





Greetings,

Despite the extreme weather throughout the last couple of months or market trends, the witnessing of new growth with new crops, both animals and plants, give us hope and something to look forward to. We will be celebrating our 50th Anniversary of the American Maine-Anjou Association (AMAA) this year. With this is mind it is great to see where we have been and exciting to plan for the future of Maine-Anjou.

Planning for the future is key if you want to have long term sustainable success. The goals of your operation are primarily unique for your program but the one thing that is not unique is how the mating decisions that you make today will impact your herd, our breed, and the beef industry for many years to come. It is crucial that we assess where we are at and methodically think what it will take to reach where we want to be.

Whether we want to admit it or not today's ranchers have more technology and challenges at hand than ever before. Managing

risks and improving predictability are a must if you want to stay in the business. This is where data or EPDs become vital. **Just raising**

good cattle is not enough anymore!

When things get tough and money is tighter the market becomes more competitive and the motivation to gain market share are a must. As Maine-Anjou enthusiasts we have to continue for improvement to sustain and potentially grow our presence when these tougher conditions present themselves. We have to re-establish our identity and prove how we can help ranchers bottom-line. We can tell folks this but having proof in black and white is what will be invaluable. All though our cattle have a lot of strengths the ability of Maine-Anjou to compliment the majority of the US cowherd with added carcass cutability and feed efficiency are two of our major attributes that we are focused on. We can improve efficient production of the end product extremely well. The information that comes in to the AMAA headquarters has to be directly linked to a registered animal before it has some working power. We all have to make the most of the tools that are available and if we want to move forward it is imperative that we make calf and cowherd reporting along with the use of EPDs the pillars from which we build.

Your AMAA Board and staff have set some broad goals and we continue to set new ones as we work toward bringing more Maine-Anjou genetics into the mainstream of the beef cattle industry. As you all know, the beef industry is a very competitive market and all the breeds are trying to establish their value and identity within this industry. We have analyzed where we are and have



By the time this issue reaches your mailbox and you get a chance to thumb through the pages, we will hopefully be well on our way to summer temperatures and this prolonged winter/spring will be behind us. It has been a trying year for those in the beef business. We have seen extreme lows on cull cow prices and bred cows, and the bull market because of it all has certainly been suppressed. If nothing else, this year proved that we should all be more aware of the product we are producing. In a year like the one we've just weathered, it's apparent that the good ones are still easy to move and the problem cattle are hard to find a home for.

In this issue, you will find a host of information from new sire availability with ads on bulls that surfaced through the spring buying season to percentile breakdown information and genetic trends for the Maine-Anjou breed. It's important to always know where your cattle fit relative to the breed in which you register, as well as relative to the breeds you directly

compete against. We haven't yet seen the full effects of the Maine-Angus program on the MaineTainer genetic trends due to those cattle just now starting to surface and be registered. I am reminded that as breeders, and as the people that make parent stock for our customer base, we are obligated to not only stay up-to-date for our own breeding program but to also breed cattle that our commercial producers can stay up-to-date with and continue to solidify their market.

While I was through the office on a sale trip, I spent a day helping Blake and Lindsey scroll through previous issues of the Voice and began building a timeline to help us celebrate 50 years for the American Maine-Anjou Association (AMAA). For me, it provided true insight into the breed that some of you have been a major part in shaping over the last five decades. I was able to lay eyes on pictures of bulls that I hear about from generations back in pedigrees and have a better understanding of how the breed has changed over the years, but also how it has stayed the same. The one underlying thought that I walked away with from this task is that we have a true commitment from you to this breed and the cattle you have produced to better it. You answered the call to moderate them when the beef cattle trend was swinging that way, and you also actively worked to temper the birth weights so that the cattle would be more commercially acceptable.

The underlying message that seemed to pop up over the years in the contents of those magazines is that Blake's and my predecessors were always calling for more emphasis on data and EPD selection. Lunderstand firsthand that sometimes cattle don't get sold on the premise of genetic evaluation or performance data. Some buyers only care about phenotypic value. Quality, itself, in the cattle business - especially the purebred seedstock business - is seen multiple ways. It could be on the basis of pedigree alone or only genetic merit, yet quality could still be seen on only phenotypic value. Whichever way you see quality and prioritize your selection pressure, without a shadow of a doubt is your decision. With that said it is still our responsibility, as seedstock breeders, to make our cattle – and more importantly our breed – as palatable as possible for every customer basis. We should be chasing every opportunity to blend the combination of pedigree, look, and genetic value every chance we get. At the end of the day, no matter how good they look or how well they are bred doesn't truly matter. The cattle all eventually get sold by the pound. Performance predictability is a must to ensure long-term profitability to those cattlemen that make a living selling them by the pound.



Junior project keeps Family involved in MAINE-ANJOU, AGRICULTURE

If you're going to do something, do your best. That's the theory the Dickerson family has always lived by.



Courtney Dickerson Stierwalt says it is how she was brought up and how her family took on the Maine-Anjou business. Courtney and brother, Casey, started involvement in the Maine-Anjou showring after parents, John Dickerson and Diana Dickerson purchased some Maine-Anjou cattle from the DeJong family in South Dakota.

"We loved showing Maine-Anjou cattle, but the community aspect of the breed and the opportunities for youth is what got us hooked," Stierwalt says.

The Indiana native says they went to every junior nationals since before she was even old enough to be in 4-H. "My mom grew up with dairy cattle, but my parents decided the beef industry is where they wanted to bring us up. Casey started showing first and then I

did," Stierwalt says. "As I grew older, I knew I wanted to be even more involved."

Stierwalt served as the National Maine-Anjou Queen from 2006 to 2007 and then served on the American Junior Maine-Anjou Association board of directors for a two-year term from 2007 to 2009.

The experiences in the Maine-Anjou business made Stierwalt realize she wanted to be involved in the livestock industry for the rest of her life. After graduation from Purdue University, she spent time in swine nutrition sales before starting her career as an extension educator.

"After being in the swine industry and going through 2012, which was a tough year for pork producers, I decided it was time to reevaluate what I was doing. That's when I



started with Purdue University Extension as an ag educator and extension agent and I also started working on my master's degree," Stierwalt says.

Educating and helping youth was something that started for Stierwalt when she served as the National Maine-Anjou Queen and on the AJMAA board. Now, it's something that she gets to do every day. In 2018, Stierwalt started her current job as Indiana 4-H Animal Science Extension Specialist. She oversees all livestock and companion animal programs for the state of Indiana. This includes working with youth at judging contests, fairs and expositions, managing animal entries and coordinating educational programs for youth across the state.

One program that has ramped up in Indiana is the Youth Quality Assurance Program in which youth go through training to ensure the proper care of animals.

"Indiana youth are one of the leaders in the nation for participating in the Youth Quality Assurance Program. We have had 19,500 youth go through the training to make them better caretakers of their livestock



and animals," Stierwalt says. "This is an expectation of our youth and they are held to the highest standards in caring for animals. We want consumers to know these kids know how to care for their animals."

The program is not only in Indiana, but is also in other states and is becoming common among the national shows and exhibitions. She says with consumers asking more and more questions about where their food comes from, training youth is very important.


The connections Stierwalt made as a youth in the AJMAA has helped her know what youth need to know through her career. "Networking is a great thing to learn at a young age, along with having responsibility, but I would say the number one thing I learned in the showring was resiliency," she says. "Life will throw you some major challenges and being able to deal with those challenges by pulling up your boots and coming out on the other side is so important.

