SETTING THE SCENE

- * Bowling Green, the defending Mid-American Conference champions, seeks to finish their non-conference schedule with a victory when they travel to the Liberty Bowl to face the Memphis Tigers at 8:00 p.m. ET on Saturday, Sept. 24.
- * The game against Memphis is the third all-time meeting between the schools. The Falcons defeated Memphis 52-35 in the 2004 GMAC Bowl, then fell to the Tigers 44-41 last season at Doyt Perry Stadium.
- * Memphis is currently a member of the American Athletic Conference, and the Falcons are 19-14 all-time against current AAC members. That includes a 4-0 record against Cincinnati and an 8-4 mark against Temple. It also includes two victories over Navy and East Carolina, as well as single wins against Tulsa and Central Florida
- * With a victory over Memphis, Bowling Green would finish at 2-2 in non-conference play for the sixth consecutive season.

ELIANO'S OPPORTUNISTIC DEFENSE

- * Defensive coordinator Perry Eliano inherits an opportunistic defense that returns six key starters in 2016.
- * The Falcons ranked eighth in the country in 2015 with 20 interceptions and 13th in total turnovers forced with 27.
- * Brandon Harris had a 63-yard interception return for a touchdown in week one against Ohio State. Against North Dakota, he posted seven tackles and his first career sack, and he earned his first career pass break-up against MTSU.
- * The linebackers are destined to be the backbone of the defense. Trenton Greene, a second-team All-MAC performer a year ago, had 16 tackles against Ohio State and nine more against North Dakota. He also led the Falcons

- * Linebacker Austin Valdez, a first-team allconference player last year, had 10 tackles and a pass break-up against Ohio State and another 10 tackles against North Dakota.
- * Defensive end Terrance Bush will provide leadership as a returning starter along the line, while Alfonso Mack will do the same in the secondary.
- * Mack is a former walk-on who made such an impact on the Falcons that Mike Jinks' first decision as head coach was to award him a scholarship on Dec. 10, 2015 in the initial team meeting. Mack led the team with six interceptions a year ago. He earned his first pick of 2016 against MTSU and returned it 47 yards, just one yard shy of a pick-six.

REBOUNDING

- * BGSU won its fifth consecutive in-season game following a loss on Sept. 10 against North Dakota. They'll look for their sixth straight victory following a loss on Saturday at Memphis.
- * In 2014, the Falcons followed a loss to Northern Illinois in the MAC Championship with a Camellia Bowl win over South Alabama. In 2015, they won road games against Maryland and Purdue after losses to Tennessee and Memphis, then blasted Ball State 48-10 on the road after falling to Toledo.
- * BGSU's last in-season losing streak was a three-game streak in November 2014.

THE 2,000 YARD MAN

- * Bowling Green senior running back Fred Coppet has quietly positioned himself to become one of the Falcons' most prolific career rushers.
- * Coppet now has 2,001 yards in his career, including seasons of 764 and 825 yards.
- * He currently ranks 13th on BGSU's all-time list. He needs 10 yards to tie for 12th place, 136 yards for 10th and 563 for fifth.
- * Against MTSU, Coppet rushed 27 times for 117 yards. It was his fifth career 100-yard game and his second-highest single-game rushing total. He had 140 in Nov. 2014 versus Ball State. The 27 carries nearly doubled his previous career high (14).

ROAD WARRIORS

* Bowling Green went 6-0 in true road games a year ago and won a total of seven games (including the MAC Championship) away from Doyt Perry Stadium.

- * BGSU was the only team in the country to win six road games in 2015.
- * The Falcons' six road wins tied the 1985 team for the most in a season in school history. The seven wins outside of Bowling Green, Ohio are a program record.

FALCON FASTER

- * Bowling Green Is living up to its "Falcon Faster" mantra in 2016. The Falcons are 24th nationally with 80.3 plays per game after taking 93 snaps against Middle Tennessee.
- * BGSU is one of only five teams whose average time between plays is less than 20 seconds. In fact, the Falcons' 18.8 seconds per play is behind only Missouri (16.5). California, TCU and Ole Miss also average less than 20 seconds per play.

