# **Neighborhood Revitalization coming to Aaronville**

Habitat for Humanity of Baldwin County has recently started a process called Neighborhood Revitalization (NR), which supports the efforts of Habitat affiliates to transform entire communities, house by house, block by block, neighborhood by neighborhood.

The first neighborhood in Baldwin County on the list: Aaronville in Foley.

"The concept of NR is to go in and work with the residents to affect an entire area, so it's not just building one house at a time," explained Executive Director Sandy Folan. "You go in and actually meet with the residents, and through surveys and

conversations, say 'What is it you want to see in your neighborhood? What would you love to see happen? What do you think needs to be better?"

NR is all resident driven through surveys. So, residents tell Habitat what they love about their neighborhood and what they want to see changed.

"We take those surveys, and we've put together an advisory committee of residents of Aaronville," Folan said. "We took the survey results and gave the results to

the committee, and then find out where we want to focus our attention: What moves you? What screams, 'Yep, I want to work on that!"

Right now, Folan said, they are at a "Let's figure that out" stage. She said one of the topics residents want to improve is traffic safety.

"Once the resident advisory committee comes up with the results, we'll actually start subcommittees," she said.

Habitat is just finishing up the third house in the community, but has a list of about 30 residents who've said they could use help. They are focusing on senior citizens, the disabled, veterans and low income homeowners who many not be able to make those repairs on their own.

Volunteers will help the residents make repairs, and then the residents will pay back a portion of the costs.

"Of course, Habitat doesn't give things away; they need to be part of the solution," Folan said. "So, of course, they'll pay back some of the repair work."

Folan said Habitat will be working with the community as to what the needs are, doing repairs and doing what they call, "Brush with kindness," which are smaller projects, like painting, landscape work and other outdoor work.

Some homes do need critical repairs which Folan said Habitat will hopefully get more funding

This Neighborhood Revitalization encompasses the entire block of Aaronville and will kick off Jan. 14.

"We're calling it Rock the Block, and bringing in volunteers and the community to start repairs," Folan said.

The timeline for this pro-

cess is unclear.

"Our ultimate goal is that the residents will take over and we're not needed anymore," said Folan. "The ultimate goal is that they take ownership in the project and they continue working in their own neighborhood to make it better and make it a great place to live. Then we step away and say, 'What's the next neighborhood we're going to work on?"

This could be a one-year plan or a five-year plan.

"It really is going to come down to how much work is needed and how long we're needed," Folan explained. "Then we move on to another neighborhood. We don't know where we'll go next."

Folan said one incident stuck out in her mind so far with Neighborhood Revitalization in Aaronville.

"The second house we did. the woman hadn't had running water in two years," she said. "The construction manager was at her home and the lady ran out and said, 'I don't know vou verv well, but I'm going to give you a hug.' She said, 'You don't know what it's like to not have taken a hot shower in two years."

Folan said the family had been getting water from outside, and she believed a spigot was nearby to get water to cook and clean.

"Through money we've

raised, we were able to bring in a plumber and fix the lines," Folan said. "They now have hot water, they can use the toilet, take a hot shower. To me, that's what it's all about. It's a win because we've been able to help someone change their own life and make it better. We've always focused so long on, 'we build a house, a whole house,' and that's a lot of money and a lot of volunteers and time. We do change lives that way, but to do something as simple as make someone's toilet work so they don't have to bring in water and dump it every time it flushes ... that's a huge change and improvement for them, and it didn't take much. It's something easier for us to do and it's just as impactful as building a home. That, to me, is one of the most impactful things about this program. These are families who maybe just didn't have the money up front to bring in a plumber and do a lot of work. For us to be able to help them ... and they're going to pay us back, and that money will go to help more families ... it continues on. For us to be able to come in and make that difference, that's what Neighborhood Revitalization is about, and there's many people out there in the same situation that we hope to help."

# **Hope in 2017**

Hope. It is as significant as love for human existence and flourishing. When hope is gone, life is gone. When hope remains, even in the face of horrific pain, loss, and injustice, life can remain full, significant, and incredibly powerful.

