NOTING THE WOLFPACK

- NC State is bowl eligible for the seventh time in Dave Doeren's nine years at the helm of the program. That's the most for any head coach in school history.
- In the past two years, NC State ranks second in the ACC in league wins, posting a 13-5 record. Only Clemson's 14-3 mark ranks better.
- The Power 5 teams with more wins than NC State over the past two years are: Alabama, Notre Dame, Georgia, Oklahoma, Oklahoma St., Clemson, Ohio State and Texas A&M.
- With the win over UNC, the 2021 Wolfpack became the first squad since 1986 (35 years!) to go undefeated at home (and that squad did post one tie) and one of just six teams in school history (1967, 1972, 1973, 1974, 1986) to post an unblemished record at Carter-Finley Stadium.
- NC State has six first-team All-ACC performers: OT Ikem Ekwonu, LB Drake Thomas, DT Cory Durden, SAF Tanner Ingle, P Trenton Gill and Specialist Zonovan Knight.
- Ekwonu was a finalist for the '21 Outland Trophy and won the ACC's Jacobs Blocking Award.
- The Wolfpack has won its last 10 games at Carter-Finley, including all seven of 2021. The only longer home winning streak in school history was a 16 game streak from 1972-75.
- The Pack outscored its foes 254-115 (36.3-16.4) at home in 2021.
- NC State has scored four TDs on special teams this season: a blocked punt return, a muffed punt recovery and two KORs. It marks the first time since 2004 that special teams has scored four times in a season.
- Despite seven starters out on defense by the end of the season (six who missed multiple games) the Wolfpack finished among the ACC leaders in several categories and ranked in the top 33 in the FBS in every defensive category.
- Head coach Dave Doeren has more nine win seasons than any coach in school history (3) and has now led five of his nine NC State squads to seasons with eight or more victories.
- The Pack was 24-of-25 in RED zone scoring over the last eight games of the 2021 regular season and ranks second in the ACC (18th nationally) with a .907 success mark for the season.
- NC State's ACC-best 15 INTs is the most since 2012. 10 different players have picked off passes for NC State in 2021.
- The Pack led the ACC and ranks 18th with just 11 turnovers in 2021.
- Head coach Dave Doeren ranks second in career victories in NC State history with 64.
- With a win over then No. 9 Clemson on Sept. 25 and over Florida State on Nov. 6, the Wolfpack has posted wins over both of those two perennial powers in the same season for the first time since 2002 (when the Wolfpack set a school record with 11 wins). This season marks the first time *any* ACC school has knocked off FSU and Clemson in the same year since UNC did it in 2010.
- During Doeren's tenure, 21 players have drafted by the NFL, including 14 in the last four drafts.
- Graduate wide receiver Thayer Thomas has eight touchdown catches this season - giving him 20 for his career. That mark is tied for third in school history.
- Fourth-year kicker Christopher Dunn became NC State's career scoring leader this season and now has 377 points for his career.
- Punter Trenton Gill led the ACC in punting average (45.05) a mark that ranks 21st nationally. If he finishes the season as the leader, it would mark the second time in the last three seasons he has led the conference.
- Wide receiver Emeka Emezie set a school record for career receptions in 2021.

THE GAME

NC STATE VS. UCLA

NC State and UCLA have met just twice in the sport of football. In 1959 and 1960, the Wolfpack traveled cross country to play the Bruins at LA Memorial Coliseum. Bruin tailback Billy Kilmer outshone Pack QB Roman Gabriel as UCLA earned the 21-12 victory in 1959. The following year, Kilmer scored the games only TD as the Bruins won 7-0. Gabriel would go on to become the NFL's MVP while playing up the road for the Rams.

In both of those seasons, the Wolfpack played just three home games, as the university sought to raise funds to build what is now Carter-Finley Stadium.

NC STATE VS. UCLA: HOOPS EDITION

In 1974, NC State's basketball team ended UCLA's streak of seven straight national titles by beating the Bruins 80-77 in two overtimes in the NCAA Tournament semi-final game. Two nights later NC State captured its first NCAA championship by beating Marquette 76-64. The Pack's only loss that whole season was to the Bruins back in December of 1973.

NC STATE VS. UCLA: ACADEMIC EDITION

Albert Carnesale, who earned a PhD in Nuclear Engineering from NC State in 1966, served as Chancellor of UCLA from 1997 to 2006.

Carnesale served on the nuclear engineering faculty at NCSU from 1962-69 and as professor and head of the Division of University Studies from 1972-74.

After leaving NC State, he spend 23 years at Harvard, serving as Provost from 1994 to 1997 before taking the position at UCLA.

Today, the conference center at UCLA is named Carnesale Commons in his honor.

FIRST IN THE LEAGUE

NC State is the first ACC team to play in the Holiday Bowl. That's it. That's the note.

SAN DIEGO TIES

WHERE RIVERS ONCE RAN

San Diego residents might not be as familiar with NC State as they are with the Wolfpack's Holiday Bowl opponent - UCLA - but the city is definitely familiar with one of the most talented and beloved players in school history.

Quarterback Philip Rivers spent 13 seasons with the San Diego Chargers. He also played three more seasons for the Chargers franchise once it was moved to Los Angeles (2017-19).

After serving as a back-up his first two seasons, Rivers was as the Chargers' starting quarterback from 2006 to 2019. He was named to eight Pro Bowls while leading the squad to four division titles and six playoff appearances overall.

