



SOTF,

This is a clear-cut case of violation which Respondents appear to be admitting in their response. However they appear to argue some sort of inability to comply due to reorganization which should shield them from violations. The people do not lose their Sunshine rights due to the City's reorganizations.

Did SFSD withhold any information without a written justification? Yes, no justifications were given whatsoever. (Therefore, SFSD violated SFAC 67.27).

Did SFSD mask any part of the records without keying by footnote or clear reference to a specific justification? Yes, both requesters' names and contact info. (Therefore, SFSD violated SFAC 67.26).

Did SFSD mask any part of the record that cannot actually be lawfully withheld? Yes, the requesters' names. (Therefore, SFSD violated SFAC 67.26 again).

This case is among the simplest of all that I have brought to your Task Force. Respondents should take their loss and use it as a lesson to learn from.

Respondents have the choice of having the Sheriff as department head sign and publish a consent letter addressed to me and SOTF, acknowledging the violations of 67.26 and 67.27 in this case, accepting responsibility for them, and committing in writing that SFSD will going forward comply with SFAC 67.26 and 67.27 for all requests.

Such a compromise would allow me to withdraw the complaint and is in the public interest, guaranteeing Sunshine for all.

I write in response to your records request dated April 10, 2019. My responses are enumerated below.

- 1) Attached you will find the contract for the current provider: Leaders in Community Alternatives, Inc. (LCA).
- 2) Attached you will find the San Francisco Sheriff's Department (SFSD) policies for electronic monitoring. It is important to identify the legal distinction for individuals who are released by the SFSD to electronic monitoring pursuant to California Penal Code § 1203.016 as an alternative to a county jail sentence versus those individuals released on their own recognize (OR) as ordered by a judicial officer, with a condition of electronic monitoring. Please note that for the policy titled, *APD 04-01 Alternative Programs Eligibility*, redactions were made to protect the security procedures associated with high scrutiny electronic monitoring.

While the SFSD has authority over individuals released as an alternative to a jail sentence, we do not have authority for individuals released to OR. In the first example, the department conducts a public safety assessment for every person sentenced to a term of confinement in the county jail. Based on the safety assessment, individuals may be placed in the electronic monitoring program. In the latter, the department follows the instruction of the court. I am attaching a form which provides different levels of monitoring as a condition of OR release.

3) The department attempts to prevent violations from occurring by preparing the prospective clients with information regarding the equipment, rules and expectations as well as consequences for violations, during the enrollment process which includes outfitting with the electronic monitoring device.

Violations are activities which are against the rules of the program, for example, not charging the device or leaving home when on home detention. Violations can also be violations of court ordered restrictions, such as initiating contact with a protected person or possession of a weapon.

The monitoring and supervision of clients occurs in real time, 24-hours a day, seven days a week.

Deputy sheriffs respond to violations based upon the seriousness of the violation, and the response is different based on the mechanism of release. In a case where there is a known risk to public safety, and for sentenced individuals, the SFSD may return a person to secure detention without judicial review. For pre-sentenced individuals released by the court deputy sheriffs must author an affidavit and present that information to a judicial officer for review and determination for the issuance of a warrant of arrest. The level and speed of responses to violations is limited by time, distance, resources and legal authority.

4) This department does not impose terms of probation. The imposition of sentencing is the determination of the San Francisco Superior Court.

As noted before, the following data for drug charges is for any bookings that had at least one of the statues listed in the attached excel file "Drug Codes". This could have been from an on-view booking or a warrant. We cannot confirm if they were in custody for the drug charge solely, only that a booking had a drug charge contained on it. In many cases, the drug charge could have been dispositioned (dropped or dismissed) and the person remained in custody for a more serious offense that could range from burglary, embezzlement or rape.

It is important to identify the legal distinction for individuals who are released by the SFSD to electronic monitoring pursuant to California Penal Code § 1203.016 as an alternative to a county jail sentence versus those individuals released on their own recognize (OR) as ordered by a judicial officer, with a condition of electronic monitoring. Please note that for the policy titled, *APD 04-01 Alternative Programs Eligibility*, redactions were made to protect the security procedures associated with high scrutiny electronic monitoring.

While the SFSD has authority over individuals released as an alternative to a jail sentence, we do not have authority for individuals released to OR. In the first example, the department conducts a public safety assessment for every person sentenced to a term of confinement in the county jail. Based on the safety assessment, individuals may be placed in the electronic monitoring program. In the latter, the department follows the instruction of the court. I am attaching a form which provides different levels of monitoring as a condition of OR release.

3) The department attempts to prevent violations from occurring by preparing the prospective clients with information regarding the equipment, rules and expectations as well as consequences for violations, during the enrollment process which includes outfitting with the electronic monitoring device.

