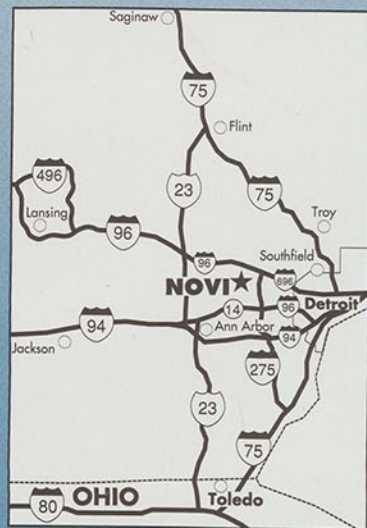

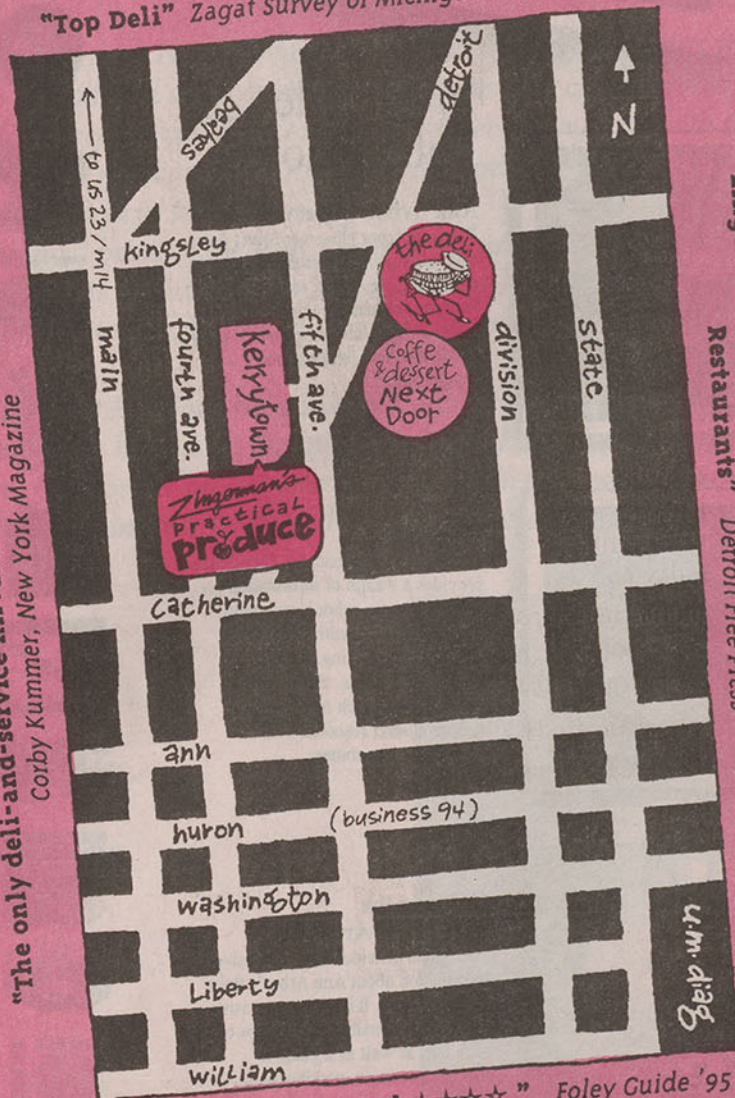

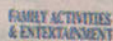

# Inspirations

## Watercolorist **Scott Hartley**

Exploring urban back streets

**M**uch to his wife's chagrin, Scott Hartley spends countless hours wandering the alleys of inner-city Detroit with his 35 mm camera. It's the first step in a process that transforms rickety fire escapes, rusty Dumpsters, peeling paint, storm drains, mud puddles, and trash-pickers into watercolors of charm, balance, and—for lack of a better word—beauty.

Once he takes a photograph he likes,

what he calls the "squint test": he lays his best sketches on the floor, then squints to discern the best composition.

"What I'm looking for is contrast and tension," he explains. "My work is about shapes and how they relate to each other inside the rectangle of the [picture] frame. They either have a dialogue that works, or they fight. I'm trying to get them not to fight."

When Hartley finally picks up a paint-

Hartley may create twenty or more preliminary pencil sketches. Then he performs

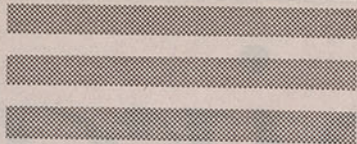
brush, the only color he uses at first is black. "A lot of people think the art of painting is about color," he says. "But color is really the final dressing. Color is very important, but you have to lay the groundwork first."

He may paint two or three preliminary studies using different color schemes. Although these sometimes end up for sale, the public will never see most of them. The process normally culminates in a single watercolor that transforms the homely details of the city's underside into a compelling conversation about light and shadow.

