CS/CS/SB 1492 (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Finance and Taxation and Senator Smith—

Judicial System; modifies county revenue & expenditure reporting requirements; authorizes clerk to dispose of items of physical evidence in cases where no collateral attack is pending; establishes Clerk of Court Operations Conference; provides that counties may continue to fund legal aid programs as local requirement with funds approved by board of county commissioners; continues fee imposed on certain payments of alimony & child support, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 05/01/2004 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on April 25, 2003

HB 1051 (3R) by Representative Goodlette and others—

Lieutenant Governor/Vacancy; provides for filling of vacancy in office of Lieutenant Governor. Amends 14.055. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **SB 2318 (SUB)** (Lee) and read the second time on April 25, 2003

HB 739 (3R) by Representative Kottkamp and others—

Governor Succession; revises provisions re succession to office of Governor; reenacts certain provision re succession as Acting Governor, to provide for same amendments to succession in office as provided for succession to office of Governor. Amends 14.055; reenacts 14.056. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **SB 2318 (SUB)** (Lee), read the second time and amended on April 25, 2003

CS/CS/SB's 1852, SB 1628 & SB 2344 (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Education, Senators Diaz de la Portilla, Wilson, Villalobos and others—

Students/Tuition/Resident Status; (THIS BILL COMBINES S1852,1628,2344) classifies specified students as residents for tuition purposes. Amends 1009.21. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Read the second time and amended on April 28, 2003 and futher amended on April 29, 2003

CS/SB 654 (3R) by the Committee on Communication and Public Utilities and Senator Haridopolos—

Telecommunications Companies; provides legislative finding that provision of unregulated voice-over-internet protocol is in public interest; changes term "alternative local exchange telecommunications company" to "competitive local exchange telecommunications company"; provides procedures for staying election of local exchange telecommunications companies to be subject to alternative regulations, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2003

HB 1593 (3R) by the Committee on State Administration and others—

Foster Parents; expands exemption to include foster parent applicants & medical records of licensed foster parents & foster parent applicants; narrows exemption to remove information contained in neighbor references; makes exempt name, address, & telephone number of persons providing character or neighbor references; provides for expiration & retroactive application of exemptions, etc. Amends 409.175. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **CS/SB 1444 (SUB)** (Lynn) and read the second time on April 29, 2003

CS/CS/SB 1072 (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Criminal Justice, Senator Crist and others—

Identity Theft/Internet Fraud; expands definition of personal identification information; revises elements of offense of criminal use of personal ID info. in which such use results in unlawful benefit, injury, or fraud; clarifies that Florida judges with jurisdiction over specific crimes have authority to issue search warrants for electronic evidence relating thereto, regardless of where electronic evidence is situated, etc. Amends 817.568, 934.23. 921.0022: creates 92.605. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2003

CS/CS/SB 1556 (3R) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Children and Families and Senator Lynn—

Independent Living Transition Svcs.; abolishes Independent Living Services Transition Workgroup; deletes report required by said workgroup; establishes Independent Living Services Workgroup; provides for activities of Independent Living Services Workgroup; provides that property acquired on behalf of client receiving independent living transition services is property of client; provides that rules are to balance normalcy & safety for youth, etc. Amends 409.1451. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 29, 2003

CS/CS/SB 1580 (3R) by the Committees on Criminal Justice, Banking and Insurance, Senator Aronberg and others—

Consumer Protection; prohibits use of deception to obtain certain personal information for commercial solicitation purposes; prohibits sale or disclosure of personal customer information by persons in bankruptcy; provides exception to civil penalty; prohibits falsely representing oneself as being affiliated with law enforcement or firefighting agency or public utility; changes obsolete dates, etc. Creates 501.165,.166,.2076; amends 501.2075,.23,.24. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2003

CS/SB 1754 (3R) by the Committee on Agriculture and Senator Argenziano—

Soil & Water Conservation; increases membership of Soil & Water Conservation Council; specifies qualifications for members; revises provisions re creation & discontinuance of soil & water conservation districts; authorizes Agriculture Commissioner to dissolve or discontinue district. Amends 582.06,.10,.30. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Read the second time on April 29, 2003

CS/CS/SB 2070 (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Transportation and Senator Sebesta—

