

Blountstown City Manager tells council he's leaving

Blountstown City Council members were surprised to learn that the city manager is leaving his job at the end of July.

Just before the conclusion of last week's city council meeting, Emory Pierce announced his resignation.

He told board members he had "obligations elsewhere in the state" and said there were some things he needed to take care of. When asked if he was sure of his decision, Pierce explained

his actions were due to family matters, according to Councilwoman Janie Boyd.

Pierce was hired nearly three years ago after an extensive interview process.

The council held a special meeting Tuesday night to address the issue.

"We are going to put our Assistant City Manager Traci Hall in as interim city manager for 90 days," said Blountstown Mayor Tony Shoemake. The group also agreed to advertise for a public works director. "We're reviewing the job requirements for that position and will approve it at the next meeting," he said. The public works director would oversee city work crews and make sure projects got completed, Shoemake explained. He said the salary would probably start around \$30,000.

He said they would later review their options for the city manager's position and decide how to proceed.

Pierce was not at Tuesday's special meeting.

The mayor indicated that the city manager felt it was time to retire and said he told him he had enjoyed his time in Blountstown but "it was time to move on."

Truck overturns three times, trapping driver

A Bristol man was cut from the wreckage of his truck after a crash about 10 miles south of Blountstown on SR 71 Tuesday. Kenneth Ivey Walden, 41, suffered non-incapacitating injuries in the accident. He was taken to Bay Medical Center by Life Flight and was said to be in stable condition, according to FHP Trooper Luke Johnson. Witnesses reported seeing Walden's 1996 Chevrolet traveling north near Carlos Peavy Road just before it went into a ditch, hit a culvert and flipped over three times. Walden stated that he had fallen asleep before losing control of the truck. A witness told the trooper it appeared the driver was talking on his cell phone just before the accident.

Child thrown from car during Saturday wreck

A three-year-old child was reportedly unhurt after being ejected from a car that overturned along SR 12 North in Bristol on Saturday. Witnesses reported seeing the vehicle run off the road around 11 a.m. When the driver, who was traveling with her two young children, tried to get back in her lane she overcorrected. The car overturned and then hit a tree. A witness said the three-year-old was found sitting in the grass nearby "smiling and happy" with no sign of serious injury. A one-year-old riding in the car also escaped harm. The three-year-old was taken to the emergency room at Calhoun-Liberty Hospital to be checked for possible injury and was soon released. The children's mother was not hurt.

Hosford woman charged stealing & selling boyfriend's vehicle to recycling yard

A 28-year-old Hosford woman has been charged with grand theft auto and dealing in stolen property after she allegedly sold a vehicle to a recycling yard in Hosford.

Amanda Smith received \$363 for the 1994 Nissan Pathfinder, which was the property of Renne Durden and her son, Richard Lance Durden, according

to the Liberty County Sheriff's Office investigation.

The arrest report states that Smith sold the sports utility vehicle at Kyle's Recycling on April 26, where she signed a document indicating that she was the owner or authorized seller of the vehicle. Also provided on the copy was her thumb print along with her Florida Driver's

license.

When contacted by a deputy, Richard Durden said he was unaware that Smith, who is his girlfriend, had taken the vehicle and scrapped it. He said he had not given her permission to drive the vehicle.

A warrant was issued for Smith's arrest and she was taken into custody on May 16.

Youngstown man arrested for sexual battery Sunday

Calhoun County Sheriff's deputies responded to a report of sexual battery on May 18 around 3:15 a.m. (CT) that had just occurred at NW County Line Rd. According to a press release from the Calhoun County Sheriff's Office, the victim stated she was staying at a family friend's residence when she was awakened by James Michael Clark, who she referred to as "Uncle Mike."

She said he had just returned from Big Bulls Bar. When she told Clark that she wasn't interested in him, he followed her to a bedroom where he and sexually assaulted her.

Once her attacker passed out, the victim fled to Hwy 231 and County Line Road and called 911.

She was immediately transported to Jackson Hospital by Jackson EMS. The Calhoun County Sheriff's Office CID responded and conducted their investigation. James Michael Clark was located by Sheriff's Deputies at the residence on NW County Line Road and taken into custody without incident.

Clark is a registered sexual offender which stems from a 1996 conviction for lewd and lascivious act on a child under 16 years of age, and a sexual battery conviction in 2002.

He is currently being held at the Calhoun County Jail without bond.

The history of Memorial Day

Though many people are quick to refer to Memorial Day as the unofficial beginning of summer, the day is much more than that. Initially known as Decoration Day, Memorial Day is a day to remember those military members who died in service of the country.

