





But Greenland was not represented at the Ric conference, and Greenland is not of American sovereignty. It is under Danish sovereignty. Nor was Denmark represented or consulted.

Moreover, there is more to this line around Greenland than the natural feeling of the Americas that it is an area of great strate-gic importance. The United States has, for some time, been steadfastly refusing the request of Denmark that we evacuate our American troops from Greenland. This country is, of course, vocally loyal to the principle that the sovereignty of other nations must be respected. But, in action, we are still more powerfully influenced by our realistic ideas of what constitutes a good base for the next war. So we keep our troops in Greenland, even though Denmark protests that their presence there is a violation of Danish sovereignty. Now that the nations o America have voted to include Greenland in their scheme fo military security, we will apparently feel that something of the curse has been taken off our re tention of our military position in Greenland. We still won't feel quite right about it, but what can we'do? How can we be in a proper position to detend the sovereignty of Egypt if we lef a little matter of Danish sovereignty stand in our way?
