# **INSIDE** THE GAME

## NO. 10/9/9 NITTANY LIONS HOST NO. 3/2/2 MICHIGAN FOR BIG NOON KICKOFF

- OPENING KICK: No. 10/9/9 Penn State welcomes No. 3/2/2 Michigan to Beaver Stadium on Saturday. The matchup is set to air on FOX's Big Noon Kickoff.
- BIG NOON KICKOFF: Penn State will appear as FOX's Big Noon Kickoff for the third time this season. Penn State was the featured game for its contests at Illinois and Ohio State.
- SERIES HISTORY: The Nittany Lions meet Michigan for the 27th time in the series. Penn State trails the all-time series, 16-10. The teams have split 3-3 in the last six matchups. Last season in Ann Arbor, Penn State fell 41-17. Curtis Jacobs had a 47-yard interception return for a touchdown and Kaytron Allen added a rushing score. Coziah Izzard recorded two tackles for loss, including a sack.
- STRONG AGAINST THE RUN: After holding Maryland to -49 rushing yards, Penn State leads the country in rushing defense, allowing just 60.3 rushing yards per game. The Nittany Lions have held each of its last eight opponents under 100 rushing yards, the longest active streak in the FBS. Contributing to PSU's rushing defense is the Nittany Lions' ability to make plays in the backfield. Penn State paces the nation in sacks per game (4.2) and ranks fourth in tackles for loss per game (8.4). PSU is tied first among FBS teams with 24 players who have recorded at least a full tackle for loss and leads the FBS with 19 players who have recorded at least one full sack.
- MULTIPLE TIGHT END TOUCHDOWNS: The Nittany Lions' tight ends have continuously found the end zone this season. At Maryland, Theo Johnson and Tyler Warren each caught touchdown receptions, marking the fourth game this season that mulitple PSU tight ends made touchdown grabs. Penn State leads FBS teams with 12 receiving touchdowns by tight ends and is the only FBS team who has two tight ends with 4+ receiving touchdowns this year.
- THE OPPOSITION: Michigan is 9-0 overall and 6-0 in Big Ten play after a 41-13 win over Purdue last Saturday. The Wolverines racked up 445 yards, including J.J. McCarthy's 335 passing yards. Blake Corum scored three of Michigan's five rushing touchdowns. Michigan held Purdue to 269 yards, while Will Johnson had a pick and two pass breakups.

# HEAD COACH JAMES FRANKLIN

## CAREER AT A GLANCE

- Franklin was named the 16th head football coach in the storied history of the Nittany Lion program on January 11, 2014.
- He is one of six current FBS head coaches to lead his teams to a bowl game in each of his first nine seasons as a head coach and one of six to do so in 11 of their first 12 seasons.
- Franklin is one of four current Big Ten coaches (Ryan Day, Kirk Ferentz, Jim Harbaugh) to have won a Big Ten Championship and became the first African American head coach to win a Big Ten title after Penn State's 2016 victory.
- He joins Mack Brown (UNC), Jimbo Fisher (Texas A&M), Nick Saban (Alabama), Kirby Smart (Georgia) and Dabo Swinney (Clemson) as the only active coaches in college football to have won at least three New Year's Six or College Football Playoff games in their career.
- Franklin has led his teams to four Top 10 finishes (4 at Penn State) and seven Top 25 finishes (2 at Vanderbilt; 5 at Penn State).
- In the last seven seasons under Franklin, Penn State is one of six teams to rank in the top 12 of the CFP final rankings at least five times, joining Alabama, Clemson, Georgia, Ohio State and Oklahoma.
- From 2016-19, Franklin led the Nittany Lions to three New Year's Six bowls 2016 (Rose), 2017 (Fiesta) and 2019 (Cotton), making Penn State one of eight teams to accomplish the feat during the four-year span. Penn State last went to three New Year's Six bowls in four years in 1980-83 (1980 Fiesta, 1982 Fiesta, 1983 Sugar).
- Franklin guided Penn State to back-to-back New Year's Six bowls in 2016 (Rose) and 2017 (Fiesta) for the first time since 1985 (Orange) and 1986 (Fiesta).
- From 2016-19, Franklin led Penn State to 42 wins, the most in program history for the Big Ten era, and 28 league wins, a program record.
- Franklin has 28 years of coaching experience at the collegiate and NFL level.
- In his first 12 years as a head coach, Franklin mentored 90 players who have gone on to the NFL ranks.
- Franklin is first all-time in total wins and winning percentage by an FBS African American head coach (minimum 80 wins).

## NITTANY LIONS ON THE FIELD

- Penn State defeated No. 8/7/10 Utah, 35-21, in the 109th Rose Bowl Game to cap off the 2022 season. The Nittany Lions reached the 11-win plateau for the 19th time in program history.
- Penn State earned a New Year's Day bowl berth against Arkansas in the Outback Bowl in 2021. With wins over No. 12/15 Wisconsin and No. 22/20 Auburn, Penn State tallied two wins over ranked teams within the first three games of the season for the first time in program history.
- In 2020, with the emergence of young skill players on offense, true freshmen accounted for 1,486 of Penn State's 3,873 total yards (38 percent), marking a school record for most combined scrimmage yards by true freshmen in a single season.
- Penn State earned its third 11-win season in four years with an 11-2 record in 2019, including a win over No. 17 Memphis in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic. The Nittany Lions posted their fourth-straight top 12 finish in the final CFP rankings, coming in 10th, and were ranked ninth in the final Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls to earn their 25th AP Top 10 finish. Franklin was a finalist for the Paul "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year award for the second time at Penn State (2016) and third time in his head coaching career.
- In 2018, the Nittany Lions posted their third-straight season with at least nine wins with a 9-4 overall record, earning a berth in the VRBO Citrus Bowl. Penn State finished No. 12 in the final CFP rankings and No. 17 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls.
- Penn State climbed as high as No. 2 in the rankings in 2017 and appeared in a second-straight New Year's Six bowl, earning a 35-28 win
  over No. 11 Washington in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl. At 11-2, the Nittany Lions earned back-to-back 11-win seasons for the fifth time in
  program history and first time since 2008 and 2009. Penn State finished the season No. 8 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls
  and No. 9 in the final CFP rankings.
- Penn State surged in 2016, winning nine consecutive games en route to the Big Ten Championship, a Rose Bowl berth and an 11-3 overall record. Penn State finished the season ranked No. 5 in the College Football Playoff rankings and No. 7 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls. It was Penn State's highest finish in the polls since 2005. The Lions claimed their fourth overall Big Ten Championship and first outright title since 1994 with a thrilling, 38-31 comeback win over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game. Franklin was honored as Sporting News National Coach of the Year and the Woody Hayes National Coach of the Year, as well as the Dave McLain Big Ten Coach of the Year and Associated Press Big Ten Coach of the Year.
- Franklin guided the Nittany Lions to a 7-6 record in 2015 and a berth in the TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Franklin's first season in 2014 was bookended with a pair of thrilling victories for the Nittany Lions. It began with a final-play 26-24 victory
  over UCF in Dublin, Ireland, in Penn State's first-ever international game and ended with a comeback, a 31-30 overtime win over Boston
  College in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in Yankee Stadium. Franklin became just the third Penn State coach to lead the team to at least seven
  wins in his first season, joining Dick Harlow (1915) and Bill O'Brien (2012), and he guided the Nittany Lions to a 4-0 start, joining Harlow as
  the only first-year Penn State coaches to win their initial four games.

## NITTANY LIONS IN THE CLASSROOM

- The Nittany Lions posted their first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- Sean Clifford (2021) and Trace McSorley (2018) were selected as a National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athletes and finalists for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman." They are the 18th and 19th Nittany Lions to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May.
- Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).
- Tyler Yazujian collected a berth on the CoSIDA Academic All-America® first team in 2016 after an appearance on the second team in 2015.
- A program-record 10 Nittany Lions were named 2020-21 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars, besting the previous mark of nine set a year earlier.

## NITTANY LIONS IN THE COMMUNITY

- The Nittany Lions are active in the community, participating in activities such as Uplifting Athletes, THON, Pennsylvania Special Olympics
   Summer Games, State College Area Food Bank and Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital visits.
- On June 15, 2020, Franklin was named to the Big Ten Anti-Hate and Anti-Racism Coalition.
- As part of the Cotton Bowl festivities in 2019, Franklin and his family made a \$10,000 financial commitment to the Dallas Children's Hospital.
- In August 2019, Franklin was named a Penn State University Renaissance Fund honoree, which awards outstanding community members for helping students in need.

## HEAD COACH JIM HARBAUGH

- Jim Harbaugh is in his ninth season as head coach at Michigan. In five of his eight previous seasons as the Michigan head coach, Harbaugh has guided the Wolverines to 10-win seasons.
- · Last year, Michigan won the Big Ten Championship and was selected for the College Football Playoff, falling 51-45 against TCU in the semifinals (Fiesta Bowl).
- From 2011-14, Harbaugh was head coach of the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He led the franchise to the NFC Championship Game in each of his first three seasons and the 2012 Super Bowl.
- From 2007-10, Harbaugh was the head coach at Stanford, leading the Cardinal to an Orange Bowl victory in 2010.
- Harbaugh is the only coach to win both the AP NFL Coach of the Year (2011) and Woody Hayes Coach of the Year Award (2010).
- · Harbaugh played for five different organizations during his 15-year NFL career (1987-2001).
- · As a quarterback at Michigan, Harbaugh earned first-team All-America honors and finished third in the balloting for the Heisman Trophy in 1986.

## SCOUTING THE WOLVERINES

- Michigan is 9-0 on the season, including 6-0 in Big Ten play.
- Last Saturday, the Wolverines earned a 41-13 win over Purdue.
- Michigan tallied 445 total yards, including 335 passing yards by J.J. McCarthy, and scored on five rushing touchdowns.
- Michigan ranks fifth in the nation in scoring offense (40.7 ppg; 1st in B1G), 42nd in total offense (424.2 ypg; 2nd), 44th in passing offense (257.1; 3rd) and 50th in rushing offense (167.1; 4th). The Wolverines also sit first in the country in completion percentage (75.1).
- J.J. McCarthy ranks third in the country with a 75.7 completion percentage and second in the nation with a 188.7 passing efficiency. McCarthy owns 2,134 passing yards and 18 touchdowns.
- RB Blake Corum leads the country with 16 rushing touchdowns to go with 649 yards.
- The Wolverines hold first in the nation in scoring defense (6.7 ppg), total defense (231.4 ypg) and passing defenese (141.3) and ninth in rushing defense (90.3).
- · LB Junior Colson paces Michigan with 49 tackles.

## LAST MEETING NO. 10/10 PENN STATE FALLS TO NO. 5/4 MICHIGAN, 41-17

ANN ARBOR, MICH. - The No. 10/10 Penn State football team suffered its first loss of the 2022 campaign, 41-17, to No. 5/4 Michigan in Michigan Stadium. The Nittany Lions' defense recorded one of two Penn State touchdowns on the day, when Curtis Jacobs picked off a tipped pass and took it all the way to the end zone for a score. However, the Wolverine rushing attack gained significant momentum in the second half, with two 60-plus-yard touchdown runs by Donovan Edwards and Blake Corum, respectively, inflating the Michigan lead. On the defensive side of the ball, the Nittany Lions were led by Ji'Ayir Brown's nine total tackles, all of which came in the first half. Coziah Izzard pitched in with Penn State's only sack of the day. Offensively, a few big plays resulted in scoring drives for the Nittany Lions, including a 62-yard run from Sean Clifford and a 48-yard reception for Harrison Wallace III. - The Nittany Lions have appeared in the CFP rankings 32 times since the College Football Playoff was introduced in 2014.

## MARYLAND POSTGAME NOTES

- Under head coach James Franklin, Penn State has averaged a 24.8 margin of victory in 10 matchups against Maryland.
- In road games against Maryland in the James Franklin era, Penn State has averaged a 43.75 margin of victory in four contests.
- Penn State limited Maryland to -49 rushing yards. Since 1947, the -49 rushing yards are the second-lowest allowed by a Penn State defense.
- The -49 rushing yards allowed are the fewest by an FBS team in a game this season. The previous low was Stanford allowing -5 rushing yards against Hawaii.
- Since 2013, Penn State is one of four FBS teams that have allowed -49 or fewer rushing yards in a game joining San Diego State (-66 vs. Middle Tennessee State, 12/24/22), Michigan State (-73 vs. Tulsa, 8/30/19) and Arizona State (-52 vs. Washington State, 10/22/16).
- Penn State scored 51 points, marking the third time this season the Nittany Lions have posted 50+ points and the fourth time PSU has scored 40+ points.
- TE **Theo Johnson** and TE **Tyler Warren** both had touchdown grabs in the first half. It marked the fourth game this season that Penn State had multiple tight ends with touchdown receptions in a game.
- Penn State held Maryland to 234 total yards. The 234 total yards are Maryland's lowest this season.

## INDIANA POSTGAME NOTES

- The Nittany Lions are 13-0 in home matchups and have won nine of the last 10 games in the series.
- Penn State snapped a streak of 11-straight games without throwing an interception. It was the longest active streak in the nation.
- An Indiana touchdown pass in the first quarter snapped a streak of 11-straight quarters at home, dating back to the Delaware game, without allowing any points.
- The Nittany Lions snapped a streak of 16-straight games with at least five tackles for loss. Entering the game, it was the second-longest streak in FBS.