Rivers was a four-year starter for the Wolfpack from 2000-2003. He still ranks as the all-time leader in school history in passing yards (13,484) and touchdowns (95).

HOME SWEET HOME

Even though Raleigh and San Diego are over 2,500 miles apart, the SDCCU Holiday Day Bowl will be a homecoming of sorts for Wolfpack head coach Dave Doeren.

NC State's leader will be able to look out his balcony of the bowl hotel and see his birthplace. He was born on Coronado Island at the Naval Base, as his father was stationed there. He lived in L.A. until he was in fourth grade and then was a graduate assistant coach at UCLA's crosstown rival USC in 1998 and 1999.

Doeren's father, Bill, still lives in L.A.

NC STATE TEAM NOTES

COMPLIMENTARY FOOTBALL

Throughout the 2021 season, head coach Dave Doeren has emphasized to his team the importance of playing complimentary football. In order to be successful, he says, the Wolfpack must be successful in four phases of the game.

Four phases, you might ask? Excellent question.

Of course, there's offense. The Wolfpack's offense averaged 33 points per game in 2021, with quarterback Devin Leary setting a single-season school record with 35 touchdown passes and the squad's 414.4 yards per game is the eighth-best average in school history.

Then there's defense. For much of the season, the Wolfpack defense led the league in most defensive categories (playing two of the league's top four offenses in the last three weeks of the season changed some of that). Heading into the Holiday Bowl, the Wolfpack ranks in the top 25 of the FBS in scoring defense, total defense and rushing defense and ranks 10th nationally in interceptions.

As for special teams, NC State has scored FOUR special teams touchdowns this season and boasts the league's top punter.

And now for the fourth phase: THE JUICE SQUAD!

Doeren challenged his young players - guys who are redshirting, reserves who don't see action, even some guys sitting out with injuries - to become that fourth vital phase. This group has taken pride in becoming a force from the bench - especially on third downs. They wave red towels, jump up and down and basically bring 'the juice.'

HOME SWEET HOME

NC State posted a 7-0 mark in games played in Carter-Finley this season and has now won its last 10 games on its home field.

With the win over UNC to close out the regular season, the 2021 Wolfpack became the first squad since 1986 (35 years!) to go undefeated at home (and that squad did post one tie) and one of just six teams in school history (1967, 1972, 1973, 1974, 1986) to post an unblemished record at Carter-Finley Stadium.

The Pack's current 10-game home winning streak dates back to last season and is the longest since a 16-game streak from 1972-75.

The Pack has outscored its foes 254-115 (36.3-16.4) at home this season.

EIGHT IS GREAT ... BUT NINE IS FINE

With his Wolfpack posting an 9-3 record heading into the bowl game, head coach Dave Doeren has now led five of his nine NC State squads to seasons with eight or more victories - most by any coach in school history. The Wolfpack now has three nine-win seasons under Doeren - a first.

Dave Doeren has led two previous teams to nine win campaigns (2017

Doeren and Sheridan are the only coaches to ever lead a Pack squad to two nine-win *regular* seasons (Doeren in 2018 & '21 and Sheridan in 1991 & '92).

SPECIAL FORCES

"Gritty, not pretty" is the mantra of the Wolfpack's Special Forces Unit.

That squad has been a key factor in the Pack's nine-win season, not only because they've taken care of their normal special teams business, but because they've put points on the scoreboard.

NC State has scored four special teams touchdowns this season, the most for a Wolfpack squad since 2004. The Pack's Zonovan Knight returned kickoffs in back-to-back weeks, and NC State has also scored TDs off of a blocked punt and a muffed punt.

NC State is tied for second nationally with its two kickoff returns for a score, only behind USF.

PACK PICKS

NC State leads the ACC and ranks sixth in the FBS with 15 interceptions this season.

10 different players have picked off passes for NC State in 2021, led by linebacker Drake Thomas, whose three INTs tied for fifth in the ACC. Thomas returned a pick 38 yards for a touchdown in the win over Syracuse.

Three other Pack players have a pair of picks: Tyler Baker-Williams, Shyheim Battle and Derek Pitts.

SIX DEGREES OF WOLFPACK NATION: The Wolfpack's experienced coaching staff may not have spent too many years together at NC State, but many members of the staff worked together prior to coming to Raleigh.

But just because these coaches are new to NC State doesn't mean they're new to each other. In fact, eight of the assistant coaches have coached with at least one other assistant coach (or head coach Dave Doeren) at a previous stop. Also, the Pack's Assistant to the Head Coach Ruffin McNeill has previous coaching ties with the current staff.

HOW LOW CAN YOU GO

Only 17 FBS schools have allowed fewer points than a staunch Pack defense has given up this season. NC State ranks second in the ACC and 18th in the FBS in scoring defense, allowing just 19.7 ppg.

NC State has given up less than 15 points in five games this season (six if you count Clemson's 14 points in regulation before the Pack won in double OT).

Ten of the Wolfpack's 12 opponents this season scored less than their season average in all of their other games - some significantly less.

WEALTH OF WEAPONS

Quarterback Devin Leary obviously has faith in all of his receivers, as evidenced by the fact that he's completed passes to 17 of them in 2021 (18 if you count the tipped pass that OG Derrick Eason caught against Louisville). Nine different receivers had double-digit catch totals in 2021, including wide receivers (5), running backs (2) and tight ends (2).

