BI-LAWS

The purpose of our organization is for charitable, religious, and educational purposes.

- Spread the word about Father Solanus and his Cause
- Hold (2) two raffles per year to raise funds for the Capuchin Soup Kitchen in Detroit and the Cause of Father Solanus for sainthood in the Catholic Church.
- Father Solanus Guild/Holy Family Circle is a subsidiary of the Father Solanus Center in Detroit, MI
- The Elected Officers who shall initially be appointed to serve as Officers until such Officer's death, resignation, or removal as provided by these bylaws. Elections are held once per year.
- 2. The initial number of Officers shall be three (3) and may be increased or decreased without further amendment of these bylaws. At no time may the number of Directors be less than (3) three.
- 3. The Elected Officers shall have authority of decisions based on majority vote of members.
- Meetings held 4th Monday of each month (September to May) at Our Lady of the Scapular Church, Wyandotte, MI 48192, in the social room.
- 5. Meetings are adjourned by two members attending.
- Any vacancy occurring shall be filled by majority vote of the members. Each person so elected shall serve until the duration of the unexpired term. The Elected Officers shall serve one year terms.
- 7. Any Officer may be removed by majority vote of the members for failure to act in the best interests of the organizations.
- 8. Officers shall receive no compensation for their service as Officers. The position is strictly volunteer.

Officers

- 1. Designation of Officers. The officers of the Corporation shall be the President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer, and they shall have authority to carry out the duties prescribed in these bylaws. One person may hold more than one office, except no person may hold the office of President and Secretary.
- 2. Election and Term. Officers shall be reelected yearly, and shall serve for one year or until their replacements are elected and qualified.
- 3. Removal. At any regular meeting, any officer may be removed by majority vote of the members for failure to carry out the duties of the office as prescribed by these bylaws.
- 4. Compensation. There is none since all work is volunteer only.
- 5. Vacancy. Vacancies, in any office for any reason, shall be filled by an elected officer for the unexpired term of office.

- 3. Deposits. All funds of the Father Solanus Guild/Holy Family Circle shall be deposited at Lake Trust Credit Union in the Father Solanus Guild/Holy Family Circle bank account.

Dissolution

Upon dissolution of the Father Solanus Guild/Holy Family Circle, the elected officers shall, after paying or making provision for payment of all liabilities of the Father Solanus Guild/Holy Family Circle, dispose of all the assets of the Father Solanus Guild/Holy Family Circle to the Father Solanus Center in Detroit, MI. None of the assets will be distributed to any officer.

This responds to your May 19, 2015, request for information regarding the status of your group tax exemption.

You have further represented that none of your subordinate organizations is a private foundation under section 509(a), although all subordinates do not all share the same sub-classification under section 509(a). Based on your representations, the subordinate organizations in the Official Catholic Directory for 2015 are recognized as exempt under section 501(c)(3) of the Code under GEN 0928.

Donors may deduct contributions to you and your subordinate organizations as provided in section 170 of the Code. Gentlemen and Madam:

This correspondence serves to encourage the members of City Council to continue negotiations with Coachlight Investments relative to the possible redevelopment of the McKinley School site. Note that two of the three dissenting votes on this issue were members of the Council in 2012 when the City obtained possession of the McKinley School building through a property exchange with the school district and both voted affirmatively to consummate the exchange. While it appears that there is some issues as to why the proposed project is unacceptable to three council members, all of the reasons for this opposition remains a bit of a mystery. In my opinion, one councilmember characterizes a 55 and older independent senior living center as "rental apartments" which have historically had a negative connotation within the City. Another councilmember has an issue with the lack of a significant purchase price at the closing of the project. The last councilmember has never disclosed the reason for the lack of support for the project.

I would like to provide my perspective on the project including these facts:

- The School District made the decision to close McKinley School due to a lack of enrollment in the District and to address the financial impact of an excess of facility capacity. This occurred in 2009.
- The School District attempted to market the resale of the building for over three years. The most detailed discussions being to locate a senior center on the property. The School District could not reach an agreement for the sale of the building.
- 3. The City and the School District consummated a property swap in December of 2012. The City obtained the McKinley School property while the School District obtained the Memorial pool, the former Maverick Saloon, and a lot adjacent to Taft School. The primary reason for this property swap was to allow the City to use its expertise in redeveloping property for the McKinley site while also getting the blighted exterior of Memorial Pool fixed which was difficult for the City due to the fact that the facility was located outside our TIFA District.
- The City sent out a Request for Proposals in 2013 and received only two responses by the deadline in November of 2013. Both respondents proposed a senior living center at the site.
- 5. In February of 2014, the City's administration recommended Coachlight Properties as the preferred developer. A main consideration for this recommendation was based on the fact that the development was to be privately-owned with no governmental subsidy or involvement that was required to pay real property taxes not a payment in lieu of tax.

- 6. After receiving the original proposal from the developer, a community meeting was held at the Copeland Center on September 24, 2014. A subsequent community meeting was held on April 22, 2015. As a result of this public input, many changes have been made to the proposed development including decreased density, more parking per unit, preservation of the existing school building, and requirements for complimentary architectural features for the new part of the project.
- 7. In December of 2015, the City Council directed the City Engineer and City Attorney to bring back a completed purchase agreement to the City Council. This purchase agreement was presented on April 23, 2016, another special meeting of the Council was held on May 5, 2016, and the purchase agreement was not approved due to a deadlocked City Council on May 16, 2016.

Lastly, to remove the deadlock, I would ask this council to support my request to have the City Engineer and City Attorney renegotiate the purchase agreement for the sale of the McKinley School property. This project is too important to our City to be unresolved.

BACKGROUND: The Electric Department (11th Street/Storeroom) currently is utilizing a forklift purchased in 1974 that is at the end of its useful life, primarily experiencing transmission failure that is now beyond repair. As a stopgap measure, the Electric Department has had to rent a forklift at a cost of \$ 2,500/month. When considering a replacement, existing forklifts on the market still use a transmission and brakes like a standard car and the current forklift, this leads to significant maintenance costs over time. Brake shoes wear out, parking brakes need to be adjusted, and parking brakes need to be set when you get off the lift and transmission fluid needs to be checked. The proposed replacement forklift, a Linde H50T, is hydrostatic, meaning it is driven by the hydraulic pump used for lifting and all other aspects of the lift. Operating the lift in this manner allows for automatic stopping when your foot is removed from the accelerator pedal, no brakes to adjust, replace or fail. Also, other lifts control the engine speed with one foot on the accelerator and one on the brake to operate the forks and tilt, this unit raises the idle on its own for operation. Also, the Linde H50T lift is safer by allowing a better view of loads through use of overhead tilt cylinders, automatic parking brakes due to design and the unit lets you know if you are lifting an excessive amount of weight, it will not let you over lift. Finally, this model is rated for towing and pushing, allowing for additional use in moving cable trailers and other equipment throughout the yard. In doing research, the U.S. government has gone with the Linde H50T after years of using Clark as their forklift of choice. The Linde H50T is the unit that most closely meets the needs of the Electric Department in terms of safety and intended/enhanced utilization and is the recommended forklift for the Electric Department by WMS management.