- The Nittany Lions ended a streak off 11-straight wins, each by a 14-point margin.
- Penn State snapped a 13-game streak of scoring at least 30 points. It was the longest active streak in the nation.
- Dating back to the Rutgers game in 2022, Penn State had scored in 38-straight quarters until being shutout in the third quarter. It was the longest active streak in the nation.
- Penn State recorded two sacks, snapping an 11-game streak of at least three sacks.
- · Penn State held the Buckeyes to 79 rushing yards.
- The Nittany Lions recorded nine tackles for loss, including two tackles for loss each by CB Johnny Dixon and DE Adisa Isaac and 1.5 tackles for loss by CB Kalen King.

## **UMASS POSTGAME NOTES**

- The Nittany Lions are 74-24-5 in homecoming games, including wins in 14 of the last 17 contests.
- The 63-0 final score marked the largest shutout by Penn State since joining the Big Ten and the largest shutout win since an 81-0 win vs. Cincinnati in 1991.
- Penn State recorded 63 points for the second time this season, the first time the Nittany Lions have scored at least 63 in two games in a season since 2018 (63 vs. Kent State; 63 vs. Illinois).
- The Nittany Lions recorded their second consecutive home shutout, marking the first time that Penn State has shut out its opponent in consecutive home games since 1981, when they shut out Cincinnati (52-0) and Temple (30-0).
- The seven points allowed in the past three home games are the fewest allowed by Penn State in three-straight home games since holding Cincinnati (0), Temple (0), and Boston College (7) to a total of seven points in three-straight home games in 1981.
- In the first half, Penn State recorded more sack yards (32) than UMass had total yards (26).
- Penn State registered 10 tackles for loss and five sacks in the first half.
- PR Daequan Hardy returned a punt 56 yards for a touchdown in the first quarter and added a 68-yard punt return touchdown in the third quarter, becoming the first player in school history to record multiple punt returns for a touchdown in a single game.
- Since 2000, Hardy is the 25th FBS player to return two punt returns for touchdowns in a game. He is one of two Big Ten players joining lowa's Kevonte Martin-Manley (vs. Western Michigan, 2013).

## NORTHWESTERN POSTGAME NOTES

- Penn State extended its win streak to six games against Big Ten West teams.
- The Nittany Lions have won nine of the last 11 matchups in the series against Northwestern.
- The Nittany Lions limited Northwestern to -10 rushing yards on 16 carries in the first half and 45 rushing yards in the game.
- Penn State tallied 12 tackles for loss and seven sacks.

- Penn State recorded a shutout against an AP Top 25 team for the first time since the 1999 Alamo Bowl against No. 18 Texas A&M (24-0).
- Penn State held the ball for 45:27 to lowa's time of possession of 14:33. In the second half, Penn State held the ball for 24:14 to lowa's 5:46 (13:26 to 1:34 in the third quarter).
- Penn State had 97 offensive plays to 33 for lowa. According to TruMediaSports, in the past five seasons, no other FBS team has out-snapped its opponent by 60+ plays.
- Penn State held lowa to four first downs, the fewest allowed by the Nittany Lions in a Big Ten game.
- The Nittany Lions limited the Hawkeyes to just five plays in Penn State territory.
- After allowing lowa to get one first down on each of its first two possessions in the first quarter, Penn State held lowa without a first down for the next seven drives.
- Penn State held lowa to 76 yards of offense, the fewest ever allowed by Penn State in a Big Ten game.
- LB Curtis Jacobs recovered a fumble in the first quarter and recovered a muffed punt in the second quarter, becoming the first Penn State player to recover two fumbles in a game since Mark D'Onofrio against Temple on October 5, 1991.
- After lowa's first fumble of the game (9:09 first quarter), Penn State held the ball for 80 of the next 96 plays. lowa had -5 yards over its 16 plays.

## **ILLINOIS POSTGAME NOTES**

- The Nittany Lions improved to 17-14 all-time in Big Ten openers and 19-12 in Big Ten road openers.
- Penn State scored 20 points off turnovers, including its first 13 points of the game.
- In the third quarter, RB Trey Potts threw an 11-yard touchdown pass to TE Tyler Warren.
- Potts became Penn State's 11th non-quarterback (12 occasions) to throw for a touchdown.
- The Nittany Lions forced turnovers on three-straight possessions (two fumbles, one interception) in the first quarter.
- Penn State forced takeaways on three-straight possessions for the first time since 2016 at Indiana (three fumbles).

## HOME SWEET HOME

- With a 315-80 all-time record in Beaver Stadium, Penn State owns the sixth-best record in its venue amongst current FBS schools and leads the Big Ten.
- Penn State averaged 107,379 fans in seven games at Beaver Stadium in 2022, marking the fifth-highest average attendance in program history and the highest mark since 2008 (108,254).
- The Nittany Lions welcomed 110,747 fans to Beaver Stadium against West Virginia, marking the fourth-highest crowd in its history and the most since Sept. 29, 2018 against Ohio State (110,889).
- The 2023 Penn State White Out attendance was 110,830, which is the second-largest crowd in Beaver Stadium history behind only the 110,889 from the 2018 Penn State White Out game against Ohio State.
- Only Alabama (.840) and Oklahoma (.816) have higher winning percentages in facilities older than Beaver Stadium.

## WEST VIRGINIA POSTGAME NOTES

- The Nittany Lions have won five-straight matchups in the series and 33 of the last 35 contests.
- Penn State is now 122-13-1 all-time in home openers, including wins in 20 of the last 22, and 113-22-2 all-time in season openers.
- QB Drew Allar became the first Penn State quarterback to throw for at least 300 yards in a season opener since Christian Hackenberg (454 vs. UCF) in 2014 and the first Penn State quarterback to throw for at least 300 yards in his first career start since Michael Robinson (379 vs. Wisconsin) in 2003.
- The Nittany Lions stopped West Virginia on three fourth-down conversion attempts.

## LIONS UNDER THE LIGHTS

- The 2023 season marks the 23rd-straight with at least one regular-season night game on the schedule.
- Penn State will play at least three night games in 2023.
- The Nittany Lions opened the 2023 season against West Virginia with a 7:30 p.m. kickoff on NBC. Penn State earned a 38-15 win.
- Penn State tallied a 31-0 win against Iowa in the annual Penn State White Out Game. It was broadcast at 7:30 p.m. on CBS.
- The Nittany Lions will close out the regular season on Friday, Nov. 24 against Michigan State with a 7:30 p.m. kickoff on NBC.
- Penn State is 61-32 at night all-time. The figure breaks down to 21-11 at home, 28-14 on the road and 12-7 in neutral site games. Penn State is 1-1 at regular season neutral sites, 11-6 in bowl games and 1-0 in conference championship games.
- In 2019, Penn State played its most regular season night games in program history with four primetime tilts.
- On Oct. 12, 2013, the Lions claimed the longest game in Big Ten history when they edged Michigan under the lights, 43-40, in four overtimes in front of a sellout Beaver Stadium crowd of 107,844 on Homecoming.

## ON TV

- Penn State has had 356 of its last 358 games televised, including 252 consecutive games.
- Over the last 15 seasons, every Penn State game has aired on either ABC, BTN, CBS, NBC, Peacock or an ESPN or FOX channel.
- Penn State has made 335 regular season TV appearances since 1995, which is tied for the national lead.
- The Penn State-Ohio State matchup drew 9.96 million viewers. It is the third-most watched game this season and the mostwatched game between two Big Ten schools.
- Penn State's game against Delaware was streamed on Peacock, the Nittany Lions' first ever exclusively on a streaming platform.
- Penn State's matchup in the 2023 Rose Bowl Game against Utah drew 10.19 million viewers as the most-watched bowl game outside of the College Football Playoff.

## OVERTIME OVER TIME

- College football introduced overtime during the bowl season in 1995 and adopted it for regular season games in 1996. Since then, Penn State has played 15 overtime games, including six over the 2012-14 seasons.
- Ten of the 15 overtime tilts have come at home, three in true road games, one in the 2006 Orange Bowl and one in the 2014 Pinstripe Bowl.
- Penn State is 8-7 all-time in overtime games, with a 5-5 record at Beaver Stadium, 1-2 mark in true road games and 2-0 in contests at a neutral site.
- Penn State's first two overtime contests came vs. Iowa in 2000 and 2002 at home. The Nittany Lions dropped their first three contests that went to the extra period, but won five straight overtime contests before falling to Nebraska on Nov. 23, 2013.

- Fashanu is also a semifinalist for the Lombardi Award, which goes annually to the college football offensive or defensive lineman who exemplifies the character and discipline of NFL Hall of Fame Head Coach Vince Lombardi in addition to outstanding performance and ability.
- Junior LB Curtis Jacobs was tabbed as one of 12 semifinalists for the Butkus Award, which is annually given to the top linebacker in college football.

# **OFFENSIVE** NOTES

- Since the start of the 2016 season, Penn State's offense is second in the Big Ten in scoring offense (34.87; 11th nationally) and total offense (420.29; 36th), and is third in touchdown percentage (31.94; 20th), points per possession (2.19; 18th), scoring percentage (40.95; 22nd), yards per pass attempt (7.76; 36th) and yards per play (5.96; 44th).
- Penn State's offense has been explosive since the 2016 campaign, as it leads the Big Ten in 80-plus yard play percentage (0.19; 2nd nationally) and 70-plus (0.37; 6th) and holds third in 20-plus (7.36; 32nd), 30-plus (3.40; 35th), 40-plus (1.85; 26th), 50-plus (0.92: 45th) and 60-plus (0.51; 34th).
- The Nittany Lions have tallied at least 55 plays of 20 or more yards in seven of the last eight seasons (86 in 2022; 57 in 2021; 63 in 2019; 73 in 2018; 85 in 2017; 91 in 2016; 67 in 2015). PSU had 52 plays of 20 or more yards in 2020 (9-game schedule).
- Additionally, the Nittany Lions are fourth in the Big Ten and 23rd nationally in 15-plus yard passing play percentage since 2016 (18.88 percent).
- Penn State has posted 50+ points three times this season and 40+ points four times.
- Against Ohio State, the Nittany Lions snapped its streak of 30+ points to 13-straight games, the nation's longest active streak entering the game.
- It marked the third time in Big Ten history a team has strung together 13 or more games of 30+ points, joining Penn State (15; 1993-94) and Ohio State (15; 2014-15).
- The only other time Penn State went 13-straight games with 30+ points in program history was 1993-94, when it scored 30+ points in a school-record 15-straight games.
- Dating back to the Rutgers game in 2022, Penn State had scored in 38-straight quarters until being shutout in the third quarter against Ohio State. It was the longest active streak in the nation.
- Against Indiana, Penn State snapped a streak of 11-straight games without throwing an interception.
- Since 2014, Penn State is 44-1 when leading by 10+ points at halftime.
- Before an interception on his 29th pass attempt of the game, QB Drew Allar tallied 311 pass attempts without an interception to start his career. Allar's 311 pass attempts without an interception to start his career is an FBS record, bettering Baylor's Robert Griffin III's 209 attempts in 2008.
- The Ohio native began the 2023 season with 251 pass attempts without an interception. Since 2000, his 251 pass attempts without an interception are the sixth-most to start a season, trailing only Louisiana Tech's Colby Cameron (428: 2012). Oregon's Marcus Mariota (285; 2013), Western Kentucky's Tyrrell Pigrome (278; 2020), NC State's Ryan Finley (274; 2017) and West Virginia's Geno Smith (273; 2012).
- Allar is the only Big Ten quarterback, since 2000, to start a season with 175+ pass attempts and no interceptions.
- Penn State is first in the nation in turnovers lost (4)
- Penn State has surpassed 200 yards rushing 41 times in the James Franklin era. PSU is 36-5 in those games.
- Since 2014, Penn State has recorded 200 passing yards on 80 occasions. Penn State is 60-20 in those games.