The Wolfpack's 35 passing touchdowns have been distributed to nine different players.

RED ZONE

Each week in practice, the Wolfpack offense spends many segments working on **RED** zone scoring. That practice is making (practically) perfect.

NC State currently ranks second in the ACC and 18th in the FBS in **RED** zone efficiency. The Pack has scored on 39 of its 43 trips inside that elusive area - a 91% scoring rate.

Even more impressive, in the last eight games of the regular season, the Pack has come away with points all but one time it's made it into the **RED** zone - 24-of-25.

FIRST ON THIRD

The Pack leads the ACC and ranks fifth in the FBS in third down conversion defense this season. The opposition has converted on just 53 of 181 attempts (29%).

BOWLING

With an 9-3 record in 2021, NC State is heading to a bowl game for the seventh time in Dave Doeren's nine years with the Wolfpack.

Doeren has led NC State to more bowl games than any coach in school history.

TURNOVERS

The Wolfpack leads the ACC and ranks 18th in the FBS with just 11 turnovers in 12 games this season. The offense has thrown six interceptions (and only five by QB Devin Leary) and lost just five fumbles. Two of those five INTs were on Hail Mary throws at the end of the game at Miss State and the end of the first half at FSU.

The Pack did not turn the ball over in four games before that end-of-half pick at FSU, which is even more impressive considering the squad had just two games without a miscue all of last season. That was the longest streak of turnover-free games for the Wolfpack since games 2-5 of 2017.

NO RUSHING TOUCHDOWNS

Even though the Wolfpack is tied for eighth in the FBS in passing touchdowns (35), NC State has just 11 rushing scores on the year. That mark is tied for 114th nationally.

The Pack scored on the ground just *twice* vs. ACC competition and one was by QB Devin Leary at Miami. An NC State running back hadn't scored a rushing TD in an ACC contest all season (although RB Ricky Person did score on a reception at Florida State) until Person opened the game with a 15-yard scoring rush against Syracuse on Nov. 20.

BEATING THE BIG DOGS

In the 29 seasons since Florida State began competing for the ACC football championship in 1992 (the Seminoles joined the ACC in 1991), they have won 15 ACC titles. Clemson has won seven ACC Championships during that time. Those two programs have historically been difficult to beat.

With a win over then No. 9 Clemson on Sept. 25 and over Florida State on Nov. 6, the Wolfpack has posted wins over both of those two perennial powers in the same season for the first time since 2002 (when the Wolfpack set a school record with 11 wins).

This season marks the first time *any* ACC school has knocked off FSU and Clemson in the same year since UNC did it in 2010.

FIRST HALF FINISHES

The Wolfpack has done a great job finishing out the first half of games this season, scoring with less than a minute remaining in seven of its 12 games.

In three of those contests – Louisiana Tech, Boston College, Miami – the Pack's late second quarter score provided a halftime lead.

Overall in the second quarter this season, the Pack is outscoring its foes 89-51. The +38 is the biggest scoring differential of any quarter for NC State.

Against Louisville, the defense was the unit that finished the first half strong for the Pack. Louisville got the ball back with 3:52 left in the second quarter, driving from their 12 to the Pack 41 before a sack by Daniel Joseph and Cory Durden kept them out of field goal range as time expired.

INJURIES

The Wolfpack - particularly on defense - has been hit particularly hard by the injury-bug this season. In the regular season finale, seven defensive starters were out with injuries.

The Wolfpack lost *both* of its defensive captains for the season due to injury. Those two - WLB Payton Wilson and MLB Isaiah Moore - also happened to rank first and second respectively on the team in tackles in 2020 (Wilson led the ACC).

THE BEST FIT

Dave Doeren and his staff have become known for recruiting players and then finding another position that better suits their abilities. In fact, a handful of contributors to the 2021 Wolfpack squad initially lined up at different positions when they first suited up for the Red & White.

Grant Gibson initially came to NC State from Charlotte to play on the defensive line, redshirting there in 2017 and then moving over to the o-line during the '18 season. Now he is one of the top centers nationally, starting every game at that position since the beginning of the 2019 season and becoming a candidate for the Rimington Trophy.

The Pack's top two tight ends this season weren't always in that position group either. Dylan Parham signed with the Pack as a quarterback in 2016, while Chris Toudle was signed as a wide receiver. Both spent their redshirt seasons at their original positions, then moved to new spots the following summer.

Three recent NFL Draft picks also made successful transitions to different positions, which in turn helped them get to the NFL. Among those are the Pack's two most recent first-round draft picks: Bradley Chubb (started as an OLB before moving to defensive end) and Garrett Bradbury (played at defensive line as a redshirt freshman before moving over to the offensive line).

Jakobi Meyers - currently the leading receiver for the New England Patriots - began his career as a quarterback before becoming one of the Wolfpack's top wideouts.

AGAINST THE RUSH

During Doeren's tenure at NC State, the Wolfpack has held the opposition to less than 100 yards rushing 41 times, including five times this season (vs. Mississippi State, Furman, Boston College, Miami and FSU).

The Wolfpack led the ACC in rushing defense for most of the season before allowing 297 rushing yards in the win over UNC. Despite that, NC State ranks third in the ACC and 25th in the FBS in rushing

defense, allowing just 124.0 ypg, heading into the bowl game.