RUNNING TO PAYDIRT

* Bowling Green's 304 rushing yards against Middle Tennessee were the most by the team since totaling 337 at Ball State on Nov. 24, 2015.

* The team's 61 rushing attempts were the most in one game by the Falcons in 18 years. BGSU ran the ball 77 times against Northern Illinois on Nov. 21, 1998.

CLEVELAND ROCKS

- * Josh Cleveland's workload continues to increase, and the results are stunning.
- * He carried the ball six times for 31 yards against Ohio State, then 11 for 44 against North Dakota.
- * His coming-out party was against MTSU. Cleveland hauled the rock 18 times for 153 yards and his first career touchdown. Cleveland is the first BGSU player to rush for more than 150 in his first career 100-yard game since Willie Geter ran for 203 against Kent State in 2007.
- * Cleveland now has 228 yards and 6.5 per carry. He ranks 23rd nationally in yards per carry and in the top five of the MAC in yards per carry, total rushing yards, and rushing yards per game.

THE POWER BACK

- * In his second season of action, Donovan Wilson had his most productive game against MTSU. He set career single-game highs with 10 carries and 36 yards.
- * Wilson also scored two touchdowns, tied for his most in a game. They were his first scores since he found the end zone twice last October against Akron.
- * Wilson now has 55 yards in 2016, just 23 yards shy of his season high for rushing yards.

INTERCEPTION CONNECTION

- * BGSU has picked off two passes in 2016 and the Falcons were just one yard shy of returning both for touchdowns.
- * Brandon Harris had a 63-yard interception return for a touchdown against Ohio State.
- * Alfonso Mack returned an interception 47 yards to the one-yard line Saturday against Middle Tennessee.
- * BGSU's 110 yards on interception returns are first in the MAC. Akron is second with 73 yards on three interceptions.
- * Bowling Green's defense picked off 20 passes and allowed only 19 touchdown passes during the 2015 season. Those 20 interceptions were tied with Oklahoma for eighth-most nationally.

MILLER TIME

- * Wide receiver Scott Miller put on a show against North Dakota, reaching the end zone for the first time and setting career highs for receptions, receiving yards and all-purpose yards.
- * Miller's first reception went for a 71-yard touchdown. The score was the first of his career, and his career receiving yardage to that point was 56
- * Miller added four more receptions during the game, including scoring catches of 51 and 11 yards. In all, he had five catches for 161 yards and three scores.
- * Miller is also BGSU's primary kickoff and punt returner. He posted 60 kick return yards and 14 via punt return, to give him 235 all-purpose yards. That is the most in a game for a BGSU player since Roger Lewis had 261 last season against Memphis.
- * Miller currently has an average of 150.67 allpurpose yards per game. That total ranks 25th nationally and leads the MAC. Miller's 225 kick return yards are second in the MAC through three games.
- * The 71-yard touchdown reception against North Dakota is BGSU's longest play of the season to date.

BOWLING GREENE

* Redshirt senior linebacker Trenton Greene set a career high with 16 tackles at Ohio State. He added nine more against North Dakota and 11 versus MTSU.

* Greene currently averages 12.0 tackles per game and ranks fifth nationally in that category. * With 15 solo tackles, Greene ranks eighth in the MAC.

SACK MASTER

- * Gus Schwieterman followed his two-sack performance against North Dakota by earning four tackles against Middle Tennessee, his most in a single game.
- * One was a sack of MTSU quarterback Brent Stockstill, which gives Schwieterman three for the season. He ranks 18th nationally and third in the MAC with an average of one sack per game.
- * The last Falcon to have three or more sacks through the first three games of the season was Chris Jones in 2012. Jones went on to earn MAC Defensive Player of the Year honors with 12.5 sacks on the season.

