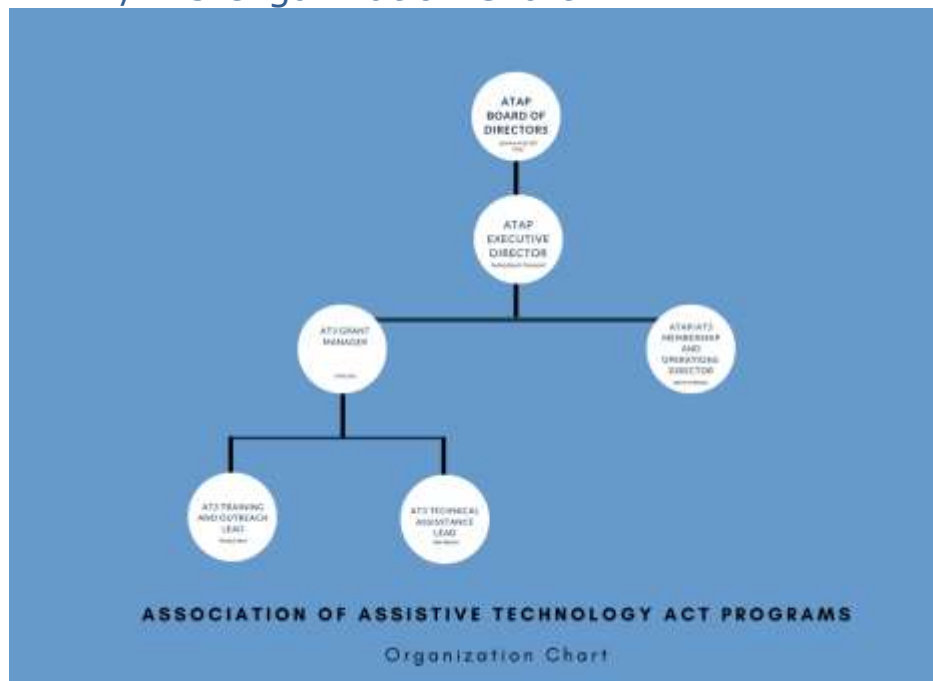

Center for Assistive Technology Act Data Assistance (CATADA)

The Center for Assistive Technology Act Data Assistance is the federally funded program charged with providing technical assistance and supports to state and territory AT Act Programs for data collection and analysis.

She has primary responsibility for TA for data entry, analysis and report development along with revision and updating of State Plan and APR data collection elements.

ACL is comprised of five major units that report directly to the ACL Administrator.
