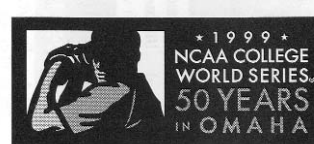

2006 SEC Tournament

The Southeastern Conference Baseball Tournament returns for an ninth straight year to Hoover Metropolitan Stadium in Birmingham suburb of Hoover, Ala., May 24-28.

The SEC Tournament will follow an eight-team double elimination tournament that is modeled after the College World Series. The tournament field includes the top two teams from the SEC's Eastern and Western Divisions plus four at-large bids based on conference winning percentage.

The eight teams are seeded 1-8 with the two divisional champions guaranteed of the top two seeds. Last season, Mississippi State defeated Ole Miss 4-1 in front of a crowd of 12,290, to claim their second SEC Tournament in the last five years.

The Hoover Met serves as home of the Double-A Birmingham Barons (Chicago White Sox) of the Southern League.

Located eight miles south of Birmingham, the stadium is regarded by many sports experts as one of the best of its kind in the nation. It seats 10,800 for baseball, but can accommodate up to 16,000 when the patio, banquet and side grassy areas are used. The stadium also houses 12 suites and state-of-the-art dressing and training rooms. Wireless internet access was added in 2004, and plans for second-level pressbox expansion and new outfield scoreboard are in the works for 2007.

The 2005 SEC Baseball Tournament, held in Hoover, Ala. drew 119,580 fans. That total was the third highest total attendance in the event's history. Over 12,000 fans were in attendance to the see championship game, the sixth largest single game crowd in tournament history and the third largest for a championship game.

The 2002 SEC Baseball Tournament total attendance of 124,440 was the largest total in tourney history. The championship game pulled in 13,023 and was the second largest title game crowd in tournament history. It was also the third largest single game attendance in tourney history at the time.

Tickets for the 2006 tournament are \$90 for reserved box seats, \$15 for a single-game reserved seat, \$48 for a Dr Pepper Six-Pack general admission book, and \$10 for a single-game general admission.

The SEC athletic directors recently decided to extend, for five years, the SEC's contract to hold the baseball tournament at the Hoover Metropolitan Stadium. The Southeastern Conference will keep its baseball tournament in suburban Birmingham through 2006 with the current contract, and through 2011 with the newly proposed deal.



SEC TOURNAMENT SEEDING: The two division champions shall be automatically seeded number one and number two based on winning percentage in conference competition. The rest shall be seeded numbers three through eight based on winning percentage without regard to division. Ties will be broken in the following manner:

1. **Two-Team Tie:** When two teams are tied for a finish, the following procedure will be used (in the following order until the tie is broken):
 - A. Won-lost results of head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
 - B. If they are divisional opponents:
 1. Won-lost percentage within their division (over the 15-game SEC division schedule).
 2. Won-lost percentage of the two teams versus the No. 1 team in their division (and proceeding through the No. 6 team, if necessary).
 - C. If two teams are not divisional opponents:
 1. Won-lost record of the two teams versus the No. 1 seed using common opponents only (and proceeding through the No. 8 seed, if necessary).
2. Coin flip by the Commissioner.
2. **Three-Team Tie (or more):** When three or more teams are tied for a finish, the following procedure will be used (in descending order until the tie is broken): Once the tie has been reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker procedure as stated in No. 1 above will be used.
 - A. If all three teams are common opponents: Total won-lost percentage of games played among the tied teams.
 - B. Won-lost percentage of the tied teams versus the No. 1 seed and proceeding through the No. 8 seed, if necessary, using common opponents only.
 - C. If three or more teams still are tied, the Commissioner will conduct a draw.

SEC TOURNAMENT HISTORY: Alabama is 44-36 (.550) all-time in SEC post-season play, dating back to its first appearance in the 1950 SEC Playoffs, a best-of-five series against Eastern Division champ Kentucky.

The Crimson Tide is 35-25 (.583) since the league adopted a tournament format in 1977.

Coach Jim Wells has posted an impressive 27-9 (.750) record at the SEC Tournament, including an SEC record six post-season titles.

Alabama won championships in 1983, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1999 and 2002, with the last five coming under Wells' watch.

In SEC Tournament games played at the Hoover Met, Alabama has compiled a 23-10 (.697) record under Wells, winning the championship in 1996, 1999, 2002 and 2003.

SEC TOURNAMENT CHAMPIONSHIP GAMES: Alabama is a perfect 7-0 (1.000) in SEC Tournament Championship game appearances, winning the title in 1983, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1999, 2002 and 2003.

WELLS WINS SIXTH SEC TOURNEY CROWN: Alabama head coach Jim Wells has directed the Crimson Tide to an SEC-record tying six SEC Tournament championships in his first 10 years at the Capstone. Alabama's 10-3 win over LSU in the 2003 SEC Championship game gave the UA skipper his sixth post-season title, tying his former boss and mentor Skip Bertman for most SEC post-season titles in league history. Bertman, now the Director of Athletics at LSU, led the Tigers to six SEC Tournament championships (1986, 1990, 1992, 1993, 1994 and 2000) during his tenure at LSU. Legendary Miss. State skipper Ron Polk joins Bertman and Wells as the only coaches in SEC history with four or more SEC Tournament championships in league history.