- · Since 2014, Penn State has tallied 400 total yards on 67 occasions. Penn State is 55-12 in those games.
- Since the start of the 2022 season, Penn State is first in the nation in turnover margin, averaging a +1.27 margin (2.09 gained per game; 0.82 lost per game).
- Over the last two seasons, Penn State is averaging 9.18 points per game off turnovers, ranking first in the nation, and has 78 points off turnovers in 2023.
- In 2023, Penn State ranks sixth in the nation in scoring offense and second in the Big Ten in scoring offense (40.2 ppg).
- Penn State is third in the nation in fourth down conversion percentage (84.2) and time of possession (33:59).
- The Nittany Lions have tallied 215 first downs, holding 17th in the country.
- Penn State is 45-of-47 in the red zone for a 95.7 conversion percentage, sitting sixth in the nation.
- Against Iowa, Penn State held the ball for 45:27 to the Hawkeyes' 14:33 time of possession. In the second half, Penn State held the ball for 24:14 to Iowa's 5:46.
- Penn State had 97 offensive plays to 33 for Iowa. According to TruMediaSports, in the past five seasons, no other FBS team has out-snapped its opponent by 60+ plays.
- The 97 plays by the Nittany Lions were the most since Penn State ran 99 offensive plays at lowa in 2017.
- Penn State scored on drives of 17, 10, 15 and 12 plays against the Hawkeyes. The last time Penn State had four scoring drives of 10+ plays was against Ohio State in 2021.
- At Maryland, TE Theo Johnson and TE Tyler Warren both had touchdown grabs in the first half. It marked the fourth game this season that Penn State had multiple tight ends with touchdown receptions in a game.
- Mike Yurcich is in his third season as Penn State's offensive coordinator/guarterbacks coach.
- Yurcich (California University (Pa.)) and Franklin (East Stroudsburg) both played in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC).
- As an FBS offensive coordinator, offenses under Yurcich have averaged 6.27 yards per play, ranking first among OC's since 2013 and 13.43 yards per completion, which is also first in that time frame.
- Since 2013, Yurcich's offenses have scored 50 or more points 30 times and 40 or more points 61 times (44.5 percent of games coached), both of which are tops among FBS offensive coordinators since 2013.
- · His teams have averaged an FBS-best 57.09 touchdowns per year and 30.55 passing touchdowns per season.
- · Penn State has scored 40 points 31 times since 2016. By comparison, from 2008 until 2015, the Nittany Lions had 18 40-point outings.

## **QUARTERBACK NOTES**

- Offensive coordinator Mike Yurcich also heads the Penn State quarterback room.
- Four quarterbacks Yurcich coached in college are currently on NFL rosters (Sean Clifford - Penn State, Sam Ehlinger – Texas, Justin Fields – Ohio State, Mason Rudolph – Oklahoma State).
- Yurcich served as the passing game coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Ohio State in 2019, where quarterback Justin Fields was a finalist for the Heisman Trophy, Walter Camp Player of the Year Award and Davey O'Brien Award.
- Sophomore quarterback Drew Allar is on the Davey O'Brien Award watch list.
- Through nine games in 2023, Allar has completed 62.8 percent of his passes for 1,895 yards and 20 touchdowns, while rushing for three scores.
- His 20 touchdown passes are tied 11th in a season at Penn State.
- Since 2000, Allar is the only Big Ten quarterback who has thrown 13+ touchdowns and no interceptions through the first seven games of a season.
- Allar is the first quarterback in Penn State history to throw for 10 or more touchdowns before throwing an interception in a season.
- In his career, Allar's 62.1 completion percentage (191-of-314) is first all-time at Penn State (minimum 200 pass attempts).
- Allar's 62.8 completion percentage (181-of-288) in 2023 ranks fifth in a season at Penn State (minimum 100 pass attempts).

- Allar ranks second in the Big Ten in completions per game (20.11) and passing touchdowns (20), fourth in total passing yards (1,895), passing yards per game (210.6) and passing efficiency (140.3) and fifth in completion percentage (62.8) and total offense per game (221.7).
- Allar has seven career games with multiple touchdown passes, five games with three or more touchdown passes and two games with four touchdown passes.
- He has five career 200-yard passing games and one 300-yard passing game.
- The Ohio native owns three career games with both a passing and rushing touchdown.
- In his first career start, against West Virginia, Allar completed 21-of-29 passes for 325 yards and three touchdowns.

- The Ohio native set a career high with four passing touchdowns against lowa, while completing 25 passes for 166 yards.
- At Northwestern, Allar completed 18-of-33 passes for 189 yards and a touchdown, while adding a 1-yard rushing score.
- He completed 16-of-23 passes for 162 yards and three touchdowns, while adding a rushing score, against UMass.
- At Ohio State, Allar threw for 191 yards and a touchdown, while throwing a career-high 42 pass attempts.
- Allar threw completed 20-of-31 passes for 210 yards and three touchdowns against Indiana.
- At Maryland, he completed 25-of-34 passes for 240 yards and four touchdowns. He tied career highs with 25 completions and four touchdown passes.
- He had a career-long 21-yard run and finished the game with a career-best 39 rushing yards.
- Quarterback Beau Pribula also enters his second season with the Nittany Lions after redshirting his rookie season.
- In 2023, Pribula has completed seven passes for 81 yards and two touchdowns, while rushing for 240 yards and four scores.
- Pribula ranks fourth among Big Ten quarterbacks with 240 rushing yards.
- Against WVU, Pribula scored on a 5-yard touchdown run.
- In the Delaware game, Pribula completed 3-of-5 passes for 22 yards and a touchdown. He added 46 yards and a touchdown on eight carries.
- At Northwestern, Pribula completed his only pass attempt to RB Trey Potts for a 30-yard touchdown.
- Pribula had a career-high 59 yards rushing against UMass, including a 31-yard touchdown run. The 31-yard run was the longest rush of his career.
- The Pennsylvania native scored on a 6-yard run at Maryland.
- Freshman Jaxon Smolik made his collegiate debut in the Delaware contest.
- The youthful quarterback room replaces Sean Clifford, who finished his career as Penn State's all-time leader in wins as a starting quarterback (32), completion percentage (.614), completions (833), passing yards (10,661), total yards (11,734), passing touchdowns (86) and pass attempts (1,356).
- Additionally, Clifford closed his career finishing third in passing efficiency (143.8), tied for sixth in yards per passing attempt (7.9) and eighth in touchdown percentage (6.34).
- A fifth-round draft pick by the Green Bay Packers, Clifford finished fourth in Big Ten history in career touchdown passes (86), fifth in passing yardage (10,661) and seventh in completions (833).

# ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- The Nittany Lions had 32 players selected as Academic All-Big Ten in Fall 2022.
- Sean Clifford was a 2021 National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athlete and finalist for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman". He is the 19th Nittany Lion to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- Penn State posted its first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May 2020.
- Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).

- Entering the 2023 season, five Nittany Lions have earned a collegiate degree.
- Smith Vilbert graduated in August 2023 with his bachelor's degree in telecommunications and media studies.

## **RUNNING BACKS NOTES**

- Co-offensive coordinator/running backs coach Ja'Juan Seider has 15 years of college coaching experience, including 12 at the Power Five level.
- As a player at Florida A&M, Seider won the Doug Williams Award for National Offensive Player of the Year, Jake Gaither Award (considered the Heisman Trophy of Historically Black Colleges) and earned All-America honors after throwing for 2,622 yards and 27 touchdowns and rushing for 740 yards and 14 touchdowns in 1999.
- A loaded running back room is led by dynamic sophomores Kaytron Allen and Nicholas Singleton and redshirt senior Trey Potts.
- Allen (1,440), Singleton (1,541) and Potts (1,302) each have over 1,300 career rushing yards.
- Penn State is one of seven FBS teams, and the only Big Ten team, with three career 1,300-yard rushers on its roster.
- In 2022, Singleton (1,061 rushing yards) and Allen (867 rushing yards) became the first freshmen teammates in Big Ten history to both rush for 700+ rushing yards in a season.
- Since 2000, Allen and Singleton are one of two FBS freshman duos to each rush for 850+ yards in a season, joining West Virginia's Steve Slaton (1,128) and Pat White (952) in 2005.
- Allen and Singleton are both on the Doak Walker Award watch list, while Singleton is also on watch lists for the Maxwell Award, Paul Hornung Award and Walter Camp Player of the Year Award.
- Singleton was also named a second-team preseason All-American by Sporting News and a Pro Football Focus Preseason All-America honorable mention.
- He was selected as a True Freshman All-American by On3, 247Sports and College Football News in 2022.
- Singleton was named the Big Ten Thompson-Randle El Freshman of the Year and was selected third-team All-Big Ten by the coaches and media and was also tabbed the AP Big Ten Newcomer of the Year.
- Allen was an honorable mention All-Big Ten selection in 2022 by the media and was a True Freshman All-American by College Football News.
- Singleton owns 1,541 career rushing yards, ranking 28th alltime at Penn State, and 19 career rushing touchdowns.
- He ranks third in the Big Ten in rushing touchdowns (7), fourth in all-purpose yards per game (100.67) and total touchdowns (8), eighth in rushing yards per game (53.3) and 10th in total rushing yards (480).
- The sophomore started the 2023 season with 70 rushing yards and a 2-yard touchdown rush against West Virginia.
- Against Delaware, Singleton scored a career-high three rushing touchdowns.
- He found the end zone on a 2-yard rushing touchdown on Penn State's opening drive of the game, and a pair of 5-yard scores in the second quarter, marking his sixth career game with multiple rushing touchdowns.
- At Illinois, Singleton scored on a 16-yard rush in the fourth quarter, while adding a career-high 49 receiving yards on three catches and 54 kick return yards for a total of 140 allpurpose yards.
- Against lowa, Singleton gained 49 yards on the ground and added a pair of catches.
- Singleton tallied a team-high 21 carries and 80 rushing yards at Northwestern, tying a career high for carries.
- Against the Wildcats, the sophomore scored on a 1-yard run in the fourth quarter and a 2-yard reception in the third quarter, giving him his first career game with both a rushing and receiving touchdown.
- He had a career-high six receptions for 39 yards in the contest.
- Singleton gained a team-high 79 rushing yards against UMass.
- In the UMass game, Singleton surpassed 2,000 career allpurpose yards. He has 2,401 all-purpose yards.
- At Ohio State, he gained a team-high 49 yards, including a 20yard run in the first quarter.
- Singleton tallied 50 rushing yards and a 2-yard score against Indiana, while adding five receptions for 31 yards.

- Singleton owns 13 career runs of 20+ yards.
- Singleton rushed for 1,061 yards as a freshman, trailing only Saquon Barkley (1,076; 2015) for the most by a Penn State freshman, and set a PSU freshman record with 12 rushing touchdowns in 2022.
- Allen has 1,440 career rushing yards and 14 career rushing touchdowns.
- In 2023, Allen ranks fifth in the Big Ten in rushing yards per game (63.7) and yards per carry (4.82) and seventh in total rushing yards (573).
- Against West Virginia, he rushed for 51 yards on 10 carries.
- In the Delaware game, Allen rushed for 103 yards on 19 carries, marking his third career 100-yard rushing game. Allen scored on a 4-yard rushing touchdown in the first quarter.
- During the opening drive of the third quarter, he went over the 1,000 career rushing yards mark. He became the 49th Penn State player to reach 1,000 career rushing yards.
- Allen rushed for a team-high 54 yards at Illinois and scored on a 4-yard rushing touchdown in the second quarter.
- Allen led PSU with 72 rushing yards against lowa. He added three receptions.
- Against UMass, Allen tallied 68 rushing yards and a 9-yard touchdown, while averaging 7.6 yards per carry.
- Allen rushed for a team-high 81 yards, averaging 4.5 per carry, against the Hoosiers.
- He ran for a team-high 91 yards on 14 carries, including a 10yard score, at Maryland.
- Potts joined the Nittany Lions in Summer 2023 after transferring from Minnesota.
- In his collegiate career, Potts owns 1,302 rushing yards and 13 touchdowns on 259 carries in 33 games (five starts).
- In 2023, he has rushed for 107 yards (5.4 yards per carry) and two touchdowns, while adding three receptions for 52 yards and a score.
- Potts is one of five FBS players in 2023 with a passing, rushing and receiving touchdown joining Kansas State's Will Howard, Kansas State's Treshaun Ward, MTSU's Nicholas Vattiato and UCF's Timmy McClain.
- Potts had five carries against West Virginia in the 2023 opener.
- He rushed for 59 yards on seven carries, including a 20-yard rush, in the Delaware game.
- In the win at Illinois, Potts threw an 11-yard touchdown pass to Tyler Warren. Potts is Penn State's 11th non-quarterback (12 occasions) to throw for a touchdown.
- At Northwestern, Potts scored on a 13-yard run and a 30-yard reception. The rushing score was his first as a Nittany Lion and the receiving touchdown was the first of his collegiate career.
- It also marked his first career game with both a rushing and receiving touchdown.
- Scored on a 2-yard run against UMass.
- Redshirt senior Tank Smith has 39 career carries, including nine in 2023.
- Had a career-long 39-yard run against UMass, while totaling a career-high 41 yards.

