IF YOU OWN BOTH BREEDS PLEASE PHOTOCOPY THE FORM AND COMPLETE TWO SEPERATE RETURNS - ONE FOR EACH BREED.

Shown opposite is a sample of the new form with English translations/explanations to assist you. I have also filled out the details of some of my own horses to show you how it should be done.

In the top section '**con Codigo**' refers to your Owner/Breeder Code. This used to be a code reserved for breeders (codigo ganadero) but individual codes are now allocated by Spain to all PRE and HA owners for their Computer Records. If you have not been allocated a code leave this box blank.

In the main section: - Box 1 is for the sex M for male & H for female

Box 2 'CODIGO' refers to the Horse's Spanish Reg. Number & this year you are asked to give the whole FIFTEEN DIGIT CODE - Foals that have been BORN in 2001 will not have been allocated a Spanish Registration Number yet so this box 'CODIGO' should be left empty for them.

Box 3 is the horse's full registered name with the correct English OR Roman Numerals depending on whether your horse has been Graded yet.

Box 4 is the Year of Birth

Box 5 ONLY USED WHEN THE FOAL DOES NOT YET HAVE A SPANISH REGISTRATION NUMBER.

So if you have left Box 2 empty you must give the complete Spanish Codes for Father and for Mother.

Box 6 '**OBSERVACIONES**' (observations) this section tells the Cria anything that has happened to a horse in the PAST TWELVE MONTHS. You MUST include all horses that have been SOLD ('**Vendido**')

since the 1st December 2000, horses that have been GELDED ('**Castrado**'), horses that have DIED

('**Muerto**'), horses that WILL BE (OR MAY BE) STANDING AT STUD IN 2001 ('**Semental**'), horses that

have been Exported ('**Exportado**' - give the country), and mares that are PREGNANT ('**Preñado**).

On a lovely sunny Sunday afternoon in July I was invited by Julie and Anthony Barham (Sky PRE Stud) to observe a clinic at their home. The instructor Daniel Pevsner was familiar with Spanish horses having been involved with the Spanish Riding School in Vienna and had a keen interest in seeing some British based horses in action.

This was the first clinic to be held at the stables in Hertfordshire and the pupils and their mounts were of varying experience in their dressage training. Julie rode both her stallions, AmorosoXXVII and Campeon at the clinic and found the afternoon very rewarding as Daniel was a hands on instructor who, after watching his pupils for a short while actually rode the horses afterwards so he could get a better idea of producing the best from them. As an observer I found him quietly encouraging and sympathetic to both horse and rider. Some of those attending the clinic were apprehensive at first but he soon put them at ease and they gained confidence in both themselves and their horses. Anita Singh brought Churizo, Jeannie Miles brought Gerente, Kim Rodia and Descaro were also put through their paces and not forgetting our honorary Spanish horse Classic Bounder with Brian Jeffels.

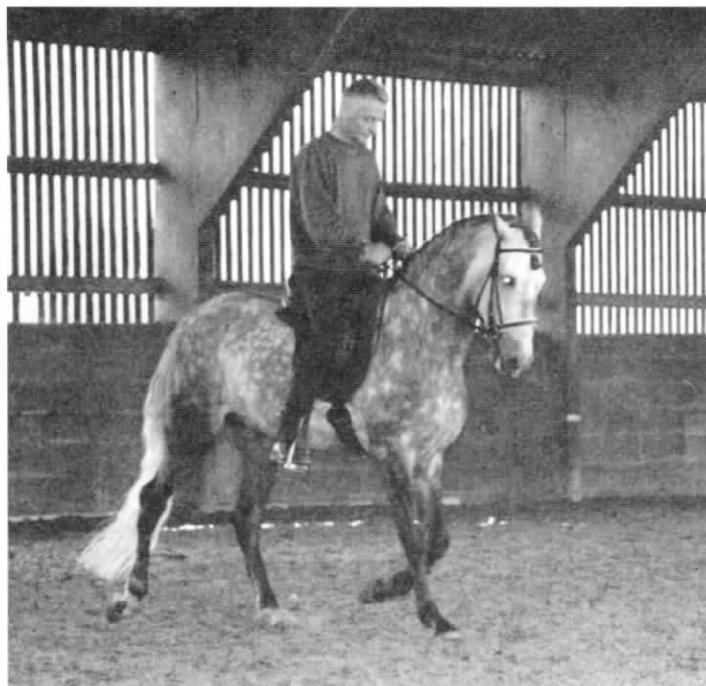
All the horses improved by the end of their lessons and the general