Being resilient to go back into the showring after you've been beat and continuing to work hard is a great life lesson."

Stierwalt says she has enjoyed seeing the AJMAA grow through the years. She and husband, Justin, have a small cowherd, with her brother Casey and his wife, Aleesa. Here young nephews, Graham and Tucker are just getting started with showing cattle.

"Graham showed his first calf just recently. It's so cool to be able to see the next generation in our family keeping up the tradition," she says. "No matter what breed they are involved with, the Maine-Anjou breed will always hold a special place in my heart."



Whether buying or selling Maine-Anjou genetics, it's always good to review your understanding of these important values.

There probably isn't anyone reading this article who hasn't listened to an educational presentation on Expected Progeny Differences, or EPDs. The technology used to calculate these genetic values dates to the 1970's, and while there have been many innovations in computing and data analysis, the meaning of the values, and how they are used hasn't really changed in the last thirty-five years. Still, as I speak to groups of seedstock breeders or commercial cattle producers, I always find that there are some misconceptions about the meaning of EPDs.

COMPARISON ACROSS ENVIRONMENTS

When EPDs were first published in the late 1970's, they truly revolutionized the beef genetics business. Prior to that time, selection for performance traits had to be based on adjusted weights or ratios. But such selection was biased and misleading, as environmental effects could increase or decrease the actual performance of an animal, and its ratio was highly dependent on the other animals it competed against in a contemporary group. An excellent calf might be below average in a truly elite group and ratio below 100, while the same animal in another group could be the highest performing individual. Only with the advent of EPDs were breeders able to fairly compare animals from different farms and

ranches, or from different years, without bias. It's no wonder that for most traits, little genetic change was observed until EPDs became available.

By using the pedigree connections that exist within the Maine-Anjou database, EPD calculations allow fair comparison of all Maine-Anjou cattle. The significant amount of artificial insemination used by Maine breeders adds accuracy to EPDs, because many contemporary groups from different breeders have one or more common sires. When a new sire first has progeny data submitted to the database, his progeny performance relative to other more proven sires helps determine whether his EPDs should change, from what was previously estimated based on his pedigree and own performance record. Breeders are sometimes

surprised that a bull, whose progeny performed well above average, actually declined in growth EPDs. In such cases, it's usually because the other sires in the contemporary groups were much lower for growth EPDs than the sire in question. While the sire's calves were the heaviest, they did not exceed the group average by as much as the previous EPDs would have predicted, and accordingly, his growth EPDs declined, while those of the other sires in the group increased.

Unlike ratios, EPDs take into account the genetic contributions of the other parent when evaluating progeny of a young bull or cow. The pedigree information in the database allows the calculations to consider whether the other parent was high or low for a particular trait, and factor that into the estimation of genetic merit. If a young sire happened to be mated to a group of females that were below breed average for weaning weight, the models factor that in, and wouldn't expect the calves to have the same weaning weights as if he had been bred to higher growth females.

Calculation of EPDs also takes advantage of traits that are genetically related, or correlated. Many of the same genes that make weaning weight increase have a similar effect on yearling weight. By using both growth traits together in a multiple-trait evaluation, accuracy of both EPDs increases. In the calving ease evaluation, birth weight (BW) is used as a correlated trait. The methodology allows separation of traits like weaning weight and calving ease into direct and maternal components. By analyzing records of a sire's daughters, along with his direct progeny, we can determine both the direct effect on weaning growth, expressed as weaning

weight (EPD), and his genetic effect for milk production expressed in his daughters, his milk EPD. Calving ease is also separated into the direct effect (CED), which reflects the size of the calf, versus Calving Ease Maternal (CEM), which describes the ability of a sire's daughters to calve unassisted, due to pelvic area and other physical effects of the dam on calving ease.

One consequence of multipletrait evaluation is that for maximum genetic improvement, breeders should focus their selection decisions on the EPDs for the traits of economic importance. For example, when selecting bulls for use on first-calf heifers, Calving Ease Direct (CED) is an important trait. Some well-meaning breeders might look at both CED and BW EPDs, searching for a sire that is especially favorable for both EPDs. In this case, the most effective method to improve calving ease is to select on CED EPD alone, and ignore the birth weight EPD. All the information used to calculate BW EPD was also used in calculation of CED EPD. If a breeder selects for both, they place more emphasis than optimal on birth weight data, and less on calving ease scores. Genetic improvement for calving ease using both BW and CED EPDs will result in less progress than selecting on CED EPD alone.

USING THE VALUES

When comparing a sire with a weaning weight (WW) EPD of 60, to another sire with a WW EPD of 40, it's the difference in EPDs that matters. In this case, the first sire exceeds the second by 20 pounds. If those two bulls were mated to similar cows, and the calves raised in similar environments, you would expect the first sire's calves to average 20 pounds heavier than those of the second

sire. Nonetheless, the actual weights are partially determined by the production environment. On one farm, the weaning weights might average 460 vs. 440 for the two sire groups. In another situation, because of differences in climate, season, cowherd genetics and management, the difference might be 680 vs. 660. Because performance traits are always influenced by environment effects, EPDs cannot predict actual performance.

If a specific performance level is a producer's goal, past experience can be used as a guide. Commercial bull buyers may wonder what EPD will result in 80 pound calves at birth. There is no one EPD level that will produce the same calf performance in all environments, when mated to all types of cows. The best advice in this situation is to ask the producer about the EPDs of the bulls they've used in the past, and whether the level of calving ease was acceptable. In situations where calving difficulty has been a problem in the past, more stringent selection on CED EPD is warranted, but if little dystocia has been observed previously, there is little incentive to place additional selection pressure on this trait.

Finally, it's important to remember that while the EPDs from the Maine-Anjou genetic evaluation are directly comparable, EPDs from other breeds are not. Each breed association has a unique method for setting the base for EPD calculations, and breedaverage EPDs vary widely across breeds. The US Meat Animal Research Center in Clay Center, NE calculates across-breed EPD adjustment factors each year. For more information about using these values, refer to information on the US MARC website, or other industry information sources.

REGISTRATIONS:

Please dispose of any old registration and self-billing worksheets. The AMAA will no longer offer a 10% online discount for registration work that is completed through Digital Beef.

The AMAA will assess a \$5 fee for any registration work received by fax, e-mail or by mail. To avoid this fee, please log into your online Digital Beef account to complete all registration work. New forms are included in this issue and can also be downloaded from our main webpage under Digital Beef/Registrations – Printable Forms. If you need assistance logging into your online account please contact us at maine@amaapc.com.

BLOCK REGISTRATION DISCOUNTS:

Blocks may only be used on animals under 13 months of age and may not be used on steers or foundation animals. Blocks will only be valid from January 1 - December 31 of each year. RUSH ORDERS:

If you are selling an animal, we ask that you register and transfer the animal in a timely manner to avoid extra charges and to assure buyers they are purchasing from a reputable business person.

Rushes will be done in the order received; a rush fee is currently \$50 (covers eight head). No work will be released until payment is complete.

Rush work is processed ahead of the regular work that is received in our office and mailed by regular mail within one to two business days. We will do our best to complete rush work that is received in our office by 2 p.m. (Monday – Friday). There is no same-day turnaround. If requiring a registration number only, it will still be considered a rush as we still have to process the work to obtain the number.