- Co-offensive coordinator and tight ends coach **Ty Howle** is in his third season coaching the Penn State tight ends and his fourth season overall on the staff.
- Howle served as an offensive analyst in 2020, working closely with the offensive line and tight ends.
- He was a four-year letterwinner on the Penn State offensive line from 2009-13. He started at center and left guard and was a four-time Academic All-Big Ten selection. He was a team captain in 2013.
- In 2023, Penn State tight ends have combined for 50 receptions, 496 receiving yards and 12 touchdowns.
- Penn State's 12 receiving touchdowns by tight ends are the most of any FBS team this season.
- Penn State is the only FBS team with multiple tight ends owning 4+ receiving touchdowns this season.
- Juniors Theo Johnson (12) and Tyler Warren (4), and redshirt sophomore Khalil Dinkins (1) have combined for 17. 20-plus yard receptions in their careers.
- Johnson, who is on the Mackey Award watch list, has 67 receptions for 843 yards and nine touchdowns in his Penn State career.
- He made two grabs for 32 yards at Illinois, including a 19-yard reception in the first quarter and a 13-yard reception to setup a Penn State touchdown in the third quarter.
- The junior had a career-high six receptions for 42 yards in the win over lowa and caught a 34-yard pass at Ohio State.
- Johnson hauled in four catches for 66 yards and two touchdowns against UMass. He had a 30-yard touchdown grab and an 18-yard touchdown catch in the third quarter.
- He made a 16-yard touchdown grab against Indiana and a 2-yard touchdown catch at Maryland.
- Warren has 38 career receptions for 400 yards and 10 touchdowns, while adding two rushing scores.
- In 2023, Warren is tied second among FBS tight ends with six touchdown receptions.
- According to Coaches By The Numbers, Warren is tied first among tight ends in red zone catches (8) and red zone targets (12).
- His six touchdown receptions are fourth in the Big Ten.
- The junior had a career-high six receptions against Delaware, doubling his previous career high.
- Warren hauled in a 2-yard touchdown in the second quarter in the win over the Blue Hens.
- The Virginia native caught three passes for 35 yards and an 11yard touchdown at Illinois.
- Warren hauled in a pair of touchdowns against lowa. He caught a 2-vard touchdown midway through the third quarter and a 7-yard touchdown grab late in the third guarter.
- Against UMass, Warren had a 7-yard touchdown catch.
- At Maryland, Warren caught four passes for 51 yards and an 8-vard score.
- Dinkins made a 9-yard touchdown catch in the second quarter against lowa and a 9-yard touchdown grab against Indiana.

## WIDE RECEIVER NOTES

- Offensive recruiting coordinator/wide receivers coach Marques Hagans is in his first season on the Penn State staff.
- Hagans joined the Penn State staff after serving as the associate head coach/wide receivers coach at Virginia for the previous 11 years. He was promoted to Associate Head Coach for the Cavaliers prior to the 2022 season.
- During his time at Virginia, Hagans coached 10 of the top 15 career receptions leaders in program history.
- Hagans was a four-year letterman at Virginia from 2002-05 and currently sits No. 10 all-time in passing yards with 4,877. He also ranks seventh in total offense with 5,779 yards.
- He was selected, as a receiver, in the fifth round (144th overall) of the 2006 NFL Draft by the St. Louis Rams. He spent three seasons with the Rams before being picked up by the Kansas City Chiefs and Indianapolis Colts in 2008. Hagans spent the 2009 and 2010 campaigns with Washington.
- Redshirt senior Dante Cephas is a member of the Biletnikoff Award watch list.
- Junior KeAndre Lambert-Smith has started 36 career games and owns 124 receptions for 1,693 yards and 11 touchdowns in his career.
- His 1,693 receiving yards rank 18th in program history and his 124 career receptions are 13th all-time at Penn State.
- He is averaging 13.7 yards per catch in his career, good for 23rd among current FBS receivers with at least 120 career receptions.
- Lambert-Smith has 22 career receptions of 20+ yards and four touchdown receptions of 50+ yards.
- In 2023, Lambert-Smith ranks third in the Big Ten in receptions per game (5.7), receiving yards per game (71.7) and receiving yards (645) and eighth in receiving touchdowns (4).
- He has six games with at least five receptions this season.
- The Virginia native owns three career touchdown receptions of 70+ yards, with his 72-yard grab joining his 83-yard touchdown against Villanova in 2021 and his 88-yard touchdown reception against Utah in the 2023 Rose Bowl.
- Lambert-Smith is the only receiver in Penn State history with multiple 80-yard receptions.
- · Against West Virginia, Lambert-Smith caught four passes for 123 yards and a career-best two touchdowns. He averaged 30.75 vards per reception.
- He hauled in a 72-yard touchdown reception on the opening drive. He added a 12-yard touchdown grab and a 30-yard reception.
- In the WVU game, Lambert-Smith recorded his second career 100-yard receiving game.
- Lambert-Smith made a career-high eight receptions against lowa, tallying 66 receiving yards and hauling in a 3-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter.
- The junior made grabs of 25 and 35 yards, while totaling four catches for 86 yards, at Northwestern.
- He caught a team-high six passes for 52 yards at Ohio State.

- A two-time first-team All-MAC selection, Cephas has collected 162 receptions, 2,338 receiving yards and 14 touchdowns in his collegiate career.
- He ranks 21st among active FBS receivers with 2,338 career receiving yards and his 14.4 yards per catch sit fifth among current FBS receivers with at least 160 career receptions.
- · The redshirt senior is one of 17 current FBS receivers with 160+ receptions, 2,330+ receiving yards and 14+ receiving touchdowns
- Cephas has 10 career 100-yard receiving games and had a reception in 32-straight games before the streak was snapped against UMass.
- In his Penn State debut, against West Virginia, Cephas made a 22-yard grab, followed by two catches for 36 yards, including a 26-yard grab, against Delaware.
- The Pittsburgh native had two catches for 21 yards at Northwestern. He caught two passes for 28 yards against the Buckeyes and had two catches against Indiana.
- Cephas recorded six catches for 53 yards and two touchdowns at Maryland, hauling in scores of 6 and 15 yards. It was his second career game with multiple receiving touchdowns.
- Junior Malik McClain arrived in Happy Valley after transferring from Florida State
- Against WVU, McClain had a career-best 58 yards, including 25-yard touchdown reception in the fourth guarter, and tied a career high with four receptions.
- McClain has 38 receptions for 460 yards and six touchdowns in his career.
- Redshirt sophomore Harrison Wallace III earned his first career start in the West Virginia game.
- He has 34 catches for 434 yards and a touchdown in his career.
- Wallace recorded a career-high seven receptions and 72 receiving yards against the Mountaineers.
- He added three catches for 26 yards against Delaware and three receptions for 44 yards against UMass.
- Wallace made catches of 27 and 20 yards in the 2023 Rose Bowl Game against Utah.

# OFFENSIVE LINE NOTES Offensive line coach Phil Trautwein enters his fourth season

- Offensive line coach **Phil Trautwein** enters his fourth seasor at Penn State.
- He was named to the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Class of 2021"35 Under 35"list, recognizing the top-35 football coaches under the age of 35. He was the only Big Ten coach and the only offensive line coach on the 2021 list.
- In his four seasons at Penn State, Trautwein has helped 12 offensive linemen earn All-Big Ten honors, including five in 2022.
- He's coached 22 All-Conference selections over the last six seasons, which includes a stint at Boston College as the offensive line coach.
- Trautwein was a two-time All-SEC selection and two-time team captain as a left tackle at Florida, earning first-team honors in 2008 and second-team accolades in 2006.
- He was part of the Gators winning the BCS National Championship and SEC titles in the 2006 and 2008 seasons.
- Six Nittany Lion offensive linemen own at least five career starts.
- Junior Olumuyiwa Fashanu has appeared in 26 games and made 19 starts at left tackle.
- He has allowed no sacks and nine pressures in 304 pass blocking snaps this season.
- Fashanu, a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy, owns an impressive 3.45 GPA in the supply chain and information systems major through Penn State's Smeal College of Business.
- He is also a semifinalist for the Lombardi Award and a member of the Outland Trophy and Walter Camp Player of the Year Award watch lists and was also selected Preseason All-America first team by the Associated Press and Pro Football Focus.
- Following the Iowa game, Fashanu was named the Outland Trophy National Player of the Week.
- Redshirt senior Hunter Nourzad was an honorable mention All-Big Ten selection by the coaches and media in his first season in Happy Valley.
- Nourzad owns 37 collegiate starts and 40 career appearances.
- According to PFF, Nourzad has not given up a sack on 310 pass plays in 2023.
- Redshirt senior tackle Caedan Wallace has 36 starts and owns 43 career appearances.
- According to PFF, Wallace has allowed just one sack in 266 pass plays.
- Redshirt senior Sal Wormley has started 22 games in 26 appearances.
- According to PFF, Wormley has allowed just one sack in 288 pass plays.
- Wormley (coaches, media) was an honorable mention All-Big Ten selection in 2022.
- Redshirt junior **JB Nelson** made his first career start against West Virginia.
- Redshirt freshman Olaivavega loane earned his first career start against Delaware.
- Sophomore Drew Shelton has appeared in 15 games and made five starts.
- Through nine games in 2023, the Nittany Lions' offensive line has allowed just six sacks, according to Pro Football Focus.
- In 2023, Penn State ranks sixth in the nation in scoring offense and second in the Big Ten in scoring offense (40.2 ppg).
- Penn State is third in the nation in fourth down conversion percentage (84.2) and time of possession (33:59).
- The Nittany Lions have tallied 215 first downs, holding 17th in the country.
- Penn State is 45-of-47 in the red zone for a 95.7 conversion percentage, sitting sixth in the nation.
- The Nittany Lions are 25th in sacks allowed per game (1.33) and 17th in tackles for loss per game (4.2).
- Penn State did not allow a sack against Delaware or lowa.
- The Nittany Lions have tallied at least 400 yards in four games this season.

## **DEFENSIVE** NOTES

- Manny Diaz is in his second season as Penn State's defensive coordinator and linebackers coach and was a Broyles Award semifinalist in 2022.
- Diaz, who has 25 years of collegiate coaching experience, including three as a head coach and 14 as a defensive coordinator, joined PSU after spending six seasons (2016-21) at Miami, including three seasons as head coach (2019-21), where he coached the Hurricanes to three bowl appearances.
- Through nine games in 2023, Penn State leads the country in rushing defense (60.3) and sacks per game (4.22).
- The Nittany Lions rank second in the nation in first downs defense (118), total defense (234.2), fumbles recovered (10) and takeaways (20), while sitting third in scoring defense (11.9).
- Penn State sits fourth in the country in tackles for loss per game (8.4), eighth in third down conversion defense (28.7), ninth in passing efficiency defense (109.24), 12th in passing defense (173.9) and 19th in interceptions (10).
- Through nine games, 24 Nittany Lions have recorded at least one tackle for loss and 19 have recorded at least one sack.
- Among FBS teams, Penn State has the most players (19) with at least 1.0 sacks this season, while Penn State and Texas State are the only teams with 24+ players with at least 1.0 tackles for loss this year.
- After the Maryland game, Penn State has held eight-straight opponents under 100 rushing yards (Delaware, 82; Illinois, 78; lowa, 20; Northwestern, 45; UMass, 64; Ohio State, 79; Indiana, 80; Maryland, -49).
- The eight-straight games holding opponents under 100 rushing yards is the nation's longest active streak.
- Since the start of the 2022 season, Penn State has held 17 opponents under 100 rushing yards, tied-most in the FBS.
- Against Indiana, Penn State snapped a streak of 16-straight games with at least five tackles for loss.
- Against Ohio State, the Nittany Lions snapped a streak of at least three sacks in 11-straight games.
- Over the last two seasons, Penn State has held opponents to under a 50 completion percentage in nine games, the nation's third-most in that span.
- Over the last two seasons, the Nittany Lions have allowed under 10 completions in four games, tied fourth-most in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2022 season, Penn State has forced 46 turnovers (24 interceptions, 22 fumbles), tied-second in the nation.
- Penn State's 22 fumbles recovered over the last two seasons are tied-second in the nation and most in the Big Ten, while the 24 interceptions are tied 17th.
- Penn State has recorded three or more takeaways in nine games over the last two seasons, tied-most among FBS teams.
- Over the last two seasons, Penn State is 12-0 when forcing multiple takeaways in a game.
- Since the start of the 2022 season, Penn State is first in the nation in turnover margin, averaging a +1.27 margin (2.09 gained per game; 0.82 lost per game).
- At Illinois, Penn State forced five takeaways, including four interceptions and a fumble recovery.
- The Nittany Lions forced turnovers on three-straight possessions (two fumbles, one interception) in the first quarter.
- Penn State held lowa to four first downs, the fewest ever allowed by Penn State in a Big Ten game.
- After allowing lowa to get one first down on each of its first two
  possessions in the first quarter, Penn State held lowa without a
  first down for the next seven drives and limited the Hawkeyes
  to just five plays in Penn State territory.
- Penn State held lowa to 76 yards of offense, the fewest ever allowed by Penn State in a Big Ten game, and just 33 plays, giving up 2.3 yards per play.
- The Nittany Lions held lowa to 20 yards rushing and 56 passing yards. Penn State held lowa to just one third-down conversion on nine attempts.