One of my favorite thinkers, Wolfhart Pannenberg, founded his entire theological and philosophical project on the explanation and exploration of hope. For him, hope is uniquely robust in the Christian tradition because it is rooted in the resurrection of Christ from the dead, a claim no other religion or philosophy makes of its founder. The resurrection is not some fairytale or religious metaphor. It is the explosion hope right in the middle of history. Jesus' overcoming of death reveals decisively the answer to humankind's most terrifying problem: death. As my father often reminds me, the death rate is 100%. Even if one has unlimited access to money, power, technology, and connections (all the things we spend too much time chasing), he has no more control over his dying day than the poorest beggar.

What Jesus being alive again after he was killed means is that death is not our unconquerable enemy. There is hope beyond the grave. Moreover the resurrection of Christ, not at the end of time, but right in the middle of things, sends eternal life gushing into the present. If Christ's life is the life God endorses, then it is the life we should live, a life made possible by the Spirit of Christ who abides in all those who believe.

As we launch from Christmas into a New Year, let us not forget that the promises of Christmas or vouchsafed in the reality of Easter. Since our future is already secured by the empty tomb, let's live like it in the upcoming year—with hope!



# Who we lost in 2016

**AT THE CLOSE OF EVERY YEAR** my tradition is to acknowledge the passing away of significant political players from the political stage in Alabama. We have lost some Icons from politics in the Heart of Dixie this year.

Lucy Baxley passed away in October in Birmingham at 78. She was born on a farm in rural Houston County in the community of Pansy. She went to school at Ashford. After graduation from high school she went to work at the courthouse in Dothan and worked for Judge Keener Baxley.

When Judge Baxley's son, Bill, got elected Attorney General in 1970, young Bill Baxley asked Lucy to come to Mont-

gomery to be his administrative assistant. Eight years later she and Bill married. She was an integral part of Baxley's first campaign for Governor in 1978. Bill became Lt. Governor in 1982, then lost again for governor in 1986. Soon, thereafter,

Bill and Lucy ended their ten year marriage.

Lucy then began her own career in Alabama politics. She was elected State Treasurer in 1990 and spent eight years in that post. She was a natural campaigner. One of the best one-on-one I have ever seen. She worked the state during those eight years as Treasurer, especially among senior citizen groups.

She parlayed that campaign into being elected as the first female lieutenant governor in history. In that 1998 campaign, she coined the campaign phrase, "I Love Lucy." Her signs were all over the state. Her name identification was so pronounced that her lieutenant governor's parking space simply said "Lucy."

She was the Democratic nominee for governor in 2002, but lost to Republican Bob Riley. She finished her political career by serving on the Public Service Commission. Lucy loved Ala-

bama and folks loved her.

Judge Perry O. Hooper, Sr. passed away in his hometown of Montgomery in April at the age of 91. Judge Hooper's career paralleled the growth and dominance of the Republican Party in Alabama. He was indeed one of the founding Fathers of the modern Republican Party in the Heart of Dixie. He was a Republican before it was cool. One time when he was state party chairman, Hooper would joke that he could call a meeting of the state GOP in a phone booth.

Hooper was a Marine. His lovely wife, Marilyn, was a Montgomery native and they raised four fine boys. As a pioneer Republican he led the Goldwater landslide of the South in 1964. That crescendo propelled him into the Montgomery Probate Judge office. He was reelected to that post in 1970 and in 1974, he moved to a Montgomery Circuit judgeship.

Twenty years later Judge Hooper broke the ice of control that the Democrats and Trial Lawyers had over the State Supreme Court. He became the First Republican Chief Justice of the Alabama Supreme Court. Democrats and Republicans alike noted at his funeral that during his years as a Judge he treated everyone fairly.

Jim Bennett was the longest serving Secretary of State in Alabama history. Jim passed away in Birmingham in August at age 76, shortly after being di

# It's time to look at your health care coverage for 2017

Now's the time to check your health care coverage for 2017 or sign up for the first time. Open enrollment through the Health Insurance Marketplace began on Nov. 1 and runs until Jan. 31.

Here are six key facts to know about this year's enrollment season.

Your actual premium costs probably aren't as high as you've heard.

About nine in 10 Alabama consumers with coverage through the marketplace will be able to find a health plan for less than \$75 per month, thanks to financial assistance.

If your income falls below 400 percent of the federal poverty level – that's \$48,000 for one person or \$97,000 for a family of four – you'll qualify for federal tax credits that will help make your coverage affordable. About nine in 10 marketplace consumers in Alabama are eligible. Because the tax credits increase dollar for dollar with the cost of a benchmark health plan, most consumers are protected from rate increases.

