STAFF COMMENT

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Governing Board approve the Lease Agreement between Hueneme Elementary School District (Lessor) and Child Development Resources of Ventura County, Inc. (Lessee) for the purpose of operating the Hueneme Head Start Center on the grounds of the Art Haycox Elementary School site.

BACKGROUND

The Civic Center Act, California Education Code Sections 38130-38139 govern the use of school facilities and states that the Governing Board of a school district shall authorize the use of school facilities or grounds under its control. Senate Bill 1404 further clarified by approving new California Code of Regulations under Title 5, Chapter 13 Subchapter 1.5. Sections 14037-14042, determining allowable costs and establishing a consistent method by which school districts calculate fees. Section 14041 states that the school district governing board shall adopt a fee schedule that includes the hourly fee for each specific school facility and grounds.

California Education Code Section 38130 – "Every public school facility is considered a civic center where citizens, school-community councils, and clubs as well as senior, recreation, education, political, artistic, and other organizations may meet. The school district may grant the use of school facilities and grounds upon certain terms and conditions deemed proper by the governing board and subject to specified limitations, requirements, and restrictions set forth within the law."

AGREEMENT FOR LEASE OF PREMISES BETWEEN

HUENEME ELEMENTARY SCHOOL DISTRICT (LESSOR) 205 North Ventura Road Port Hueneme, CA 93041

and OF VENTURA COUNTY, INC. (LESSEE)

(A California Non-Profit Corporation)

221 Ventura Boulevard

Oxnard. CA 93036

TERMS

1. **PURPOSE:** Lessor shall lease to Lessee the Premises, defined as an enclosed portion of the ground of the **Art Haycox Elementary School**, adjacent parking and access, for the purpose of housing and operating the Hueneme Head Start Center. The Premises shall be identified in a final site plan which shall become an attachment hereto as Exhibit A.

The Premises will be for exclusive Lessee use as a non-school project, subject to the licensing requirements of the Department of Public Social Services, and shall therefore be exempt from the regulations, policies, and procedures of the Department of the State Architect and the Hueneme Elementary School District, except as Lessor. Lessee and Lessor are not partners and nothing herein contained shall be construed to create a partnership or joint venture.

- 2. **TERM:** The lease agreement, originally dated July 1, 2015 and extended through June 30, 2020, shall be for five (5) years beginning on July 1, 2020 and ending on the last day of June 2025.
 - A. The lease may be terminated by the Lessee on sixty (60) days' written notice if the funding for the program is terminated or if the safety or acceptability of the leased facilities is compromised by any event or action.
 - B. The lease may be terminated by the Lessor for any reason on ninety (90) days' written notice to assure the Lessee may be afforded a minimal opportunity to relocate without significantly disrupting operations.
 - C. The lease may be terminated by either party for any breach or violation of the terms and conditions herein by the other party, which remains unresolved for thirty (30) days, upon the giving of advance written notice to the other party.

The lease may be automatically renewed on an annual basis beginning July 1, 2021, unless three (3) months written advance notice of intent not to renew is provided by either party to the other. Lessor agrees to make the site accessible for purposes of site preparation upon approval of the lease, and Lessee agrees to minimize distracting work and extend full insurance and indemnification during the preparation period.

3. **RENT:** Lessee shall pay to Lessor for the lease of the Premises the sum of \$1.00 for each year of exclusive occupancy, and the Lessor shall identify the fair market value of the premises as an annual in-kind donation to the Lessee, in the public interest.

- 4. **UTILITIES:** Lessor agrees to allow reasonable access to required utilities without surcharge, provided that the modifications and costs shall be at no expense to Lessor. Lessee shall pay for all gas, electric, telephone, utilities, and trash as prorated or as metered.
- 5. TAXES: Lessee shall be responsible for any taxes attributable to the premises and lease, except that Lessor shall be responsible for any taxes and assessments that are levied and assessed against the real property portion of the premises.
- 6. **ALTERATIONS:** Lessee shall develop an acceptable plan for the development of the premises, which considers traffic flow, emergency accessibility, adjacent structures, and restoration. Lessee shall retain ownership of all equipment, fixtures, furnishings, and improvements in the Premises, except that certain alterations and improvements shall become the property of the Lessor after the fifth year of the lease. Lessee agrees to remove their equipment, fixtures and improvements at their sole expense in the event of termination, other than at the convenience of the Lessor, after the fifth year, with the exception of the improvements transferred to the Lessor.
- 7. MAINTENANCE OF PREMISES: Lessee shall maintain the premises in good condition and repair at all times, at no expense to Lessor, and to surrender them to Lessor at the conclusion of the lease after the fifth year in as good a condition as before the lease, except for the effects of the site modifications which Lessee offers and Lessor accepts as permanent improvements to its property, except for reasonable wear and circumstances beyond the control of the Lessee. Lessee shall perform custodial services at their sole expense.
- 8. **INDEMNIFICATION:** Lessee shall indemnify Lessor, its employees, directors, and agents, from and against any and all claims arising from the conduct of the Lessee's business or from any activity, work, or things done or permitted by the Lessee, its agents, contractors, employees, or clients in or about the premises, and from and against any claims arising from a breach or default in the performance of any obligation on Lessee's part to be performed under the terms of the lease, or arising from any negligence of Lessee and from any costs, attorney's fees, expenses, and liabilities incurred in the defense of any such claim or action or proceeding brought thereon; and in any case, any action or proceeding be brought against Lessor shall defend the same at Lessee's expense.

Lessor shall indemnify Lessee, its employee, directors, and agents, from and against any and all claims arising from the conduct of the Lessor's business or from any activity, work, or things done or permitted by the Lessor, its agents, contractors, employees, or clients in or about the premises, and from and against any claims arising from a breach or default in the performance of any obligation on Lessor's part to be performed under the terms of the lease, or arising from any negligence of Lessor and from any costs, attorney fees, expenses, and liabilities incurred in the defense of any such claim or action or proceeding brought thereon; and in any case action or proceeding be brought against Lessee shall defend the same at Lessor's expense.

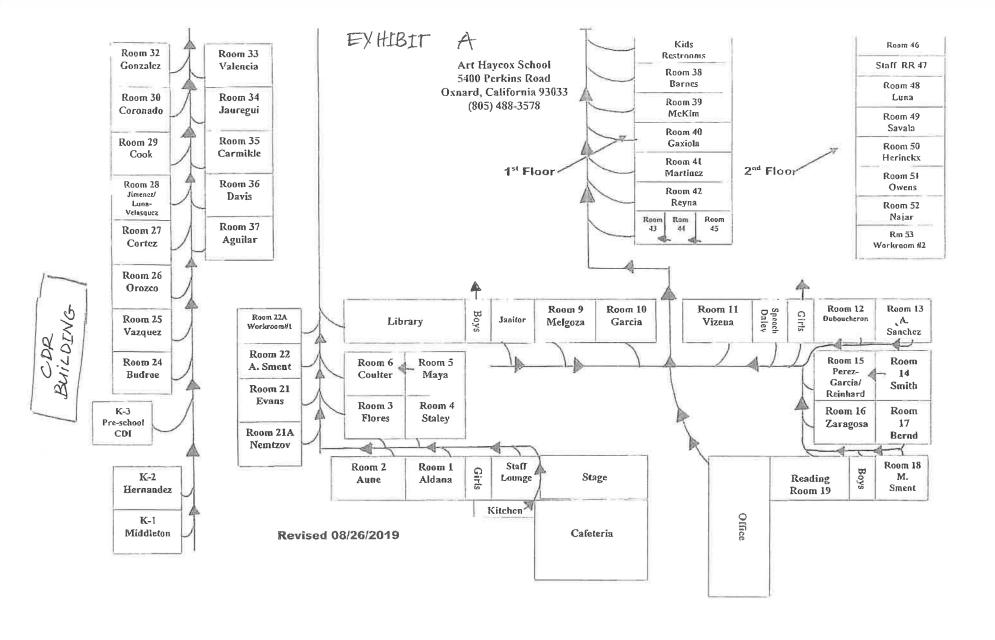

Lessee shall name Lessor as an additional insured on said policy. Lessee shall provide Lessor, as evidence of this required insurance, a certificate in a form acceptable to the Lessor.

Lessor shall, at Lessor's expense, obtain and keep in force during the term of the lease, a policy of combines single limit bodily injury and property damage insurance in the amount of not less than \$1,000,000 insuring Lessor, its employees, directors, and agents against any liability arising out of the use, occupancy, operation or maintenance of the Premises by the Lessor. Lessor shall provide Lessee as evidence of this required insurance, a certificate in a form acceptable to the Lessor.

- 10. ACCESS BY LESSOR: Lessee shall permit access to Premises by Lessor or Lessor's agents upon advance notice to the Central Office of Lessee, for non-emergency inspection or other purposes, with the full understanding that the Hueneme Head Start Preschool is not a District activity. Lessor, or any emergency service, has the express permission of the Lessee to enter the Premises at any time for any emergency reason.
- 11. **ASSIGNMENTS:** Lessee shall not assign or sublet the facilities, in whole or in part, without the prior written consent of the Lessor. Lessor shall not impair the Premises or access to the Premises through the action of any other use or lease.
- 12. **NOTICE:** Any written notice, demand, request, consent, approval, or communication that is required by this lease, or required by either party of the other, shall be sent to the addresses shown on the face of the lease.
- 13. CHANGES: These terms may be changed only by written consent of both parties.

STAFF COMMENT

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Governing Board ratify the MOU with Ventura County Office of Education for K-12 Strong Workforce Program (SWP) funding for Blackstock and E.O. Green Junior High Schools.