FIRST TIMERS

* Half of Bowling Green's 22 starters at Ohio State earned the distinction for the first time in their careers. The five first-time starters on offense include running backs Josh Cleveland and Donovan Wilson, wide receivers Scott Miller and Deric Phouthavong and offensive lineman J.J. Beggan. On defense, six players started for the first time, including defensive linemen Shannon Smith and David Konowalski, linebacker Brandon Harris, and defensive backs Antonio

* Redshirt freshman Janarvis Pough became the
12th first-time starter of the season for BGSU
when he earned a start against North Dakota.
Pough set career highs with four receptions for
41 yards in the game.

- * Four more players made their first starts against MTSU, bringing the season total to 16. Hunter Folkertsma started at wide receiver, while Nilijah Ballew started at linebacker, Cameron Jeffries at cornerback, and Tavaraus Wade at safety.
- * Redshirt freshman James Morgan saw his first career action at quarterback in the fourth quarter at Ohio State. He completed nine of ten passes for 65 yards. Seven of those completions went to true freshman wide receiver Marquis Zimmerman, who led BGSU in receptions and totaled 43 yards. He also played one series against North Dakota.

* Four other players have caught their first passes for BGSU this season. Against Ohio State, Pough caught his first ball for 17 yards, while Deric Phouthavong hauled in one for 11 yards. Vanel Dossous also had one reception, which went for six yards. Josh Cleveland's first two career receptions occurred against North Dakota.

BRANDON "PICK SIX" HARRIS

- * Sophomore defensive back Brandon Harris has begun the 2016 season as well as you possibly can.
- * Against Ohio State, Harris picked off a J.T. Barrett pass on OSU's fourth play from scrimmage and weaved 63 yards for the first score of the season and a 7-0 lead.
- * It was the first BGSU pick-six since Dernard Turner pulled the trick on Nov. 4, 2014. Ohio State had not allowed once since Oct. 25, 2014.
- * The interception was the second of Harris' career; the other occurred on Nov. 4, 2015 against Ohio.
- * Against North Dakota, Harris hauled down seven Fighting Hawks and was credited with his first career sack. He followed that by collecting his first pass break-up against Middle Tennessee.

FROM QB TO ALL-MAC LINEBACKER

- * Recruited as a quarterback, Austin Valdez has become one of the most dominant linebackers in the Mid-American Conference.
- * Valdez posted 10 tackles in the season opener (five solo) against Ohio State, adding a pass break-up.
- * He earned 10 more tackles (two solo) against North Dakota.
- * Just a sophomore in 2015, Valdez totaled 144 tackles, more than anyone else in the conference, and averaged 10.3 per game.
- * As a first-team All-MAC linebacker, he tied for the team lead with 11 tackles for loss, including a sack. He also posted two interceptions and five pass break-ups.
- * Valdez was a huge factor in BGSU's MAC title game win over Northern Illinois, as he recorded 13 tackles (1.5 for loss).

THE JINKS IMPACT

- * New Bowling Green head coach Mike Jinks' previous job was running backs coach for Texas Tech. His tutelage created a monster in the Texas Tech backfield.
- * After scoring just eight rushing touchdowns as a team in 2014, the Red Raiders scored 34 in 2015 an improvement of 26, more than any other FBS school.
- * That led to a 14.6 points-per-game improvement for Texas Tech, as they improved from

52nd to second nationally in that category. * The team ran for 651 more yards in 2015, which led a total offensive improvement of 75.4 yards per game.

TEXAS TECH WENT TO WASHINGTON

- * The Mike Jinks-led improvement in the Texas Tech running game in 2015 was headed by Deandre Washington.
- * Last season, Washington improved by 23 yards per game en route to a season total of 1,492 yards. He ran for 6.4 yards per carry and scored an impressive 14 touchdowns. He piled up 144.38 all-purpose yards per game and ranked second in the Big 12. He also ranked second in rushing yards and rushing touchdowns.