Also, if you're buying an individual health plan but not through the marketplace, you'd be wise to visit healthcare.gov and recheck your eligibility for the tax credits. An estimated 33,000 Alabama residents who purchased coverage outside the marketplace and paid full price for it last year have incomes low enough to qualify for assistance.

All consumers still have

choices

Even consumers served by a single insurer will be able to select from a range of plans. Alabama residents can choose from an average of six health plans, though the exact number will vary from county to county. You can view all of the plans for sale in your area at healthcare.gov.

If you haven't purchased a health plan through the marketplace before, you should know that all plans cover a comprehensive set of benefits, including doctor visits, hospital stays, preventive care, pregnancy and prescription drugs. The plans must treat vou fairly. Insurers can't deny you coverage because you have a medical issue, such as cancer or diabetes. Nor can they charge you more than they would someone who's in good health.

It pays to shop and check out your options.

If your health plan from this past year is continuing into 2017, you may be automatically re-enrolled. But you'll still want to review it to make sure it meets your needs.

Every year, insurers adjust premiums, out-of-pocket costs and benefits. You should have received a letter from your insurance company explaining the changes for 2017.

Even if you're satisfied with your current coverage, it'll be smart to log into your marketplace account at healthcare.gov and update your information on household income and family size.

Updating your personal information is important, because you may be eligible for lower costs than last year.

Comparing plans at healthcare.gov is easier than ever. The marketplace simpli-

fies your shopping for coverage by letting you make convenient comparisons of health plans.

The process is faster

The process is faster and more streamlined this year. You can even shop and enroll from a smartphone or tablet.

Healthcare.gov helps you put together the full picture of your health care costs, including premiums, deductibles, copayments and coinsurance. An "out-of-pocket calculator" will give you an estimate of your total yearly costs for each health plan, based on factors like your age, gender, income, ZIP code and how much health care you expect to use.

You can also check out a plan's list of covered drugs and find out which doctors and hospitals participate in the plan you're considering.

Deductibles can often be made more manageable.

Most marketplace consumers qualify for financial assistance that lowers their deductibles -- the median marketplace deductible is now \$850.

All plans cover some preventive services, such as cancer screenings, vaccines and well-child visits, without a deductible. And eight in 10 marketplace consumers select plans that cover common health services, such as primary care visits, generic drugs and some specialist visits, before meeting the deductible. Instead of bearing the full cost of your doctor visit, you may have just a copayment.

There are places to turn

for help with signing up.

Besides relying on healthcare.gov, you can call 1-800-318-2596 and visit with a marketplace customer service representative. You can also visit localhelp.healthcare.gov to locate the organizations in your community that will assist you in signing up for coverage.

Open enrollment runs until Jan. 31.

Don't risk paying a penalty of \$695 or more because you go uninsured next year. Check out your options at healthcare.gov. Plans may be more affordable than you think.

# Now is the time to survey your deer population

By using trail cameras, many landowners and hunters have some idea of what mature bucks are living on or near their hunting land. But far fewer have a grasp on the overall condition of their deer herd. Trail cameras are a great tool for not only for deciding which big buck you will set your sights on during hunting season, but also for managing and improving your deer herd as a whole. Conducting a camera survey can provide the landowner or manager with information on sex ratio, relative age, general health, antler growth, fawn production, and recruitment, all of which will help to guide harvest and land management decisions. Perhaps

most important, if surveys are conducted over multiple seasons or years, the information gathered can help to track significant changes in herd characteristics and allow for focused, proactive herd and land management.

Right now (late sum-

mer/early fall) is an ideal

time to conduct a camera survey because most fawns have been birthed and are mobile, antlers are close to full-development, and since acorns have yet to drop, most deer will readily come to bait sites. Late winter/early spring (after hunting season has closed) is another good time. The survey should span a length of 10-14 consecutive days and camera density should consist of 1-camera per 100 acres. Be sure to place cameras in areas of high deer activity, such as feeders, deer trails, scrapes, natural funnels, and water sources. Baiting 7-10 days prior and during the survey will greatly improve the survey's success and accuracy; after all, the goal is to get as many deer on camera as possible. The Alabama Cooperative Extension System has produced publication **ANR-1895 Managing** White-Tailed Deer: Camera Surveys which outlines many of the details and considerations to take into account regarding a camera survey.

