- Do not enter backup courses. Your counselor will ask for these at your counselor meeting.
- If you have a course locked in your home access center that you do not want (excluding level changes), contact your counselor.

#### Regular or Honors? Placement Questions?

Your teacher will make their best recommendation based on many factors. If you disagree with a recommendation, a parent or guardian must take the step below **by February 14<sup>th</sup>**.

**Level Up request** (example: regular to honors)- A parent/guardian must contact the appropriate High School Department Chair **by February 14<sup>th</sup>**.

**Level Down request** (example: honors to regular)- Select the lower level class through HAC and inform your counselor that you wish to level down. Counselor will make the appropriate change.

### Step 4: Finalize with your counselor (January 27<sup>th</sup> - February 14<sup>th</sup>)

- Meet with your counselor to finalize your course selections.
- Please have your course request entered into Home Access Center **prior** to your meeting with your counselor.
- Give careful consideration to your selections since some of these options may not be available to you if you do not request them during the course selection period.

### Step 5: Verify (May 18<sup>th</sup> – May 29<sup>th</sup>)

- Contact your counselor for elective changes **by May 29<sup>th</sup>!** Level change requests **MUST** go through the Dept. chair.
- Staffing and sectioning decisions were based on your original course selections so changes are **NOT GUARANTEED** and will be processed on **A SPACE AVAILABLE BASIS OVER THE SUMMER.**
- Schedules will be viewable through Home Access in mid-August.
