RIDING IN THE PADDOCK

Your attention is drawn to the serious consequences which could arise following an accident caused by unauthorised riding of any sort of machine in the Paddock.

All too frequently at meetings children are allowed to ride machines in the mistaken belief that because a race paddock is on private property and outside the jurisdiction of the Road Traffic Act, no insurance is necessary. It cannot be stressed too strongly that **liability for a substantial claim could rest with the owners of the vehicle and the driver.** (Or the parent in the case of a minor.)

The Union's insurers will quite legitimately repudiate any claim on them for damages arising out of the accident caused by an unauthorised driver.

THE SIDECAR MEN

No. 1 The reigning British Champion Chris Etheridge with his new passenger Paul Henderson. Chris is from Maidstone in Kent and he has won 6 titles so far and is aiming for his 7th. Paul has finished in 2nd place with previous drivers and is aiming for that no. 1 spot himself.

Following a crash during the second round at Doncaster which resulted in a damaged shoulder Chris has remained in contention due mainly to the fact that both Clarke/Chambers and Mallows/Peters failed to finish in one race at Wakes Colne the second round, and two disastrous punctures befalling Mallows and Peters at Frome. Chris would be the first to admit that the pace was fast and furious at that Wakes Colne meeting and could not have guaranteed to beat them even if fully fit. At Tinsley Green Etheridge was back to his blistering best and only Mallows and Peters were good enough on the day to beat him and passenger Henderson. At Wrangway in Somerset a mechanical fault in the second leg denied them the overall win and the championship lead. At the Frome event Etheridge and Henderson regained that top spot with consistent finishes and now need another three good places at Canada Heights for the title. Etheridge is aiming for his 100th championship race win having now won 98 championship races!

Etheridge/Henderson - MTH/BSU 650 cc

No. 3 Pete Clark from Little Yeadham, Nr. Colchester, Essex and John Chambers. Pete and John get on so well together and can turn it on when the track cuts up. Their season started with three wins, three seconds and three third places, but mechanical gremlins at Wrangway left them with no points in the first two legs. They were the series leaders going into round four but dropped to a despondent third place. They came out at Frome with all guns blazing scoring two wins and a second to put them back into contention.

Clark/Chambers - Zabel/EML 685 cc

No. 4 Shaun Mallows from Tiptree, Nr. Halstead, Essex and Jason Peters. These two are winners and are currently third in the all time British list of World Championship race winners. Shaun has never won the British Championship but passenger Jason has and will urge Shaun on to ensure that he does his very best this year.

Shaun and Jason look likely to maintain their championship challenge for 1997 at Canada Heights and go there with four wins, five seconds and three thirds so far this season. They were the series leaders going into the Frome round but following two punctures they've dropped to third, and nothings more certain than these two going all out for the overall win at Canada Heights even if the title eludes them.

Mallows/Peters - KTM/EML 650 cc

THE FOURSTROKE MEN

Reigning five times British champion Perry Leask, from Crawley in Sussex, is in determined mood to make it six in a row on his Husky Sport 610 cc Husqvarna powered fourstroke machine. Perry has been training hard all winter for the defence of his title, and at the age of 35 feels he has the experience and stamina to keep at bay the young guns who have been snapping at his heels for the past couple of seasons. Perry Leask has won thirteen races held so far this year which indicates another championship year for sure, although those present at the first five rounds will disagree! Stacy Harman and Tom Fuller riding Huskys have dominated the early running in every race so far and it's only a matter of time before the wheels come off Perry's domination. Russ Jarman, still mounted on KTM machinery which took him to second place in the '96 Championship also feels that this could be his year although a slow start has left him floundering in the wake of the three Husky riders, Lee King who switched back to the Husaberg of D & B Moto Cross midway through last season has been an inspiration and was probably the quickest rider at Wrangway. It was Lee who finished Leask's domination of this year's series and will be hoping for a repeat performance at Canada Heights. Tom Fuller stood on top of the rostrum at Frome much to the delight of his team. Challenging them on a 500 cc British build CCM which carried him to last year's fourth place is Simon Wyse who is currently in sixth place will also be aiming for better things at future rounds of the series.