Public Transit; defines new terms for purposes of Florida Public Transit Act; includes intercity bus service as part of transit responsibilities of DOT; authorizes dept. to receive federal & state funding for intercity bus service; includes intercity bus lines within state's intermodal freight network; provides that intercity bus service is one projects eligible for funding under Intermodal Development Program, etc. Amends 341.031,.041,.051,.053, 339.135. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 29, 2003

SB 1638 (3R) by Senator Lynn and others—

Child Support; redefines term "support order" for purposes of specified provisions, to include order of administrative agency; deletes requirement that child support order include minor's social security number; requires clerk of court to establish account for interstate cases; provides for location of administrative hearing; permits voluntary acknowledgments of paternity which are witnessed, etc. Amends Chs. 61, 120, 382, 409, 742. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2003

CS/CS/SB 2172 (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Criminal Justice and Senator Cowin—

Dangerous Sexual Felony Offender Act; provides short title; defines dangerous sexual felony offender; provides mandatory sentencing for such offenders. Amends 794.0115. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Read the second time on April 29, 2003

CS/SB 1822 (3R) by the Committee on Children and Families and Senator Margolis—

Adult Protective Services; requires CFS Dept. to enter into certain working agreements with local law enforcement agencies; requires OPPAGA to review & report to Legislature; defines term "multidisciplinary adult protection team"; creates Guardianship Task Force within Elderly Affairs Dept.; provides for staff, chairperson, & membership of task force, & for organizations that appoint members to pay their expenses; provides term of service, etc. Amends 415.1045, 1102. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2003

CS/SB 2518 (3R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Webster—

Insurance; revises definitions; conforms provisions to revised definition & to certain governmental reorganization; prohibits affiliated parties from certain activities constituting conflict of interest; specifies certain restrictions governing affiliated party conduct; provides for calculating certain surplus for certain insurers; revises requirements for securities of trust fund for single assuming insurer, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 10/01/2003.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2003

CS/SB 2462 (3R) by the Committee on Agriculture and Senator Garcia—

Agriculture & Consumer Services; redefines term "qualifier" for purposes of Sale of Liquefied Petroleum Gas law re sale of said gas; provides for licensure of category V liquefied petroleum gases dealers for industrial uses only; provides additional prerequisite for certification as master qualifier; revises provisions re applications, renewal applications, registration, & registration fees re motor vehicle repair shops, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2003

CS/SB 2334 (3R) by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning and Senator Lynn—

Municipal Police/Firefighter Pension; authorizes certain municipalities to provide extra benefits to firefighter pension plans prior to receipt of additional premium tax revenues; provides procedure; authorizes certain municipalities to provide extra benefits in police officer pension plans under certain circumstances; provides procedure. Amends 175.351, 185.35. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 29, 2003

CS/SB 2366 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Fasano and others—

Aggravated Child Abuse; defines term "maliciously" for purposes of offense of aggravated child abuse. Amends 827.03. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 29, 2003

HB 1203 (3R) by Representative Zapata and others—

DOC/Personnel; deletes from career service exemption provisions obsolete language re Correctional Education Program; classifies colonels & majors within DOC as Selected Exempt Service employees. Amends 110.205. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Substituted for **CS/SB 2228 (SUB)** (Cowin) and read the second time on April 29, 2003

CS/SB 2122 (3R) by the Committee on Education and Senator Peaden—

University Bldg. & Roads/Designation; designates renovated transplant housing unit at University of Florida's Shands Hospital as "Gerold L. Schiebler/Shands Transplant Housing Complex"; designates proposed entrance pavilion at John & Mabel Ringling Museum of Art at FSU Ringling Center for Cultural Arts in Sarasota as "John M. McKay Visitors' Pavilion"; designates FAMU Graduate School of Business & Industry as Sybil C. Mobley Graduate School of Business & Industry, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2003

HB 533 (3R) by Representative D. Davis and others—

Tourism Promotion Agencies; revises powers of county governing body; authorizes county to prohibit business entities that are not county tourism promotion agencies from using certain specified designations; revises powers & duties of county tourism promotion agencies; authorizes use of certain designations by said agencies. Amends 125.01,.0104. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **CS/SB 724 (SUB)** (Margolis) and read the second time on April 29, 2003