THE MORE THINGS CHANGE...

- * While Bowling Green opens 2016 with its third head coach in four years, the Falcons will have new offensive and defensive coordinators for the fourth consecutive season
- * BGSU is the only school in the country that has had new offensive and defensive coordinators in each of the past four years.
- * Including co-coordinators, BGSU has had seven offensive coordinators in the past four vears.

MAC CHAMPS AGAIN

- * BGSU won its 12th Mid-American Conference Championship in 2015, defeating Northern IIlinois 34-14 at Ford Field.
- * It was the fourth time that Bowling Green played in the MAC Championship and third consecutive year. BGSU is 2-2 all-time in MAC title games.
- * BGSU has played four games at Ford Field in the past three years, three times in the MAC Championship Game and once in the 2013 Little Caesar's Pizza Bowl.

YOUTH IS SERVED

- * There's a lot of experience on the Bowling Green football team but youth still runs deep for
- * BGSU has just 16 seniors, redshirt seniors or grad transfers, tied for 19th fewest in the country.
- * Even better, the Falcons have only seven

seniors, redshirt seniors or grad transfers on offense, tied for the 15th fewest nationally.

SENIORS LOOKING FOR MORE

- * Bowling Green's senior class is in position to go down in history as one of the best in school history. With 29 wins over the past 3+ years, BGSU needs eight wins to tie the program record for victories in a four-year span.
- * The 2015 senior class won 36 games, tied for second-most in school history. Only the 2004 class won more with 37 wins. The program also won 36 games from 1991-94.
- * Considering many student-athletes redshirt, Bowling Green's trend over five years has potential to be even more impressive. The Falcons need just six wins to tie the program record for victories over a five-year span.
- * The 2005 senior class won a school record 43 games in five years, while the 1994, 1995 and 2015 seniors won 41. The 1963 and 1964 classes each won 40. This year's group has 37 wins (and counting) in their five seasons.

DAVIDSON ALSO AN ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN

- * Joseph Davidson is one of the top punters in the country, but he has also been recognized as one of the brightest minds in college football.
- * Davidson was named to the 2015 Academic All-America Division I football team as selected by the College Sports Information Director of America (CoSIDA).
- * Of the 52 players named to the Academic All-America team, he was one of just seven to hold a grade point average of 3.95 or higher. He is a mathematics major.

DAVIDSON IN THE RECORD BOOK

- * Punter Joseph Davidson holds two single-season school records and a single-game school record, while also sitting in first all-time in career punting average.
- * Davidson set school records by punting 82 times in 2014 for 3,497 yards. His 46.0 yards per punt average in 2015 is second-best in school history, and his 42.6 yards in 2014 is seventh.
- * In a 2014 game against Ball State, Davidson averaged a school-record 60.5 yards per punt, including a career-best 78-yarder.
- * At Wisconsin in 2014, Davidson punted 11 times for 496 yards. The 11 punts is tied for third-most in a game in school history and the 496 yards ranks third all alone.
- * In 2016, Davidson is getting even better. He has 18 punts in three games for 864 yards and a 48.0 average. That average ranks fourth nationally and first in the MAC. His career mark is now 44.4, the highest in school history.

KNAPKE CAN

- * Redshirt senior James Knapke has started the first three games of the 2016 season, replacing last year's MAC Offensive Player of the Year Matt Johnson.
- * Although he was the back-up for all of the 2015 season, Knapke has plenty of experience after starting 13 games in 2014 when Johnson sustained a season-ending injury in the opener.

Scott Miller

- * Knapke holds three single-game school records as he led BGSU to a 45-42 victory over Indiana at Doyt Perry Stadium. His 46 completions and 73 passing attempts are both program highs, as was his 81 total plays. It was BGSU's first ever win over a Big Ten team in The Doyt.
- * Knapke threw for a career-high 443 yards in a 47-42 win at UMass in 2014, the sixth-highest single-game total in program history.
- * Among single-season records, Knapke ranks in the top 10 in program history with 483 passing attempts (fourth), 280 completions (seventh) and 3,173 passing yards (eighth).

