She received her master's degree in Portuguese and Brazilian studies at the University of Texas at Austin and later her Ph.D. in Linguistics. Dr. Natalicio also served as a language coordinator for the Peace Corp training program in

Brazil. Over the last two decades, she has written numerous books, reviews, and articles on applied linguistics, specifically on the student who has difficulty speaking English.

Her seminar title is HIGHER EDUCATION: CHANGING FACE at the Allen Hall, Salado 10 a.m.-3:30 p.m. Oct. 7.

Her lecture title is CROSSING BORDERS at Mill Creek dining room, Salado 4-6 p.m. Oct. 8. A buffet dinner follows the lecture and discussion.

The other speakers in the LITERATURE AND TRUTH series are Susan Wolf, chair of the philosophy department at The Johns Hopkins University; Joseph Brodsky, Nobel Lit-



erature Laureate; and Max Cleland, Secretary of State of Georgia.

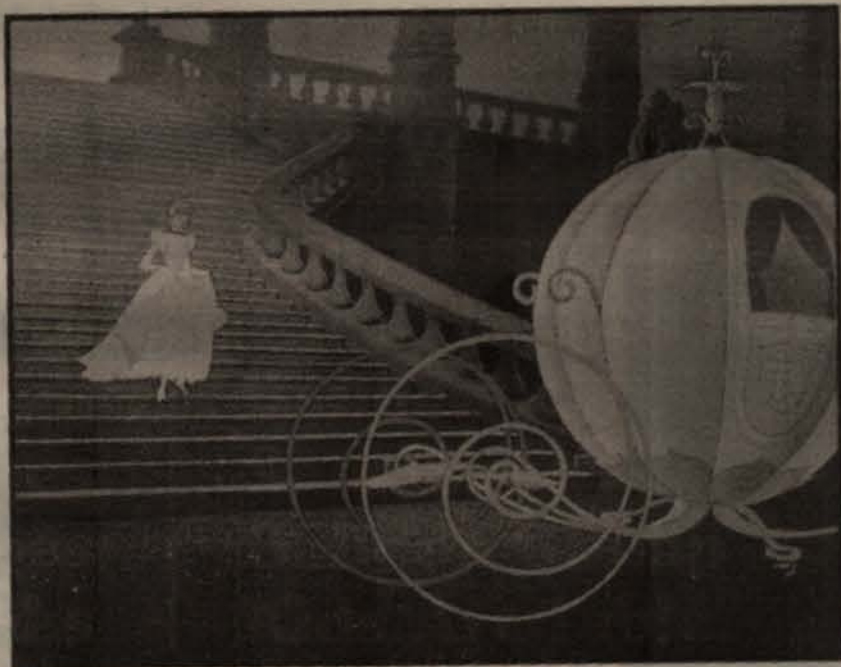

Kiss of Death

Kiss of Death is inevitably overshadowed by *Pulp Fiction*, but it is a much better film. David Caruso (NYPD Blue) makes his move to feature films as Jimmy Kilmartin, an ex-con trying to stay on the straight and narrow.

His cousin convinces him to drive in one more heist, a caper in which Jimmy is caught and serves several years in jail. But he keeps his mouth shut, and Little Junior (Nicolas Cage), brings him in under his wing.

Jimmy is forced to choose between turning in Little Junior or keeping his silence.

It is a terrific story and Caruso is outstanding in his portrayal of the ex-con. Samuel L. Jackson is also strong as Calvin, a police detective who is thrown into a strange friendship with Jimmy by fate.

Kiss of Death is violent, but it does not glorify its violence as *Pulp Fiction* did. While they are very much the same subject matter and genre, you can hardly compare *Kiss of Death* with *Pulp Fiction*.

Gramm 1st with Republican women

There are several noteworthy side-lights gleaned from the National Federation of Republican Women's convention held several days ago in Albuquerque, New Mexico.

Despite orders to the contrary, from national GOP headquarters, about holding a presidential-preference-straw poll at the convention - the ladies peacefully rebelled and went ahead with 1194 of the delegates marking a ballot.

Phil Gramm came in first with 35 percent of the total and was followed by: Lamar Alexander, Bob Dole, Pete Wilson, Alan Keyes, Richard Lugar, Pat Buchanan, Arlan Specter and Bob Dorman.

The Eagles will try to get their second win before district play starts when they face Axtell 8 p.m. Oct. 6 at Eagle Field. The Eagles fell victim to the top-ranked Thorndale Bulldogs Sept. 29 in Thorndale.

The Bulldogs were fast and furious with three touchdowns in the opening period.

Michael Calvin scored on a 17 yard run with 10:56 left in the first. The PAT kick was good to give Thorndale an early 7-0 lead.

behavior of Perot.

Or it could be that this is just another ploy to allow the multi-zillionaire to personally lead his minions into battle in 1996.

Chances of a third party power-team winning remains in doubt - although most polls show up to 60 percent of American voters are unhappy with both Democrats and Republicans alike.

The Great Pumpkin will be adorning the Square, while you have the opportunity to admire the handiwork at the pumpkin carving contest.