The origins of Memorial Day remain a topic of debate. In 1966, President Lyndon Johnson declared Waterloo, N.Y. as the official birthplace of Memorial Day. However, the roots of Memorial Day likely run much deeper, as researchers at Duke University note that during the Civil War, organized women's groups in the south had begun to decorate the graves of fallen soldiers.

Memorial Day as we know it today can likely be traced to Charleston, S.C., where teachers, missionaries and some members of the press gathered on May 1, 1865 to honor fallen soldiers. During the Civil War, captured Union soldiers were held at the Charleston Race Course and hundreds died during captivity. Upon their deaths, soldiers were buried in unmarked graves. When the Civil War ended, the May Day gathering was organized as a memorial to all the men who had died during captivity. The burial ground was landscaped, and those freed as a result of the Civil War played an integral role in the event at the Charleston Race Course.



While the event in Charleston might have been the first Memorial Day-type celebration in the southern United States, General John A. Logan is often cited as inspiring similar events in the north. As commander-in-chief of the Grand Army of the Republic, a veterans' organization for men who served in the Civil War, General Logan issued a proclamation just five days after the Charleston event that called for Decoration Day to be observed annually across the country. Logan preferred the event not be held on the anniversary of any particular battle, and thus the day was observed for the first time on May 30. Celebrating the day in May also was significant to event organizers because May is a month when flowers are in bloom, making it easier for observers of the holiday to place flowers on the graves of fallen soldiers.

In 1868, events were held at more than 180 cemeteries in 27 states, and those figures nearly doubled in 1869. By 1890, every northern state officially recognized Decoration Day as a state holiday. But southern states honored their dead on a different day until after World War I, when the holiday was changed to recognize Americans who died in any war and not just the Civil War. Nearly every state now celebrates Memorial Day, a name for the holiday first used in 1882, on the last Monday in May.

Wildflower alert

YELLOW COLICROOT

In May when you drive through the national forest on SR 65 or CR 379 you cannot fail to see pretty tall thin spikes of yellow flowers blooming all along the damp open roadsides. The common name of this flower is Yellow Colicroot (*Aletris lutea*). Native Americans and early immigrants to this country made concoctions of the bitter root of this plant to cure colic - which is where it got its common name. Its botanical name "aletris" is the Greek word for "grind", referring to the grainy look of the flower petals; and "lutea" is the Latin word for yellow, referring to its color.

If you want to get a good look at this plant you can safely pull onto one of the side roads off of the highway. When you are close to it you will notice that it grows on a tall, almost leafless stalk with many small tubular flowers clustered along it. These flowers have small openings so they can be pollinated by butterflies, and the petals are full of little "bumps" that cause the grainy look. You will also see that at the very base of the tall flower stalk there is a circle or rosette of leaves right on the ground. These leaves last throughout the year, and the flower is a perennial, blooming each year. It only grows where the soil continues to be damp and there is plenty of sunshine, which is why it is so abundant along the roadsides.

OGLESBY PLANT SALE

It's probably the only plant sale with a starting line.

Each one is scheduled for only three hours but most of the inventory is whisked away within 90 minutes.

The sales are cash only. Customers know not to hesitate when they spot something they want. If they don't grab it, someone else will. Soon.

An avid group of gardeners and small business owners keep an eye peeled for the tiny black and white "Plant Sale" sign that pops up infrequently in front of Oglesby Plants International in Altha.

The company provides plants to over 400 commercial growers around the world and is known for developing several new varieties each year.

"It's started out as a means of allowing the community to buy some of our plants while recouping some of our research and design costs," explains Mary Oglesby McKenzie. The sales are held five or six times a year.

She said they're not trying to compete with nurseries and gardening

centers, but it's a good way to move out some of their excess inventory from their growing trials.

The sales are held at a site down a road behind the plant labs on Saturdays from 8 a.m. until 11 a.m. Each event draws between 50 and 75 people.

Those who arrive early are deterred by a ribbon across the parking lot, barring them from access to the rows

of plants nearby. While waiting for the clock to hit 8 a.m., customers stand behind the ribbon and scrutinize their choices, deciding which area to go to first.

Each sale has different offerings, which have included ferns, hanging baskets, ornamental grasses, cactus, begonias and peace lilies. McKenzie said they often include plants they don't grow that they have purchased from some of their own customers.

Those who flock to each sale know not to waste a moment. When that ribbon drops to give them the all clear to shop, some run, anxious to grab a treasure for their own homes that many others around the world have to wait for.