THE BEASTS OF THE EAST

- * Bowling Green went 5-0 against MAC East Division opponents a year ago and has now gone undefeated against divisional foes for three consecutive seasons.
- * Since the start of the 2012 season, Bowling Green has a combined record of 21-1 against the MAC East.
- * More impressively, BGSU has won 17 straight games against MAC East opponents dating back to a 2012 win over Buffalo in the regular season finale.
- * With that success has come championships as the Falcons have won three straight MAC East titles

MOORE RONNIE

- * Ronnie Moore continued the 2016 season against Middle Tennessee with a reception in his 33rd straight game -- every contest since the 2013 MAC Championship Game.
- * Moore had 72 catches for 951 yards a year

- ago, but there is potential for those numbers to look rather pedestrian by the end of the 2016 season.
- * Of the Falcons top six in receptions a year ago, only Moore returns. Those five combined for 280 receptions.
- * Moore now ranks 10th in program history with 2,289 career receiving yards. He needs just 35 more to tie for ninth place all-time and 1,161 to catch Charles Sharon (2002-05) atop the all-time leaderboard with 3,450 receiving yards.
- * Moore now has 168 career receptions and resides in tenth place in BGSU history. With 22 more catches this year, he would move into fifth place all-time, and he needs just 65 for second place, behind only NCAA record-breaker Freddie Barnes.
- * Moore also needs just six receiving touchdowns to move into a tie for fifth on BGSU's all-time list
- * As a freshman in 2013, Moore's 19.5 yards per reception was the fourth-highest single-season average in program history.
- * Against North Dakota, Moore scored the fourth rushing touchdown of his career. He now has 22 total career scores and needs only four more to tie for ninth in BGSU history.


- * Redshirt junior Austin Valdez was named to the Bednarik Award Watch List, given to the college defensive player of the year, as well as the Butkus Award Watch List, given to the nation's best linebacker.
- * Redshirt junior Tim McAuliffe was recognized on the Rimington Award Watch List, presented to the best center in college football.
- * Redshirt junior Joseph Davidson was named to the Ray Guy Award Watch List, given to the nation's best punter.
- * Senior Ronnie Moore was named to the Biletnikoff Award Watch List, presented to the outstanding receiver in college football.

- * Several Bowling Green football alumni started the 2016 NFL season on active rosters.
- * Center Kory Lichtensteiger will continue to play for the Washington Redskins in his ninth NFL season.
- * Linebacker Gabe Martin will enter his second season with the Arizona Cardinals, as will cornerback Jude Adjei-Barimah with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.
- * Undrafted free agent wide receiver Roger Lewis will play his rookie campaign for the New York Giants.
- * On Sept. 1, Lewis caught his first NFL touchdown in the Giants' final preseason game against New England. Later that night, Martin intercepted Denver Broncos' rookie quarterback Paxton Lynch and returned it for a Cardinals' touchdown.

FUTURE SCHEDULES

- * During the offseason, BGSU announced an agreement with Northwestern to play a game on Sept. 16, 2017. That announcement completed the program's 2017 non-conference slate.
- * BGSU also announced a contest at Georgia Tech on Sept. 29, 2018. Three of the Falcons' non-conference games for that season have now been announced as BGSU will play at Oregon and will host Maryland.
- * BGSU recently announced that the team will play a game at Tennessee on Sept. 4, 2021. The Falcons just played Tennessee a year ago, a 59-30 defeat to open the season.

MIKEJINKS

On Dec. 9, 2015, BGSU announced that it had tabbed Texas Tech Associate Head Coach Mike Jinks to lead the defending Mid-American Conference Champion football program. Jinks, who also coached running backs for the Red Raiders, became the 19th head coach in program history.

