by Polish President Andrzej Duda and first lady Agata

Kornhauser-Duda.

“It seems to me to be a scene of unspeakable tragedy, reminding us what tyranny is capable of,” Pence said hours later during an event Friday evening on the sidelines of the Munich Security Conference in Germany. “But it seems to me also to be a scene of freedom's victory.”

“I traveled in our delegation with people who had family members who had been at Auschwitz — some had survived, some not. But to walk with them and think that two generations ago their forebears came there in box carts and that we would arrive in a motorcade in a free Poland and a Europe restored to freedom from tyranny is an extraordinary experience for us, and I'll carry it with me the rest of our lives,” Pence said.

Pence toured an exhibition hall that includes

human hair and personal belongings of the victims before a wreath-laying at the Death Wall in a courtyard where prisoners were executed. Many of those shot there were Poles who were part of the underground resistance against the German occupation.

Several times during his visit Pence compared the evil of the Nazis to that of Iran today.

He accused the regime in Tehran of “breathing out murderous threats with the same vile anti-Semitic hatred that animated the Nazis in Europe.”

He added that “to be there to see the end result of that and understand all that happened there, I think will better prepare us and strengthen the resolve of the free world to oppose that kind of vile hatred and to confront authoritarian threats of our time.”

## NEWS FROM AROUND THE WORLD

### Haiti to unveil economic measures to quell violent protests

PORT-AU-PRINCE, Haiti (AP) — Haitians on Friday vowed to keep protesting until President Jovenel Moise resigns, despite his announcement of upcoming economic measures designed to quell more than a week of violent demonstrations across the country.

Moise said during a televised address late Thursday that he would not surrender the country to armed gangs and drug dealers, and he accused people of freeing prisoners to kill him. It was the first time Moise had spoken since the demonstrations began, and he made another call for dialogue with the opposition.

Protesters remain angry about skyrocketing inflation and the government's failure to prosecute embezzlement from a multi-billion dollar Venezuelan program that sent discounted oil to Haiti. Few believe the government will take any steps to alleviate the crisis.

### Main suspect in Sweden's royal jewels heist confesses

COPENHAGEN, Denmark (AP) — The main suspect in the theft of royal funeral artifacts from a Swedish cathedral confessed Friday to stealing them after his DNA was

found on the items that were pulled out last week from a garbage bin north of Stockholm.

Swedish broadcaster SVT, reporting Friday from a Stockholm court, quoted the 22-year-old Swede as saying he cut himself when taking the two crowns and an orb from a display at the Strangnas Cathedral, west of the capital, on July 31. Police say blood on two of the items, found Feb. 5, matched his DNA, but they have no clue as to why the jewels turned up when they did.

### Hackers flock to hunt for cracks in Swiss e-voting system

GENEVA (AP) — Swiss authorities are trumpeting the fact that more than 2,000 would-be hackers from around the world have taken up an invitation to try to find holes in Switzerland's groundbreaking online voting system — and potentially earn tens of thousands of francs (dollars) if they succeed.

The Federal Chancellery and Swiss regions, known as cantons, expressed satisfaction at the high response barely a week after launching a registration for IT experts to help crack a planned update to Switzerland's 15-year-old e-voting system. Among countries in Europe, only Estonia has a similar online voting program, a Swiss official said.

As of Friday morning, more than 2,000 had been registered.

### It's a girl! Berlin zoo's baby polar bear has 1st checkup

BERLIN (AP) — Berlin's Tierpark zoo says its latest baby polar bear is “a perky, strong girl.”

Keepers and vets were able to separate the 11-week old bear from mother Tonja for the first time to conduct a medical checkup, during which they also determined the cub's sex.

The zoo said Friday that the as yet unnamed bear weighs 18.7 pound and is 24 inches from head to tail.

Tonja's last two cubs died within months of birth and keepers caution that the mortality rate for young polar bears can be quite high.

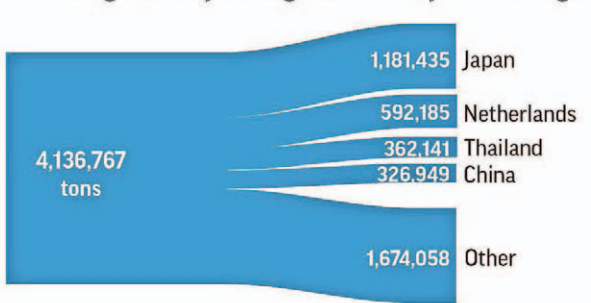
## Getting around Trump's steel tariffs

The Commerce Department has granted thousands of waivers for U.S. companies — some with corporate parents in other countries — to bypass Trump administration tariffs on millions of tons of foreign-made steel.

applications for relief from the import tax on steel. Many recipients of the waivers are subsidiaries of foreign-owned businesses.

Although Trump has sought to rebuild America's steel industry by curbing imports, tariffs are fraught with economic risk — a message that came through loud and clear in many of the waiver applications. Companies that use steel in their products warned the Commerce Department that the 25 percent tariff could do serious damage to their businesses.

The numbers also provide a window into a steel tariff exemption program that has vexed many applicants as well as lawmakers who've questioned the pace, transparency and fairness of the process. The flood of applications overwhelmed the system the department set up nearly a year ago to review them, and more than 38,000 requests still await rulings.

The Commerce Department has received waiver applications from 45 states and Puerto Rico,

evidence of the geographic range of companies angling for exemptions.

Tioga Pipe in Philadelphia, which supplies a variety of industrial customers with pipe, fittings and flanges, received approval to import as much as 86,500 tons of Chinese steel duty free; that was the most of any company with approved waivers. Tioga did not return calls and emails seeking comment, but its applications indicate the material isn't available from domestic suppliers in the sizes and shapes it needs.

DS Containers, a subsidiary of Japan's Daiwa Can, makes aerosol and liquid pour cans at factories in Illinois using laminated tin-free steel that U.S. suppliers have shown no interest in manufacturing, CEO Bill Smith told the Commerce Department. Smith received the go-ahead to import up to 390,000 tons of the material from Japan, the Netherlands and United Kingdom. If the waivers had not been granted, Smith warned, DS Containers might have been forced to shut down production lines or lay off employees.

A decision should come by late June.

The case pits the administration against immigrant advocacy organizations and Democratic-led states, cities and counties that argue the citizenship question is intended to discourage the participation of minorities, primarily

Hispanics, who tend to support Democrats from filling out census forms.

The challengers say they would get less federal money and fewer seats in Congress if the census asks about citizenship because people with noncitizens in their households would be less likely to fill out their census forms.

The Constitution requires a census count every 10 years. A question

about citizenship had once been common, but it has not been asked of every household since 1950. At the moment, the question is part of a detailed annual sample of a small chunk of the population, the American Community Survey.

The case stems from Commerce Secretary Wilbur Ross' decision in 2018 to add a citizenship question to the next census,

over the advice of career officials at the Census Bureau, which is part of the Commerce Department. At the time, Ross said he was responding to a Justice Department request to ask about citizenship in order to improve enforcement of the federal Voting Rights Act.

U.S. District Judge Jesse Furman in New York ruled in January that the question could not be

included, saying that fewer people would respond to the census and that the process Ross used was faulty.

Pressed for time, the administration bypassed the federal appeals court in New York and appealed directly to the justices. The challengers defended the lower court ruling, but acknowledged the need for a quick answer to the legal issue.

Manhattan. Fires burned for weeks. Thousands of construction workers, police officers, firefighters and others spent time working in the soot, often without proper

respiratory protection.

In the 17 years since, many have seen their health decline, some with respiratory or digestive-system ailments that appeared almost immediately, others with illnesses that developed as they aged, including cancer.

Scientists can't say definitively whether toxins at the site gave people cancer. One study published last year found that overall mortality rates among nearly 30,000 rescue and recovery workers weren't elevated. But researchers have raised concern an unusual

number of suicides among first responders and more deaths than expected from brain cancers and non-Hodgkin's lymphoma. Bhattacharyya said the volume of claims has increased over the past year, with more than 8,000 claims filed in the last four months.

Reasons for the increase include the long latency period for some cancers as well as an increase in applications by people who lived or worked near the trade center but were not actively involved in recovery efforts, Bhattacharyya said.

But this study was a unique dive into the molecular level, with former astronaut Mark Kelly, Scott's twin, on the ground for comparison. Full results haven't yet been published, but researchers presented some findings Friday at a meeting of the American Association for the Advancement of Science.

A number of genes connected to the immune system became hyperactive, Mason said. It's not a change in DNA but in

what's called "gene expression," how genes turn off and on and increase or decrease their production of proteins. Mason also spotted a spike in the bloodstream of another marker that primes the immune system. Yet at the same time, Kelly's blood showed fewer of another cell type that's an early defense against viruses.

It's not a surprise that gene activity would change in space — it changes in response to all kinds of stress.

"You can see the body adapting to the change in its environment," Mason said.

The good news: Most everything returned to normal shortly after Kelly got back on Earth in March 2016. Those immune-related genes, however, "seemed to have this memory or this need to almost be on high alert" even six months later, Mason said.