Hartley didn't grow up a big-city kid. An unassuming hands-in-the-pockets type, he was raised in an upstate New York

farming community with a population of about a hundred people. He came to his career as a painter while a grad student at the University of Michigan. He was a trombonist in the music school's Ph.D. performance program when he stopped by the Ann Arbor Art Fairs in 1978 and got hooked.

"It's always been painting and music for me since kindergarten," explains Hartley. "But when I went to the art fair, I saw that people can actually earn their living at this."

Within a year, Hartley was selling his paintings at fairs around the Midwest while he finished up his music degree. He has managed to maintain his dual careers ever since: he's also a professional trombonist in the Ann Arbor Symphony and other area symphonies.

His first paintings were of a farm in Ann Arbor Township, created on the front porch of the farmhouse he and his new wife rented. But around 1980, he says, he got tired of "peaceful rural scenes," so he ventured back into Ann Arbor with his camera to collect some urban compositions. Several of his earliest cityscapes were featured on covers of the *Ann Arbor Observer* during the early 1980s.

You can still find some pastoral landscapes among Hartley's paintings at the fair. But he says he is drawn more and more to the visual intricacies of urban environments.

Lately, his search for the perfect composition has been taking him farther and farther afield. In a recent work, the blue steel grid of a bridge foundation—as elegant as lacework—rises from the ground. He found the scene in Pittsburgh. Filtered through his painstaking process of composition, the painting makes the viewer aware of the astonishingly rich forms, structures, and patterns that are part of our everyday lives.

"I paint something because I like the way it looks," Hartley says simply. "I don't feel affection for these places, and I wouldn't like to spend a lot of time there. But I'm excited by a potential I find there... a vision."

## Collage Artists Susan & Wil Johnson

Paper magicians

Is it a watercolor? Is it an oil painting? Maybe a colored-pencil drawing? When first approaching Susan and Wil Johnson's booth, many fairgoers are mystified by the artists' work.

"We have to put signs up," says Susan, "because people don't know what they're looking at." Those who stop at the Paper Magic booth for a closer look discover that the images are actually incredibly intricate collages created with bits of paper.

Collaging is full-time work for the couple. Eight years ago, Susan turned to working with paper after growing bored with watercolors, her medium for twenty years.

"I decided I should have some fun and started fooling around with magazines—just colors and patterns," she says. "I took a few of my watercolors and put paper on maybe seventy-five percent of the [image] and loved what happened. I turned kind of a boring watercolor into something very exciting." She realized she could eliminate the watercolor altogether by using pencil sketches and covering them completely with paper. "I think I've done one watercolor since then," she says.

Four years ago, Wil happily dumped his corporate job to join Susan as a full-time collage artist. They have run the Paper Magic studio together ever since.

The Massachusetts couple mostly creates still lifes, interiors, and landscapes, some-

times working alone, sometimes collaborating.

When creating an interior, for instance, "Wil might make a chair while I'm creating the room to put it in, with little collages on the walls and a scene out a window," explains Susan.

Each piece begins with a pencil sketch on a heavy illustration board. Then Susan and Wil tackle their most time-consuming task—the search for the right paper. They use heavy glossy papers so that the colors don't run. Not many magazines are heavy enough, but calendars

and hardcover books work well. They get many of their supplies at used-book sales and from friends. "Sometimes people, when they see us at a show, they'll actually go home and get their good magazines and bring them back to us," says Susan.

Once the paper is chosen, the Johnsons start cutting and gluing. Moving from the background to the more detailed areas, they cover the pencil sketch with angular pieces of paper, overlapping a lot. "The nice thing is, it's very forgiving," says Susan. "You can put a piece down and if you don't like it, you can cover it up with another one. So in some places there might be two layers of paper, and in some places there might be six or seven." She uses both solid colors and patterned papers in highly imaginative ways—one recent image of a vase of flowers combined striped paper, flower patterns, and images of fish.

Sometimes the imagined scene controls the direction of the piece, and sometimes the paper does. If Susan and Wil dream up a still life that they want to create, they look for papers to fit the image. At other times, they stumble across incredible paper that they want to build a scene around. Either way, Susan says, "it changes as it goes because of the paper that's found. It's never how it's imagined in the beginning."