Jinks, who came to BGSU after spending the 2015 season as Associate Head Coach, had coached the Red Raiders' running backs for the past three seasons. Prior to his time at Texas Tech, he was a National Coach of the Year finalist while winning the 2010 Texas State Championship and compiling a record of 43-4 in his final three seasons at San Antonio

powerhouse, Steele High School.

Known for their prolific offense, Texas Tech saw great success with Jinks in 2015. The Red Raiders owned the second-best offense in the country, totaling 7,134 yards in 12 games (594.5 yards per game). TTU also had the second-best passing offense. The Red Raiders averaged 46.6 points per game (second in FBS) and had 33 touchdown drives under two minutes. Texas Tech also ranked inside the top five nationally for third-down conversions (.519), first downs offense (346), and plays run (1,002).

Under Jinks, Texas Tech saw incredible success in the running game. In just his second season, Jinks tutored DeAndre Washington, who became the first Red Raiders' running back since Ricky Williams in 1998 to surpass 1,000 yards rushing in a single season. Washington finished the season with 1,103 rushing yards and was named second team All-Big 12.

In 2015, Washington turned into the Big 12 Conference's most prolific rusher under Jinks, totaling a league-best 1,455 yards on the ground and 14 touchdowns. Washington was second in the Big 12 in all-purpose yards (146.6 yards per game) behind only teammate Jakeem Grant (180.6 yards per game). The Texas Tech rushing attack averaged 204.8 yards per game and tallied 34 rushing touchdowns.

Jinks joined the Texas Tech program after a highly successful tenure at Steele High School in Cibolo, Texas – a suburb of San Antonio. Jinks was the first head coach at Steele when the school opened its doors in 2005, and it didn't take long for him to mold the program into a state powerhouse. While at Steele, Jinks compiled a 76-18 record overall, including an impressive 43-4 mark in his final three seasons. He led the Knights to the 2010 Class 5A Division II State Championship and to the state finals again in 2011.

His highly successful career at Steele led him to receiving the honor of coaching the West Team in the U.S. Army All-American Bowl in January 2013. He was also a finalist for the Xenith National High School Coach of the Year Award. While at Steele, Jinks coached former Texas Longhorn, and All-American running back, Malcolm Brown.

Prior to becoming the head coach in Cibolo, Jinks was the head coach at Burbank High School for a season. Prior to that, he had a highly successful career as a high school assistant coach and offensive coordinator at five different schools. Jinks' coaching career began in 1995 as the quarterbacks coach at Eillison High School. In 1998, Jinks then became the quarterbacks coach at his alma mater, Judson High School. Following that, he served as offensive coordinator at David Crockett High School, Galena Park High School and Robert E. Lee High School, all prior to his first head coaching position

Jinks is a graduate of Angelo State University where he earned his degree in kinesiology. He and his wife Meredith have three children – Jaden. Madison and Tristan.

WEEK ONE

COLUMBUS, Ohio – The Bowling Green State University football team took an early 7-0 lead but Ohio State rallied to defeat the Falcons 77-10 in front of 107,193 fans at Ohio Stadium to open the 2016 season.

BGSU received the opening kickoff and went three-and-out. After a Joe Davidson punt, Ohio State began their initial series on their own 42 yard line. Four plays later, the Falcons were on the board.

Facing 2nd-and-5 at the BGSU 41, J.T. Barrett rolled left and threw into the flat, where Brandon Harris was occupying space. Harris grabbed the ball out of the air at the 37 and weaved his way 63 yards for a touchdown. It was the first pick-six for Bowling Green since Dernard Turner on Nov. 4, 2014. OSU had not allowed a pick-six since October 2014.

Jake Suder came on for a successful extra point, the first point of his career, and the Falcons led 7-0 just 2:41 into the game.

By the time the first quarter ended, Ohio State led 21-7 and then added 14 points in the second quarter to take a 35-10 lead into halftime.