The mud campaign has begun Politics has gotten meaner

WASHINGTON — Anyone who thinks it's too early to focus on the 2016 presidential election better think again

because the campaign has begun, kicked off by none other than the GOP's favorite attack dog, Karl Rove. In remarks that have been well publicized, he says Hillary Clinton suffered a traumatic brain injury in a fall at home after the 2012 election, and that the voters have a right to know more about her health before she runs for president.

Asked about the assessment of "Dr. Rove," former President Clinton said at an economic forum in Washington that his wife works out every week, is strong, and "seems to have more stamina now." He poked fun at Rove and the Republicans for initially saying Hillary faked her fall to avoid testifying about Benghazi. "Now they're saying she's auditioning for a part on 'The Walking Dead,'" he said. "It's just the beginning," he added.

The Republicans are just warming up; they'll get better at it, Clinton said, seeming to signal he and Hillary are gearing up for what will likely be a nasty campaign, and not to worry, the First Couple knows how to handle the rough and tumble of campaigning and governing. And they know there will be legitimate issues to address.

The opposition party is teeing up the scandals, one by one, as if on a conveyor belt, testing to see what sticks with the conservative base, and what might have broader appeal beyond the base. So far, everything they've come up with excites the Tea Party, but pretty much leaves the rest of the electorate cold.

The House committee investigating Benghazi will have to uncover some new information for their work to be taken seriously. But short of the proverbial smoking gun that leads directly to the Secretary of State for some real or alleged wrongdoing, it's hard to see anything sticking to Hillary and creating such significant problems that she would decide not to run.

The Clintons have weathered so much together that the reappearance of Monica Lewinsky in a magazine piece

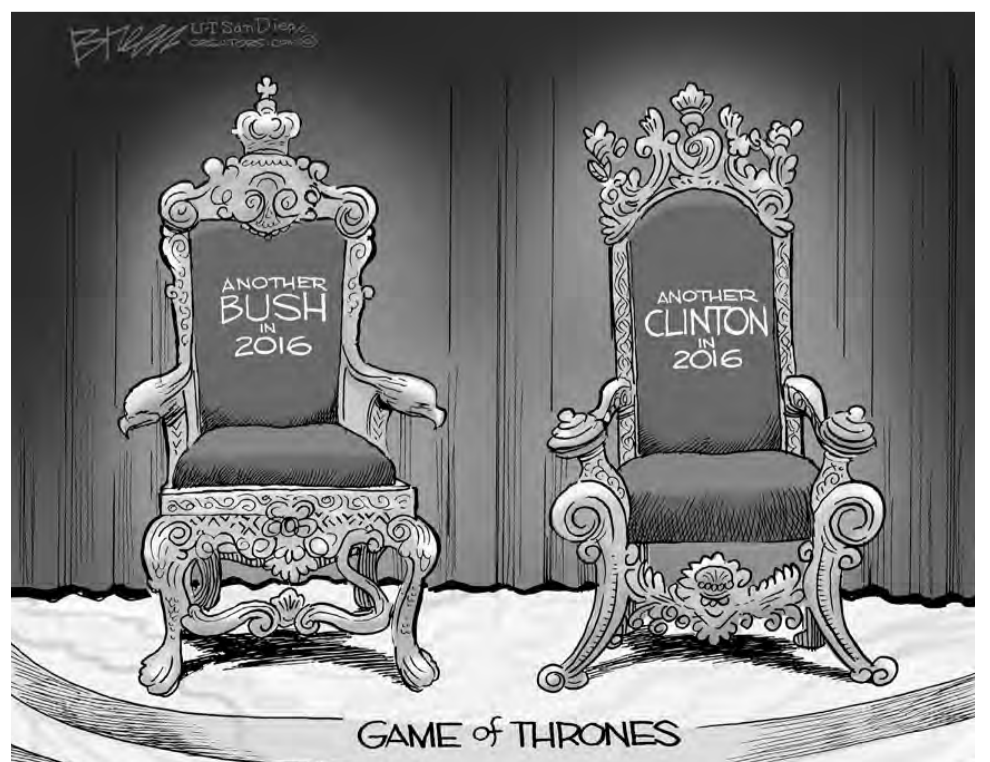
is one more chunk of history they'd like to forget. The country feels the same way, making it unlikely that the tawdry episode will cost Hillary any votes beyond those she already doesn't have.

Examining Clinton's record at the State Department will get underway in earnest next month with the release of her book, "Hard Choices." No matter what she says about Benghazi, her critics will not be satisfied. That's a given. Still, her upcoming book tour should help put to rest criticism about whether she has the stamina for a campaign.

