HAMPDEN-SYDNEY (2-2, 0-1) vs. FERRUM (2-2, 0-1)

1 p.m. | Fulton Field at Lewis C. Everett Stadium | Hampden-Sydney, VA

Hampden-Sydney College welcomes Ferrum College in Old Dominion Athletic Conference (ODAC) football action on Saturday afternoon, October 7, at 1 p.m. on Fulton Field at Lewis C. Everett Stadium. The host Tigers are 2-2 overall, 0-1 in the ODAC, while the visiting Panthers are also 2-2 overall, 0-1 in the ODAC. It's Family Weekend on the Hill as the Garnet & Grey play at home for the fourth time in the first five games this season.

H-SC dropped a heartbreaking 39-38 ODAC decision at home to Bridgewater College on September 30 at Everett Stadium. The Tigers led 21-14 after one quarter and were ahead 21-17 at halftime, but the Eagles tied it at 31-31 after three quarters, before BC's Kennedy Fauntleroy scored on a one-yard touchdown run—his fourth touchdown of the contest—with just 23-seconds remaining and Malcolm Anderson converted a two-point rush attempt for the last-minute road win. FC dropped a 38-3 ODAC decision at home to Shenandoah University.

H-SC is competing in its 129th season of football, and the Tigers are enjoying their 48th year as a charter member of the ODAC. FC joined the conference for the 2018-19 academic year.

Favret Coaching Final Season

Head coach Marty Favret, the all-time winningest coach in program history, announced on August 20 that 2023 will be his final season of coaching. He has attained 147 victories (147-88) and led the Tigers to 15 winning seasons with five ODAC Championships (2007, 2009, 2011, 2013, 2014) and six NCAA Division III Football Championship appearances (2007, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2013, 2014). In his 24th season, Favret is currently the longest-tenured collegiate football head coach in Virginia.

The Series

H-SC leads the overall series against FC 5-3, including three-straight wins, the most recent a 35-16 road win last season (10/8/22). The Tigers and Panthers first met on the gridiron in 2011, resulting in a 38-14 home win for H-SC. The Garnet & Grey are 3-1 at home against FC.

Scouting The Tigers

Senior quarterback Andrew Puccinelli has passed for 771 yards (59-85-0) and eight touchdowns with no interceptions this season, adding one rushing touchdown. Puccinelli made his first start of the season at Greensboro (9/16) and passed for a career-high 368 yards (30-42) and three touchdowns, adding the rushing touchdown, as well. He passed for a game-high 333 yards (24-37-0) and four touchdowns, tying is career-high, last week vs. Bridgewater (9/30).

Senior running back Melik Frost has rushed for 260 yards on 75 attempts and three touchdowns.

Sophomore wide receiver Mason Cunningham has 27 receptions for 257 yards and one touchdown. Junior wide receiver Austin Fernandez has 18 receptions for 258 yards and two touchdowns. Senior wide receiver Jahmahdia Whitby has 17 receptions for 198 yards and three touchdowns. Senior wide receiver Braeden Bowling has 11 receptions for 219 yards and two touchdowns.

Senior All-American safety and team captain Will Pickren has 39 total tackles, including 11 solo, one tackle for loss, two interceptions, two pass breakups, one fumble recovery/return for a touchdown and one blocked punt. Senior linebacker Dorian Green has 34 total tackles, including 12 solo, two tackles for loss, 0.5 sacks, one forced fumble and one quarterback hurry. Senior safety James-Ryan Salvi has 33 total tackles, including 10 solo, and 1.5 tackles for loss. Junior linebacker Jackson Lott and freshman linebacker Harrison Wood each have 24 total tackles ... including seven solo, 0.5 tackles for loss and 0.5 sacks by Lott ... and eight solo, 2.5 tackles for loss and one sack by Wood. Senior cornerback Tobias Lafayette has 21 total tackles, including 14 solo, one tackle for loss and four pass breakups.

Sophomore placekicker Elijah Swett is 17-20 (85%) on PAT kicks and 4-6 (67%) on field goals, including a season-long of 41 yards. Swett has averaged 57.8 yards on 27 kickoffs (seven-yard line) with three touchbacks.