CS/SB 1784 (3R) by the Committee on Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care and Senator Fasano—

Public Records/Health Care Records; exempts from public records requirements information & records reported to Health Dept. under electronic monitoring system for prescription of controlled substances listed in Schedules II-IV; authorizes certain persons & entities access to patient-identifying information; provides guidelines for use of such information & penalties for violations; provides for future legislative review & repeal; provides finding of public necessity. Effective Date: Contingent.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2003

CS/CS/SJR's 1172, SJR 1672 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Ethics and Elections and Senator Cowin—

Constitutional Amendments; (THIS BILL COMBINES S1172,1672) constitutional amendment to prohibit placement of proposed constitutional amendment or revision on ballot if it does not alter, amend, or repeal existing article or amendment to constitution, address fundamental right of citizen of state, or seek to create, implement, or otherwise change basic structure of state government, as determined by Fla. Supreme Court. Amends s. 5, Art. XI.

Read the second time on April 29, 2003

CS/CS/SB 478 (3R) by the Committees on Criminal Justice, Comprehensive Planning, Senator Posey and others—

Law Enforcement Fair Defense Act; redefines term "law enforcement officer" for purposes of payment of costs & attorney's fees in certain actions commenced against said officer; revises circumstances under which employing agency of law enforcement officer has option of paying legal costs & attorney's fees in action arising out of officer's official duties; provides for jurisdiction re legal costs & attorney's fees, etc. Amends 111.065. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 29, 2003

HB 747 (3R) by Representative Kallinger and others—

Sexual Battery Time Limitations; revises language re time limitations for prosecution of crime of sexual battery. Amends 775.15. Effective Date: 10/01/2003.

Substituted for **CS/SB 1734 (SUB)** (Webster) and read the second time on April 29, 2003

CS/SB 728 (3R) by the Committee on Appropriations, Senator Dockery and others—

Rural Land Protection; provides for distribution of certain excise taxes on documents to Rural Lands Program Trust Fund of Agriculture & Consumer Services Dept.; authorizes issuance of bonds for rural land protection; provides for deposit of proceeds; provides that issuance of such bonds is in best interests of state; provides uses for funds in Conservation & Recreation Lands Program TF, etc. Amends 201.15, 570.207,.70,.71; creates 215.6195. Effective Date: Contingent.

Read the second time on April 29, 2003

SB 730 (3R) by Senator Dockery and others-

Rural Lands Program Trust Fund; creates said trust fund within Agriculture & Consumer Services Dept.; provides for sources of funds & purposes; provides for annual carryforward of funds; provides for future legislative review & termination or re-creation of trust fund. Creates 570.209. Effective Date: Contingent.

Read the second time on April 29, 2003

CS/CS/SB 1300 (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Agriculture and Senator Alexander—

Citrus; amends permitted emissions limits; provides for DEP to develop, by specified deadline, management practices to prevent or minimize certain pollutants that are not specifically named in this section; provides specific contents of rules adopted by department; provides for expiration of program created under this section; provides prerequisites to salary adjustments for certain employees of Citrus Dept, etc. Amends 403.08725. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2003

CS/CS/SB 1776 (3R) by the Committee on Appropriations, the Committee on Finance and Taxation and others—

Streamlined Sales & Use Tax; redefines various terms for purposes of sales & use taxes; deletes provisions re rental or lease of motor vehicles; provides for determination of location of sale or recharge of prepaid calling arrangements; provides that purchaser seeking refund or credit under specified provisions must submit written request for refund or credit; provides for notice of state sales or use tax rate changes, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 01/01/2004.