After the survey is complete, photos must be examined for total fawns, does, and bucks and unique bucks must be determined and counted. A free computation form may be found at www. qdma.com which will help calculate the statistics of does: buck, fawns: doe,

acres/deer, and deer/ square mile. This information can aid in developing sound harvest and management strategies and can be used to provide data that supports the formation of local hunting cooperatives (i.e. those hunting families, clubs, or groups from nearby or surrounding properties that wish to manage towards a common goal). State and private wildlife biologists can assist you with interpreting the results and provide recommendations towards deer harvest and land management to maintain or improve your deer herd.

It is still important to understand that camera surveys are not a substitute for gathering information such as weight, age, and lactation rates from harvested deer. Harvest data provides critical information about herd health and composition and should be used alongside camera survey data to develop appropriate management recommendations. Detail on this important management practice can be found in extension publication ANR-1412 Managing White-tailed Deer: Collecting Data from Harvested Deer.

I am not beholden to any spe-

cial interests groups. As a lawmaker and public servant, I am beholden to the 45,000 citizens in House District 25, to the people of Alabama, to my family, and to my Lord and Savior.

Now let me tell you the things that I am. I am a man who is

humbled by the confidence and trust that my colleagues have offered by electing me as Speaker of the House, especially following such difficult and often controversial times in our government.

I am determined to utilize the talents, ideas, and input of every member of the House whether man or woman, Republican or Democrat, conservative, moderate, or liberal. A legislator's worth as a member should not be solely determined by whether a D or an R follows their name on the roster, but rather by their work ethic, their commitment to understanding important issues, and the soundness of the ideas and initiatives they have to offer.

Evidence of this fact was on display during the September special session when House members of both parties joined together in passing landmark legislation that pays down a significant portion of our state's debt, provides needed funding for road and bridge projects related to economic development on the Gulf Coast, and shores

up funding needs in the Medicaid agency's budget. And, best of all, we were able to do all of this with no new taxes.

On the day my colleagues elected me Speaker, I stood in the well of the House and asked God's blessings on every action, every decision, and every vote that takes place in the chamber so that we may fulfill the calling in Peter 4:10, which reads, "Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms."

I believe that if we simply follow that biblical admonition, House members will succeed in doing our jobs well.

agnosed with cancer. Jim was a writer, reporter, State Representative, State Senator and Secretary of State.


He became a reporter

for the Birmingham Post Herald after graduation from Jacksonville State. He covered the Civil Rights protests in Birmingham in 1963 and stood next to Bull Conner when he ordered fire hoses turned on protesters, including children. He once told me he interviewed George Wallace, Bull Conner and Martin Luther King in the same day.

He ran for and was elected to the state legislature in 1978. We served together in the House. He later moved to the Senate. He was first appointed Secretary of State in 1993. He won the election in 1994 and served two four year terms through 2003. He is not only the longest serving Secretary of State, but is also the only one to have been elected as both a Democrat and as a Republican.

He was a longtime member of the Jacksonville State University Board of Trustees and was Chairman of the Board when he passed away. Jim Bennett was a true public servant.

seconds quarter as Alabama went into halftime leading 13-7.

Mississippi's only score of the first half came on a 9-yard run at 4:11 of the second quarter by Kylin Hill of Columbus to cap a 70-vard. 12 play drive. Mississippi kept the ball for 14:29 of the 24 minutes, out-gaining Alabama 137 yards to 86. Kam White of Clinton picked off a pass from McGill-Toolen quarterback Bubba Thompson early in the third period and raced untouched 49 yards for a touchdown and Mississippi place-kicker Connor McKay of Germantown booted the extra point to give Mississippi the lead 14-13.

An intentional grounding penalty late in the third quarter moved Wayne County Coach Todd Mangum's Mississippi All-Stars back to their own 8-yard line – and following a 31-yard punt, Alabama had great field position at the Mississippi

39 as the quarter came to an end. Seven plays netted 17 yards and with 11:06 remaining in the fourth quarter, Lane kicked a 38-yard field goal, his third kick of the game, to give Alabama the lead for good 14-13. Mississippi took possession on its own 10 following the ensuing Lane kickoff and was pushed back to the 5 after Murphy defensive end Neil Farrell and Oxford linebacker Kenney Britt stopped Clinton running back Cam Akers for a five-yard loss on a

short pass play on third down. On fourth down, the punt snap sailed over the punter's head out of the end zone for a safety. Lane boomed a 60-yard punt when Alabama stalled on its next possession, and Jackson-Olin linebacker T.J. Moultry, who had nine tackles in the game, made perhaps his biggest play when he hustled to down the punt at the 1-yard line.