Senior punter George Langhammer has averaged 32.2 yards on just six punts, including a long of 47 yards.

Sophomore wide receiver Joseph Gonzalez has averaged 20.6 yards on seven kick returns, including a long of 30 yards. Mason Cunningham has averaged 4.3 yards on three punt returns, including a long of seven yards.

Scouting The Panthers

Graduate quarterback Braxton Hughes has passed for 547 yards (49-81-1) and four touchdowns with one interception—adding one rushing touchdown. Freshman running back Jahylen Lee has rushed for 202 yards on 55 attempts and one touchdown. Senior wide receiver Ryan Downer has 17 receptions for 128 yards, while junior wide receiver Marquise Woodruff has 16 receptions for 215 yards and one touchdown.

Sophomore linebacker Cameron Ross has 32 total tackles, including 14 solo, and 1.5 tackles for loss. Senior linebacker Hunter Cannaday has 27 total tackles, including 16 solo, and three tackles for loss. Sophomore safety Ian Ashworth has 20 total tackles, including 11 solo, and one pass breakup.

Junior placekicker Seth Deaton is 7-7 on PAT kicks (100%) and 7-8 (88%) on field goals, including a season-long of 40 yards. He has averaged 55.5 yards on 16 kickoffs (10-yard line) with two touchbacks. Deaton has averaged 34.0 yards on 21 punts, including a long of 50 yards, with five fair-caught and six inside the 20.

Freshman cornerback TreVonte McGahee has averaged 18.2 yards on five kick returns, including a long of 26 yards, and has averaged 15.0 yards on six punt returns, including a long of 45 yards.

Among the ODAC Leaders

Andrew Puccinelli leads the ODAC in passing yards (771), passing yards per game (257.0), passing efficiency (176.7), completion percentage (69.4) and total offense per game (253.0), and is tied for first in passing touchdowns (8).

Will Pickren has one of only two fumble returns for a touchdown in the ODAC, is tied for second in interceptions (2) and passes defended (4), fourth in total tackles (39) and tackles per game (9.8), and tied for fourth in fumbles recovered.

Mason Cunningham leads the ODAC in receptions (27), and is third in receiving yards (257) and receiving yards per game (64.3).

Austin Fernandez is second in the ODAC in receiving yards (258) and receiving yards per game (64.5), is tied for second in receptions (18), and is tied for sixth in receiving touchdowns (2).

Elijah Swett is second in the ODAC in kick scoring points per game (7.3), tied for second in field goals (4) and ninth in points per game (7.3).

Tobias Lafayette is tied for second in the ODAC in pass breakups (4) and passes defended (4).

Sophomore safety **Jaylan Long** is tied for second in the ODAC in interceptions (2).

Braeden Bowling is fourth in the ODAC in receiving yards (219) and receiving yards per game (54.8), fifth in yards per reception (19.9), tied for sixth in receiving touchdowns (2) and tied for 10th in receptions (11).

Jamahdia Whitby is tied for fourth in the ODAC in receptions (17) and receiving touchdowns (3), and seventh in receiving yards (198) and receiving yards per game (49.5).

Dorian Green is tied for fourth in the ODAC in fumbles forced (1), and is tied for fifth in total tackles (34) and tackles per game (8.5).

Sophomore cornerback **James Townsend** is tied for fourth in the ODAC in fumbles forced (1) and fumbles recovered (1).

Junior defensive end **Brendan Wallace** is tied for fourth in the ODAC in fumbles forced (1) and tied for 10th in sacks (1.5).

Senior defensive tackle **Braxton Mergenthal** is tied for fourth in the ODAC in fumbles recovered (1).

Joseph Gonzalez is fifth in the ODAC in kick return average (20.6).

Melik Frost is eighth in the ODAC in rushing yards (260) and rushing yards per game (65.0), and tied for eighth in rushing touchdowns (3).

James-Ryan Salvi is eighth in the ODAC in total tackles (33) and tackles per game (8.3).