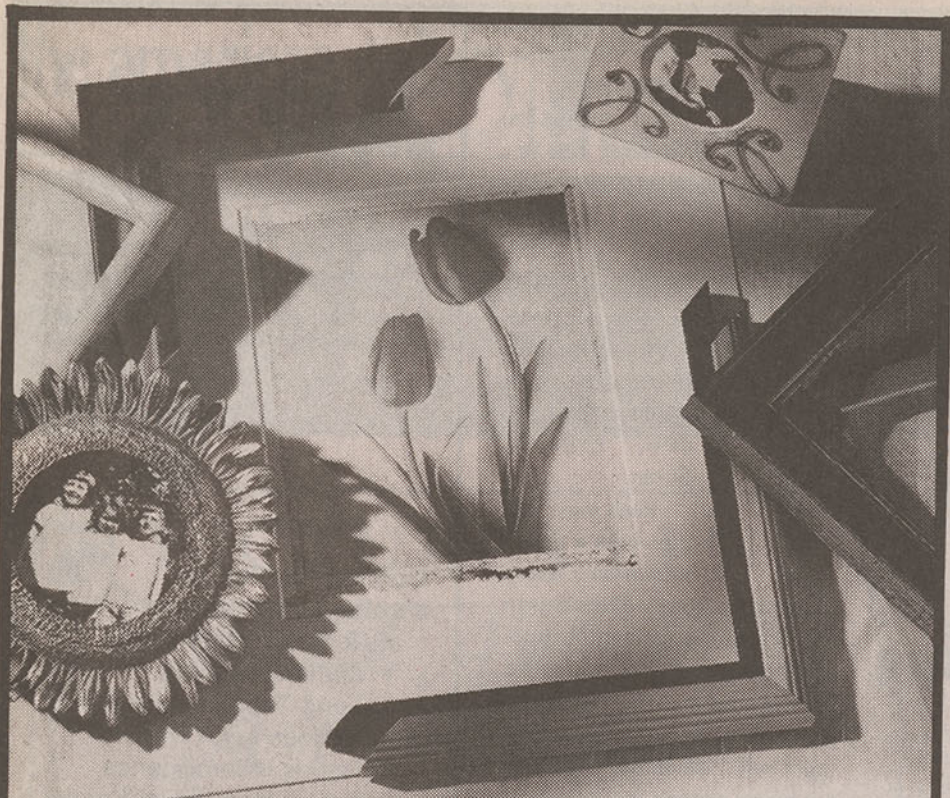

## Toy Maker Don Shurlow

Gee-haws and  
Peckin' Chickens

After mooning over impossibly expensive artworks in other sections of the fairs, it's always refreshing to stop by Don Shurlow's booth on Main Street. For \$3 you can buy a twirling wooden "gee-haw" and endlessly amuse yourself with its clever physics. Four dollars will get you one of Shurlow's handmade "Peckin' Chickens." If you're feeling really spendthrift, you can own one of his most expensive items—a hardwood brain-teasing puzzle—for about \$30.

Even if you don't buy anything, the rollicking booth-side entertainment is free. "I just like to tease and harass people," explains Shurlow. "I don't care if they buy anything or not. I'm here to have fun!"

Shurlow is so goofy by nature that in Midland, Michigan, the city nearest to his rural home, he earns pocket money as a clown and juggler. "He's a perpetual child!" his wife, Dawn, exclaims with a laugh. "A lot of times he forgets that we're there [at the fair] to sell toys."

Unlike many artists at the Ann Arbor Art Fairs, you won't find Shurlow trying to be "innovative," "contemporary," or "original." Take the gee-haw, for example, which is also known as the "whimmy-diddle." To make it, he carves notches into

a stick and fastens a little wooden propeller to the end. Rub the notches with another stick and the propeller spins. A physicist would call this transforming energy from friction into centrifugal force, but people have been calling it a gee-haw for hundreds of years.

In fact, a lot of Shurlow's designs are more than three thousand years old. "Most of these toys and games date back to ancient Egypt or Persia," explains Dawn, who acts as the research and marketing division of the family business, Toys From Times Past. Even toys that many people associate with Appalachia, like the gee-haw, were brought over from Europe in the childhood memories of immigrants, who then made the toys for their children.

Shurlow's toys look so authentic that he's caught at least one antiques store trying to pass his work off as older than it is. "It had my name on it and everything, but I just chuckled and I didn't say anything," he says. "Heck, they were asking less than I do."

Shurlow taught himself how to whittle, carve, and cajole wood into useful objects. "I was living in my grandfather's old house in Pinconning after he died, and I found his wood-carving tools," he remembers. "He used to carve us grandkids stuff—little animals—and hide them in the forest for us to find. Now I see he was really trying to get rid of us so he could talk to my parents in peace.

"But I would watch him. He would just take out a jackknife and whittle whenever he was talking. He was always making something. When he was done, he would smooth out the edges with a piece of bottle glass."

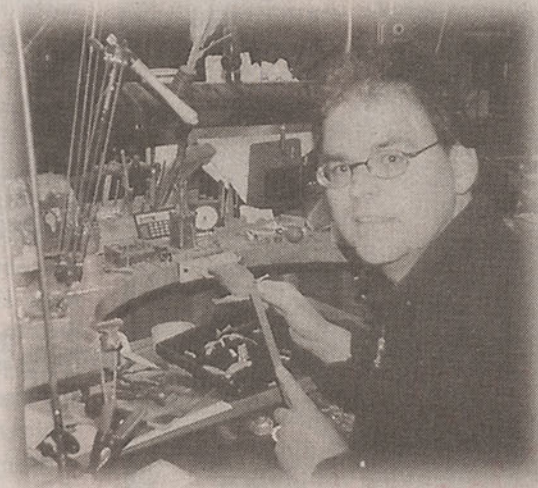
Also a self-taught bluegrass musician, Shurlow began making his own musical instruments during unhappy apprenticeships as a carpenter and a housepainter. He courted Dawn on the harmonica and banjo, and after they were married in 1978, he taught her how to back him up on the guitar and mandolin. They performed in nightspots around Midland for several years, and Don helped found the Midland

Folk Society.