The Alabama defense, led by Moultry and Spanish Fort linebacker Thomas Johnston, stopped Mississippi near mid-field

on fourth down with 5:58 left and the offense responded with a six-play, 41-yard drive culminated with Hillcrest-Tuscaloosa running back Brian Robinson scoring on a 13-yard run with 3:07 to play. Robinson, who had been held in check most of the game, had 28 yards on four carries in the drive to give Alabama its final 25-14 lead.

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# Sports safety: avoiding mouth injuries

As the new year begins, so do youth sports like baseball, softball and soccer — all of which can result in sport-related injuries to the mouth.

In older children and adults, sports injuries are common. Dentists estimate that between 13 and 39 percent of dental injuries occur while playing sports. Nearly 80 percent of all dental injuries affect at least one of the front teeth, while damage to the tongue or cheek is common.

More than 5 million teeth are avulsed, displaced from their socket, each year, many during sports activities. This results in nearly \$500 million spent on replacing these teeth each year. According to the CDC, sports-related dental injuries account for more than 600,000 emergency room visits each year.

# **Basic protection**

UAB School of Dentistry Associate Dean for Academic Affairs Ken Tilashalski, DMD, says when it comes to protecting teeth, the best mouth guard is the one that will actually be

"Wearing a mouth guard reduces the chances of tooth fractures, tooth dislocations and soft tissue cuts," Tilashalski said. "The guards also protect against jaw fractures and concussions by absorbing the energy of a traumatic blow to the chin."

There are three basic types of mouth guards:

- · Stock, which are pre-formed and ready to wear, but typically do not fit very well
- · Boil and bite, which come in a preformed shape and are customized by softening in boiling water
- · Custom-made, which require a visit to the dentist and offer the best fit and protection

"Having four active kids, I understand the time crunch parents are faced with just making it through most days, and this will influence decisions," he said.

Tilashalski also coaches youth soccer and has seen what can happen when children do not protect their teeth.

"For my kids, I have chosen to use custom mouth guards as they fit and feel better, do not interfere with speech, and are essentially invisible," Tilashalski said. "Mouth guards need to be replaced as they wear down, and athletes in the tooth-forming years will have to have these replaced more often as the mouth grows and the teeth change."

Tilashalski also says rinsing the guards off after use and storing in a hard container will help keep germs from building up. Athletes should not chew on the guards, as it will dramatically shorten their life span.

Between one-third and one-half of all athletes will receive a sportsrelated dental injury, and most of these occur in athletes who are not wearing mouth guards. Considering that the lifetime cost of replacing a permanent tooth has been estimated to exceed \$20,000, UAB dentists suggest a good mouth guard is one of the best investments to be made in sports equipment. It has been shown to




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


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

# Flu season and vaccines — what you need to know

While getting the flu shot may not keep you from getting the flu, it will provide you with some protection against future infections in subsequent seasons.

As the winter months and cold weather approach, so does flu season.

Approximately 970,000 Americans were hospitalized due to the flu in 2014, and more than 40 million were affected by flu-related illnesses, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. In addition to symptoms including sore throat, aches and fever, the flu can lead to serious health complications, such as pneumonia. These data, say UAB experts, are reason enough for Americans to receive their yearly influenza vaccine.

During recent flu seasons (October-May), between 80 and 90 percent of flu-related deaths have occurred in people 65 years

and older. The upcoming season's flu vaccine will protect against the influenza viruses that research indicates will be most common during the season. This includes two influenza A viruses (H1N1 and H3N2) and select influenza B viruses, depending on the flu vaccine.

"The flu shot can reduce the risk of hospitalization and severe disease due to the influenza virus in addition to reducing the incidence or severity," said Kevin Harrod, Ph.D., Benjamin Monroe Caraway Endowed Chair and professor in the Department of Anesthesiology and Perioperative Medicine. "The influenza vaccine is particularly beneficial to children, the elderly, those with underlying chronic disease — such as cardiac disease, and women during and after pregnancy."