It didn't look like Boston College would be included in the list of teams who didn't go over the 100-yard rushing mark against the Pack. The Eagles entered the game averaging 185.6 rushing yards per game and at halftime, they had already rushed for 100 yards exactly.

In the second half, however, a strong defense kept BC in the red in terms of rushing yardage and the final tally for the game was just 97 yards.

DOEREN FINE

Wolfpack head coach Dave Doeren, now in his ninth year at NC State, boasts the second-longest tenure of any coach in school history. Only one other ACC coach - Clemson's Dabo Swinney - boasts a longer current stint. Doeren's tenure ranks 14th nationally.

That stability at head coach has resulted in unprecedented success for the Wolfpack. Doeren was named the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Week following the Wolfpack's win over Clemson.

Here's some of the highlights from Doeren's stint at NC State:

- His 2020 squad set a school record with seven ACC wins.
- His players have won three national awards (Bradley Chubb won the Nagurski & Hendricks Award in 2017 and Garrett Bradbury won the Rimington Award in 2018).
- Has had 21 players drafted by the NFL, including 14 in the last four drafts.
- Boasts two first-round draft picks.

EXPERIENCED LEADERS

NC State may have one of the most experienced coaching staffs in the nation for 2021. The Wolfpack's 10 + head coach Dave Doeren combine to boast 299 years of coaching experience. That's one year shy of THREE CENTURIES!

The Wolfpack returns all but one full-time position coaches from a year ago, as assistant head coach/wide receivers coach Joker Phillips is the only new face. But even though the staff is basically the same from a year ago, the entire staff has turned over since 2018.

THE BREAKFAST CLUB

Every Sunday during the football season, the Wolfpack offensive staff hands out bottles of syrup to his players in commemoration of their pancake blocks from the previous game.

At this point in his career, third-year tackle Ikem "Ickey" Ekwonu should open his own restaurant, because he would need a LOT of pancakes to use up all the syrup he's received. He has 154 pancakes + 47 knockdowns in his 35 career contests.

NC STATE INDIVIDUAL NOTES

DE-LEARY-OUS

With 35 touchdown passes in 2021, Devin Leary set a new school record for a single season. That mark broke the previous best set by Philip Rivers - who had 34 scoring passes in 2003.

Leary became one of just three QBs in ACC history to post a 3400 yards/35 TD regular season: Kenny Pickett (Pitt, 2021) and Jameis Winston (FSU, 2013) are the others.

Leary passed for 27 touchdowns in ACC play - the top mark in the league - and ranks second to Pitt's Kenny Pickett in overall touchdowns with 35 (Pickett has 40).

A LITTLE MORE LEARY ...

Leary is the *only* QB in school history to throw for four or more TDs against five ACC opponents in the same season and the only player to throw for four or more in three consecutive games.

He had four TD tosses against Clemson and then in consecutive games vs. Louisville, FSU and Wake Forest, then had another four-TD game in the regular season finale vs. UNC

WAM!

When Zonovan "Bam" Knight returned the second-half kickoff 100-yards for a touchdown against Wake Forest on Nov. 13, he became the first Wolfpack player to accomplish that feat since Zonovan Knight did it a year ago against Miami!

Knight joined Nyheim Hines (Indianapolis Colts) as the only players in school history to return two kickoffs for 100 yards. Hines did it in 2015 vs. Clemson and in 2016 vs. Vanderbilt.

SDCCU HOLIDAY BOWL

Knight tallied three returns for 194 yards in the contest - the third-highest mark in school history for a single game. He leads all Power 5 players with a 37.1 ypr mark this season.

BAM!

When Zonovan "Bam" Knight returned a kickoff 97 yards for a TD against Syracuse on Nov. 20 ... well it wasn't a big deal since he had just done it the week before.

Actually it was a big deal, not only because it broke the game open for the Pack, but because it gave him three KORs for touchdowns for his career - a mark that ranks in third school history for total returns for TDs and is the best for KOR for TDs.

Knight's career KOR average stands at 35.2 yards per return - the best mark by far in school history.

He ranks second in the FBS in kick return average for the season with a 34.3 mark, the No. 2 mark in school history and the best since 1954 (67 years!).

EKWONU WINS

Wolfpack left tackle Ikem "Ickey" Ekwonu's has been honored for his dominance this season with some pretty major awards in 2021.

He was named the recipient of the ACC's Jacobs Blocking Trophy, voted on by the league's head coaches and given to the top blocker in the conference. He was the first Wolfpack player to win the award since Jim Ritcher - the 1979 Outland Trophy winner - won it in back-to-back season (1978 & '79).

And speaking of the Outland Trophy ... Ekwonu is a finalist for that national award. Although he's led the team in pancake blocks each of his previous two seasons, he has more in 2021 (67) than in his previous campaigns (50 in 2020, 37 in 2019).

Ekwonu has played 819 snaps this season - all at left tackle - and has allowed just two sacks. He's rated the top offensive tackle in the Power 5 conferences by PFF.

In addition to leading the team in pancakes and knockdowns (19), he was the team's top grader in all but one conference game.

Against Wake Forest, Ekwonu played 80 snaps and graded out at a rare 90+% with no sacks while the Wolfpack passed 59 times.

