WHEREAS the U.S. House of Representatives has designated July as Parks and Recreation Month; and

WHEREAS the Township of Maplewood recognizes the benefits derived from parks and recreation resources.

RESOLUTION PERMITTING PARKING ON ELMWOOD AVENUE FROM JULY 18, 2023 TO SEPTEMBER 10, 2023

WHEREAS, New Jersey Transit is presently leasing parking spaces from the Township of Maplewood ("Township") at the Township's Swimming Pool parking lot on Boyden Avenue; and

WHEREAS, the pool season has begun and New Jersey Transit will not be permitted to park vehicles in the pool parking lot during the pool season; and

WHEREAS, the Township wishes to work with New Jersey Transit in finding its employees temporary parking; and

WHEREAS, it has been proposed that temporary parking be allowed on Elmwood Avenue.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Maplewood, County of Essex, State of New Jersey that effective from July 18, 2023 through September 10, 2023, parking shall be permitted on Elmwood Avenue as follows:

- On the south side of Elmwood Avenue beginning at a point approximately one hundred fifty (150') feet from the intersection of Boyden Avenue and proceeding west thereof, to a point approximately five hundred eighty (580') feet west of Boyden Avenue. Parking shall be permitted except for overnight parking.
- 2. Temporary signage shall be installed to implement the intent of this Resolution.

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RESOLUTION NUMBER 233-23 APPROVING EMERGENCY TEMPORARY APPROPRIATIONS

WHEREAS, on January 3, 2023, the Township Committee adopted Resolution 10-23 establishing a Temporary Budget for Fiscal Year 2023 in an amount not exceeding 26.25% of the total appropriations in the Fiscal Year 2022 Budget; and

WHEREAS, an emergent condition has arisen in that the Township is expected to enter in contracts, commitments, or payments prior to the adoption of the 2023 budget and no adequate provision has been made in the 2023 temporary budget for the aforesaid purposes; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-20 provides that, in addition to temporary appropriations necessary for the period prior to the adoption of the budget and regular appropriations, the governing body may, by resolution adopted by a two-thirds vote of the full membership, make emergency temporary appropriations for any purpose for which appropriations may lawfully be made for the period between the beginning of the current fiscal year and the date of the adoption of the budget for the current year; and

WHEREAS, the amount of such emergency temporary appropriations shall be included under the correct headings in the budget and provided for in full in the final adopted budget; and

WHEREAS, it is the recommendation of the Chief Financial Officer that this emergency temporary appropriation be authorized in the amount of an additional \$875,000 to the following budget line items:

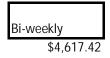

Matrix New World Engineering, Land Surveying and Landscape Architecture, PC (Matrix) is pleased to provide this proposal to the Township of Maplewood (Township) / Maplewood Library Trust, hereinafter referred to as Client, for professional / environmental services associated with the Township's Library, located at 51 Baker Street (Block 17.02, Lot 126), in the Township of Maplewood, Essex County, New Jersey (hereinafter referred to as Site).

The scope provided details those steps anticipated to be necessary to remediate (and obtain NJDEP closure for) impacts to soil and groundwater identified from a 2,000 gallon fuel oil underground storage tank (UST) at the above-referenced Site.

1.0 INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

On December 8, 2022, evidence of petroleum impacted soil was identified at the Site during renovation activities at the Township Library building. The Client requested a Matrix representative mobilize to the Site to identify the potential source of the petroleum impacted soil. Matrix representative, Mr. Edward Huss, Senior Engineering/Technical Director, arrived on-site and identified what appeared to be UST copper product and return piping within the concrete base of the stairs leading to the basement of the library building. Additionally, what appeared to be remote UST fill and vent piping was observed in the area in which the petroleum impacted soil

was observed. Impacted soil identified in the vicinity of the UST had already been removed and stockpiled at the Site for later disposal, and plastic sheeting was placed over that soil pile. The New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) was notified of the release, and Case Number 22-12-08-1329-25 was assigned to the Site.

On December 15, 2022, an Office of Public Records Access (OPRA) request was submitted to the Township of Maplewood to identify any files regarding an UST at the Site. A response was received on December 16, 2022, indicating that a construction permit dated September 28, 1999, was identified which proposed the abandonment of a fuel oil UST at the Maplewood Library (51 Baker Street). The size and location of the UST was not indicated on the permit. No records or information as to if the UST was ever actually abandoned was identified. No indication of a historic release (other than the December 8, 2022, NJDEP notification previously discussed) from a UST was identified via review of NJDEPs' Data Miner Website for the 51 Baker Street (Library) address.

On March 1, 2023, a Matrix representative returned to the Site in effort to locate the alleged abandoned-in-place UST. Ms. Sheila Innella, Senior Environmental Scientist, and Mr. Jay Graf with Geo-Graf, Inc. mobilized to the Site to conduct a geophysical survey. The geophysical survey utilized Ground Penetrating Radar (GPR), Electromagnetic (EM), Radio Frequency (RF), and Magnetic (MAG) instrumentation to locate the alleged UST.

