DATE: Saturday, September 13, 2008

**TIME**: 3:43 p.m. ET

**SITE (CAPACITY)**: Notre Dame Stadium (80,795); Notre Dame, Ind.

**TICKETS:** The game is officially sold out making it the 201st consecutive sellout at Notre Dame Stadium. Since 1966, every Notre Dame home football game has been a sellout except one - a 1973 Thanksgiving Day game vs. Air Force. The Irish have now played in front of sellouts in 249 of their last 250 home games.

**TV**: NBC national telecast with Tom Hammond (play-by-play) and Pat Haden (analysis), Alex Flanagan (sideline), David Gibson (producer) and John Gonzalez (director). NBC will stream a live 30 min. pre-game show (3-3:30 p.m.) and post-game show on NBCSports.com.

GAME 2: NOTRE DAME (1-0) vs. MICHIGAN (1-1)

**RADIO**: ISP Sports is the exclusive national rights-holder for Irish football radio broadcasts. The Notre Dame-ISP relationship begins with the 2008 season and extends through the 2017 season -- with ISP managing, producing and syndicating the Irish national football radio network. Notre Dame games will be broadcast

### COUNTDOWN TO KICKOFF

- **300** Notre Dame will look for its 300th victory in Notre Dame Stadium this weekend.
- **20** The Irish will celebrate the 20th anniversary of the 1988 national championship team this weekend.
- 10 In just his second career start, senior SS Kyle McCarthy registered 10 solo tackles en route to a game and career-high 14 stops last week.
- 9 Freshman TE and #9 **Kyle Rudolph** became the first freshman to ever start a season opener at tight end for Notre Dame.
- 8 Sophomore QB Jimmy Clausen completed passes to eight different receivers in the season-opening victory over San Diego State.
- 7 Notre Dame held San Diego State to seven drives of 10 or fewer yards. In fact, 10 of the Aztecs' 15 drives for the game were for less than 20 yards.
- 6 Sophomore WR Golden Tate recorded a career-best six receptions last week, equalling his entire output from his rookie campaign.
- 5 Five freshmen made their Notre Dame debuts last week against San Diego State. The list included TE Kyle Rudolph, WR Michael Floyd, LS Braxston Cave, LB Darius Fleming and DT Ethan Johnson.
- 4 Former walk-on **Mike Anello** registered four solo tackles on special teams last week. He had two tackles on punt coverage and two tackles on kickoff coverage.
- 3 Three Irish players made their first career start last week, including junior S Sergio Brown, junior RG Chris Stewart and freshman TE Kyle Rudolph.
- 2 Notre Dame has forced at least two turnovers in four consecutive games dating back to the Air Force game last season. In the last two games, the Irish have been minus two in turnover margin and still managed to come away with victories (just the third and fourth occasions since 2005).
- Freshman WR Michael Floyd not only became the first Irish freshman to register a TD catch in α season opener, but also became the first freshman to score Notre Dame's first TD of α season.
- **0** After giving up a school and NCAA record 58 sacks a year ago, Notre Dame did not allow a single sack last week. The Irish had not gone an entire game without yielding a sack since Nov. 12, 2005 in a 42-21 victory over Navy.

**POLLS**: Notre Dame only received votes in the USA Today coaches poll (not AP), while Michigan failed to receive votes in either poll.

**SERIES INFO**: This meeting will be the 36th alltime between the rivals. It is Notre Dame's sixth-most played series and the third most frequent with any school in the Big Ten. Michigan holds a 20-14-1 lead in the series and took last year's meeting, 38-0, in Ann Arbor. The Wolverines have captured each of the last two meetings, including a 47-21 triumph in Michigan's last trip to Notre Dame Stadium. The Irish are 7-8-1 against the Wolverines in Notre Dame. The Irish have not lost two straight in the series at home since 1942 and 1978. (see All-Time Series Results on page 2).

WHAT TO WATCH FOR: Notre Dame will honor the 1988 National Championship team this weekend. Former Irish head coach Lou Holtz, as well as some 50 players, will return for festivities celebrating the 20th anniversary of Notre Dame's most recent national title. Holtz will also have a sculpture dedicated at Notre Dame Stadium's Gate D.

### MICHIGAN HEAD COACH RICH RODRIGUEZ:

On Dec. 17, 2007, Rich Rodriguez was announced as the 18th head coach in University of Michigan football history, and just the 11th in the 106 years since Fielding H. Yost made his debut in 1901.

Rodriguez comes to Michigan after spending seven years as head coach at his alma mater, West Virginia University, where he led the Mountaineers to a 60-26 record, four Big East titles and six consecutive bowl game bids. In 2005, he was named to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees.

Under Rodriguez's guidance, WVU claimed four of the last five Big East championships and recorded three consecutive seasons (2005-07) of double-digit victories for the first time in school history. The Mountaineers recorded at least eight wins in each of the last six seasons, and since 2002 have accumulated a record of 57-16, winning 78.1 percent of their games.

Prior to accepting the West Virginia job on Nov. 26, 2000, Rodriguez served as offensive coordinator and associate head coach for Tommy Bowden at Clemson in 1999 (6-6) and 2000 (9-3). He spent the previous two years as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for Bowden at Tulane, where he helped lead the Green Wave to 7-4 and 12-0 marks, culminating with a victory at the Liberty Bowl.

Rodriguez began his collegiate head coaching career at the NAIA/Division II level at Salem (1988) and Glenville State College (1990-96). At Glenville State, he won or shared four consecutive West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference titles and was named the WVIAC Coach of the Year in 1993 and '94. He was the 1993 NAIA Coach of the Year after leading his team to a national runner-up finish. Rodriguez, who also served as Glenville's athletic director in 1995-96, was inducted into the Glenville Hall of Fame in 2003.

NOTRE DAME - MICHIGAN SERIES NOTES

► This year's meeting will mark the 36th meeting between Notre Dame and Michigan, with the Wolverines holding a 20-14-1 series lead. Notre Dame has captured three of the last four meetings in Notre Dame, but Michigan walked away with a 47-21 victory in 2006 (see page 9 for recap). The Irish own a 7-8-1 record against Michigan in Notre Dame.

► The first meeting between the two schools took place during the 1887 season. Michigan blanked Notre Dame, 8-0, in South Bend. The Wolverines proceeded to win the next seven games over the Irish. Notre Dame's first victory over Michigan came during the 1909 season in Ann Arbor by a score of 11-3. The two teams would not meet for another 33 years. After the Wolverines and Irish split meetings in 1942 and 1943, the series took another break, this time 35 years. Since renewing the rivalry in 1978, Notre Dame and Michigan have played every season except 1983, 1984, 1995, 1996, 2000 and 2001.

▶ Prior to last year's matchup, either Notre Dame or Michigan had been ranked entering the game for each of the previous 24 meetings. The last meeting between the Irish and Wolverines in which they were each unranked came way back in 1909 -- an era before national polls (polls debuted in 1936). Furthermore, six times both teams have been ranked in the Top 10 and three games one or the other was ranked No 1.

▶ Michigan is one of only four school's that own a winning record against Notre Dame (based on a minimum of five all-time meetings). Florida State, Ohio State and Nebraska are the other programs.

► Over the last 16 meetings (dating back to 1988), the Notre Dame-Michigan game has been decided by a touchdown or less on 10 different occasions.

▶ Notre Dame and Michigan announced jointly a 20-year contract extension in the football series, extending the series from 2012-31. With the current contract expiring after the 2011 season, the new contract guarantees that the two winningest football programs in NCAA Division I history will meet annually for the next 25 years.

#### NOTRE DAME-MICHIGAN SERIES PRODUCES EXCITING GAMES

▶ Eight of the last 17 Notre Dame-Michigan games have been decided by five points or less while only five of the last 24 games have been won by more than 10 points: Michigan's 25-7 home win in 1981, Notre Dame's 26-7 victory at Michigan in 1987, Notre Dame's 36-20 triumph at home in 1998, Michigan's 38-0 victory in Ann Arbor back in 2004, the Wolverines 47-21 win at Notre Dame in 2006 and Michigan's 38-0 triumph last season.

▶ The average margin of victory has been just 5.0 points over the span of the all-time series. Take away the 2004, 2006 and 2007 meetings and the average margin of victory is 2.3.

► Five of the last 22 games in the series have seen the winning points come in the final two minutes (1980, '88, '90, '94 and '99), including two that were decided in the final seconds ('80 and '94).

