


seven high-heel shoes caught in the grating. I thought it must have been a sacrifice towards the success of the evening. This was definitely going to be rough.




The Final Boundary







Academics Is A Class Act






For the 87-88 school year, all English teachers proposed a new program which was called the integrated English program. Each quarter, to receive an "A", the students had to work extra hard. For a "C", all class work had to be done and in on time, and your class percentile had to be up to a "C" standard. But for the "A" and "B" grades, the projects varied from class to class. To obtain a "B" in Mrs. Bloom's English IV classes, students had to have a "B" percentile and also read two books and do book reviews on them. For an "A" in Mr. Landis' English III classes, students had to do the B project, a journal on a book, maintain an "A" level on daily work and do a Writer's Notebook.






JUNIORS EXCEL


FRESHMAN POWER





These types of things made the difference, for he cared about every aspect of student life and those of his friends. The example of pride and dedication was always radiated. Someone said, "To be a teacher was not a job, but had to be a way of life." Clarke personified this to all of us. Kayhi was his home, and you, the students, were his kids. He began teaching at Kayhi in 1965, when he came from lowa where he excelled in football and baseball at Iowa State Teachers College. At Kayhi, he taught physical science, and his room was the focal point for all activities. He became, over the years, synonymous with Kayhi.

In 1983, Clarke died playing basketball in the gym. The "Christmas Classic" and the gym are named in his honor. It is hoped that the principles and ideals that Clarke lived by will be emulated by those athletic and extra-curricular activities taking place here. "The people who influence us the most are the people who believe in us the most." This ² is Clarke's legacy for us all.