will be a great advert for Spanish horses in the dressage arena.

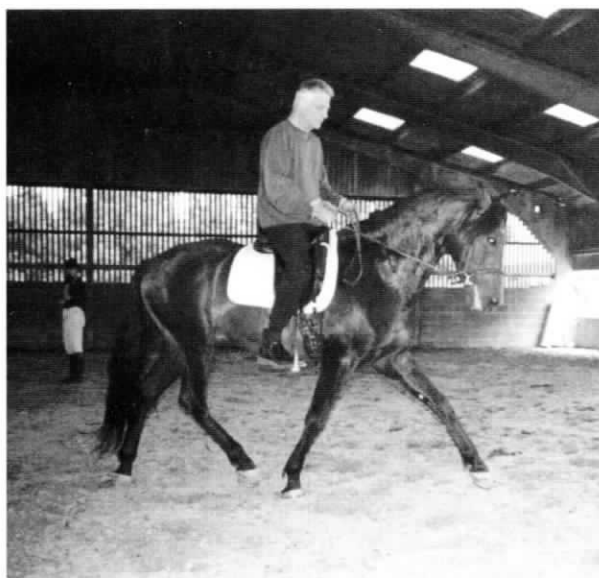

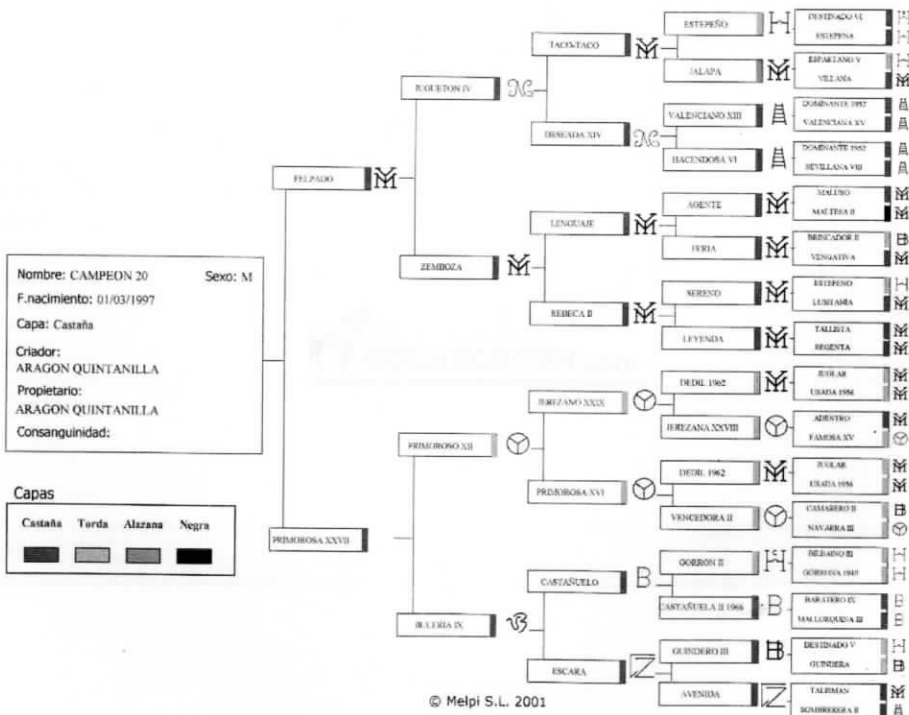


CAMPEON XXXVI (formerly *Campeon 20*)