"On the whole it's encouraging," said Craig Kundrot, who heads space life and science research for NASA. "There are no major new warning signs. We are seeing changes that we didn't necessarily anticipate" but don't know if those changes matter.

From four Russians living in space for more than a year, NASA already knew prolonged time off Earth is possible, Kundrot said, adding, "We also aim for more than just possible. We want our astronauts to do more than just survive."

Ultimately, the twin study gives NASA a catalog of things to monitor on future missions to see if other astronauts react the same way. Astronauts on future missions will be able to do some of this testing in space instead of freezing samples for scientists back home, Mason said.

Immune issues sound familiar to Dr. Jerry Linenger, an American astronaut who spent more than four months on the Russian space station Mir. He said he was never sick in orbit, but once he came back to Earth "I was probably more sick than I was in my life."

Astronauts launch into orbit with their own germs and get exposed to their crewmates' germs and then after a week with nothing else new in the "very sterile environment" of a space station "your immune system is really not challenged," Linenger said.

# US military aircraft to deliver more aid to Venezuela border

## Tons of boxes of emergency aid stamped with the U.S. flag already awaiting delivery

CARACAS, Venezuela — The Trump administration is sending another large shipment of humanitarian aid to the Venezuelan border in Colombia, for the first time using U.S. military aircraft as it increases pressure on Nicolas Maduro to give up power, according to a State Department email sent to Congress.

The announcement of additional aid comes as the Trump administration on Friday added Venezuela's oil boss and key intelligence officers to a long list of Maduro loyalists under U.S. financial sanctions.

The 250 tons of food supplies, hygiene kits and nutritional supplements will begin arriving Saturday to the border city of Cucuta, where tons of boxes of emergency aid stamped with the U.S. flag are already warehoused awaiting delivery into Venezuela.

The email sent Friday was provided to The Associated Press by a congressional aide who wasn't authorized to discuss the matter publicly.

The aid came at the request of opposition leader Juan Guaido, who the U.S. and dozens of other countries have recognized as Venezuela's rightful leader after President Nicolas Maduro last month was sworn in for a second term widely seen as illegitimate.

Guaido has vowed to deliver the aid over the objections of Maduro, who in an exclusive interview Thursday with the AP said that the offer of U.S. assistance represents mere "crumbs" compared to hostile efforts to block the country's oil exports and restrict its access to foreign funding.

While the U.S. military has long supported civilian-led humanitarian assistance missions around the world, this is the first time they are being used to deploy aid for Venezuela. Last year, the U.S. government sent more than

\$100 million in aid to Cucuta to help Colombian authorities absorb some of the estimated 3 million of Venezuelans fleeing hyperinflation and food shortages.

In slapping new sanctions on Maj. Gen. Manuel Quevedo, the president of the Venezuelan state oil company PDVSA, U.S. Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin said the oil executive had been instrumental in propping up what he called Maduro's illegitimate regime.

In the AP interview Maduro said Quevedo had been in India this week looking to drum up new business for PDVSA after the company was itself hit with sanctions aimed at cutting off an estimated \$11 billion in profits.

The new sanctions also target four high-ranking intelligence officials, including the head of the feared SEBIN intelligence police and an elite commando unit known as FAES that is accused of several targeted killings.

In a statement, Mnuchin accused the officials of corruption and helping Maduro repress democracy in Venezuela — which includes using "torture and other brutal use of force."

Dozens of first responder vehicles converged on the building housing the company in Aurora after police received multiple calls about an active shooter.

Several ATF teams also responded to the shooting and were at the scene, according to the agency's Chicago spokeswoman, and the FBI said it also responded.

"It's a shame that mass shootings such as this have become commonplace in our country. It's a shame that a cold and heartless offender would be so selfish as to think he has the right to take an innocent life," Aurora Mayor Richard C. Irvin said.

The White House said President Donald Trump was briefed on the shooting and monitoring the situation. Trump tweeted his thanks to law enforcement officers in Aurora and offered his condolences to the victims and their families. "America is with you," he said.

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. — Among those trying to win the Daytona 500 this year are a Florida watermelon farmer, a short-track champion from New England, a television analyst and a 22-year-old whose career nearly was derailed by a brain tumor. The front row is the youngest in Daytona 500 history and it will be William Byron, a Liberty University student who had his wisdom teeth removed in the offseason,

leading the field to green in Sunday's showcase race to kick off the NASCAR season.

The overall look of the nation's top racing series has undergone a transformation the last few seasons and proof is plastered on the hood of Corey LaJoie's car. His full facial-haired face adorns his Ford Mustang, which easily makes him the most recognizable driver among the eight Daytona 500 rookies in the field.

"He looks like he's going to eat you every lap," quipped Clint Bowyer.

LaJoie's paint scheme for his low-budget team is courtesy of sponsor Old Spice, which chose "The Great American Race" to promote its dry shampoo. Manscaped.com bought the space on the back of Landon Cassill's car, Bubba Wallace signed Aftershokz headphones for the race. After Casey Mears made the field — his first race in two years — skateboard rim maker Rim Ryderz joined his program.

This Daytona 500 is unlike any in recent memory and truly highlights

the dramatic loss of star power from just four years ago. The 2015 race featured Jeff Gordon, Dale Earnhardt Jr., Tony Stewart, Matt Kenseth, Carl Edwards, Bobby Labonte, Michael Waltrip and Danica Patrick. All are now retired.

Some of the big-money sponsors in that race included Lowe's, Target, Dollar General, GoDaddy and 5-Hour Energy. All have since pulled out of NASCAR.

## Experiences taught Oliver Drake to pack light

PORT CHARLOTTE — One of the lessons Rays pitcher Oliver Drake has learned over the past year is that comfort is a luxury while living on the fringe of a major league roster.

Since the beginning of the 2018 season, the right-hander has been in six different organizations, including two twice. He had been designated for assignment eight times over that stretch, claimed by new organizations six times and jettisoned to the minors after clearing waivers two other times.

Last season, Drake pitched for five different major league clubs

— the Brewers, Indians, Angels, Blue Jays and Twins — which is a major-league record.

"One thing I've learned is to pack light," Drake joked.

Rays manager Kevin Cash said this week he had some fun with Drake about how well-traveled he is.

"I told him, 'Man, when you get to the Hall of Fame, you're going to have a tough time picking what hat you're going to wear,'" Cash said.

Drake takes his frequent travel in stride, but it's not an easy life. The fact he pitched for so many teams shows he can help a major-league bullpen, but being the 25th man means you can be on your way somewhere else on

a whim.

"I kind of learned to just roll with the punches, and I was real appreciative of the support system I have, from my friends, family, to my wife (Shannon)," Drake said. "They definitely made it easier."

"It seemed like every month I was on the move not knowing where I was going to be, so it's easy for the mind to start to race and a lot of negative thoughts can creep in. So when you have a good support system, it kind of helps to stay positive and stay upbeat and ready for the next chapter."

Drake, who turned 32 last month, is now trying to establish himself with the Rays. Tampa

Bay actually held his rights twice this offseason. The Rays claimed him off waivers from the Twins in November, then lost him on waivers to the Blue Jays later that month. Tampa Bay reacquired him in January, slid him through waivers and outrighted him to Triple-A. He is in Rays camp as a non-roster invitee.

Throughout a season full of changing teams, Drake said he learned that to stick with what has gotten him to the big leagues — a fastball-splitter mix — instead of trying to re-invent himself at every new spot.

Drake's four-seam,

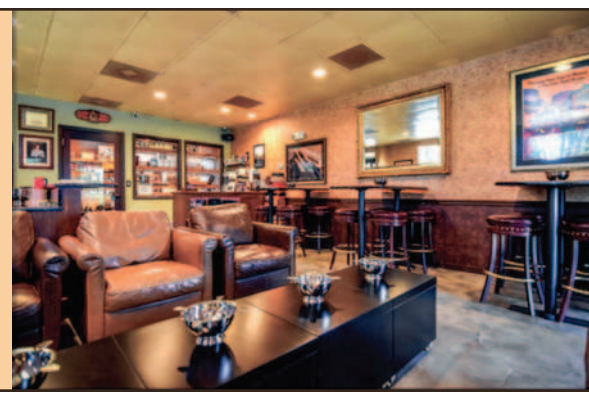

# Georgiev stops 31 in Rangers' 6-2 win over Sabres

BUFFALO, N.Y. — Rookie Alexandar Georgiev stopped 31 shots, including 13 in the final period, and the New York Rangers rolled to a 6-2 win over the Buffalo Sabres on Friday night.

Vladislav Namestnikov scored twice in the final four minutes, while also adding an assist. Jesper Fast and Boob Nieves staked the Rangers to a 2-0 lead in the first period, and Jimmy Vesey and Pavel Buchnevich also scored.

New York improved to 8-5-1 in its past 14 and earned its 58th point to move into 12th in the Eastern Conference standings.