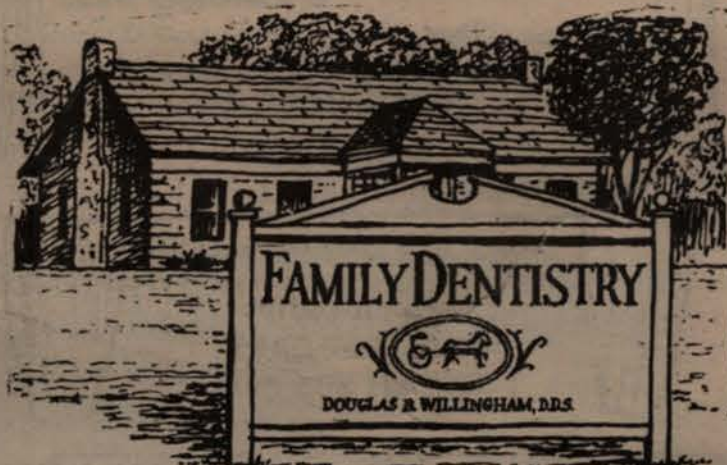

"Not your doctor or the nurse, nobody else: only you are the captain of your Health Care Team."

Tips on managing a woman's health care were valuable and varied as Dr. Wayne F. Baden spoke to members and guests of the Chisholm Trail American Business Women's Association who met in Salado Sept. 26.

"You are your first line of defense. For Pete's sake, be informed and ask questions," Baden told the group, who included "the most wonderful woman in the world," his wife and business partner Kay Baden.

The retired doctor said one of his tips for keeping ahead of the kinds of topics he could expect to come up in his office came from Kay. She alerted him to the latest issues she was reading about in the best monthly ladies' magazines, and sure enough, those were among the questions he would soon be fielding in his practice. Mrs. Baden not only was a friendly and popular receptionist in the offices of the Women's Clinic in Belton, but also has helped her husband prepare papers and materials for his published books over the years.

"If your doctor is too busy to answer your questions then you should find an-

other doctor, you really should," Baden cautioned his audience. "He can tell you what your options are but deciding what options to take is up to you. And if you're looking at a serious illness or injury, I recommend getting a second opinion, even for my own patients. Doctors aren't infallible. Get a second opinion if it's something important. If they don't want you to get a second opinion-look out. He should give you two or three doctors to consider, not just railroad you to one physician for another estimation."

Baden's tips on selecting a compatible physician included what to look for in the waiting room: "Doctor's offices should have teaching tools, pamphlets. If they don't have good educational material around, be careful, because he's supposed to care."

You should expect honesty and caring - rapport - from the patient physician relationship. "Don't be afraid of medical terms. If you don't understand, say you'd like to hear it in English.

"Every one of you needs a family physician or internist as your family doctor: one that you know and that knows you," he said.

Baden says he always recommended that his pa-

tients schedule their annual exam, or at least begin thinking about doing so, on their birthdays. "You can ignore it but you can't forget it," he pointed out. "After I started making this recommendation, I noticed that more and more women began coming back on time, or two or three months later.

A 25-year resident of Salado, Dr. Baden founded the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology and organized the OB/GYN program at Scott & White Hospital in Temple. He is the founding president of the National Society of Gynecologic Surgeons and author of three texts in the OB/GYN field as well as the co-author of the *Atlas of Vaginal Reparative Anatomy*. During his distinguished career, Dr. Baden developed the successful new procedure for correcting bladder control and prolapse problems.

The Baden's joined the group and its guests for the monthly ABWA chapter meeting at Young-Williams Manor in Salado. Members of the Chisholm Trail ABWA invite interested business women to join them Oct. 24, for their 6:30 dinner social and 7:00 p.m. business meeting. Beauty consultant and chapter member Ann Marie Harwell will be the featured speaker as she discusses "Image."