### IRISH, WOLVERINES RANK AT TOP OF MOST NCAA LISTS

▶ Notre Dame has won 11 consensus national championships, while Michigan has won nine titles.

▶ Notre Dame currently has 825 career Division I-A victories (second all-time), while Michigan leads with 870 career wins, although the Wolverines have played nine more seasons than the Irish.

▶ Michigan holds the record for times ranked in the Associated Press poll (753), followed closely by Ohio State (738) and Notre Dame (705).

▶ Notre Dame ranks first all-time with 95 consensus All-America selections (from 79 players), while Michigan is tied for second on that list with 77 consensus All-America picks (from 64 players each). USC (67 players) and Ohio State (59 players) each have 76 selections.

### IRISH RECORD SETTERS IN THE NOTRE DAME-MICHIGAN SERIES

▶ Harry Jewett scored Notre Dame's first ever touchdown on April 20, 1888 and it came against Michigan on a five-yard scamper.

▶ The following performances are tied for first in the Irish record book and came in games against Michigan: two kickoff returns for touchdowns (Raghib "Rocket" Ismail, 1989) and 26 tackles (Bob Crable, 1978).

Crable also recorded the fourth (20 tackles against Michigan in 1981) and fifth most ever in a single game (19 tackles against Michigan in 1980).

▶ The following performances are tied for fourth in the Irish record book (all on four attempts): four field goals by Chuck Male (1979), John Carney (1985) and Reggie Ho (1988).

▶ Raghib "Rocket" Ismail's 192 kick return yards in 1989 rank second in Irish history.

▶ Harry Oliver's game-winning 51-yard field goal versus Michigan in 1980 is tied for the secondlongest kick in Irish history, while Ricky Watters' 81-yard punt return against the Wolverines in 1988 ranks 11th all-time at Notre Dame.

▶ Notre Dame's all-time opponent records do not include any by Michigan (both team and individual).

### REMEMBER THESE NAMES

Here are just a few of the memorable names and performances from the Notre Dame - Michigan series in Notre Dame Stadium:

▶ 1980 - Harry Oliver's legendary 51-yard field goal at the gun pushes Notre Dame to a 29-27 victory.

▶ 1986 - Unranked Notre Dame takes No. 3 Michigan to the brink, piling up 455 yards of offense behind Tim Brown (65 yards, touchdown run). John Carney misses possible game-winning field goal with 18 seconds remaining.

▶ 1988 - Reggie Ho kicks four field goals to lead Notre Dame to victory, 19-17. Mike Gillette misses a 49-yard attempt as time expires. Ricky Watters scores Notre Dame's lone touchdown on an 81-yard punt return.

▶ 1990 - Rick Mirer connects with Adrian Jarrell for an 18-yard touchdown pass with 1:40 remaining to give Notre Dame a 28-24 victory. Michael Stonebreaker and Reggie Brooks (then a corner-

back) post crucial second half interceptions of Elvis Grbac. Desmond Howard explodes for 133 yards receiving and two touchdowns for the Wolverines.

▶ 1994 - Remy Hamilton drills a 42-yard field goal to provide Michigan with a victory in Notre Dame Stadium, 26-24. Hamilton's kick erases a Ron Powlus - Derrick Mayes possible game-winning touchdown pass.

▶ 1998 - Autry Denson rushes for 163 yards and two touchdowns as Notre Dame scored 30 points in the second half en route to a 36-20 victory over No. 5 Michigan.

▶ 2002 - Ryan Grant rushes for a (then) career-high 132 yards and two touchdowns to help Notre Dame defeat Michigan 25-23. Shane Walton posts an interception on the Wolverines' final offensive play to seal the victory.

▶ 2004 - Darius Walker runs for 115 yards on 31 carries and two fourth-quarter touchdowns as the Irish beat No. 8 Michigan, 28-20. He was the first Notre Dame freshman to rush for more than 100 yards since Julius Jones had 146 yards against Navy in 1999.

#### NOTRE DAME VS. BIG TEN

▶ Notre Dame has faced no other conference as often as the Big Ten. The Irish have played 342 all-time games against the 11 current members of the league. Notre Dame is 216-111-15 in those meetings. The Irish have played almost three times as many games against the Big Ten as any other conference. The Pac-10 (125) and ACC (106) are the only other conferences against whom Notre Dame has played at least 100 games.

▶ Notre Dame has faced Michigan 35 times (14-20-1), fourth most of any Big Ten program. Purdue leads the Big Ten with 79 all-time games against Notre Dame (51-26-2) followed by Michigan State (44-26-1) and Northwestern (37-8-2).

▶ Last year's matchup with Penn State, the 19th all-time meeting, was the second with the Nittany Lions as a member of the conference.

▶ Notre Dame will face three members of the Big 10 in 2008 (Michigan, Michigan State and Purdue). The Irish face the Wolverines, Spartans and Boilermakers for the seventh consecutive season. Notre Dame played four members of the Big 10 in each of the last two seasons. Notre Dame has played a member of the Big Ten every single season since 1915.

▶ Notre Dame has posted a 110-45-5 (.703) record against Big Ten opponents at home and a 89-40-3 (.686) mark inside Notre Dame Stadium.

### ON THIS DATE

Notre Dame has played just three previous games in its history on Sept. 13. The Irish are 0-3 alltime on this date.

Sept. 13, 2003: Chris Perry rushed for 133 yards on 31 carries to lead fifth-ranked Michigan past 15th-ranked Notre Dame, 38-0. In a rivalry known for its nailbiters, the Wolverines posted the first shutout in the series since their 23-0 win in 1902.

Sept. 13, 1997: Current Irish quarterback coach Ron Powlus completed 31 of 43 passes for 293 yards and Autry Denson rushed for 104 yards, but each were not enough as Purdue upended Notre Dame, 28-17.

Sept. 13, 1986: Lou Holtz's first game as coach of Notre Dame. In a torrid, tense battle against the nation's No. 3 football team, the unranked Fighting Irish piled up 455 yards and twenty-seven first downs. They converted eight of 12 third-down situations and lost a 24-23 heartbreaker in one of the most pulsating, come-from-behind surges in Irish history. They came within a single point of toppling the highly ranked Wolverines, losing the game only because John Carney missed an extra-point conversion and then with thirteen seconds remaining missed a forty-five yard field goal attempt.

### NOTRE DAME-MICHIGAN CONNECTIONS

▶ Notre Dame defensive coordinator Corwin Brown was a member of four Big Ten championship teams at Michigan. He played in three Rose Bowls during his time in Ann Arbor (1989-1992). Recruited to the Wolverines by legendary head coach Bo Schembechler, Brown was a four-year letterwinner on teams that finished with a 38-7-3 record and never finished a season ranked lower than seventh in the Associated Press poll. He was a tri-captain of the 1992 Wolverine team and also earned first-team all-Big Ten honors that season after ranking second on the squad with 82 tackles. Brown started every game as a junior and received second-team all-Big Ten accolades following a 71-tackle season. He majored in English and received his degree in 1994.

▶ Notre Dame defensive line coach Jappy Oliver and Michigan associate head coach/running backs Fred Jackson served on Gerry DiNardo's (Notre Dame '74) staff at Vanderbilt in 1991.

▶ The 2008 Notre Dame roster features three players from the state of Michigan, including senior WR David Grimes, senior QB Evan Sharpley and freshman TB Jonas Gray. Grimes is a native of Detroit and graduated from DePorres High School. Sharpley graduated from Marshall High School in Marshall, Michigan, while Gray attended Detroit Country Day High School and calls Beverly Hills home.

Michigan senior TE Mike Massey's father, Jim, played defensive end for the Irish in 1969.

▶ The 2008 Michigan roster features three players from the state of Indiana, including junior S Stevie Brown (Columbus/Columbus East H.S.), sophomore S Artis Chambers (Fort Wayne/Snider H.S.) and freshman OL Kurt Wermers (Crown Point/Crown Point H.S.).

► A number of players from Michigan and Notre Dame either attended the same high school or hail from the same hometown.

### NOTRE DAME AND THE GREAT LAKES STATE

Notre Dame owns an 81-47-4 all-time record against schools from the Great Lakes State, last playing a Michigan school (hosted Michigan State) in 2007 (α 31-14 defeat). Other Irish series records vs. teams from Michigan include a 1-0 mark vs. Adrian, 3-1-1 vs. Albion, 4-0 vs. Alma, 2-0 vs. Detroit, 4-0-1 vs. Hillsdale, 7-0 vs. Kalamazoo, 14-20-1 vs. Michigan, 44-26-1 vs. Michigan State and 2-0 vs. Western Michigan.