BACKGROUND

SWP is a program established by the California legislature as an ongoing statewide funding opportunity. It is designed to support K-12 Local Education Agencies (LEAs) in creating, improving and expanding Career Technical Education (CTE) courses, course sequences, programs of study and pathways for students transitioning from secondary education to postsecondary education to living-wage employment.

Hueneme Elementary School District has partnered with VCOE for the past eight years to provide CTE exploratory elective classes and after school classes related to the pathway fields of STEM, robotics, journalism, digital art media, and Mariachi to junior high students at both Blackstock and E.O. Green.

The current MOU with VCOE is specifically aligned to the following work plan areas of Healthcare, STEM and Media & Entrepreneurship. Junior high teachers will have opportunities to provide students with access to learning about each of these career fields with this new grant.



Memorandum of Understanding

HUENEME ELEMENTARY SCHOOL DISTRICT And VENTURA COUNTY OFFICE OF EDUCATION

K12 Strong Workforce Program - July 2020

This service contract sets forth the terms and conditions under which the VENTURA COUNTY OFFICE OF EDUCATION (hereafter referred to as VCOE), serving as the fiscal agent, and HUENEME ELEMENTARY SCHOOL DISTRICT serving as the local educational agency (hereafter referred to as LEA District), will work together to meet the deliverables of the K12 Strong Workforce Program (hereafter referred to as SWP), a program administered by the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (hereafter referred to as CCCCO).

SWP is a program established by the California legislature as an ongoing statewide funding opportunity. It is designed to support K-12 Local Education Agencies (LEAs) in creating, improving, and expanding Career Technical Education (CTE) courses, course sequences, programs of study, and pathways for students transitioning from secondary education to postsecondary education to living-wage employment.

As a partner in this project the LEA District agrees to meet and adhere to the requirements of the SWP, as outlined below. Further, LEA District agrees to meet and adhere to the obligations of each of three grant work plans, as outlined in this document, one for each (I) Healthcare; (II) STEM Design-Build; and (III) Media & Entrepreneurship.

LEA District Responsibilities

The LEA District assumes the following responsibilities:

- Districts shall collect and report Career Technical Education data to the California Department of Education, as applicable to middle school programming. The statewide tracking systems used includes California Longitudinal Pupil Achievement Data System (CALPADS).
- All SWP expenditures must be coded with goal code of 3800 (CTE).
- All funds must be expended by December 31, 2022.
- Funds must be held in separate accounts for each of the three work plans: (I) Healthcare; (II) STEM Design-Build; and (III) Media & Entrepreneurship.
- Identify CTE specific work in the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP).
- Maintain and provide supporting documentation for all expenditures related to grant activities.
- Maintain all records for five years upon completion of the project.
- Solicit prior approval for expenditures in excess of \$5,000. Route approval requests through VCOE for approval. Purchases in excess of \$5,000 that are not approved will be the responsibility of the LEA.
- LEA District must engage in **regional efforts with Oxnard Union High School District CTE Department** to align education services to meet the CTE Program Requirements minimum standards, for each of the three grant workplan areas, Healthcare, STEM Design-Build, and Media & Entrepreneurship:

- 1. Offer high-quality curriculum and instruction aligned with the California Career Technical Education Model Curriculum Standards, including, but not limited to, providing a coherent sequence of CTE courses that enable pupils to transition to postsecondary education or training programs that lead to a career pathway or attain employment upon graduation from high school.
- 2. Provide pupils with quality career exploration and guidance.
- 3. Provide pupil services, including, but not limited to, counseling and leadership development.
- 4. Provide opportunities for students to participate in afterschool, extended-day, and out-of-school internships, competitions, and other work-based learning opportunities.
- 5. Leads to an industry-recognized credential or certificate, appropriate postsecondary training or employment, or a postsecondary degree.
- 6. Is staffed by skilled teachers or faculty and provides professional development opportunities for those teachers or faculty members.
- 7. Reports data that can be used by policymakers, LEA's, community college districts, and their regional partners to support and evaluate the program, including, to the extent possible, demographic data used to evaluation progress in closing equity gaps in program access and completion, and earnings of underserved demographic groups.
- Meet reporting requirements, to include:
 - O Annual reporting as required by the California Department of Education (CDE). LEA districts shall submit the required end-of-the-year files to California Department of Education by November 1, immediately following the fiscal year for which data are being reported;
- Participate in grant activity opportunities which may include field trips, student events, and additional professional development.
- Provide program and fiscal information to VCOE in support of SWP program and fiscal reporting requirements, when requested by VCOE. Such program and fiscal information shall be disaggregated in three separate accounts, for each of the three separate work plans: (I) Healthcare; (II) STEM Design-Build; and (III) Media & Entrepreneurship.
- Expend funds in accordance with Attachment A: Appendix B: Guidelines, Definitions, and Allowable Expeditures; and in accordance with the three work plans outlined in this MOU.

VCOE Responsibilities

VCOE assumes the following responsibilities:

- Reporting Requirements: VCOE shall complete program and fiscal reporting requirements related to the SWP.
- Facilitate pre-approval of expenditures in excess of of \$5000, upon request of LEA district.
- Provide programmatic guidance and support to carry out the SWP work plans.

Term

The term of this MOU is July 1, 2020 – December 31, 2022, subject to all terms and conditions set forth herein.

Funding

Funding for three work plans (I) Healthcare; (II) STEM Design-Build; and (III) Media & Entrepreneurship are outlined in the section below, "Work Plans."

Upon execution of this MOU, in a timely manner VCOE shall release 70% of funds as outlined in the SWP Work Plan specifications; the remaining 30% shall be released to LEA district upon receipt of full funding from the CCCCO.

Termination due to Cessation of State Funding

VCOE shall have the right to terminate this Contract upon three (3) days written notice in the event that the receipt by VCOE of funds from the State government for this program is reduced, suspended or eliminated for any reason. The LEA District hereby expressly waives any and all claims against VCOE for damages arising from the

termination, suspension or reduction of the funds provided by the State government to VCOE for the program under which this Service Contract is made, or of the portion thereby delegated by this Service Contract.

Insurance

VCOE and LEA District each participate in the Ventura County Schools Self-Funding Authority (VCSSFA), and therefore collectively self-insure for worker's compensation, general liability, and property coverage under the VCSSFA self-insurance program.

Indemnification

VCOE and LEA District each participate in the VCSSFA, and therefore collectively indemnify and defend the other for general liability coverage under the VCSSFA self-insurance program.

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Appendix B: Guidelines, Definitions, and Allowable Expenditures

Guidelines, Definitions, and Allowable Expenditures

Determining if a Cost is Allowable

All allowable costs must meet three primary criteria: (1) Substantiate that the cost was necessary and reasonable for proper and effective administration of the allocations; (2) The cost must be allocable to the funding source activities; and (3) The cost must not be a general expense required to carry out the fiscal agent's overall responsibilities (not supplanting). However, even if the costs meet the prior three criteria, the costs must be approved within the statement of work/budget of the individual fiscal agent; otherwise, they are not allowable within that year without changes to the statement of work/budget. In addition, the Strong Workforce Program Career Technical Education Regional Consortium has the discretion to impose special conditions beyond the funding source that would also determine allowability of cost.

While the proposed cost is allowable under the funding source, is it also reasonable?

Reasonable is defined by the dictionary as agreeable to sound judgment, not exceeding the limit prescribed by reason (not excessive), moderate in price, and a rational decision.

Systems that can guide this definition are necessary for the performance of the grant; following sound business practices (procurement processes, follow state and local laws, follow the terms of the grant); use of fair market prices; acting with

prudence under the circumstances; and having no significant deviation from established prices.

What are the guidelines of allocable?

Allocable is defined by the dictionary as capable of being allocated or assigned. A cost is considered allocable to a particular funding source/program to the extent it actually benefits the objectives of that program. You can only charge in proportion to the value received by the funding source/program. An example would be that a Project Director works 80% on the funded program (only 80% of the salary and benefits can be charged in the grant application). Beyond this definition, allocable also means that the cost must be related to the statement of work/budget that have been approved by the Strong Workforce Program Career Technical Education Regional Consortium.

What is supplanting?

Funding may not result in a decrease in state or local funding that would have been available to conduct the activity had these funds not been received. These grant funds may not free up state or local dollars for other purposes but should create or augment programs to an extent not possible without the funding. You must be able to demonstrate that the funds are added to the amount of state and local funds that would, in absence of the grant funds, be made available for uses specified in your plan.

Federal grant funds must supplement and not supplant state or local funds. Federal funds may not result in a decrease in state or local funding that would have been available to conduct the activity had Federal funds not been received. Federal funds may not free up state or local dollars for other purposes but should create or augment programs to an extent not possible without Federal dollars. You must be able to demonstrate that Federal funds are added to the amount of state and local funds that would, in absence of Federal funds, be made available for uses specified in your plan. Allocation recipients and sub-recipients must use grant funds to provide extra goods, services, materials, staff coordination positions, etc. that would not otherwise be purchased with state, local, or other non-Federal funds.

Allowability of General Costs

There are permissible activities within K12 Strong Workforce Program funds. In addition, there are criteria for what can be funded while doing those activities. The following table is a synopsis of rules to determining allowability of costs. The rules in their entirety can be found in (Title 2 Code of Federal Regulations [2 CFR Parts 215 and 220]).

The following table is an easy reference synopsis of allowability of general costs. As stated above, just because a cost is allowable via 2 CFR 215-220, the intent of the RFA must be followed, the cost must be necessary, reasonable, allocable, and not supplanting, and any additional cost restrictions listed in the RFA would supersede allowable costs within this document.