An Afternoon At La Ciervina

I went to arrange for a shipment of one of La Ciervina's brood mare to the States. Ramón Jimenez is the owner, and foreman of his own ranch. He raises Purebred Spanish Horses, crossbreds, beef cattle, fighting bulls and partridges. I tend to be a little uncomfortable there because he keeps his fighting bulls, beef cattle and horses all together. I've been charged once by a cow with horns and I don't want that to happen again. La Ciervina is a composite of 6 ranches in Extremadura with its head quarter in Monroy, a little town just north of Caceres. La Ciervina is run by Ramón with the help of his son Jaime, the veterinarian and Alvaro, a fine horseman. Ramón is a man a little over 60, wrinkled by the sun. Like our American cowboys, he is lean and in physically great shape, graying around the temples. He has worked fighting bulls from horseback to showing horses in dressage classes. He no longer rides but he is

still bullfighting to test the young stock.. Ramón is one of the only owners who shows and trains all his own horses. He rides, drives and shows in hand. He is known as one of the top showman in Spain and specializes in the pure Terry lines know as Cerrado en Bocado. What makes him tick are his horses.

I drove over to Monroy after visiting Maleni Conesa , daughter of Joaquin Conesa and breeder of the champion stallion, Indiana 18 now in California.. Maleni and I were trying to figure out some way to get the shipping costs down for the horses we were sending to the states. After lunch I drove over to La Ciervina a couple of hours away. It is a ride through a strange terrain with lots of green rocks that look like strange sculpture sitting on the horizon. The fences are made of stone and very carefully put together. The prairie has a sprinkling of encina which produce an acorn that is highly

appraised for its commercial value as animal feed.

I passed through Trujillo where many of the Conquistadors came from including Pizarro. All the chimneys in Trujillo have big stork nests on them sometimes weighing up to 200 lbs. After I left Trujillo, I turned onto a little winding road that went past fighting bull ranches and famous fishing spots until I got to the little tiny town of Monroy. It has a castle on the highest point and no cell phones work there it is so removed. I met Ramón in a little café called La Herradura(The horse shoe) where Ramón eats everyday. There is a wonderful family who owns the restaurant that makes you feel as if you have always known them. I went there only once and now it is as if I've lived there all my life. Across the street is a general store that sells everything, even phone cards that don't work because the town is out of range.

Ramón had been asked to give a demonstration with his stallion and cobra of 9 mares. He said it takes him a month of training to prepare the horses for this type of performance. When I arrived, he had just received a call from Jacobo Orsini asking him to bring his cobra and stallion to the show in Talavera.

After the sun went down a bit, Ramón asked me to help him hook up his cobra. First we herded the mares and foals as well as the stallion into a large corral. Then we put a collar on Goloso, his stallion and hooked him up to Indomable, Ramon's famous mare. We added one mare at a time and worked them before adding another. While hooking up the mares, Ramon made a point of telling me never to stand in front of the cobra but to either side. If by chance they shied, without meaning to, they would run you over. He has the mares trained to voice commands and whip signals. We proceeded to hook up the next mare who was less experienced, then we

hooked up America, a strong mare who Veronica Brownell just bought.. Ramón alternated the really well trained strong mares with the weaker ones. He finally had a string of 7 mares and Goloso. There were only two that weren't experienced enough. So he went on changing the position of these mares in the cobra until they finally all settled in.