If Clinton wins the presidency in 2016, she would be the second oldest person to assume the office, the first being Ronald Reagan. He was 69 when elected, older only by a matter of months than Hillary would be. Running for reelection in 1984, Reagan deftly defused the age issue by saying, "I won't make age an issue of this campaign. I am not going to exploit, for political purposes, my opponent's youth and inexperience."

Standing across from Reagan on the debate stage, Vice President Walter Mondale laughed as heartily as the rest of the country, and the die was cast for Reagan's landslide victory.

Politics has gotten meaner and more partisan since then, but openly questioning Hillary's fitness for office based on her age and a bad fall she suffered has Rove on the defensive over his tactics. Among those chiding him is former Speaker of the House Newt Gingrich who declared himself "deeply offended" by the personal attack. "I was angry when people did this to Reagan in 1980, and I am angry when they do it to her today," Gingrich wrote on his Facebook page. In Congress, Gingrich pioneered the art of personal attacks, so it's nice to know there's still a line or two he'd rather not cross.

This season was set at the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) meeting in April. Opening the season the Saturday before Memorial Day will provide recreational red snapper fishing opportunities through an important holiday weekend, helping attract more visitors and bringing economic benefits to our coastal communities.

The federal season will be 9 days, starting June 1 and remain-

ing open through June 9, closing June 10.

Florida state waters in the Gulf are from shore to 9 nautical miles. Federal waters extend from where state waters end, out to about 200 nautical miles.

The daily bag limit for red snapper will remain 2 per person in Gulf state and federal waters. The minimum size limit is 16 inches total length. There is a zero daily bag and possession limit for captain and crew of for-hire vessels.

Recreational anglers targeting reef fish such as red snapper in Gulf state and federal waters are required to use dehooking devices and non-offset, non-stainless steel circle hooks when fishing with natural bait. These devices are designed to help increase the likelihood a fish will survive if it is released. Venting tools are no longer required when targeting reef fish. This requirement was removed to allow fishermen the freedom to use the methods or tools of their choosing when releasing reef fish.

Ex-superintendent's son seeks spot on Liberty County School Board

Five running for Liberty School Superintendent's job

Five candidates are vying for the office of Liberty County School Superintendent in a special election for the two-year term following Monday's deadline to qualify by petition.

Anyone else who wants to run can do so during by paying the \$5,380.68 fee during qualifying week June 16- 20, deadline is at noon.

Five filed their intent to run after the only declared candidate - incumbent Tony Anderson - withdrew from the election May 8.

Kathy Nobles and Greg "Coach" Solomon both filed their intent to run on May 13.

The next day, three more candidates came forward: Jill Davis, David Summers and Rob Wheatley.

Nobles and Summers were initially were running as Democrats but Nobles changed her status on May 16 and is now running with no party affiliation.

The remaining three candidates are also running without party affiliation.

Unless a candidate comes forward, pays the fee during qualifying week and runs as a Democrat, the race will skip the Aug. 26 primary and will be on the ballot for the Nov. 4 general election.

LIBERTY COUNTY COMMISSION

In the District 2 commission race, Paula Parrish is challenging incumbent Dexter Barber. She is running without party affiliation; he is running as a Democrat.

Incumbent Davis Stoutamire has two opponents so far for his District 4 seat: James "Bo" Sanders and Jason Singletary. Since Stoutamire and Sanders are both running as Democrats, they will face off in the primary. The winner of that race will go up against Singletary, who is running without party affiliation, in the general election.

LIBERTY COUNTY SCHOOL BOARD

Lucas Uzzell, 20-year-old son of former Liberty County School Superintendent Gloria "Gay" Uzzell, wants a seat on the school board and is running for the District 3 spot currently held by Darrel "Doobie" Hayes, who is seeking re-election. Retired prison warden Ed Mercer was the first to file in that race, declaring his intent to run for school board on May 10.

Incumbent Kyle Peddie is facing Adam "Buck" Alford in the race for the District 4 school board seat.

Pat Summerlin filed her intent to run for the District 5 school board office on May 15. Roger Reddick, the incumbent in the District 5 school board race, is seeking re-election.

School board races are non-partisan. The winner must have 50% of the vote plus one, otherwise, the two highest vote-getters will runoff in the general election.

Candidates who missed the deadline to file by petition can still get in the race during June's one-week qualifying period. County commission candidates will have to pay a \$1,413.48 qualifying fee; school board candidates will have to pay \$932.80. \$1,413.48 qualifying fee; school board candidates will have to pay \$932.80.