Given the estimated useful life of the forklift an outright purchase is also part of the recommendation of WMS management.

WMS Executive Summary - Six (6) Month Financial Results for the period ending March 31, 2016

Electric

Electric operations resulted in a net loss of \$ 313,000 compared to a net loss of \$ 328,000 for the same period last year. On a comparative basis netting the impact of implementing GASB 68, operating results are breakeven. This represents the strongest operating results mid-year for Electric in the last four (4) fiscal years and bodes well for the balance of the fiscal year as we enter the warmer months.

Year to year variances:

o Revenue

- The mild winter contributed to a decline in steam and residential rate class revenue, commercial rate classes held steady.
- Facility charges to BASF for the steam line terminated in August 2015, therefore that revenue stream no longer exists.
- Reciprocal Power Sales Revenue generated by the sale of electricity pursuant to long-term Power Purchase Agreements (PPA's) had the biggest impact on the revenue decline mid-year. This decline is due to the current low cost of market power. However, this also provides validation to the economic dispatch model adopted by WMS and costs associated with purchasing power for use locally.
- Grant revenue declined as activity wrapped up on expiring grants in the prior year with those grants now closed.

o Expenditures

- Fuel costs declined dramatically. Natural Gas and a small amount of diesel fuel were the only fuels utilized with Natural Gas expenditures decreasing \$ 1.1M from the previous year. This is attributed to the mild winter, low market prices and strategic hedging to minimize risk.
- Calculated decisions made regarding power generation have been realized as observed by the decrease in Power Plant related expenditures for wages & benefits. Also, adoption of an economic dispatch model for market electric purchases has allowed WMS to take advantage of current inexpensive market power to meet customer needs.
- Electric T&D maintenance and service has been boosted by the addition one (1) Lineman.
- Administrative costs were impacted due to securing the 4th Floor of 3200 Biddle for final consolidation of WMS operations from 3005 Biddle to meet the City's Strategic Plan initiative.
- Retiree costs represent healthcare premiums paid currently, healthcare liability for current actives and retirees covered by traditional retiree healthcare (OPEB) and the expense associated with the liability for Defined Benefit pensions (GASB 68). GASB 68 was adopted at the end of FY15 and would not have been included in mid-year operating results for FY15. As noted, the impact on FY16 is \$ 312,000 of additional expense year to date.

Budget to actual variances:

o Revenue

Budget allocations have been made evenly over 12 months. This may result in budgeted revenue figures that are weighted disproportionately relative to actual operations that are seasonal in nature.

- As is the case with actual results, the low cost of market power has impacted the sale of power generated pursuant to PPA's into the market and has resulted in a budgeted figure for Reciprocal Power sales that most likely will remain unfavorable for the balance of the fiscal year.
- GASB 68 expense was not budgeted as information was not available from the Actuary until January 2016.

Expenditures

- Budget allocations have been made evenly over 12 months. This may result in budgeted expenditure figures YTD that are weighted disproportionately relative to actual operations that are seasonal in nature.
- Favorable variances for fuel and purchased power parallel comments previously noted.
- Favorable variances for T&D were caused by vehicle leases not finalized until April 2016 and construction season projects that will not materialize until the summer.

Capital Project Status:

All capital projects are within budget year to date.

Water

Water operations resulted in a net loss YTD through March 31, 2016 of \$ 63,000 compared to net income
of \$ 212,000 for the same period last year. On a comparative basis netting the impact of implementing
GASB 68, operations resulted in net income of \$ 93,000.

Year to year variances:

- o Revenue
 - Water revenue declined mid-year from last year by \$ 140,000. This is due to the mild winter and the decline in demand for steam by Electric customers which impacts the need for water to make steam and thus the decrease in water revenue.

o Expenditures

- Filter Plant operations proved less costly mid-year due to personnel turnover caused by retirements/transfers with new hires compensated with benefit packages that include lower retirement costs.
- Cost variances in the Superintendent's Department center on benefit cost changes, primarily related to the actuarial required contribution % for the Defined Benefit Pension Plan. This % changed during the current fiscal year from 31.72% to 40.50% for covered payroll and becomes more apparent in departments with fewer employees.
- Retiree costs represent healthcare premiums paid currently, healthcare liability for current active and retirees covered by traditional retiree healthcare (OPEB) and the expense associated with Defined Benefit pensions (GASB 68). GASB 68 was adopted at the end of FY15 and would not have been included in mid-year operating results for FY15. As noted, the impact on FY16 is \$ 156,000 of additional expense year to date.

Budget to actual variances:

- Revenues and expenditures
 - Budget allocations have been made evenly over 12 months. This may result in budgeted figures YTD that are weighted disproportionately relative to actual operations that are seasonal in nature.
 - Unfavorable Revenue and expenditure variances parallel those for year to year variances centering around the mild winter impact on steam sales and thus water use and the implementation of GASB 68 which was not included in the FY16 budget due to information not being available from the Actuary until January 2016.

Capital Project Status:

All capital projects are within budget year to date.

Cable

Cable operations resulted in net income through March 31, 2016 of \$ 132,000 compared to net income
last year for the same period of \$ 403,000. The decline in net income year to year is primarily due to
programming royalty increases that have outpaced the decline in subscribers and the cost for additional
bandwidth for enhanced internet speeds. On a comparative basis netting the impact of implementing
GASB 68, operations resulted in net income of \$ 156,000.