Buffalo squandered a chance to close the gap on idle Pittsburgh in the race for the Eastern Conference's eighth and final playoff spot. The Sabres have 63 points and remain four behind the Penguins.

Jeff Skinner scored twice for Buffalo, including his team-leading 36th, and Linus Ullmark stopped 23 shots.

With the Rangers up 3-2, Georgiev was particularly sharp in the opening six minutes of the third period. First, he got across to his left to stop Rasmus Dahlin's one-timer 58 second in. Some five minutes later, the goalie squared up in his crease to stop Tage Thompson's shot from the slot.

Georgiev won his third straight start. He was coming off a 55-save performance in a 4-1 win over Toronto on Sunday. Buchnevich put New York up 4-2 by tapping in Kevin Hayes' pass into the open left side with 4:01 left. Namestnikov then scored into an open net off the ensuing faceoff after Ullmark misplayed the puck. It caromed off Ullmark's stick and toward the front of the net to Namestnikov.

The Sabres closed their seven-game homestand at 3-3-1 while continuing a lengthy string of inconsistent outings.

Coming off a 3-1 victory over the New York Islanders on Tuesday, Buffalo was trying to win consecutive games for the first time since Dec. 11-13.

Skinner cut the Rangers' lead to 2-1 by one-timing in Jason Pominville's pass into the left circle 53 seconds into the second period.

The Rangers responded 54 seconds later, when Vesey jammed a puck inside the right post off a pass from Buchnevich. Skinner then scored a power-play goal with 3:04 left. Dahlin corralled a bouncing puck and fed Skinner at the top of the right circle, and he knuckled in a shot that fooled Georgiev.

NOTES: LW Connor Brickley made his Rangers debut a month after he was acquired in a trade that sent Cole Schneider to Nashville. Brickley played in place of rookie Filip Chytil, who was benched because of what coach David Quinn described as steadily declining play. ... Sabres D Zach Bogosian returned after missing two games with a lower-body injury. ... Quinn is pleased with Vesey's physical play of late, which is noticeably getting under the skin of opponents. "It's a funny sport. When you (tick) people off, they tend to come after you after the whistle," Quinn said. "So he's (ticking) people off with his play."

# Slow start dooms Community Christian

BRADENTON – Perhaps it was the noisy, festive crowd inside the Hoagland Arena that was busting at the seams to see Saint Stephen's win its first boys basketball district title in school history.

Or it could have been the fact that Port Charlotte Community Christian could only manage two field goals in the first 14 minutes of the game. The Mustangs also had trouble hanging onto the ball and committed more fouls than coach Kurt Taylor would have liked to have seen in the first half.

All of those factors were too much for Community Christian to overcome in Friday night's Class 3A-District 5

championship game. Saint Stephen's ran out to a 26-3 lead in the first half and delivered a district title to a hungry throng of fans with a 63-44 victory in Bradenton.

The Falcons capitalized on four early turnovers and five fouls by the Mustangs on their way to a quick 11-0 lead. "I really thought we were ready to play...but apparently we weren't,"

Taylor said. "It took us too long to get any offense going. If we make some baskets early it's a different game."

Ethan Bray started hitting some baskets in the second half to give the Mustangs some hope. The senior hit a pair of three-pointers in the third quarter and added several more buckets over the final period. He finished with a team-high 14 points.

"He played a good, all-around game," Taylor said.

The Saint Stephen's tandem of Cade Westerberry and Cam Vining proved to be too much for the Mustangs late. Community Christian got within 15 points after a three by Rodney Anicet, but Westerberry and Vining converted several late shots to ice the game.

"Getting down the way we did

against the way they play is asking for trouble," Taylor said. "They don't make mistakes. We had to get ahead of them early but we didn't do that. We came out in the second half with more energy – but I don't know where that was in the first half."

Sam Battle added 12 points for Community Christian, which fell to 13-13 on the year.

The Mustangs will hit the road for a Class 3A regional quarterfinal game on Thursday. A win over a yet-to-be determined opponent as of press time could set up a potential rematch with Saint Stephen's (21-5).

"We just need to be ready to play when the ball goes up," Taylor said. "We've struggled with that all year...and I don't know why."

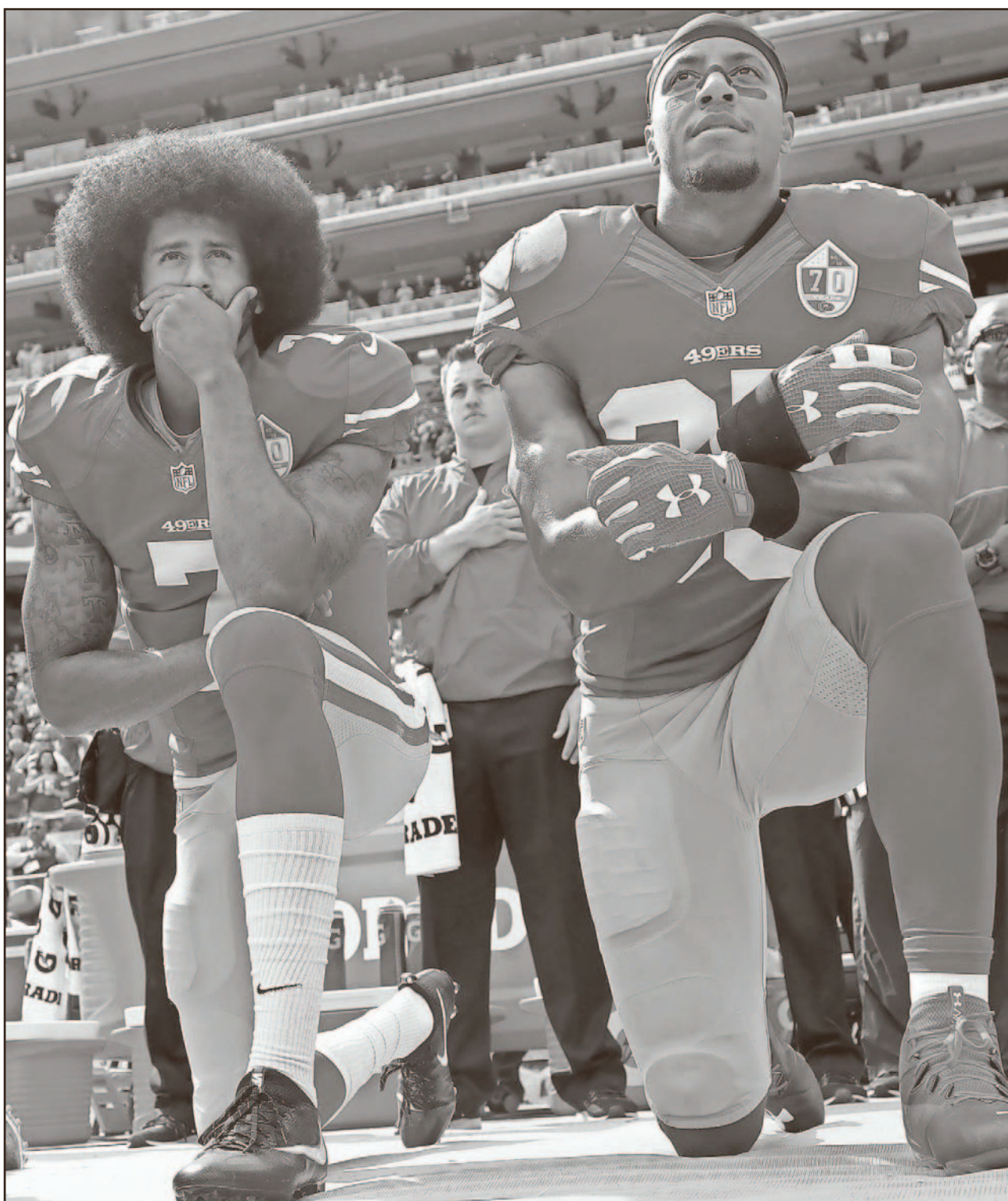

# Kaepernick and Reid settle collusion cases

The NFL has reached an agreement with players Colin Kaepernick and Eric Reid to resolve their collusion grievances, the sides announced Friday. Terms of the deal were not disclosed.

“For the past several months, counsel for Mr. Kaepernick and Mr. Reid have engaged in an ongoing dialogue with representatives of the NFL. As a result of those discussions, the parties have decided to resolve the pending grievances,” the NFL and attorney Mark Geragos said in a joint statement. “The resolution of this matter is subject to a confidentiality agreement so there will be no further comment by any party.”

The agreement settles a dispute that likely was headed for arbitration and comes 16 months after Kaepernick, a former San Francisco 49ers quarterback, filed a collusion grievance arguing that NFL teams had blackballed him for kneeling during the national anthem to protest racial inequalities that exist in the U.S.

Kaepernick has been the focal point of the most controversial sports protest in a generation. His act led to some type of protest on virtually every NFL team, divided fans, became a central talking point for President Donald Trump and recently inspired a

major advertisement campaign by Nike, coinciding with the 30th anniversary of the company’s “Just Do It” slogan.