Based on the results of the geophysical survey, what appeared to be a 2,000-gallon UST was identified approximately nine feet northeast of the northeast side (back side) of the library building. The UST was noted to be between 18 inches to 2 feet below ground surface (bgs) and measured approximately 64 inches wide (e.g. in diameter) by 12 feet long, indicative of the dimensions of a 2,000 gallon UST. Additionally, copper product piping was observed extending through the inside of the concrete wall along the northern side of what would have been the basement of the library building. Based on the observations made (e.g. copper feed and return lines typical of fuel oil heating) and the results of the geophysical survey (typical unregulated 2,000 gallon heating oil tank), it appears that the UST likely contained fuel oil connected to a boiler within the basement of the library building.

On April 20-21st, 2023, Matrix returned to the Site to conduct an initial Site Investigation (SI) of soil and groundwater adjacent to the UST, former piping and former excavation area to initially determine if soils and groundwater in the vicinity of the UST system contained extractable petroleum hydrocarbon (EPH) concentrations in soils that exceed the NJDEP Soil Remediation Standards (SRS) and if groundwater exceeds the NJDEP Class IIA Groundwater Quality Standards (GWQS).

Results of the investigation indicated soil EPH results of up to 10,900 milligrams per kilogram (mg/KG) were identified in sample UST-3, and free phase fuel oil product (free product) globules were noted at or near groundwater depth in boring UST-3 (at 11-12 feet in depth below grade).

This soil result exceeds the residential NJDEP standard of 5,100 mg/KG (requiring a Deed Notice and / or remediation and further delineation, (at a minimum)) and the NJDEP residual / free product saturation limit of 8,000 mg/KG, requiring further delineation and likely remediation. Two ground water samples collected from UST-2 and EX-1/UST-4 did not contain targeted compounds in excess of the NJDEP GWQS. However, due to the limited scope of the SI, groundwater at the UST-3 location could not be assessed at the time, and was subsequently evaluated during Remedial Investigation (RI) activities, further detailed below, to determine potential for free product on groundwater and exceedances of the GWQS.

In addition, non-petroleum odors and elevated volatile photo-ionization detector (PID) readings were observed in shallow soils around the former excavation area. These non-fuel oil volatile organic compound (VOC) odors and elevated PID readings in soils were subsequently addressed during RI activities, as described below. These potential impacts needed to be sampled for VOC analysis to confirm there has been no release of VOCs in excess of the NJDEP SRS in shallow soils in this area.

As approved, Matrix returned to the Site on May 12, 2023, and the top of the UST surface was un-earthed via backhoe, and the UST was inspected. The excavation work confirmed the UST as a 2,000 gallon fuel oil UST. Based on the inspection of the UST, it was determined that the tank had likely been pumped out and filled with foam. However, no personnel entrance port had been cut into the top of the entire UST surface to allow proper cleaning of sludge and potential residual fuel oil (following pump out) within the tank. The 22.18 tons of impacted soil that had previously been generated from the product piping area that was staged on the Site was loaded-out into a tri-axle dump truck and transported to and properly disposed of offsite at a licensed facility under approval #2723-0408 (Bayshore Soil Management, LLC, of Keasbey, NJ, USEPA ID# NJ1225001522).

In addition, as approved, Matrix completed RI activities on May 16, 2023, and May 31st and June 1, 2023 to delineate the extent of fuel oil impacts to soil and groundwater that exceed NJDEP standards around the UST. Results from the RI work indicate that the fuel oil soil and groundwater impacts are limited in extent, and do not extend beneath the library building footprint. Based on the soil and groundwater data collected, the area of impact beneath and adjacent to the UST measures up to approximately 12 feet wide by 42 feet long and 13 feet in depth (below exterior grade surface). In addition, the results from the soil sampling investigation of the potential non-fuel oil odor / unknown potential VOCs previously identified via odors and elevated PIDs indicated that potential VOCs impacts to soil in the area around the fuel oil UST do not exceed NJDEP standards, and are not of concern.

Since the Library construction work includes installation of a new storm water line through the UST location, and the construction of a subsurface concrete ramp in the vicinity of the soil impact, the Township / Library Trust has opted to remediate the impacts quickly via excavation (including UST removal) rather than utilizing a longer-term *in-situ* treatment (e.g. in-ground amendment injections), long-term monitoring and / or a Deed Restriction approach.

The following Scope of Work was developed to complete activities that are anticipated to be required to remediate fuel oil impacts (via direct impacted soil / groundwater removal with offsite disposal) to levels below the NJDEP standards (for soil and groundwater), and to achieve NJDEP regulatory close-out of the existing record case for the fuel oil release identified at this Site (for NJDEP Case Number 22-12-08-1329-25).