HELPFUL TIPS WHEN REGISTERING:

To avoid delays in your registration work during our busy season follow the tips below.

Double check that all blanks and information are correct and complete before mailing or submitting online. Things most commonly missed are:

When registering annual active dams for performance only animals please submit them online if you have the capabilities. This will help the registrar processing tremendously.

We appreciate you and your business and want to make sure that the registration process runs as smooth as possible. Thank you in advance for your extra time in making sure all work is correct, complete and received in a timely manner.

BULL CALF REGISTRATION:

If registering a bull calf born after Jan. 1, 2014, it must be TH/PHA free by parentage or have testing completed prior to registering and on file with the AMAA. Carriers will no longer be registered, but may be entered as a foundation animal. All progeny out of a Foundation carrier bull needs to be tested free of that defect prior to registration. If registrations are submitted before testing has been completed, the animal will not be registered. Instead the animal will be given a performance number at a non-

refundable penalty charge of \$10. Once the animal has been tested the registration may be completed at the regular rate. Please plan accordingly as testing can take up to three or four weeks.

FOUNDATION ANIMALS:

Non-registered bulls and females must be entered as a foundation animal prior to MaineTainer progeny being registered. All current "P" (performance only) cattle will be grand-fathered into the program. If the sire is an AI sire and registered at another breed association, the pedigree and testing must be on file with the AMAA. The charge to add a sire pedigree will be a onetime charge of \$40. If the AMAA finds that the pedigree has already been paid for by another breeder, the \$40 charge will not be applied. Dams registered at another breed association may also be added for a one-time charge of \$25. See the new self-billing sheet for foundation fees.

ONLINE TRANSFERS:

When transferring an animal on line make sure there is not a member number already created for the buyer. Creating more than one number for an individual creates registration problems later. If you find the buyer in the system at a different address please notify the buyer first to confirm the address and then notify the Maine office to update the account. It is always a good idea to always search for the buyer using the search tools before doing the work that way if they have a different address it is caught before entering the registration and transfer.

When creating a new profile for a

buyer please make sure to never give a junior a farm name. Please enter the junior's name on the farm line and also as the contact.

DNA, TH AND PHA REQUIREMENTS:

Prior to registering any ET calves, all donor dams (including commercial or non-registered dams) must have DNA, TH and PHA on file in our office. Also, all Al sires are required to have the same on file. Therefore, our office will hold any ET registrations submitted out of dams without testing on file as well as all registrations out of Al sires that do not have complete testing on file.

If the donor dam is deceased and not tested, we do require that the ET(s) have the tests done, in the absence of the donor's records.

The DNA, TH and PHA testing can be done at GeneSeek. A submission form is found on our Web site, maine-anjou.org.

Maine-Anjou samples are put into testing at GeneSeek on Wednesdays, please plan accordingly when submitting. DNA results will be back in the AMAA office late the next week after the testing begins; TH and PHA results will be in our office two weeks later, usually on a Thursday.

We would like to start sending the test results by e-mail only, please make sure we have an up-to-date e-mail address for you, if applicable.

MAINE/ANGUS PAPERS:

If you wish to obtain a Maine/ Angus registration select the MA/ Angus box when registering on line. You will receive an error that AMAA staff must check the testing and percentage requirements so please make sure to validate your entry to save it so that that AMAA can check the entry. If you submit a registration on paper, please put Maine/Angus in the comment section of the application. If the animal does not qualify as a Maine/Angus it will be recoded as a regular Mainetainer.

A Maine/Angus paper will be blue in color, have Maine/Angus under the Maine Logo, and will have MaineTainer across the center of the paper. The animal can be shown as a MaineTainer or Maine Angus.

Requirements:

*Off spring must be 3/8 - 5/8 to qualify.

*Bulls and Heifers must be TH/ PHA free by parents or by test *Bulls must be NH, CA and AM free by parents or free by test. Angus pedigrees will not be assumed free of these defects. Bulls must be clean of DS if out of a Red Angus.

*Angus percentages will only be counted from actual registered Angus. Commercial Angus percentages will not be used in the Maine/Angus equation.

NEW MEMBERS:

All new members must choose a program when submitting a new membership. The two programs that are offered are MAPP and Breeders Choice. More information on these two programs is available by visiting maine-anjou.org and clicking on "Member Services" "MAPP Agreement." If a membership is submitted without choosing a program, the new member will be placed in the Breeders Choice program.



OBITUARY

Charles Sumner Mapes, Jr., an only child born to Clara (Moore) and Charles Sumner Mapes II., was born on July 21, 1941. Sumner and his parents lived on a farm about two miles east of Earlham, Iowa. This is where his love of cattle and all animals began. He learned quickly that there were many chores to do to keep a farm operating and learned the love of hands-on work. Early Chapel Church, near Earlham, was where they attended church.

Sumner attended Earlham Grade School, graduating from Earlham High School in 1960 and was very active in the music program at the schools. A big inspiration was Jack Oatts, who came to Earlham while Sumner was in high school and started up jazz bands in the state of Iowa. He then enrolled at Drake University in Des Moines, Iowa as a Vocal Music Major and graduated in 1965.

On December 28, 1968, Sumner married Carol Lynn Franken at the Second Reformed Church of Pella, Iowa. Their son, Elliott Bruce, was born in 1974. Daughter, Donna Eileen, was born in 1977. They purchased 90 acres of land south of Pella, allowing Sumner to continue his cattle interests while teaching music in the Pella Community Schools. He loved doing chores with his children, helping them with projects in 4H, and supporting them in all their activities.

Sumner became the vocal director at Pella High School in 1965 and taught instrumental music at the Pella Middle School for a total of 32 years, retiring in 1997. His love of jazz bands continued throughout his career. Many a student got to talk about cattle and horses before their band lesson ever began.

Sumner had a cattle partner, Elliott Brown, for many years. After that he was partners with Marty Van Vliet. They loved traveling to look for cattle and attending shows in Denver, Kansas City, Omaha, Louisville, and Des Moines. In the summer of 2018 at the lowa State Fair, they won Supreme Grand Champion. Sumner and Marty travelled thousands of miles together looking for good show cattle.

Sumner and Carol liked to travel as well. For a couple months in 1970, they rented a car and travelled all over Europe. Trips were made to Canada to see family, east to visit family and historical sites, but their favorite was Colorado, returning year after year to the Rocky Mountains, and Grand Lake, of which they never got tired.

Sumner spent about 30 years in 4H!! He started at a young age and showed cattle. As an adult, he became a leader of the Lake Prairie 4H group and helped many 4Hers. Elliott and Donna became avid 4Hers as well. One honor was to have

four of their cattle be a part of the "Governor's Steer Show" Event at the lowa State Fair in Des Moines.

One of his passions in life was to give as many children and/or adults the experience of riding one of his horses. Many a child has had a grin on their face from holding the reins and either being led around or getting the feel of being on their own.

Upon retirement Sumner became very interested in reading more and more about Native Americans and the Civil War. He made several friendships and visited reservations in his quest for learning more. Trips out to Gettysburg became frequent. Another interest was becoming friends with many Sudanese in the Des Moines area. He put a lot of energy into helping raise money, learning about brick making machines, and helping the Sudanese community build a school in Sudan. He loved hosting students from other countries who attended Central College, especially wanting them to have a good horse riding experience, or letting them carve a turkey for the first time on Thanksgiving Day.