After their two children were born, Shurlow began carving toys to amuse them. Whenever he and Dawn performed, they brought along the kids and a box of hand-carved toys. "People were always wanting to buy these toys, so I started making them to sell," Shurlow recalls.

Within a few years, the business became so successful that Dawn was able to quit her job as an elementary school teacher and start home-schooling. "We always wanted to live a simple, quiet life," she says. "Our parents are always teasing us that we should have been born in another century."

## Jeweler **Tom Herman** Making heirlooms

**A**s a severely nearsighted boy of six or seven, Tom Herman used to put his head so close to the paper when he wrote or drew that all he could see were details. "Probably right there is the birth of my interest in ornament," he says, "which is just looking at the fine details, as opposed to the bigger picture."

Back then, Herman worked with a mechanical pencil. Today, the forty-one-year-old jeweler uses an array of delicate chisels, punches, and saws to work his intricate magic on eighteen-karat gold, platinum, and precious and semiprecious stones. His brooches, earrings, and, above all, wedding rings—which range in price from \$1,600 to \$3,600 apiece—have

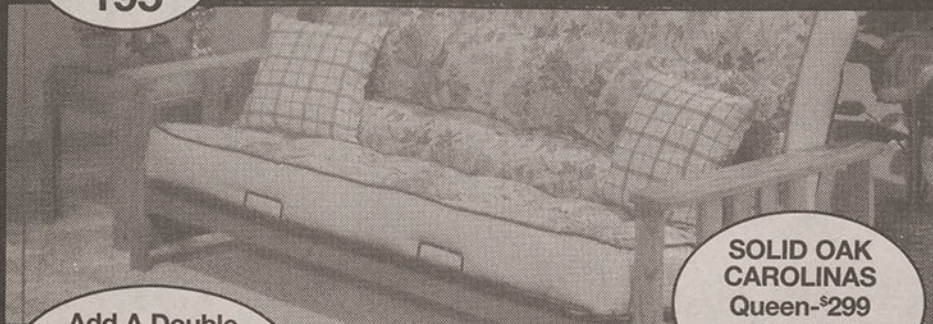

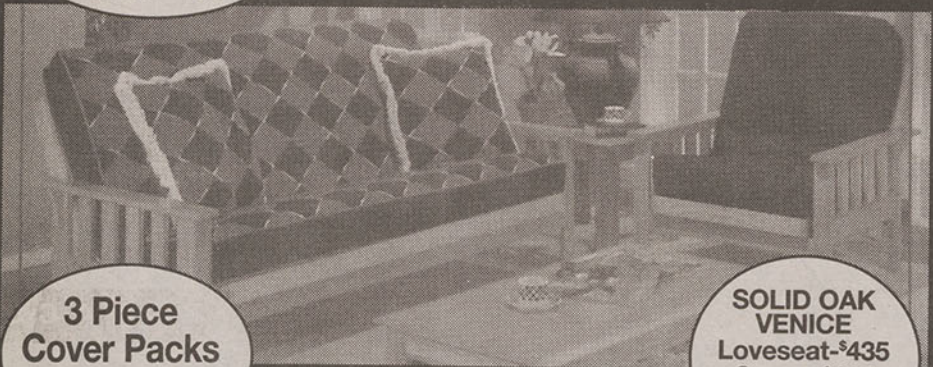

earned him customers throughout the United States.

Herman opened his first jewelry shop in 1978 in Iowa City, shortly after graduating from high school, and "kind of taught myself," he says. He later honed his art during a four-year stint with Van Craeynest, Inc., a high-end jewelry manufacturer in San Francisco, where he learned how to carve and "chase" gold by drilling directly into the metal and then lifting out the background, a process he likens to bas-relief. He's now the owner of Seven Fingers Jewelers in Stone Ridge, New York. (The name of his studio is an allusion to a childhood farming accident that left him with only seven fingers.)

Most of the time Herman uses foliage or architectural patterns to ornament his amazingly detailed designs. While he sells a lot of earrings and brooches, he finds that more and more of his business—about 40 percent—is creating custom wedding rings. He typically brings a dozen sample rings to an art fair and lets customers specify the pattern, weight, color, metal, stone, and size they want. "A wedding ring is a very personal thing," he says.

Many couples take a year or more to choose a design. After much deliberation, one couple opted to have Herman create a pair of rings bearing an oak-leaf pattern to remind them of the red oaks near their home. Another couple sent him a half-inch stack of Xeroxes showing six different plants—from pomegranates to coco leaves—each of which had relevance to the pair. He worked all six into their rings.