2.0 SCOPE OF WORK

2.1 <u>TASK 1</u>: REMEDIAL SPECIFICATIONS

A described by the Township / Maplewood Trust, the identification of this UST and the fuel oil impacts to soil are a previously unknown condition relative to the new library construction work contract currently being implemented at the Site by the general Site contractor (Pal-Pro). Therefore, as directed by Maplewood Township / the Maplewood Library Trust, remedial activities to excavate and remediate the impacted soils and remove the UST will be completed via change order (to the library construction work) through / to Pal-Pro, and a NJDEP UST-Closure-Licensed and 40-hour OSHA-HAZWOPER certified company (qualified to perform the work) will be subcontracted through Pal-Pro to complete the remedial work.

As requested, this task will include preparation of a specification package for prospective subcontractors to bid on the remedial work. This phase / task of work will include such items as:

- Solicitation of pricing quotes / bids / proposals from at last three (3) qualified (NJDEP Licensed and OSHA certified) environmental remediation companies to complete the UST removal and soil removal work;
- UST removal specifications;
- Soil removal and disposal specifications;
- Backfill and compaction specifications;
- Contract bidding documents, including bid form, computer aided design (CAD) contract drawings providing the location and dimensions of the UST and soils to be removed,

including a cross-sectional (vertical profile) drawing relative to the building foundation / footer to facilitate structural support development;

- Onsite pre-construction (bid walk) meeting with the prospective contractors for them to observe Site conditions to facilitate their proposal development;
- Preparation of any Addenda or response to questions or Requests For Information (RFI) from the bidders, and,
- Review of bids / proposals, and a recommendation for award.

2.2 <u>TASK-2</u>: ONSITE CONTRACTOR OBSERVATION AND DIRECTION AND CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION / SUPPORT

This task includes full time Matrix environmental consulting support during the course of all remedial work, including:

- Review of Contractor submittals prior to mobilization;
- Full time onsite observation and environmental Contractor direction during the course of the onsite remediation work, including observation / direction for UST removal and soil removal;
- Interaction and coordination between the Contractor, Pal-Pro and the Township;
- Contract administration support, including Contractor invoice review, and,
- Post-excavation soil sampling for the required NJDEP parameters (including certified laboratory analysis) to confirm soils remaining following removal comply with NJDEP standards to complete case close-out.

All work will be completed in accordance with the NJDEP Technical Requirements for Site Remediation (N.J.A.C. 7:26E), Administrative Requirements for the Remediation of Contaminated Sites (N.J.A.C. 7:26C), Heating Oil Tanks System Remediation Rules (N.J.A.C. 7:26F), and NJDEP Technical Guidance for Investigation of Underground Storage Tank Systems.

All soil samples collected, as described above, will be submitted to a NJDEP certified laboratory for analysis on a turn-around time basis of 5 days. The subsurface investigation will be conducted under the supervision of Matrix NJDEP licensed subsurface evaluator (SE) in anticipation of obtaining a NJDEP No Further Action (NFA) determination for the UST and NJDEP Release / Case # 22-12-08-1329-25.

2.3 TASK-3: POST-EXCAVATION WELL INSTALLATION AND GROUND WATER SAMPLING

Since fuel oil contaminants were detected in groundwater at levels above the NJDEP Class IIA Ground Water Quality Standards (GWQS), post-excavation monitoring wells must be installed following the soil removal, and sampled for fuel oil compounds twice (one initial post-excavation sample and one confirmatory sample if the first sampling round meets the GWQS) in order to close out the case and obtain a NFA letter from NJDEP. Two wells are recommended for installation; one within the impacted soil area (will be the former impacted soil area following removal), and one 10 feet downgradient of the proposed excavation area, pursuant to NJDEP requirements. The wells will be installed by a New Jersey Licensed Well Driller, and sampled at least two weeks following installation, per NJDEP requirements.

All work will be completed in accordance with the NJDEP Technical Requirements for Site Remediation (N.J.A.C. 7:26E), Administrative Requirements for the Remediation of Contaminated Sites (N.J.A.C. 7:26C), Heating Oil Tanks System Remediation Rules (N.J.A.C. 7:26F), and NJDEP Technical Guidance for Investigation of Underground Storage Tank Systems.

All ground water samples collected, as described above, will be submitted to a NJDEP certified laboratory for analysis on a turn-around time basis of 5 days.

2.4 <u>TASK-4:</u> REPORTING, MEETINGS AND PROJECT MANAGEMENT

Matrix will prepare a final (closure report) Remedial Action Report (RAR), as required by NJDEP, detailing the results of the soil removal work, post-excavation soil and groundwater sampling and well installation activities in accordance with NJDEP requirements. This work will include analytical data summary tables, figures, description of sampling activities, and a request for NFA if post-excavation results (as anticipated) meet NJDEP standards. An electronic DRAFT report will be issued for your review and comment. Upon receipt and consideration of your comments, the FINAL report will be submitted to NJDEP upon your authorization. This task also includes the NJDEP review fee (\$450) for the closure / RAR. This task also includes all project management, staff, subcontractor and vendor coordination and client interaction. This task also includes reasonable meetings / and conference calls with the Township to coordinate the work in light of the rapid renovations that are occurring at the Library.