▶ Notre Dame's all-time varsity football roster includes just over 2,700 players who have appeared in at least one career game, with 135 of those hailing from the state of Michigan.

▶ The 2008 Notre Dame roster includes three Michigan natives, including two seniors and one freshman. That group is headlined by senior starting WR David Grimes (Detroit/DePorres H.S.), senior backup QB Evan Sharpley (Marshall/Marshall H.S.) and freshman HB Jonas Gray (Beverly Hills/Detroit Country Day H.S.).

▶ Five of Notre Dame's more noteworthy all-time players from Michigan include All-American and legendary halfback George Gipp (Laurium, 1917-20) plus four other consensus All-Americans: offensive guard Heartley (Hunk) Anderson (Hancock, 1918-21), cornerback Clarence Ellis (Grand Rapids, 1969-71), cornerback Todd Lyght (Flint, 1987-90) and defensive tackle Greg Marx (Redford, 1970-72).

▶ Other All-Americans from the state of Michigan include defensive end Earl Brown (Benton Harbor, 1936-38), defensive tackle Mike Kadish (Grand Rapids, 1969-71) and split end Jim Seymour (Berkley, 1966-68).

### The Last Meeting Michigan 38, Notre Dame 0 Sept. 15, 2007

**ANN ARBOR, Mich. (AP)** -- Michigan took care of Mike Hart's guarantee with ease.

Hart ran for 187 yards on 35 carries and scored two touchdowns, and Ryan Mallett threw for three scores, leading the Wolverines to a 38-0 win over Notre Dame on Saturday.

Michigan handed the Fighting Irish their worst loss since beating them by the same score in 2003.

The Wolverines (1-2) avoided their first 0-3 start in seven decades.

Notre Dame (0-3) is winless after three games for just the second time in school history, putting coach Charlie Weis in unwanted company with Bob Davie.

The Fighting Irish have lost five straight for the first time since the 1985-86 seasons, Gerry Faust's last year and Lou Holtz's first.

In an unprecedented matchup of the storied programs, Michigan looked like it might not be that bad while the Fighting Irish appeared to be even worse than expected after losing to Penn State and Georgia Tech by a combined 51 points.

Hart backed up his prediction of a win with a sensational performance, even against a defense stacked to stop him. His freshman quarterback was efficient in his first career start.

Michigan's defense suddenly was swarming to the football after giving up 73 points in losses to Appalachian State and Oregon.

Freshman Jimmy Clausen was 11-of-17 for just 74 yards and an interception. He was sacked seven times, leading to Notre Dame's rushing total of minus-6.

Notre Dame prevented Clausen from taking more abuse in the fourth quarter, and had to use Evan Sharpley because backup quarterback Demetrius Jones stunned the team by not showing up for a team meal or the bus trip to Ann Arbor on Friday. Fittingly, Sharpley threw an interception just as it seemed that Notre Dame might avoid a shutout.

The Fighting Irish did move the ball enough on the ground on their final drive, however, to avoid breaking their school record of minus-12 yards rushing.

In three games, Notre Dame's offense hasn't scored.

Mallett was asked to throw just 15 times, and he connected on seven passes for 90 yards and TDs to receivers Mario Manningham, Adrian Arrington and Greg Matthews.

Senior quarterback Chad Henne, who had started each of his 39 games at Michigan, is out with what appears to be a knee injury. Coach Lloyd Carr has refused to give details, but Henne watched the game with a brace that seemed to be protecting his right knee.

It was ugly right from the start for Notre Dame.

The first snap sailed over running back Armando Allen's head, and the Fighting Irish lost 27 yards on their first two drives.

Notre Dame fumbled five times in the first half, losing two of them, and Clausen threw an interception, helping Michigan take a 31-0 lead.

The Wolverines just coasted in the second half, perhaps ending their stay in the national spotlight.

For the first time since The Associated Press started ranking teams in 1936, Michigan and Notre Dame were both unranked. They also entered the game winless for the first time, not counting openers.

Hart guaranteed a win over Notre Dame soon after Oregon beat the Wolverines 39-7, handing them their worst loss since 1968, and a week after being upset by Appalachian State and becoming the butt of Jay Leno's jokes.

### The Last Meeting in Notre Dame #11 Michigan 47, #2 Notre Dame 21 Sept. 16, 2006

**NOTRE DAME, Ind. (AP)** -- No. 11 Michigan finally put a Big Blue bruising on the second-ranked Fighting Irish in a 47-21 rout Saturday - the most points scored against Notre Dame at home in 46 years.

Chad Henne threw three touchdown passes to Mario Manningham, and the Wolverines intercepted Brady Quinn three times and shut down the rest of the Irish offense.

Prescott Burgess intercepted Quinn on the second play of the game to set the tone. The Wolverines were ahead 26-7 before the Irish had their initial first down.

The Wolverines (3-0) ended a two-game losing streak to Notre Dame (2-1) as well as a three-game slide at Notre Dame Stadium. The 47 points were second only to the 51 scored at Notre Dame by Purdue in 1960.

It was a huge win for Michigan coach Lloyd Carr, who had been under fire for failing to win big games the past two seasons - twice in bowl games, and twice each to Notre Dame and Ohio State. Carr, though, improved to 4-1 against No. 2 teams and 16-6 against Top 10 teams.

For Notre Dame, the loss was another setback on its road to restore its storied program. In 2000, there was a 41-9 loss to Oregon State in the Fiesta Bowl when the Irish were No. 10; three years ago it was a 38-0 loss to Michigan; and last year it was a 34-20 loss to Ohio State in the Fiesta Bowl when the Irish were ranked No. 4.

It was just the eighth time the Irish have given up at least 40 points at home.

The Wolverines jumped on Notre Dame mistakes, including a pass that sailed through the hands of tight end John Carlson to Burgess, who returned it 31 yards for a touchdown. Then Manningham was left open for a 69-yard touchdown catch and David Grimes fumbled a kickoff return that set up a 2-yard TD run by Mike Hart, who finished with 124 yards on 31 carries.

Henne then threw TD passes of 20 and 22 yards to Manningham to make it 34-7. The 34 points were the most allowed in a half by Notre Dame since 1998 when the Irish gave up 42 points in the first half in a 45-3 loss at Michigan State.

The 34 first-half points by an opponent were the most since Purdue scored 45 in its' 51-19 win in 1960.

Quinn, touted as the Heisman Trophy favorite, was just 3-of-13 passing for 14 yards before going 7-of-7 for 71 yards in leading the Irish to a touchdown drive just before halftime, cutting the score to 34-14.

Michigan held Notre Dame to 4 yards rushing on 17 carries and 245 total offense, 1 yard more than the Irish had against Michigan last season in their worst offensive output under Charlie Weis. The difference Saturday is Notre Dame gained most of its yards well after the game was decided.

Notre Dame's two top receivers, Jeff Samardzija and Rhema McKnight, didn't have their first catches until Michigan was ahead 34-7.

Hart had his third straight 100-yard game. The Wolverines improved to 12-1 in games when he runs for 100 or more yards.

It also was a big day for Henne, who last season was heavily criticized for his performance in Notre Dame's 17-10 victory.

Henne got off to a rocky start Saturday, throwing a pass that was picked off by Chinedum Ndukwe. Ndukwe returned it 51 yards to the Michigan 4 to set up Notre Dame's first score. But he finished the day 12of 22 for 220 yards.

Quinn, who has never had a big game against Michigan, struggled again. He threw three interceptions and fumbled a ball that LaMarr Woodley returned 54 yards for a touchdown. He was 24-of-48 for 234 yards.

NOTRE DAME HEAD COACH CHARLIE WEIS: A record combined win total for the first two seasons of any University of Notre Dame head football coach. consecutive Bowl Championship Series appearances for the first time in Irish history, and the two most accomplished passing seasons in Notre Dame football annals - those are the most notable byproducts of the first three seasons of the Charlie Weis era in South Bend.

Weis, a 1978 Notre Dame graduate and owner of four Super Bowl-champion rings as products of a stellar 15-season career as a National Football League assistant coach, wasted no time putting his signature stamp on his alma mater's program in his first two years as Irish head coach in 2005 and 2006.