As of Monday's deadline to seek election by petition, this year's Calhoun County election has 10 candidates who hope the voters will support their bid for office.

CALHOUN COUNTY COMMISSION

In the District 2 County Commission race, incumbent Darrell McDougald has three challengers: Earl Hunt, Clifford Edenfield and Willie D. Wise. All are

running with no party affiliation except Wise, who is running as Democrat.

Four candidates are vying to oust Democrat incumbent Willie T. Grant from his District 4 County Commission seat. The list includes Carrier Baker, Alvin Battle, and two fellow Democrats, Clifford Jackson and Dennis Jones.

CALHOUN COUNTY SCHOOL BOARD

Incumbent Kelly King will run against Julian J. Shiver for the District 2 School Board seat. Kevin O'Bryan had qualified for the race but later withdrew his candidacy.

Robert Pickron will challenge District 3 School Board incumbent Tim Smith for his job.

District 5 School Board incumbent Danny Hassig is unopposed.

Should a candidate decide to run during qualifying week in June, they will be required to pay the following fees:

- County Commission (by party) \$1,617

- School board \$1006.96

Two new citrus cultivars among 13 approved for release

GAINESVILLE – Two new citrus cultivars with high industry interest are among 13 recently approved for release by the University of Florida's Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences.

The UF/IFAS Cultivar Release Committee voted April 15 to release UF 711 and RBB 7-34, two new citrus cultivars. Fred Gmitter, a citrus genetics and breeding professor at the Citrus Research and Education Center in Lake Alfred, told the panel growers are excited to field-trial the two cultivars.

UF 711 is an easy-to-peel mandarin, while RBB 7-34 is a new navel orange-like variety with much more color and flavor than ordinary Florida navels, Gmitter said. Both varieties were deemed to be good-tasting, as well.

UF 711 and RBB 7-34 will be released under the UF/IFAS Citrus Fast Track Release Option, which means they will be made available to growers and, thus, the market, 10-15 years faster than the 15 to 20 years typically required to breed and release such cultivars.

The panel also approved for release five sweet sorghum cultivars. Sorghum has traditionally been used to produce syrup, sugar and molasses but can be used to produce renewable chemicals and biofuels. The new cultivars are F4-45-3-1, F4-28-4-1, F4-20-2-1, F4-15-2-1 and F4-1-2-1.

Two renewable fuel companies — Fort Lauderdale-based Southeast Renewable Fuels and Riverview-based Highlands EnviroFuels — have expressed inter-

est in the cultivars, said Wilfred Vermerris, a UF/IFAS associate professor in microbiology and cell science.

Southeast Renewable Fuels is building a biorefinery that will use sweet sorghum as a feedstock for fuel ethanol. Highlands EnviroFuels plans to build a biorefinery near Lake Placid, Florida.

"As the first expected commercial-scale sweet sorghum-to-ethanol plant in the U.S., Southeast Renewable Fuels is excited to be working with the University of Florida," said company CEO Aaron Pepper. "We are awaiting the results of our field trials and are looking forward to including UF's sweet sorghum cultivars in our planting cycle."

The sorghum cultivars were

developed partly as a result of a \$5.4 million United States Department of Agriculture grant awarded in 2011 to UF/IFAS to develop sweet sorghum for energy fuels and chemicals.

Scientists at the North Florida Research and Education Center in Marianna received approval on two new cultivars.

A peanut cultivar, 297, has shown superior yield to current peanut cultivars and good resistance to tomato spotted wilt virus and white mold disease. Seed from 297 will be marketed under the TUFRunner™ brand.

A new awnless triticale, FL01143, also was approved. Triticale, relatively new as a Florida forage, came from crossing wheat and cereal rye. It has

wheat's quality and rye's disease resistance. Florida's dairy and beef industries have used triticale for winter grazing for cattle and for silage and have seen excellent results, said Ann Blount, professor of forage breeding and genetics at NFREC.

Two limpograsses, 4F Hybrid and 10 Hybrid, were also approved. These warm-season cultivars serve as forage primarily for the beef industry.

Limpograsses have been increasingly adopted by ranchers for their digestibility, adaptation to seasonal floods and light-frost tolerance. These new hybrids were selected for improved persistence under grazing and maintenance of nutritive value when used as stockpiled forage.

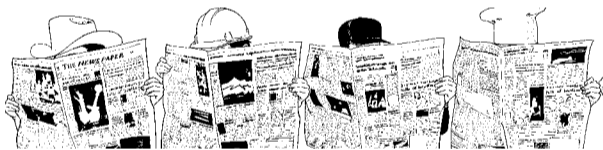