In his writeup for the 2021 "Freaks" list, The Athletic's Bruce Feldman called Ekwonu "the most dominant O-lineman in college football" and said "it's a treat for scouts and coaches to watch him maul opponents."

Ekwonu doesn't only boast the brawn, but he's got the brains to match, as he has been named to the ACC All-Academic team each of the past two years.

CORY'S STORY

One of the great individual stories on the Wolfpack squad this season has been the contributions of Cory Durden.

NC STATE GAME NOTES

Durden joined the Pack in May after three seasons at Florida State, where he played in 32 games and started 16. He spent the summer getting back into playing condition and getting to know his new teammates.

He spent preseason camp at end and came off the bench in the first three games at that position. When starting nose C.J. Clark suffered a season-ending injury prior to the Clemson game, Durden got the nod at the position vs. the No. 9 Tigers and responded with six tackles and 1.5 sacks.

He would end up starting eight of the last nine games of the season and was a huge factor behind the Pack's strong defensive rankings.

The story seemed to have a happy ending when Durden won first-team All-ACC honors, but there is another chapter to go. Following the regular season, he announced that he will return to the Wolfpack for 2022.

FAMILY REUNION ... IN THE ENDZONE

The Thomas brothers had quite a night in the Wolfpack's win over Syracuse on Nov. 20. Linebacker Drake Thomas led team in tackles and picked off his third pass of the season. After the interception, he called on his skills as a high school running back, streaking 38 yards to hit paydirt.

A quarter later, Drake's older brother Thayer scored in that same endzone - on an eight-yard pass from Devin Leary. Thayer was the leading receiver for the night with four total catches for 80 yards and that score.

It marked the first time in 46 years that a pair of brothers scored for the Wolfpack in the same game. Against Wake Forest on Sept. 13, 1975, QB Buckey scored on a 1-yard run while his brother Don scored on a 43-yard pass (from Dave).

It marked the 20th time Thayer had crossed into the endzone (plus three more passing TDs), but it was the first of Drake's college career. Thayer now has 21 career TDs.

Drake and Thayer are the first pair of brothers to start on opposite sides of the ball since 2007 (Pat Bedics started at FB and John Bedics started at DT).

Thayer is in his fifth season and boasts 30 career starts, while Drake has 25 in season three. They have started the same game 18 times (eight times in 2021, eight times in 2020, twice in 2019).

EMEKA-ING CATCHES

Fifth-year wide receiver Emeka Emezie is now the leading receiver in NC State history. With two catches against Boston College, he broke the mark set by Jaylen Samuels (Pittsburgh Steelers) from 2014-17. He now has 229 career receptions for 2,895 yards.

Emezie now ranks third in school history in receiving yards and is tied for fifth in TD receptions with 19.

A second-team All-ACC performer, Emezie won ACC Wide Receiver of the Week honors three times this season - vs. Clemson, Wake Forest and UNC.

DOMINANT DRAKE

Heading into the 2021 campaign, the Wolfpack's linebacking corps - which returned three starters - was touted as one of the best in the ACC, perhaps the country. The unit returned the ACC's leading tackler from 2020 - WLB Payton Wilson - and longtime starter at MLB Isaiah Moore. The third in the trio, third-year player SLB Drake

Thomas was returning for his second year as a starter.

Before the season ended, Thomas would be the last one standing, as Wilson went down with a season-ending injury in Game 2 and Moore was lost in Game 7. But Thomas came out of the gate dominating the opponents this season - leading the team in tackles in six different games.

Thomas moved to middle LB for the Louisville game - quite the task to move to a new position but especially against Louisville's elusive QB Malik Cunningham. His response? He tallied a career-high 15 tackles in the win, holding the Cardinal offense (which entered the game averaging 31.7 yards per contest) to just 13 points. While playing 73 defensive snaps at middle linebacker, he made five stops either at or behind the line of scrimmage.

He tallied a career-high 2.5 total tackles for loss and two sacks. One sack was on a 2nd & goal when the Cardinals ended up settling for a field goal, and the other was on 3rd & 7. He earned ACC LB of the Week honors for his performance.

Thomas finished the regular season ranked fourth in the ACC in tackles with 8.33 per game and tied for fifth with three interceptions.

STREAKY

Devin Leary had a streak of 228 pass attempts without an interception before throwing a pick at Florida State. During that streak, he threw 20 TDs.

Leary's streak of multiple TD and no INT games (6) was the longest in the ACC since Trevor Lawrence had seven in 2019. The only QBs who had longer streaks in the playoff era are Tua Tagovailoa (Alabama), Justin Fields (Ohio State), Trevor Lawrence (Clemson), Baker Mayfield (Oklahoma) and Marcus Mariota (Oregon) - all first-round picks NFL Draft picks.

In fact, the only QBs who've even had five straight in playoff era who weren't first round picks were Skyler Howard at WVU and JT Barrett at Ohio State.

TOUCHDOWN, THOMAS!

Graduate wide receiver Thayer Thomas has eight touchdown catches this season - giving him 20 for his career. That mark that is tied for third in school history.

He needs just two more to rank second only to Torry Holt (who coached Thomas in high school) in school history.