What A Debut

Carter Sido made quite the splash in his first collegiate start at quarterback in the season-opener vs. Wabash (9/2). Sido accounted for 337 yards of total offense and four touchdowns ... rushing for a game-high and career-high 184 yards and three touchdowns ... and passing for

153 yards and one touchdown. It's believed to be a school record for single-game rushing yards by a quarterback — he had seven runs of 10-plus yards or more, including three of 20-plus yards — a 46-yard touchdown run being his longest. The second-year standout from Dallas, Texas was playing in only his seventh college game overall, and just his fourth college game at QB.

ODAC Offensive Player of the Week

Carter Sido was named the ODAC Football Offensive Player of the Week for week one of the 2023 season. (See What A Debut) He got started early when he broke loose on a third-and-one, running 46 yards down the middle of the field to the end zone at 13:03 of the first quarter for his first rushing touchdown, before completing a 16-yard touchdown pass to Sutton Lasso at 5:11 of the second quarter. Sido added two fourth-quarter rushing touchdowns, including an 11-yard touchdown run with 10:17 remaining, and a one-yard touchdown run at 4:23 of the final stanza—his third rushing touchdown of the game. He is currently out with an injury.

ODAC Offensive Player of the Week

Andrew Puccinelli was named the ODAC Football Offensive Player of the Week for week three of the 2023 season. He passed for a game-high and career-high 368 yards (30-42-0) and three touchdowns with no interceptions, adding one rushing touchdown, while making his first start of the season during a 58-28 road win at Greensboro (9/16). He scored on a one-yard touchdown run at 10:37 of the first quarter, and then connected with Austin Fernandez on a 67-yard touchdown pass at 5:27 of the second quarter, before adding two third-quarter touchdown passes ... an eight-yard touchdown pass to Jamahdia Whitby at 4:55 and a four-yard touchdown pass to JT Diehl at 1:33.

Sutton Lasso caught his first collegiate receiving touchdown in the season-opener vs. Wabash (9/2) ... a 16-yard catch from Carter Sido in the second quarter. Sophomore running back **Markevus Graves-Franklin** caught his first collegiate receiving touchdown vs. Brevard (9/9) ... a two-yard catch from Carter Sido in the first quarter—*Graves-Franklin* scored his first collegiate rushing touchdown at Greensboro (9/16) ... a six-yard run in the second quarter. **Will Pickren** scored his first collegiate touchdown at Greensboro (9/16) ... a 33-yard fumble return in the second quarter. Junior running back **JT Diehl** caught his first collegiate receiving touchdown at Greensboro (9/16) ... a four-yard catch from Andrew Puccinelli in the third quarter. Freshman running back **Terry Hicks** scored his first collegiate rushing touchdown at Greensboro (9/16) ... a 24-yard run in the fourth quarter.

Career Watch: Will Pickren

The 2022 First Team AP Division III All-American and three-time First Team All-ODAC safety currently totals 306 career tackles, and now needs just 39 to equal and 40 to surpass and become the school's all-time leader in tackles. Brendan Weinberg '22 is the current career leader in tackles with 345.

100/200-Yard Rushing Games

Melik Frost has five career games with 100-plus yards rushing, including a career-high 211 yards on 21 attempts (10.0) and four touchdowns last season vs. Greensboro (9/17/22). It was the sixth-best single-game rushing effort in program history. He had his first 100-yard rushing game this season with 103 yards on 23 attempts and one touchdown vs. Brevard (9/9) ... and had three other 100-yard rushing games in 2022, including 101 yards on 17 attempts and two touchdowns at Wabash (9/3), 105 yards on 18 attempts and one touchdown at Ferrum (10/8) and 125 yards on 30 attempts and three touchdowns vs. Guilford (10/29).

300-Yard Passing Games

Andrew Puccinelli has three career 300-yard passing games, including 305 yards (28-33-2) and a career-high four touchdowns vs. Greensboro (9/17/22) in his first collegiate start ... a career-high 368 yards (30-42-0) and three touchdowns at Greensboro (9/16) in his first start of this season, and second of his career ... and 333 yards (24-37-0) and four touchdowns, tying his career-high, vs. Bridgewater (9/30).

100-Yard Receiving Games

Austin Fernandez has four career games with 100-plus yards receiving, including one this season — 109 yards on four receptions and one touchdown at Greensboro (9/16). He had three 100-yard receiving games in 2022, including 134 yards on five receptions and one touchdown vs. Widener (9/10), 124 yards on seven receptions and one touchdown at Bridgewater (10/1) and a career-high 165 yards on eight receptions and one touchdown vs. Averett (10/15).