¹ Advertising and Public Relations: The term advertising costs means the costs of advertising media and corollary administrative costs. Advertising media include magazines, newspapers, radio and television, direct mail, exhibits, electronic or computer transmittals, and the like. The term *public relations* includes community relations and means those activities dedicated to maintaining the image of the institution or maintaining or promoting understanding and favorable relations with the community or public at large or any segment of the public.

ALLOWABLE Advertising costs are those that are solely for: (1) The recruitment of personnel required for the performance by the institution of obligations arising under a sponsored agreement; (2) The procurement of goods and services for the performance of a sponsored agreement; (3) The disposal of scrap or surplus materials acquired in

the performance of a sponsored agreement except when non-Federal entities are reimbursed for disposal costs at a predetermined amount; or (4) Other specific purposes necessary to meet the requirements of the sponsored agreement.

ALLOWABLE Public Relations costs are those that are solely for: (1) Costs specifically required by the sponsored agreement; (2) Costs of communicating with the public and press pertaining to specific activities or accomplishments which result from performance of sponsored agreements (these costs are considered necessary as part of the outreach effort for the sponsored agreement); or (3) Costs of conducting general liaison with news media and government public relations officers, to the extent that such activities are limited to communication and liaison necessary to keep the public informed on matters of public concern, such as notices of Federal contract/grant awards, financial matters, etc.

UNALLOWABLE: Advertising and public relations costs include the following: (1) All advertising and public relations costs unless specified as allowable above; (2) Costs of meetings, conventions, convocations, or other events related to other activities of the institution, including: (a) Costs of displays, demonstrations, and exhibits; (b) Costs of meeting rooms, hospitality suites, and other special facilities used in conjunction with shows and other special events; and (c) Salaries and wages of employees engaged in setting up and displaying exhibits, making demonstrations, and providing briefings;

- (3) Costs of promotional items and memorabilia, including models, gifts, and souvenirs;
- (4) Costs of advertising and public relations designed solely to promote the institution.
- ² Entertainment Costs: Costs of entertainment, including amusement, diversion, and social activities and any costs directly associated with such costs (such as tickets to shows or sports events, meals, lodging, rentals, transportation, and gratuities) are unallowable.
- ³ Equipment: Equipment means article of nonexpendable, tangible personal property having a useful life of more than one year and an acquisition cost that equals or exceeds the lesser of the capitalization level established by the institution for financial statement purpose, or \$5,000. Any equipment requested within the K12 SWP grant will be closely scrutinized to determine purchases meet the intent of the funding and show long-term sustainability.

General Purpose Equipment – General purpose equipment furnishings, modular offices, telephone, networks, information technology equipment systems, air conditioning equipment, reproduction and printing equipment, motor vehicles, etc. are unallowable unless the awarding agency approves them in advance. The Strong Workforce Program Career Technical Education Regional Consortium consider general purpose equipment and furnishings to be the responsibility of the local education agency and as such, it will not approve such expenditures.

- ⁴ Fines and Penalties: Costs resulting from violations of, or failure of the institution to comply with, Federal, State, and local or foreign laws and regulations are unallowable, except when incurred as a result of compliance with specific provisions of the sponsored agreement, or instructions in writing from the authorized official of the sponsoring agency authorizing in advance such payments.
- ⁵ **Gifts of Public Funds:** If it looks like a gift, it is. You are not allowed to purchase pencils, pens, mouse pads, t-shirts, etc. and give them out (under the marketing banner). This

would still be considered a gift of public funds. Awards and honorarium would also be considered a gift of public funds and not allowed.

- ⁶ **Improvements:** Improvements for land, buildings, or equipment that materially increases their value or useful life are unallowable as a direct cost.
- ⁷ **Lobbying:** Lobbying is never allowed unless it meets the following criteria: (1) Technical and factual presentations on topics directly related to the performance of a grant, contract, or other agreement (through hearing testimony, statements, or letters to the Congress or a State legislature, or subdivision, member, or cognizant staff member thereof), in response to a documented request (including a Congressional Record notice requesting testimony or statements for the record at a regularly scheduled hearing) made by the recipient member, legislative body or subdivision, or a cognizant staff member thereof, provided such information is readily obtainable and can be readily put in deliverable form, and further provided that costs under this section for travel, lodging, or meals are unallowable unless incurred to offer testimony at a regularly scheduled Congressional hearing pursuant to a written request for such presentation made by the Chairman or Ranking Minority Member of the Committee or Subcommittee conducting such hearings.
- ⁸ Meetings and Conferences: Costs of meetings and conferences, the primary purpose of which is the dissemination of technical information, are allowable. This includes costs of meals, transportation, rental of facilities, speakers' fees, and other items incidental to such meetings or conferences. Be aware not to cross over into entertainment costs.

NOTE: Food is only allowed at meetings that require a working breakfast, lunch, or dinner and disseminate technical information to participants. The meeting must have an agenda that shows a working meal; must have a sign-in sheet for participants; and cannot go over the fiscal agent's per diem guidelines for food purchases. The Strong Workforce Program Career Technical Education Regional Consortia are not allowing the cost of food be charged for outreach and/or student events.

- ⁹ Memberships: OMB only allows institutional memberships (not individual memberships), the Chancellor's Office Budget and Accounting Manual allows individual memberships that are required within a job description. If the K12 SWP applicant requests any (individual, institutional, or regional) membership costs, the application must justify why the statement of work cannot be accomplished without paying for such membership(s). Business, technical, and professional organization or periodical memberships are allowed. Civic or community, or country club or social or dining club memberships are not allowed.
- ¹⁰ Maintenance and Repairs: Activities such as construction and remodeling, which increase the value of an asset or appreciably extend its useful life, are not allowed unless authorized by the funding source. Maintenance of equipment that neither adds to the permanent value of the property nor appreciably prolongs its intended life, but keeps it in an efficient operating condition, is allowable.
- ¹¹ **Student Expenses, Activities, or Direct Services:** All forms of student aid are allowable only when the purpose of the sponsored agreement is to provide training to selected participants and the charge is approved by the sponsoring agency. Costs incurred for intramural activities, student publications, student clubs, and other student activities are unallowable.

¹² **Selling and Marketing:** Cost of selling and marketing any products or services of the institution are unallowable unless the agreement requires this activity or if it is allowable under public relations costs (see #1 above).

¹³ **Travel:** Only travel necessary for the project is allowed. Travel costs are the expenses for transportation, lodging, subsistence, and related items incurred by employees who are in travel status on official business for the grant. Such costs will be based on the fiscal agent's per diem rates. These costs shall be considered reasonable and allowable only to the extent such costs do not exceed charges normally allowed by the institution in its regular operations as the result of the institution's written travel policy.

OUT-OF-STATE TRAVEL: Out-of-state travel will be closely scrutinized and must be disclosed in the Budget summary. After the application is fully executed, any further Out-of-state travel requires prior approval of the Strong Workforce Program Career Technical Education Regional Consortia by submitting the necessary (as determined by the Strong Workforce Program Career Technical Education Regional Consortia) documentation for approval. The Strong Workforce Program Career Technical Education Regional Consortium reserve the right to limit Out-of-state travel.

OUT-OF-COUNTRY TRAVEL: Out-of-country travel will not be allowable via this funding source.

It is recommended that the Governing Board approve an agreement between Total Compensation Systems, Inc., and the Hueneme Elementary School District for Actuarial Consulting Services.

BACKGROUND

The Governmental Account Standards Board (GASB) determines accounting pronouncements for public agencies.

District contracted with the firm of Total Compensation Systems, Inc. to perform an Actuarial Valuation of Postretirement Welfare Benefits under GASB 74/75 as of June 30, 2021. The intent of GASB 74/75 is for governmental employees to recognize their costs and obligations related to OPEB systematically over the employees' years of service.

The actuarial study is intended to serve the following purposes:

- To provide information to enable Hueneme Elementary School District to manage the costs and liabilities associated with its retiree benefits.
- To provide information to enable Hueneme Elementary School District to communicate the financial implications of retiree health benefits to internal financial staff, the Governing Board, employee groups and other affected parties.
- To provide information needed to comply with Governmental Accounting Standards Board No. 74 and No. 75 related to "other postemployment benefits" (OPEB)

Thank you for your interest in retaining Total Compensation Systems as your OPEB actuary! This letter is our proposal for GASB 74/75 actuarial valuation services. The proposal includes a full actuarial valuation as of June 30, 2021 as well as an anticipated roll-forward valuation as of June 30, 2022.

Fees and Our 10% Discount

To confidently schedule clients, we provide an incentive for clients who make a commitment in advance of the valuation date. To reserve a place in our schedule, please send the signed contract and non-refundable deposit of one-half of the full valuation fee by June 1, 2021. The deposit is non-refundable because of the preliminary work we do to streamline valuations, as well as to compensate for downtime of resources that could result from cancelled contracts. By reserving a spot, Hueneme Elementary School District is not only guaranteed a valuation slot, but is given priority over every client that didn't reserve one. We give a 10% discount of the full valuation fee as well as of the subsequent roll-forward valuation fee to those who reserve a spot by June 1, 2021. That means that, to reserve a spot, we must receive the signed contract and a check for \$2,160 – i.e. one-half of 90% of \$4,800 – by June 1, 2021. RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Governing Board ratify six extended Agreement for Services with the Boys and Girls Club of Port Hueneme and Greater Oxnard and the District to continue to provide child care services during Phase II of the hybrid/blended learning model for students enrolled in the District at Bard, Hathaway, Haycox, Hueneme, Parkview, Larsen, Sunkist and Williams. Students were enrolled in child care during Phase I of 100% distance learning.

BACKGROUND

The BGC has provided child care services since October 12, 2021 for students enrolled in the District, whose parents identified themselves as critical infrastructure workers based on surveys collected in summer 2020. All of those contracts ended on March 12, 2021.