Harrod says that the CDC's Advisory Commit

# Plan to succeed – UAB experts offer New Year's resolution tips

Many people start the new year with a list of lofty goals for self-improvement, but statistics say most of the 45 percent of Americans who typically make resolutions don't keep them all year long. In fact, according to the Statistic Brain Research Institute, only 8 percent of Americans who make resolutions are successful in achieving them, and other studies suggest that 80 percent of people will abandon those resolutions by February.

The No. 1 resolution on most lists? Losing weight. But even though statistics say resolutions do not typically yield results, they can still be worthwhile.

According to UAB Director of Employee Wellness Anna Threadcraft, RDN, there are four ways in which people can manage expectations of being healthy and keep their New Year's resolutions:

Start Small: When it comes to making health goals, start small. Begin incorporating small, sustainable changes into your lifestyle that you can stick with, not just the ones that sound good but you know you'll never maintain.

Plan Ahead: Whether you're married or single, your first date in 2017 needs to be with your grocery store. It's much easier to make wise choices if you have healthy options readily available.

Be Accountable: A lot of people fall off the wellness wagon within a few short weeks after setting goals so set yourself up for success. Place a reminder or check-in on your phone, or send a prescheduled email to yourself. Include reminders of why you're working on the goals, and ask yourself the questions you know you want to confidently answer when the reminder comes through.

Rest: We underestimate the simple power of being rested. Before you start making any huge health changes that require great effort, consider your sleeping patterns. There may be room for some simple improvement that goes a long way. Changes might include making a point to get more sleep in general, or working on improving

tee on Immunization Practices does not recommend the use of the live attenuated influenza vaccine, also known as the "nasal spray" flu vaccine, in the 2016-2017 influenza season.

"Data from last season showed the vaccine to be largely ineffective with the strains that are expected to circulate," Harrod said. "The vaccine effectiveness of the nasal spray has been shown to be lower the last three years and it is unclear if this is due to the strains that are circulating or some issue with the manufacture or administration of this vaccine."

In those same studies, the flu shot was shown to be largely effective.

# Signs and symptoms of flu

People who have the flu often feel some or all of these signs and symp-

- · Fever or feeling feverish/chills
- Cough
- · Sore throat
- · Runny or stuffy nose
- Muscle or body aches
- · Headaches
- Fatigue (very tired) Some people may have

vomiting and diarrhea, though this is more common in children than adults.

# How flu spreads

Most experts believe that flu viruses spread mainly by droplets made when people with flu cough, sneeze or talk. These droplets can land in the mouths or noses of people who are nearby. Less often, a person might also get flu by touching a surface or object that has flu virus on it and then touching their own mouth, eyes or possibly their nose.

# Period of contagiousness

Flu germs may be passed onto someone else before symptoms appear. Most healthy adults may be able to infect others beginning one day before symptoms develop and up to five to seven days after becoming sick. Some people, especially young children and people with weakened immune systems, might be able to infect others for an even longer time.

The time from when a person is exposed to flu virus to when symptoms begin is about one to four days, with an average of about two days.

# **Complications of flu**

Most people who get influenza will recover in several days to less than two weeks, but some people will develop complications as a result of the flu. A wide range of complications can be caused by

influenza virus infection of the upper respiratory tract (nasal passages, throat) and lower respiratory tract (lungs).

Complications of flu can include bacterial pneumonia, ear infections, sinus infections, dehydration and worsening of chronic medical conditions, such as congestive heart failure, asthma or diabetes.

While anyone can get sick with flu and become severely ill, some people are more likely to experience severe flu illness. Young children, adults ages 65 years and older, pregnant women, and people with certain chronic medical conditions are among those groups of people who are at high risk of serious flu complications.

# Get the vaccine anyway

'While getting the flu shot may not keep you from getting the flu, it will limit the severity and duration of the illness, and provide you with some protection against future infections in subsequent seasons," Harrod said. "Even in years when the flu vaccine is a 'bad match.' there is partial protection, as one's immune system can make antibodies that still recognize and bind to the influenza virus even when new strains emerge unexpectedly."

reduce the risk of sportsrelated dental injury by 60 times.

In 1962, high school and collegiate football players were required to wear faceguards and mouth protectors during practice sessions and in competition. Several studies confirm that, since this requirement, the percentage of orofacial injuries in football has dropped from approximately 50 percent to one-half of 1 percent.