Weis and his Irish followed up a 9-3 record in '05 and BCS appearance in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl with a 10-3 overall mark in '06 and  $\alpha$  second consecutive BCS invitation, this time to the Allstate Sugar Bowl. Those 19 combined wins (including eight straight in the middle of the '06 regular season) gualified as most in a two-year period by the Irish since they collected 21 in 1992-93. It was also the first time Notre Dame played in BCS games in successive years and the most prominent two-season bowl qualification since the Irish played in the Fiesta and Orange Bowls after the 1994 and '95 campaigns. The only schools to play in BCS games after both the '05 and '06 seasons were Notre Dame, Ohio State and USC.

Notre Dame's 10 regular-season wins in '06 marked the ninth time that figure had been achieved in Irish history. Weis' 19 combined wins in his first two seasons were the most by a Notre Dame head football coach in his first two years (the previous high was 17 by both Terry Brennan in 1954-55 and Dan Devine in 1975-76). For the second straight season in '06 Weis was one of three finalists for the George Munger Award presented by the Maxwell Football Club (of Philadelphia) to the college coach of the year.

► The 15 seasons Notre Dame lost its opener, the Irish posted winning records six times and a losing mark eight times (with one .500 season).

▶ The five seasons Notre Dame registered a tie in its opener, the Irish had four winning records and one losing record.

### COACHING IN THE CLUTCH

Knute Rockne owns the best career winning percentage among Notre Dame coaches in games decided by seven or fewer points, at 21-1-5 (.870). Among Irish coaches with 14-plus "close games", the other top winning percentages in tight games belong to Elmer Layden (22-7-3, .734), Frank Leahy (17-5-8, .700), Tyrone Willingham (10-5, .667), Ara Parseghian (13-64, .652), Dan Devine (15-9-1, .620), Bob Davie (14-12, .611) and Lou Holtz (20-18-2, .525). Current head coach **Charlie Weis** owns a .667 winning percentage in such games (6-3).

#### FROM ACROSS THE COUNTRY

▶ Notre Dame has historically recruited from all across the country and 2008 is no different. A total of 29 different states are represented on the Irish roster. Among Football Bowl Subdivision (formerly Division IA), only Army has more states represented on its 2008 roster.

### MORE EXPERIENCED IRISH

▶ In the 2007 season opener against Georgia Tech, Notre Dame used a total of 61 players and 31 were either freshmen or sophomores, including five that started. Just over 50% of the players on the field were in their first or second year with the Irish. Meanwhile, in last Saturday's victory over San Diego State, Notre Dame played 47 players and 16 were either freshmen or sophomores (five sophomores started and TE Kyle Rudolph was the lone freshman starter).

▶ In the 2007 opener, 16 of the 61 players that played against Georgia Tech for the Irish were making their first ever appearance in an Irish uniform. That number was cut in half last weekend as just eight players made career debuts.

### MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

▶ The Irish are now 9-4 in season openers following a losing season, including victories against five ranked opponents. In fact, when opening a season following a non-winning season the year prior Notre Dame is 5-1 against ranked foes.

began in 1936): USC (1931), Texas (1934), Iowa (1940), Missouri (1972), 14th-ranked Clemson (1979) and 20th-ranked Florida State (1981). Michigan (1942) and Penn State (1982) also won its first games at Notre Dame Stadium but previously had played the Irish at Cartier Field.

► Since the 1981 loss to Florida State, 11 consecutive opponents have lost in their first trip to South Bend: Colorado (1984), Mississippi (1985), Boston College (1987), BYU (1992), Vanderbilt (1995), Rutgers (1996), West Virginia (1997), Arizona State (1999), Texas A&M (2000), Washington State (2003) and San Diego State (2008).

▶ Notre Dame owns a 68-38-5 all-time record against schools from the Golden State. Other Irish series records vs. teams from California include a 4-0 mark vs. Cal, 1-0 vs. San Diego State, 1-0 vs. Pacific, 16-6 vs. Stanford, 4-0 vs. UCLA and 42-32-5 vs. USC.

### STOPPING THE RUN

▶ Notre Dame surrendered an average of 195.4 yards per game on the ground in 2007, but limited San Diego State to 71 yards on 15 carries last week.

### TURNOVERS, TURNOVERS, TURNOVERS

▶ Notre Dame was victimized by four turnovers on last week, including a pair inside the San Diego State red zone. Sophomore HB Robert Hughes fumbled at the Aztec four-yard line early in the second quarter, while sophomore QB Jimmy Clausen was intercepted in the end zone early in the third quarter (immediately following sophomore LB Kerry Neal's first career interception).

### IT'S NOT ALWAYS A MATTER OF TURNOVERS, BUT WHAT YOU DO WITH THEM

▶ Not only did San Diego State benefit from two Irish turnovers deep in Aztecs' territory, but San Diego State also scored two touchdowns following an Irish turnover. T.J. McKay's interception return to the Notre Dame 44-yard line setup a one of the scores.

### MORE ON TURNOVERS

▶ Notre Dame caused a pair of turnovers, but committed four of its own. While the Irish captured the 2007 season finale against Stanford with four turnovers and a minus-2 in turnover margin, Notre Dame is just 4-7 under Charlie Weis when losing the turnover battle.

### IRISH MISS OPPORTUNITIES IN RED ZONE


▶ Notre Dame has been outstanding in the red zone during the four-year tenure of Notre Dame head coach Charlie Weis. The Irish have converted 115-of-140 (.821) visits inside their opponents 20-yard line. However, Notre Dame failed to score a single point in its first three opportunities last week. The Irish fumbled, threw an interception and mishandled the snap on a field goal attempt in those first three chances. The Irish finally scored from the red zone on their final touchdown drive when sophomore QB Jimmy Clausen hit senior WR David Grimes for a six yard TD reception with 2:08 left in the contest. Notre Dame did enter the Aztecs' red zone a fifth time in the waning seconds of the game, but ran out the clock.

### NOTRE DAME PROTECTS THE QUARTERBACK

▶ Notre Dame surrendered a school record (and NCAA FBS record) 58 sacks last season. The Irish ran 68 plays, including 34 pass attempts on offense last week and did not allow San Diego State register a single sack.

▶ The Irish had not gone an entire game without yielding a sack since Nov. 12, 2005 in a 42-21 victory over Navy. In fact, the 34 pass attempts without a sack are the most since Notre Dame (Brady Quinn and David Wolke) registered 39 attempts without being taken down in a 49-28 win at Purdue on Oct. 1, 2005

### BALANCED IRISH OFFENSIVE ATTACK

▶ Notre Dame ran 68 plays in the victory last weekend over San Diego State. The Irish, under offensive coordinator and first-year play caller **Mike Haywood**, called 34 running plays and 34 passing plays. Notre Dame actually should have had 33 rushes, but the mishandled snap by Eric Maust is considered a rush as opposed to a missed field goal.

► The Irish featured eight different receivers with at least one catch and four with three or more receptions.

### SPECIAL TEAMS SHOW MAJOR IMPROVEMENTS

In the final 2007 NCAA stats, Notre Dame ranked 40th in punt return defense (7.44), 53rd in punt returns (9.12), 89th (out of 119) in kickoff return defense (22.75) and 94th in kickoff returns (19.69).

### CHECKING THE WEIS ERA RECORD BOOK

► With 13 points allowed, the Irish allowed the seventh fewest points under Weis. The fewest points Notre Dame has allowed under Weis were the six points in a 20-6 victory over UCLA on Oct. 6, 2007.

► The 71 rushing yards allowed was the sixth-fewest surrendered in a game under Weis and fewest since Army managed just 58 on Nov. 18 2006. The fewest rushing yards Notre Dame has allowed under Weis was -11 against Stanford on Nov. 26, 2005.

▶ The eight pass breakups by the Irish defense are the second-most ever under Weis. Notre Dame broke up nine passes in the 17-10 triumph at Michigan on Sept. 10, 2005.

▶ The 14 tackles by senior SS **Kyle McCarthy** were the eighth-most by an Irish defender under Weis. Chinedum Ndukwe holds the record for tackles in a single-game under Weis with 22 (Air Force, Nov. 11, 2006).

Senior DB **Terrail Lambert**, junior LB **John Ryan** and junior S **Sergio Brown** became the 12th, 13th and 14th different Irish players to register two pass break-ups in a single game under Weis.

Sophomore HB Armando Allen average under Weis. Tom Zbikowski holds the best punt return average in the Weis era (39.3 yards per return, Tennessee on Nov. 5, 2005).

Crum, Jr. has 247 career stops, needing just 48 tackles to enter Notre Dame's top-10 list for career stops.