It was a spectacular sight to see the seven mares, Goloso, the stallion and Ramón working on the horizon during sunset. The little foals ran in and out of the cobra always causing some kind of problem. Spaniards just don't seem to get perturbed by this. The beams of sunlight streamed across the prairie while Ramón put the mares through their paces at a walk, trot and canter, a turn to the left, to the right and a rein back.. It was breathtaking to see

the horses and a man in pure ecstasy all working together. Ramón with his cobra and stallion galloping in the high grass at sunset was a sight I'll never forget. The sound of the bells on the mares and the special call that Spaniards use as signals sent chills up my back. It was a pastoral symphony and Ramon's calls were like the timpani accenting the score.. Ramón was so happy to be in the country working his horses nothing else mattered.

Review of

'A WORK IN HAND WITH BETTINA DRUMMOND'

Bettina Drummond was Master Nuno Oliveira's favourite pupil. She started riding with the Master when she was seven years old. Her mother, the late Phyllis Field, translated Oliveira's book "Reflections on Equestrian Art".

When I came to live in America five years ago the culture shock was enormous. Especially as at the last moment I had had to leave behind my beloved Arlequin, the Andalusian horse I had been living with in Spain. I said I would never ride again, but after a while I realised that this would be an insult to Arlequin, who had taught me all I knew about riding, life and love.

It was when I found my stallion Soldado, a son of Embajador IX, that I met Bettina. We found that we had a lot in common. She and I both had

spent the largest part of our lives living on the Iberian peninsula and we both love the Iberian horse.

For me meeting her was a dream come true. I knew that she is one of only two people to whom Nuno Oliveira gave a teacher's license, so I realised that she has a gift for sharing her knowledge in such a way that one can learn much from her. And so it is.

Bettina has now made a video, in two volumes, and I thought you'd like it reviewed.

The title of the video is "Work in Hand". And it's a treasure. In fact, it's like a treasure chest, which you open and look through and everything you find is beautiful.

Bettina told me it is thanks to the Andalusian horse that this video has been made. The purebred

Spanish stallion Embajador XI, bred and owned by Allan and Linda Hamid and the purebred Lusitano stallion Trouvere, bred by Roger Bouzin and owned by Jean Peigne, were the first Iberian horses Bettina rode after leaving Portugal. Most of the horses in Bettina's stables now are Iberian horses. They form the "cast" for the video. There is Bandolera, the beautiful broodmare. She is an Andalusian. And Mimi (Granada du Plessis) has a Terry mother. Boccanegra and Guerreiro are purebred Spanish stallions.

They are full brothers (and half brothers to my Soldado). With Ilyad they share great-grandfather Destinado. The video is worth watching just for all the beautiful horses that play a part.

Volume I is one and 3/4 hours

long and volume II one hour and 10 minutes, so together they are three hours. The video takes you from newborn foal to haute école horse. And when I say "newborn foal" I mean literally newborn.

You see Bettina lying in the straw "imprinting" a three day old foal. It's all "work" in hand: anything done from the ground, rather than while in the saddle.

The value of work in hand is made perfectly clear through these videos. I had always wanted to learn about it, because I very much liked the idea of teaching the horse movements while I'm not sitting on his back unbalancing him. At one point I tried to teach myself, from books, but I really needed to know more than I did before I could get started. So Bettina's video is another dream come true! She takes you step by step through the process and doesn't expect you to already know most of the technique (which is a problem I have encountered with instructional videos made by other people)

In volume I is shown a session

with a novice student and we are taught how to hold the whip before we do anything else. But, as I already mentioned, the video is not at all aimed only at the beginning student. In volume II is a session with an advanced student.

Bettina shows us the work not only with students of different levels, but with horses of different levels, of different breeds and with different personalities. She addresses teachers as well as students and she shares with us advice from her teacher to her. Not only does Bettina share with us his words, but we are shown clips from her mother's private films, of Master Oliveira himself riding Bettina's mother's horses.

Also a clip of Bettina's first private lesson in the indoor. She was nine years old and riding her first and much loved horse Junco.

As a part of performing work in hand, Bettina also shows us how to understand the horse. And how to find pleasure in everything we do or attempt to do with the horse, even if things don't immediately go the way we intended.