Reid, one of his teammates in San Francisco who knelt alongside him, subsequently signed with the Carolina Panthers.

The grievance, which was filed by Geragos and not the NFL Players Association, asserted that the NFL and team owners “have colluded to deprive Mr. Kaepernick of employment rights in retaliation for Mr. Kaepernick’s leadership and advocacy for equality and social justice and his bringing awareness to peculiar institutions still undermining racial equality in the United States.”

The NFLPA said in a statement Friday that it doesn’t know the details of the settlement but supports the decision by Kaepernick and Reid.

“We continuously supported Colin and Eric from the start of their protests, participated with their lawyers throughout their legal proceedings and were prepared to participate in the upcoming trial in pursuit of both truth and justice for what we believe the NFL and its clubs did to them,” the players union said. “We are glad that Eric has earned a job and a new contract, and we continue to hope that Colin gets his opportunity as well.”

NEW YORK (AP) — Right-hander Luis Severino avoided an arbitration hearing with the New York Yankees, agreeing Friday to a \$40 million, four-year contract, a person familiar with the negotiations told The Associated Press. Severino’s deal includes a team option for 2023 that could make the agreement worth \$52.25 million for five seasons. If the option is not exercised, Severino would be eligible for free agency after the 2022 season.

The person spoke on condition of anonymity because the agreement is subject to a successful physical.

Severino gets a \$2 million signing bonus, \$4 million in 2019, \$10 million in 2020, \$10.5 million in 2021 and \$11 million in 2022. The team option is for \$15 million with a \$2.75 million buyout.

He had been scheduled for the final salary arbitration hearing of the year on Friday morning at St. Petersburg, Florida. Severino had asked for a raise from \$604,975 to \$5.25 million in his first season of arbitration

eligibility and the Yankees had offered \$4.4 million.

Severino has a 41-25 career record with a 3.51 ERA and falls two days of service time short of having been eligible for free agency after 2021. He was set back when he struggled in 2016 and was sent to the minor leagues several times.

A right-hander who turns 25 next Wednesday, Severino is a two-time All-Star. He went 19-8 with a 3.39 ERA last year, winning 14 of his first 16 decisions but then five of his last 11. He came out early in both of his postseason starts, going 0-1 in seven innings.

## Pelicans’ GM Demps casualty of Davis fallout

NEW ORLEANS — The Pelicans have decided to fire ninth-year general manager Dell Demps and start the process of finding someone to deal with the fallout of All-Star Anthony Davis’ recent trade demand, said a person familiar with the situation said.

Demps’ firing comes after Davis said in late January that he would not sign an extension with New Orleans and wants to be traded to a contending team. Davis has another season remaining on his contract after this one and this

season’s trade deadline has passed, meaning no trade will happen until summer.

The new general manager also would oversee the upcoming draft and decide the future of coach Alvin Gentry, who for now is being retained.

Davis was the first pick in the 2012 NBA draft out of Kentucky and has been named an All-Star six times in his first seven seasons, so the return on a trade for him should be considerable.

Demps received his only general manager position with New Orleans in the summer of 2010 and the Pelicans

have made the playoffs three times during his tenure.

The Pelicans enter this season’s All-Star break at 26-33 and unlikely to make the Western Conference playoff field this season.

Demps’ last game in charge was Thursday night, a 131-122 victory over Oklahoma City that was overshadowed by Davis leaving the game with a left shoulder injury at halftime.

Davis could be seen leaving the arena during the second half with his agent, Rich Paul, to get an MRI exam that revealed he has a muscle bruise.

## All-Star Game: What to know about this weekend

CHARLOTTE, N.C. — With All-Star festivities set to officially begin Friday, here are 10 things to know going into the weekend:

### BACK TO CHARLOTTE

Charlotte hosted NBA All-Star weekend in 1991, and now gets it back a second time to join 14 other cities that can say it hosted the league’s showcase midseason event on multiple occasions.

### LEBRON’S RECORDS

LeBron James now has the record for most All-Star captaincies: Two. He and Stephen Curry had the jobs last year when the captain’s format was first introduced to the All-Star weekend, and he and Giannis Antetokounmpo have the jobs this year.

But James’ records revolving around this game hardly stop there.

By starting on Sunday, James will tie Kobe Bryant with 15 starts in the All-Star Game. James will also extend his record of consecutive starts, which will also rise to 15. Some of the other All-Star records James already holds include total points (343), field goals (141) and 3-pointers (35).

And by playing two minutes, James will increase his All-Star total in that stat to 416 — one more than Bryant for No. 2 on the all-time list. Kareem Abdul-Jabbar has played the most All-Star minutes, 449.

### FOULING OUT

Bold prediction: No one will foul out on Sunday.

The last player to foul out of an All-Star Game

was Hakeem Olajuwon in 1987. Chris Paul was the most recent to come close, when he was whistled for five fouls in the 2008 game.

There have been only 14 instances of someone fouling out of an All-Star Game. Rick Barry and Bob Cousy each fouled out twice; 10 others, including Olajuwon, have done so once.

### MVPs AT HOME

Kemba Walker, the lone Charlotte player in this year’s All-Star Game, has suggested that he’s hoping he can wow the home crowd with an MVP-worthy performance.

There’s a history of that sort of thing happening. There have been 14 players who have won All-Star MVP honors in their home cities.

### AGE MARK

Dallas’ Dirk Nowitzki — one of the special additions to the rosters by NBA Commissioner Adam Silver, who also added Miami’s Dwyane Wade

to the list — will become the second 40-something to appear in the All-Star Game. Nowitzki is 40; Kareem Abdul-Jabbar played in the game when he was 40 and 41.

Michael Jordan almost pulled off the feat; he was eight days shy of turning 40 when he last played in the All-Star Game in 2003. Jordan, now the owner of the Charlotte Hornets and the unofficial host of the weekend, will turn 56 on Sunday.

Wade, also assuming he gets into the game, will become the 12th player to be an All-Star at 37 or older.

### HEROES

Jason Weinmann and James Shaw Jr. were invited to play in Friday’s All-Star Celebrity Game to commemorate heroic acts. Weinmann, a retired

Marine, used a military transport vehicle — which he bought at a government auction years ago — during Hurricane Florence last September to help rescue flood victims in North Carolina and bring them to safety. Shaw disarmed a man who had opened fire at a Waffle House restaurant near Nashville last April.

### G LEAGUE FIRST

Khristian Middleton of the Milwaukee Bucks is the first member of a new club.

He’s the first G League alum to become an NBA All-Star.

There will be plenty of G League graduates participating on All-Star Saturday as well — Middleton, Seth Curry, Danny Green and Joe Harris are all slated to be in the 3-point contest.

# Kiermaier joins camp early, hopes to stay healthy

PORT CHARLOTTE — Centerfielder Kevin Kiermaier, looking even more in shape than usual (if that's possible), reported early to camp Friday and was eager to get on the field.

The challenge for the Rays, after a third straight injury-shortened season, is keeping him there.

"We're a different team when KK is on the field," manager Kevin Cash said. "When he's not, we miss him. Obviously, our defense is different. Our offense, when he's going right, he's got the ability to really ignite us.

"Last year, we look at it, it was a broken year for KK in the fact that it's not easy to come out of spring training, get banged up, miss time, try to re-start everything. It was like he was playing catchup, swimming uphill the entire time."

Kiermaier has played only 291 of 486 games the last three seasons due to a series of what Cash called "fluke" injuries: broken left wrist in 2016, fractured right hip in 2017, torn right thumb

ligament in 2018. "We'll do everything we can to avoid them," Cash said.

**First steps**  
Brandon Lowe ordered his own glove, sought advice from veterans such as Justin Smoak and studied the fundamentals. Friday he got on the dirt to start actually working at learning to play first base. Lowe, who played second and outfield after his Aug. 4 call up, welcomes the opportunity, having played first in youth leagues: "If it gets me on the field and it gets me at-bats, I'm all for it."

The Rays will look at Lowe and Ji-Man Choi, both lefty swingers, to see who pairs best with Yandy Diaz at first. Cash said he expects Lowe to be a quick study based on the athleticism he showed last year. "We've got to give him a little bit of time to work on the little nuances, the footwork and stuff like that," he said.

split-finger fastball mix is a good one. His low-90s fastball plays faster when combined with a splitter that has consistently averaged about 10 mph slower and has late depth. That combination has allowed Drake to keep hitters off balance and miss bats to the tune of a career 24.9-percent strikeout rate.

"He has shown the ability to miss bats," Cash said. "He pitches a little backward in the fact that it's heavy split, and pops in fastballs here and there. But it's a pretty simple approach. Sitting behind him watching his bullpen (session), you see why people swing and they don't hit it. They chase a lot of balls out of the zone. It looks like a fastball kind of coming middle to middle up, and it dives out of the zone."

In the beginning of last season, Drake incorporated a

curveball that he worked on in the previous year in Milwaukee as a third pitch. While the early reviews were good, it took away some of the effectiveness of his bread-and-butter pitches. And in the situation Drake was in — where one or two bad outings can lead to your way out the door — he decided to shelve it.

