Practice

All practice sessions are open to media and public unless otherwise posted. On days when post-practice interviews are conducted, media may gather and view the final 20-30 minutes of practice before the workout is complete. Media members wishing to film practice must contact the Media Relations office two days prior to coming to practice. All media must wear issued credentials to practice to film or take pictures.

Credentials

Media credentials should be requested via e-mail at least one week in advance of game and will be mailed if time permits. Otherwise, credentials can be picked up at the Media Will Call at the base of the middle elevator shaft on the press box side of Bearcat Stadium on game day. Media Will Call opens two and half hours prior to game time. Media seating is limited, so credentials will be issued according to the following protocol:

- 1. Local newspapers, wire services, national publications and newspapers regularly covering the Bearcats and opponent.
- 2. Other daily newspapers with a preference to those covering the Bearcats on a regular basis.
- 3. Radio and television personnel reporting but not broadcasting.
- 4. Scouts from professional teams.
- 5. Non-daily publications with a preference to those covering the Bearcats on a regular basis.
- 6. Magazines and newsletters focusing primarily on one team with a preference to those covering the Bearcats on a regular basis.

Game Day Interviews

Northwest's locker room is closed to the media at home and on the road. For NCAA playoff games, the non-advancing coach and players will be available first followed by the advancing team and coach. Any individuals selected for postgame press conference cannot do any other interviews prior to press conference.

Photographers

Photo credentials should be requested in the same manner as regular media credentials. Camera persons must stay out of the team area on both sidelines or they will be escorted from the stadium. Photo credentials will be issued according to the following protocol:

- 1. Local newspapers, wire services, national publications, local TV stations stations regularly covering the Bearcats and/or the opponent.

THE COACHES

Northwest is led by fifth-year head coach Rich Wright. Wright was named head coach at Northwest Missouri on Dec. 19, 2016. Wright has posted a 38-9 mark for the Bearcats. Wright arrived at Northwest in 2004 as the defensive line coach and coordinator of special teams. In 2011, Wright was named defensive coordinator and assistant head coach. A native of Hamilton, N.Y., Wright earned his bachelor's degree at Dana College in 1995 and his master's at Northwest in 1996.

Atiba Bradley was named the 14th head football coach in the history of Missouri Southern on

February 5, 2021. He becomes the first graduate of Missouri Southern to lead the Southern football program. Bradley went 1-0 in his only game in the spring of 2021. As a player at MSSU, Bradley was a twotime All-MIAA honorable mention pick as a linebacker. During his senior season, he finished as Missouri Southern's second-leading tackler with 72 stops (30 solo), including 9.5 for losses and one sack. Bradley was ninth in the MIAA that year in tackles. In his career, Bradley finished with 224 tackles, including 17.5 for a loss of 69 yards, 6.5 sacks for a loss of 52 yards, four forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries and one interception for a return of 37 yards.

HOHENSEE GRABS MIAA OF-FENSIVE POW HONOR

Quarterback Mike Hohensee has been named the MIAA's football offensive athlete of the week presented by Mammoth Turf.

Hohensee passed for 270 yards (14-of-18, 3 TDs) and rushed for 68 yards (1 TD) as he led Northwest to a 66-13 Homecoming win over No. 17-ranked Neb.-Kearney.

Hohensee engineered six firsthalf (seven total) touchdown drives and completed 77% of his passes for a 258.8 QB rating against the Lopers. Hohensee rushed a 56-yard touchdown in the first quarter to put Northwest on top for good at 12-7. He connected on three touchdown throws to three different receivers (Imoni Donadelle - 55 yards; Trevon Alexander - 15 yards; Cole Hembrough - 9 yards). He also rushed for a two-point conversion following the 55-yard touchdown toss to Donadelle. Hohensee was responsible for 32 points in the victory.

DAVIS TAKES OPENING KICK TO THE HOUSE

Kaden Davis took a reverse from teammate Imoni Donadelle on the opening kickoff of the game 90 yards for a touchdown en route to a convincing 66-13 win at home over No. 17-ranked Nebraska-Kearney.

Davis tallied 123 kick return yards against the Lopers. He also tallied three receptions for 73 yards. On the day, Davis registered 196 all-purpose yards on five touches.

Davis ranks tied for No. 6 in the MIAA and leads the Bearcats with six touchdown receptions.

Davis has 21 total catches for 348 yards. He is averaging 16.6 yards per catch.

YOU CAN CALL ME AL

Senior running back Al McKeller leads the MIAA and ranks No. 10 in the nation in rushing yards per game (128.5 yards/game).

McKeller has carried the ball 168 times for 1,028 rushing yards, which ranks as the nation's 11th-highest total in 2021.

McKeller recorded his 22nd collegiate 100-plus rushing game with 130 rushing yards at Northeastern State.

McKeller joined the Bearcats after transferring from the University of Indianapolis.



Northwest avoided back-to-back losses with a convincing 59-7 victory at Northeastern State after coming off a 17-16 loss at Washburn.

Northwest last dropped two straight MIAA games on Oct. 28, 2017 at Pittsburg State and then lost the following week at home on Nov. 5, 2017, against Fort Hays State.