According to the American Dental Association. an American Association of Orthodontists survey found that 84 percent of children do not wear mouth guards while playing organized sports because they are not required to wear them. Although other protective materials, such as goggles, helmets, shoulder pads or shin guards, are required in order to participate,

mouth guards sometimes are not.

"Our family rule is that a mouth guard must be worn for both practices and games," he said.

# Taking the field

Organized sports that have the most oral injuries include basketball, wrestling, field hockey, ice hockey, football, soccer, lacrosse, baseball and softball.

"Many cases of facial trauma are actually seen in unorganized or pickup sports activities," Tilashalski said. "Biking, skating and skateboarding are the recreational sports that have the highest chances of injury."

# In case of emergency

If a tooth is knocked out of its socket, the best thing to do is to put the tooth back into the socket.

"Even if a tooth has been knocked out, it often can be saved if you get to a dentist quickly enough," said Assistant Professor

and Director of the UAB Pediatric Dentistry Clinic Lina Soler-Ballman, DMD.

Depending on the injury, Soler-Ballman says that, in many cases, dentists have to splint damaged teeth with a flexible wire to hold them in place to heal. Some cases require a tooth-colored filling material to repair the tooth. In the worst-case scenario, damaged teeth have to be removed

"If the tooth is dirty, you can wash it off quickly with water," she said. "If you cannot place the tooth back into the socket, the preferred medium to store the tooth in is a tooth-saver solution, milk or saliva."

Tilashalski urges parents and children to play it safe when protecting teeth.

"I have four soccer players at home," he said. "Having a mouth guard in place seems a small price to pay to prevent a lifetime of dental treatment as a consequence of a knockedout tooth."

the quality of what you already get. When you are well-rested, you make better decisions, plan better and typically embrace life with a better attitude all the way around.

But many people do not focus just on physical health. UAB clinical psychologist Josh Klapow, Ph.D., says people should focus on mental wellness as well.

"Our thoughts and feelings have a direct impact on our overall well-being,' he said.

Klapow says taking hold of stress can have a lasting impact on mental well-

"Daily stresses have a funny way of building up to a point where people can feel overwhelmed," he

"Stressful situations can't always be stopped, but there are ways to manage the feelings of stress."

Klapow suggests writing down those stressful situations and putting checkmarks next to the ones that can be changed.

"Monitoring stress levels is a good habit to make, and taking short mental breaks can be helpful in breaking up the high-tension moments," Klapow said.



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

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# Jimmy Fallon does the Golden Globes his way as this year's host

Since he basically hosts a party every weeknight, Jimmy Fallon expects to feel at home at The Golden Globe Awards.

The current "Tonight Show" star succeeds others including Ricky Gervais and the team of Tina Fey and Amy Poehler as he presides over NBC's telecast of the Hollywood Foreign Press Association's 74th annual celebration of film and television Sunday, Jan. 8, from Los Angeles' Beverly Hilton Hotel. Movies and television programs of the past year will be honored, and Meryl Streep — a winner of eight Golden Globes — will receive the Cecil B. DeMille Award for career achievement, and Sylvester Stallone's daughters Sophia, Sistine and Scarlet will help hand out the statues by sharing the title Miss Golden Globe.

Knowing the event's typically loose feel, Fallon is planning to maintain it in his own way. Previously an Emmy Awards host, the "Saturday Night Live" alum says that "according to our network, this is the biggest award show that we have. I was like, 'Let's do it up. Let's make it glitzy and glamorous.' That's what an award show should be; I love that type of stuff. After seeing Tina and Amy crush it, and Ricky crush it, I want to see

what we can do that's different but still keep it fun."

Fallon indicates that will be "a lot of the stuff we do on the ('Tonight') show, and still keep that vibe. The surprises can be in who wins The Golden Globes, but we have that positivity that we've never lost from 'The Tonight Show.' I love pop culture and TV and movies. If there weren't entertainers, I wouldn't have a show ... they're all my guests. Basically, 90 percent of my guests will be in that (Golden Globes) audience, and it's like, 'Hey, we're all here. This is so cool that we get to do this.' It's very showbizzy, and I like it.'