- Jacobs recovered a fumble in the first quarter and a muffed punt in the second quarter, becoming first Penn State player to recover two fumbles in a game since Mark D'Onofrio against Temple on October 5, 1991.
- The Nittany Lions limited Northwestern to -10 rushing yards on 16 carries in the first half.
- Penn State recorded 12 tackles for loss against the Wildcats.
- DT Zane Durant secured a career-high three tackles for loss and became Penn State's first defensive tackle to record three or more tackles for loss against a Big Ten opponent since Curtis Cothran against Wisconsin in 2016.
- Against UMass, the Nittany Lions recorded their second consecutive home shutout, marking the first time that Penn State has shut out its opponent in consecutive home games since 1981, when they shut out Cincinnati (52-0) and Temple (30-0).
- Against Indiana, DE Dani Dennis-Sutton recorded a stripsack late in the fourth quarter, resulting in a safety. It was Penn State's first safety since the 2022 season opener vs. Ohio.
- Penn State limited Maryland to -49 rushing yards. Since 1947, the -49 rushing yards are the second-lowest allowed by a Penn State defense.
- The -49 rushing yards allowed are the fewest by an FBS team in a game this season. The previous low was Stanford allowing -5 rushing yards against Hawaii.
- Since 2014, Penn State is one of four FBS teams that have allowed -49 or fewer rushing yards in a game joining San Diego State (-66 vs. Middle Tennessee State, 12/24/22), Michigan State (-73 vs. Tulsa, 8/30/19) and Arizona State (-52 vs. Washington State, 10/22/16).
- Penn State held Maryland to -40 rushing yards on 11 attempts in the first half and -49 in the game. The -49 rushing yards are Penn State's lowest allowed under James Franklin.
- PSU held Maryland to 234 total yards. The 234 total yards are Maryland's lowest this season.
- The Nittany Lions forced three takeaways in the fourth quarter. The three takeaways came in a span of four plays.
- Over the last nine seasons, PSU sits second nationally in fewest passing TDs allowed per game (1.05), second in sacks per game (3.14; trailing only Clemson) and QB hurries (980), third in tackles for loss percentage (10.97), fourth in total pressures generated (1,506), sixth in fewest passing yards per attempt (6.22) and ninth in fewest rushing yards per attempt (3.47).
- Penn State's 345 sacks over the last nine years (2015-23) are fourth behind Clemson (395), Alabama (381) and Pitt (358).
- Over the last nine years, Penn State has accumulated a 8.82 percent sack percentage (345 sacks on 3,874 pass plays), which ranks second in the FBS.
- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents to seven or less points 28 times, tied fifth-most among FBS teams. Twenty of those 28 games have been against Big Ten opponents.
- Since 2015, Penn State has recorded 10 shutouts, tied secondmost among FBS teams. PSU also has the third-most shutouts (15) in the FBS since 2007.
- Penn State leads the FBS with seven shutouts against conference opponents since 2015.
- Since 2014, PSU has held an opponent under 300 total yards 56 times, tied seventh-most among FBS teams.
- Since 2014, the Nittany Lions have allowed less than 200
  passing yards in 69 games, eighth-most among FBS teams, and
  have held opponents under 100 passing yards in 20 games in
  that span, eighth-most among FBS teams.
- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents under 100 rushing yards on 56 occasions, tied seventh-most among FBS teams, and have held opponents under 50 rushing yards in 21 games, tied eighth-most among FBS teams.
- Penn State has registered 10 or more tackles for loss 31 times since 2014, third-most among FBS teams.
- Since 2014, Penn State has collected six or more sacks in a game 18 times, most among FBS teams.
- The Nittany Lions have forced multiple takeaways in a game on 54 occasions since 2014, including five times in 2023.

- **Deion Barnes** is in his first season heading the Nittany Lion defensive line corps. Barnes spent the previous three years on the Penn State staff as a graduate assistant working with the defensive line.
- · Barnes was a three-year letterwinner at defensive end for Penn State from 2012-14 and was named Big Ten Freshman of the Year in 2012.
- He helped coach 11 All-Big Ten defensive linemen, including three first-team selections and a second-team All-American in his first three seasons working with the Penn State defensive line.
- Through nine games in 2023, Penn State leads the country in rushing defense (60.3) and sacks per game (4.22).
- The Nittany Lions rank second in the nation in first downs defense (118), total defense (234.2), fumbles recovered (10) and takeaways (20), while sitting third in scoring defense (11.9)
- Penn State holds second in total sacks (38), fourth in tackles for loss per game (8.4) and fifth in total tackles for loss (76).
- · Through nine games, 24 Nittany Lions have recorded at least one tackle for loss and 19 have recorded at least one sack.
- The Penn State defensive line recorded three sacks, three forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries against lowa.
- Against Northwestern, Penn State registered 12 tackles for loss and seven sacks, while holding the Wildcats to 45 rushing yards in the game and -10 rushing yards in the first half.
- In the UMass game, Penn State registered 10 tackles for loss and five sacks in the first half, finishing the game with 14 tackles for loss and seven sacks.
- Redshirt senior DE Adisa Isaac has played in 42 games as a Nittany Lion, making 22 starts.
- He owns 76 tackles, 26 tackles for loss, 13.5 sacks, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery in his career.
- In 2023, Isaac owns 10.5 tackles for loss and 6.5 sacks, both team highs.
- Isaac ranks third in the Big Ten with 6.5 sacks and fourth with 10.5 tackles for loss, while sitting third in sacks per game (0.69) and fourth in tackles for loss per game (1.2).
- Isaac has six career games with multiple tackles for loss.
- Over the last two seasons, Isaac's five games with multiple tackles for loss are tied for most in the Big Ten.
- · Isaac collected four tackles, including a tackle for loss and a half-sack at Illinois.

COACHING STAFF CHANGES

- The Nittany Lion coaching staff has two new faces for the 2023 season with the addition of wide receivers coach/ offensive recruiting coordinator Margues Hagans and defensive line coach Deion Barnes.
- Hagans joined Penn State staff after serving as the Associate Head Coach/Wide Receivers Coach at Virginia for the previous 11 years.
- During his time at Virginia, Hagans coached 10 of the top 15 career receptions leaders in program history.
- Hagans was a four-year letterman at Virginia from 2002-05 and currently sits No. 10 all-time in passing yards with 4,877. He also ranks seventh in total offense with 5,779 vards.
- He was selected, as a receiver, in the fifth round (144th overall) of the 2006 NFL Draft by the St. Louis Rams.
- Barnes spent the previous three years on the Penn State staff as a graduate assistant working with the defensive line.
- Following a professional playing career in the NFL and the AAF, Barnes joined the Penn State coaching staff in 2020.
- During his three seasons working with the defensive line, Barnes helped coach 11 All-Big Ten defensive linemen, including three first-team selections and a second-team All-American.
- Barnes tutored defensive tackle PJ Mustipher, who was a two-time captain for the Nittany Lions and a three-time All-Big Ten honoree.
- During the 2022 season, Penn State led the Big Ten with 104 tackles for loss (T-4th nationally) and 42 sacks (T-6th).

## **CORNERBACKS** NOTES

- Terry M. Smith is in his 10th season as Penn State's cornerbacks coach. He is also the program's associate head coach and defensive recruiting coordinator.
- Smith has tutored a secondary which has seen 11 defensive backs taken in the NFL Draft since 2016, including two in 2023, tied for the fourth-most nationally.
- Joey Porter Jr. was selected 32nd overall by the Pittsburgh Steelers in the 2023 NFL Draft.
- Smith was a four-year letterwinner (1988-91) and three-year starter at wide receiver at Penn State. He ranks tied for 10th in career receiving touchdowns (15), 13th in career receiving yardage (1,825) and 14th in career receptions (108).
- Through nine games in 2023, Penn State leads the country in rushing defense (60.3) and sacks per game (4.22).
- The Nittany Lions rank second in the nation in first downs defense (118), total defense (234.2) and takeaways (20), while sitting third in scoring defense (11.9).
- Penn State sits third down conversion defense (28.7), ninth in passing efficiency defense (109.24), 12th in passing defense (173.9) and 19th in interceptions (10).
- Over the last two seasons, Penn State has held opponents to under a 50 completion percentage in nine games, the nation's third-most in that span.
- Over the last two seasons, the Nittany Lions have allowed under 10 completions in four games, tied fourth-most in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2022 season, Penn State has forced 46 turnovers (24 interceptions, 22 fumbles), tied-second in the nation.
- Penn State held lowa to four first downs, the fewest ever allowed by Penn State in a Big Ten game.
- Penn State held lowa to 76 yards of offense and just 33 plays, giving up 2.3 yards per play.
- Penn State held lowa 56 passing yards and just six completions.
- Penn State held lowa to just one third-down conversion on nine attempts.
- The Nittany Lions limited Northwestern to 175 total yards and 130 passing yards.
- Junior Kalen King begins the 2023 season on watch lists for the Bednarik Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy, Butkus Award, Lott IMPACT Trophy and Jim Thorpe Award.
- In his career, King has 78 tackles, 5.5 tackles for loss, three interceptions, 25 pass breakups, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery.

- He was named Preseason All-America first team by the Associated
  Press and Pro Football Focus.
- King recorded four tackles and a pass breakup at Illinois.
- King had six tackles and a career-high 1.5 tackles for loss at Ohio State.
- King registered three tackles and a pass breakup vs. Indiana.
- Senior Johnny Dixon has recorded 89 tackles, 10 tackles for loss, six sacks, four interceptions, 20 pass breakups, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery in his collegiate career.
- He leads FBS cornerbacks with three sacks in 2023.
- Dixon began the 2023 season with three solo tackles and two pass breakups against West Virginia.
- At Illinois, Dixon picked off a pass in the third quarter and returned it 21 yards, his longest career return.
- Dixon notched five tackles, including a career-high two tackles for loss at Ohio State. He added a solo sack and a pass breakup.
- Dixon posted a solo sack against Indiana and at Maryland.
- Redshirt senior Daequan Hardy has accounted for 51 tackles, 7.5 tackles for loss, 3.5 sacks, five interceptions, 20 pass breakups, and a forced fumble in his Penn State career.
- At Illinois, Hardy notched an interception in the first quarter.
- Hardy picked off a pass in the fourth quarter at Northwestern and returned it 34 yards for the longest return of his career.
- The Pittsburgh native broke up a career-high three passes, all in the first quarter, at Ohio State. He added a career-high six tackles and a half-tackle for loss.
- · Hardy registered a solo sack against Indiana.
- He posted a half-tackle for loss and a pass breakup at Maryland.
- According to Pro Football Focus, Hardy is allowing a 42.4 completion percentage when targeted and has forced six incompletions.
- Sophomore Cam Miller has totaled 21 tackles, three tackles for loss, two sacks and an interception in 20 games at Penn State.
- The Florida native picked off a pass in the third quarter at Illinois for his first career interception.
- Against UMass, Miller registered his first two career sacks and became Penn State's first defensive back to record multiple sacks in a game since Derek Bochna had two for the Nittany Lions at West Virginia in 1992.
- Freshman Zion Tracy made a key tackle on a fake punt attempt by Northwestern to help PSU to make back-to-back stops on fourth down tries.

## **LINEBACKERS** NOTES

- In addition to leading the defense, Manny Diaz also coaches the linebacker unit.
- · Penn State's linebacker corps returns a four-year veteran in Curtis Jacobs, an honorable mention All-Big Ten selection in 2022, who has played in 41 career games and made 32 starts.
- Jacobs, one of 12 semifinalists for the Butkus Award, owns 158 career tackles, 20 tackles for loss, eight sacks, a forced fumble, four fumble recoveries and two interceptions.
- Against West Virginia, Jacobs finished with a team-high 10 tackles, including seven solo, and a solo sack.
- In the lowa game, Jacobs recorded a solo tackle for loss and two fumble recoveries. He recovered a fumble in the first quarter and a muffed punt in the second quarter.
- Jacobs is the first Penn State player to recover two fumbles in a game since Mark D'Onofrio against Temple on October 5, 1991.
- The junior notched a team high-tying nine tackles, including a half-tackle for loss, at Ohio State.
- · Jacobs registered 1.5 tackles for loss at Maryland.
- · Sophomore Abdul Carter owns 90 tackles (53 solo), 13.5 tackles for loss, 8.5 sacks, two forced fumbles, an interception and seven pass breakups in his first two seasons in Happy Vallev.
- Carter started his 2023 campaign with a solo sack in the fourth quarter against West Virginia.
- Carter recorded his first career interception in the first quarter at Illinois and posted a career-high nine tackles and a pass breakup against the Buckeyes.
- · Carter secured a solo sack, a team-high six tackles and a pass breakup at Maryland.
- Redshirt sophomore Kobe King secured four tackles, a tackle for loss and his second career fumble recovery at Illinois.
- King tallied four tackles at Northwestern, including two tackles for loss and a solo sack in the first quarter.
- He had six tackles, including a half-sack, at Ohio State.
- Redshirt sophomore Dominic DeLuca is a Burlsworth Trophy nominee. The award honors the nation's most outstanding player who started his career as a walk-on.
- He registered a solo sack against West Virginia.
- DeLuca picked off a pass and returned it 26 yards for a touchdown against Delaware. It was his first career interception and PSU's first pick-six since Jacobs' interception return against Michigan.
- DeLuca tied for the team-lead with a career-high six tackles at Illinois. On a tackle for loss, DeLuca notched his first career forced fumble.
- Against Iowa, DeLuca forced a fumble in the fourth quarter, his second forced fumble in two weeks.
- DeLuca recorded an interception at Maryland, returning it 35 vards.
- Tony Rojas posted his first career tackle for loss, against • Delaware, and a career-high four tackles against UMass.
- At Maryland, Rojas caused turnovers on back-to-back possessions in the fourth quarter.
- He recorded his first career sack and forced fumble on a stripsack and picked off a pass, which he returned 20 yards.
- Redshirt freshman Keon Wylie had two tackles for loss and a sack at Maryland. He has three tackles for loss in 2023.