Starting quarterback James Knapke completed 12 balls for 110 yards before giving way to redshirt freshman James Morgan in the fourth quarter. Morgan completed nine of ten passes for 65 yards. Seven of those nine completions were to true freshman Marquis Zimmerman. Zimmerman led the Falcons with those seven catches in his first career game. Ronnie Moore led the team with 45 receiving yards.

In the backfield, Josh Cleveland's first six BGSU carries went for 31 yards, as he led the team with a 5.2 yards per carry average. Coppet's 28-yard jaunt led to a team-high 38 yards on 12 carries.

WEEK TWO

BOWLING GREEN, Ohio – The Bowling Green State University football team opened the 50th anniversary season of Doyt Perry Stadium with an exciting 27-26 win over the University of North Dakota on Saturday, Sept. 10. The Falcons benefitted from three touchdown receptions from Scott Miller but had to tip away a two-point conversion attempt in the final seconds to preserve the victory.

Miller finished the contest with five catches for 161 yards and three touchdowns. The scores were the first three of his career, and the yardage total nearly tripled his previous career total. His 71-yard reception is the longest play of the season to date for BGSU.

Moore scored BGSU's other touchdown on the fourth rushing score of his career. He also hauled in three passes for 39 yards. He has receptions in 32 consecutive games, and the 39 yards gives him 2,272. That total moves him into tenth place on BGSU's career reception yards list.

Janarvis Pough had four catches for 51 yards, while Deric Phouthavong added five for 41. All of those totals are career highs. Knapke fed his receivers to the tune of 23-of-40 for 315 yards, three touchdowns and two interceptions. The three scoring passes ties Knapke's career high.

Antonyo Sotolongo and Austin Valdez led BGSU's defense with ten tackles; the total for Sotolongo was a career high and gives him 19 for the season, while Valdez has 20. Trent Greene added nine for a team-leading season total of 25. Gus Schwieterman had two sacks, and Brandon Harris added another. Those were the first career sacks for both players.

Overall, BGSU outgained North Dakota 417-383 and 327-219 through the air. They also allowed just 3.8 yards per carry despite 43 attempts by UND. The Falcon defense limited the Fighting Hawks to just 4-for-17 on third down attempts.

WEEK THREE

BGSU led through much of the first half but ultimately fell to the Middle Tennessee Blue Raiders 41-21 Saturday at Doyt Perry Stadium. MTSU scored three touchdowns in the span of 2:01 surrounding halftime, and inclement weather limited offensive production in the second half, as the Falcons failed to score in the final 30 minutes.

Josh Cleveland rushed for 153 yards on 18 rushes and Fred Coppet added 117 yards on 27 carries. The Falcons ran for 304 yards on the ground in a driving rainpour.

Alfonso Mack made his first interception of the season and seventh of his career as the Falcons went ahead 21-14 just 1:46 into the second quarter. The rest of the game, however, belonged to the Blue Raiders.

BGSU ran 93 plays for 433 yards. Of those, 61 plays for 304 yards came on the ground. That is the most rushing yards for Bowling Green since Nov. 24, 2015 at Ball State. It is the first time BGSU has rushed the ball at least 60 times since 2014 against Kent State.

Cleveland's 18 carries and 153 yards were both career highs, and he posted his first career touchdown. Donovan Wilson also set career bests for carries (10) and yards (36). His two scores were his first since last October against Akron, and they tie for his most in a single game. Coppet's 27 carries were 13 more than his previous high, and his 117 yards were the second most in his career. It is his fifth career 100-yard game.

Defensively, Trent Greene had 11 more tackles and now owns 36 for the season. He was fifth nationally with 12.5 per game entering the contest. Alfonso Mack's interception is his first of the season and seventh of his career. Gus Schwieterman added a sack; he now has three in the last two games.

Four players (Hunter Folkertsma, Cameron Jefferies, Nilijah Ballew and Tavaraus Wade) all made their first starts for the Falcons today.