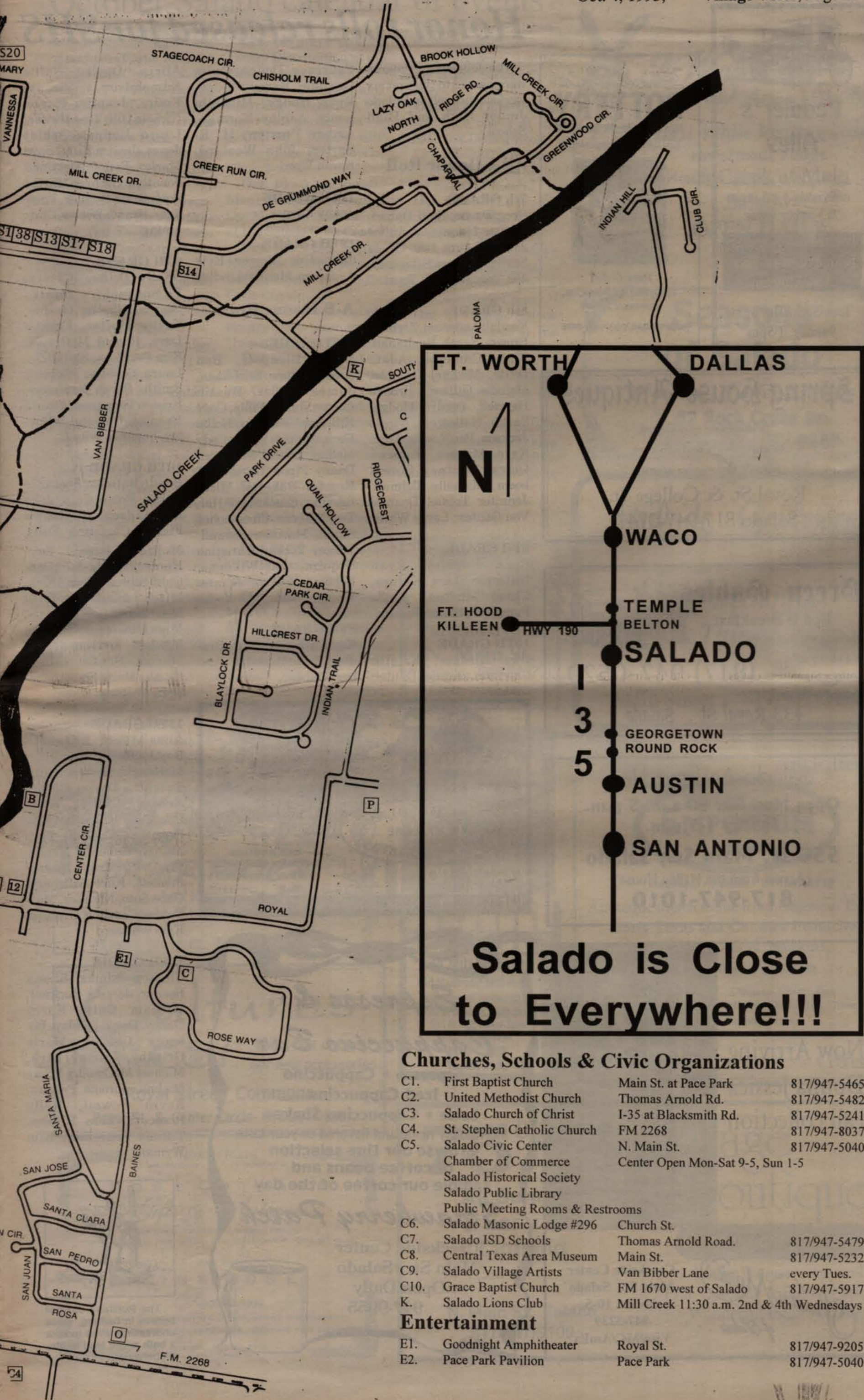

Library on-ramps superhighway

Does the Information Super Highway pass through the Salado Public Library?

"Well not quite" according to library president Lynn Epps. "We are more on the Farm to Market Road right now, but we are well on the way."

With financial assistance from the Tocker Foundation and hard work from volunteers, the library's entire collection was computerized utilizing

Follett's library software. The entire effort was completed in less than seven months. Hardware installation began in March and training sessions were completed in September.

Effective Oct. 2, patrons are able to utilize the electronic card catalog to search for a particular title.

"Many of our patrons may feel a little hesitant at first, but they will find the electronic card catalog much easier to use and a

lot more informative than the old hard copy card catalog," according to Epps.

Patrons will also find checking out books a little easier and library staff will be able to analyze borrowing patterns for future book acquisitions. There are currently two workstations dedicated for patron use setup in desk type kiosks. The old hard copy catalog will remain in place until the patrons are completely familiar with the electronic version.

Epps stated that there was a two fold reason for computerizing the library's collection.

"First to make it easier for public library patrons and secondly to enable students within the Salado Public School System to borrow books from the public library." The public library and the school libraries both utilize the Follett software and are able to share patron and collection information.

Effective Oct. 2, any SISD student will be able to borrow books, audio tapes or video tapes the same as they would from the school libraries. By the end of the year, students will be able to look up in their system and find out what's available at either of the library systems.

Though not anticipated to be as strong of demand, public library patrons will

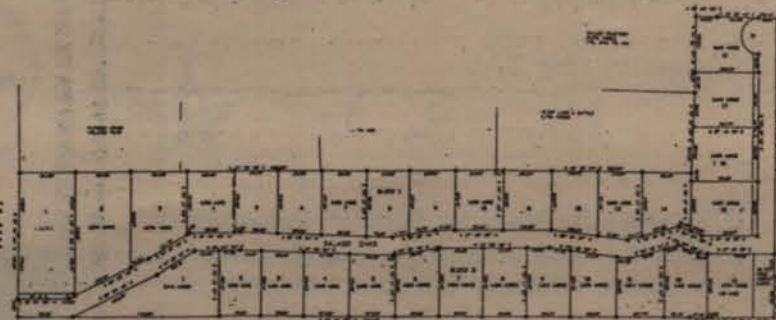