With HESD schools re-opening for the Phase II hybrid/blended learning model the agreement for services contracts extend until the last day of school at eight elementary schools now that students will be attending their home schools. Students in grades 2 and 3 from Haycox who attended Phase I BGC child care will be able to attend child care at the BGC Pleasant Valley Club next to Bard School, as there is limited classroom space available at Haycox School due to the HVAC installations in classrooms. No BGC child care is being offered at Hollywood Beach School in Phase II, as only two students attended the child care program in Phase I at Sunkist, which is the school site that offered child care to students from Sunkist and Beach Schools in Phase I.

Students are grouped in cohorts with adults in a ratio of 12:1 and students may attend the child care programs on the days when they have remote learning. On days when they attend school, they will be able to attend the in-person after school program, ASES, at dismissal from regular day. Both ASES and BGC child care are offered Monday - Thursday until 4:00 p.m. in Phase II to allow for custodial staff to sanitize and prepare all classrooms or the next day of learning.

The California Department of Public Health and VCPH COVID-19 Guidelines are required as part of the waiver approval process by the Department of Social Services prior to any child care program operating. At this time, the Department of Social Services has approved an extension of the original approved waiver for operating child care programs at Bard, Haycox, Larsen and Sunkist until April 12, 2021 and we are awaiting approval for this extension. New waivers have been approved at Hathaway, Hueneme, Parkview and Williams until June 14, 2021.

This Agreement of Services will go into effect between March 15 - June 18, 2021 for eight elementary schools and for the one cohort of 12 second and third graders from Haycox School at the BGC Pleasant Valley Club next to Bard School.

Article 8 - Class Size

- D. To help address workload issues for teachers, the District will provide a grant of \$480 for each teacher in the following positions:
 - Teachers in grades 4-6

 - All TK-3 combination classes
 - Dual Immersion classes that require team teaching between two unit members who plan and assess for two groups of students regardless of class size
 - Special Day Classes with more than 2 grade levels
 - Speech and Language Pathologists and RSP TK-6 teachers who service students at more than one school site
 - For TK-3 and Special Day classes, the workload reduction program will take effect on October 1 of each year.

The principal and grant recipients at each school site shall meet annually to determine the best use of these funds to reduce workload.

BACKGROUND

In 1991, the State Legislature adopted AB 1200 Fiscal Accountability Legislation. The Legislation included language that districts were required to publicly disclose the provisions of all collective bargaining agreements prior to approving the agreements. In 1994, the Legislature adopted AB 3141, which strengthens the disclosure provisions of AB 1200. It requires public school employers to prepare and forward a disclosure statement to the county superintendent of schools that analyzes the financial impact of any proposed collective bargaining agreement.

Representatives of the Hueneme Elementary School District and the Hueneme Education Association (HEA) reached a tentative agreement for a 1% increase on the salary schedule retroactive to July 1, 2020 and a one time, off the schedule COVID-19 bonus equivalent to 3.5% of the 2020-21 salary schedule. In addition, the District increased the Health and Welfare cap from \$16,800 to \$18,504 for the 2021-22 school year and will cover the cost of Health and Welfare benefits above the new cap for the 2021-22 school year. The proposed agreement will be presented to the Governing Board for approval.

The District prepared the Disclosure of Collective Bargaining in accordance with AB 1200, AB 2756 and Government Code 3547.5. The report includes the cost impact of the agreement and includes a certification of the District's ability to fund the cost of the agreement for the duration of the agreement, signed by the Superintendent and the Chief Business Official. In addition, the District sent a copy to the Ventura County Office of Education (VCOE) for review.

In accordance with AB 1200 and Government Code Section 3547.5, the Ventura County Office of Education has received a copy of the Disclosure of Collective Bargaining Agreement for the tentative agreement with the Hueneme Education Association bargaining unit. This code section allows the County Superintendent to review and comment on the financial impact of proposed agreements. In our review, we assess whether proposed agreements will allow the district to meet its financial obligations in the current fiscal year and are consistent with a financial plan that will enable the district to satisfy its multi-year financial commitments.

We have reviewed the proposed agreement dated April 12, 2021. Based upon the data presented, it appears that the terms of the tentative agreement would allow the district to meet its financial obligations. However, it is important to remember that budget assumptions will change over time, and those changes could impact the agreement's effect on the financial condition of the district.

In accordance with AB 2756, please provide our office with a copy of the board minutes that includes the approval of this agreement to School Business Advisory Services as soon as possible. In addition, please forward any corresponding board-approved budget revisions needed to implement the agreement as soon as those documents are available.

The Governing Board recognizes that the district has the primary responsibility to ensure compliance with applicable state and federal laws and regulations governing educational programs. The Board encourages early resolution of complaints whenever possible. The Board recognizes that alternative dispute resolution (ADR) can, depending on the nature of the allegations, offer a process for resolving a complaint in a manner that is acceptable to all parties. An ADR process such as mediation may be offered to resolve complaints that involve more than one student and no adult. However, mediation shall not be offered or used to resolve any complaint involving sexual assault or where there is a reasonable risk that a party to the mediation would feel compelled to participate. The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the use of ADR is consistent with state and federal laws and regulations.

The district shall protect all complainants from retaliation. In investigating complaints, the confidentiality of the parties involved shall be protected as required by law. For any complaint alleging retaliation or unlawful discrimination (such as discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying), the Superintendent or designee shall keep the identity of the complainant, and/or the

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subject of the complaint if different from the complainant, confidential when appropriate and as long as the integrity of the complaint process is maintained.

RISK MANAGEMENT/INSURANCE

The Governing Board desires to promote the safety of students, staff and the public while protecting district resources. The Superintendent or designee shall establish a risk management program that uses effective safety and loss control practices.

The district shall strive to keep its liability at a minimum and its insurance premiums as low as possible while maintaining adequate protection against loss which may occur due to hazards facing the district.

To determine the most economical means of insuring the district consistent with required services, the Superintendent or designee shall annually review the district's options for obtaining coverage, including qualified insurance agents, a joint powers agency, self-insurance, or a combination of these means.

To minimize the district's exposure to liability, the Board shall adopt clear policies related to discrimination, harassment, safety procedures, and the timely handling of claims. The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that these policies and related procedures are enforced fairly and consistently. The Superintendent or designee shall provide safety-related training and protective equipment to staff as appropriate for their position.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT

The following policy shall apply to all district employees, interns, volunteers, contractors, job applicants, and other persons with an employment relationship with the district.

The Governing Board is committed to providing a safe work environment that is free of harassment and intimidation. The Board prohibits sexual harassment against district employees and retaliatory behavior or action against any person who complains, testifies, or otherwise participates in the complaint process established for the purpose of this policy.

Sexual harassment includes, but is not limited to, harassment that is based on the sex, gender, gender identity, gender expression, or sexual orientation of the victim and harassment based on pregnancy, childbirth, or related medical conditions.

The Superintendent or designee shall take all actions necessary to ensure the prevention, investigation, and correction of sexual harassment, including but not limited to:

- 1. Providing training to employees in accordance with law and administrative regulation
- Publicizing and disseminating the district's sexual harassment policy to employees and 2. others to whom the policy may apply
- 3. Ensuring prompt, thorough, and fair investigation of complaints
- 4. Taking timely and appropriate corrective/remedial action(s), which may require interim separation of the complainant and the alleged harasser and subsequent monitoring of developments

The Superintendent or designee shall periodically evaluate the effectiveness of the district's strategies to prevent and address harassment. Such evaluation may involve conducting regular anonymous employee surveys to assess whether harassment is occurring or is perceived to be tolerated, partnering with researchers or other agencies with the needed expertise to evaluate the district's prevention strategies, and using any other effective tool for receiving feedback on systems and/or processes. As necessary, changes shall be made to the harassment policy, complaint procedures, or training.

Sexual Harassment Reports and Complaints

District employees who feel that they have been sexually harassed in the performance of their district responsibilities or who have knowledge of any incident of sexual harassment by or against another employee shall immediately report the incident to their direct supervisor, a district administrator, or the district's Title IX Coordinator. Employees may bypass their supervisor in

filing a complaint if the supervisor is the subject of the complaint. A supervisor or administrator who receives a harassment complaint shall promptly notify the Title IX Coordinator.

Once notified, the Title IX Coordinator shall ensure the complaint or allegation is addressed through AR 4119.12/4219.12/4319.12 – Title IX Sexual Harassment Complaint Procedures or AR 4030 – Nondiscrimination in Employment, as applicable. Because a complaint or allegation that is dismissed or denied under the Title IX complaint procedure may still be subject to consideration under state law, the Title IX Coordinator shall ensure that any implementation of AR 4119.12/4219.12/4319.12 concurrently meets the requirements of AR 4030.

The Title IX Coordinator shall offer supportive measures to the complainant and respondent, as deemed appropriate under the circumstances.

Upon investigation of a sexual harassment complaint, any district employee found to have engaged or participated in sexual harassment or to have aided, abetted, incited, compelled, or coerced another to commit sexual harassment in violation of this policy shall be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal, in accordance with law and the applicable collective bargaining agreement.

The Governing Board recognizes the importance of political activity, voting, and civic engagement, and respects the right of district employees to engage in political discussions and activities on their own time and at their own expense. When engaging ins such activities, employees shall make it clear that they are acting on their own behalf and not as representatives of the district.

BARGAINING UNITS

The Governing Board recognizes the right of district employees to form a bargaining unit, select an employee organization as their exclusive representative, and be represented by that organization in their employment relationship with the district. The Board is committed to negotiating in good faith with recognized employee organizations and respecting the rights of employees and employee organizations.