It takes Herman between eighteen and thirty-six hours to produce a single ring, and he makes around twenty a year. While he works, he listens to books on tape. "If I'm thinking too much about what I'm doing, I tend to overwork a piece," he explains. "The tapes occupy my mind and let my fingers do what they know best."

Herman considers it an honor to create rings that people intend to wear forever. "It takes a lot of time. But I look at it this way: we're making heirlooms. I've told people, 'Someday your grandchildren will be fighting over this ring.' A lot of my customers come to me and say, 'I want a ring just like my grandmother had.'"

sters," he says. "And actually there are a couple mermaids rescuing a man from an attacking octopus."

No two pieces he creates are alike. "I repeat the animals, but each one has its own personality," he says.

His covered jars are his newest and most challenging project. Inspired by ancient vessels from Greece, Egypt, South America, and other places, they, too, often feature animals. Raasch scratches intricate drawings into the sides using a technique called sgraffito, carving through a layer of glaze to reveal a

different color underneath. "There are different motifs going on around the outside," he explains. "My jars are like continuous universes; you turn the piece and it all joins all the way around."

Raasch worked as a waiter for fourteen years while putting together his own studio. "In 1991 I got a really great waiter job, and I promised myself that was going to be the last one," he recalls. "I worked there about a year and the place went out of business. And before I knew it, I had to hold myself to that promise."

His first year as a professional artist was frightening. He traveled to art shows without any idea of what to do, and he made very little money. But he survived, and business has picked up significantly since then. Raasch did so well at two shows this spring that he had to cancel a third because he didn't have enough work to bring.

"It's difficult to do both galleries and art shows and have enough work for both," he says. "Eventually I'd like to do all galleries, but right now I think I like to stop and see people react to my work."

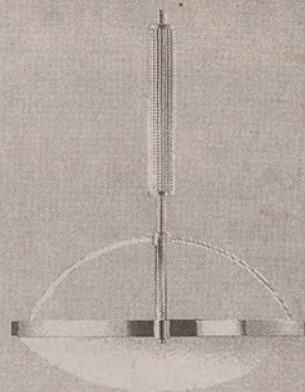
## Ceramist Jef Raasch

### Creatures from clay

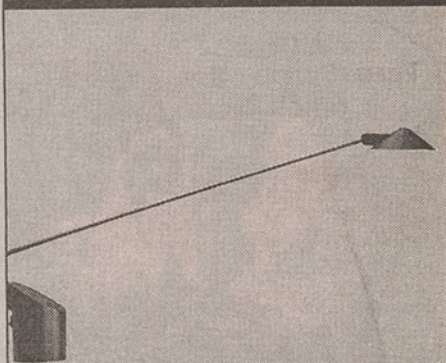
**M**ilwaukee-based ceramist Jef Raasch has loved playing in the mud for as long as he can remember. "People always ask me, 'When did you start doing this?'" he says. "I don't know how to answer that question." As a child, Raasch regularly got in trouble from his mother for coming home looking like Pig Pen. Now he makes a living with clay and can't imagine any job he'd rather have.

Raasch's pieces include teapots, tables, and covered jars, most of which incorporate animal sculptures. His teapots are topped with monkeys, rhinos, box turtles, even woolly mammoths. Tea pours right out of the animal's mouth, and the lid is part of its back (on the turtle teapots, one plate of the turtle's shell lifts off). His tables have glass tops supported by clay sculptures of animals stacked on top of one another. "Right now I have a sea-creatures table with different fish and lob-

## Glass Artist Kathie Farr

Reveling in the joys  
of color

**K**athie Farr is pretty clear about what inspired her to become a stained-glass artist. "I owe it all to a Peeping Tom," she says with biting irony.

In 1975, Farr was a stay-at-home mom with two small daughters and a degree from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. ("I majored in beer and minored in art," she says.) Her big excitement was going next door to her neighbor's house for gossip and coffee. One winter morning, Farr's neighbor announced to the assemblage of mothers that she was having trouble with a Peeping Tom.

"We all went out to her backyard, where we could clearly see the imprint of a man's boots in the snow," Farr remembers. "I followed the set of footprints over to my house, where they stopped at my kitchen window."

Farr was so spooked that she signed up for a stained-glass class the next day, planning to make something to cover her front windows. That eight-week class turned out to be more fruitful for Farr than her four years as an art student. Within a year she was selling her colorful lamp shades and beveled windows at arts and crafts fairs near her home in Webster City, Iowa (population 8,000).

In 1983, Farr moved with her family to Michigan. She's been a member of the Michigan Guild of Artists and Artisans for a dozen years and has participated in the Ann Arbor Summer Art Fair for more than a decade.

Farr says she never felt completely at home in the studied, technically demanding medium of stained glass. So when the more spontaneous, free-form technique of fusing glass became available in the mid-1980s, she jumped at the chance to use it.

