Equal Play: The Country Of Women

Three years after <u>SaladGate</u> sparked a national conversation about gender parity on Country radio, balance remains largely elusive for the genre as a whole. While the numbers (below) aren't markedly different than they've been for decades, tangible efforts at reaching consumers with more country music made by women are underway on a number of platforms. iHeartMedia, Cumulus, CMT, CMT Radio, Slacker Radio and, yes, local radio are stepping out with programming. While there isn't always an airplay component involved, the hope is increased exposure for participating female artists will begin to reshape the genre.

By The Numbers: Two-thirds of the way through the 2018 chart year, 19 of the top 100 songs were led by female voices, according to airplay data from Mediabase 24/7. That's up from last year's 14, but roughly on par with 2015's 18. The following year actually brought a decrease to 15. In all years, the number of female-led songs inside the top 50 is even less impressive.

Interestingly, things aren't necessarily better in the digital space. Amazon's Great Modern Country Songs and New To Prime Country lists are 18% and 17% female, for example, and Spotify's

New Boots playlist is 14% female. Clearly, the challenges facing women in country music aren't limited to getting on the radio.

The good news is female-centric, feature-based programming and events are being developed, launched, expanded and/ or continuing. CMT's Next Women of Country franchise has been in the vanguard of raising the profile for female artists for five years. "We saw great music and wanted to build on it

every year," says SVP/Music Strategy & Talent Leslie Fram. "That started with videos and content, and now the tour is going into its (continued on page 6) KENNY CHESNEY


cially country fans, tailgating is the best part of any event. As soon as the show starts, however, everyone packs up, stuffs what they can in their pockets and heads inside to drink \$8 beers and sit in uncomfortable chairs. But what if you didn't have to pack up the party and, instead, the music came to you? That's the question that led Shark Tank alum Melissa Carbone to found Tailgate Fest, scheduled for Sept. 1 on Melissa Carl

the grounds of Los Angeles' The Forum. Performers include **Toby Keith**, **Randy Houser**, **Joe Nichols**, **David Nail**, **Eric Paslay**, **Jana Kramer** and **Parmalee**.

"I've always loved tailgating," says Carbone. "And the more I tailgated, particularly at country music events, the more I noticed the unanimous sentiment that people don't want it to end when

the show starts. Fans take the time to create a perfect oasis around their trucks with coolers, grills, beer pong tables and friends, but have to leave it to be able to enjoy the music. So we're taking the stage truck-side."

As the brains behind some of the country's most popular horror attractions, including the <u>Los Angeles Haunted Hayride</u>, Carbone is using her experience to create another immersive world, but this time without scary clowns. Hopefully.



"People think this is a far departure from the Halloween experiences I create, but it's really not," says Carbone, who scored a \$2 million investment from Cuban on *Shark Tank* season five. "We're creating a world—a down-home, Americana, tailgating atmosphere plopped in the middle of Los Angeles. We also created this experience to be dealer's choice. We have VIP and GA lots where you can sit in the back of your truck and enjoy the show and a 15,000-person standing area in front of the stage for those who want a more traditional concert experience. There's even a pool to

the side if you want to plant your ass in there and watch." A cornhole tournament, indoor honky-tonk with line dancing and food/beverage trucks are also planned. Video screens will be set up for areas without sight lines.

With tailgating estimated to be a \$20 billion business, it might be surprising this hasn't been tried before. Carbone has a theory. "Logistically, it is a huge undertaking and not for the faint of heart," she says. "I can understand why someone would have cried uncle during the initial stages of the process."

In a post-Route 91 world, the challenges posed by the idea might seem even greater. "This event actually makes tailgating safer," Carbone counters. "It's happening outside of concerts all over the country, but currently there is very little, if any, oversight until after you enter the venue. From the moment you enter the grounds at Tailgate Fest, you're scanned and your truck and bags are checked. Ensuring a safe and positive environment for our patrons is the top priority."