Fishing had been a great childhood experience for Sumner as his Uncle Fred would take him to Canada every year. Fortunately, last summer he renewed that love for fishing and taught Elliott, Donna and John a thing or two. Trips were made to Minnesota where he caught the most fish, by far!!

Sumner was an active member of the "Maine Anjou Cattle Association" and served on the board for many years. He was named "Maine Man of the Year – Iowa" a couple years ago. His most recent award was "Maine Man of the Year" in the nation!!

On Friday, March 1, 2019, Sumner passed away at his residence he

loved at the age of 77 years. He is survived by his wife, Carol, son, Elliott Mapes of Pella, daughter, Donna Mapes and John De Bruin of Minneapolis, Minnesota and a sister-in-law, Marilyn (Franken) De Roos of Des Moines, Iowa; along with nieces and nephews. Sumner was preceded in death by his parents, Charles Sumner II and Clara Mapes, and his parents-in-law, Rev. Henry and Harriet (Dykshorn) Franken.

Sumner had his goals and always kept striving for them.

SUMNER MAPES HONORED AS 2018 MAINE MAN OF THE YEAR

Sumner purchased his first Maine-Anjou's in 1986 after acquiring genetics from Saskatchewan, Canada. Of that purchase, and maybe his favorite, was Poplar Haven Louisette 17D, which his daughter Donna showed.

Sumner was a longtime partner in Blueprint Cattle Company with Tom & Marti Van Vliet. He was an excellent promoter, not only for Blueprint, but also for the Maine-Anjou breed. He was an active participant on the lowa Maine-Anjou Board of Directors where he had served multiple terms.

Sumner enjoyed traveling across the United States and Canada looking for new genetics and the next great one. Additionally, he enjoyed going to shows like the American Royal, North American, National Western, Canadian Western Agribition and the junior national.

Recently he was a part of many of the Blueprint Cattle Company females that have been successfully campaigned and he loved meeting at the backdrop for a picture at any show.

"Although a man of few words,

when he voiced his opinion you better listen, because it is an honest opinion, not necessarily what you wanted to hear," says close friend and business partner, Marti Van Vliet.

My (Lindsey) first encounter with this individual was via phone as the newest *Voice* editor who could not get his subscription to his house. It was my first year on the job and for whatever reason, issue after issue came and went, but I could not get them delivered to his house. I remembered thinking, "man, this guy really wants his magazine!" We did finally get that right.

A few years later Sumner learned of my "Dutch" heritage and we joked about who's "dutch bakery" is better and he would bring me Dutch letters to compare. Like any good rivalry, I'm loyal to the home team, but Pella's not too shabby.

Most recently, and every June, his title had become "most valuable player or knight in shining armor" as he would wheel up to the junior national show office with the coveted show programs. No matter the location of the show, he brought them ever year, with a big smile and "I got your programs." And of course taking nothing in return but a Thank You.

He was a family man, a board member and avid supporter of Maine-Anjou, but most importantly Sumner Mapes was my friend, and he's this year's 2018 Maine Man of the Year.

Sumner recently lost his brave fight with cancer. I will miss our chats and all of the projects he helped me with. Always in our hearts, he will never be forgotten.

WHAT IS MAINE ANGUS?

This program will reveal Maine-Anjou cattle's ability to enhance feed efficiency and red meat yield when placed on British based genetics. This program should provide seedstock that will increase production and carcass yield through heterosis.

The name Maine Angus is both strong and informative by stating exactly what breeds are present in said animal.

The standard is both parents must be registered at the AMAA, American Angus Association (AAA) or Red Angus Association of America (RAAA) will provide validated lineage and genetic information along with valuable EPDs. Through a partnership with the AAA our EPDs will be updated with the latest genetic evaluation by the AAA which will provide the breeders and customers the best genetic prediction available. This program is focused on producing quality registered offspring that will aid in the incorporation of Maine-Aniou genetics into the mainstream of the USA beef sector.

PROGRAM STANDARDS

- Maine Angus refers to cattle with the following characteristics:
- The animal will have between 3/8 Maine-Anjou to 5/8

Maine-Anjou blood and have between 3/8 registered Angus to 5/8registered Angus and/or registered Red Angus blood.


- The standard is both parents must be registered at the AMAA, American Angus Association (AAA) or Red Angus Association of America (RAAA) will provide validated lineage.
- Qualifying cattle can have no more than 1/8 of non-registered blood or other breeds.
- A registered Maine Angus bull must be proven free of genetic defects PHA and TH. Depending on the Maine Angus bull's genetic makeup, the individual must also be proven free of known Angus lethal genetic defects (Ex. AM, NH and CA) and/or known lethal Red Angus genetic defects (Ex. AM, NH, CA and OS) whether determined by pedigree or test.
- A registered Maine Angus female must be proven free of PHA and TH, whether identified by pedigree or test.

MAINE ANGUS COLOR STANDARDS

- All qualifying individuals will be predominately solid black or red in color. White markings are only allowed on the underline and switch of the tail.
- Starting Jan. 1, 2019 all animals that have qualified and registered as Maine Angus prior to Jan. 1, 2019 will retain their Maine Angus papers but will not be able to exhibit/show in the Maine Angus division, however, these animals are eligible to show as MaineTainers.

- Twins are used in calculating calving intervals, but not average weaning ratios.
- The average weaning ratio of all of the cows' calves must be at least 104.5.

 is found to be a carrier, he can register as a foundation or performance bull only, but all progeny will have
 to test free of that defect in order to register. Foundation bulls will carry their Maine-Anjou percentage to
 their offspring.
- All Al sires, regardless of breed and/or commercial, must have DNA, TH and PHA on file prior to registering any progeny.
- Maine Angus bulls must be TH and PHA free as well as AM, NH and CA free for black Angus and AM, NH, CA and OS free for Red Angus.

Females

- Carrier heifers out of carrier bulls born after January 1, 2014 can only be registered as foundation or
 performance only. Foundation carriers will carry their Maine-Anjou percentage to their offspring, but their

- All donor dams must have DNA, TH and PHA on file prior to registering their ET calves. If a donor is dead before a sample was procured, you must DNA, TH and PHA test all ET calves in order to register them.

We will be adjusting the DNA testing process beginning in January 2019 in hopes of making this a quicker and easier process. This only changes the testing process through GeneSeek. We will still accept results from other labs. The new process is as follows:

- 1. Any animal being tested must have a number created within Digital Beef. Bulls and suspect heifers will have a performance number. Al sires and donor dams must be registered, have their foreign pedigree added or have a commercial number created to order testing.
- 2. After logging into Digital Beef and viewing your herd, find the animal that needs testing and check the box for DNA. If you have more than one animal to test, be sure to check the box for all the animals that need testing.



- On the left side of the screen, select DNA. All of the animals you selected in the previous step should appear in this list.
- 4. For each animal, select the reason for testing.
- 5. If you use a hair card, blood card, TSU vial, etc., enter that unique barcode in the designated box. If you are not

using one of those sample types, leave the box black, and GeneSeek will assign a barcode when the sample at arrives at the lab. Samples without unique barcodes must be properly labeled.

- 6. Select the sample type.
- 7. Next, select the tests you would like to order.
- 8. If you are testing for parent verification, you can enter the alternative sire's registration number in the designated box.