Though the Hollywood Foreign Press Association often takes its shots from The Golden Globes host during the show, the ever-friendly Fallon notes that "they've been super-great with me. They haven't said 'No' to anything. There were a couple of changes I wanted to make, because I've been to The Golden Globes a couple of times as an audience member. It's more the technical stuff; I've said, 'What do you think about this or that?, and they've said, 'Yeah, we can make that work

On the movie front, "La La Land" leads the Golden Globe nominees with seven bids — and on the TV side, "The People v. O.J. Simpson: American

Crime Story" is in front with five nominations. The November announcement of Streep as the DeMille honoree gave Fallon an immediate dose of comfort about his role at the event: 'I was like, 'Oh, fantastic!' Just to get Meryl Streep, that sets the bar. It'll be a classy night, top-of-the-line. You can't get much cooler than that."

You also can't write the show too far in advance, Fallon reasons, because of what other programs might do. "You come up with an idea for something, then somebody will host (an earlier award show) and they'll take that idea. Then you get another idea, and 'Saturday Night Live' does a sketch with it. There are so many people doing variety now, I can't plan that far ahead. It's really tricky, but we have a general idea of what we want to do with the opening, and I don't think anybody else will do that."

Whatever the outcome, Fallon intends to enjoy himself as the Golden Globes unfold. "It's definitely going to be a big night, and definitely fun," he forecasts. "I know what it's like to watch it, and the job's not over for these entertainers (who appear at the ceremony), because this is being broadcast. It's like, 'Make it a good show for people at home.' And it's the best of film and TV, so it's like two award shows in one."

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

WHEREAS the City of Fairhope has adopted the Fairhope Subdivision Regulations that regulate the subdivision of land and multiple occupancy projects within the city limits and the five-mile planning jurisdiction;

WHEREAS there has been rapid and substantial growth in and around the City of Fairhope; and

Section 1. Moratorium Established. Except as hereafter set forth, a moratorium is imposed upon the acceptance and consideration of all Subdivision and Multiple Occupancy Project Applications by the City of Fairhope Planning Commission (the "Moratorium").

Section 2. Exemption for Current Projects. Notwithstanding anything contained in Section 1 hereof to the contrary, the Moratorium shall not apply to any project for which any of the following has been made to and received by the City of Fairhope Planning Commission prior to the effective date of this ordinance:

a. Application for preliminary plat approval; or
b. Application for final plat

c. Application for multiple occupancy project approval.

Section 3. Categorical Exemptions. The following forms of subdivision are expressly exempted by the Moratorium based upon a finding by the City Council that such subdivisions do not materially impact the issues sought to be addressed during the Moratorium:

a. Replat as defined in Article IV, Section E. of the Fairhope Subdivision Regulations.

b. Minor Subdivisions as that term is defined in the Subdivision

Section 4. Effective Period of Moratorium. The Moratorium shall be effective immediately upon passage, publication as required by law, and shall continue for a period of six (6) months, unless terminated sooner by action of the City Council.

Section 5. Severability. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance, or its application to any person or circumstance, be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid for any reason, or should any portion of this ordinance be pre-empted by state or federal law or regulation, such decision or pre-exemption shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance or its application to other persons or circumstances.



# THE RATIONALE OF **GOOD DEFENSE**

The bidding:

South

Good defense is mostly a matter of visualizing declarer's hand and utilizing this knowledge to obtain the best possible result. Consider this deal where West leads the king of clubs, on which East plays the gueen.

It is widely accepted that the play of the queen under partner's king at trick one signifies a singleton or possession of the jack. West therefore returns a low club at trick two, confident that Fast will either ruff or play the jack.

After East wins the trick, he is faced with the crucial problem of what to play next. But there are many clues to guide him to the proper return. Most of these clues come from the bidding.

East knows that West must have five clubs for his overcall, which means that South has no more clubs. He likewise knows that South bid diamonds before he bid spades, giving South a 4-2-5-2 or 4-3-4-2

distribution. (If South had only one heart, West would have had five hearts and almost surely would have overcalled with one heart rather than two clubs.)

North

So, by putting all of these inferences together, East concludes that a club continuation would be futile and that a heart shift might be critical. He therefore returns the deuce of hearts at trick three.


The shift strikes pay dirt when West scores the A-Q of hearts to put the contract down one. Actually, after taking the king of hearts with the ace. West might have a problem deciding whether to try to cash the queen of hearts or the ace of clubs, but this is an easy problem to solve.

East's lead of the deuce of hearts (fourth-best) indicates that he cannot have more than four cards in the suit, so South must have started with at least two hearts. West therefore plays the queen and defeats the contract.

Observe that without this precise defense, declarer would end up making four spades.
