SBN Commercial law, mercantile law, economics law

- * In common law systems, commercial law is an indeterminate term covering topics from civil law particularly relevant to business and commerce in the widest sense and often including industrial law. It draws heavily on contract and property law. When a particular transaction or other legal relationship is considered (e.g. bankruptcy) its primary connotation relates to business associations, but includes also individuals.
- * In civil law systems it is usual to treat commercial law as a branch of law distinct from civil law and some concepts (e.g. merchant, commercial transaction) have a particular significance outside civil law.
- * The following schedule follows that in T/TP Economics and TQ/TY Management of economic enterprises, amplified by concepts prominent in the law of some classes, such as company law (SBO Q) and transport law (SBP).
- * For commercial law in the narrow sense of business law (i.e. relating to the administration and management of businesses & their various types) see SBN Q.
- * Add to SBN letters A/Y following T in TA/TY.
- * Compounding of economic and management concepts within classes SBN A/Y follows the normal retroactive rules in class T. These do not allow at the same time the retroactive synthesis of class S (i.e. adding directly letters A/Y from Auxiliary Schedule S1). So number 9 from Auxiliary Schedule S1 has been modified, as indicated below, to accommodate all the legal concepts needed to qualify the economic and commercial classes which follow.
- * Any class in SBN and SBO may, unless otherwise noted, be retroactively qualified as follows (where the hyphen represents the classmark added to):

 - * The history of law in general goes at S4. Locate here only those works which deal with the history of national legal systems per se. If in doubt, prefer S4.
 - . Ethnolaw, ethnological jurisdictions, non-literate societies law, tribal law, pre-literate societies law, primitive law
 - * This class takes the literature on ethnological jurisdictions as they operated (and perhaps still operate) independently of the context of a modern national jurisdiction (under which virtually all such ethnological groups now live).
 - * Class here also works on the law of an ethnological group which is distributed over several different modern national jurisdictions.
 - * Works on the present operation of these ethnological jurisdictions within a particular modern nation state should go with the latter. The class -XQ (under the constitutional law of the state concerned) should be used to locate them (see Auxiliary Schedule S1)

- * All the law relating to a church or other religious institution, whether derived from state law, divine law, natural law or the rules of any given society.
- The literature is concerned almost entirely with the ecclesiastical law relating to particular religions; this class is for completely general works only.
- For ecclesiastical law as part of the constitutional law of a national jurisdiction (especially when it features an established church) see SCY B.

. . Primary materials

- This concept applies only to particular religions.
- Each religion or sect may be qualified by 22/28 in Auxiliary Schedule S2; e.g. Collections of Jewish law primary materials SWW 27.
- Under each religious jurisdiction, the divisions 2A/2X in Auxiliary Schedule S2 are replaced by a substantially modified version of them, or by a completely new set.
- Each of these divisions 2A/2X may be qualified by 2/8 following 2 in Auxiliary Schedule S2; e.g. Index to the Talmud SWW 2L44.
