FROM THE RABBI

The Joys of Daylight Savings Time

I remember vividly my first arrival in Toledo in the spring of 1994. Rabbi Garsek greeted me at the airport with: "Welcome to Toledo, where daylight savings time helps nobody." Over the past twenty-one years I have definitely learned the truth of that statement.

Judaism is a religion whose practices are often related to time. This is particularly true regarding Shabbat and holidays, which begin and end when the sun goes down. Toledo, being located where it is relative to the time zone boundaries, makes sunset here later than most other places. That coupled with expansion of daylight savings time causes many issues.

Early in my life daylight savings time began at the end of April. Passover was always on standard time, at least the beginning including both seders. In 1987 DST was expanded to begin the first week in April. That meant that most years' seders would now be during DST. It is amazing what a difference one hour makes in the timing of a seder. In 2007, DST was expanded again, beginning the second Sunday in March. Now not only was Passover impacted, but Purim became much later as well.

I know the times for Purim don't look very appealing this year, especially for our children going to school in the morning. I offer apologies, but unfortunately the timing is out of my control. I hope to be able to see you for our Purim celebrations this year. May this celebration bring us closer to redemption.

CONGREGATION ETZ CHAYIM CEMETERY BURIAL POLICY EFFECTIVE AUGUST, 2015

The Congregation Etz Chayim cemeteries are Eagle Point Cemetery in Rossford, Ohio and Beth Shalom Cemetery in Oregon, Ohio. Operation of the cemeteries are governed by the rules and regulations of the Toledo Jewish Cemetery Association (TJCA) and its successor(s).

The Rabbi of Congregation Etz Chayim shall have the final decision on all issues of Halacha and ritual.

Congregation Etz Chayim provides the following burial rights to members in good standing, including their minor children:

- 1. The deceased must have been an Etz Chayim member in good standing for at least the 5 years prior to death. If the deceased has not been a member for 5 years, then they must pay dues for the years they were not a member, up to the total of 5 years' dues.
- 2. The deceased must be Jewish through matrilineal lines or orthodox conversion. Non-Jewish spouses are not permitted to be buried in an Etz Chayim cemetery.
- 3. No cremations are permitted.
- 4. The casket must be a proper kosher all wood casket (to be paid to the funeral home).
- 5. Tahara, the ritual preparation of the deceased, is required to be performed by the Cheverah Kadisha. A shroud and a tallis (for men) are required. No jewelry or adornments are permitted.
- 6. Etz Chayim membership includes the choice of grave based on availability. Etz Chayim follows the custom of no unrelated men and women buried next to each other.
- 7. The monument (paid to a monument company) must be in compliance with TJCA rules and regulations. The monument will be permitted to be set after all burial expenses and synagogue fees are paid in full.
- 8. Etz Chayim clergy will be available upon request to meet with family, conduct funeral and burial services, and conduct home minyans during shiva. Any substitute clergy must be approved in advance by Etz Chayim clergy.
- 9. Funeral services may be held at a funeral home (cost to be paid to funeral home), graveside, or at the chapel at Beth Shalom Cemetery.
- 10. Current burial fees are \$1500 for interment, \$750 for perpetual care (plus \$750 prepaid perpetual care if a double monument is chosen), \$200 for the shroud, \$50 for a tallis (or men can provide their own) and \$600 for a Memorial Plaque at Congregation Etz Chayim (optional).
- 11. Prepayment plans for interment and perpetual care are permitted. Prepayment of fees must be completed within 12 months of the first payment. If prepayment is not completed by then, all payments made through that date will be refunded.
- 12. Non-members of Etz Chayim may reserve plots in Beth Shalom Cemetery or Eagle Point Cemetery for a one-time nonrefundable fee equivalent to a one year full single or family membership in effect at the time of the reservation. This fee will not count towards the 5 years of membership required for burial.
