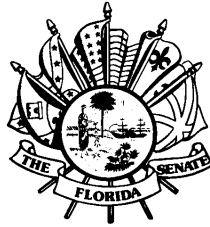

### **CS/SB 1184 by the Committee on Education, Senator Latvala and others**

**Charter Schools Capital Outlay TF**; creates said trust fund & provides for administration by DOE; provides for sources of moneys & purposes; provides for annual carryover of moneys; provides for future review & termination or re-creation of trust fund; takes effect if enacted by 3/5ths vote of membership of each house of Legislature & if SB 1182 or similar legislation providing guidelines for distribution of moneys from fund is enacted in same legislative session or extension thereof. Effective Date: Contingent.

**Deferred Retirement Options/FRS**; revises criteria, limitations, & restrictions for eligibility, participation, & benefits payable under Deferred Retirement Option Program; provides conditions for payment of annual leave; amends provision re provisions for purchase of retirement credit for in-state-service in accredited nonpublic schools & colleges. Amends 121.091, 1122. Effective Date: Contingent.

**Vehicles Used By State Agencies**; requires report from agency heads on employee use of state motor vehicles; revises purchasing requirements for state motor vehicles used by state attorneys & public defenders; amends provision re powers of Motor Pool Division of DMS to remove power to require transfer of ownership, custody, or control of aircraft & motor vehicles used principally for state fire marshal purposes; provides definitions, etc. Amends 20.055, 287.151, 16, 17. Effective Date: 07/01/1998.

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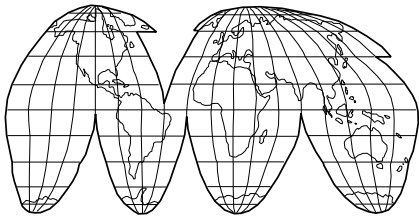

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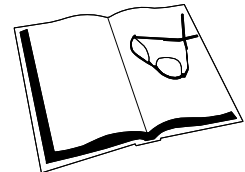