"I started using a breaking ball at the beginning of the year to see if it could help, but at the same point, I don't want to get away with what my strengths are and what makes me good by focusing so much time on a new pitch," Drake said. "Last year, especially, kind of reminded me to stick to what got me here and what I do best. It was kind of a re-affirmation of, this is why you're good. This is what you do."

Once he joined the Twins in August, Drake had his most successful stretch of the season, posting a 2.21 ERA over 20-1/3 relief innings. He held opposing batters to a .164 batting average and posted

scoreless outings in 15 of his 19 appearances. And his splitter induced a 21.6-percent whiff rate.

"I think more than anything with Oliver, it's probably a little bit of consistency will do him some good," said Cash, who sees Drake as a one-inning reliever. "He said he thought he figured some stuff about himself last year in Minnesota whenever that spell came about. We just want to be able to assist him and see how he can fit into our mix."

For the first time in his career, Drake is opening a spring-training camp with a team he didn't spend the previous season with. He is starting as a minor leaguer, so the Rays don't have to keep him on the major-league roster to open the season.

"I'm just trying to go out there and try to show what I've got and stick to who I am as a pitcher and hopefully that's enough," Drake said. "It's still the same thing. Different

location and different team. This is new for me because I'm showing up not really knowing anyone, really. So there's a lot of new names and faces, but when it gets down to it, it's about putting on a jersey and

"Last year, I got a lot of practice having to learn names and faces pretty quickly," Drake deadpanned.

"So it shouldn't be too hard."

the premise that if a budding driver or team owner could scrape together the funds to field a car, they could bring it down to the beach and try to make the big show. As the sport exploded, it became nearly impossible for a new driver to claw his way into a ride.

But change has created opportunity — even second and third chances for a guy like Ross Chastain. The eighth-generation watermelon

farmer impressed a sponsor with his work ethic and landed a career-changing ride with unexpected funding.

Federal agents raided the sponsor right before Christmas, but Chastain still managed to land a seat for his first Daytona 500.

Ryan Preece bounced back and forth between NASCAR and New England short tracks before finally gambling on his future. He settled for a part-time job with a competitive team because he believed he could show his true talent if given the right equipment. Now he's also a Daytona 500 rookie.

Same with Matt Tifft, who learned he had a brain tumor four races into his 2016 season. Or Daniel Hemric of Kannapolis, North Carolina, who followed hero Dale Earnhardt Sr. from the old mill town into a ride with Richard Childress Racing.

Hendrick Motorsports and its four fast Chevrolets at the start of Speedweeks went 1-2-3-4 in time trials. Byron, who is 21, and 25-year-old teammate Alex Bowman swept the front row for qualifying and gave Chevrolet an early boost in its effort to defend last year's Daytona 500 victory with

Austin Dillon.

Still, Ford drivers swept both podiums in the pair of 150-mile qualifying races to load rows two, three and four with the brand new Mustang. Ford competed last year with the Fusion, winning 19 of 36 races and its first Cup title in 14 seasons, and is eager to make an immediate statement with its sportier new race car.

Kevin Harvick and Joey Logano, previous Daytona 500 winners, led the Ford charge. Logano and Team Penske teammate Brad Keselowski are listed as 8/1 favorites in betting lines.

Jimmie Johnson ended a 19-month losing streak with a victory in a Speedweeks exhibition race, but he triggered a 16-car accident while making his race-winning pass. Then contact with Kyle Busch in a qualifying race increased the scrutiny around Johnson, who has a new sponsor Ally Financial and a new crew chief.

The Toyota bunch has yet to stand out from the crowd, which doesn't bother Martin Truex Jr. His 0-for-14 skid in the in the Daytona 500 is longest among active drivers, but he knows he's got a chance Sunday.

# Thomas, Scott share lead at rain-delayed Riviera

LOS ANGELES — Justin Thomas was playing well enough to want to keep going, with six birdies in a seven-hole stretch before it was too dark to continue Friday at the Genesis Open.

It also was raining.

It was cold.

And he already had been sloggling through Riviera for nine hours.

"It's hard playing 30 holes, but it's really hard when it's raining and it's soft," Thomas said after making 14 birdies on a long day that sent him home tied for the lead with Adam Scott at 10-under par. "My legs

are tired, so I just need to go home and rest and get some food and try to go to sleep early as I can."

Thomas, who opened with a 5-under 66 in the morning, was 5 under for his second round through 12 holes. He had an eight-hole stretch when he didn't make a par (six birdies, two bogeys), ending with a two-putt par on No. 3.

Scott was in the group right behind him and just as efficient, also opening with a 66 and reaching 5 under. His only blemish was a long three-putt for bogey on the par-5 17th on a course he loves. Scott won at Riviera in the rain 14 years ago, a tournament that was cut short to 36 holes and decided

in a playoff.

"I just got the momentum going and I kept it going," Scott said.

Tiger Woods had a few big moments that didn't last long. He had four straight birdies around the turn in the morning, a streak that ended with a three-putt bogey at No. 12. He had four three-putts in the first round for a 70.

His highlight in the afternoon, as the temperatures and rain became steady, was a 45-foot eagle putt on the par-5 first to start his back nine. It really was an Instagram moment, for a fan screamed out, "Make this! It's going on Instagram!" Woods delivered, only to bogey the next two

holes to end his day at even par for the second round, 1 under for the tournament.

"I'm stiff right now," Woods said after playing the most number of holes in one day since his return from a fourth back surgery. "It got pretty chilly toward the end. The ball wasn't going very far."

No need telling that to Thomas. He was in the right rough after hitting driver 260 yards, leaving him 222 yards to a back pin on an elevated green. He pounded 5-wood to 10 feet and made his last birdie of the day.

J.B. Holmes was another shot behind at the turn. Holmes was the 18-hole leader thanks to a hole-in-one on the par-3 sixth

hole, followed by a birdie that led to an 8-under 63. At the time, he was one shot ahead of Jordan Spieth, who played all of six holes on Friday to complete his bogey-free 64 in calm conditions.

Spieth figured it would be like that all day. He was wrong. Light rain fell as Woods, Thomas and Rory McIlroy (3 under through 12) were finishing the first round.

The start of the tournament was delayed seven hours Thursday, so just about everyone who makes the cut will face long days at some point. The second round resumes at 7 a.m., and the other half of the field starts their second round at 7:40 a.m.

# St. John's rallies from far back to stun No. 8 Marquette

NEW YORK (AP) — Nearly seven years to the day of the biggest upset in St. John's women's basketball history, the Red Storm pulled off another top-10 stunner.

Tiana England scored 20 points and St. John's rallied from a double-digit deficit to beat No. 8 Marquette 81-74 on Friday night.

It was the first victory for the Red Storm over a top-10 team since upsetting then-No. 2 UConn on the road to end the Huskies' 99-game home winning streak on Feb. 18, 2012.

"It's obviously huge, we need to understand the breadth in what happened here," Red Storm coach Joe Tartamella said. "They are the No. 8 team in the country, undefeated in the Big East and beating teams by 40. For us to compete at that level here and to be able to finish the game is great."

The victory was a season-best fourth in a row for St. John's (13-12, 6-8 Big East).

"In the scope of my time here as a head coach what happened tonight, that's one of the biggest wins we've had," said Tartamella who is in his seventh year in charge of the

team.

The Red Storm were down 14 in the second quarter and eight at the half before pulling off the shocking win that ended a 12-game winning streak for the Golden Eagles (21-4, 12-1).

"St. John's wanted it more than us," Marquette coach Carolyn Kieger said. "That's really hard for me as a head coach to say. They wanted it more than us. They were tougher than us and deserved the win. They were coming in with a chip on their shoulder and did it from start to finish."

The score was tied at 56 heading into the fourth quarter and St. John's was down 67-66 midway through the quarter when Jasmine Sina's 3-pointer from the corner in front of the Red Storm bench started a 9-1 run. After a defensive stop, England scored on a fast-break layup to extend the Red Storm's advantage to four. That was the team's biggest lead of the game to that point.

The Red Storm kept the run going as the Golden Eagles had no answer on the offensive end. England's layup with 2:17 left made it 75-68. Marquette could get no closer

than five the rest of the way.

"The difference today and some of our closer games earlier in the season was that we were locked in," England said. "We got down and didn't stay down. We made it our mission to come back and play together as a team."

Erika Davenport had 24 points and 13 rebounds to lead Marquette while Amani Wilborn added a season-high 22 points.

Davenport got the Golden Eagles started, scoring 12 points in the opening period when Marquette jumped out to a 24-14 lead.

The lead grew to 14 in the second quarter before the Red Storm pulled within six behind Qadashah Hoppie. A nifty full-court pass from Davenport to Selena Lott on the run gave Marquette a 40-32 lead at the half.

Alisha Kebbe scored seven of her 16 points in the third quarter as St. John's took its first lead of the game at 56-54 late in the period.