- A look back in time, 1969-2019 -

1969

- The Maine-Anjou Society, Inc. is incorporated in the state of Nebraska. Present are Hayes Walker III, president and acting executive director and Charles L. Tremain, secretary.
- The initial board of directors includes four people: Hayes and Claudette Walker of Kansas City, Mo., and Charles and Marion Tremain of Beatrice, Neb.

1970

- The first annual membership meeting is held in Las Vegas, Nev.
- On display at the meeting are purebred bull, Shaver Bysantin (AMAA #2), and two half-blood heifers owned by Donald McQ Shaver of Ontario.
- The first executive director is hired: Larry Aschermann.

1971

- A contract is signed with Boeing Computer Services to compile all registration and performance information.
- The second annual membership meeting is held in Denver, Colo. The name of the society is changed to the International Maine-Anjou Association.
- The fee to register a purebred bull is set at \$1,000.

- The Association's office is established at the Livestock Exchange Building in Kansas City, Mo.

1973

- The second executive director is hired: Richard Sneddon.

- The Association is instrumental in organizing the World Maine-Anjou Council. It will work with foreign countries to help establish the Maine-Anjou breed.
- The Association's net worth is \$107,000.

1975

- Data processing equipment is purchased for \$56,000.
- The breed's first Sire Summary is published.
- Trish Huston is hired and joins a staff of 16.
- Dick Sneddon resigns as executive secretary.
- The first fullbloods are imported directly into the U.S. from France.

1976

- The Association's name is changed to the American Maine-Anjou Association.
- The fee to register a purebred bull is reduced to \$500.
- The first AMAA Youth Committee meets in Kansas City, Mo.
- The Association's net worth is \$39,000.

The first Fullblood Maine-Anjou bull sold in the United States for \$102,000, PTR Epinal 83E. The new owners, from left, David Gilger, San Saba, Texas; Harold Biensch, Neilburg, Sask., Canada; Ancel Armstrong, Manhattan, Kan., Calvin Fryar, Brownwood, Texas; Guthrie Packard, Elbert, Colo.; Dr. D.R. Kerby, Brownwood, Texas; and David Marold, Warren, Texas.



1977

- The third executive director is hired: J. Patrick Buchen.
- Performance calculations are no longer mandatory, but voluntary.
- The National Junior Heifer show is announced.
- The fee to register a purebred bull is lowered to \$250.

1978

- The first junior show is held at the American Royal.
- The first National Breeder Award is presented.
- The fee to register a purebred bull is lowered to \$50.

1979

- The National Women's Auxiliary is formed and is known as the Maine Dames. The name is later changed to Maine-Amie.
- The first national queen is crowned, Tracy Johnson, Mo.
- Pat Buchen resigns as executive director.
- The second Sire Summary is available; it is based on data processed by the final Boeing Computer Services run in 1978.

1980

- The fee to register a purebred bull is lowered to \$25.

1981

- The fourth executive director is hired: Steve Bernhard.
- The active membership fee is \$25 annually.
- The fee to register a purebred bull is lowered to \$15.
- The Association's net worth is a negative \$1,700.

1982

- The \$2 checkoff for the promotion fund begins.

- The A.I. Certificate Program begins and remains until June of 1989.
- The AMAA purchases new computer equipment.
- The "fullblood" designation and the animal's color are added to the registration paper. All registration papers are still produced in-house and only carry within-herd performance information.

1983

- The AMAA prints a membership directory.
- The "The All-Purpose Breed" slogan is adopted.

- Steve Bernhard begins negotiations with the American Beef Records Association (ABRA) to have all registrations and transfers processed and performance information calculated. The ultimate goal is to compile records for a future sire summary and to calculate EPDs.
- The World Congress is held in Calgary.
- Bernhard tours Maine-Anjou operations in France, sponsored by the French government.
- Twenty juniors participate in the National Junior Show.



CROSS LANES GEORGIA

Believed to be the selling open female of any breed, Cross Lanes Georgia, was the first Fullblood Maine-Anjou female to sell at public auction in the United States. Cattle Genetics Enterprises, Inc., Springfield, Mo., made the record bid of \$100,000 for the 14-month-old imported Fullblood heifer.

- ABRA keys in all pedigree and performance information for animals registered since the AMAA left Boeing in 1978. To establish a performance base for EPDs, ABRA also entered performance data on large herds dating back to 1971. This was due to Boeing's loss of 76,000 records.
- The AMAA begins registration for steers.
- The AMAA staff consists of two people for 330 paid members.
- The Association's net worth is \$5,500.
- Scott Holt is hired as AJMAA youth director and Voice Editor.

1986

-The first ABRA computer run issues the new performance pedigree.

1987

- The first Summer Board Meeting is held in Kansas City, Mo.
- The AMAA staff consists of one part-time and two full-time persons for 460 paid members.
- Glen Ferris suggests that a junior steer show is held in conjunction with the National Junior Heifer Show in Oklahoma City, Okla.
- Junior board members attend the Youth Beef Industry Congress; it's the first time the breed has been represented at a junior leadership conference.
- The Assocaition's new worth is \$71,000.

1988

- The AMAA co-sponsors the National Beef Conference in Stillwater, Okla., with Oklahoma State University.
- The registration application form is changed in preparation to print herd inventories.
- 573 members paid annual dues.
- The first director of communications and youth is hired.
- The National Junior Show in Oklahoma draws 50 juniors from six states who exhibit 79 head of cattle.
- A volume sale of quality cattle is authorized for the National Western Stock Show.
- For the first time, Maine-Anjou form a class for the Intercollegiate Livestock Judging Contest at the American Royal.

1989

- A committee is formed to develop a scholarship program for the American Junior Maine-Anjou Association.
- The first Maine influence show of lower percentage cattle is held at the American Royal.
- The AMAA updates its in-house computer system.
- Steve Bernhard resigns as executive director after nearly nine years with the AMAA.

- The fifth executive director is hired: John Boddicker.
- Brad Pellett is hired as AJMAA director.

- Rhonda Boddicker is hired as an administrative assistant.
- The Canadian Maine-Anjou Association hosts the World Congress in Calgary.
- The World Maine-Anjou Federation is reactivated.
- The Maine-Anjou Voice, the new official publication of the AMAA, begins with the September/October issue.

WHAT ARE EPDs?

Expected Progeny Differences (EPDs) may be used to estimate how future progeny of the subject animal will compare to progeny of other animals within the breed. The key words are estimate, future, compare and within breed. EPDs are not designed to predict the performance of one or two progeny of a sire, but rather should be used to compare bulls based on estimated progeny performance. EPDs predict differences, not absolutes. They describe the genetic value of an animal much like a feed tag describes the contents of a feed sack.

EPDs are computed as part of the AMAA National Cattle Evaluation (NCE) program. The NCE program represents the application of the most recent genetic and computing technology for calculating EPDs for beef cattle. The Maine-Anjou NCE program incorporates all available performance into the prediction of an individual's EPD for a specific trait. An EPD may be based on any combination of individual performance, pedigree and progeny performance information. In addition, EPDs are more accurate than anything previously available because they account for the following factors:

- Genetic value of cows to which a bull is bred.
- Environmental differences affecting contemporary groups.
- Genetic values of other parents in the contemporary group.
- · Genetic trend.

EPDs are reported in pounds for birth weight, weaning weight, maternal milk, maternal milk & growth and yearling weight.

1. SIRE INFORMATION

Sires are listed in alphabetical order according to their registered name. Also included in this column are the bull's date of birth, registration number, breed percentage, color (if available), horned/polled/scurred status, sire (S), breeder (B) and current owners (O).