100-Yard Receiving Games

Mason Cunningham has four career games with 100-plus yards receiving, including one this season — 103 yards on five receptions and one touchdown vs. Brevard (9/9). He had three 100-yard receiving games in 2022, including 116 yards on nine receptions and one touchdown vs. Greensboro (9/17), a career-high 163 yards on a career-high 13 receptions and a career-high three touchdowns at Ferrum (10/8) and 130 yards on nine receptions and two touchdowns vs. Averett (10/15).

100-Yard Receiving Games

Braeden Bowling has three career games with 100-plus yards receiving, including one this season — a career-high 181 yards on five receptions and two touchdowns to tie his career-high vs. Bridgewater (9/30). He had two 100-yard receiving games in 2021, including 169 yards on a career-high seven receptions and one touchdown at Guilford (9/25/21) and 133 yards on two receptions and a career-high two touchdowns vs. Ferrum (10/23/21).

100-Yard Receiving Game

Jamahdia Whitby had the first 100-yard receiving game of his collegiate career with a game-high and career-high 123 yards on a game-high and career-high eight receptions and one touchdown at Greensboro (9/16). His size, speed and athleticism has drawn interest from several National Football League (NFL) teams this fall with their visits to practice.

William V. Campbell Trophy®

George Langhammer was named a semifinalist for the 2023 William V. Campbell Trophy®, college football's premier scholar-athlete award, as announced on Sept. 27 by the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF). He was among a record number of 201 semifinalists from all divisions, while one of only two from the ODAC and 48 selected from Division III. Langhammer is the College's fourth consecutive semifinalist, following **Tyler Howerton '21**, **Kaleb Smith '22** and **Michael Harris '23**—Howerton went on to become one of 12 finalists for the prestigious award in 2020. George is a six-time Dean's List student majoring in foreign affairs with a minor in Spanish and has attained a 3.91 GPA.

Team Captains

Leading the Tigers are senior offensive tackle **TJ Minter**, senior safety **Will Pickren**, senior safety **James-Ryan Salvi** and senior defensive end **Tramell Thompson**. Minter becomes a two-time team captain after serving in the leadership role last season, as well, while Pickren, Salvi and Thompson are each first-time team captains. TJ is the son of the late Tony Minter and Catherine Minter. Will is the son of Wilson and Renee Pickren. James-Ryan is the son of Ryan and Denise Salvi. Tramell is the son of Chelsea Thompson.

Marty Favret is in his 24th year as the Head Football Coach at Hampden-Sydney College during 2023-24. He announced on August 20, 2023 that this would be his final season at the helm of the Tigers, after being named the new head coach on December 30, 1999. Favret is the all-time winningest football coach in school history with 147 victories (147-88), and ranks second all-time for program winning percentage (.626) among coaches with at least five seasons. He has led the Tigers to 15 winning seasons in 23 years, including 10 seasons with at least eight wins, while a five-time Old Dominion Athletic Conference (ODAC) Coach of the Year (2003, 2007, 2009, 2011, 2013). His program is 95-52 (.646) in ODAC games, while winning five ODAC Championships (2007, 2009, 2011, 2013, 2014) and earning six NCAA Division III Football Championship appearances (2007, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2013, 2014). Marty is currently the longest-tenured collegiate football head coach in Virginia.

Favret has coached 25 All-Americans, including four former Tigers who were two-time All-Americans, and seven who have been First Team All-Americans—one a two-time First Team honoree (Bill Doody, 2009-10). H-SC has had four Academic All-America® selections during Favret's tenure, including one two-time honoree (Tyler Howerton, 2019-20), and three have also been named the ODAC Football Scholar Athlete of the Year—one the overall ODAC Scholar Athlete of the Year (Tyler Howerton), as well. Nine Tiger football standouts have won the Gammon Cup, awarded to the student-athlete member of the graduating class who has best served the College in terms of character, scholarship and athletic ability. H-SC football has had 114 First Team All-ODAC selections under Favret, including one four-time honoree (Ben Rogers, 2008-11), seven three-time honorees (Chris Scott, 2000-02; C.W. Clemmons, 2002-04; Ben Dull, 2003-05; Paul Williams, 2004-06; Will Farrell (2011-13; Holton Walker, 2012-14; Will Pickren, 2020-22) and 16 two-time honorees. Additionally, the program has had numerous second and third team All-ODAC selections during his tenure.