Read the second time on April 29, 2003

CS/CS/SB 1944 (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Finance and Taxation and Senator Dockery—

Mobile Home Owners; provides for service of process in action for possession of residential premises; provides for license tax surcharge for deposit in Fla. Mobile Home Relocation Trust Fund; provides surcharge under Fla. Mobile Home Act on certain mobile home lots for deposit in Fla. Mobile Home Relocation TF; provides for placement of any size used or new mobile home on mobile home lot under certain circumstances, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2003

CS/CS/SB 2446 (3R) by the Committees on Education, Children and Families and Senator Wasserman Schultz—

Child Care; revises inservice training requirements for child care personnel; requires training in early literacy & language development; provides grounds for injunctive relief against family day care homes or large family child care homes; requires annual training & annual health & safety home inspection self-evaluation by family day care home operators; requires CFS Dept. to adopt rules, etc. Amends 402.305,.312,.313,.3131. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Read the second time on April 29, 2003

CS/CS/SB 1312 (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Natural Resources, Senator Alexander and others—

Phosphate Mining; amends tax on phosphate rock & provides for distribution of proceeds; directs DEP to amend master reclamation plan; creates not-for-profit partnership to assist in phosphate reclamation; provides authority for variance for certain reclamation activities; allows variances for water supply development; provides limited liability for entities assisting in abatement of imminent hazards; requires DEP to conduct study, etc. Amends Chs. 378, 403, 211.3103. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2003

CS/CS/SB 1724 (3R) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Comprehensive Planning and Senator Bennett—

Construction Services/Prompt Payment; cites act as "Local Government Prompt Payment Act"; redefines terms used in certain provisions; revises provisions re timely payment for purchases of construction services; revises deadlines for payment of subcontractors, sub-subcontractors, materialmen, & suppliers on construction contracts for public projects; provides for timely payment for purchases of construction services by public entity, etc. Amends Chs. 218, 255. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2003

CS/SB 2388 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity and Senator Dockery—

Fish & Wildlife Conservation Comm.; authorizes commission to purchase certain promotional items; increases license fee for private game preserves & farms; increases nonresident hunting license fee; increases fees for nonresident turkey permits; increases private hunting preserve license fee & reptile license fee; revises provisions re license requirements for sale & exhibition of wildlife; increases permit fee for personal possession of certain wildlife, etc. Amends Ch. 372. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2003

CS/CS/SB 1168 (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Transportation and Senator Sebesta—

Motor Vehicles; includes airbags & airbag assemblies within definition of term "major component part" for purposes of provisions prohibiting operation of chop shop & authorizes seizure & forfeiture of parts & vehicles; provides common wheelchair is not motor vechicle; amends provision re expedited issuance of duplicate certificates of title of off-highway vehicles; provides for display of license plate on wreckers, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 10/01/2003 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2003

CS/CS/SB 1434 (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Senator Garcia and others—

Public Libraries; authorizes municipalities to receive operating grants; permits eligible political subdivisions to receive warrants; revises provisions re confidentiality of public library registration & circulation records to authorize disclosure of information to parent or guardian of library patron under age 16, for purpose of collecting fines or recovering overdue books or other materials, etc. Amends 257.17,.191,.22,.23,.261; repeals 257.19. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Read the second time on April 29, 2003

CS/CS/SB 1782 (3R) by the Committees on Finance and Taxation, Judiciary and Senator Saunders—

Guardianship; redefines term "professional guardian"; revises procedures for registration of professional & public guardians; provides for Elderly Affairs Dept. to contract with not-for-profit entity; provides for voluntary registration as public guardian of state college or university or independent college or university; allows court to require nonprofessional guardians to undergo credit checks & background screening, etc. Amends Ch. 744. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2003

CS/SB 1842 (3R) by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning and Senator Diaz de la Portilla—

Municipal Parking Facility Surcharge; authorizes certain municipalities to impose & collect surcharge on certain parking facility space sale, lease, or rental charges; requires referendum approval; provides for maximum surcharge rate; provides exception; provides limitation; specifies uses & limits of surcharge proceeds; provides for local administration of surcharge. Creates 166.271. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2003

HB 1579 (3R) by Representative Roberson and others—

Autopsy Records; provides for certain survivors of deceased persons to designate agents to view or obtain autopsy records from medical examiners. Amends 406.135. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Substituted for **SB 1052 (SUB)** (Smith) and read the second time on April 29, 2003

HB 691 (3R) by Representative Hasner—

Economic Dev. Incentive Program; includes certain financial services facilities as qualified project for purposes of capital investment tax credit; revises definition of target industry business to include defense & homeland security businesses; deletes function of Governor's Executive Office re project approval recommendations & release of certain funds, etc. Amends 220.191, 288.1045,.106,.1088. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 2410 (SUB)** (Garcia), read the second time and amended on April 29, 2003