2. CALVING EASE

Calving ease EPD describes the heritable component of a sire's ability to produce calves with minimal dystocia or calving difficulty when mated to heifers. It is the best selection tool to use to reduce dystocia. A sire with an 9.0 CE EPD is expected to 6% more unassisted births than a sire with a 3.0 CE EPD. Units are in percentage of additional unassisted births.

3. BIRTH WEIGHT

Progeny can be expected to weigh 1.2 lb. more at birth than progeny sired by a bull with an EPD of 0.3 lb. (1.5 minus 0.3 = 1.2 lb.) Birth weight is an indicator of calving ease. Larger birth weight EPDs usually indicate more calving difficulty.

4. WEANING WEIGHT

Weaning EPD reflects pre-weaning growth. Calves sired by the above bull should have a 16 lb. advantage in 205-day adjusted weaning weight compared to calves sired by a bull with an EPD of 32.0 lb. (48.0 minus 32.0 = 16 lb.)

5. YEARLING WEIGHT

Yearling EPD for this sire indicates his progeny should be 16 lb. above the average of progeny of a bull with an EPD of 54 lb. Yearling EPD reflects differences in the 365-day adjusted yearling weight for progeny. It is the best estimate of total growth.

6. MATERNAL CALVING EASE

Maternal Calving Ease provides an indicator of the ability of a sire's daughters to calve unassisted. Units of measure are additional percentage of unassisted births. A sire with MCE EPD of 4.2 is expected to sire daughters that have 4% more unassisted births than a bull with a 0.2 MCE EPD.

7. MATERNAL MILK

The milking ability of a sire's daughters expressed in pounds of calf weaned. It predicts the difference in average weaning weight of sires' daughters' progeny due to milking ability. Daughters of the sire in the above example should produce progeny with 205-day weights averaging 4.1 lb. more (as a result of greater milk production) than daughters of a bull with a maternal milk EPD of 10.8 lb. (14.9 minus 10.8 = 4.1 lb.). This difference in weaning weight is due to total milk production over the entire lactation.

EXAMPLE LISTING AND TRAIT DEFINITION (CONTINUED)

8. TOTAL MATERNAL

Maternal Milk & Growth reflects what the sire is expected to transmit to his daughters for a combination of growth genetics through weaning and genetics for milking ability. It is an estimate of daughters' progeny weaning weight. The bull in the above example should sire daughters with progeny weaning weights averaging 5 lb. heavier than progeny of a bull's daughters with a Maternal Milk & Growth EPD of 34 lb. (39 minus 34 = 5 lb.). It is equal to one-half the sire's weaning weight EPD, plus all of his milk EPD. No accuracy is associated with this since it is simply a mathematical combination of two other EPDs. This EPD is sometimes referred to as "total maternal" or "combined maternal."

9. CARCASS WEIGHT

Carcass Weight EPD reflects differences in the 450-day adjusted hot carcass weight (pounds) of progeny. Carcass Weight EPD for this sire indicates his progeny should be 18.0 lb. above the average of progeny of a bull with an EPD of 0.0 lb.

10. FAT THICKNESS

Fat Thickness EPD reflects expected differences in a sire's progeny for the carcass measurement of inches of 12th rib fat thickness. A negative Fat Thickness EPD reflects the expectation of progeny having less fat thickness (leaner carcass). Fat thickness is one of the components used to determine USDA Yield Grade and estimates of cutability.

11. RIB-EYE AREA

Rib-eye Area EPD reflects expected differences in a sire's progeny for the carcass measurement of square inches of rib-eye area

taken between the 12th and 13th ribs. Rib eye area is one of the components used to determine USDA Yield Grade and estimates of cutability. Positive Rib-eye Area EPDs are reflective larger average progeny rib-eye area.

12. MARBLING

Marbling EPD reflects differences in expected progeny marbling scores (intramuscular fat). Marbling EPD is measured in marbling score units. For example the progeny of a sire that has a Marbling EPD of 0.50 would be expected to average one-half marbling score better than progeny of a sire with Marbling EPD 0.00.

13. PERCENT RETAIL CUT

Percent Retail Cuts EPD reflects the expected genetic differences in the percentage of boneless closely trimmed retail cuts (PBCTRC) of progeny. PBCTRC is a measure of cutability and is closely related to USDA Yield Grade. Positive values represent expectations of progeny with more desirable cutability (a higher percentage of retail cuts).

14. HERDS

Number of herds in which progeny were raised with recorded measurements for each specific trait. Number of herds gives a general indication of progeny distribution.

15. PROGENY

The number of progeny sired by the bull with recorded measurements for each specific trait. Number of progeny should not be used in lieu of accuracy, but simply to further clarify accuracy values.

PERCENTILE BREAKDOWN OF EPDs

Percentile charts for the breed's active Maine-Anjou and MaineTainer sires (those producing a calf with a performance record since 2012) appear below. These can be used to get a better idea of how a bull ranks in the current group of active sires in the Maine-Anjou or MaineTainer breed groups. The chart is divided into 5 percent increments for each trait. The top 5 percent are further divided into 1 percent increments.

Very few bulls rank at the top in every trait, but through careful evaluation you should be able to find bulls to match your specifications. To see how the table may be used, let's look at our example bull used previously.

Since EPDs may be used to compare young bulls that are not parents, the average EPDs and ranges and a percentile breakdown

for animals born in 2011-2012 are also provided. These tables are useful for comparing the EPDs of calves born in these years. Moreover, since the recent change is relatively small, it can be used as a benchmark for all young calves.

The breakdown chart and EPD ranges for the active cows with a calf reported since Jan. 1, 2013, allow one to compare his or her herd with all active cows in the Maine-Anjou breed.

The Percentile Breakdown charts and Genetic Trend graphs for the MaineTainer cattle appear on pages 7 and 8.


GENETIC TRENDS

The graphs below illustrate the genetic trends in the Maine-Anjou and MaineTainer breed groups. All animals in the analysis were used to generate this information. This includes Fullblood and Purebred animals as well as lower percentage Maine-Anjou cattle. In general, the EPD changes from one year to the next are quite small. This does not mean the performance of the cattle has

not changed over the years. The actual weights taken on animals are phenotypic measurements. Phenotypic changes can be made through changing not only an animal's genetics, but also by changing an animal's environment.


MAINE-ANJOU BW, CED, & CEM TRAITS

Genetic Trend | 1999 to 2018





Genetic Trend || 1999 to 2018




MAINE-ANJOU WW & YW TRAITS

Genetic Trend | 1999 to 2018






MAINE-ANJOU TM TRAITS








MAINE-ANJOU CW TRAITS

QUESTIONS -AND- ANSWERS

If a bull has a yearling weight EPD of +80lb., does this mean he will ad 80 lb. to yearling weights?

It is important to remember that EPDs do not predict performance; they merely allow us to compare the average expected performance of progeny of different bulls. This bull, when compared to another bull within the same breed with a 65 lb. yearling EPD, would be expected to produce an additional 15 lb. of yearling weight if both were randomly mated to a large number of cows in the same environment.

Does a +15 lb. milk EPD mean an extra 15 lb. of milk?

