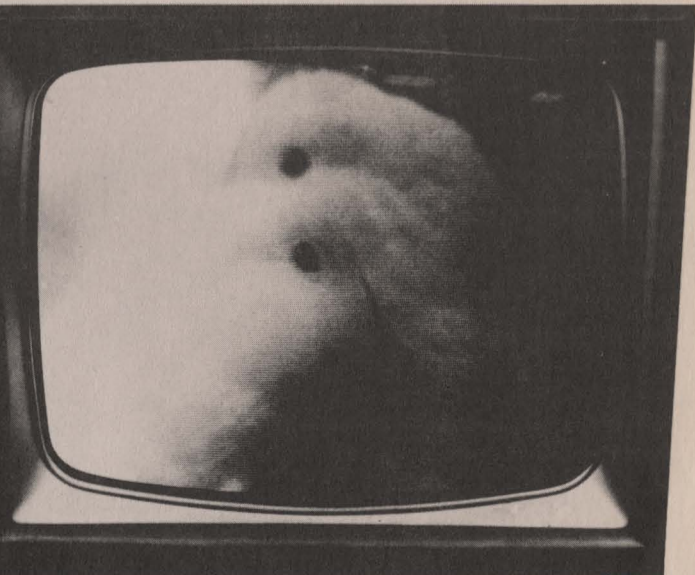
In addition, Mr. Mike Getz of UNDERGROUND CINEMA-12 customarily attends the festival and selects films for presentation at leading theaters throughout the country. Last year 8 different program of films were screened at 20 theaters. Participating film makers shared nearly \$12,000.00 in fees. A similar arrangement is anticipated this year.