Prior to those losses to PSU and FHSU in 2017, Northwest had not lost consecutive MIAA games since a three-game skid in 2001 against Truman State, Central Missouri and Missouri Western.

MORE & MORE MOYA

Junior Jamar Moya enjoyed a breakout performance in Saturday's 59-7 win at Northeastern State.

Entering Saturday, Moya had rushed the ball 11 times for 55 yards and had caught three passes for 36 vards.

Against the RiverHawks, Moya simply took over. He carried the ball eight times for 169 yards (21.1 yards/rush) and two touchdowns. He also caught four passes for 22 yards and two more scores.

Mova tallied touchdown runs of 10 and 71 yards and receiving scores of 16 and five yards against the RiverHawks.

MOYA'S LONG RUN

Jamar Moya's 71-yard touchdown run was the longest rushing play by a Bearcat since James Franklin had a 74-yard run against Emporia State on Nov. 12, 2011.

COMEBACK 'CATS

Northwest produced its 11th comefrom-behind victory, and the largest second-half comeback, in the head coach Rich Wright era in Saturday's

Sophomore quarterback Mike Hohensee directed three second-half touchdown drives to lead a Northwest comeback that saw the Bearcats trailing 16-0 with 10:39 to play in the third quarter.

Hohensee hit Kaden Davis for a 33-yard touchdown strike with 7:59 to play in the third. Following a PSU field goal, Hohensee drove the Bearcats for another touchdown that was capped off with a 23-yard scoring pass to Jadon Brady. The Hohensee to Brady connection trimmed the PSU lead to 19-14 with 0:53 left in the third.

Hohensee then led the game-winning drive that was comprised 79 yards in 10 plays and consumed 4:30 off the block in the fourth. Hohensee went 5-for-6 passing on the drive, including an 8-yard touchdown pass to Davis on 3rd-and-goal with 5:15 to play in the game.

Hohensee finished the game going 17-of-23 passing for 199 yards and three touchdowns. He also ran for 12 yards on two carries.

However, the Bearcat defense responded with the first turnover of the game as Barnes intercepted a pass and returned it 15 yards to turn away the Mules drive. His interception led to a touchdown four plays later and Northwest did not look back en route to the 40-point win.

Davis has tallied two 100-yard receiving games in his career and both have come against the Mules.

Davis posted four receptions for 103 yards and two touchdowns in Northwest's 47-7 win at UCM.

The Bearcat defense put on quite an impressive performance in the 15-7 win at Fort Hays State.

Northwest did not allow Fort Hays State to begin a play in the red zone. The closest FHSU got to the red zone was the 22-yard line.

FHSU's average starting field position for the game was its own

15-yard line. In the first quarter, FH-SU's average starting position was its own 4-yard line. It improved to their own 31-yard line in the second quarter. FHSU's average starting position in the third quarter was its own 11-yard line. FHSU's fourth quarter average starting position was its own 22-yard line.

The Bearcats held the Tigers to eight rushing yards in the first half and 48 total rushing yards in the game.

HOHENSEE NAMED MIAA SPECIAL TEAMS ATHLETE OF WEEK

Sophomore Mike Hohensee was named the MIAA's Special Teams Athlete of the Week (Sept. 6).

Hohensee (St. Charles, III.) punted seven times for a 41.4 average in a 15-7 victory at Fort Hays State. Four of his punts were downed inside the 20-yard line, including a pair at the one-yard line.

Hohensee recorded the longest punt of the 2021 season by any MIAA player when he unleashed a 73-yard punt in the third quarter.

3RD-LONGEST STRETCH BE-TWEEN BEARCAT VICTORIES

Northwest scored a 15-7 victory at Fort Hays State to begin the 2021 season. It marked the first victory for the Bearcats in 642 days - the third-longest stretch between victories in school history.

Northwest has been tabbed as the top team by both the coaches and the media in the 2021 MIAA football preseason polls. Northwest was also pegged at No. 4 in the 2021 Preseason American Football Coaches' Association Top 25 Poll and the D2FootballCom Top 25 Poll.

NEW TO THE STAFF

Head coach Rich Wright added Todd Sturdy to the Bearcat coaching staff in the offseason.

Sturdy will serve as the offensive coordinator at Northwest and he brings a wealth of coaching experience with him to Maryville. Sturdy has coached football at the FBS, FCS and NAIA levels for 28 years. He has served as an offensive coordinator in 20 seasons. In 14 seasons as a head coach at the collegiate level, Sturdy has compiled a record of 96-51.

Wright also added Roberto Davis to coach the Bearcat running backs and Zach Martin to serve as the Northwest wide receivers coach.

It's not easy to get on the Academic All-America list. The Bearcats do a pretty good job of filling it up though, placing 19 players on the list, including 18 since 2003. The facility is named for the Carl and Cheryl Hughes family, who committed a significant gift to the project through the Hughes Family Foundation.

HEAD COACH

Richard Wright was named head coach at Northwest Missouri on Dec. 19, 2016. He arrived at Northwest in 2004 as the defensive line coach and coordinator of special teams. In 2011, Wright was named defensive coordinator and assistant head coach.