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(cf. 4141/4241 – Collective Bargaining Agreement)

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The district shall not dominate or interfere with the formation or administration of any employee organization or contribute financial or other support to it. (Government Code 3543.5)

Employees shall not be prohibited from wearing union buttons or other items that favor or oppose the formation of a bargaining unit or any matter that is the subject of negotiations.

Membership

The district shall not deter or discourage employees or job applicants from becoming or remaining members of an employee organization, authorizing representation by an employee organization, or authorizing dues or fee deductions to an employee organization. In addition, the district shall not impose or threaten to impose reprisals on employees, discriminate or threaten to discriminate against employees, or otherwise interfere with, restrain, or coerce employees because of their membership or nonmembership in an employee organization. (Government Code 3543.5, 3550)

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The Superintendent or designee may communicate with district employees regarding their rights under the law. Such communications shall be factual and accurate, and may not promise a benefit, threaten a reprisal, or in any way deter or discourage employees from joining an employee organization or paying dues.

However, before disseminating to multiple employees any mass communication concerning employees' right to join or support an employee organization or to refrain from joining or supporting an employee organization, such as a written document or script for oral or recorded presentation or message, the Superintendent or designee shall meet and confer with the employees' exclusive representative regarding the content of the communication. If the district and exclusive representative do not come to agreement on the content of the mass communication, the Superintendent or designee may disseminate the district's mass communication provided that, at the same time, copies of the exclusive representative's communication, which shall be of reasonable length, are also distributed. (Government Code 3553)

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BARGAINING UNITS

Access to Employee Orientations

The district shall permit employee organizations access to new employee orientations where newly hired employees are advised, whether in person, online, or through other means or mediums, of their employment status, rights, benefits, duties, responsibilities, or any other employment-related matters. The district shall provide employee organizations at least 10 days' notice in advance of an orientation. However, in any specific instance where an unforeseeable, urgent need critical to the district's operation prevents the required 10 days' notice, a shorter notice may be provided. (Government Code 3555.5, 3556)

The structure, time, and manner of the access to new employee orientations shall be determined by mutual agreement of the district and the exclusive representative, following a request to negotiate by either party. If the district and exclusive representative fail to reach an agreement, matters related to the access to new employee orientation shall be subject to compulsory interest arbitration. The district and employee organization may mutually agree to submit any dispute to compulsory interest arbitration at any time. In addition, if any dispute arises during negotiations and is not resolved within 45 days after the first meeting or within 60 days after the initial request to negotiate, whichever is earlier, either party may make a demand for compulsory interest arbitration. When any such dispute arises during the summer when the district's administrative office is closed, the timeline shall commence on the first day the administrative office reopens. The decision of the arbitrator shall be final and binding on the parties. (Government Code 3556, 3557)

The date, time, and place of the orientation shall not be disclosed to anyone other than employees, the exclusive representative, or a vendor that is contracted to provide a service for purposes of the orientation. (Government Code 3556)

Access to Employee Contact Information

The Superintendent or designee shall provide an exclusive representative with the name, job title, department, work location, telephone numbers (work, home, and personal cell phone), personal email address(es) on file with the district, and home address of any newly hired employee in the bargaining unit, within 30 days of hire or by the first pay period of the month following hire. In addition, the Superintendent or designee shall provide the same information in regard to all employees in the bargaining unit to an exclusive representative at least every 120 days, unless more frequent or detailed lists are required by agreement with the exclusive representative. (Government Code 3558, 6254.3)

However, the Superintendent or designee shall not disclose the home address and any phone numbers on file for employees performing law enforcement-related functions, nor disclose the home address, home or personal cell phone number(s), or personal email address(es) of any employee who is a participant in the Safe at Home address confidentiality program pursuant to Government Code 6207 or of any employee who provides a written request that the information

not be disclosed for this purpose. Following receipt of a written request, the district shall remove the employee's home address, home and personal cell phone numbers, and personal email address from any mailing list maintained by the district unless the list is only used by the district to contact the employee. (Government Code 3558, 6207, 6254.3)

Communications with Employees

Employee organizations may have access at reasonable times to areas in which employees work and may use district facilities at reasonable times for the purpose of meetings. Subject to reasonable regulation, employee organizations may also use institutional bulletin boards, mailboxes, and other means of communication to communicate with employees. (Government Code 3543.1)

Access to district means of communication shall be limited in cases where such access would be disruptive to district operations.

Membership Dues or Other Payments to an Employee Organization

When drawing an order for the salary or wage payment of a bargaining unit employee of an employee organization, the district shall deduct any amount which has been requested by the employee in a revocable written authorization for the purpose of paying dues or other payments for any service, program, or committee provided or sponsored by the employee organization. (Education Code 45060, 45168)

An employee organization that certifies that it has and will maintain individual employee authorizations shall handle and process employee written authorizations for payroll deductions. When an employee organization provides such a certification to the district, the district shall rely on information from the employee organization regarding the amounts of such payroll deductions and from which employees. The employee organization shall not be required to submit to the district a copy of the written authorization in order for the payroll deductions to be effective. However, when there is a dispute about the existence or terms of the written authorization, a copy of the employee's written authorization shall be submitted to the district. The employee organization shall indemnify the district for any employee claims regarding payroll deductions made by the district in reliance on notification from the employee organization. (Education Code 45060, 45168)

When an employee organization which has declined to certify that it will handle and process employee written authorizations makes a request for payroll deductions, the district shall request a copy of the employee's written authorization before making the payroll deductions. (Education Code 45060, 45168)

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BARGAINING UNITS

A written authorization shall remain in effect until expressly revoked in writing by the employee and pursuant to the terms of the written authorization. Employee requests to cancel or change authorizations for payroll deductions for employee organizations shall be directed to the employee organization rather than the district. The employee organization shall be responsible for processing these requests. The district shall rely on the information provided by the employee organization regarding whether deductions for an employee organization were properly canceled or changed. The employee organization shall be required to indemnify the district for any claims made by an employee for deductions made by the district in reliance on information from the employee organization. (Education Code 45060, 45168)

EMPLOYEE SAFETY

The Governing Board is committed to maximizing employee safety and believes that workplace safety is the responsibility of every employee. Working conditions and equipment shall comply with standards prescribed by federal, state and local laws and regulations.

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No employee shall be required or permitted to be in any place of employment which is unsafe or unhealthful. (Labor Code 6402)

The Superintendent or designee shall promote safety and correct any unsafe work practice through education and enforcement.

All employees are expected to use safe work practices and, to the extent possible, correct any unsafe conditions which may occur. If an employee is unable to correct an unsafe condition, the employee shall immediately report the problem to the Superintendent or designee.

The Superintendent, attendance supervisor, or designee shall consult with students, parents/guardians, school staff, and community agencies, as appropriate, to identify factors contributing to chronic absence and truancy.

The Superintendent, attendance supervisor, or designee shall develop a tiered approach to reducing chronic absence. Such an approach shall include for preventing attendance problems, which may include, but are not limited to, efforts to provide a safe and positive school environment, relevant and engaging learning experiences, school activities that help develop students' feelings of connectedness with the school, school-based health services, letters alerting parents/guardians to the value of regular school attendance, and incentives and rewards to recognize students who achieve excellent attendance or demonstrate significant improvement in attendance.

The tiered approach shall also provide for early outreach to students as soon as they show signs of poor attendance or if they were chronically absent in the prior school year. Early intervention may include personalized outreach, individual attendance plans, and/or mentoring to students with moderate levels of chronic absence, with additional intensive, interagency wrap-around services for students with the highest level of absence.

Superintendent, attendance supervisor, or designee may collaborate with child welfare services, law enforcement, courts, public health care agencies, other government agencies, and/or medical, mental health, and oral health care providers to make alternative educational programs and support services available for students and families.

WORK PERMITS

The Governing Board recognizes that part-time employment can provide students with income, job experience, and valuable life skills and should be permitted to the extent that such employment does not interfere with a student's education. Before accepting any offer of employment, district students who are minors shall obtain work permits from the Superintendent or designee, regardless of whether the employment will occur when school is in session and/or not in session, unless otherwise exempted by law.

In determining whether to grant or continue a work permit, the Superintendent or designee shall consider whether employment is likely to significantly interfere with the student's schoolwork. Students granted work permits shall be required to demonstrate and maintain a 2.0 grade point average and satisfactory school attendance, except during periods of extended school closure due to an emergency as described in Education Code 49200 and the accompanying administrative regulation. On a case-by-case basis, the Superintendent or designee may approve a maximum work hour limit that is lower than the limit specified in law and administrative regulation.

Students with work permits may be exempted from attendance in a full-time day school provided they attend part-time classes. (Education Code 48230)

Any student authorized to work full time when school is in session shall be enrolled in part-time continuation classes. A student age 14 or 15 who receives a permit to work full time shall also be enrolled in a work experience education program. (Education Code 49130, 49131, 49135)

To protect the health of all students and staff and to curtail the spread of infectious diseases, the Governing Board shall cooperate with state and local public health agencies to encourage and facilitate immunization of all district students against preventable diseases.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT

The Governing Board is committed to maintaining a safe school environment that is free from harassment and discrimination. The Board prohibits, at school or at school-sponsored or schoolrelated activities, sexual harassment targeted at any student by anyone. The Board also prohibits retaliatory behavior or action against any person who reports, files a complaint, or testifies about, or otherwise supports a complainant in alleging sexual harassment.

The district strongly encourages students who feel that they are being or have been sexually harassed on school grounds or at a school-sponsored or school-related activity by another student or an adult, or who have experienced off-campus sexual harassment that has a continuing effect on campus, to immediately contact their teacher, the principal, the district's Title IX Coordinator, or any other available school employee. Any employee who receives a report or observes an incident of sexual harassment shall notify the Title IX Coordinator.

