PUZZLES AND RIDDLES


Do you love words, riddles and conundrums?

cbbg bn



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


3. Can you find 21 types of vehicles in the wordsearch below?


4. Can you enter the words correctly into the grid? The letters in the shaded boxes will spell out a mystery word...






5. Can you work out which letters of the alphabet are missing from the circle?



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


10. WORD LADDERS!