With stained glass, the process of composition stops once an artist completes a metal grid to hold the glass: the rest is predictable, tedious labor. But when manufacturers began making "fusing compatible" glass about ten years ago, Farr could indulge her favorite part of the process: reveling in the joys of color. Now she can cut and arrange her glass pieces according to the inspiration of the moment, and she can change her composition right up until the moment she places a piece in a kiln for fusing.

The result could almost be described as an elaborate doodle. In Farr's "Wave and Bubble" series, graceful ribbons of color swim through a background of geometric patterns and groups of bright jewel-like beads of glass.

Unlike functional stained glass, Farr's work is framed and mounted for hanging on a wall. This frees the one bright steel wire Farr usually includes as a kind of signature to meander through the composition at will, taking whimsical twists and turns before disappearing off-frame.

She almost always uses Wasser glass, which is so uniform in color and texture that it could be mistaken for plastic. The unusual thinness of this glass enables her to cut the delicate ribbons of color that animate her compositions. Farr's palette of bold primary colors is not for the timid. "My favorite color is school-bus yellow," she says.

Her compositions are infused with the same sharp, ironic, playful humor that makes her a highly entertaining storyteller. (You should hear the one she tells about the inspiration for her "Wave and Bubble" series—an ill-fated trip to Florida fraught with infinite variations on the experience of motion sickness.) She finds it amusing that many people who buy her highly abstract designs work in high-tech industries—a world that she herself finds totally foreign. Says Farr: "I can barely work the remote on my TV!"

**The 1999 Ann Arbor Street Art Fair**  
will take place July 21 - 24

Since 1960, the original Ann Arbor art fair has evolved into one of the nation's premier fine-arts events, attracting serious collectors and representatives from major art galleries around the country. What started as a few paintings by local artists strung between parking meters on a clothesline has become a showplace for cutting-edge art. This is the smallest and most selective of Ann Arbor's three simultaneous fairs; nearly 2,000 artists from North America and Europe competed for its 193 exhibit spaces this year. (An additional sixteen ceramists from the Ann Arbor Potters Guild and five graduate students from the University of Michigan art school won places through separate jurying processes.)

**The Place:** The Ann Arbor Street Art Fair takes place on South University Avenue from Washtenaw to Tappan, and on East University Avenue between Willard and the University of Michigan campus, with a small section on Church Street.

**Ann Arbor Street Art Fair, Inc.:** This non-profit organization is governed by an eighteen-member board of directors that includes South University merchants and Ann Arbor artists and townspeople. For information about exhibitors or about the 1999 fair, July 21-24, send a stamped, self-addressed envelope to the Ann Arbor Street Art Fair, Box 1352, Ann Arbor, MI 48106, or call (734) 994-5260. (Applications are due during February 1999.)

**Prizes:** On the first day of the fair, Wednesday, July 15, two jurors will select ten exhibits of exceptionally high quality and originality to receive \$300 cash awards. Look for the blue ribbons in the artists' booths on Thursday.

**AAA Michigan Travel Artist Showcases:** Twenty-one artists, including master jeweler Tom Herman (see p. 13), will be demonstrating their craft at their booths. Sponsored by AAA Michigan Travel, these showcases are part of the fairs' ongoing commitment to public art education. See the box on p. 23 or check the list of schedules and locations posted near the information booth on the corner of South University and East University.

**Children's Art Activities:** Young and old can try their hands at artistic expression at the children's art activity booth on Church south of South University. Open from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. each day, the booth is produced by the Michigan Art Education Association and features free art activities designed for the whole family.

**Information Booths:** Can't find your favorite Ann Arbor Street Art Fair artist? Ask the volunteers at one of the fair's two information booths on South University: the familiar one at the corner of East University, and a new one at the corner of Tappan. Posters, T-shirts, and enameled pins are on sale at two **merchandise booths**, one located across the street from the East University information booth, the other on the corner of South University and Church.

**Emergency First Aid:** A Red Cross trailer, located near the corner of South University and

Barbara Bate, Pastels

Tappan, provides emergency first aid, including water and ice packs for heat stress.

**Emergency Radio Team:** Volunteers from the Ann Arbor Emergency Radio Team patrol the fair, helping to find lost children and relaying information to fair organizers on everything from crowd problems to weather. The team's headquarters are located just west of the South University-East University intersection.

**Live Music and Entertainment:** Boogie-woogie pianist Mark "Mr. B" Braun will hold court at his usual spot on the corner of South University and East University, and a variety of acoustic artists will perform on Church Street just north of South University. For details, see Fair Entertainment, p. 55.


**Food and Beverages:** There are numerous food and beverage merchants in the fair area. See Food at the Fair, p. 61.

**T**he Ann Arbor Summer Art Fair is a sprawling, multitudinous paradise for collectors, with more than 540 exhibitors from around North America selling everything from clothing to folk art to furniture. The fair is known for its huge selection of handmade, affordable crafts, and many artists in this fair have earned a loyal following of customers who seek them out every year to add to their collections of everything from baskets to whimmy-diddles.