- Co-Defensive coordinator/safeties coach Anthony Poindexter is in his third season on the Nittany Lion coaching staff.
- · Poindexter has 19 years of collegiate coaching experience, including seven as a defensive or co-defensive coordinator.
- As a player, Poindexter, a two-time consensus All-American at Virginia and was chosen as the 1998 ACC Defensive Player of the Year.
- Poindexter was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2020
- The Nittany Lions held lowa to 56 passing yards and just six completions.
- Over the last two seasons, Penn State has held opponents to under a 50 completion percentage in nine games and have allowed under 10 completions in four games.
- Senior Keaton Ellis, a team captain, brings a wealth of experience to the Penn State secondary, having appeared in 52 career games, making 22 starts.
- In his career, Ellis owns 85 tackles (56 solo), three tackles for loss, four forced fumbles, one fumble recovery, two interceptions and 12 pass breakups.
- Ellis made three stops, all solo, against West Virginia and three tackles at Northwestern.
- The senior forced a fumble in the third quarter against Delaware and intercepted a pass against UMass.
- Junior Jaylen Reed has played in 30 contests and started nine games. He has tallied 69 tackles (49 solo), five tackles for loss, one sack, an interception and four pass breakups at Penn State.
- Reed made his first career start against WVU and finished the game with four tackles (three solo).
- · The Michigan native recorded his first career sack against Delaware. It was his third career tackle for loss.
- Reed had two tackles and a pass breakup vs. lowa and three tackles, including a half-tackle for loss, at Northwestern.
- The junior posted five tackles at Ohio State.
- · Reed set a career high with eight tackles vs. Indiana, including a solo tackle for loss in the second quarter.
- . He recorded his first career interception in the second guarter and returned it 17 vards to setup a field goal.

- Ten members of the Penn State coaching and support staffs played at Penn State.
- Associate head coach/cornerbacks coach Terry M. Smith was a three-year starter at wide receiver from 1989-91.
- Co-offensive coordinator and tight Ends Coach **Ty Howle** was a four-year letterwinner on the Penn State offensive line from 2009-13. He played in 47 career games, making 13 starts.
- Defensive line coach **Deion Barnes** made 31 starts as a Nittany Lion from 2012-14. In 2014, Barnes tallied 12.5 tackles for loss and six sacks. He led PSU with 10 tackles for loss and six sacks in 2012 to earn consensus freshman All-American honors.
- Defensive graduate assistant **Torrence Brown** was a threeyear letterman on the defensive line for the Nittany Lions (2015-17). He appeared in 30 career games, making seven starts.
- Defensive analyst **Dan Connor** was a two-time first-team All-America linebacker for Penn State in 2006 and 2007, the 14th Nittany Lion to be named a two-time first-team All-American. He finished his career as Penn State's all-time leader with 419 tackles.
- Offensive analyst Calvin Lowry was a first-team All-Big Ten safety for the Nittany Lions. He totaled nine career interceptions and was PSU's leading punt returner for three seasons.
- Assistant director of performance enhancement Tyrone Smith was a defensive tackle for Penn State and lettered during the 2014 season.
- Recruiting coordinator **Alan Zemaitis** letterman and three-time All-Big Ten selection for the blue and white from 2002-05. Zemaitis sits tied fifth all-time at Penn State with 12 career interceptions. He also holds fifth all-time at Penn State with 46 passes defended. Zemaitis helped the Nittany Lions to a Big Ten Championship in 2005.
- Director of Football Academic Services Todd Kulka lettered as a linebacker and graduated in 1995. He helped Penn State to a 9-3 record and an Outback Bowl victory in 1995.
- Director of the Football Letterman's Club **Wally Richardson** was a four-year letterman as a quarterback in 1992 and 1994-96. Richardson ranks 12th all-time at Penn State with 4,419 career passing yards. He also sits eighth all-time with 378 completions and 12th all-time with 27 touchdown passes.

## THREE ON HALL OF FAME BALLOT

- Penn State lettermen Ki-Jana Carter, D.J. Dozier and Paul Posluszny have been selected as a part of the national ballot for the National Football Foundation's College Hall of Fame's Class of 2024.
- Carter, a running back for the Nittany Lions, was a first-team All-American during the 1994 campaign. Carter staked a claim to being one of the most decorated Penn State running backs of all-time with a junior season in which he was fourth nationally in rushing (139.9), second in scoring (10.8 ppg) and fifth in allpurpose yardage (158.4).
- Dozier, a tailback for the Nittany Lions, matriculated to Happy Valley from Virginia Beach, Va. He earned first team All-America honors from the Walter Camp Football Foundation in 1986.
   Dozier is the only Nittany Lion to the lead the team in rushing four consecutive seasons, doing so from 1983-86.
- Posluszny, an outside linebacker for the Nittany Lions, was a first-team All-American in 2005 and 2006. Posluszny became just the second two-time winner of the Chuck Bednarik Award, presented to the nation's top defensive player, in 2006. In 2005, he also won the Butkus Award.

## SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- Stacy Collins is in his second season as Penn State's special teams coordinator/outside linebacker/nickels coach. Collins has 25 years of collegiate coaching experience.
- Last season, Collins helped Chris Stoll to win the Patrick Mannelly Award, honoring the nation's top long snapper.
- According to Coaches By The Numbers, since 2019, Penn State's kick return defense ranks second in percentage of kickoffs returned inside the 25 (75.4; 2nd in B1G), fifth in the nation in touchback percentage (72.6; 1st), sixth in the nation in percentage of kickoffs returned (18.4; 1st) and 13th in average opponent field position (25.3; 4th).
- Since 2019, Penn State's punt return defense is ranked fourth in the country in punts inside the 10 (18.1 percent; 3rd in B1G), fourth in punts inside the 20 (43.2; 3rd) and ninth in net punting (41.3; 3rd).
- Since 2017, Penn State has scored nine special teams touchdowns (four kick return, five punt return), ranking second in the Big Ten.
- Penn State is one of seven FBS schools that has not allowed a special teams touchdown since the start of the 2019 season (57-straight games).
- Senior K Alex Felkins transferred to Penn State from Columbia, where he earned his degree in psychology.
- Felkins owns five career games with three field goal makes.
- He has hit four career field goals of 50+ yards, 17 of 40+ yards and is 115-of-119 on extra points. He has 262 career points.
- Felkins converted a 46-yard field goal in the first quarter against lowa and a 47-yard kick at Northwestern.
- Felkins hit field goals of 40 and 41 yards at Ohio State, drilled a 50-yard field goal against Indiana and hit three field goals at Maryland.
- Senior P Riley Thompson, a member of the Ray Guy Award watch list, has placed 39 career punts inside the 20 and 12 punts inside the 10, while blasting 22 punts of 50+ yards in his career.
- He averaged 43.8 yards on six punts at Illinois, landing two punts inside the 20.
- At Northwestern, Thompson averaged 46.8 yards on four punts, including a 50-yard boot and two punts inside the 20.
- He averaged 43.7 yards on a career high-tying nine punts at Ohio State. Thompson placed four punts inside the 20, two inside the 10, and booted a pair of 50+ yard punts.
- The senior blasted four punts of 50+ yards and averaged 49.0 yards on six punts against Indiana. He landed two punts inside the 10.
- All-Big Ten second team KR Nicholas Singleton is averaging 25.1 yards per kick return, ninth all-time at Penn State, including a 100-yard touchdown return at Rutgers in 2022.
- Singleton had a 50-yard kick return against Indiana and a 51yard return at Maryland.
- On his first career punt return, PR Daequan Hardy had a 56yard punt return for a touchdown in the first quarter against UMass and added a 68-yard punt return for a touchdown in the third quarter, becoming the first player in school history to record multiple punt returns for a touchdown in a single game.
- Since 2000, Hardy is the 25th FBS player, and second Big Ten player, to return two punt returns for touchdowns in a game. He is one of two Big Ten players joining Iowa's Kevonte Martin-Manley (vs. Western Michigan, 2013).
- He is tied for the school record for most punt return touchdowns in a season with the two, joining Larry Johnson (2001), Bruce Branch (1999), O.J. McDuffie (1991) and Jimmy Cefalo (1977).
- Hardy was named Big Ten Co-Special Teams Player of the Week.
- Redshirt sophomore SN Tyler Duzansky has appeared in 16 career games.
- LB Dominic DeLuca has been voted as a captain and was awarded No. 0 as the team's special teams leader.
- DeLuca deflected a punt against UMass for his second career punt block. His first came against Minnesota in 2022.
- LB Tyler Elsdon recovered a muffed punt at Ohio State and S Kevin Winston Jr. recovered a muffed punt against Indiana.

## **GAME** RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - No. 7 Penn State defeated West Virginia, 38-15, in front of 110,747 fans, the fourth-largest crowd in Beaver Stadium history and the largest in a home opener. The Nittany Lions outscored the Mountaineers, 24-8, in the second half to pull away for the season-opening victory.

Drew Allar shined in his first game as Penn State's starting quarterback, completing 21 of his 29 pass attempts and finishing with 325 passing yards, three touchdowns and no interceptions. Allar and wide receiver KeAndre Lambert-Smith proved to be a strong connection all night, including a 72-yard touchdown on Penn State's opening possession of the game, the longest pass of Allar's career. Lambert-Smith tallied 123 receiving yards and a career-best two touchdown grabs on four catches.

The Nittany Lions totaled 478 yards of offense (332 passing, 146 rushing) in the well-balanced attack. The dynamic running back duo of Nicholas Singleton and Kaytron Allen combined for 121 yards (70 for Singleton, S1 for Allen). Singleton scored a rushing touchdown in the second quarter, highlighting his solid day on the ground. Malik McClain gained 58 yards and caught a touchdown and Harrison Wallace III added 72 yards on a team-high seven receptions to round out the receiving corps. Quarterback Beau Pribula scored his first collegiate touchdown with a five-yard run in the final seconds of the fourth quarter.

The Penn State defense held West Virginia's offense to just 15 points and 310 total yards, allowing the Mountaineers to convert only four of their 14 third-down attempts. The Nittany Lions made three fourth-down stops during the game and held West Virginia's passing attack to just 167 yards through the air.

Linebackers Dominic DeLuca, Curtis Jacobs and Abdul Carter each recorded one sack apiece. Jacobs accumulated a team-best 10 tackles, while linebacker Kobe King notched five. Zakee Wheatley, Jaylen Reed and Cam Miller made four stops each.

## **HOW IT HAPPENED**

Penn State forced a West Virginia punt on the opening drive of the ball game. The Penn State offense stepped up right away, capping off its first drive of the season with a 72-yard catch-and-run from Allar to Lambert-Smith.

West Virginia got on the board at the 14:14 mark of the second quarter, tying the game, 7-7. The Mountaineers scored on a 1-yard touchdown run by CJ Donaldson. The scoring drive went 69 yards on nine plays.

The Nittany Lions responded immediately, constructing a 10-play, 81-yard touchdown drive to retake a 14-7 advantage. Singleton put the Nittany Lions up on a 2-yard run. The Nittany Lions went into the break up 14-7.

Lambert-Smith hauled in his second touchdown of the ballgame for the first score of the second half. The 12-yard score put Penn State up 21-7 with 8:36 left in the third quarter. The Nittany Lions' scoring drive lasted 3:26 as the offense used seven plays to march 56 yards into the end zone.

The Nittany Lion defense forced a turnover on downs on the next drive and the offense capitalized with a 25-yard field goal by Alex Felkins to extend the lead to 24-7.

Penn State's offense scored two more touchdowns in the final frame to put the game out of reach for the Mountaineers.

The first came on a 25-yard touchdown pass to McClain from Allar.

West Virginia cuts its deficit to 31-15 with 3:34 left in the game as Garrett Greene scored on a 1-yard run and then connected with Donaldson on a successful two-point conversion.

The final score was on Pribula's first career touchdown, a 5-yard quarterback keeper.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - No. 7 Penn State football defeated Delaware, 63-7, on Saturday afternoon in Beaver Stadium. The Nittany Lions racked up 541 total yards and scored eight offensive touchdowns, while holding the Blue Hens to only 140 total yards and one touchdown

GAME 2 PENN STATE VS. DELAWARE

Sophomore quarterback Drew Allar continued his outstanding start to the season, completing 22-of-26 passes for 204 yards and one touchdown. Redshirt freshman guarterback Beau Pribula entered the game in the middle of the 3rd quarter and scored one rushing touchdown and one passing touchdown, his first career throwing score.

Nicholas Singleton and Kaytron Allen combined for 155 rushing yards and four touchdowns leading the Nittany Lion rushing attack that posted 315 yards on the afternoon. Through the air, Tyler Warren and Omari Evans hauled in touchdowns while KeAndre Lambert-Smith led the team with 74 receiving yards.

The Nittany Lions totaled an impressive 541 yards of offense (226 passing, 315 rushing). Penn State scored on its first four drives of the afternoon, putting the pressure on the Blue Hens early and often.

Defensively, the Nittany Lions had an impressive performance, holding the Blue Hens to just seven points and 140 total yards of offense, 66 of which came on one rushing play. The defensive unit held Delaware to just five first downs in the game, tied for the fewest by an opposing offense since 2014.