The members of this leading sextet are all seasoned campaigners but there are plenty of youngsters in the field who are quite capable of winning the crown, the racing will be fast and furious right down to the last place. They call the fourstroke class "rolling thunder" but from some of the racing at the first two rounds they should change it to "greased lightning"!

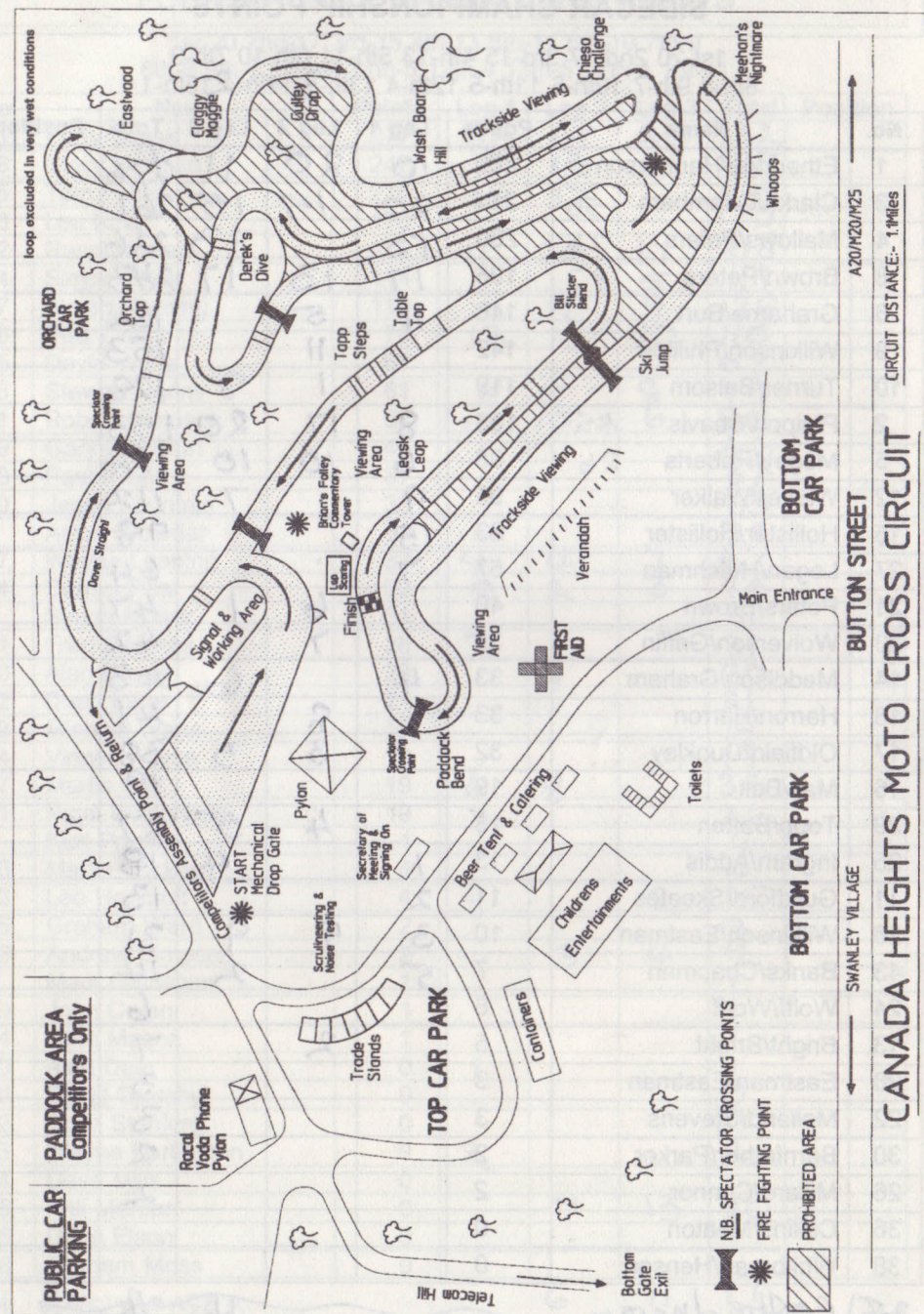