POINTS OF INTEREST

Fourth-year kicker Christopher Dunn became NC State's career scoring leader vs. Miami and now has 377 points for his career. He broke the mark of 332 set by kicker Niklas Sade (2011-14). His current mark ranks 11th in ACC history. (*Interesting that the top two scoring leaders in school history both played under NC State head coach Dave Doeren!*)

In 2020, Dunn set the school record for field goals made and currently boasts 68 for his career. He's made all 170 of his career PATs and set

that career record as well this season.

GIVE A DAWG A BONE

Defensive coordinator Tony Gibson says he wants 'dawgs' on his defense, aka tenacious, relentless, aggressive players. To commemorate those who play with those characteristics, the defensive staff introduced the TAKEAWAY BONE in 2020.

When a Wolfpack defender recovers a fumble or intercepts a pass, the BONE comes out on the sideline. The player who got the takeaway signs it and at the end of the season, whoever has signed it the most times gets to keep the bone.

NO. 1

Since 2014, NC State head coach Dave Doeren has honored a member of the Wolfpack squad by giving them the No. 1 jersey. Last season, linebacker Isaiah Moore was awarded that special number and he will wear it again in 2021.

Moore was only the second underclassman to earn the privilege (Jaylen Samuels wore the No. 1 jersey as a junior and senior). He returns in 2021 for this fourth year as a starter and was the second-leading tackler on the team last season.

Moore has also been the de facto leader of the team's involvement in the #PackUnited movement, which stands out against racial violence and social justice.

#DLU

Heading into the 2021 season, eight former Wolfpack defensive linemen are currently on NFL squads. Seven have been drafted over the last four years, including three in the last two NFL Drafts.

Highlighting the group are the four d-linemen drafted in 2018 - all now entering their fourth NFL seasons. Bradley Chubb made his first Pro Bowl last season with the Denver Broncos, Justin Jones is a projected starter for the L.A. Chargers, while B.J. Hill (N.Y. Giants) and Kentavious Street (San Francisco 49ers) look to provide depth with their squads.

The 2020 draft saw Larrell Murchison selected by the Tennessee Titans and James Smith-Williams by the Washington Football Team. Alim McNeill was a third-round selection by the Detroit Lions this past spring and could end up starting.

Although he went undrafted in 2015, T.Y. McGill is entering his seventh NFL season and his second with the Philadelphia Eagles.

An additional defensive lineman moved over to the offensive line once he made it to the NFL. J.R. Sweezy played on the defensive side of the ball for the Pack from 2009-11, but was drafted by the Seattle Seahawks as a guard on offense.

QUICK HITTERS

- DT **C.J. Clark** is the cousin of former Pack DT B.J. Hill - now with the New York Giants.
- Defensive tackle **Cory Durden** has a two-year old son, Jaxxon.
- OT **Ikem Ekwonu** was a member of a Charlotte-based musical theatre group from grades 3-5. He played parts in productions of "The Jungle Book" and "The Aristocats" before landing a leading role as Pongo, in the "101 Dalmatians" musical.
- OT **Ikem "Ickey" Ekwonu's** twin brother Osita is a linebacker at Notre Dame. His sister, Adaora, is enrolled in the UChicago Pritzker School of Medicine and his older brother, Chike, is a 2D animator in Atlanta.
- Backup QB **Ben Finley** is the younger brother of Ryan Finley, who started at quarterback at NC State from 2016-18 and ranks second in school history with 10,505 career passing yards.
- **Grant Gibson's** grandfather, Harvey Gantt, was the first black student to attend Clemson University and the first black mayor of Charlotte. The Gantt Center for African-American Arts+Culture is named in his honor. His mother Sonja was a long-time news anchor, working at WGN in Chicago and WCNC in Charlotte.
- During the COVID shutdown in 2020, P **Trenton Gill** raised over \$8,000 to purchase 1,000 meals for needy families in his hometown of Hillsborough, N.C. By doing so, he also helped supply business for eight restaurants in his hometown. In 2021, he has raised \$12,000 to buy playground equipment for his former elementary school.
- LB **Levi Jones** Is the younger brother of East Carolina wide receiver Isaiah Jones and former Arizona wide receiver Cayleb Jones, and the son of former Dallas Cowboy linebacker Robert Jones. He blocked three kicks last season and now has four for his career - the sixth-highest mark in school history.
- DE **Daniel Joseph** was the fourth-pick in the 2021 CFL Draft (BC Lions). His brother, Faith Ekakite, played defensive line at Iowa and was the No. 1 pick of the Winnipeg Blue Bombers in the 2017 Canadian Football League Draft. Cousin, Ese Mrabure-Ajufo, played for the BC Lions of the CFL in 2015.
- Wolfpack running back **Zonovan Knight** earned his nickname at an early age. When left in a playpen, he would constantly bang his toys, prompting his uncle to remark 'All I hear is 'Bam! Bam!'" The nickname "Bam Bam" stuck and was later shortened to Bam.
- Quarterback **Devin Leary** is naturally left-handed. He just throws with his right hand because as a kid, he didn't have a baseball glove so he used his right-handed brother's.
- TE **Dylan Parham** has added 55 lbs. to his frame since he came to NC State as a quarterback in 2016.
- When CB **Derrek (pronounced dehr EEK) Pitts** was six years old, playing for the South Dekalb Saints, a midget league team in Atlanta, he took his first handoff handoff and ran nearly 60 yards in the wrong direction before spiking the ball in the end zone and looking for teammates to celebrate with. Upon realizing his mistake, he promptly picked the ball up and weaved his way 100 yards the other way for a real score.
- OT **Tyrone Riley** is in his seventh season with the program. He was awarded a sixth year of eligibility due to injuries, then got another year because of COVID.
- Identical twins **Cedd and Fred Seabrough** are the same height, same weight, play the same position and wear jersey numbers 47 and 48 respectively.
- The Pack has a **Thomas brother** starting on both sides of the ball: Thayer at WR and Drake at linebacker. They are the first brothers to start at the same time since DaJuan and DeAndre Morgan started at SAF and CB in 2007.
- LB **Payton Wilson's** brother Bryse is a pitcher for the Pittsburgh Pirates (formerly the Atlanta Braves).
- Graduate transfer **Chandler Zavala** is the son of Demetrio Zavala, a chef and "Chopped" Grand Champion on the Food Network. (Rumor has it that Chef Zavala is planning to cook for the entire team at some point this season).