Linebacker Dominic DeLuca recorded Penn State's first defensive touchdown of the season on the first career interception of his career in the late third quarter. DeLuca returned it all the way to the end zone for a pick-six. The defense also recovered one fumble, forced by Keaton Ellis and recovered by Kevin Winston Jr. Jaylen Reed, Zane Durant, and Zuriah Fisher each chipped in a sack

#### **HOW IT HAPPENED**

Penn State stopped the Blue Hens on the opening possession of the game and scored on the ensuing drive, going up 7-0 with 8:19 remaining in the first guarter. Singleton punched in the first Nittany Lion touchdown of the day on a 2-vard run.

Reed posted a third-down sack on Delaware's next trip down the field, forcing a punt and giving the Nittany Lion offense excellent field position. Allen found the end zone on a 4-vard rushing touchdown, giving the Nittany Lions a 14-0 lead

Delaware answered with a 66-yard rushing touchdown by Marcus Yarns, cutting the Penn State lead back to seven.

Singleton scored two more rushing touchdowns in the first half, reaching a career-best three rushing scores in the game. The sophomore's third touchdown put the Nittany Lions up 28-7 with 4:36 remaining in the opening half.

Penn State scored once more before the end of the half when Allar found Warren in the end zone for a 2-yard score with 22 seconds left to play in the second quarter.

The Penn State offense marched down the field and scored on the initial possession of the second half, going up 42-7 with just under 10 minutes remaining in the third quarter. Allar scored his first rushing touchdown of the season on a 1-vard sneak

On the very next drive, Ellis forced a fumble that was picked up by Winston Jr. for the Nittany Lions' first takeaway of the season. Pribula entered the game and drove the Lions down the field and scored on a 6-yard rushing touchdown. The Penn State defense followed with its first touchdown of the 2023

campaign on a DeLuca pick-six. The Nittany Lions scored one more touchdown in the fourth quarter, a

4-yard pass from Pribula to Evans, to go up 63-7.

## **GAME** RECAP

CHAMPAIGN, III. - No. 7 Penn State football took down Illinois, 30-13, on Saturday afternoon at Memorial Stadium. The Nittany Lions played complimentary football on both sides of the ball, fueled by five defensive takeaways.

The defense led the way for the Nittany Lions, recording its first fivetakeaway game in seven years. Penn State racked up four interceptions- by four different players- and a fumble recovery. Offensively, the Nittany Lions scored 20 points off of the five turnovers. Stout defense held the Illini in check all day, as the opposing rushing attack gained just 62 yards.

Dominic DeLuca also forced the first fumble of his career, the first of the Nittany Lions' five takeaways. Linebacker Abdul Carter, and cornerbacks Johnny Dixon. Daequan Hardy. and Cam Miller each secured interceptions.

Johnny Dixon, Daequan Hardy, and Cam Miller each secured interceptions. On offense, quarterback Drew Allar posted yet another turnover-free outing, going 16-of-33 for 208 yards. Penn State's running backs were involved in all three offensive touchdowns on the afternoon. Kaytron Allen and Nicholas Singleton each recorded rushing scores, while Trey Potts tossed a touchdown pass to tight end Tyler Warren.

Singleton led the Nittany Lion receiving corps with three grabs and a career-best 49 yards through the air, with tight end Warren (3-35-1) and wide receiver Liam Clifford (1-33-0) complimenting his effort.

#### **HOW IT HAPPENED**

The Nittany Lions made their first splash play of the day on their second defensive drive as DeLuca forced a fumble that was picked up by Kobe King to give the ball back to the offense at the Illinois 43.

The Nittany Lions took the ball 40 yards on nine plays for a 20-yard field goal for the first score of the game, going up 3-0 with 5:27 to play in the opening quarter.

Penn State's defense forced its second turnover in two possessions with an interception by Carter, the first of his career, and he returned the ball to the Illinois 37. Alex Felkins knocked through a 45-yard field goal to increase the Nittany Lion lead to 6-0 with under two minutes remaining in the opening quarter.

The Nittany Lion defense recorded its third turnover in the first quarter on the Illini's next drive. Hardy picked off an Altmyer pass at the Penn State 43 and the offense proceeded to use 12 plays to march 57 yards for its first touchdown. Allen punched in the 4-yard score at the 11:04 mark of the second quarter.

Reggie Love III put the Illini on the board with a 5-yard touchdown run with 2:08 left to play in the half. Illinois constructed an 8-play, 68-yard drive for the score to cut the Nittany Lions' advantage to 13-7.

The Nittany Lions tacked on an additional field goal before halftime to go up 16-7 at the break. Allar found Clifford on a 33-yard strike to the Illinois 11 to set up the Felkins 28-yard field goal.

Penn State's defense made its presence felt right away in the second half. On Illinois' first possession, Dixon intercepted Altmyer at the Penn State 7 and returning his first interception of the season 21 yards to the Nittany Lions' 28.

The Nittany Lions broke through for their second touchdown of the afternoon to go up 23-7 at the 2:14 mark of the third frame. Potts caught a lateral from Allar and tossed an 11-yard touchdown pass to the tight end, Warren, capping off a 7-play, 68-yard scoring drive. On the ensuing Illinois possession, the Nittany Lions intercepted Altmyer

On the ensuing Illinois possession, the Nittany Lions intercepted Altmyer for the fourth time, this time by Miller. His pick at the Illinois 30 preceded the Nittany Lion offense's third touchdown of the game. Penn State wasted no time, scoring in just over a minute on a Nicholas Singleton 16-yard rushing touchdown. The back-to-back scoring drives saw the Nittany Lions go up 30-7 with 14:24 left to play in the game. Illinois found the end zone one more time, scoring on a 19-yard reception

Illinois found the end zone one more time, scoring on a 19-yard reception by Malik Elzy from quarterback John Paddock late in the fourth quarter. A failed two-point conversion left the score at 30-13.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - No. 7 Penn State Football dominated on both sides of the ball and registered a 31-0 victory against the No. 24/22 Iowa Hawkeyes on Saturday evening in front of the second-largest crowd in Beaver Stadium history

GAME 4 **PENN STATE VS. IOWA** 

Penn State's defense stole the show, shutting out an AP Top 25 opponent for the first time since it did so in the 1999 Alamo Bowl against No. 18 Texas A&M. The Blue & White held lowa to just 76 total yards of offense, split between 50 passing yards and 26 on the ground. Linebackers Abdul Carter and Curtis Jacobs led the way with a trio of tackles apiece, while linebacker Dominic DeLuca, and defensive ends Chop Robinson, Amin Vanover and Dani Dennis-Sutton each forced fumbles on the night. Jacobs became the first Nittany Lion to recover a pair of fumbles in a single game since Mark D'Onofrio did so against Temple on Oct. 5, 1991.

The complementary outing saw PSU out-gain lowa by a 397-76 yardage tally in addition to a striking 97-33 differential in total plays. The Blue & White did an exemplary job of keeping lowa's offense off the field, winning the time of possession battle by over 30 minutes. Penn State finished the night 9-for-20 on third down, while lowa was held to a 1-for-9 conversion rate. Additionally, PSU was able to cash in on all four of their red zone opportunities, while the Nittany Lion defense held lowa without a red zone chance

A balanced Penn State rushing attack, led by running back Kaytron Allen, gained 215 yards on the evening, with the Norfolk, Virginia, native responsible for 72 on his own. Quarterback Beau Pribula entered the game in the fourth quarter and finished with 55 yards on the ground while running back Nicholas Singleton tallied 49 yards highlighted by a game-high 19-yard scamper in the third quarter.

The Nittany Lions totaled 182 yards through the air, with quarterback Drew Allar responsible for 166 of those after completing 25 of his 37 passing attempts. Allar finished the night with four touchdown passes and zero interceptions. Wide receiver KeAndre Lambert-Smith hauled in eight receptions for 66 yards and a touchdown, while tight end Theo Johnson snagged six passes for 42 yards. Tight end Tyler Warren recorded a career-high two touchdown grabs and fellow tight end Khalil Dinkins recorded his first receiving touchdown of the 2023 campaign.

The Blue & White welcomed a sellout crowd of 110,830, the second-largest attendance figure in Beaver Stadium history.

#### **HOW IT HAPPENED**

On lowa's second drive, Dennis-Sutton forced a fumble that was picked up by Jacobs at the Nittany Lion 18-yard line.

The Nittany Lion offense got on the board first, thanks to a 46-yard field goal by Alex Felkins. Felkins capped off a 17-play 53-yard scoring drive. Penn State took the 3-0 advantage with 1:35 remaining in the opening frame.

On the Nittany Lions' next drive, the Hawkeyes forced a punt, however Thompson's boot hit an lowa player on the fly and was recovered by Curtis Jacobs at the Hawkeye 39-yard line, sending the Penn State offense back on the field. Allar tossed a 9-yard touchdown pass to Dinkins, extending the lead to 10-0.

On Penn State's opening drive of the second half, Allar led the Nittany Lions on a 15-play, 75-yard scoring drive. A 2-yard touchdown from Allar to Warren capped off the drive.

The Nittany Lions scored once again on Warren's second touchdown of the game, a 7-yard grab, with 1:01 left in the third quarter. Penn State's defense went back to work, forcing a fumble on the first play

of lowa's next drive. Robinson got to quarterback Cade McNamara for a strip

sack that was picked up by Isaac. The Nittany Lions took possession at the Iowa 19 yard-line. Allar took the Penn State offense down the field and threw his fourth touchdown pass of the night to increase the Nittany Lion lead to 31-0 on a 4-yard touchdown to Lambert-Smith in the corner of the end zone

## **GAME** RECAP

EVANSTON, III. – No. 6/7 Penn State breezed past Northwestern behind a dominant second half, winning 41-13 at Ryan Field on Saturday.

An outstanding defensive performance once again fueled the complimentary win for the Nittany Lions. Penn State limited Northwestern to just 175 total yards, including just 45 on the ground, compared to its own 353 total yards and 134 rushing yards.

The Nittany Lions posted seven sacks, an interception, and forced two turnovers on downs in the game on defense, putting pressure on Northwestern all afternoon. The unit yielded just three points in the second half and provided outstanding field position for many of the Nittany Lions' scoring opportunities.

Twenty-three Nittany Lions recorded tackles in the game, with Kevin Winston Jr. picking up a team-high five. Zane Durant led the squad with three tackles for loss. Daequan Hardy filled up the stat sheet with two tackles, an interception, a tackle for loss, and a pass breakup.

Offensively, Allar posted yet another turnover-free performance, completing 18-of-33 passes for 189 yards and a touchdown. Beau Pribula stepped in late in the game and completed his only pass for a 30-yard touchdown to Trey Potts. KeAndre Lambert-Smith led the team with 86 receiving yards on four catches while Nicholas Singleton caught a career-high six passes for 39 yards and a touchdown. Singleton led the way on the ground for Penn State, carrying the ball 21 times for 80 yards and another score.

Northwestern scored first on its opening possession of the game, the result of Penn State's first turnover of the season. After the Wildcats gained possession of the ball on Penn State's 15-yard line on a fumbled kickoff return, the Nittany Lion defense pushed them back four yards and forced a 33-yard field goal.

The Nittany Lions bounced back and evened it up at 3-3 with under three minutes to play in the first quarter on a 20-yard field goal by Alex Felkins. With 5:16 remaining in the first half, the Wildcats were able to tack on

a touchdown to take the lead back. Northwestern took 5:16 off the clock on its 10-play scoring drive that culminated in a 1-yard touchdown run by quarterback Ben Bryant.

The Nittany Lions responded immediately, creating their own six-play, 63yard drive that was capped off by a 13-yard run by Potts. The teams entered the break tied 10-10.

Following a defensive stop on Northwestern's first possession of the second half, Penn State found the end zone once again. On fourth-and-goal from the 1-yard line, Allar was able to push his way into the end zone.

Penn State made it 17 unanswered points with a 47-yard field goal from Felkins, his second of the game, after the Nittany Lion defense forced a turnover on downs.

Another fourth-down stop in Northwestern territory led to Penn State's next score. The Wildcats attempted a fake punt, but fell short of the first down marker, giving the Nittany Lion offense possession of the ball at the 34. Allar tossed a 2-yard touchdown pass to Singleton to complete the scoring drive. Northwestern was able to chip in a field goal early in the fourth quarter,

cutting Penn State's lead down to two scores, at 27-13.

Singleton punched in another Penn State touchdown, this one with just over four minutes left to play in the game. A 13-play, 54-yard drive resulted in Singleton's 1-yard score, giving Penn State a 34-13 lead.

On the ensuing Northwestern drive, Hardy's interception gave the Nittany Lions possession at the Northwestern 30-yard line. It took just one play for Penn State to find the end zone, with Pribula finding Potts on a 30-yard catchand-run for the tally.



## **GAME** RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - No. 6/5 Penn State dominated on both sides of the ball and secured a shutout victory over the UMass, 63-0, Saturday afternoon at Beaver Stadium.

GAME 6 **PENN STATE VS. UMASS** 

Penn State's defensive unit put on a formidable performance, registering seven sacks to secure PSU's 11th-straight game with at least three, the nation's longest streak. Their relentless pressure kept UMass on its back foot throughout the game. In the second half, the Nittany Lion defense limited the Minutemen to zero points and dominated the field position battle, clinching the shutout victory and providing multiple scoring opportunities for the other side of the ball.