H-SC completed its 2022 season with a record of 5-5. The Tigers enjoyed a four-game winning streak during a successful stretch of the season that included five wins in six games—among them a thrilling 44-43 overtime road win at Washington and Lee on October 22 (2022) in Lexington that gave Coach Favret the most football coaching wins in school history. H-SC placed nine team members on the All-ODAC Team, including four on the First Team, and WR Mason Cunningham earned ODAC Rookie of the Year honors—the program's fourth rookie of the year since 2015. S Will Pickren was named to the Associated Press (AP) Division III All-America First-Team, the program's first AP All-American since the non-profit news agency headquartered in New York City relaunched its Division III All-America Team selections in 2017. Pickren was also an American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Division III Coaches' Second Team All-America selection, while four Tigers earned D3football.com All-Region 3 honors, including Pickren (First Team), TE David Byler, RB Melik Frost and OL TJ Minter—the latter three earning Third Team accolades.

H-SC completed its traditional 2021 fall season with a record of 5-5. The Tigers played a difficult schedule as seven of their nine NCAA opponents had winning records, combining to win 62 percent of their respective games; in fact, the schedule ranked as the fourth-most difficult among 239 Division III schools, according to D3football.com. The effort did not go unnoticed with 11 team members earning All-ODAC honors, including five First Team selections. Brendan Weinberg was named the Touchdown Club of Richmond State Small College Linebacker of the Year and Second Team All-Region 3 by D3football.com. S Will Pickren was named the Touchdown Club of Richmond State Small College Defensive Back of the Year and Third Team All-Region 3.

H-SC was able to play an abbreviated five-game schedule during the Spring of 2021, after the traditional 2020 fall season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Tigers finished with a record of 4-1, winning the third-place game of the ODAC's first-ever (only) Football Championship Weekend. Based upon winning percentage (4-1, .800), it was the finest season for the program since 2010 (9-2, .818). TE Ed Newman was named to the D3football.com All-America Second Team, while OL Brad Gholson was named to the All-Region Second Team. H-SC had 11 All-ODAC selections, including six that earned First Team honors, while OL Tyler Howerton was voted the ODAC's 2020-21 Harry G. "Doc" Jopson Scholar-Athlete Award Winner as the conference's top male scholar-athlete. Howerton was also the ODAC (Football) Scholar-Athlete of the Year after being selected as one of 12 finalists nationwide for the prestigious 2020 William V. Campbell Trophy® ... the academic Heisman for college football. Howerton was a 2020-21 Academic All-America® Division III Football First Team honoree, as well, as selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). S Will Pickren was named the ODAC Rookie of the Year, as well.

In 2019, H-SC finished with an uncharacteristic record of 1-9 with six All-ODAC selections—two earning First Team honors, while Major Morgan was named the Touchdown Club of Richmond State Small College Wide Receiver of the Year for the second consecutive season. In addition, OL Tyler Howerton was voted to the 2019 Academic All-America® Division III Football First Team, and PK Rhett Andersen was tabbed to the 2019 Academic All-America® Division III Football Second Team, as selected by CoSIDA. Howerton was also named a 2020 Goldwater Scholar, the College's first ever physics department recipient.

In 2018, the Tigers finished with a record of 4-5, though second in the ODAC (4-3) for the 10th time under Favret with nine All-ODAC selections, including four on the First Team, and RB Kaleb Smith was named the ODAC Rookie of the Year. In addition, Major Morgan was named the Touchdown Club of Richmond State Small College Wide Receiver of the Year. H-SC finished third in Division III passing offense (381.0) and 19th in total offense (457.3).

In 2017, H-SC finished with a record of 6-4 and had 12 All-ODAC selections, including WR Cam Johnson earning ODAC Offensive Player of the Year honors. The Tigers finished 12th in Division III passing offense (320.8). It was a solid bounce-back season after the squad finished 3-7 in 2016.