· Year to year variances:

o Revenue

- Revenue from cable television service decreased \$ 116,000 from the prior year.
- Revenue from internet service increased \$ 44,000 from the prior year.
- Commercial insertion revenue decreased \$ 24,000, primarily due to the lack of political advertising mid-term in the fall of 2015.
- Comparative subscriber counts for selected service categories are as follows:

Category	March 2016	March 2015
Cable TV	6,093	6,567
Internet	4,766	4,742
VoIP	1,069	1,159

o Expenditures

- Pension contributions as a % of payroll and wage adjustments led to an increase in costs to operate the TV Studio. This increase impacted all departments with employees who participate in the traditional DB Pension Plan; however it is more apparent for departments with fewer individuals assigned.
- Programming royalty increases continue to outpace subscriber declines resulting in deterioration in the contribution to net income. An updated cost of service analysis will be completed in conjunction with the FY2017 budget to address matters relative to this issue.
- Pass-thru fees continue to rise as the cost to retransmit broadcast signals for local TV has increased.
- An analysis of time spent by the Customer Assistance Department on activities related to each utility resulted in an increase in the allocation to Cable.
- Administrative costs rose due the addition of bandwidth to accommodate increased internet user speeds and rental expenses to secure the 4th Floor of 3200 Biddle Avenue for final consolidation of WMS operations from 3005 Biddle Avenue, including the Headend and Server Room, to fulfil the City's Strategic Plan.
- Retiree costs represent healthcare premiums paid currently, healthcare liability for current active and retirees covered by traditional retiree healthcare (OPEB) and the expense associated with Defined Benefit pensions (GASB 68). GASB 68 was adopted at the end of FY15 and would not have been included in mid-year operating results for FY15. As noted, the impact on FY16 is \$ 24,000 of additional expense year to date.

Budget to actual variances:

- Budget allocations have been made evenly over 12 months and are representative of a true allocation as Cable operations are not seasonal in nature.
- Cable results are trending favorably relative to the annual budget for FY2016.

Capital Project Status:

All capital projects are within budget year to date.

BACKGROUND: In accordance with the EPA Consent Decree for the Sewage Treatment Plant in Wyandotte the City's Operation & Maintenance (O & M) Work Plan was approved January 18, 2006. The O & M Work Plan requires the cleaning, televising and repair of all sewers in the City. In the last ten (10) years the City has cleaned, televised and repaired all sewers as per attached map with the exception of the area recently televised south of Eureka. This year, an area from Eureka Avenue to Grove Street between 16th Street and 13th Street was cleaned and televised. The results identified four areas of repair that need to be corrected by slip-lining.

The City currently has a contract with LiquiForce to complete this work. The attached estimated cost to complete this work is \$ 98,401.60.

STRATEGIC PLAN/GOALS: Committed to maintaining and developing excellent neighborhoods by: Matching tools and efforts to the conditions in city neighborhoods; tracking infrastructure conditions in all neighborhoods. The City will work to establish and sustain the quality of street lighting, sidewalks, curbs. gutters and pavement. Continuing neighborhood renewal projects, where needed, in order to revitalize structures and infrastructures in residential and commercial areas.

ACTION REQUESTED: Approve the slip-lining work at the following locations.

The four sewer lines are located as follows;

- 1. MH# 725- MH# 724 is located north of Grove between 15th and 14th in the vacated alley.