No. Maternal milk EPDs are expressed in pounds of calf weaning weight, not in pounds of milk. In an attempt to explain how this works, let's consider a contemporary group of calves where there is a prediction of how each calf should rank within that group based on weaning weight EPDs of the sires and dams represented. Assume that a bull has daughters that consistently wean calves that are 15 lb. above the predicted rank when compared to daughters of other bulls in the same contemporary group. This greater weaning weight is credited to milk production, even though other environmental factors may also play a role.

Do I need to know what the breed average is for birth weight before I select a bull?

Absolute breed averages for birth weight or any other traits do not exist because of non-genetic environmental factors such as climate, nutrition, management systems, etc. For example, we know that birth weights may be as much as 15 to 20 lb. lower in Florida than in Montana, strictly due to variation in temperature, humidity and grass quality. Thus, breed averages will vary from one herd to the next and the only way you will know what breed average is in your herd is with experience gained by using proven bulls with high accuracy. Remember, EPDs are meant to predict differences in progeny performance rather than determine absolute performance.

How much confidence can I have in an EPD with a low accuracy value less than .30?

If you were able to sample several bulls with low accuracy, on the average the EPDs would do a fairly good job of sorting the bulls into high, medium and low performance levels. However, when you are selecting only one bull, "on the average" is not good enough, so you really need to know the possible change associated with the given accuracy. For example, let's assume the minimum yearling weight you are willing to accept is 70 lb., and you were considering a bull with a yearling weight EPD of +85 lb. with an accuracy of .40. Next we look at the Possible Change Value table on page 3 and find a value of +15.4 for yearling weight with an accuracy of .40. This bull may work for you because +85 minus 15.4 is 69.6 lb., which is slightly lower than the acceptable level of 70 lb. It is true that the bull could stay the same or even go up in yearling weight EPD. You must decide how much risk you are willing to accept. For a given accuracy, approximately 67 percent of the bulls will not change more than plus or minus the possible change value when re- evaluated with additional progeny information. The table for converting accuracy to possible change is printed on page 3 of this Sire Summary. Please note that possible change values differ for each trait.

How are embryo transfer (ET) calves handled with respect to EPD values?

The performance records of ET calves are not considered in the calculation of EPDs for the animal or its sire and dam. The reason is because there is no way to account for the influence of the recipient female on the calf's performance. EPDs for ET animals are estimated using information from relatives until the animal has progeny with performance records.

Will mating a specific sire to my best cows affect his EPDs?

No. When calculating EPDs, the mates of a particular animal are accounted for in the analysis. In other words, breeding a sire to either high growth cows or low growth cows should not affect his EPDs. For example, let's say you have 50 cows. You breed your higher yearling weight EPD cows to Sire A and breed your lower yearling weight EPD cows to Sire B. Sire A's calves should weigh more at a year of age than Sire B's simply because of the dams. This type of mating is accounted for in the present statistical analysis.

How important is it to identify my contemporary groups correctly?

Extremely important. More inaccuracies in the genetic analysis occur from incorrectly identifying contemporary groups than any other single cause. Weaning Management Codes (feed code and group) must be used to distinguish calves which have had different opportunities to perform. Calves that have been treated differently should have different management codes

Do I need to send in to AMAA the performance records of all my calves?

Absolutely YES. Sending in only your best calves really hurts your best sires and dams. You must record ALL calves for the analysis to be correct. If one calf has been sick and therefore weighs much less, simply give him a different management code. Also at birth, weighing the dead calves is just as important as the live calves.

Should calves out of my first-calf heifers be in separate contemporary groups than calves out of my older cows?

A contemporary group is a group of animals who have been treated alike. If you treat your first-calf heifers differently than your mature cows, those calves should be in different contemporary groups. If you treat your first- calf heifers identically to your mature cows, both sets of calves would be considered contemporaries. Use different management codes to identify separate contemporary groups. How you manage and feed your cows is totally your decision, but calves (or dams) treated differently should be grouped separately. If you treat your first-calf heifers better than your mature cows and still group them all together, the calves out of the first-calf heifers get the added adjusted weaning weight correction as well as the superior treatment.

GLOSSARY

ACCURACY (ACC)

A measure of certainty regarding the genetic merit of an animal. Accuracy values are calculated for each EPD according to Beef Improvement Federation (BIF) Guidelines and reported as a decimal number between zero and one. Larger values indicate greater accuracy.

BIRTH WEIGHT

Calf weight at birth adjusted to a mature dam equivalent. Expected progeny performance is reported in pounds. The EPD value predicts the difference in average birth weight of a bull's calves compared to calves of all other bulls evaluated. When comparing birth weight EPDs of two sires, the larger EPD indicates a heavier average birth weight for calves sired by this bull.

CALVING EASE

Controlling the percentage of heifers experiencing dystocia during their first calving is a goal of many produers. Service sires mated to these heifers can have a large influence on the rate of calving difficulty or dystocia. Calving ease EPD describes the additional percentage of calves expected to be born unassisted. The CE EPD uses both calving ease scores for calves born to heifers and birth weights from calves born to all age of dam classifications to predict calving ease

CARCASS WEIGHT

Carcass Weight EPD reflects differences in the 450-day adjusted hot carcass weight of progeny. Carcass Weight EPDs are estimated from progeny carcass weights and/or the genetically correlated ultrasound Scan Weight of the individual and/or progeny. Larger Carcass Weight EPDs are associated with heavier expected progeny average hot carcass weights. Carcass Weight EPD is expressed in pounds.

EXPECTED PROGENY DIFFERENCE (EPD)

The expected difference in performance of a bull's progeny when compared to the average progeny performance of all evaluated bulls. The EPD is a prediction of 1/2 of an animal's breeding value or its genetic value as a parent.

FAT THICKNESS

Fat Thickness EPD reflects expected differences in a sire's progeny for the carcass measurement of 12th rib fat thickness at a standard 450 days of age. The EPD is scaled in inches of fat thickness. A negative Fat Thickness EPD reflects the expectation of progeny having less fat thickness (leaner carcass) on average. Fat thickness is one of the components used to determine USDA Yield Grade and estimates of cutability.

GENETIC CORRELATION

Correlations between two traits that arise because the same genes affect both traits. When two traits are positively correlated (e.g. weaning and yearling weights) selection for an increase in one trait will result in an increase in the other trait. When two traits are negatively correlated (e.g. birth weight and calving ease) selection for an increase in one trait will result in a decrease in the other trait.

HERITABILITY

The proportion of variation observed in a trait that is due to heredity and is transmitted to offspring (i.e. additive gene action). Heritability varies from zero to one. The higher the heritability of a trait, the more rapid should be the response to selection.

MARBLING

Marbling EPD reflects differences in expected progeny marbling scores (intramuscular fat) at an age constant basis of 450 days. Marbling EPD is measured in marbling score units. For example the progeny of a sire that has a Marbling EPD of 0.50 would be expected to average one-half marbling score better than progeny of a sire with Marbling EPD 0.00. The MAY/JUNE/JULY 2019

USDA Quality Grade of Select contains animals that display marbling in the Slight score (Slight 00 - Slight 99). The Choice grade spans three marbling scoreS: Small 00 - Small 99 (Choice-), Modest 00 - Modest 99 (Choiceo) and Moderate 00 - Moderate 99 (Choice+).

MATERNAL CALVING EASE

In addition to the genetic influence a service sire has on the calving ease of a particular calf, there is a genetic component to the ability of a sire's daughters to calve unassisted. This genetic effect is described by MCE EPD. The unit of measure is in additional percentage of calves born unassisted to first calf heifers.