Once notified, the Title IX Coordinator shall ensure the complaint or allegation is addressed through AR 5145.71 - Title IX Sexual Harassment Complaint Procedures or BP/AR 1312.3 -Uniform Complaint Procedures, as applicable. Because a complaint or allegation that is dismissed or denied under the Title IX complaint procedure may still be subject to consideration under state law, the Title IX Coordinator shall ensure that any implementation of AR 5145.71 concurrently meets the requirements of BP/AR 1312.3.

The Title IX Coordinator shall offer supportive measures to the complainant and respondent, as deemed appropriate under the circumstances.

The Superintendent or designee shall inform students and parents/guardians of the district's sexual harassment policy by disseminating it through parent/guardian notifications, publishing it on the district's web site, and including it in student and staff handbooks. All district staff shall be trained regarding the policy.

Instruction/Information

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that all district students receive age-appropriate information on sexual harassment. Such instruction and information shall include:

SEXUAL HARASSMENT

- 1. What acts and behavior constitute sexual harassment, including the fact that sexual harassment could occur between people of the same sex and could involve sexual violence
- 2. A clear message that students do not have to endure sexual harassment under any circumstance
- 3. Encouragement to report observed incidents of sexual harassment even when the alleged victim of the harassment has not complained
- 4. A clear message that student safety is the district's primary concern, and that any separate rule violation involving an alleged victim or any other person reporting a sexual harassment incident will be addressed separately and will not affect the manner in which the sexual harassment complaint will be received, investigated, or resolved
- 5. A clear message that, regardless of a complainant's noncompliance with the writing, timeline, or other formal filing requirements, every sexual harassment allegation that involves a student, whether as the complainant, respondent, or victim of the harassment, shall be investigated and action shall be taken to respond to harassment, prevent recurrence, and address any continuing effect on students
- 6. Information about the district's procedure for investigating complaints and the person(s) to whom a report of sexual harassment should be made
- 7. Information about the rights of students and parents/guardians to file a civil or criminal complaint, as applicable, including the right to file a civil or criminal complaint while the district investigation of a sexual harassment complaint continues
- 8. A clear message that, when needed, the district will implement supportive measures to ensure a safe school environment for a student who is the complainant or victim of sexual harassment and/or other students during an investigation

Disciplinary Actions

Upon completion of an investigation of a sexual harassment complaint, any student found to have engaged in sexual harassment or sexual violence in violation of this policy shall be subject to disciplinary action. For students in grades 4-8, disciplinary action may include suspension and/or expulsion, provided that, in imposing such discipline, the entire circumstances of the incident(s) shall be taken into account.

SELECTION AND EVALUATION OF INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS

The Governing Board desires that district instructional materials, as a whole, present a broad spectrum of knowledge and viewpoints, reflect and value society's diversity, and enhance instructors' ability to educate all students through the use of multiple teaching strategies and technologies. The Board shall adopt instructional materials based on a determination that such materials are an effective learning resource to help students achieve grade-level competency and that the materials meet criteria specified in law. Textbooks, technology-based materials, and other educational materials shall be aligned with academic content standards and the district's curriculum to ensure that they effectively support the district's adopted courses of study.

The Board shall select instructional materials for use in grades K-8 that have been approved by the State Board of Education (SBE) or that have, during the district's review process, been determined to be aligned with the state academic content standards adopted by SBE. (Education Code 60200, 60210)

In selecting or adopting instructional materials, the Board shall consider the recommendation of the Superintendent or designee and/or an advisory committee established to review the materials.

Public Hearing on Sufficiency of Instructional Materials

The Board shall annually conduct one or more public hearings on the sufficiency of the district's instructional materials, including textbooks, technology-based materials, other educational materials, and tests. Technology-based materials include, but are not limited to, software programs, video disks, compact disks, optical disks, video and audio tapes, lesson plans, databases, and the electronic equipment required to make use of those materials by students and teachers as a learning resource. (Education Code 60010, 60119)

The hearing shall be held on or before the end of the eighth week from the first day students attend school for that year. (Education Code 60119)

SELECTION AND EVALUATION OF INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS

The Board encourages participation by parents/guardians, teachers, interested community members, and bargaining unit leaders at the hearing. Ten days prior to the hearing, the Superintendent or designee shall post a notice in three public places within the district containing the time, place, and purpose of the hearing. The hearing shall not take place during or immediately following school hours. (Education Code 60119)

At the hearing(s), the Board shall determine, through a resolution, whether each student in each school, including each English learner, has sufficient textbooks or other instructional materials that are aligned to the content standards adopted by SBE and consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by SBE in each of the following subjects: (Education Code 60119)

1. Mathematics

(cf. 6142.92 – Mathematics Instruction)

2. Science

(cf. 6142.93 – Science Instruction)

3. History-social science

(cf. 6142.94 – History-Social Science Instruction)

4. English language arts, including the English language development component of an adopted program

(cf. 6142.91 – Reading/Language Arts Instruction) (cf. 6174 – Education for English Learners)

5. World language

(cf. 6142.2 – World Language Instruction)

6. Health

(cf. 6142.8 – Comprehensive Health Education)

In making these determinations, the Board shall consider whether each student has sufficient textbooks or other instructional materials to use in class and to take home. This does not require that each student have two sets of materials. However, materials shall not be considered sufficient

if they are photocopied sheets from only a portion of a textbook or instructional materials copied to address a shortage. (Education Code 60119)

If materials are in digital format, they shall be considered sufficient as long as each student, at a minimum, has and can access the same materials in the class and to take home as all other students in the same class or course in the district, and has the ability to use and access them at home. (Education Code 60119)

If the Board determines that there are insufficient textbooks or other instructional materials, the district shall provide information to classroom teachers and to the public setting forth, for each school in which an insufficiency exists, the percentage of students who lack sufficient standards-aligned textbooks or instructional materials in each subject area and the reasons that each student does not have sufficient textbooks or instructional materials. The Board shall take any action to ensure that each student has sufficient materials within two months of the beginning of the school year in which the determination is made. (Education Code 60119)

The degree to which every student has sufficient access to standards-aligned instructional materials shall be included in the district's local control and accountability plan. (Education Code 52060)

TRANSITIONAL KINDERGARTEN

The Governing Board desires to offer a high-quality transitional kindergarten (TK) program for eligible children who do not yet meet the minimum age criterion for kindergarten. The TK program shall assist students in developing the academic, social, and emotional skills they need to succeed in kindergarten and beyond.

The district's TK program shall be the first year of a two-year kindergarten program. (Education Code 48000)

The Board encourages ongoing collaboration among district preschool staff, other preschool providers, elementary teachers, administrators, and parents/guardians in the development, implementation, and evaluation of the district's TK program.

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Eligibility

The district's TK program shall admit children whose fifth birthday is from September 2 through December 2. (Education Code 48000)

Parents/guardians of eligible children shall be notified of the availability of the TK program and the age, residency, immunization, and any other enrollment requirements. Enrollment in the TK program shall be voluntary.

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On a case-by-case basis, a child whose fifth birthday is on or before September 1 may be admitted into the district's TK program upon request of a child's parents/guardians, if the Superintendent or designee determines that it is in the child's best interest.

At any time during the school year, the district may admit into the TK program a child whose fifth birthday is after December 2 of that same school year, provided that the Superintendent or designee recommends that enrollment in a TK program is in the child's best interest and the child's parents/guardians approve. Prior to such enrollment, the child's parents/guardians shall be provided information regarding the advantages and disadvantages and any other explanatory information about the effect of early admittance. (EDUCATION CODE 48000)

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TRANSITIONAL KINDERGARTEN

Curriculum and Instruction

The district's TK program shall be based on a modified kindergarten curriculum that is age and developmentally appropriate. (Education Code 48000)

The program shall be aligned with the preschool learning foundations and preschool curriculum frameworks developed by the California Department of Education (CDE). It shall be designed to facilitate students' development in essential knowledge and skills related to language and literacy, mathematics, physical development, health, visual and performing arts, science, history-social science, English language development, and social-emotional development.

(cf. 5148.3 – Preschool/Early Childhood Education) (cf. 6011 – Academic Standards)

(cf. 6174 – Education for English Language Learners)

The Board shall establish the length of the school day in the district's TK program, which shall be at least three hours but no more than four hours long. If the district has adopted an extended-day kindergarten, the length of the school day for the TK program may be different than the length of the school day for the kindergarten program either at the same or different school sites. The Superintendent or designee shall annually report to CDE as to whether the district's TK programs are offered full day, part day, or both. (Education Code 8973, 37202, 46111, 46115, 46117, 48003)

TK students may be placed in the same classrooms as kindergarten students when necessary, provided that the instructional program is differentiated to meet student needs.

TK students may be commingled in the same classroom with four-year-old students from a California State Preschool Program as long as all of the requirements of each program are met and the classroom does not include students enrolled in TK for a second year or students enrolled in a regular kindergarten. (Education Code 8235, 48000)

Staffing

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that teachers assigned to teach in TK classes possess a teaching credential or permit from the Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CTC) that authorizes such instruction.

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TRANSITIONAL KINDERGARTEN

A credentialed teacher who is first assigned to a TK class after July 1, 2015, shall, by August 1, 2021, have at least 24 units in early childhood education and/or child development, comparable experience in a preschool setting, and/or a child development teacher permit issued by the CTC. (Education Code 48000)

The Superintendent or designee may provide professional development as needed to ensure that TK teachers are knowledgeable about the standards and effective instructional methods for teaching young children.