In 2015, the Tigers enjoyed their ninth consecutive winning season, finishing with a record of 6-4. The team had 14 All-ODAC selections, including five First Team honorees, and RB Kyree Koonce was named the ODAC Rookie of the Year.

In 2014, H-SC repeated as ODAC Champions, Favret's fifth conference title and the program's ninth overall while becoming the first team to win back-to-back ODAC titles since 2005. Finishing with a record of 7-4, the Tigers again had a strong award showing with 11 named All-ODAC, including three First Team choices. Additionally, QB Nash Nance won the Touchdown Club of Richmond's Lanier Award as the State Small College Player of the Year in Virginia for NCAA Division II, III and NAIA.

In 2013, Favret won his fourth ODAC Championship, the programs' eighth and for the first time in school history, H-SC advanced to the second round of the NCAA Playoffs. The Tigers finished with a record of 9-3 (6-1 ODAC) and a No. 18 national ranking (D3football.com). On October 19 (2013), Favret won his 100th game with a 33-12 road win at Emory & Henry, and H-SC also earned a 28-26 road win at archrival Randolph-Macon. He coached three All-Americans, and his first D3football.com South Region Offensive Player of the Year (QB Nash Nance). Favret was named the ODAC Coach of the Year for the fifth time, and was the Virginia Sports Information Directors' (VaSID) Co-Coach of the Year, the third time being recognized by VaSID. H-SC placed 13 on the All-ODAC Team, including nine First Team selections, and LB Tyler Ikwild followed in the footsteps of

his older brother (Trevor) in garnering ODAC Defensive Player of the Year honors.

In 2012, the Tigers posted another winning record of 6-4 while leading the conference in scoring offense (36.5, 28th in Division III). H-SC had 12 players on All-ODAC teams, including six on the First Team. For the fourth-straight season, Favret coached an All-American (Will Ferrell, AFCA).

In 2011, Favret's Tigers won their third ODAC Championship since 2007 and advanced to the NCAA Playoffs for the third consecutive season — fourth in five years. Favret and crew finished with a record of 8-3 (5-1 ODAC), including a 5-0 mark at home to extend the win-streak at Lewis C. Everett Stadium to 15 (ended at 16 the following season). H-SC ranked second in Division III passing offense (340.6), and seventh in both total offense (474.5) and scoring (41.9). Favret was named the ODAC Coach of the Year for the fourth time while also capturing the same honors from VaSID.

In 2010, Favret guided the Tigers (9-2, 5-1 ODAC) to nine wins for the third time in his early tenure while earning a home game in the NCAA Playoffs for the second consecutive season. The Tigers completed the regular season with a 31-28 home win past Randolph-Macon for its ninth win in 11 games against their archrival under Favret. H-SC ranked 10th in Division III passing offense (307.6). LB Trevor Ikwild was named the ODAC Defensive Player of the Year.

In 2009, Favret led his squad to an unbeaten and perfect 10-0 regular season record (10-1, 6-0 ODAC) for just the second time in school history (1971), and the program's sixth overall ODAC Championship. That season also marked the third time Favret was named the ODAC Coach of the Year, as well as earning VaSID and Touchdown Club of Richmond State Small College Coach of the Year honors. DE Will Riegenbach earned ODAC Defensive Player of the Year honors, while LB Josh Miller was the ODAC Scholar-Athlete of the Year. H-SC ranked 10th in Division III passing offense (310.0) that year, making its second NCAA Playoff appearance under Favret, and first playoff game at home (second ever).