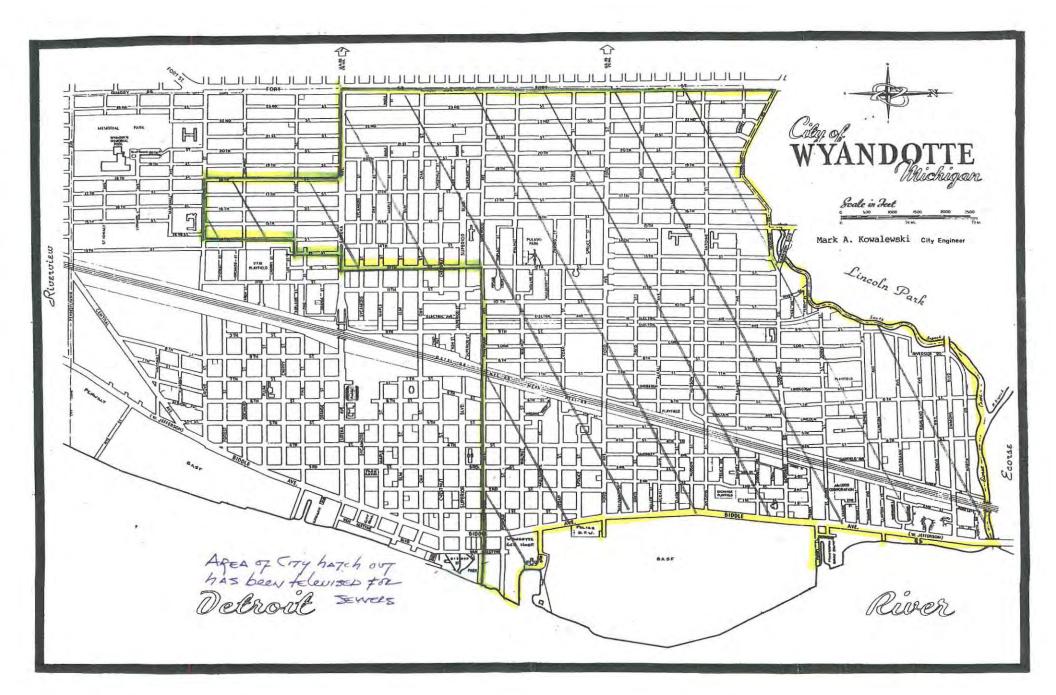

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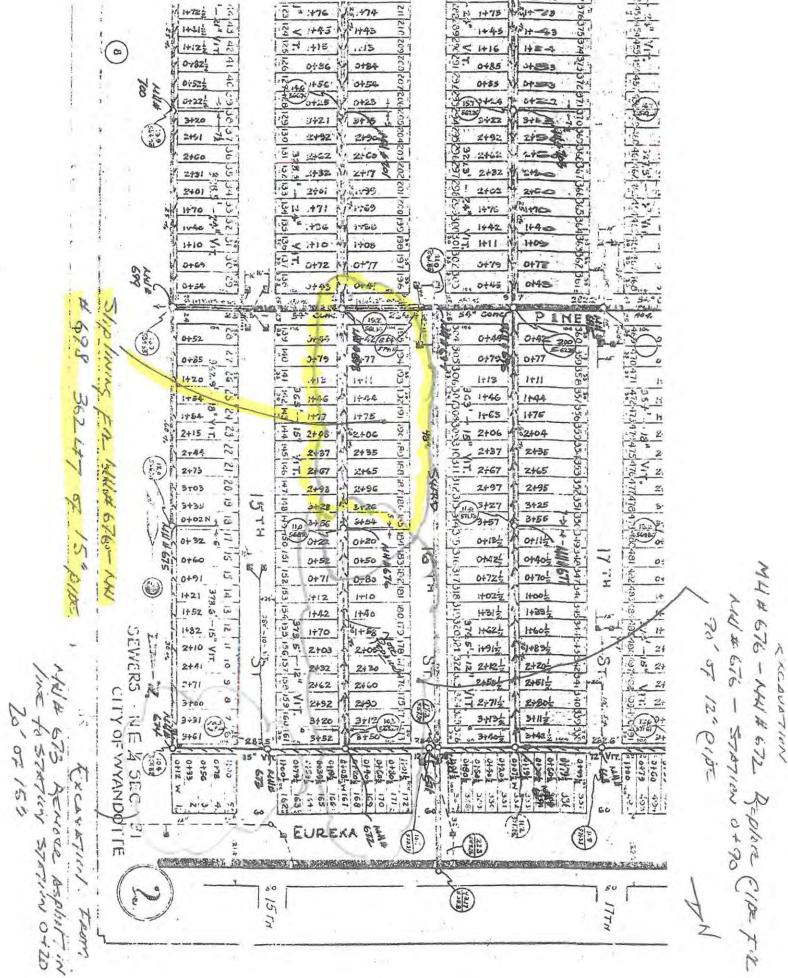

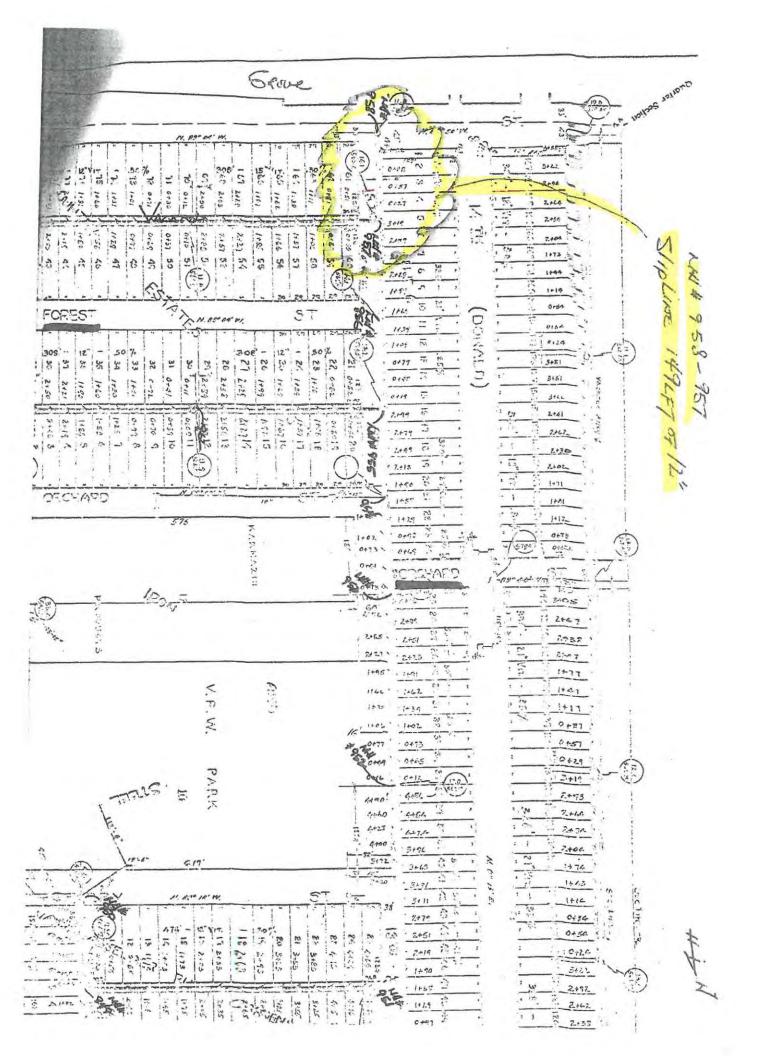

ITEM: HEARING - General City Election Schedule

PRESENTER: Lawrence S. Stec, City Clerk

INDIVIDUALS IN ATTENDANCE: Lawrence S. Stec

BACKGROUND: PA100 of 2015, effective September of 2015, enacted changes to the dates in which elections could be held. Essentially, it eliminated the ability to hold any elections in February, with the exception of special elections. The City of Wyandotte's current election schedule for city offices includes an odd-year May election with a primary in the preceding February. Under the new state law governing election dates, "If a city's regular election is held on the May regular election date, the city shall not hold a regular primary election". Due to this change in law (MCL 168.642), and the impact that it has on our current election calendar for city offices, it is necessary that we change the city calendar in order to comply with the new law. According to Lori Bourbonais, an administrative lawyer with the State of Michigan Bureau of Elections, the City of Wyandotte has the following options and action items based on option chosen:

- 1. The city may choose to keep the May election date.
 - a. Nothing needs to be done and the February primary is eliminated by operation of law.
- 2. The city may choose to move to the odd-year August/November election schedule.
 - a. The terms of the current elected officials would be extended by approx. 6 months
 - b. This would need to be passed by resolution in compliance with section 642 no later than December 31, 2016.
- 3. The city may choose to move to the even-year August/November election schedule.
 - a. The terms of the current elected officials would be extended by approx. 18 months
 - b. This would need to be passed by TWO resolutions one moving the election schedule to August/November of the odd-year and immediately after, another moving the election schedule to August/November of the even-year in compliance with section 642 no later than December 31, 2016.

If either option 2 or 3 are chosen, in order to be in compliance with Section 642 with the resolutions to move the election schedule, the council would need to hold at least 1 public hearing on the resolution with appropriate notice given to reach the largest number of the jurisdiction's qualified electors in a timely fashion. The council would need to vote on the resolution and, on a record roll call vote, a majority of the council's board members, elected or appointed, and serving, adopt the resolution and file said resolution with the Secretary of State.

It is the recommendation of the Clerk that the city chooses to continue to hold the elections for city offices in May, as it currently stands. This recommendation is based on the following factors:

- 1. The city will realize a cost savings due to a decrease in the number of elections held. The average cost of a local election is approximately \$25,000.
- An election takes months of preparation before and follow-up after the actual election
 day. Eliminating an election will free up Clerk and DPS staff to focus on the many duties
 that need to be performed on a daily basis.
- Keeping the election in May creates consistency for the voting population of the City of Wyandotte.
- The review of the results of the May 2009 General Election, which showed an
 overwhelming response of the public to hold city elections in May of an odd year and
 every fourth year thereafter.