Wright led the Bearcats to the program's 30th MIAA title in 2019. Northwest secured its 24th trip to the NCAA Division II playoffs, which marked the 16th consecutive season the Bearcats have been selected to compete in the playoffs.

Northwest collected its 49th and 50th Division II playoff victories in 2019 with a 7-6 win over Harding and a 63-7 triumph over Lindenwood. Northwest is the first program in Division II history to record 50 playoff victories. The Bearcats finished the 2019 season ranked No. 7.

The 2019 Bearcats had five first-team all-MIAA selections in Spencer Phillips, Tanner Owen and Blake Bayer. Phillips was named the MIAA Defensive Player of the Year.

The 2018 Bearcats had five first-team all-MIAA selections in Austen Eskew, Zach Flott, Anthony Lane, Tanner Owen and Sam Roberts. Braden Wright was named the MIAA Freshman of the Year.

Northwest ranked No. 6 in the nation in scoring defense (14.6 ppg) and No. 7 in rushing defense (89.1 yards/game). Northwest had a streak of 19 straight games without giving up a rushing touchdown that stretched from the 2016 season into the 2018 campaign. All four starters on the defensive line earned all-MIAA honors - Austen Eskew (first team), Sam Roberts (first team), Mike Ehlke (honorable mention) and Spencer Phillips (honorable mention).

The Northwest defense continued to be dominating in 2017. The Bearcats ranked first in the nation in scoring defense (9.3 ppg), total defense (212.8 yards/game), blocked punts (7) and third down conversion defense (19.9 percent). Northwest limited the opposition to 62.0 yards per game on the ground. The Bearcat defense did not allow a rushing touchdown in 2017. In fact, Northwest was the only NCAA school to not allow a rushing touchdown all of last season - including FBS, FCS, Division II and Division III. The Northwest defense had three players named to the All-MIAA First Team in defensive lineman Austin Eskew, linebacker Ben Althoff and defensive back Marcus Jones.

DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR

In 2016, Northwest's defense led the nation in total yards (240.9), rushing yards (67.7), scoring (12.0) and blocked kicks (13). Four Bearcats earned first-team All-MIAA honors and four earned All-America honors. On five occasions, the Northwest defense held opponents under 200 yards of total offense and 12 times held rushing attacks under 100 yards. The Bearcats' four playoff opponents averaged just 54.7 rushing yards, 170.5 passing yards, 225.5 total yards and 9.0 points per game.

The Bearcats' 2015 national championship featured one of the most well rounded defensive units in history. Northwest led the nation in six categories including total defense, scoring defense, team sacks, rushing defense, team passing efficiency defense and third-down conversion percentage defense. The team finished atop the MIAA in 15 defensive categories as well, leading to six first-team All-MIAA selections. Collin Bevins earned the third-consecutive MIAA Defensive Player of the Year award for the

Bearcats, setting school records in sacks (15.5) and tackles for loss (26.5).

One of the most dominant defenses at any level of football could be found under Wright in 2014. The Bearcats led the nation in total defense and were ranked second in rushing defense, team pass efficiency defense and third down conversion defense. Northwest ranked third in first down defense, fourth in passing yards allowed and fifth in scoring defense. Five Bearcat defensive players earned first team All-MIAA honors including Matt Longarcre who was named the MIAA Defensive Player of the Year in 2013 and 2014.

In 2013, Wright's defense was ranked ninth in the NCAA in total defense, allowing just 292.5 yards per game. The Bearcat defense led the MIAA defensively in pass yards allowed, sacks, pass efficiency defense, turnovers gained, third down percentage defense, blocked kicks, blocked punts and total defense.

The 2012 Bearcat defense was nothing short of spectacular, ranking among the nation's elite in scoring defense (second), turnover margin (third), pass efficiency defense (seventh), pass defense (12th) and total defense (17th).

In his first season as the defensive coordinator, Josh Lorenson became the 10th All-America defensive lineman to play under Wright. The 2011 season also saw his defensive unit hold opponents under 100 yards rushing four times and under 100 yards passing three times.

ASSISTANT COACH

Northwest tied for the most sacks in the nation in 2009 when 19 Bearcats combined for 48 sacks. Former player and current graduate assistant Kendall Wright enjoyed one of the most decorated seasons as a return specialist in 2008, earning All-America accolades.

Three former players have been on NFL rosters, Longacre, Dave Tollefson and Steve Williams. Each have spent time with the Kansas City Chiefs, Carolina Panthers and New England Patriots. Tollefson is a two-time Super Bowl Champion earning his first ring with the New York Giants in 2007 and again following the 2011 season.

Wright began coaching during the 1991 season at Cortland State before spending time at Dana College (Neb.) from 1993-94. Covering several facets of coaching, Wright has been an offensive coordinator, linebackers coach, wide receivers coach and special teams coordinator.

PERSONAL

A native of Hamilton, N.Y., Wright earned his bachelor's degree at Dana College in 1995 and his master's at Northwest in 1996. Wright resides in Maryville with his wife, Sarah, who is also a Northwest alum, and their daughters, Grace and Kate.