DAVE DOEREN HEAD COACH

Hard. Tough. Together.

That's the culture that NC State head coach Dave Doeren has built in his nine seasons at the helm of the Wolfpack football program. Tough, hard-working players who play not for individual, but for the collective.

That culture has paid off with success on the field. In his nine seasons leading the NC State football program, Doeren has led the Wolfpack to 64 victories – the second-highest total in school history. In 2021, the Pack will compete in its seventh bowl game during his tenure, the most under any coach in program history.

Doeren has more nine-win campaigns than any coach in school history (three) and has now led five of his nine NC State squads to seasons with eight or more victories. In the past two years, NC State ranks second only to Clemson in the ACC in league wins, posting a 13-5 record.

In terms of overall victories, Doeren has put NC State in elite company, as the only Power 5 teams with more wins than NC State over the past two years are Alabama, Notre Dame, Georgia, Oklahoma, Oklahoma St., Clemson, Ohio State and Texas A&M. Between 2017-20, 14 of his players have been drafted by the NFL – including an ACC-best seven in 2017 – the sixth-highest total nationally.

Doeren came to NC State after leading the program at Northern Illinois to its most successful two years in program history. His first Husky squad won the school's first Mid-American Conference Championship since 1983 and tied the school record with 11 wins. His second version repeated as league champions and set a new school record by posting 12 victories for the season and earned a trip to the Orange Bowl – the first BCS berth

ever for a MAC school.

Prior to his stint in DeKalb, Doeren spent five seasons in the Big Ten at Wisconsin, where he served as defensive coordinator and linebackers coach. He spent four seasons (2002-05) at the University of Kansas, where he served as linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator for three seasons before being promoted to co-defensive coordinator.

In 2000 and 2001, Doeren coached the secondary at NCAA Division I-AA (now Football Championship Subdivision) powerhouse Montana, also serving as the Grizzlies' recruiting coordinator for one year. Montana advanced to the I-AA national championship game in 2000, losing by two points, but returned to win the national title the following season.

A graduate of Drake University, Doeren lettered at tight end for the Bulldogs. He majored in pre-medical biology, earning Academic All-America honors as a senior.

He landed his first coaching job in 1994, in his hometown of Kansas City at Shawnee Mission Northwest High School. His collegiate coaching career began just a year later, when he was named an assistant coach at Drake, leading the linebackers from 1995-97 before adding defensive coordinator chores in 1997. He also earned his master's degree from Drake in educational leadership.

Doeren got his first taste of a bowl experience as a defensive graduate assistant at the SC. During his stint with the Trojans, he began work on his Ph.D.

Doeren and his wife Sara have three sons: Jacob (21), Luke (19) and Connor (15).

- In the past two years, NC State ranks second only to Clemson in the ACC in league wins, posting a 13-5 record.
- The only Power 5 teams with more wins than NC State over the past two years are Alabama, Notre Dame, Georgia, Oklahoma, Oklahoma St., Clemson, Ohio State and Texas A&M.
- In the past four seasons, has had 14 players drafted by the NFL - including an ACC-best seven in 2017 (the sixth-highest total nationally that season). 21 total have been drafted during his tenure at NC State.
- NC State has boasted 35 Academic All-ACC performers under his guidance and in 2018, Ryan Finley was named to the prestigious NFF National Scholar-Athlete Team.
- His 2021 NC State squad has a chance to become just the second in school history to post a double-digit win total.
- The 2020 Wolfpack set a school record with seven ACC wins (7-3).
- With nine victories in 2017 and 2018, it marked the first time since 1991-92 that State posted back-to-back nine-win seasons (only the third time in school history).

- A nominee for the 2020 Broyles Award – given to the nation's top assistant coach.
- QB Devin Leary set a new NC State school record for most TD passes in a single season in 2021, with 35. He became one of just three QBs in ACC history to post a 3,400 yard/35 TD regular season. He also passed for 27 TDs in ACC play – a mark that led the conference, and he became the first Pack QB to throw for four or more TDs against five ACC opponents.
- Despite starting two different quarterbacks in 2020, the Wolfpack posted some of the top offensive marks in school history: passing yards (3,154, 11th), passing yards/game (252.8, 9th), completion pct. (.628, 5th), scoring (363 pts, 12th), first downs (267, 10th), fewest turnovers (19, 10th), fewest fumbles lost (4, 1st).
- Both starting quarterbacks in 2020 finished the season with some of the top passing efficiency marks in school history. Devin Leary's 148.33 mark is second in school history only to Philip Rivers, while Bailey Hockman's 138.08 mark ranks sixth in school history.