In the interest of providing complete information, should the May elections stand, the filing deadline would be 15 weeks prior to the May 2, 2017 election (January 17, 2017) and nominating petitions would need to be available to the public for beginning candidate procedures by 180 days prior to the filing deadline (July 21, 2016). The date that the resolutions need to be final in order to take effect is December 31, 2016; although, this would put quite the burden on those planning to run for office should the Council decide in December to keep the elections in May.

<u>ACTION REQUESTED:</u> To hear public opinion regarding the election schedule for the general city elections and refer Council recommendation to the Clerk for preparation of proper resolutions/hearings/etc. necessary.

Beth,

It is my understanding that the City of Wyandotte currently holds its city elections on the odd-year May election date. Additionally, prior to the elimination of the February election date, Wyandotte held its city primary election on the February election date. You have asked what options the city has now if it wishes to keep its odd-year May election, or if it wishes to keep the option of a primary, how to move to an even- or odd-year August/November schedule.

If the city wishes to keep the May election date, nothing needs to be done and the February primary is eliminated by operation of law:

If, on September 1, 2004, a city holds its regular election at other than a regular November election date, the city council may choose to hold the regular election on the May regular election date by adopting a resolution in compliance with this section. Except as provided in section 642a, if a city council adopts the resolution in compliance with this section to hold its regular election on the May regular election date, after December 31, 2004, the city's regular election is on the May regular election date. If a city's regular election is held on the May regular election date, the city shall not hold a regular primary election.

MCL 168.642(2). (Emphasis added).

If the City wishes to move to the odd-year August/November schedule, it may do so by resolution. MCL 168.642a(1) provides:

After December 31, 2004, a city council that adopted a resolution so that its regular election is held on the May regular election date may change its regular election to the odd year general election by adopting a resolution in compliance with section 642. If a city council adopts the resolution in compliance with section 642 to hold its regular election at the odd year general election, after December 31 of the year in which the resolution is adopted, the city's regular election is at the odd year general election.

The change would take effect the year after the resolution is adopted. Here is the pertinent section of 642 that talks about the requirements of the resolution:

- (7) A resolution permitted under this section or section 642a is valid only if a city council adopts the resolution in compliance with all of the following:
 - (a) The resolution is adopted before 1 of the following:
 - (i) If the resolution is permitted under subsection (2),
 - (3), or (4), January 1, 2005.

- (ii) If the resolution is permitted under section 642a(1), (2), or (4), January 1 of the year in which the change in the date of the election takes effect.
- (b) Before adopting the resolution, the council holds at least 1 public hearing on the resolution. The public hearing may be held on the same day and immediately before considering the adoption of the resolution.
- (c) The council gives notice of each public hearing on the resolution in a manner designed to reach the largest number of the jurisdiction's qualified electors in a timely fashion.
- (d) The council votes on the resolution and, on a record roll call vote, a majority of the council's board members, elected or appointed, and serving, adopt the resolution.
- (e) The council files the resolution with the secretary of state.

MCL 168.642(7).

Unfortunately, there is no section that allows the city to move directly from May to even-year August/November. However, MCL 168.642a(4) allows a city to move from the odd-year August/November to the even-year August/November schedule:

After December 31, 2011, a city that holds its regular election for city offices annually or in the odd year on the November regular election date may change its regular election schedule to the even year general election and the even year primary election by adopting a resolution in compliance with section 642. If a city council adopts the resolution in compliance with section 642, after December 31 of the year in which the resolution is adopted, the city's regular election is at the even year general election and its primary is at the even year primary election.

MCL 168.642a(4). So what the city could do is pass a resolution that moves the city's election to odd-year August/November and then immediately pass a resolution that moves the city to the even-year August/November. And again, the change would take effect in the year after the resolutions are passed and the resolutions would have to comply with MCL 168.642(7). This could all be done at one meeting.

The one other thing to remember is that this process may temporary lengthen a term of office, but a term may never be shortened:

A term of office shall not be shortened by the provisions of sections 641 to 644i. An officer scheduled by prior law to be elected at a time other than the odd year general election shall not be elected on the date scheduled but shall continue in office until a successor takes office after being elected in the first odd year general election following that date. If the regular election date for holding a jurisdiction's regular election is changed under section 642, 642a, or 642c, the term of an official who was elected before the effective date of the change continues until a successor is elected and qualified at the next regular election.

- (b) A city shall hold its regular election primary at the odd year primary election.
- (c) A city that holds its regular election for a city office annually or in the even year on the November regular election date shall continue holding elections on that schedule.
- (d) A city that holds its regular election primary for a city office annually or in the even year on the August regular primary election date shall continue holding primary elections on that schedule.
- (2) If, on September 1, 2004, a city holds its regular election at other than a regular November election date, the city council may choose to hold the regular election on the May regular election date by adopting a resolution in compliance with this section. Except as provided in section 642a, if a city council adopts the resolution in compliance with this section to hold its regular election on the May regular election date, after December 31, 2004, the city's regular election is on the May regular election date. If a city's regular election is held on the May regular election date, the city shall not hold a regular primary election.
- (3) If, on September 1, 2004, a city holds its regular election annually or in the even year on the November regular election date, the city council may choose to hold the regular election at the odd year general election by adopting a resolution in compliance with this section. Except as provided in section 642a, if a city council adopts the resolution in compliance with this section to hold its regular election at the odd year general election, after December 31, 2004, the city's regular election is at the odd year election. If a city's regular election is held at the odd year general election, the city's regular election primary shall be held at the odd year primary election.
- (4) If, on September 1, 2004, a city holds its regular election annually on the November regular election date, the city council may choose to hold the regular election at the even year general election by adopting a resolution in compliance with this section. Except as provided in section 642a, if a city council adopts the resolution in compliance with this section to hold its regular election at the even year general election, after December 31, 2004, the city's regular

(2) If, on September 1, 2004, a city holds its regular election at other than a regular November election date, the city council may choose to hold the regular election on the May regular election date by adopting a resolution in compliance with this section. Except as provided in section 642a, if a city council adopts the resolution in compliance with this section to hold its regular election on the May regular election date, after December 31, 2004, the city's regular election is on the May regular election date. If a city's regular election is held on the May regular election date, the city shall not hold a regular primary election.