CS/CS/SB 1756 (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Commerce, Economic Opportunities, and Consumer Services and Senator Saunders—

Entertainment Industry; expands applicability of definition of term "entertainment industry"; creates program under which certain persons producing, or providing services for production of, filmed entertainment are eligible for state financial incentives for activities in or relocated to this state; prescribes powers & duties of Tourism, Trade, & Economic Development Office & Film & Entertainment Office re program, etc. Amends 288.125; creates 288.1254. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Read the second time on April 29, 2003

CS/SB 1758 (3R) by the Committee on Commerce, Economic Opportunities, and Consumer Services and Senator Saunders—

Entertainment Industry Incentive TF; creates Entertainment Industry Financial Incentive Trust Fund; provides for sources of funds & purposes; provides for future review & termination or re-creation of fund. Effective Date: Contingent.

Read the second time on April 29, 2003

CS/SB 1854 (3R) by the Committee on Education and Senator Diaz de la Portilla—

School Personnel/Rules & Regulations; requires certain personnel in alternative school that operates under contract with district school system to file set of fingerprints; requires personnel to be subject to state & federal rules & regulations. Creates 1012.47. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Read the second time on April 29, 2003

CS/CS/SB 554 (3R) by the Committees on Comprehensive Planning, Natural Resources and Senator Constantine—

Interdistrict Transfer & Water Use; redefines term "interdistrict transfer & use"; validates & provides continued effect of agreements between water management districts which were entered into before effective date of act. Amends 373.2295. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2003

CS/SB 2348 (3R) by the Committee on Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care and Senator Pruitt—

Advisory Council for Fit Florida; provides for creation & placement of council; provides for powers & duties, membership & terms thereof; provides for reimbursement for per diem & travel expenses for members of council. Amends 288.1229. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2003

CS/SB 2210 (3R) by the Committee on Children and Families and Senator Lynn—

Substance Abuse Treatment; provides additional legislative findings & purposes re substance abuse treatment; specifies that treatment may be required following adjudication; authorizes court to order specified persons to submit to substance abuse assessment upon showing of good cause in connection with shelter hearing or petition for dependency; authorizes court to extend time for completing case plan during judicial review, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Read the second time on April 29, 2003

HB 1501 (3R) by Representative Baker and others—

Hospice License Plate; creates said license plate; provides for distribution of annual use fees received from sale of such plates. Amends 320.08056, 08058. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Substituted for **SB 1118 (SUB)** (Wasserman Schultz) and read the second time on April 29, 2003

CS/SB 924 (3R) by the Committee on Appropriations and Senator Clary—

Trust Funds/DMS/DOR/DEP; terminates specified trust funds within Management Services Dept., Revenue Dept. and Environmental Protection Dept.; provides for disposition of balances in & revenues of such trust funds; declares finding of Legislature that specified trust funds within Environmental Protection Dept., Management Services Dept., & Revenue Dept. are exempt from termination requirements of certain provision of State Constitution, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Read the second time on April 29, 2003

CS/SB 1248 (3R) by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Senator Wise and others—

Public Swimming Pools; requires such pools to be enclosed by barrier; establishes additional safety requirements; requires inspections; provides administrative penalty for violations; provides for application; authorizes licensure of portable pool used for certain purposes re scuba diving. Creates 514.0305; amends 514.031. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

CS/SB 2358 (2R) by the Committee on Natural Resources and Senator Pruitt—

Lake Okeechobee Phosphorus Control; provides legislative findings & intent; authorizes Agriculture & Consumer Services Dept. to provide financial assistance to certain projects that benefit Lake Okeechobee Watershed Phosphorus Control Program's intent; provides for adoption of rules; requires dept. to submit annual report to Governor & Legislature. Creates 373.45951. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

CS/CS/SB 2416 (2R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Transportation and Senator Sebesta—

Motor Vehicle Records/Pub. Rec.; revises exemption from public records requirements for personal info. contained in motor vehicle record; removes requirement that exemption be conditioned on request for exemption by person who is subject of record; restricts release of social security numbers & medical & disability information; revises conditions for release of information for bulk distribution use, etc. Amends 119.07. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

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
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