**The Place:** The Summer Art Fair is the only fair with two separate locations: the campus section (booths C1-C314) is on State Street from South University to William; the downtown section (booths D315-D540) is on Main Street from Huron to William, and on Liberty Street from Ashley to Fifth Avenue.

**Michigan Guild of Artists and Artisans:** This nonprofit organization evolved during the early 1970s to manage a free fair that sprang up along the University of Michigan Diag. Booths are open to Guild members only.

The Guild, which began as a local, grassroots artists organization, now has more than 1,400 members from around the United States and Canada. Its fair booths have become so prized that newer members may spend ten years on the waiting list before being offered a space. As the only Ann Arbor fair controlled by the artists themselves, this fair doesn't jury out exhibitors just to bring in flashier new work—a few artists have returned every year since the fair's founding.

**Creation Station:** Young and old can try their hands at artistic expression at the Creation Station at Post Office Plaza, on East Liberty at Fifth Avenue. Open Wed.-Fri. 10 a.m.-6 p.m., Sat. 10 a.m.-5 p.m., the booth features free art activities designed for the whole family.

**Trio Exhibit:** Original artwork by pop icons John Lennon, Miles Davis, and Jerry Garcia will be on sale inside the Michigan Union Ballroom during fair hours. In addition to drawings, paintings, and limited-edition serigraphs by the three musicians, the exhibit also includes rare Beatles photographs, manuscripts from the Lennon estate, and several new works by Yoko Ono. Proceeds from entrance donations go to the Ann Arbor Art Fairs; suggested donation is \$3.

**Information Booths:** Guild booths on State in

front of the University of Michigan Museum of Art (campus section) and on Main at Liberty (downtown section) offer friendly assistance of all kinds. You can purchase caps, T-shirts, posters, ponchos, and canvas bags at four souvenir booths scattered throughout the fair. In the campus section, souvenir booths are located at each end of State; in the downtown section, they're on Main at Liberty and at William.

**Live Music and Entertainment:** A performance area is located at the intersection of Liberty and Main. For details and performance schedules, see Art Fair Entertainment, p. 55.

**Main Street Food Fair:** Local restaurants sell food and drinks at this food court on West Liberty between Main and Ashley. Opens at 10 a.m. each day of the fair; covered seating. See Food at the Fair, p. 61.

**Michigan Union Food Court:** When's the last time you had souvlaki, stuffed avocados, or an "elephant ear"? Maybe it was at last year's fair? Those outdoor vendors are back, selling ethnic food and American favorites. 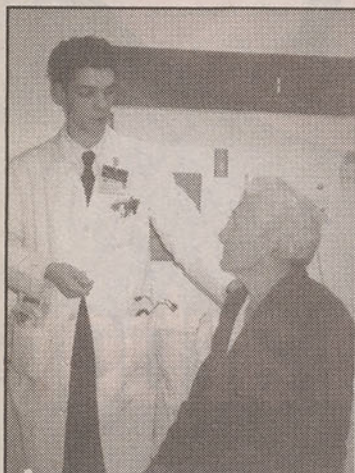

University, the air-conditioned museum is open for extended hours during the Art Fairs (Wed.-Fri. 11 a.m.-9 p.m., Sat. 11 a.m.-5 p.m.). Admission is free (donations are welcome). The museum gift shop moves outside during the fair, selling discounted cards, posters, books, games, jewelry, and other handicrafts (including a wide selection of African art and jewelry).

**Nonprofit Organization Booths:** Representatives from more than fifty local organizations pass out literature and talk on everything from AIDS research to preserving the rain forest at booths located on East Liberty between Fifth Avenue and Division.

**Main Street Area Association:** The association sells souvenirs and provides information about downtown Ann Arbor at its booth at Liberty and Main.

**Live Broadcasts:** WWJ (950 AM) broadcasts from the corner of Main and William.

This fair was established in 1968 by a group of merchants and businesspeople located on the northwest edges of the University of Michigan campus. They saw the four-day explosion of business on South University during the Ann Arbor Street Art Fair, and they wanted to find a way to lure those same thousands of hungry, thirsty, sophisticated, and curious visitors past their storefronts as well.

The State Street Area Art Fair (SSAAF) has now carved out a niche of its own. Aggressively juried throughout most of its thirty-one years, it vies for many of the same top artists as the Ann Arbor Street Art Fair; an artist who appeared in one fair last year is likely to show up this year in the other. With 300 exhibitors, this year's fair is the largest ever; about a third of the participants are new this year. (An additional twenty-seven artists exhibit their work at the Ann Arbor Fiber Arts Guild booth through a separate jurying process.)

**The Place:** "Area" is the key word in this fair's name. Almost all of the artists in the State Street Area Art Fair set up on Maynard, East Liberty, William, and North University. The booths on State Street south of William are actually the campus section of the Summer Art Fair.