(3) If, on September 1, 2004, a city holds its regular election annually or in the even year on the November regular election date, the city council may choose to hold the regular election at the odd year general election by adopting a resolution in compliance with this section. Except as provided in section 642a, if a city council adopts the resolution in compliance with this section to hold its regular election at the odd year general election, after December 31, 2004, the city's regular election is at the odd year election. If a city's regular election is held at the odd year general election, the city's regular election primary shall be held at the odd

year primary election.

- (4) If, on September 1, 2004, a city holds its regular election annually on the November regular election date, the city council may choose to hold the regular election at the even year general election by adopting a resolution in compliance with this section. Except as provided in section 642a, if a city council adopts the resolution in compliance with this section to hold its regular election at the even year general election, after December 31, 2004, the city's regular election is at the even year election. If a city's regular election is held at the even year general election, the city's regular election primary shall be held at the even year primary election.
 - (5) A village shall hold its regular election as follows:
- (a) A village shall hold its regular election for a village office at the general election and the appropriate township clerk shall conduct the election.

(b) A village shall not hold a regular primary election.

- (6) If a village's special election is held in conjunction with another election conducted by a township, the village shall pay the township a proportionate share of the election expenses. If a village's special election is not held in conjunction with another election conducted by a township, the village shall pay the township 100% of the actual costs of conducting the village's special election.
- (7) A resolution permitted under this section or section 642a is valid only if a city council adopts the resolution in compliance with all of the following:

(a) The resolution is adopted before 1 of the following:

(i) If the resolution is permitted under subsection (2), (3), or (4), January 1, 2005.

- (ii) If the resolution is permitted under section 642a(1), (2), or (4), January 1 of the year in which the change in the date of the election takes effect.
- (b) Before adopting the resolution, the council holds at least 1 public hearing on the resolution. The public hearing may be held on the same day and immediately before considering the adoption of the resolution.
- (c) The council gives notice of each public hearing on the resolution in a manner designed to reach the largest number of the jurisdiction's qualified electors in a timely fashion.
- (d) The council votes on the resolution and, on a record roll call vote, a majority of the council's board members, elected or appointed, and serving, adopt the resolution.
 - (e) The council files the resolution with the secretary of state.

1. Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by John at 6:01 pm.

2. Reading and Approval of Previous Minutes:

- a. <u>April 13, 2016 Regular Meeting</u>: After review of the minutes, Andrea made a motion, seconded by Alice, to approve the draft minutes of the April 13, 2016 regular meeting of the Beautification Commission without change. The motion was approved.
- 3. <u>Approval of Agenda:</u> Motion was made by Alice, seconded by Andrea, to approve this meeting's agenda without change. The motion was approved.

4. Chairperson's Report:

- a. Documents: An updated 2016 Attendance Report and Contact List were distributed.
- b. <u>Commissioner Re-Appointment, Alice Ugljesa:</u> John reported that Alice has been re-appointed to the Commission, effective May 2, 2016, with her term expiring April, 2019. She was congratulated by all.
- c. <u>Commissioner Appointment, Kelly Dodson:</u> John reported that Ms. Kelly Dodson has been appointed to the Beautification Commission to fill the unexpired term of Lisa Lesage, term to expire April, 2018. She was congratulated by all.
- d. <u>Commission Vacancies and Recruitment:</u> Applications are being received and are under active consideration, including one from this evening's guest, Mr. Michael Bak. John introduced Mr. Bak, who discussed his background and interests in the vacant Commissioner position with all.
- e. <u>DDA Update:</u> It was reported that Noel, Alice, Andrea, and Linda comprise the Beautification Commission's Sub-Committee for the Eureka Road Viaduct Re-Planting Project. John reported that he emailed Joe Gruber, on request, a copy of the DDA Master Planting Plan with Sprinkler Zone Map, and Updated 2015-2016 Budget Plan, and provided contact information for our landscape supplies vendor, Panetta's Landscape Supplies, Inc.

5. Treasurer's Report:

- a. <u>FY 2015-2016 YTD Expense Report</u>: John reported new approved expenses in the current FY 2015-2016 budget, namely 34 yards of topsoil at wholesale price (\$25.00/yard) in the amount of \$1025.00, with delivery, and various supplies for the Spring Clean-Up totaling \$64.06, leaving a current balance of \$3,271.57.
- b. <u>Approved FY 2015-2016 Budget Plan, As Revised 4/13/16</u>: The revised Budget Plan, as approved at the 4/13/16 Commission meeting, was distributed. It reflects the topsoil purchase and the one-time funding grant to cover that purchase.
- c. Accounting Policy New Vendor Information Request Form & Electronic Payment: John distributed and reviewed this new Accounting Policy which requires all vendors and suppliers who invoice the Beautification Commission to complete an Authorization Agreement to receive electronic payment for their services and products. Each commissioner needs to ensure that this Agreement is completed one-time for all vendors with whom they do business on the Commission's behalf. This policy is effective immediately.
- d. Accounting Policy Request for Travel & Education Approval Form: John distributed and reviewed this new Accounting Policy which requires that all expenditures for education and travel over \$25.00 must be approved by the City council's Education Committee prior to reimbursement of a Commissioner's educational (registration fee) expenses. Each commissioner needs to ensure that this Request Form is completed and submitted to the Mayor's Office prior to registration for the event. This policy is effective immediately.

6. Communications and Event Marketing Report:

- a. <u>Thank You Notes</u>: Andrea reported that she has sent Thank You notes to our 70+ volunteers who assisted with the Spring Clean-Up.
- b. <u>Hotline</u>: There have been numerous Hotline messages concerning community garden plot availability. These were forwarded to John for response.