Twenty-eight Nittany Lions recorded tackles in the game. Adisa Isaac led the squad with 3.5 tackles for loss, including 2.5 of Penn State's seven sacks. Cam Miller, Chop Robinson, and Dani Dennis-Sutton all contributed to Penn State's sack total.

The offensive highlights included Drew Allar delivering another impressive performance, connecting on 16-of-23 passes, gaining 162 yards and throwing three touchdowns. Beau Pribula made an impact on the rushing front, recording 59 rushing yards and a touchdown.

Theo Johnson emerged as a key player with 66 receiving yards on four receptions for two touchdowns. Daeguan Hardy made a significant impact becoming the first player in Penn State history to score two punt return touchdowns in a single game.

Penn State held UMass to just 26 yards in the first half and 109 total yards.

#### HOW IT HAPPENED

On UMass' second possession, the Nittany Lions only allowed the Minutemen to advance three yards before forcing a punt. On the punt, Hardy fielded the ball at the Penn State 44-yard line and scampered 56 yards for the touchdown

Penn State's next offensive possession resulted in a 1-vard touchdown run by Allar, giving the Nittany Lions a 14-0 lead with 12:35 remaining in the half.

The Nittany Lions scored their second rushing touchdown as Allen crossed the goal line on a 9-vard score at the end of a seven-play, 80-vard drive.

Penn State scored on its third consecutive offensive possession, this time on a 7-yard touchdown reception by Warren, going up 28-0 with just over a minute left to play in the first half.

In the third guarter, the Nittany Lions tacked on their fourth-straight offensive touchdown of the day, a 30-yard dart from Allar to Johnson. Penn State scored once again on the Allar-Johnson connection. With 5:12 remaining in the third quarter, Allar tossed an 18-yard touchdown to Johnson to cap off an eight-play, 54-yard scoring drive. It marked Penn State's fifth-consecutive offensive touchdown and gave the Nittany Lions a 42-0 lead.

Following the ensuing UMass drive, Hardy set a Penn State record by scoring his second punt return touchdown of the game. Hardy broke multiple tackles on his way to the 68-yard score, giving Penn State a 49-0 advantage at the 3:57 mark of the third quarter.

A Keaton Ellis interception led to Penn State's sixth-straight offensive touchdown to put them up 56-0 with 13:37 left in the game. Pribula entered the game at quarterback and led a four-play, 49-yard scoring drive that was highlighted by a 2-yard rushing score by Potts.

Penn State tacked on one last touchdown in the fourth quarter, a 31-yard dash into the end zone by Pribula that put the Nittany Lions up 63-0. The squad held the lead through the final buzzer, securing its second shutout of the season

### **GAME** RECAP

**COLUMBUS, OHIO** – No. 7/6 Penn State dropped its Big Ten road contest, 20-12, at No. 3/3 Ohio State in Columbus on Saturday.

Penn State's defense held the Ohio State offense 16 points below its season scoring average, allowing just 20 points compared to the Buckeyes' season average of 36. The Nittany Lions put defensive pressure on the Buckeyes all afternoon, securing a fumble on a muffed punt and also forcing a turnover on downs by Ohio State inside the five-yard line.

Linebackers Abdul Carter and Curtis Jacobs led Penn State with nine tackles apiece. Johnny Dixon (1), Kobe King (0.5), and Adisa Isaac (0.5) each contributed to the Nittany Lions' sack total, with the Nittany Lions also racking up nine tackles for loss in the game.

Offensively, quarterback Drew Allar extended his turnoverfree streak, throwing for 191 yards and a touchdown without an interception. KeAndre Lambert-Smith posted a team-leading 52 receiving yards on six catches, while Kaden Saunders hauled in Allar's touchdown pass.

#### HOW IT HAPPENED

Ohio State got on the board on its first trip down the field. The Buckeyes took a 3-0 lead on a 33-yard field goal at the 10:49 mark of the opening quarter, the result of an 11-play, 57-yard drive.

Penn State answered later in the first quarter, with Alex Felkins knocking through a 40-yard field goal with 2:36 left in the frame to tie the game at three apiece. The Nittany Lions went 39 yards in six plays for the score.

A 5:16 drive for the Buckeyes resulted in the first touchdown of the ballgame at the 7:31 mark of the second quarter. Miyan Williams recorded the game's first touchdown on a 2-yard run to put Ohio State ahead, 10-3.

The Nittany Lions answered with a field goal, a 41-yarder by Felkins. Penn State went 51 yards in seven plays for the score with just over three minutes remaining in the first half. The Nittany Lions entered the halftime break trailing 10-6.

Neither team was able to get anything going in the third quarter, as the defenses led the way into the fourth and final frame. The Nittany Lion defense forced a goal-line fourth down stop and another special teams turnover in the third quarter but were unable to convert.

Ohio State kicked its second field goal of the afternoon at the 8:59 mark of the fourth quarter to increase its lead back to seven points. The Buckeyes took nine plays and 4:40 off the clock to go 71 yards, taking a 13-7 advantage.

The Buckeyes tacked on another touchdown with 4:07 to play, taking a 20-6 advantage on an 18-yard touchdown by Marvin Harrison Jr.

Penn State scored its first touchdown with 29 seconds left in the game, an 8-yard pass from Allar to Saunders that cut the Ohio State lead to 20-12. The Nittany Lions' two-point conversion attempt was stopped.

### **GAME** RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. – No. 10 Penn State took down the Indiana Hoosiers, 33-24, Saturday afternoon at Beaver Stadium. The Nittany Lions remain undefeated at home on the season.

Quarterback Drew Allar threw for 210 yards and completed a trio of touchdown passes to Theo Johnson, Khalil Dinkins, and Keandre Lambert-Smith.

Lambert-Smith led the team with 96 receiving yards on six receptions and the go-ahead touchdown late in the fourth quarter. Johnson hauled in two passes for 21 yards and his third touchdown of the season. Dinkins' only reception in the game was a 9-yard touchdown from Allar in the first quarter. On the ground, Kaytron Allen took charge with 81 yards on 18 carries, both leading the team, while Nicholas Singleton toted the ball 15 times for 50 yards and a score.

Nineteen different Nittany Lions recorded tackles in the game, with Jaylen Reed picking up a team-high eight. Daequan Hardy, Dani Dennis-Sutton and Johnny Dixon all recorded sacks for the Nittany Lions. Penn State held yet another opponent to under 100 rushing yards, limiting Indiana to just 80 on the day. Penn State also recorded a safety on a strip-sack by Dennis-Sutton on Indiana's final drive.

This was Penn State's seventh time this season scoring over 30 points in a game.

#### **HOW IT HAPPENED**

Indiana got on the board first with a 90-yard touchdown pass from Brendan Sorsby to Dequece Carter on the first play of the Hoosiers' third offensive possession.

Penn State's punt on its next possession was muffed by Indiana's return man and scooped up by Kevin Winston Jr. at the Indiana 32-yard line. Penn State converted the scoring opportunity on a 9-yard touchdown pass from Allar to Dinkins.

A 69-yard touchdown pass to Donaven McCulley put the Hoosiers back up by seven at the 13:26 mark of the second quarter.

A 2-yard touchdown run by Singleton tied the game at 14 with 2:09 remaining in the first half.

On the Hoosiers' next possession, Jaylen Reed picked off a Sorsby pass and returned it to the Indiana 43-yard line with just over a minute left to play in the second quarter. Alex Felkins converted a 50-yard field goal as time expired to put the Nittany Lions up 17-14 at the break.

Penn State received the ball to start the second half and constructed a 12-play, 75-yard scoring drive to extend its lead to 24-14. Johnson hauled in a 16-yard pass from Allar.

- Indiana cut into the Penn State lead in the fourth quarter on a 26-yard touchdown pass from Sorsby to Omar Cooper Jr.
- The Hoosiers tied the game at 24-24 with a field goal with just under three minutes left in the game

Penn State responded with a three-play, 78-yard touchdown drive, highlighted by a 57-yard touchdown pass from Allar to Lambert-Smith, to take a 31-24 advantage with 1:46 still left on the clock.

On Indiana's first play of their next possession, Dennis-Sutton produced a strip-sack of Sorsby and the ball rolled through the back of the end zone for a safety.

### **GAME** RECAP

**COLLEGE PARK, Md.** – No. 11/9/9 Penn State put together another outstanding complimentary performance as it earned a 51-15 win over Maryland on Saturday. Excellent play on both sides of the ball led the Nittany Lions to their fifth Big Ten win of the season.

Quarterback Drew Allar tied his career high with four touchdown passes in the game, highlighting a performance in which he completed 25-of-34 passes for 240 yards. Dante Cephas caught two of Allar's four touchdowns as the senior wideout produced his first multi-score game in a Penn State uniform. KeAndre Lambert-Smith caught eight passes for 95 yards, leading the team in both categories. Allar's other two scores went to his tight ends, Theo Johnson and Tyler Warren.

On the ground, Kaytron Allen averaged 6.5 yards per carry on 14 totes, picking up 91 yards and a touchdown.

Penn State's defense dominated the line of scrimmage, holding the Terrapins to -49 rushing yards in the game. The unit picked up six sacks and 12 tackles for loss in its stellar outing. True freshman linebacker Tony Rojas had a hand in two of Penn State's four takeaways in the game, registering a forced fumble and an interception in the fourth quarter. Abdul Carter led Penn State with six total tackles and added a sack and a pass breakup to his final line. In total, 22 different Nittany Lions recorded tackles in the game, with 12 recording tackles for loss, and six posting sacks.

#### **HOW IT HAPPENED**

On Penn State's first possession, Allar led his group down the field for a touchdown on eight plays, capping off the drive with a six-yard touchdown pass to Cephas.

Penn State was able to go up 14-0 as the Nittany Lions marched 79 yards on eight plays and scored on a 2-yard toss from Allar to Theo Johnson.

Maryland scored its first touchdown of the day with 7:59 remaining in the second quarter, cutting the Penn State lead to 14-7 on a 13-play, 75-yard drive. The Nittany Lions answered immediately, constructing their own 12play, 75-yard touchdown drive on their next possession. Allar capped off the opportunity with an 8-yard touchdown pass to Tyler Warren.

Penn State got on the board first in the second half with a field goal on its first trip down the field as Alex Felkins knocked a 30-yarder through the uprights.

Allar threw his fourth touchdown of the day at the tail end of a 13-play, 88-yard drive to increase Penn State's lead to 31-7. Cephas caught the 15-yard strike from Allar.

Maryland tacked on its second touchdown of the day, another Taulia Tagovailoa passing score, with 11:27 remaining in the game. The Terrapins converted a two-point conversion on the score, reducing the Penn State lead to 31-15.

Thanks to a 51-yard kick return by Singleton, the Penn State offense began its drive inside Maryland territory once again. The Nittany Lions wasted no time scoring, as Allen added to his outstanding day on the ground with a 10-yard touchdown run.

A pair of Felkins field goals and a rushing score by Beau Pribula gave Penn State 16 additional points on its possessions following three-straight Maryland turnovers.

#### Notes

- Penn State is now 43-3-1 in the all-time series against Maryland, including 16-1 in road matchups.
- The Nittany Lions have won 12 of the last 14 games in the series.
- Under head coach James Franklin, Penn State has averaged a 24.8 margin of victory in 10 matchups.
- In road games against Maryland in the James Franklin era, Penn State has averaged a 43.75 margin of victory in four contests.
- Penn State limited Maryland to -49 rushing yards. Since 1947, the -49 rushing yards are the second-lowest allowed by a Penn State defense.
- The -49 rushing yards allowed are the fewest by an FBS team in a game this season. The previous low was Stanford allowing -5 rushing yards against Hawaii.
- Since 2013, Penn State is one of four FBS teams that have allowed -49 or fewer rushing yards in a game joining San Diego State (-66 vs. Middle Tennessee State, 12/24/22), Michigan State (-73 vs. Tulsa, 8/30/19) and Arizona State (-52 vs. Washington State, 10/22/16).
- Through nine games, Penn State has not allowed a point in the third quarter (97-0 advantage).
- Penn State scored 51 points, marking the third time this season the Nittany Lions have posted 50+ points and the fourth time PSU has scored 40+ points.
- TE Theo Johnson and TE Tyler Warren both had touchdown grabs in the first half. It marked the fourth game this season that Penn State had multiple tight ends with touchdown receptions in a game.
- WR Dante Cephas recorded six catches for 53 receiving yards and two touchdowns. It was his second career game with multiple touchdown receptions and first at Penn State.
- Penn State held Maryland to 234 total yards. The 234 total yards are Maryland's lowest this season.
- Penn State notched 12 tackles for loss and six sacks.
- The Nittany Lions forced a takeaway in the first quarter on a fumble forced by DE Adisa Isaac and recovered by DT Zane Durant.
- Penn State forced three takeaways in the fourth quarter. The three takeaways came in a span of four plays.
- LB Dominic DeLuca and LB Tony Rojas recorded interceptions, while Rojas forced a fumble on a strip-sack, which was recovered by DT Jordan van den Berg.
- K Alex Felkins hit three field goals on the day. He also converted all six extra-point attempts for a total of 15 points.