Wristbands (shipped in advance) are sold per person, not per vehicle, and range from \$89 for general admission to \$999 for Super VIP. Gates open at 10am, cornhole games and jacked-up truck judging begin at 11am with music starting just after noon. Carbone has been working with KKGO/Los Angeles and KFRG/Riverside to market and promote the event and is "dabbling" in San Diego.

"Typically with tailgating, you have control over the artists you're listening to," she says. "So we wanted the entire lineup, even the opening slots, to be what attendees actually want to hear. Given the outpouring of positivity and excitement from both fans and artists, who are already asking to play in the coming years, I think we achieved that."





Mercury's **Maddie & Tae** put an industry spin on the artist interview:

I wish I had written any song from Kacey Musgraves' Golden Hour. I'm obsessed. (Maddie)

I always have essential oils with me. We have a diffuser on the bus. (Maddie) I always have a blanket, because I am literally always cold. (Tae)

My bad habit? I love watching trashy TV. (Maddie) There's a show called *The Proposal*. I know it's scripted, but it's one of those things you can't *not* watch. One person sits behind this wall while people participate in a pageant on the other side. At the end they pick the one they like and propose to them. Immediately. (Tae)

My happy place is a random town called Laramie, WY. We had so much fun there last summer when we had a day off. It's the cutest little town with a great coffee shop. (Maddie)

fifth year. These tours have been anchored by big female artists and give a lot of developing artists a chance they wouldn't have had since they're not on the radio. We also have a digital franchise where we bring artists into our studio and film performances that can then be made into videos."

The network also has a Next Women of Country playlist on Spotify and is conscious of creating balance on its awards shows. Fram, meanwhile, has been instrumental in the Change The Conversation effort to reframe the opportunities for female artists in country. "We're never negative about radio or anyone else," she notes. "The

point is, let's all work together to make some positive change. We have to come together on this and there have to be gatekeepers willing to become champions for women. That's what we're seeing with these efforts and it's a really positive step."

Air Apparent: Premiere-syndicated CMT Radio Live and CMT After MidNite are other ongoing examples. "Woman Crush Wednesday" is a weekly feature on both shows born



of the #WCW social media hashtag. "We latched on to the idea a couple years ago as an additional platform to spotlight female artists," host **Cody Alan** explains. "It's great from a show stand-

point because we know every Wednesday we'll give love to one specific female artist on air, on our social posts and via CMTcody. com." Rising artists like RaeLynn, Carly Pearce, Clare Dunn, and Lindsay Ell have made appearances, along with many of the format's female mainstays. "Listener response has been incredibly positive," Alan says. "It's a no-brainer to wrap our shows around talented female artists who deserve respect."

Whole iHeart: A weekend effort soon to air on more than 100 iHeartMedia Country stations goes a step further. The hour-long Women of iHeartCountry show hosted by Bobby Bones and his morning show co-host Amy Brown launches Labor Day weekend. The program will feature 11 or 12 songs from "current artists who are charting, hits from earlier years and, in particular, new, up-and-coming artists who haven't necessarily charted yet," says

Premiere EVP/Entertainment Programming **Jennifer Leimgruber**. "Bobby and Amy are the primary hosts, but we'll also involve other female Country talent from our stations. They will play a role each week either around one of the new artists we're featuring by sharing the story, or with an interview they've done."

The initiative will include playlists on iHeartRadio, allowing listeners the chance to hear the show's music and other content through the app. "Programming is a bit of a committee, primarily with **Rod Phillips** and the iHeartCountry brand team along with Bobby, who plays a major role since he was a big reason we started this show," Leimgruber explains. "He's been very focused on promoting female artists through his morning show already."


"This is yet another extension of other efforts to ensure that there is, in fact, nothing in the way of female artists obtaining airplay," adds Phillips. "Through On The Verge and features like Female Fridays on *The Bobby Bones Show* we have been committed to this effort for quite some time."

Next Week: Nash Nights Live's Elaina Smith and Slacker's Jess Wright, as well as a local programmer on street-level strategies that elevated the music and targeted the core listener demo.