Classical riding is an artform and Bettina Drummond, in this video, presents teaching as a form of art.

Members might want to think about becoming members of the Vardon Trust - National Foaling Bank if they have mares expecting foals next year.

Members of the Vardon Trust can receive practical and very knowledgeable help on mare and foal problems around the clock. An adoption service is provided for orphans, the trust will take on the nursing of orphans, injured foals, problem foalers, and any problem too much for a breeder to cope with. They also have a frozen mare colostrum bank which members can access.

After a traumatic trip from Holland to France all the horses recovered well and now they are used to the heat have settled down to enjoy the wonderful weather we have here.

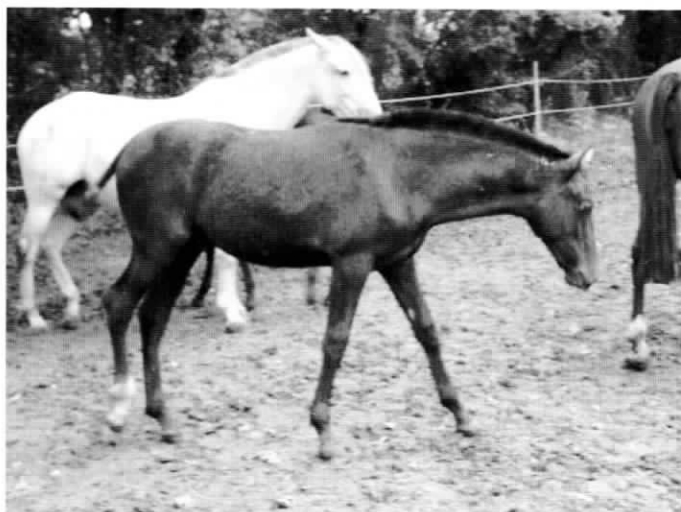

We wish her the best of luck with him in the future.

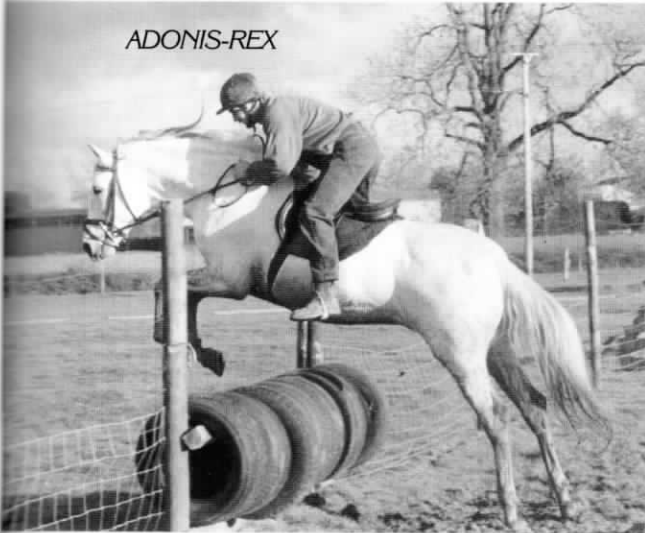

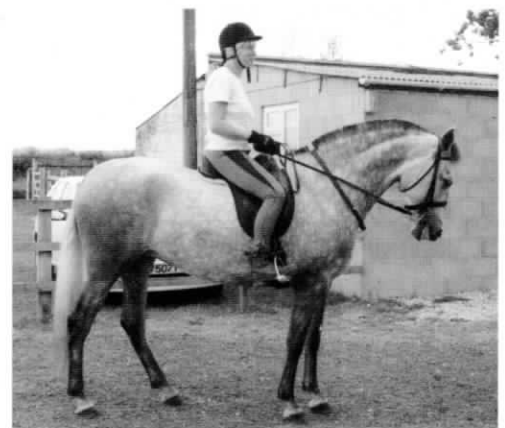