### Tip-ins:

St. John's last win over a top-10 team was at then-No. 2 UConn on Feb. 18, 2012, to end the Huskies' 99-game

home winning streak. ... In a touching tribute before the game, St. John's honored a dozen cancer survivors by giving them pink Red Storm t-shirts. Friday night's contest was the school's annual Play4Kay game.

Marquette was two victories short of the school-record 14-game winning streak set in the 2006-07 season.

St. John's has had Marquette's number this year in basketball with both the men's and women's teams upsetting the ranked Golden Eagles. The men swept the two games from the Golden Eagles while the women split the two contests.

### 1K mark:

Davenport is one of four players in Marquette school history to have 1,000 points and 1,000 rebounds in her career.

She reached the milestone against Georgetown a week ago and joined Abbie Willenborg, Julie Sievers and Christine Kennedy.

### No. 19 Arizona St 66, Colorado 49

Kianna Ibis scored 18

points with nine rebounds and No. 19 Arizona State defeated Colorado 66-49 on Friday night for the Sun Devils' fourth straight win.

Ibis, though shooting only 5 of 14 Friday, has scored in double figures in all but two games this season.


Courtney Ekmark added 14 points on 6-of-9 shooting for the Sun Devils (17-6, 8-4 Pac-12), who swept the season series from the Buffaloes, winning 76-70 at Colorado (11-13, 1-12) on Jan. 6.

Reili Richardson's 3-pointer with 4:53 left in the third quarter put the Sun Devils up by 12 and the lead remained in double figures, reaching 19 late in the period before the Buffaloes cut it to 15 entering the fourth quarter. An 11-0 run gave ASU its largest lead of 22 with 2:28 remaining.

Alexis Robinson scored 13 points for Colorado, which was coming off its lone conference victory over USC after losing its previous 11 games.

A 14-2 run gave ASU an 11-point lead with 2:25 left in the first quarter and the Sun Devils led thereafter.

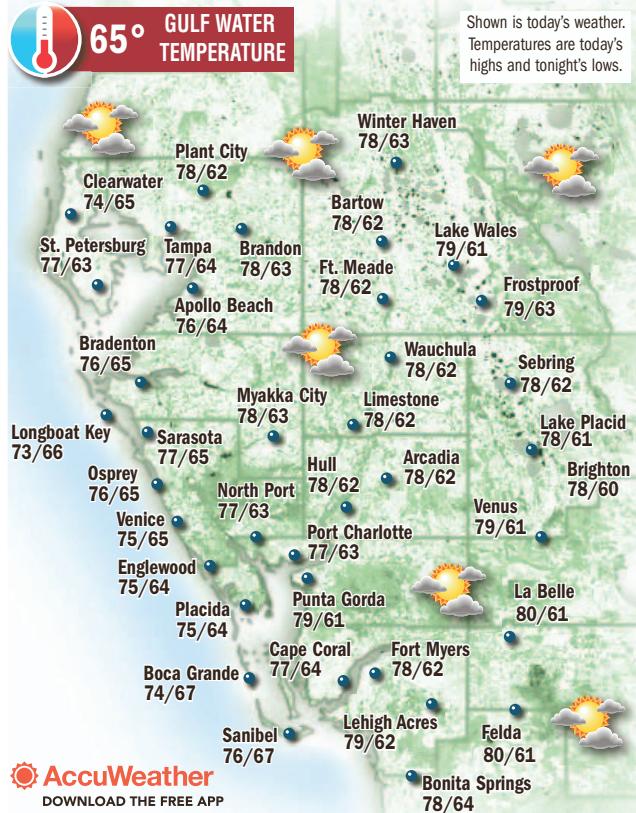

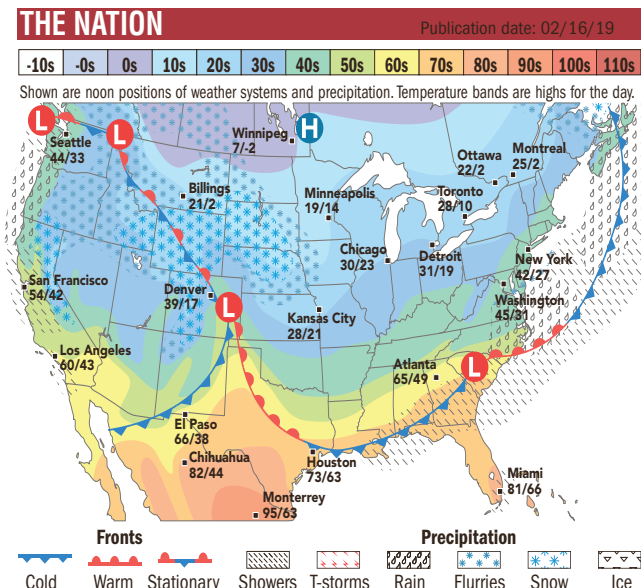

# Kyle vs. The King: Busch chases Petty for record

DAYTONA BEACH — Kyle Busch had been sprayed with champagne and hoisted his winner's trophy last July at Pocono Raceway when fans sitting high above the stage shouted his name so they could snap a quick photo. Busch craned his neck to oblige the requests and the signage on the premium seating structure was impossible to miss: the Richard Petty 200 Victory Circle.

NASCAR drivers for a generation have looked up at Petty's record win total, a number as synonymous with The King as his feathered cowboy hats, dark glasses and cowboy boots. "It's just a bunch of wins," Petty said. A whole bunch that add up to one big number that Busch is primed to zip past this season. It's Kyle vs. The King in the battle for winningest driver in NASCAR history. Sort of. Petty is NASCAR's undisputed leaders in victories with 200 and each checkered flag was collected in the elite Cup series. He won his first race in 1960 and his last one in Daytona in 1984. Not only is Petty in first, he has no peer — David Pearson, who died in November, is up next with 103. Hall of Famer Jeff Gordon was the only other driver within striking of distance of 100 with 93 Cup wins.

The 33-year-old Busch has 194 NASCAR wins across three series and sits a solid 11th on the career Cup list with 51. "If he's not the best, he's one of the best," long-time Petty crew chief Dale Inman said. The debate is raised because Busch accumulated his wins in two other NASCAR series that weren't available in Petty's heyday: Busch has a record 51 wins in the Truck Series (formed in 1995) and 91 more in the second-tier Xfinity Series (1982).

Busch said he would never compare his win total with Petty's. "Absolutely not because his number is obviously Cup wins and mine's not," Busch said. Busch seems a lock to pass Petty for the overall mark at some point this season. He won eight times in Cup in 2018 and that total alone would push him past Petty. He is scheduled to race five times this season in Trucks and seven in Xfinity.

Even as Busch posted big Cup seasons, he continued to dip down to the lower levels and race each Friday and Saturday. Busch was the class of each series from 2008 to 2016. He'd sweep race weekends and take his customary bow to thousands of fans booing the outlier who had essentially spoiled a shot at a win for a rising star or lower-series stalwart. When some teenager

or some 20-something prospect would trudge into the media center with another runner-up behind Busch, the question would inevitably arise — is it fair for a veteran like Busch in top equipment to come down and run roughshod over the field? Mike Trout doesn't moonlight in Triple-A. Joel Embiid doesn't mess around on off nights in the G-League. Tired of the complaining, NASCAR implemented rules for 2017 that restricted the

number of Trucks and Xfinity races for Cup drivers. It was basically a Kyle Busch rule. Petty earned his first victory in 1960, his third season on the Grand National circuit, and his 27 victories in 1967 still stand as a single-season record. While Busch has only competed in a 36-race season, Petty drove in 61 races — 61! — in 1964. He made 52 and 54 starts in consecutive seasons (1962-63) and crushed the competition in an era when NASCAR

was still a regional series racing on short tracks in the South. The races themselves were also much different. Busch and the rest of the Cup drivers had twin 150-mile qualifying races in the 1961 World 600 Qualifier No. 1 (67 laps, 100.5 miles), and he even won 50-milers in 1962 at Roanoke, Huntsville and Winston-Salem, North Carolina. "If you go back and look at some of the older

guys, Red Farmers and all that, they've won thousands of races in Saturday night deals. Sunday deals. Different kinds of cars. It's just a number," Petty said. "Just like me winning 200 is just a number. I just happened to be in the same kind of car." Petty won his 200th race in his 915th career start but he failed to win again over the final eight years of his career. Busch, who is only racing this weekend in the Daytona 500, has 51 Cup wins in 498 starts.

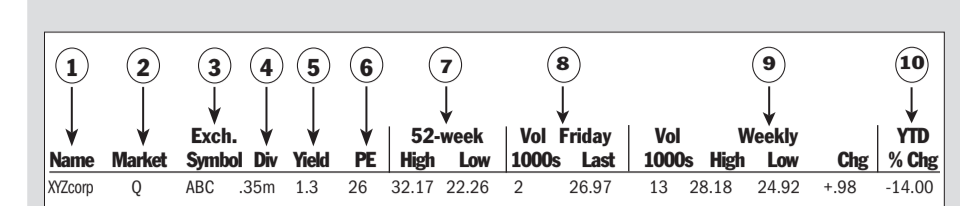

# Austin Dillon looks forward to his 'chess match' at Daytona

Austin Dillon will be the first to tell you that winning last year's Daytona 500 was the highlight of his season, if not his career.