Crum, Jr. has started every contest for Notre Dame (38) over the past three seasons.

Crum, Jr. holds Notre Dame's longest active streak in consecutive games played and started (both 38).

Crum, Jr. started at outside linebacker as a sophomore, middle linebacker as a junior (both in a 4-3 scheme) and inside linebacker as a senior (in a 3-4 scheme).

Crum, Jr. ranked tied for 28th in the NCAA in 2007 with the three forced fumbles

▶ In 2007, Crum, Jr. added 4.5 tackles for loss, one sack, two interceptions, four passes broken up, and two fumble recoveries.

Crum, Jr. was responsible for five turnovers as he intercepted two passes, forced a fumble (that was recovered by a teammate) and recovered two fumbles that he forced.

Crum, Jr. received national Defensive Player of the Week award from the Walter Camp Foundation following his performance at UCLA.

Crum, Jr. scored first career touchdown when he returned a fumble he forced and returned 35 yards for a score at UCLA.

Crum, Jr. became the first Irish player to ever record a pair of forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and two interceptions in the same game. Crum, Jr. also set a single-game school record with four turnovers forced at UCLA.

### WHO SAYS KUNTZ IS UNDERSIZED?

Senior NT Pat Kuntz entered the 2007 season without a single start and just 11 tackles in 21 career games. Kuntz excelled in Notre Dame's new 3-4 defensive scheme last season.

 Despite missing the final two games to injury, Kuntz started 10 games, totaled 53 career tackles with three tackles for loss, 0.5 sacks, nine pass break-ups and one fumble recovery.

Kuntz has moved to defensive end after starting at nose tackle in 2007. ▶ Kuntz possesses a tremendous motor and work ethic and displayed

an uncanny ability to knock down passes at the line of scrimmage.

▶ Kuntz led all defensive linemen in the Football Bowl Subdivision with nine pass break-ups last year and tied for the team-high honors.

### SOMETHING BRUTON IN THE NOTRE DAME SECONDARY

Senior FS **David Bruton** will serve as one of three captains of 2008 Irish squad, joining Maurice Crum Jr. and David Grimes.

▶ Bruton is the top returning tackler on 2008 roster after ranking third on the team and pacing the secondary in 2007 with 85 tackles.

▶ Bruton has recorded the second-most career tackles (122) on the team (behind Maurice Crum Jr., 246 tackles).

Bruton recorded one sack, 5.5 tackles for loss, three interceptions, three passes broken up, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery a year ago.

▶ Bruton has appeared in 36 career games and started 12 contests while

making 458 special teams appearances.

- Bruton was primarily a special teams player in his first two seasons before starting at free safety throughout his junior year in 2007.
- Bruton is still one of the top gunners on the punt coverage unit, as he was during his sophomore and junior seasons.
- Bruton is one of two returning starters in the Notre Dame secondary.

Bruton was named to the Nagurski Watch List (defensive player of the year) for 2008.

Bruton was rated the 12th-best safety in the nation by Lindy's and the No. 19 free safety by Phil Steele in the `08 preseason.

▶ Bruton was named to '08 Jim Thorpe and Nagurski Award Watch List.

### CLAUSEN FOUND HIS WAY

▶ With Notre Dame trailing 13-7 and 11:55 to go in the fourth quarter last week against San Diego State, Clausen proceeded to complete 8-of-hisfinal-9 passes for 98 yards and two touchdowns (led Notre Dame on scoring drives of 80 and 55 yards) to secure the come-from-behind victory.

▶ Recoded at least three touchdown passes in the same game for the third time in his career (third time over Notre Dame's last four games dating back to the Air Force game of 2007).

Eclipsed 200 yards passing for the second time in his career.

▶ Over the final three games of 2007 and last Saturday's contest against San Diego State, Clausen has tossed nine touchdown passes and three interceptions. He has completed 78-for-138 (.565) and 873 yards over those four games.

▶ Now, sophomore signal caller **Jimmy Clausen** had his best game to date against Air Force on Nov. 10, 2007. He completed 22-of-40 for 246 yards and three touchdowns. The completions, attempts, yards and touchdowns were all career-highs

Clausen was even better in the second-half against the Falcons. He was 17-of-29 for 192 yards and two scores. Clausen was victimized by at least five dropped passes.

Clausen connected with now senior WR **David Grimes** for a 25-yard touchdown pass that gave Notre Dame a 7-0 lead with 1:17 left in the first half against Duke. The 25-yard TD pass was the longest of the season for Clausen and tied the longest scoring pass of the season for the Irish.

Clausen wasted little time in matching his season-long touchdown pass. He found now sophomore WR Duval Kamara in the corner of the endzone with only four seconds remaining in the opening half to push

Including his second half effort against Air Force (17-of-29 for 192 yards and two touchdowns), Clausen went 30-of-52 for 361 yards and four TDs in that four-quarter span against the Falcons and Blue Devils.
 Clausen finished the Air Force and Duke games with three touchdown passes, tying career-high and the Irish freshman quarterback record.

▶ Prior to the Air Force contest, Clausen's best game came at Purdue on Sept. 29, 2007. Despite missing most of the fourth quarter after suffering a hip injury, he went 18-of-26 for 169 yards and one touchdown. Clausen recorded a completion percentage of 69.2% against Purdue -- secondhighest ever by a Notre Dame freshman quarterback (only Steve Beuerlein (.700, 14-for-20) at Penn State on Nov. 12, 1983 completed a higher percentage).

### WHAT DOES BROWN DO FOR YOU?

Junior S Sergio Brown made his first career start last week against San Diego State. The safety, who saw extensive playing time in the nickel package, set career-highs in tackles, tackles for loss, quarterback hurries, pass breakups and even managed a blocked punt.

### HELLO, ANELLO

► Senior DB Mike Anello, who was awarded a scholarship during fall practice, has made quite a name for himself over the past two seasons. Anello joined the squad a walk-on in 2007 and spent the entire fall camp as well as the first two weeks on scout team. After making one play after another against the Irish first team special teams until, head coach

rlie Weis moved Anello into the starting lineup as a gunner opposite

 ▶ In his first career game last year at Michigan, Anello proceeded to make a solo tackle on his first ever play in a Notre Dame uniform. He finished last season with six tackles in eight games.

► Anello was incredible in the season opener against San Diego State. He registered four solo tackles on special teams (two on punt return coverage and two on kickoff return coverage).

### FOLLOW THE GOLDEN RULE

▶ Sophomore WR Golden Tate show glimpses of his athletic ability in 2007. Tate had three receptions for 104 and a touchdown against Purdue and not only became the first freshman to catch a touchdown pass since Maurice Stovall (2002 against Rutgers), but also became the first Notre Dame freshman to surpass 100 yards receiving in a game since Derrick Mayes (100 yards on two catches) against Pittsburgh on Oct. 10, 1992.

► Tate only managed three receptions the rest of the season, but show major improvements last week against San Diego State. He hauled in six catches for 93 yards, including a 38-yard touchdown pass to give the Irish a 14-13 fourth-quarter lead. The TD reception was the longest by an Irish player since Jeff Samardzija recorded a 51-yard scoring strike from Brady Quinn against Air Force on Nov. 11, 2006.

### CHECK OUT THAT SHINY KAMARA

► Sophomore WR **Duval Kamara** finished 2007 with 32 receptions for 357 yards and four touchdowns. He set a pair of Notre Dame rookie receiving single-season records in 2007. Kamara's 32 receptions are the most ever by an Irish receiver, breaking the previous mark of 28 held by eventual Heisman Trophy winner Tim Brown in 1984. His four receiving touchdowns are also the most ever by a Notre Dame freshman.

### THOSE AREN'T BOOS, THEY'RE HUGHES

 Sophomore HB Robert Hughes finished 2007 with 294 yards rushing on 53 carries and four touchdowns. He totaled 246 of those yards on 35 carries over the season's final two games. Hughes became the first Notre Dame freshman tailback to eclipse 100 yards rushing in consecutive weeks since Allen Pinkett during the 1982 season. Pinkett rushed for 129 yards against Navy (Oct. 30) and 112 yards against Pittsburgh (Nov. 6).
 Hughes opened the season last week against San Diego State with 54 yards on 17 carries.