Continuation to Kindergarten

Students who complete the TK program shall be eligible to continue in kindergarten the following school year. Parents/guardians of such students shall not be required to submit a signed Kindergarten Continuance Form for kindergarten attendance.

However, whenever children who would otherwise be age-eligible for kindergarten are enrolled in TK, the Superintendent or designee shall obtain a Kindergarten Continuance Form signed by the parent/guardian near the end of the TK year consenting to the child's enrollment in kindergarten the following year.

A student shall not attend more than two years in a combination of TK and kindergarten. (Education Code 46300)

Assessment

The Superintendent or designee may develop or identify appropriate formal and/or informal assessments of TK students' development and progress. The Superintendent or designee shall monitor and regularly report to the Board regarding program implementation, the progress of students in meeting related academic standards, and student preparedness for future education.

BOARD MEMBER ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATIONS

The Governing Board recognizes that electronic communication is an efficient and convenient way for Board members to communicate and expedite the exchange of information within the district and with members of the public. Board members shall exercise caution so as to ensure that electronic communications are not used as a means for the Board to deliberate outside of an agendized Board meeting nor to circumvent the public's right to access records regarding district business, or restrict access to public forum.

(cf. 9000 – Role of the Board)

(cf. 9322 – Agenda/Meeting Materials)

A majority of the Board shall not, outside of an authorized meeting, use a series of electronic communications of any kind, directly or through intermediaries, to discuss, deliberate, or take action on any item that is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board. (Government Code 54952.2)

(cf. 9320 – Meetings and Notices)

Examples of permissible electronic communications concerning district business include, but are not limited to, dissemination of Board meeting agendas and agenda packets, reports of activities from the Superintendent, and reminders regarding meeting times, dates, and places.

Board members may engage in separate conversations or communications with members of the public on a social media platform to answer questions, provide information, or solicit information regarding a matter that is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board, as long as a majority of the Board does not use the platform to discuss among themselves any business of a specific nature that is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board. A Board member is prohibited from responding directly to any communication from other Board members regarding matters that are within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board or using digital icons (e.g., "likes" or emojis) to express reactions to communications made by other Board members. (Government Code 54952.2)

Whenever a Board member uses a social media platform to communicate with the public about district business or Board activities, the Board member shall not block access to a member of the public based on the viewpoint expressed by that individual.

Board members may use electronic communications to discuss matters that do not pertain to district business, regardless of the number of Board members participating in the discussion.

Board members shall make every effort to ensure that their electronic communications conform to the same standards and protocols established for other forms of communication. A Board member may respond, as appropriate, to an electronic communication received from a member of the community and should make clear that the response does not necessarily reflect the views of the P

Board as a whole. Any complaint or request for information should be forwarded to the Superintendent in accordance with Board bylaws and protocols so that the issue may receive proper consideration and be handled through the appropriate district process. As appropriate, communication received from the media shall be forwarded to the designated district spokesperson.

Board Bylaws

Meetings of the Governing Board are conducted for the purpose of accomplishing district business. In accordance with state open meeting laws (Brown Act), the Board shall hold its meetings in public and shall conduct closed sessions during such meetings only as authorized by law. To encourage community involvement in the schools, Board meetings shall provide opportunities for questions and comments by members of the public. All meetings shall be conducted in accordance with law and the Board's bylaws, policies, and administrative regulations.

(cf. 9321 – Closed Session Purposes and Agendas)

(cf. 9322 – Agenda/Meeting Materials)

(cf. 9323 – Meeting Conduct)

A Board meeting exists whenever a majority of Board members gather at the same time and location, including teleconference location, to hear, discuss, deliberate, or take action upon any item within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board or district. (Government Code 54952.2)

A majority of the Board shall not, outside of an authorized meeting, use a series of communications of any kind, directly or through intermediaries, including social media and other electronic communications, to discuss, deliberate, or take action on any item that is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board. (Government Code 54952.2)

However, an employee or district official may engage in separate conversations with Board members in order to answer questions or provide information regarding an item within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board, as long as that employee or district official does not communicate the comments or position of any Board members to other Board members. (Government Code 54952.2)

(cf. 9012 – Board Member Electronic Communications)

In order to help ensure participation in the meeting by individuals with disabilities, the Superintendent or designee shall provide appropriate disability-related accommodations or modifications upon request in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act. (Government Code 54953.2, 54954.1, 54954.2)

Regular Meetings

The Board shall hold one regular meeting(s) each month from August through May. Regular meetings shall be held at 6:00 p.m. on the fourth Monday of each month at the Port Hueneme City Hall. Two meetings are scheduled in June, on the second and fourth Monday of the month. Exceptions in other months might occur if the fourth Monday is a holiday celebrated by the District.

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A standard exemption to this rule occurs in three months every year. The March, September, and December meetings are scheduled on dates that ensure the District will complete tasks with specific due dates per federal and state law. In these months, meetings are generally held on the Monday that occurs prior to the required due dates. If, for any reason, a meeting on a Monday is not possible, the meeting will be scheduled on any other weekday, at the Board's option, that would still meet the legal timing requirements.

At least 72 hours prior to a regular meeting, the agenda shall be posted at one or more locations freely accessible to members of the public and on the district's Internet web site. (Government Code 54954.2)

Whenever agenda materials relating to an open session of a regular meeting are distributed to the Board less than 72 hours before the meeting, the Superintendent or designee shall make the materials available for public inspection at a public office or location designated for that purpose. (Government Code 54957.5)

(cf. 1340 – Access to District Records)

Special Meetings

Special meetings of the Board may be called at any time by the presiding officer or a majority of the Board members. However, a special meeting shall not be called regarding the salary, salary schedule, or other compensation of the Superintendent, Assistant Superintendent, or other management employee as described in Government Code 3511.1. (Government Code 54956)

(cf. 2121 – Superintendent's Contract)

Written notice of special meetings shall be delivered personally or by any other means to all Board members and the local media who have requested such notice in writing. The notice also shall be posted on the district's Internet web site. The notice shall be received at least 24 hours before the time of the meeting. The notice shall also be posted at least 24 hours before the meeting in a location freely accessible to the public. The notice shall specify the time and place of the meeting and the business to be transacted or discussed. No other business shall be considered at this meeting. (Education Code 35144; Government Code 54956)

Any Board member may waive the 24-hour written notice requirement prior to the time of the meeting by filing a written waiver of notice with the clerk or secretary of the Board or by being present at the meeting at the time it convenes. (Government Code 54956)

Every notice of a special meeting shall provide an opportunity for members of the public to directly address the Board concerning any item that has been described in the meeting notice, before or

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during the item's consideration. (Government Code 54954.3)

Emergency Meetings

In the case of an emergency situation for which prompt action is necessary due to the disruption or threatened disruption of public facilities, the Board may hold an emergency meeting without complying with the 24-hour notice and/or 24-hour posting requirement for special meetings pursuant to Government Code 54956. The Board shall comply with all other requirements for special meetings during an emergency meeting. (Government Code 54956.5)

An emergency situation means either of the following: (Government Code 54956.5)

1. An emergency, which shall be defined as a work stoppage, crippling activity, or other activity that severely impairs public health and/or safety as determined by a majority of the members of the Board

(cf. 4141.6/4241.6 – Concerted Action/Work Stoppage)

2. A dire emergency, which shall be defined as a crippling disaster, mass destruction, terrorist activity, or threatened terrorist act that poses peril so immediate and significant that requiring the Board to provide one-hour notice before holding an emergency meeting may endanger the public health and/or safety as determined by a majority of the members of the Board

(cf. 3516 – Emergencies and Disaster Preparedness Plan)

Except in the case of a dire emergency, the Board president or designee shall give notice of the emergency meeting by telephone at least one hour before the meeting to the local media that have requested notice of special meetings. All telephone numbers provided by the media in the most recent request for notification must be exhausted. If telephone services are not functioning, the notice requirement of one hour is waived and, as soon after the meeting as possible, the Board shall notify those media representatives of the meeting and shall describe the purpose of the meeting and any action taken by the Board.

In the case of a dire emergency, the Board president or designee shall give such notice at or near the time notification is given to the other members of the Board about the meeting. (Government Code 54956.5)

The minutes of the meeting, a list of persons the Board president or designee notified or attempted to notify, a copy of the roll call vote, and any actions taken at the meeting shall be posted for at least 10 days in a public place as soon after the meeting as possible. (Government Code 54956.5)

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Adjourned/Continued Meetings

The Board may adjourn/continue any regular or special meeting to a later time and place that shall be specified in the order of adjournment. Less than a quorum of the Board may adjourn such a meeting. If no Board members are present, the secretary or the clerk may declare the meeting adjourned to a later time and shall give notice in the same manner required for special meetings. (Government Code 54955)

Within 24 hours after the time of adjournment, a copy of the order or notice of adjournment/continuance shall be conspicuously posted on or near the door of the place where the meeting was held. (Government Code 54955)

Study Sessions, Retreats, Public Forums, and Discussion Meetings

The Board may occasionally convene a study session or public forum to study an issue in more detail or to receive information from staff or feedback from members of the public.

The Board may also convene a retreat or discussion meeting to discuss Board roles and relationships.

Public notice shall be given in accordance with law when a quorum of the Board is attending a study session, retreat, public forum, or discussion meeting. All such meetings shall comply with the Brown Act and shall be held in open session and within district boundaries. Action items shall not be included on the agenda for these meetings.