**State Street Area Association:** This nonprofit organization of merchants and businesspeople promotes the north-of-campus shopping district. For information on the 1999 fair, July 21-24, or for artists' addresses and phone numbers, write to the State Street Area Art Fair, Box 7469, Ann Arbor, MI 48107, or call (734) 663-6511.

**Prizes and Purchase Awards:** This fair awards two \$600 Best of Show cash awards (one for two-dimensional works and one for three-dimensional) and eight \$150 honorable-mention prizes. The names of the prizewinners will be posted at the main information booth on State Street at East Liberty on Thursday. In addition, several State Street Area Association members have committed themselves to "purchase awards," pledging to buy artwork costing \$150 or more from the fair artists of their choice.

**AAA Michigan Travel Artist Showcases:** At his booth on William Street, William Rees will show you not only how to make a harp, but how to play one as well. Rees is one of eight artists in this fair who will be demonstrating their craft as part of the fairs' ongoing commitment to public art education. Sponsored by AAA Michigan Travel, these showcases are free. See the box on p. 53 for schedules, or inquire at an information booth.

**Information Booths:** Volunteers at three locations answer questions and sell postcards, T-shirts, and posters. This fair's information booths are at State and East Liberty, at Liberty

Michael & Ruth Anne Grove, Jewelry/Mixed Media (3-D)

and Division, and at William and State.

**Electronic "Art Fair Postcards":** Fairgoers can send these free postcards to anyone with Internet access in front of the offices of Michigan Live, located at the corner of Liberty and Division streets (across from Liberty Plaza).

**First Aid Station:** Staffed by paramedics from the Ann Arbor Fire Department, the first aid station is located at Liberty and Division.

**Children's Activities:** "Fire Safety Sammy" will be on hand near the first aid station to teach kids about fire safety. (Look for the big red bus.) The Children's Fire Safety Area features a variety of free interactive displays and is open the same hours as the fair.

The annual "Chalk the Park" event at Liberty Plaza allows kids of all ages to express themselves in the artistic medium of sidewalk chalk. Sponsored by the Huron Valley Chapter of the American Institute of Architects, the event is free and open Saturday from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

**Live Music and Entertainment:** There are three performance locations: Liberty Plaza, on the corner of East Liberty and South Division (produced by WIQB); State Street near East Washington; and a new **World Music Performance Area**, at the north end of Thompson near the parking structure. For performance schedules, see Art Fair Entertainment, p. 55.

**Michigan Theater:** Located on East Liberty, the theater operates a "beer garden" featuring cold beer, bratwurst, snacks, and air-conditioning for weary fairgoers Wed.-

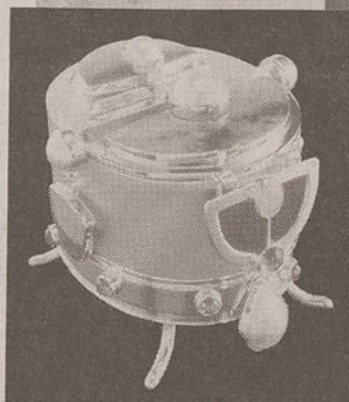

Sat. 11 a.m.-9 p.m. The theater sells movie posters, T-shirts, and other film memorabilia at a booth outside the theater, and presents art and foreign films and live performances in the evenings (see Art Fair Entertainment, p. 55). You can also buy movie posters and snow cones at a booth outside the nearby **State Theatre** (located at East Liberty and State).

**Live Broadcasts:** The Edge (105.1 FM), the fair's official FM station, broadcasts live near the Michigan Theater. WIQB (102.9 FM) broadcasts from the Liberty Plaza Stage at Liberty and Division each day of the fair starting at 10 a.m.

**Herb David Guitar Studio:** Located at East Liberty at Fifth Avenue, the studio presents its popular porch performances again this year at various times throughout the fair.

**Nonprofit Organization Booths:** Representatives from more than fifty local organizations pass out literature and talk on everything from AIDS research to preserving the rain forest at booths located on East Liberty between Fifth Avenue and Division.



### Paint your palate

#### Places to eat, from Argiero's to Zanzibar

How many art galleries do you know of where a child can walk around with a dripping ice-cream cone? And when was the last time you admired a painting, pontificating about its use of contrasting textures to create a sense of discord, while at the same time sucking pizza grease off your fingers?

Well, in mid-July in Ann Arbor—when “eat” is the only three-letter word that competes with “art”—it could happen to you. While your eyes feast on the vast visual variety, don't forget about your tongue. During the Art Fairs, local restaurants go all out to provide that fickle muscle in your mouth with everything it could possibly desire.

The following restaurants and temporary food courts are all located within four blocks of the fairs. Restaurants are arranged in alphabetical order by neighborhood, with each restaurant's name followed by coordinates referring to its location on the accompanying map on pages 62 & 63. For instance, **D2** means that Argiero's can be found at the intersection of column D and row 2.