### AR(MAN)DO TO BE RECKONED WITH

 ▶ Freshman HB Armando Allen totaled 1,176 all-purpose yards in 2007. He led Notre Dame with six receptions against Penn State and returned three kicks for 67 yards (including a long of 25 yards). Allen registered 110 all-purpose yards in his first career game with Notre Dame versus Georgia Tech. Allen recorded 84 kick return yards on five tries and 25 yards rushing on three carries. He also added a reception for one yard.
 ▶ Allen totaled 226 all-purpose yards against Navy on Nov. 3. The 226 all-purpose yards was tied for the 11th most in single-game Notre Dame history. It is also the most all-purpose yards by an Irish player since Darius Walker had 241 at Stanford on Nov. 11, 2005.

► Allen set new single-season school records for kickoff returns (33) and kickoff return yards (704) in 2007. He broke the previous school record for kickoff returns in a single-season of 26 held by Julius Jones (1999) and Tim Brown's previous school record of 698 kickoff return yards in 1986. In fact, his 33 kickoff returns already rank seventh in Notre Dame career history.

► Allen eclipsed the 150 all-purpose yards for the third time in his career last week against San Diego State. He registered 59 yards on the ground, 18 in the air, 46 in kickoff returns and another 35 on punt returns, including a career-best 22-yard return.

### NEXT WEEK: MICHIGAN

Notre Dame hits the road next weekend for its annual matchup with the Michigan State Spartans. Kickoff on ABC is scheduled for 3:30 p.m. ET. The Spartans dropped their season-opener at Cal, but rebounded last week with a 42-10 rout of Eastern Michigan. Michigan State hosts Florida Atlantic this weekend. Last year, the Spartans upended the Irish, 31-14, at Notre Dame Stadium. The Irish have captured 15 of their last 18 games at Spartan Stadium.

All 2008 pep rallies will be held in the Joyce Center Arena (south dome), unless moved inside Notre Dame Stadium, on Fridays before Saturday home games, beginning at 6 p.m. (ET). The Irish squad enters the arena at 6:30 p.m.

▶ Notre Dame is 121-47-4 (.715) all-time during the month of September.

▶ The Irish are 76-18-2 (.802) in September home games.

▶ Notre Dame has an all-time mark of 40-27-2 (.594) in road games during September.

## NOTRE DAME FOOTBALL TEAM ECLIPSES 3.0 GPA FOR SIXTH STRAIGHT SEMESTER

Members of the 2007-08 Notre Dame football team combined to post a semester grade-point average above 3.0 during the '08 spring semester, marking the sixth straight semester (and the first six times in recorded history) that the Irish football team has topped the 3.0 GPA level as a group.

Fifty-four of the 104 players registered at least a 3.0 mark for the '08 spring semester and 53 members of the team currently have a cumulative GPA of at least a 3.0.

Fourteen members of the team earned a place on the Dean's List and the team's current cumulative GPA is over 3.0.

Statistics for the semester cumulative GPAs of the football team were not kept prior to 1992, but before Weis' arrival in 2005, the previous best semester cumulative GPA was 2.911. Beginning with the '05 fall semester, the Irish football team has recorded over a 3.0 combined GPA in each semester.

Weis' first team in 2005 surpassed the 3.0 mark for the first time ever with a 3.044 combined GPA in the fall semester of '05. At that time, that marked the highest figure ever attained by the football team. Then, the Notre Dame players followed that up with a combined and unprecedented 3.072 mark in the spring semester of '06.

The fall semester of '06 saw the Irish football team post a 3.041 cumulative GPA and 61 of the 104 players achieved at least a 3.0 during that semester. In the spring of '07, Irish players improved on that and recorded a 3.043 combined GPA.

### BRUTON NAMED TO JIM THORPE AWARD WATCH LIST

Senior FS **David Bruton** was one of 40 players named to the Jim Thorpe Award Watch List. The Thorpe Award is given annually to college football's top defensive back.

Bruton is Notre Dame's top returning tackler in 2008 after ranking third on the squad last year with 85 tackles. In 2007, Bruton added one sack, 4.5 tackles for loss, three interceptions, two passes broken up, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery while starting 11 of the 12 contests he played. He was a key member of an Irish secondary that ranked second in the nation in passing yards allowed per game, permitting just 161.6 yards per game.

Bruton is one of 11 free safeties to make the watch list. He enters 2008 with the second-most career tackles on the team and has been a special teams stalwart for the Irish.

### CRUM JR. PLACED ON CHUCK BEDNARIK AWARD WATCH LIST

Senior LB **Maurice Crum Jr.** was named to the watch list for the Chuck Bednarik Award. Crum was one of 75 players selected to the preseason list for the award presented to college football's outstanding defensive player.

Crum was one of 26 linebackers to make the list and one of 20 seniors at his position mentioned. The 6-0, 230-pounder enters 2008 with 241 career tackles, needing 54 stops to enter Notre Dame's top-10 list for career tackles. Crum has started every game over the past three seasons and holds Notre Dame's longest active streak for most consecutive games played and started (37). A 2008 graduate of Notre Dame with a degree in sociology, Crum was voted captain for the 2008 season becoming just the 17th two-time football team captain in school history.

### CLAUSEN NAMED TO MAXWELL AWARD WATCH LIST

Sophomore QB **Jimmy Clausen** was one of 75 players named to the 2008 Maxwell Award Watch List. The preseason list was based on individual performances during the 2007 season.

Clausen was one of 26 quarterbacks to make the list and one of only three sophomore signal-callers honored (a total of 12 sophomores made the list). The 6-3, 212-pounder started nine of the 10 games he appeared in last year and made his mark on Notre Dame's freshman passing records. Clausen started the second game of the 2007 season, the earliest any Notre Dame quarterback had started at that position since freshmen regained eligibility in 1972. He completed 138 of 245 passes for 1,254 yards with seven touchdowns and six interceptions in his rookie season. Clausen ranks second on Notre Dame's freshman quarterback singleseason lists for completions, attempts, yards and completion percentage.

#### BRUTON AND CRUM JR. NAMED TO NAGURSKI TROPHY WATCH LIST

Senior FS **David Bruton** and senior linebacker Maurice Crum Jr. have both been named to the watch list for the 2008 Bronko Nagurski Trophy. They are two of 88 players selected to the watch list of the Nagurski Trophy that is awarded annually to the best defensive player in college football.

### CRUM JR. NAMED TO LOTT TROPHY WATCH LIST AGAIN

Senior LB **Maurice Crum Jr.** is among 42 of the top defensive players in the nation to be named to the 2008 Lott Trophy Watch List.

Crum, who was named to the 2007 watch list, is one of seven repeat nominees. The other players nominated for a second straight year are Jonathan Casillas of Wisconsin, Brian Cushing of USC, Zack Follett of Cal, Nic Harris of Oklahoma and Darryl Richard of Georgia Tech.

### NOTRE DAME, NBC EXTEND FOOTBALL CONTRACT THROUGH 2015

The University of Notre Dame and NBC Sports have reached agreement on a new five-year contract giving NBC the rights to televise Irish home football games from 2011 to 2015, extending the partnership between the University and network to 25 years.

A joint announcement of the extension was made on June 19 by NBC Sports & Olympics chairman Dick Ebersol, NBC Sports president Ken Schanzer and Notre Dame's president, Rev. John I. Jenkins, C.S.C.

Each season from 2011 to 2015, NBC will televise seven games at Notre Dame Stadium and an additional eighth off-site game airing in prime time.

Revenues from the NBC contract have played a key role in Notre Dame's financial aid endowment since the start of the relationship in 1991. University officers decided then to use a portion of the football television contract revenue for undergraduate scholarship endowment (not athletic scholarships). To date, some 2,400 Notre Dame undergraduate students have received nearly \$26 million in aid.

The University also has committed NBC revenues to endow doctoral fellowships in its Graduate School and MBA scholarships in its Mendoza College of Business.

The revenue generated through the NBC contract is a primary reason why Forbes magazine has recognized the substantial financial contributions made by Irish athletics to the University's academic enterprise. In a 2007 survey, Forbes reported that the Notre Dame football program returns \$21.1 million to academic initiatives, a total that is more than the survey's next five programs combined.

NBC has been televising Irish home games since 1991, and this marks the fifth of a series of five-year agreements with Notre Dame. The original agreement covered the seasons from 1991 through 1995. The first five-year extension (announced in 1994) covered 1996 to 2000, the second extension (announced in May '97) covered 2001 to 2005, and the third extension (announced in December '03) covered 2006 to 2010.