MATERNAL MILK

The maternal ability of a bull's daughters. Expected progeny performance is expressed in pounds of calf weaning weight. The EPD value predicts the difference in average 205-day weight of a bull's daughters' calves compared to calves from daughters of all other bulls evaluated. When comparing milk EPDs of two sires, the larger maternal milk EPD indicates heavier average weaning weights due to daughters' greater maternal ability.

MATERNAL WEANING WEIGHT

The weaning weight of a bull's daughters' calves. Expected progeny performance is reported in pounds. The EPD value predicts the difference in average 205-day weight of a bull's daughters' calves compared to calves from daughters of all other bulls evaluated. The evaluation reflects both the maternal ability of a bull's daughters and the growth potential of their calves. When comparing maternal weaning weight EPDs of two sires, the larger maternal weaning weight EPD indicates heavier weaning weights due to daughters' ability to produce heavier calves.

PERCENT RETAIL CUTS

Percent Retail Cuts EPD reflects the expected genetic differences in the percentage of boneless closely trimmed retail cuts (PBCTRC) of progeny. PBCTRC is a measure of cutability and is closely related to USDA Yield Grade. Percent Retail Cuts EPD is computed as a linear index of Carcass Weight, Fat Thickness and Rib-eye Area EPDs. Positive values represent expectations of progeny with more desirable cutability (a higher percentage or retail cuts) on average.

RIB-EYE AREA

Rib-eye Area EPD reflects expected differences in a sire's progeny for the carcass measurement of rib-eye area taken between the 12th and 13th ribs at an age constant basis of 450 days of age. Rib-eye Area and Rib-eye Area EPD are measured in square inches. Rib eye area is one of the components used to determine USDA Yield Grade and estimates of cutability. Positive values represent expectations of progeny with larger average rib-eye area.

WEANING WEIGHT

Calf weight taken between 130 and 280 days of age and adjusted to 205 days of age and a mature dam equivalent. Expected progeny performance is reported in pounds. The EPD value predicts the difference in average 205- day weight of a bull's calves compared to calves of all other bulls evaluated. When comparing weaning weight EPDs of two sires, the larger EPD indicates a heavier average weaning weight for calves sired by this bull.

YEARLING WEIGHT

Weight taken between 300 and 470 days of age and adjusted to 365 days of age and a mature dam equivalent. Expected progeny performance is reported in pounds. The EPD value predicts the difference in average 365-day weight of a bull's progeny compared to progeny of all other evaluated bulls. When comparing yearling weight EPDs of two sires the larger EPD indicates a heavier average yearling weight for calves sired by this bull.



LEGACIES LIVE ON WITH THE

Jones Family

After over a decade of purchasing, showing, breeding, and selling Maine-Anjou cattle, Jones Cattle Co., Pontiac, Ill. earned the prestigious American Maine-Anjou Association (AMAA) Breeder of the Year award for the 2018-2019 show season. Today Jones Cattle Co., is comprised of Janet Jones; her two sons Andy and Jacob and their families. Andy and Darcy (Rahe) and their

children Kaisson, 4 and Kamryn, 2. Jacob (Jac) and his wife Kristin and their children Emmerson, 6 and Harper, 3. The spirit and legacy that Paul Jones left behind after his passing in 2012 have kept the family's focus on the vision and goals set forth in the operation since day one.

Paul and Janet were high school sweethearts, married at 19 and purchased their first farm shortly thereafter in Pontiac, III. Growing up, Paul was one of seven children involved in his family's commercial cattle and grain farming operation. Janet didn't grow up on a farm but through her agricultural connections, she was afforded the opportunity to exhibit a market steer at the Illinois State Fair during her 4-H career. Both Paul and Janet worked off the farm, he as a tractor mechanic and she in

finance. After the purchase of the first farm, Paul and Janet started a farrow to finish hog operation that their sons, Andy and Jac became actively involved with from an early age and continued to raise hogs through high school.

In the 1990s Andy and Jac convinced their parents that they were ready to start their cattle operation - and so it began, a Maine-Anjou Breeder of the Year was in the making. They chose Maine-Anjou cattle because they had a lot to offer their members and the cattle were 'their kind'. They set out with the goal - to make a name. Their first priority was always that the cattle had to be maternal and functional to accomplish their goal of making everything work as a cow on their operation.

Andy and Jac spent a lot of time on the road going to shows helping breeders and people that they could learn from. Their hours spent learning, watching and listening paid off in 2005 when they earned the Illinois High Point Heifer of the Year. While continuing to expand their herd, Andy and Jac spent a lot of time driving home on the weekends from the University of Illinois to help on the farm. During that time, they brought their cousin, Justin Kaisner, on board to help at the farm. Justin still is still employed by Jones Cattle Co. and has become quite a hand, helping with everything from equipment maintenance to working cattle and making hay.

Andy and Jac both obtained Fighting Illini Alumni status with agricultural degrees and are deeply involved in the agricultural industry through their professional careers. Andy took an opportunity with Mix 30 after graduation and covers over a dozen states in the Southeastern region of the country. Jac's professional endeavors revolve around the agronomy side of things, selling seed to farmers in the Midwest.

Today, Andy and his family reside in Chapin, Ill., a small town an hour West of the state's capital, where his wife Darcy grew up. Nearly 150 miles from the home farm in Pontiac, Andy and Darcy keep

all of the show and sale cattle at their operation. Darcy's parents Tim and Carman Rahe are able to help balance the workload with the cattle and feed business. Andy's Mix 30 schedule keeps him on the road at different events and meetings for over half the year. Additionally, Darcy has recently taken a marketing position with Umbarger and Sons Show Feed. She also manages their feed store where they're growth rates exceed 30% annually and they're on track to move over 300 ton of show feed in 2019.

Jac and his wife Kristin reside in Pontiac, very close to Janet and the 120 cows that they calve annually. Jac heads up the breeding and calving portions of Jones Cattle Co. He and Andy spend countless hours on the phone communicating about progress, decisions being made about breeding and the day-to-day operations around the farm.

Oftentimes the last words of a conversation are "let me know if you need anything". When Andy mentioned those words to AMAA staff at the conclusion of the Junior National Heifer show in his home state, he was taken up on his offer. Andy's offer to get more involved with AMAA earned him a ballot ticket for the board of directors. Since being elected, he has been a part of numerous conversations and a champion for decisions that the board has discussed and voted upon for the breed's sustainable longevity. For example, in the area of breed improvement, Andy states, "the Maine-Angus division has brought us an additional pool of cattle that not only build our registry but open our breeding options to continue raising versatile and competitive cattle that'll go out and work after their time spent in the ring."

Already spending hours in the barn with the cattle, Andy and Jac's young families are excited about their future careers with the American Junior Maine-Anjou Association (AJMAA). "One of the most unique things about the AJMAA is that it provides the opportunity for the youth involved to see success and furthermore the platform to attain

lofty goals,' remarked Andy. "I've witnessed it throughout the years and now that my kids are getting started, I couldn't

be more excited that we're in the Maine-Anjou business."

The only road that can sometimes seem longer than that to success is the path traveled to shows throughout the season. The AMAA Breeder of the Year is tabulated by how the breeder does at the four major shows, Kansas City, Louisville, Denver, Ft. Worth and their state fair. In 2018, Jones Cattle Co. attended all four shows across the country and took a string of
