3 Applications should be submitted to the Acting Commissioner of Lands, Nairobi, through the District Commissioner, Nanyuki. Applications must not be sent direct to the Acting Commissioner of Lands

4 Applications must be sent so as to reach the District Commissioner, Nanyuki, not later than noon on 12th April, 1960

5 Applicants must enclose with their application a cheque for Sh 1,000 drawn on the applicant's own banking account in favour of the Acting Commissioner of Lands, and no other cheques will be accepted. This sum will be dealt with as follows—

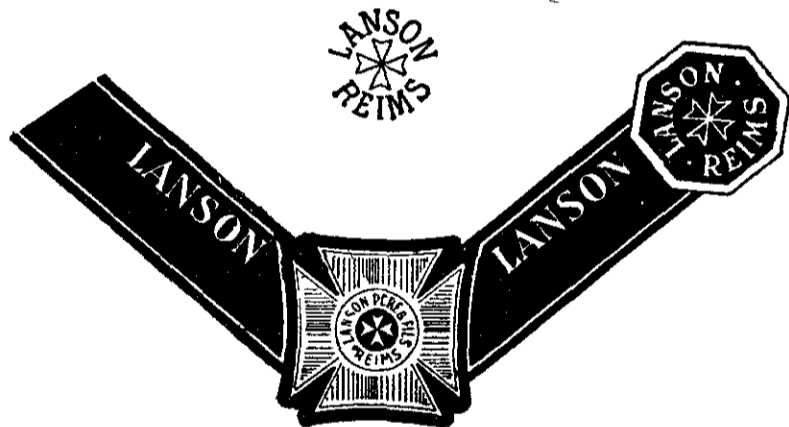

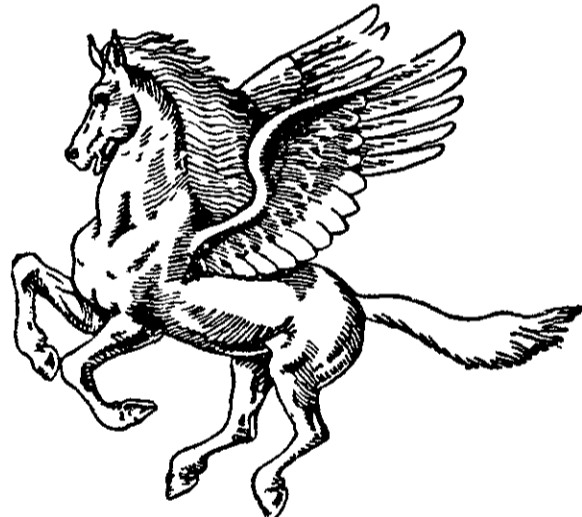

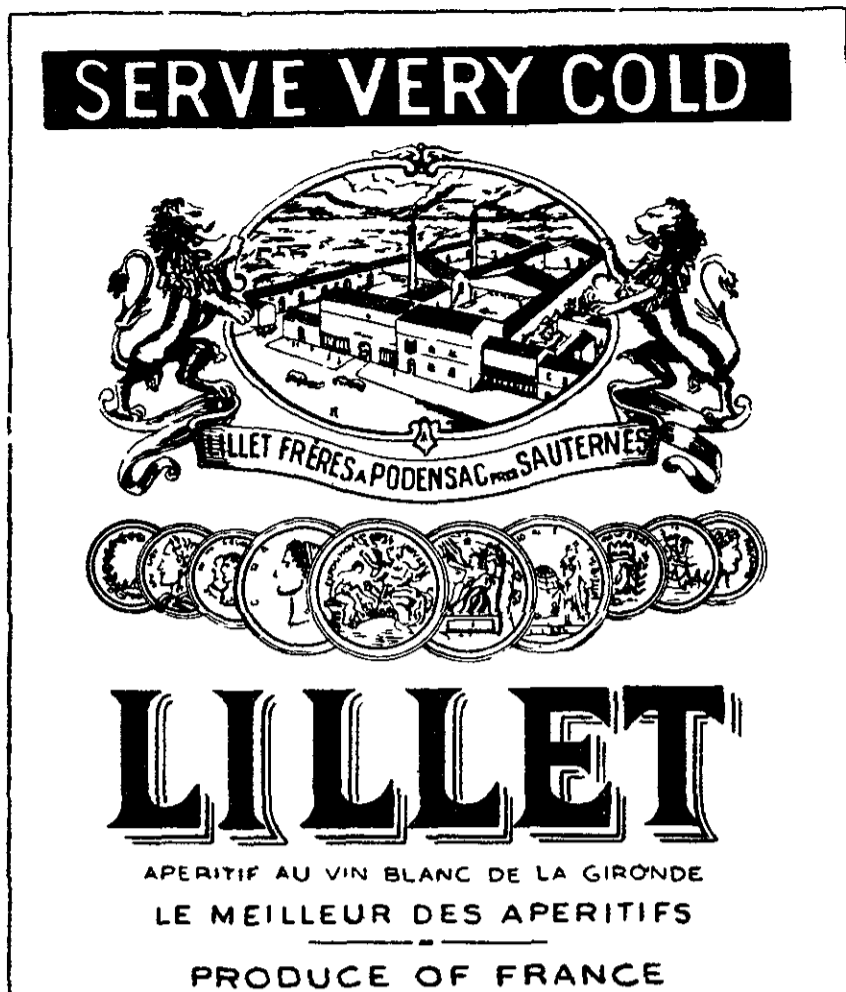