## NOTRE DAME AND ISP JOIN TO PRODUCE FOOTBALL RADIO NETWORK

The University of Notre Dame and ISP Sports, have approved a new, 10year business partnership in which ISP will become the new exclusive national rights-holder for Notre Dame football radio broadcasts.

The Notre Dame-ISP relationship will begin with the 2008 season and extend through the 2017 season -- with ISP managing, producing and syndicating Notre Dame's national football radio network.

ISP, the largest collegiate-only sports marketing firm in the country, represents athletics marketing and multi-media rights for more than 40

Division I-A universities, five major conferences (including two Bowl Championship Series conferences, the BIG EAST Conference and the Atlantic Coast Conference) and two postseason football bowl games.

ISP takes over for Westwood One, which had held Irish football radio rights since 1968, originally as the Mutual Broadcasting Company.

ISP has named Ron Murphy the general manager for the Notre Dame ISP Sports Network. Murphy brings over 30 years of advertising sales and management experience, having worked for several notable companies such as CBS, Yankee Entertainment and Sports (Y.E.S.) and FOX Sports Net.

Murphy joins ISP's team of more than 250 professional sales people dedicated to the collegiate market, with relationships with more than 800 radio stations (and more than 100 television stations) around the country.

Headquartered in Winston-Salem, N.C., ISP has nearly 50 sales offices around the country. Sutton founded the company in 1992. Among ISP clients are seven ACC athletic programs (Boston College, Clemson, Florida State, Georgia Tech, Miami, Virginia Tech, Wake Forest), five from the BIG EAST (Cincinnati, Pittsburgh, South Florida, Syracuse, Villanova), five from the Southeastern Conference (Alabama, Auburn, Georgia, South Carolina, Vanderbilt) and three from the Pacific-10 Conference (California, UCLA, Washington). In 2007, the BIG EAST Conference and ISP announced a six-year agreement involving virtually all conference marketing and sales.

Notre Dame remains the only college football program to have its games broadcast on a truly national radio network of linear stations. Joe Boland, former sports director at WSBT in South Bend, originated the Irish Football Network in 1948. In 1956, the Mutual Broadcasting System first carried Notre Dame games on approximately 560 stations. From 1958-67, the ABC Radio Network carried Irish games on a similar-sized network. Mutual began carrying Notre Dame games again in 1968 (that year with 253 affiliates). Mutual eventually became Westwood One (now a publicly held company managed and partly owned by CBS Radio).

### IRISH ATHLETICS TEAM WITH WSBT RADIO GROUP

The University of Notre Dame athletics department has partnered with the WSBT Radio Group for the next six years (2008-09 through 2013-14), making WSBT the radio home of Notre Dame football, men's basketball, and hockey in the South Bend market.

WSBT Radio Group will be the designated exclusive local radio partner for Notre Dame football network broadcasts, with those games carried on NewsTalk 960 WSBT-AM as well as on Sunny 101.5 FM. Irish football games are originated by the ISP Notre Dame Radio Network, a national listings of stations around the country.

In addition, WSBT Radio Group will carry the Notre Dame Football Friday Live Show on Cat country 99.9 FM, the Notre Dame Football Postgame Show home and away on Sunny 101.5 FM - and the Notre Dame Football Coaches Shows on NewsTalk 960 WSBT-AM (on weeknights during the season). All three of those shows are produced by NDSP.

NewsTalk 960 WSBT-AM also will originate the annual Blue-Gold spring football game.

#### YOUNG RECEIVED HARVEY G. FOSTER AWARD

Bryant Young, a 1994 Notre Dame graduate and former Irish and professional football player, received the Harvey G. Foster Award during a halftime ceremony at the Notre Dame-San Diego State game Sept. 6. The Foster Award is given annually to a Notre Dame graduate distinguished for athletic endeavors and community service.

An All-American defensive tackle for the Irish, Young played for 13 years with the San Francisco 49ers before retiring last year with 89 career sacks. His NFL accolades include Defensive Rookie of the Year, four Pro-Bowl and All-Pro honors, selection to the 1990s All Decade Team and Comeback Player of the Year after suffering a potentially careerending leg injury in 1999. Last year, Young's teammates voted him the winner of the Len Eshmont Award, the team's most prestigious honor for inspirational and courageous play, for a record eighth time. No other player in 49ers history has won the award more than twice.

Young and his wife, Kristin (also a 1994 Notre Dame graduate), established the Young Dreams Foundation, which benefits youth organizations in San Francisco and Chicago. The supports summer youth football camps and college tuition for San Francisco Bay-area students. In addition, the Youngs have established several scholarships at Notre Dame for San Francisco and Chicago students.

For his philanthropic efforts, Young was named USA Today's Most Caring Athlete in 2000 and was nominated as one of the 10 Most Influential African-Americans in the Bay area.

### ROCKNE AND YONTO

They represent two of the most storied names in Fighting Irish annals when it comes to coaching football at Notre Dame.

That Irish football family lost two individuals with major connections to the University's coaching tree late this past summer with the deaths of Jack Rockne and Joe Yonto.

Rockne was the last remaining child of legendary Irish coach Knute Rockne. A long-time South Bend resident, Jack had been closely involved with Notre Dame athletics in recent years through the athletic department's Rockne Heritage Fund. Though never associated with football the way his famous father was, he had been a frequent fan at Irish home games of late. In 2006 he received an honorary monogram from the Notre Dame Monogram Club in recognition of his contributions and dedication to the University.

Yonto made his name as the long-time Notre Dame defensive line coach, beginning in 1964 when Ara Parseghian came to town and continuing on Dan Devine's staff and several years under Lou Holtz. When he wasn't coaching on the field, he worked under athletics directors Gene Corrigan and Dick Rosenthal as a special assistant to the athletics director while helping administer the football program. Yonto coached a glossy list of All-Americans and first-round NFL draft picks, including the likes of Alan Page, Mike McCoy, Walt Patulski and Ross Browner. Rockne and Yonto.

They were loyal sons of Notre Dame. They will be missed. -- John Heisler

### TWO-SPORT STANDOUTS

Following a long tradition of Notre Dame two-sport athletes, the trio of junior P **Eric Maust**, senior QB **Evan Sharpley** and sophomore WR **Golden Tate** -- all of whom made major contributions for the Irish baseball squad this past spring -- will again suit up for the Notre Dame football team in 2008.

Maust (Alpharetta, Ga.) filled in at punter during the 2007 season and averaged a team-high 42.1 yards on 21 punts, landing nine inside the 20 with only one touchback. He enters the 2008 season as the starting punter for the Irish. On the diamond, Maust served as the Irish Sunday starter, went 6-3 with a 4.52 earned-run average. He was named to the BIG EAST honor roll on two separate occasions during the season and was awarded all-BIG EAST second team.

Sharpley (Marshall, Mich.) had a breakout spring season in baseball. After spending most of the previous two springs with the Irish football squad, Sharpley turned his attention to baseball almost exclusively and the development was evident. He led the Irish in home runs (13) and slugging percentage (.691). Sharpley is the first Notre Dame player to ever throw multiple touchdown passes and hit a home run in the same academic year. He was named BIG EAST Player of the Week on March 24 after carrying Notre Dame to a sweep over Georgetown.

Tate (Hendersonville, Tenn.) saw action in 18 games (started nine) for the Irish baseball squad. He batted .262 with three doubles and four RBI. Tate also swiped three bases in five attempts. While Tate's participating in spring football somewhat hindered his playing time, his incredible athletic ability did not go unnoticed. None more evident than when he scored from first base, standing and without a throw, on a single to right field against Lehigh.

### NEW SCHOLARSHIPS

Former Notre Dame walk-on and current senior OC **Thomas Bemenderfer** was elevated to scholarship status prior to the start of the 2008 season, as was junior P **Eric Maust** and senior CB **Mike Anello**.

Anello (Orland Park, Ill.) earned the scholarship following a sensational 2007 season. Anello was a starting gunner on the punt coverage team and tallied six tackles. He is currently involved in many of the special teams units for the 2008 season. Anello owns a 3.93 cumulative grade-point average (GPA), qualifying him for the dean's list, and is a finance major in Notre Dame's Mendoza College of Business.

Bemenderfer (Mishawaka, Ind.) earned a scholarship for the second straight season. He began his college career as a scholarship athlete at Northwestern University before transferring to Notre Dame for the 2006-07 school year. He is currently listed as the backup center. A member of the dean's list, Bemenderfer is enrolled in pre-professional studies in the College of Science and has a 3.762 GPA.

