### Rockville-Vernon Board Votes 3-Year Teacher Pay Plan

The Vernon board of education last night approved a three-year package of salary raises for teaching staff which will cost the town an additional \$34,289.

The increase, the result of months of discussions between the board and the teachers' union, will be \$2,000, and in 1967, to \$2,500.

Maximum salaries will rise to \$24,364 from the present level of \$21,100.

The board also approved a reduction in the number of years it will take a teacher to reach the maximum salary level.

Director William Pope reported that a total of 276 pupils registered, and about 30 per cent were from out of town.

A discussion of guidance counseling practices last month led to a report by Pope, who is also director of guidance in the school system.

Pope noted that the board has already approved the hiring of one new guidance teacher.

He also reported that the board has approved the hiring of one full-time girls' counselor and one part-time boys' counselor.

Full Blue Cross and CMS coverage, and Major Medical insurance or its equivalent will be provided to teachers.

Other fringe benefits approved include a 10 per cent increase in the health insurance plan.

The board also approved a plan to hire an additional teacher to handle the increased enrollment.

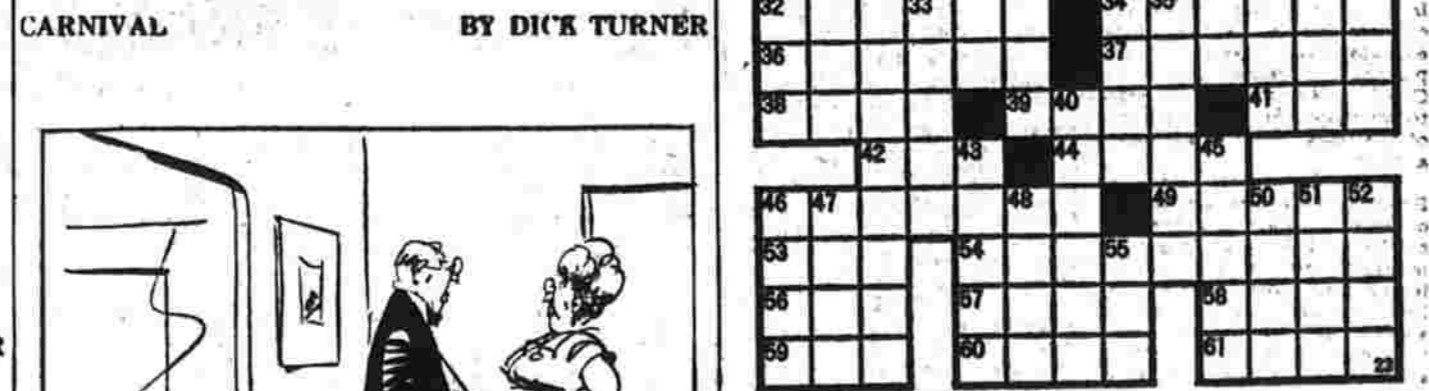