At Texas:

- Under his guidance, Texas' offense ranked among the nation's most prolific. In 2019, the Longhorns ranked 17th nationally in scoring (35.2 ppg), 17th in completion percentage (.651), 20th in passing offense (289.3), 12th in red zone offense (.920), and 14th in total offense (465.8).
- Mentored Longhorn QB Sam Ehlinger, who posted some of the top marks nationally in 2019, ranking fourth nationally in total offense, ninth in passing yards and 13th in touchdown passes in the regular season. He was the sixth Longhorn quarterback, and first since Colt McCoy (2006-09) to rush for 1,000 yards
- Ehlinger was 284-of-436 for 3,462 yards and 29 touchdowns and rushed for 4590 yards and six touchdowns on 152 carries in 2019. He accounted for 4,052 yards of total offense (3rd in school history) and 35 total touchdowns (4th) that season. He was a semifinalist for the Maxwell Award, Davey O'Brien Award, Wuerffel Trophy and Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award.
- Texas converted 86-of-175 (49.1%) third downs in 2019, the ninth-best conversion rate nationally.
- In 2018, Ehlinger passed for 3,292 yards and accounted for 41 touchdowns (25 passing/16 rushing) – only five other players in college foot-

ball history ever tallied that many TDs (and they all won the Heisman)

- In 2018, UT ranked fourth in the FBS in turnovers lost, went three straight games without a turnover and did not turn the ball over in five total games for the season.
- In 2017, freshman Ehlinger was also the Longhorns' leading rusher with 385 yards, becoming the first Texas quarterback since McCoy in 2008 to lead UT in both passing and rushing.

At Ohio State:

- Fielded one of the top offenses in the nation in 2016 en route to an 11-2 record and an appearance in the College Football Playoff.
- OSU ranked 14th in the FBS in scoring offense with an average of 39.4 points per game in 2016. The rushing attack ranked 12th nationally at 245.2 yards per game, which led the Big Ten, while the team's completion percentage (62.3%) also led the conference.
- Coached quarterback J.T. Barrett, who set the school record for touchdowns responsible for with 100.
- Barrett posted 3,400 total yards (2,555 passing/845 rushing) and accounted for 33 touchdowns (24 passing/nine rushing) in 2016. He was one of two players to share the 2016 Chicago Tribune Silver Football Award, which is voted on by the conference head coaches and awarded to the Big Ten MVP, and he was also named the conference quarterback of the year.
- In 2015, Ohio State featured a ground game that ranked 11th in the nation, matching the 2016 team with a 245.2 yards per game average. Buckeyes also ranked in the top 30 in the country in completion percentage at 62.8 percent (29th), while their 35.7 scoring average ranked 28th.
- In 2015, Ohio State ranked second in the Big Ten in passing efficiency with a 140.0 rating.
- Coached Cardale Jones, who went on to be a fourth-round pick by the Buffalo Bills in the 2016 NFL Draft. Running back Ezekiel Elliott, who was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year and MVP. Ohio State finished the season with a 12-1 record, capped by a Fiesta Bowl win over Notre Dame.

At Nebraska:

- A finalist for the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach in both 2012 and 2013.
- Between 2011-14, Beck's Nebraska offenses ranked among the best in the Big Ten Conference and his passing attack amassed more than 10,000 yards during that time with 86 touchdowns.
- In his four seasons as coordinator, the Huskers averaged 33.5 points per game. The Huskers broke more than 50 individual records including career marks for passing yards, completions, passing touchdowns, yards from scrimmage and total offense.
- In 2012, Nebraska totaled 2,500 rushing and passing yards in the same season for the first time in school history. The Huskers accomplished the feat again in both 2013 and 2014.
- On the ground, Nebraska ranked in the top 20 nationally in rushing every season with Beck as coordinator. Five Huskers posted a 1,000-yard rushing season.
- Through the air, two of Nebraska's top six passing seasons in school history came under Beck's direction. Quarterback Taylor Martinez set more than 40 school records and was named the All-Big Ten Conference quarterback following the 2012 regular season.
- In 2011, All-Big Ten back Rex Burkhead scored 17 touchdowns – seventh in NU history and the most by a Husker since Heisman Trophy winner Eric Crouch scored 19 touchdowns in 2001. Burkhead finished with 1,357 rushing yards, the seventh-most in school history and the most by a Husker I-back since 1997.
- As running backs coach in 2010, the Huskers ranked seventh nationally with an average of 5.47 yards per carry. Nebraska also posted its first 2,500-yard rushing season since 2003 and scored 30 rushing touchdowns for the first time since 2001.
- Two-time All-Big 12 selection Roy Helu Jr. ran for a career-high 1,245 yards, the second-highest total by a senior running back in NU history, before being selected in the fourth round of the 2011 NFL Draft. Helu Jr. became the first Husker to post back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons since Calvin Jones in 1992 and 1993.

- The Jayhawks finished second nationally in scoring offense in 2007

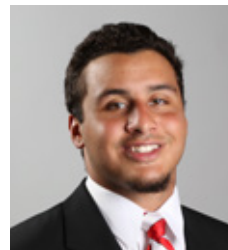