Maust (Alpharetta, Ga.) filled in at punter during the 2007 season and averaged a team-high 42.1 yards on 21 punts, landing nine inside the 20 with only one touchback. A junior from Atlanta, Ga., Maust enters the 2008 season as the starting punter for the Irish. He is also one of the top pitchers for Notre Dame's baseball team and recorded a 6-3 record last season. Maust is enrolled in the Mendoza College of Business, majoring in finance, and owns a 3.153 GPA.

#### FRESHMAN WALK-ONS

Notre Dame's freshman class includes 23 scholarship players and four walk-ons: quarterback **Nate Montana** (who will be sharing No. 16), OL **Carl Brophy** (who will be wearing No. 69), **Mike Hernandez** (who will be wearing No. 65) and **Dennis Mahoney** (who will be wearing No. 71). Montana is the son of former Notre Dame quarterback and four-time NFL Super Bowl MVP Joe Montana. Brophy attended Gonzaga Preparatory School as did his sister Annie, a junior member of the Irish women's golf team. She became first outright BIG EAST medalist in Notre Dame program history.

### **RANK AND FILE**

Notre Dame's penchant for playing the best teams in the country is well known. In fact, over the last 22 seasons (1987-2008), the Irish have played 98 games against ranked opponents, an average of nearly five games per season. Notre Dame has posted a record of 49-47-2 (.510) in these games, including a 24-17-1 (.595) mark against ranked teams at home. Here's a breakdown of how the Irish have done against Top 25 teams over the past 21 years:

### IN FRONT OF A FULL HOUSE

Notre Dame has played in front of sellout crowds in 202 of its previous 231 games, including 77 of its last 85 contests dating back to the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl at the end of the 2000 season (the 2001, 2003, 2005 and 2007 games at Stanford, the 2004 game vs. Navy at the Meadowlands, the 2005 game at Washington and the 2007 game at UCLA were not sellouts). At Michigan in 2003, the Irish and Wolverines attracted the largest crowd in NCAA history (111,726), marking the third time in the history of the series that an NCAA attendance record was set. Including the 2006 game at Georgia Tech, the Irish have been part of establishing a new stadium attendance record seven times since 2001. The list also includes: at Nebraska and Texas A&M in 2001, at Air Force and Florida State in 2002, home vs. Boston College in 2002, vs. Oregon State in the Insight Bowl in 2004 (the game set a Bank One Ballpark record for football configuration). Notre Dame and Michigan played before an over-capacity 111,386 at Michigan Stadium in September of 2005. At Purdue in '05, the Irish and Boilermakers played before 65,491 football fans, a Ross-Ade Stadium record (since the renovation of the facility in 2003). Penn State

drew the second largest crowd in Beaver Stadium history for the meeting with the Irish last season.

### SIRIUS TO BE EXCLUSIVE INTERNET RADIO BROADCASTER

SIRIUS XM Radio (NASDAQ: SIRI), the Official Satellite Radio Partner of the University of Notre Dame, announced Sept. 2 that, starting this season, SIRIUS will offer Fighting Irish football and basketball games on SIRIUS Internet Radio (SIR), the Internet version of the SIRIUS radio service. SIRIUS Internet Radio will be the exclusive online home of every Notre Dame regular season football game and will also carry every Fighting Irish regular season basketball game live.

It marks the first time that radio broadcasts of live sporting events are available on the SIRIUS Internet Radio platform.

SIRIUS Internet Radio is the Internet version of the SIRIUS radio service, available without the use of a radio to current SIRIUS subscribers, or for the monthly subscription fee of \$12.95. SIRIUS Internet Radio delivers more than 80 channels of talk, entertainment, sports, and 100% commercial free music in CD-quality sound.

SIRIUS, which has aired Notre Dame sports since 2004, will also continue to broadcast the university's football and basketball games nationwide on the SIRIUS radio service. All Notre Dame games air on The Catholic Channel, SIRIUS channel 159.

The Notre Dame football broadcasts are produced by ISP on the Notre Dame Radio Network.

Every Friday night before a home game Notre Dame Football Friday Live is broadcast from Waterford Estates Lodge on SR 933 North of the Notre Dame campus from 8-9 pm on Cat Country 99.9 FM. Jack Nolan will host the show with former consensus Irish All-American Mirko Jurkovic. The show features live interviews with big names from Notre Dame football lore. The show can also be heard live on www.und.com.

#### LOU HOLTZ TO HAVE STATUE DEDICATED SATURDAY

A sculpture of former University of Notre Dame football coach Lou Holtz, a newly elected member of the College Football Hall of Fame, will be dedicated on Saturday (Sept. 13) at Notre Dame Stadium.

The dedication, slated for 10:30 a.m. EDT, on the morning of the Notre Dame-Michigan football game, will take place at Notre Dame Stadium's Gate D, which honors the Irish national championship football coaches.

Holtz will also be honored at halftime for his 2008 selection to the National Football Foundation's College Football Hall of Fame.

Participating in the presentation will be National Football Foundation executive director Steve Hatchell, College Football Hall of Fame execu-

tive director Lisa Malin, former Minnesota Gopher player Michael Moe (he played for Holtz and is now a Football Foundation board member), and Notre Dame athletics director Jack Swarbrick.

All of Holtz's former players, coaches and staff members have been invited to the dedication ceremonies. Speaking at the dedication on behalf of Holtz's former players will be 1987 Heisman Trophy winner Tim Brown. Other speakers include New York Times best-selling author Harvey Mackay, Notre Dame president Rev. John I. Jenkins, C.S.C., and Notre Dame athletics director Jack Swarbrick. Assisting with the sculpture unveiling will be former Holtz players Chris Zorich, Pat Terrell and Ned Bolcar, all members of the '88 Irish national championship squad. The general public is welcome to attend the ceremony.

The Holtz sculpture shows the former Irish coach calling a play on the sidelines, with two Irish players beside him. Notre Dame graduate Jerry McKenna created the sculpture. He also created the Frank Leahy and Moose Krause sculpture east of Notre Dame Stadium, the Knute Rockne sculpture at the College Football Hall of Fame in downtown South Bend, Ind., and the Ara Parseghian sculpture that was dedicated last September at the same Notre Dame Stadium Gate D location.

The sculpture has been funded by donations from Holtz's former players, assistant coaches, student managers, friends and business associates.

The sculpture complements bas relief portraits of the five Notre Dame national championship coaches – Rockne, Leahy, Parseghian, Dan Devine and Holtz – that are located at Gate D, designated the national championship coaches gate.

Former Irish team captains under Holtz who are confirmed to attend the ceremonies are Mike Kovaleski (1986), Mark Green ('88), Bolcar ('88 and '89), Tony Rice ('89), Zorich ('90), Todd Lyght ('90), Rick Mirer ('92) and Brian Hamilton ('94).

All-Americans under Holtz expected to attend include Brown (1986 and '87), Wes Pritchett ('88), Michael Stonebreaker ('88 and '90), Frank Stams ('88), Zorich ('88, '89 and '90), Raghib Ismail ('89 and '90), Lyght ('89 and '90), Rice ('89), Mirer ('92) and Mirko Jurkovic ('91).

Holtz coached 132 games in 11 seasons at Notre Dame and guided his teams to an overall record of 100-30-2. He holds the Irish record for most games coached and is second to Rockne in victories. He led Notre Dame to the 1988 national championship and remains 11th on the NCAA all-time win list for Division I-A coaches. Holtz took his Notre Dame teams to nine straight New Year's Day bowl games from 1987 through '95 and coached the Irish to finishes of sixth or better in the final Associated Press poll in five seasons.

Holtz was named the national coach of the year in 1988 by several organizations and saw his team play the most difficult schedule in the country three different years. Holtz had a 32-20-2 mark against teams ranked in the Associated Press top 25 during his career with the Irish.

Before coming to Notre Dame, the Kent State graduate previously served as head coach at William & Mary (1969-71), North Carolina State (1972-75), Arkansas (1977-83) and Minnesota (1984-85). He served as a college football analyst for CBS Sports in 1997 and '98 before serving as head football coach at the University of South Carolina from 1999 to 2004. Holtz compiled a 33-37 record with the Gamecocks in six seasons at the helm of the program before retiring from coaching at the end of the 2004 season.

Holtz then joined ESPN as a studio and game analyst for its college football coverage.

In 33 seasons as a college head coach, Holtz compiled a record of 249 wins, 133 losses and seven ties for a winning percentage of .651.