From 2002 through 2008, the Tigers won eight or more games during six of the seven seasons (53-18). H-SC won its first ODAC Championship under Favret in 2007 (8-3, 5-1 ODAC), earning the first NCAA Playoff appearance under Favret, as well, and the program's first (second ever) since 1977. Favret was named the ODAC Coach of the Year after six consecutive conference runner-up finishes, ranking eighth in Division III passing offense (317.0), 11th in total offense (465.5) and 19th in scoring (35.8). The Tigers finished among the Top Five in Division III total offense and passing offense during 2003, 2005 and 2008, and were second nationally in scoring (45.0) in 2005. The 2003 Tigers led the nation in scoring (47.2), and Favret earned his first ODAC Coach of the Year honor, while WR Conrad Singh was the ODAC Co-Player of the Year. The 2004 squad was among the Top 15 nationally in the three offensive categories, with RB C.W. Clemmons earning ODAC Offensive Player of the Year and ODAC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, and WR Drew Smith was named the ODAC Rookie of the Year—Smith later became the ODAC Offensive Player of the Year in 2007. The 2005 team led the nation in total offense (525.2), as QB J.D. Ricca was the ODAC Offensive Player of the Year. Records during this period included 8-2 (2002), 9-1 (2003), 8-2 (2004), 8-2 (2005), 4-6 (2006), 8-3 (2007) and 8-2 (2008).

Favret led H-SC to a record of 4-6 in his first year at the helm in 2000, equaling the win total of the previous three seasons combined, and followed with a record of 5-5 in 2001, including a 38-26 road win at archrival Randolph-Macon, that began a seven-game winning streak against the Yellow Jackets (2001-07). The .500 record that season was the program's first since 1993.

Prior to taking over at H-SC, Favret served as the offensive coordinator and assistant head coach at Catholic (DC) University for six seasons, where he was the architect of one of the most prolific offenses in Division III. Under his direction, CUA finished in the Top 30 in the country in scoring five times. His offenses set 75 school records, including the school's Top Three single-season scoring records. Over the course of his last three seasons at Catholic, he helped guide the Cardinals to a 29-1 regular season record and three NCAA Playoff appearances. In 1999, CUA's first year as an ODAC football member, the school claimed the conference title while the Favret-led offense topped the conference in both total offense and scoring.

Before joining the Catholic staff, Favret served for four years as the head junior varsity football coach at his alma mater, Gonzaga College High School in Washington, D.C. He became the Purple Eagles' varsity offensive coordinator in 1991, helping the team earn a No. 6 national ranking in 1993.

Favret was born in Washington, D.C. and graduated from the Catholic University of America in 1984 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in history. He was a three-year starter at shooting guard for the Catholic U. basketball team from 1981-84, serving as team captain during his junior and senior seasons. Favret established a school record as a sophomore when he connected on 18 consecutive field goals. Prior to graduating from Gonzaga College High School, Favret played basketball for two years and baseball for one.

Marty and his wife, Cynthia, reside in Hampden-Sydney and have two daughters, Rebecca and Amanda.

MARTY FAVRET ANNOUNCES 2023 WILL BE HIS FINAL SEASON

HAMPDEN-SYDNEY, Va. – Hampden-Sydney College football head coach **Marty Favret**, the all-time winningest coach in program history, announced on Sunday night that 2023 will be his final season of coaching. In 23 seasons at the College, he has attained 145 victories (145-86) and led the Tigers to 15 winning seasons with five Old Dominion Athletic Conference (ODAC) Championships (2007, 2009, 2011, 2013, 2014) and six NCAA Division III Football Championship appearances (2007, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2013, 2014). Favret is currently the longest-tenured collegiate football head coach in Virginia.

“For nearly a quarter century, I’ve had the best job in college football. HAMPDEN-SYDNEY FOOTBALL

H-SC has a 128-plus year history of football, amassing 574 wins since beginning in 1892. The Tigers have experienced great success over the years, including nine ODAC Championships, nine Mason-Dixon Conference Championships, seven NCAA Division III Championship appearances, 86 All-Americans, 16 Academic All-America selections and 214 First Team All-ODAC honorees. H-SC also played in the 1970 and 1971 Knute Rockne Bowls (NCAA College Division East Regional Championship).

FROM DIVISION III TO FBS MEMPHIS

Ryan Silverfield '03 became the 25th head coach in the University of Memphis football history in December 2019. He is currently 25-16 overall in his fourth season at the helm of the Tigers, including 4-1 in 2023. Silverfield led Memphis to a record of 7-6 in 2022 following an 8-3 season in 2020, and the Tigers were 6-6 in 2021. Ryan coached four seasons as an undergraduate at H-SC, starting as an offensive assistant in 2000, serving as the defensive line coach during 2001 and 2002, before coaching the tight ends and H-backs in 2003.