7. "Adopt-A-Spot in Wyandotte" Program Update:

- a. Additions of BASF Park and Bishop Park Sites: John reported that the following Bishop Park and BASF Park sites have been approved by Mark Kowalewski for inclusion in the Adopt-A-Spot in Wyandotte Program. It will be required that volunteers working the BASF Park sites must obtain approval for their specific work days through the Recreation Department to avoid conflict with specials events held at BASF Park. John will revise the Program Rules to incorporate these sites and the BASF Park approval requirement.
 - WWI Memorial, Superior Boulevard East of Biddle
 - o WWII Memorial and Plaza, Bishop Park
 - o Log Cabin, Bishop Park
 - o BASF Park Landmark Sign, Biddle Avenue
 - o Gazebo Container Pots and Grounds, BASF Park
 - o Settler's Statue and Memorial, BASF Park
 - Wyandot Indian Statue and Memorial, BASF Park
- b. <u>Welcome Signs Being Removed for Refurbishing</u>: John reported that various city welcome Signs are being temporarily removed by DPS for refurbishment. Gary Ellison will contact John in advance so that the Adopt-A-Spot volunteers can be notified appropriately.
- 8. <u>Community Garden Update</u>: The 34 yards of topsoil mix has been delivered from Panetta's Landscape Supply, and the 34 beds have been back-filled by the District Court Work Force, who did a wonderful job. A number of beds in the first three rows were found to be low on soil, so an additional 5 yards of topsoil will needed to be ordered to complete the bed prep. It is expected that the community garden will officially open for planting on Saturday, May 14th.
- 9. <u>City-Wide Spring Clean-Up</u>: The Spring Clean-Up went very well, with over 70 volunteers registering for the event. Andrea reported that Harmony Bedikian participated in and won the Trash Scavenger Hunt during the Wyandotte Beautification Spring Clean-Up Event. She was awarded a custom-made Beautification Commission Volunteer tee shirt, and recognition of her achievement was posted on the Commission's Facebook page.
- 10. Spring Dig-In: This event will occur Saturday, May 21st.
 - a. <u>DDA Planting</u>: Noel's Spring Dig-In punch list of commissioner responsibilities was distributed and reviewed again. Linda's plant orders for the Dig-In, and for Purple Heart Memorial Garden and the Vietnam Veteran's Memorial were reviewed. Alice reported that 7 yards of mulch have been spread in the tree boxes and planted areas in the DDA that will not be planted at the Dig-In.
 - b. Vietnam Veteran's Memorial: The service ribbon will be re-planted again with annuals.
 - c. Purple Heart Memorial Garden: Linda and Alice will plant new roses and a variety of other plants.
- 11. <u>Volunteers Update</u>: The consensus of the Commission was that we will need about 50 volunteers. They will go through a brief orientation and training, and will be supervised by commissioners during the event. Bill will ensure all equipment is delivered. John will bring signs and hand tools.

12. Downtown Plantings Update:

- a. <u>Hanging Baskets</u>: Alice reported that the Spring Baskets have been ordered and are scheduled for delivery during the Dig-In on May 21st. They will be delivered at 9:30 am, and will be installed by Eckert's Greenhouse staff.
- b. <u>Planter Pots</u>: Alice noted that she will purchase 6 Dwarf Spruce for \$16.99 each from Block's Nursery for the 6 cubes at former city hall.

Appeal #612 – Granted with stipulation of no public access. Letter from Owner stating this to be placed on file with Minutes and Resolutions.

The proposed would not substantially impair the intent and/or purpose of the Ordinance.

Ziad Nakaad (Applicant) and Nakaad Investments (Owner) has appealed to the Building Board of Appeals of the City of Wyandotte for permission to obtain a variance at 646 Biddle Avenue, Wyandotte MI (see file for legal description) in a RA zoning district, where the proposed conflicts with In accordance with Section R-1009.7.2, and R-1009.10 of the Michigan Building Code as follows:

In accordance with <u>Sections R-1009.7.2 and R-1009.10</u> of the Michigan Building Code does not comply with the requirements as follows:

Section R-1009.7.2

A maximum of 7 inches rise and a minimum of an 11 inch tread depth is required. The stairs were constructed at a 7 ½ inch rise with a 9 ¾ inch tread width.

Section R-1009.10

A flight of stairs shall not have a vertical rise greater than 12 feet between floor levels and landings. There is approximately 13 feet 6 inches of rise prior to the 2nd floor level,

Appellant is requesting that these two (2) violations remain uncorrected. This area is private offices for two (2) persons.

Motion was made by Member Badalamenti, supported by Member Havlicsek to grant w/stipulation of no public access to the private office for this appeal.

Mr. Disanto explained that he was the Builder from Coachlight Properties which submitted the original plans but were changed and re-routed with shifting the overhead door over to make it better for deliveries and that the Owner would have a straight shot up to his private office, Mr. Disanto reviewed and showed on the plans what he was appealing to the Building Board Members. Mr. Disanto continued that no staff or public access would use the stairs to the private office. Mr. Disanto noted that both sides of the stairwell would have handrails for safety.

Member Badalamenti asked if the Owner could state this in a letter of the private office use only.

Mr. Disanto replied yes.

Member Parker stated that the incline is steeper.

Mr. Disanto replied yes.

Member Havlicsek explained that the top platform was the same as the Residential Code stated even though this was for a Commercial Use and that he also seen that the glass window would be tempered glass.

Mr. Disanto replied yes.

The Members mostly agreed that since a letter from the Owner would be submitted with the Minutes and Resolution stating that there would be not public access and was only a private office use only, they had no problem granting the variance.

Director's Report:

- 2. Regarding this year's Cemetery Walk, a discussion was held regarding raising the price of tickets to this event, since we now have to pay for transportation. MOTION: by Jesse Rose, supported by Anne Ronco, to raise the price of tickets up to \$22 and have up to 6 tours each night. Motion carried, 7-0
- 3. Work on the telephone is still pending.
- 4. The Inventory and Archives committees met April 8. They discussed the two data systems we have for inventory: PastPerfect and Archivist Tool Kit. It is recommended that we incorporate the information in the Archivist Tool Kit into PastPerfect. We will look for volunteers to help with this project. The library is interested in sharing information at one site, also, so that the public can have access to both our archives and the library's.
- Custodian Tom Faryniarz is retiring but will stay on until we get someone else. We will share a custodian with the Recreation Department, although the focus will be on the Museum.
- 6. We will have a booth at the Lions Club Flea Market this weekend. Volunteers are already set.

7. The City has asked us to submit a Capital Improvement Plan by April 15th that would encompass the next seven years. Since the request came with short notice, the report will be preliminary. The Strategic Planning Committee will develop a formal plan for Commission approval.

Friends of the Museum:

The Friends of the Museum met and will be sending out letters shortly informing parties as to funds awarded for upcoming projects.

Wyandotte Historical Society:

The Society is still discussing whether to move their office from the Burns to the MacNichol. The gift shop will be moved from its present location to the original Museum office. Furniture from that room is currently stored in the future children's room, but Shirley Prygoski wants to begin work on the children's room. Eula Grooms said furniture could be stored at the salvage storage building (Schlep's) as soon as space can be cleared.

Old Business:

Jesse Rose may have a friend who can be the secretary of the Commission. If this does not work out, one of the Museum Assistants could possibly take minutes.