Other Gatherings

Attendance by a majority of Board members at any of the following events is not subject to the Brown Act provided that a majority of the Board members do not discuss specific district business among themselves other than as part of the scheduled program: (Government Code 54952.2)

- 1. A conference or similar public gathering open to the public that involves a discussion of issues of general interest to the public or to school board members
- 2. An open, publicized meeting organized by a person or organization other than the district to address a topic of local community concern

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MEETINGS AND NOTICES

- 3. An open and noticed meeting of another body of the district
- 4. An open and noticed meeting of a legislative body of another local agency
- 5. A purely social or ceremonial occasion
- 6. An open and noticed meeting of a standing committee of the Board, provided that the Board members who are not members of the standing committee attend only as observers

(cf. 9130 – Board Committees)

Individual contacts or conversations between a Board member and any other person are not subject to the Brown Act. (Government Code 54952.2)

Location of Meetings

Meetings shall not be held in a facility that prohibits the admittance of any person on the basis of ancestry or any characteristic listed in Government Code 11135. In addition, meetings shall not be held in a facility which is inaccessible to individuals with disabilities or where members of the public must make a payment or purchase in order to be admitted. (Government Code 54961)

(cf. 0410 – Nondiscrimination in District Programs and Activities)

Meetings shall be held within district boundaries, except to do any of the following: (Government Code 54954)

- 1. Comply with state or federal law or court order or attend a judicial or administrative proceeding to which the district is a party
- 2. Inspect real or personal property which cannot conveniently be brought into the district, provided that the topic of the meeting is limited to items directly related to the property
- 3. Participate in meetings or discussions of multiagency significance, provided these meetings are held within one of the other agencies' boundaries, with all participating agencies giving the notice required by law
- 4. Meet in the closest meeting facility if the district has no meeting facility within its boundaries or if the principal office is located outside the district
- 5. Meet with elected or appointed state or federal officials when a local meeting would be impractical, solely to discuss legislative or regulatory issues affecting the district over which the state or federal officials have jurisdiction

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MEETINGS AND NOTICES

- 6. Meet in or near a facility owned by the district but located outside the district, provided the meeting agenda is limited to items directly related to that facility
- 7. Visit the office of the district's legal counsel for a closed session on pending litigation, when doing so would reduce legal fees or costs
- 8. Attend conferences on nonadversarial collective bargaining techniques
- 9. Interview residents of another district regarding the Board's potential employment of an applicant for Superintendent of the district
- 10. Interview a potential employee from another district

Meetings exempted from the boundary requirements, as specified in items #1-10 above, shall still be subject to the notice and open meeting requirements for regular and special meetings when a quorum of the Board attends the meeting.

If a fire, flood, earthquake, or other emergency renders the regular meeting place unsafe, meetings shall be held for the duration of the emergency at a place designated by the Board president or designee, who shall so inform all news media who have requested notice of special meetings by the most rapid available means of communication. (Government Code 54954)

Teleconferencing

A teleconference is a meeting of the Board in which Board members are in different locations, connected by electronic means through audio and/or video. (Government Code 54953)

The Board may use teleconferences for all purposes in connection with any meeting within the Board's subject matter jurisdiction. All votes taken during a teleconference meeting shall be by roll call. (Government Code 54953)

During the teleconference, at least a quorum of the members of the Board shall participate from locations within district boundaries. (Government Code 54953)

Agendas shall be posted at all teleconference locations and shall list all teleconference locations whenever they are posted elsewhere. Additional teleconference locations may be provided to the public. (Government Code 54953)

All teleconference locations shall be accessible to the public. All teleconferenced meetings shall be conducted in a manner that protects the statutory and constitutional rights of the parties or the public appearing before the Board, including the right of the public to address the Board directly at each teleconference location. (Government Code 54953)

All Board policies, administrative regulations, and bylaws shall apply equally to meetings that are teleconferenced. The Superintendent or designee shall facilitate public participation in the meeting at each teleconference location.

ACTIONS REQUIRING A SUPER MAJORITY VOTE

Actions Requiring a Two-Thirds Vote of the Board:

1. Resolution declaring intention to sell or lease real property (Education Code 17466)

(cf. 3280 – Sale, Lease and Rental of District-Owned Real Property)

- 2. Resolution declaring intent of Governing Board to convey or dedicate property to the state or any political subdivision for the purposes specified in Education Code 17556 (Education Code 17557)
- 3. Resolution authorizing and directing the Board president, or any other presiding officer, secretary, or member, to execute a deed of dedication or conveyance of property to the state or a political subdivision (Education Code 17559)
- 4. Lease, for up to three months, of school property which has a residence on it and which cannot be developed for district purposes because funds are unavailable (Education Code 17481)
- 5. Request for temporary borrowing of funds needed for immediate requirements of the district to pay district obligations incurred before the receipt of district income for the fiscal year sufficient to meet the payment(s) (Government Code 53821)
- 6. Upon complying with Government Code 65352.2 and Public Resources Code 21151.2, action to render city or county zoning ordinances inapplicable to a proposed use of the property by the district (Government Code 53094)
- (cf. 7131 Relations with Local Agencies)
- (cf. 7150 Site Selection and Development)
- (cf. 7160 Charter School Facilities)
- 7. When the district is organized to serve only grades K-8, action to establish a community day school for any of grades K-8 (Education Code 48660)

(cf. 6185 – Community Day School)

- 8. When the district is organized to serve only grades K-8, has an average daily attendance (ADA) of 2,500 or less, or desires to operate a community day school to serve any of grades K-6 (and no higher grades) and seeks to situate a community day school on an existing school site, certification that satisfactory alternative facilities are not available for a community day school (Education Code 48661)
- 9. Resolution of intent to issue general obligation bonds with the approval of 55 percent of the voters of the district (Education Code 15266)

(cf. 7214 – General Obligation Bonds)

- 10. Resolution of intent to issue bonds within a school facilities improvement district with the approval of 55 percent of the voters of the school facilities improvement district (Education Code 15266)
- (cf. 7213 School Facilities Improvement Districts)
- 11. Resolution to place a parcel tax on the ballot (Government Code 53724)

(cf. 3471 – Parcel Taxes)

12. Resolution of necessity to proceed with an eminent domain action and, if the Board subsequently desires to use the property for a different use than stated in the resolution of necessity, a subsequent resolution so authorizing the different use (Code of Civil Procedure 1245.240, 1245.245)

Actions Requiring a Two-Thirds Vote of the Board Members Present at the Meeting:

- 1. Determination that there is a need to take immediate action and that the need for action came to the district's attention after the posting of the agenda. If less than two-thirds of the Board members are present at the meeting, a unanimous vote of all members present is required. (Government Code 54954.2)
- 2. Determination that a closed session is necessary during an emergency meeting. If less than two-thirds of the Board members are present, a unanimous vote of all members present is required. (Government Code 54956.5)

(cf. 9320 – Meetings and Notices) (cf. 9321 – Closed Session Purposes and Agendas)

Actions Requiring a Four-Fifths Vote of the Board:

- 1. Resolution for district borrowing based on issuance of notes, tax anticipation warrants, or other evidences of indebtedness, in an amount up to 50 percent of the district's estimated income and revenue for the fiscal year or the portion not yet collected at the time of the borrowing (Government Code 53822, 53824)
- 2. Resolution for district borrowing, between July 15 and August 30 of any fiscal year, of up to 25 percent of the estimated income and revenue to be received by the district during that fiscal year from apportionments based on ADA for the preceding school year (Government Code 53822-53824)
- 3. Declaration of an emergency in order to authorize the district to include a particular brand name or product in a bid specification (Public Contract Code 3400)

(cf. 3311 – Bids)

4. When the district has a five-member Board and has adopted the procedures set forth in UPCCAA, action to respond to an emergency facilities condition without giving notice for bids to let contracts, including the repair or replacement of district facilities, the taking of any other action that is directly related to and immediately required by that emergency, the procurement of the

necessary equipment, services, and supplies for those purposes, the delegation of authority to the Superintendent or designee to take such action, and the determination during a regular Board meeting of the need to continue the action (Public Contract Code 22035, 22050)

5. Resolution to award a contract for a public works project at \$212,500 or less to the lowest responsible bidder, when the district is using the informal process authorized under the UPCCAA for projects of \$200,000 or less, all bids received are in excess of \$200,000, and the Board determines that the district's cost estimate was reasonable (Public Contract Code 22034)

Actions Requiring a Four-Fifths Vote of the Board Members Present at the Meeting

A four-fifths vote of the Board members present at the meeting shall be required to approve the expenditure and transfer of necessary funds and use of district property or personnel to meet a national or local emergency created by war, military, naval, or air attack, or sabotage, or to provide for adequate national or local defense. (Government Code 53790-53792)

(cf. 3110 – Transfer of Funds)

Actions Requiring a Unanimous Vote of the Board:

- 1. Resolution authorizing and prescribing the terms of a lease of district property for extraction and taking of gas not associated with oil (Education Code 17510-17511)
- 2. Authorization of the use of day labor or force account, or waiver of the competitive bid process pursuant to Public Contract Code 20111, when the Board determines that an emergency exists requiring the repair, alteration, work, or improvement to any facility to permit the continuance of existing classes or to avoid danger to life or property, and upon approval of the County Superintendent of Schools (Public Contract Code 20113)

Actions Requiring a Unanimous Vote of the Board Members Present at the Meeting:

1. Private sale of surplus property without advertisement in order to establish that such property is not worth more than \$2,500. Disposal of surplus property or donation to a charitable organization requires the unanimous vote of the Board members present to establish that the value of such property would not defray the cost of arranging its sale. (Education Code 17546)

You will be provided with written notice, sent by any means or media you provide in response to this message, to whatever address (es) you specify, of any intention to consider rescinding this commitment at least 30 days before any such regular meeting. In the event that this commitment is rescinded, a notice will be delivered to you by the same means as this commitment, or by mail to an address that you have designated in writing, and you will have the right to commence legal action pursuant to Government Code 54960(a).
