Police Seize Anti - Castro Arms Cache

NEW YORK (AP) - Police reported today the seizure of mortars, machine guns, pistols and ammunition at a sporting goods shop that allegedly had been shipping armaments to an anti-Castro group inside Cuba.

Three men—one listed as a Cuban—were arrested.

Detective Edward Lehane, head of a six-man detail that raided the shop, said armaments had been sent to South America for reshipment to Cuba. The South American destination was not made rubble. tination was not made public.

Lehane listed the seized material as two 60mm mortars, 25 machine guns, 1,000 rounds of ammunition for the machine guns, a number of pistols and blasting caps, and detonators for the mortars. No mortar shells were found. Lehane gave this account:



Shadowy Cong Guerrillas Conduct Hit and Run War

The men move rapidly, scattering in many directions in twos and threes. This is their base area, and they know every feature of the dense jungle in the area—the hidden trails, the carnouflaged bunkers and tunnels the gun emplacements, the mines and booby traps.

Viet Cong positions were first prepared here years are and

prepared here years ago and with each month the positions have been improved. The Viet Cong guerrilla spends much of his day digging, even when there is no immediate need for it.

Indian officials boday denied Pakistani President Mohammed Ayub Khan's report that the cease-fire agreement for the cease-fire agreement for the Rann of Kutch had been accompanied by a second agreement for a general withdrawal of troops all along the Indian-Pakistani frontier.

Ayub Khan announced in Karachi that he and Indian Prima Minister Lal Bahadur Shastri had agreed in London to order the immediate withdrawal along "the entire India-Pakistan border."

Ayub said the agreement for the general withdrawal is in some respects 'more important than the pact on the Rann of Kutch dispute.'
"It is not true. We know nothing about such an agreement,"
said K.P.S. Menon, Indian foreign ministry spokesman.
G. G. Mirchandani, a defense