A discussion was held regarding access to the Museum buildings. Concern was expressed by Ken Munson that not everyone who has a legitimate need for access has been issued keys despite prior requests. This matter will be addressed in the coming week.

An updated Commissioner Roster was distributed. A new roster will be sent out as soon as any changes are complete.

A maximum of 35% lot coverage is allowed for structures in a RA zoning district. Proposed front and rear addition will result in the allowable lot coverage being exceeded by 239.72 square feet.

A minimum of a 20' front yard setback is required or the average of the block. Proposed front addition would be located 19.5 feet from the front property line, and the average of the block is 19.90 feet. Note: field measured.

Proposed front and rear additions will not be detrimental to the development of adjacent buildings or uses, and will not impair the purpose of the ordinance as written.

A motion was made by Member Olsen supported by Member Flachsmann to grant this appeal.

APPEAL #3221 - GRANTED

Austin Sash, 1743 N. Trenton Drive, Trenton (appellant) and Peter Dieringer, 848 Oak, Wyandotte (owner)

for a variance to obtain a Certificate of Occupancy for a four (4) family multiple dwelling at 848 Oak (Lots 118, 199, 120, Bishop's Sub.) in a B-1 zoning district, where the proposed conflicts with Sections 2100, 2100.E and 2404.Q of the Wyandotte Zoning Ordinance.

Section 2100.0 – Front Yard: A minimum of a 20 foot front yard is required for a multiple family dwelling. Existing building which is proposed to be converted to a four (4) family dwelling has a 2.92 foot front yard setback to the property line.

Section 2100.E: The following minimum lot area per dwelling shall be provided: Four (4) – two (2) bedroom apartments require 2,200 square feet of lot area each or 8,800 square feet. There is a total lot area of 8,625 square feet and therefore is deficient in the minimum lot area by 175 square feet.

Section 2404,Q – For all new parking areas of six (6) or more spaces or existing parking lots that add additional parking spaces the off street parking area shall have a planting area of at least five (5) feet in width along any street. Additional planting areas shall be required equaling at least ten (10) square feet in area for each parking space. Landscape plan shall be submitted for review by Planning Commission. Nine (9) parking spaces are shown on plan and requirements are not met. Landscape plan has not been submitted.

Note: If approved by Planning Commission, as Limited Dwellings under Special Uses Provisions then any site plan deficiencies will require a zoning variance by the Zoning Board of Appeals. If both boards approve this use, then Architectural plans shall be submitted by a State of Michigan Licensed Architect with the building permit application.

Currently 1st floor is a business office with the 2nd floor having two (2) apartments. The property is zoned B-1, which allows uses permitted as special uses and as regulated in the OS District. (Section 2200.L.Limited Dwellings)

The applicant is proposing to add two 1st floor apartments at the rear and front of existing business office area. This would eliminate the business office area, and the 2 upper apartments would remain.

Proposed addition of two 1st floor apartments in place of the business office area will not hinder or discourage further business or residential development in that area, and will not impair the purpose of the ordinance as written.

A motion was made by Member Flachsmann supported by Member Nevin to grant this appeal.

Mr. Sash explained that it will be a four unit building and he will also be living there, and he wants to restore it back to Victorian, and feels that this will be a good use.

Chairperson Duran asked if the building is currently vacant. Mr. Miller replied yes, it has been on the market for a couple of years.

Member Trupiano asked Mr. Sash if he has already purchased the building. Mr. Sash replied no, it is contingent upon it being a four unit.

Member Gillon asked that the Planning Commission meeting be reviewed. Mr. Miller stated that the 4 unit was approved by the Planning Commission, and they just had to appeal to the Zoning Board for approval, and the architectural renderings would have to be approved.

Mr. Miller continued that the pool needs to come out to meet the parking. Mr. Miller added that it is a corner lot with an alley entrance, and they will have to work with the landscaping plans.

Member Gillon and Member Flachsmann discussed the Planning Commission's approval and landscaping. Member Flachsmann stated that they need three items approved for a variance, and if granted, they can proceed. Member Flachsmann discussed how the landscaping ordinance is not written for every situation, but you still have to go through the steps. This building is the same, it will be landscaped, and someone will be living there.

Member Flachsmann stated that they are asking for a 2.92 setback, it is an existing nonconforming building, 175 square feet is minimal, and asking for variance on one parking spot.

Chairperson Duran commented that the building will just set vacant, or someone else will need to come before the board asking for a variance.

Member Flachsmann commented that the longer it is vacant, the worse it will get, and the appellant is going to be undertaking some major improvements and he is willing to do it.

Mr. Miller commented that the lower level handicap unit would probably enter from the front and will probably park on Oak Street.

Member Gillon commented that there are 4 units, and at least 8 off street parking, and feels that the parking is sufficient.

Member Trupiano commented that he is struggling with it being vacant, and is not crazy about 4 units.

Member Flachsmann commented that the appellant is probably working on a balance sheet where he needs the 4 units, the Planning Commission already allo wed the 4 units, it is not the Zoning Board's call.

Member Trupiano commented that a variance will still be required no matter what.

Member Flachsmann stated the building needs a lot of work, and the appellant will need 4 units to make it pay off, and he will be living there.

Member Wienclaw discussed Section 2404.Q referring to the planting area. Member Flachsmann stated that the parking ordinance is very confusing.

Donald Streeter, 849 Chestnut, present.

Mr. Streeter stated that there are apartments across the street, there is a fire hydrant in front of this building, and there is the bingo hall, he doesn't see how you will get the parking. Member Flachsmann stated that the parking spots will be 8x18.

Mr. Streeter stating that getting in and out of the parking is going to be a problem.

Chris Lukitsh, 831 Chestnut, present.

Mr. Lukitsh stated that he has been in his home for 20 years. The pool at 848 Oak needs to go. The alley is horrible especially if the parking is going to be off the alley. There are 3 rental properties now in the area, with no parking. The alley needs to be paved and sewers put in. The City does not plow the alley, and you get stuck in it in when there is snow.

Member Flachsmann stated that the City does have a program for alley paving, but some commercial properties didn't want the alley paved because they would have to pay for it. There was discussion regarding the alley paving program.

Mr. Lukitsh stated that the FOP disconnected their downspouts and the water now drains into the alley. Member Flachsmann suggested to Mr. Lukitsh to contact the Engineering Department. Mr. Lukitsh stated that has already sent emails. Member Flachsmann suggested that he petition to get the alley paved. There was discussion regarding a petition.

Mr. Lukitsh stated that he is all for the appeal except for the alley and the parking.