The trouble is, the 28-year-old North Carolina native and driver of the No. 3 Chevrolet for Richard Childress Racing couldn't maintain that level of success into the rest of the 2018 Monster Energy Cup season, ringing up only seven more top-10 finishes, one more top-five and no wins in the ensuing 35 races. Winning at Daytona got him to the postseason but he wasn't much of a factor there, getting eliminated in the Round of 16 to finish 13th in the final Cup standings.

Now Dillon is rested, relaxed and smarter for his struggles as he and 39 other series drivers gear up for the 2019 Daytona 500, the Cup Series season-opener that airs from Daytona International Speedway Sunday, Feb. 17, on Fox.

"It's a long race and you know guys are coming off of the winter break," explains Dillon, the grandson of team owner Richard Childress, "everybody's pumped up to go out there and compete hard. So people are being aggressive early on and you've got to be smart.

"It's a chess match," he continues. "It's really like playing chess at 200 miles per hour. Daytona is one of those places that sometimes things can go outside of your control and you'll be caught up in something that you weren't really a part of. And you just have to have a little bit of luck but also put yourself in a smart position."

In last year's race, Dillon benefited from a little of both. He managed to sidestep three massive wrecks that eliminated many of the strongest cars in the field to come from one lap back of the lead with 20 to go and wind up directly behind leader Aric Almirola. As Almirola tried to block him in the last lap of overtime, Dillon tagged his rear bumper and sent him spinning into the wall, thus enabling Dillon to speed past for the victory.

And he did it in Dale Earnhardt's No. 3 Chevy, 20 years after Earnhardt's first and only victory in the 500 and 17 years to the day the NASCAR legend was killed in a last lap wreck on the North Florida tri-oval.

"The No. 3 car has always been historically famous at Daytona," Dillon says, "and there's everything that Dale Earnhardt was able to accomplish. And when he won 20 years ago from when we won, it was really cool ... to go back to Victory Lane with the No. 3. There's so much history at Daytona and the No. 3 car has so much history, it was very special."

"I mean, that's a championship race right there," he continues, "and not many races where they say afterwards 'champion.' So you know it's the Super Bowl of our sport and to cross the checkered flag, it just felt so good to bring it back to all of our employees at RCR and my grandfather, my family. It just felt good."

# Celebs who cook: Talented on screen and in the kitchen

## BEST RACING MOVIES

**"Bobby Deerfield" (1977)** Al Pacino garnered a Golden Globe nomination in the title role of an American driver who becomes obsessed with dying after a fiery crash kills a Formula One teammate and seriously injures a rival. During a hospital visit to the latter, he meets an enigmatic Swiss woman (Marthe Keller) with a terminal illness – and falls in love, thus heightening his new sense of urgency. Sidney Pollack directed.

**"The Cannonball Run" (1981)** A cavalcade of old-guard Hollywood as it was at the time – including Burt Reynolds, Farrah Fawcett, Roger Moore, Dom DeLuise, Dean Martin and Sammy Davis Jr. – turned out for this comic romp from director Hal Needham about a real-life illegal cross-country race. Almost as fun as the movie itself is the

closing blooper reel, commonplace today but a novelty back in the 1980s.

**"Days of Thunder" (1990)** Tom Cruise stars as a young hotshot open-wheel driver full of attitude and temper, who suddenly finds himself at a disadvantage when he enters the rough-and-tumble world of NASCAR's Cup series. Produced by Jerry Bruckheimer and Don Simpson and directed by Tony Scott, the film boasts an impressive cast including Robert Duvall, Nicole Kidman, Randy Quaid and Cary Elwes, along with real-life NASCAR stars Rusty Wallace, Neil Bonnet and Harry Gant and racing commentator Dr. Jerry Punch.

**"Talladega Nights: The Ballad of Ricky Bobby" (2006)** Will Ferrell has the title role of a NASCAR veteran who finds his place at the top of the Cup series threatened by the arrival of a flamboyant French Formula

One driver played by Sacha Baron Cohen. After a crash, a lost ride, a divorce and other personal problems, he finds himself at rock bottom, but a rematch with his foreign rival could set things right. John C. Reilly, Amy Adams, Gary Cole, Michael Clarke Duncan and Jane Lynch also star.

**"Rush" (2013)** The rivalry of real-life 1970s Formula One drivers James Hunt and Niki Lauda (Chris Hemsworth, Daniel Bruhl) is re-created to dramatic effect in director Ron Howard's superb actioner. **Does your role in "Flack" reflect publicists you've known or dealt with?**

Absolutely not.

**Early in "Flack," you make a lengthy speech about being a woman in today's world. What were your thoughts upon tackling that?**

I just think that it's really worthy of note how amazing it is to work with a male writer who understands the female experience so incredibly well, like Ollie (series creator and executive producer Oliver Lansley) does, and is able to write it in such a personal and detailed and beautiful way.

In all of the sort of MeToo of it all, I think sometimes not very much credit is given to men who actually are part of the solution, not the problem. That kind of dialogue is, excuse the expression, kind of like actor-porn wet-dream stuff. It's exciting. It's a whole big, beautifully worded mouthful that, if you actually memorize correctly – and the punctuation is very specific, and the words are very specific – it just flows. And it's beautiful. And I love stuff like that. It's one of the things I love about doing theater; there's no second take.

**a lot of series-television work in recent years. What keeps bringing you back?**

We are primarily driven by good material. We are not really looking for a specific genre or a specific medium. 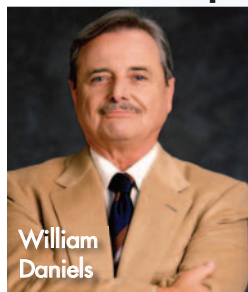

Things down to the food, the way it's cooked, the way it's prepared to the way the house looks. It was absolutely a wonderful asset for us.

### What surprised you?

There were a lot of things. The writer, Michael Amo, comes from a Mennonite family. It's not so much what surprised me about what I learned, it was more about

how appealing that life sort of seemed to me, that simpler, off-the-grid life, just having to worry about your community and your family and not all the horrors and atrocities of the world.

I found that really fascinating, things like not having power or running water in your house, but in the milking barn where the cows are, it looks like it was built by NASA because it has to meet industry standards and certain codes in order for you to sell your milk. It has to meet all these standards. So you walk into a milking barn and as I said, it looks like it was built by NASA but then you enter your home, you've just got a wood fire and candlelight and that's it.

# Streaming Standout

## Enemies old and new descend on the Ravens in Season 2 of 'The Oath'

Walking in the shoes of a Los Angeles cop – albeit a corrupt one – for two seasons in the Sony Crackle drama series “The Oath” has given Ryan Kwanten an appreciation for what those who protect and defend must endure.

“I really don’t know how they can, I guess, deal with the emotional ramifications of that job,” the Australian actor explains. “You know, Joe (Halpin, the series’ creator and a former L.A. County cop) talks about how it can’t help but change you, change the way you look at the world. And so for me, that was far more important to tap into that sort of emotional well and go to kind of those dark places in myself that I know I’ve got kind of locked up for a reason, as everyone does have their demons.”

As the eight-episode second season begins streaming Thursday, Feb. 21, Kwanten’s character, Steve Hammond, and his police gang, the Ravens, are attempting to get out from under their debt to the cartel by trying to free the patriarch of the Velasquez family. But complications arise that pit Hammond and fellow Ravens Beach (Katrina Law), Cole (Cory Hardrict), Ramos (J.J. Soria) and newcomer Christine Parks (music’s Christina Milian) against a new enemy.

At the same time, an investigative reporter’s article threatens to put cop gangs back in the spotlight at the worst possible time.

Former “Entourage” regular Kevin Connolly joins the Season 2 cast as the journalist in question, Hoke, and he also directs three episodes.

“Kevin’s (character) ... sort of helps out (Beach) with one of the bigger issues that she’s dealing with – or we are,” Kwanten says. “There’s some heat that comes out on the legitimacy of these cop gangs and his article kind of threatens to kind of tear down the very fabric of what the Ravens are. And so we need to get some help from the inside and Kevin’s our inside man.”

As for his character, Kwanten admits there is an emotional toll that comes with putting himself in the headspace of the intense Hammond and he even jokes that the end of a season means he can smile again. Toward that end, he credits Halpin with letting him and his castmates run with their characters.

“Joe was and is still so giving when it comes to sort of letting us live and breathe the characters,” he says. “I think he just cast well and he knew that he had actors that were willing to go places that I can firmly say other actors would not go. I’m so proud of the guys that we have. They really are great humans as well as great actors.”

# movie review

## 'Glass' has less shine than its forerunners

Ever since his success with "The Sixth Sense," which now goes back 20 years, it's been clear that M. Night Shyamalan is a filmmaker who likes to stretch. That hasn't always worked, but two examples where it has are "Unbreakable" and the relatively recent "Split."

The writer-director merges characters and situations from those movies in "Glass," named for the character Samuel L. Jackson played in "Unbreakable." He turns up again here, as does that film's Bruce Willis, whose alter ego is a self-styled, special-powered vigilante on the trail of the multiple-personality villain played by James McAvoy in "Split."

He also reprises his role here, and it's only a matter of time before all of those figures converge – with Sarah Paulson in another American horror story as a psychiatrist who surveys all of them. That may sound rather dry, but don't worry: The stuntmen and special-effects experts eventually earn their keep here.

Shyamalan's ambition with "Glass" is clear: It's pretty bold for a moviemaker to go back to two of his earlier projects and attempt to merge them, but the director has built something of a cinematic universe of his own. He set the groundwork for "Glass" well, but the catch is to make the combination work fully.

Fans of "Unbreakable" likely will enjoy seeing Willis in his role again as much as he appears to enjoy playing it again. Indeed, he puts forth more conviction and energy as he has in some time, and he's been working quite a bit ... which speaks to his relative level of interest in each piece of material. Of course, he knew what he was getting into here, having worked with Shyamalan before.

That also goes for Jackson and McAvoy, the latter of whom actually is given the most to take and run with. That could be a matter of his again playing several characters rolled into one, but he's the real protagonist of "Glass," being the fiend pursued by Willis. And he is still every bit the fiend, though "Split" was overall a stronger story on its own, the same argument that can be made for "Unbreakable."

It certainly helps to have seen "Unbreakable" and/or "Split" to get the most out of "Glass," but it's not an absolute requirement. The downside is that in trying to cobble all of the pieces together, Shyamalan makes "Glass" a mere reflection of its former selves.

**"Sin City" (2005):** It's tough-guy time yet again for Willis, playing a down-and-out policeman trying to protect a stripper (Jessica Alba).

**"The Whole Nine Yards" (2000):** Spoofing his rugged image, Willis is amusing as a hit man whose stay in the suburbs isn't as quiet as hoped.

**"The Sixth Sense" (1999):** An understated Willis is as fine as he's ever been as a tormented psychologist advising a boy (Haley Joel Osment) who sees dead people.

**"Armageddon" (1998):** Willis is typically tough, and good, as an oil driller who leads his team into outer space to destroy an asteroid.

**"The Fifth Element" (1997):** A cult-classic dip into sci-fi finds Willis as a futuristic cabbie who may hold the key to keeping the world intact.

**"Twelve Monkeys" (1995):** Terry Gilliam's effectively grim fantasy casts Willis as a prison inmate sent back in time to prevent a plague that will ravage the world.

**"Pulp Fiction" (1994):** As a boxer whose plans are short-circuited, Willis is a big contributor to Quentin Tarantino's superb ensemble cast.

**"Die Hard" (1988):** Willis cemented his screen image as wisecracking New York cop John McClane, who's in the wrong place at the wrong time when terrorists overtake the Los Angeles building where his wife works.

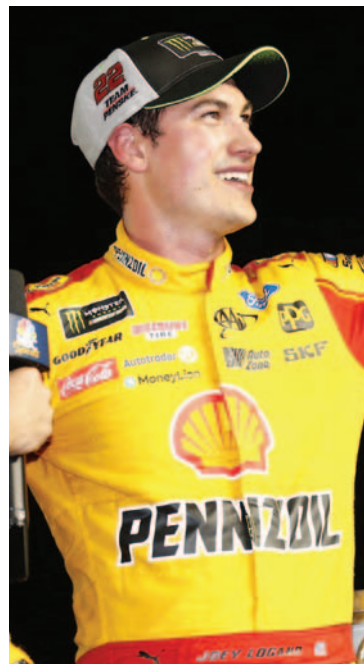

# Joey Logano looks to pick up where he left off in 2018



When the season ends, athletes like to kick back and get far away from it all – mentally if not physically, too.

Some travel, tend to outside businesses, write a book or ski and still others catch up on projects around their home(s).

For Joey Logano, fresh off his first championship in the Monster Energy Cup, it was a time to celebrate. So he and wife Brittany spent New Year's Eve in New York's Times Square, watching the ball drop and reveling in their good fortune.

The persistent rain that night failed to dampen their spirits.

"What a great night!" Logano wrote in an Instagram post that also included a photo of him and Brittany kissing in their foul weather gear. "What a feeling to be in Times Square to bring in the new year!"

The new season, which gets going Sunday, Feb. 21, on Fox, with the Daytona 500, sees Logano coming in with a target on his back, not only because he's the defending series champ but also due to his aggressive driving style. ## SELA WARD



Sela Ann Ward was born on July 11, 1956, in Meridian, Miss. The eldest of four siblings, she was a University of Alabama homecoming queen and a Crimson Tide cheerleader.

Ward started her acting career in director Blake Edwards' American remake of "The Man Who Loved Women." Her other movies have included "Nothing in Common," "Hello Again," "Double Jeopardy," "The Fugitive," "My Fellow Americans," "The Day After Tomorrow," "The Guardian," "The Stepfather," "Gone Girl" and (as the U.S. president) "Independence Day: Resurgence."

On television, Ward's first series credit was "Emerald Point N.A.S." and after subsequent guest roles on such shows as "L.A. Law" and "Night Court," she landed the role of Teddy Reed on "Sisters" – for which she won her first Emmy. Ward then added a CableACE Award to that for her portrayal of the title newscaster in the Lifetime movie "Almost Golden: The Jessica Savitch Story."

The drama series "Once and Again," casting her as a separated wife and mother who embarks on a new romance, brought Ward her second Emmy and a Golden Globe Award. She then had a recurring role on "House" as the title doctor's ex, and though she decided to stay away from weekly television right after that, she eventually joined "CSI: NY" for its seventh season and then stayed for its final two years.

Ward also has appeared on two premium-cable series, "Graves" (as the wife of an ex-president played by Nick Nolte) and HBO's ongoing "Westworld." She now co-stars in the CBS drama "FBI" as Dana Mosier, the special agent in charge of the title bureau's New York office.

Married to entrepreneur (and, last year, U.S. Senate candidate) Howard Sherman, with whom she has two children, Ward did much to found Hope Village for Children – a group home and emergency shelter – in her hometown.

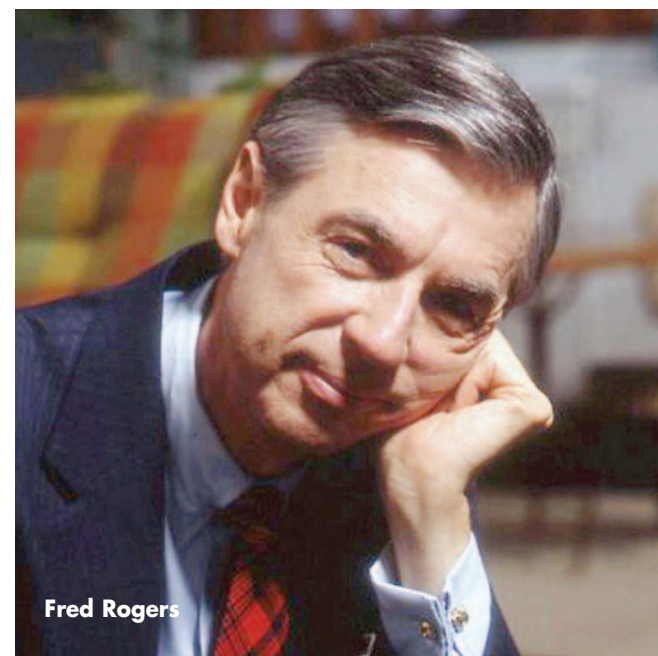
With independent films prominent in the Oscars now, the Film Independent Spirit Awards offer a more logical start than ever to that weekend of honors.

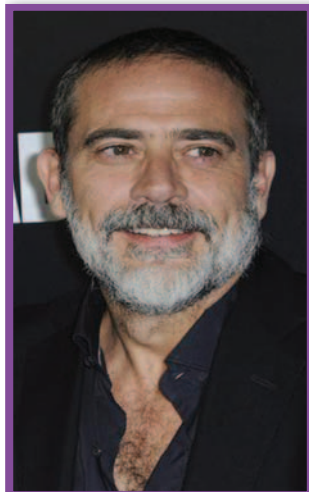

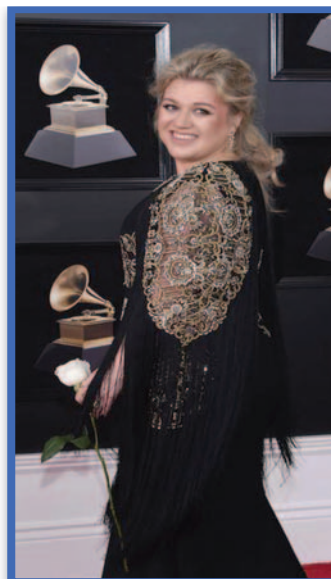