Violations are activities which are against the rules of the program, for example, not charging the device or leaving home when on home detention. Violations can also be violations of court ordered restrictions, such as initiating contact with a protected person or possession of a weapon.

The monitoring and supervision of clients occurs in real time, 24-hours a day, seven days a week.

Deputy sheriffs respond to violations based upon the seriousness of the violation, and the response is different based on the mechanism of release. In a case where there is a known risk to public safety, and for sentenced individuals, the SFSD may return a person to secure detention without judicial review. For pre-sentenced individuals released by the court deputy sheriffs must author an affidavit and present that information to a judicial officer for review and determination for the issuance of a warrant of arrest. The level and speed of responses to violations is limited by time, distance, resources and legal authority.

4) This department does not impose terms of probation. The imposition of sentencing is the determination of the San Francisco Superior Court.



As noted before, the following data for drug charges is for any bookings that had at least one of the statues listed in the attached excel file "Drug Codes". This could have been from an on-view booking or a warrant. We cannot confirm if they were in custody for the drug charge solely, only that a booking had a drug charge contained on it. In many cases, the drug charge could have been dispositioned (dropped or dismissed) and the person remained in custody for a more serious offense that could range from burglary, embezzlement or rape.

December 2009-end of 2012:

Total number of bookings: 61,083 Total number of bookings with a drug charge (may be combined with other nondrug charges): 21,336

The following may have a booking counted in more than one year, if the incarceration spans over more than one year. A sum of the years should not be taken to identify the totals for the time period. We provided that sum, excluding duplicates in the data above. The following is better because it shows that over time, the number of drug charges compared to the total population has reduced from about 46% in 2009 to 31% in 2012.

FOR FILE 20009:

Respondents appear to have now complied, but in an untimely fashion, which remains a violation of the law and SOTF should of course not dismiss the complaint.

What Respondents do not seem to understand is that violations are not undone when agencies only comply with the law after requesters file complaints, and SOTF routinely finds a violation for untimely or incomplete response by the City (see for example my own SOTF 19091 Anonymous v Office of the Mayor wherein the City eventually complied but was still found in violation for untimeliness).

It is unclear whether Respondents accept their legal responsibility to provide justifications and keys and minimal redaction to all records requests, without filing complaints.

I will again ask Respondents to accept responsibility to comply with SFAC 67.26 and SFAC 67.27 in future requests in a signed response, after which I can dismiss the complaint. If they do so, it is as good for me and the public interest as a formal finding of violation of the law.

SOTF,

This is a clear-cut case of violation which Respondents appear to be admitting in their response. However they appear to argue some sort of inability to comply due to reorganization which should shield them from violations. The people do not lose their Sunshine rights due to the City's reorganizations.

Did SFSD withhold any information without a written justification? Yes, no justifications were given whatsoever. (Therefore, SFSD violated SFAC 67.27).

Did SFSD mask any part of the records without keying by footnote or clear reference to a specific justification? Yes, both requesters' names and contact info. (Therefore, SFSD violated SFAC 67.26).

Did SFSD mask any part of the record that cannot actually be lawfully withheld? Yes, the requesters' names. (Therefore, SFSD violated SFAC 67.26 again).

This case is among the simplest of all that I have brought to your Task Force. Respondents should take their loss and use it as a lesson to learn from.

Respondents have the choice of having the Sheriff as department head sign and publish a consent letter addressed to me and SOTF, acknowledging the violations of 67.26 and 67.27 in this case, accepting responsibility for them, and committing in writing that SFSD will going forward comply with SFAC 67.26 and 67.27 for all requests.

Such a compromise would allow me to withdraw the complaint and is in the public interest, guaranteeing Sunshine for all.

Respondents appear to have now complied, but in an untimely fashion, which remains a violation of the law and SOTF should of course not dismiss the complaint.

What Respondents do not seem to understand is that violations are not undone when agencies only comply with the law after requesters file complaints, and SOTF routinely finds a violation for untimely or incomplete response by the City (see for example my own SOTF 19091 Anonymous v Office of the Mayor wherein the City eventually complied but was still found in violation for untimeliness).

It is unclear whether Respondents accept their legal responsibility to provide justifications and keys and minimal redaction to all records requests, without filing complaints.

I will again ask Respondents to accept responsibility to comply with SFAC 67.26 and SFAC 67.27 in future requests in a signed response, after which I can dismiss the complaint. If they do so, it is as good for me and the public interest as a formal finding of violation of the law.

SOTF,

This is a clear-cut case of violation which Respondents appear to be admitting in their response. However they appear to argue some sort of inability to comply due to reorganization which should shield them from violations. The people do not lose their Sunshine rights due to the City's reorganizations.

Did SFSD withhold any information without a written justification? Yes, no justifications were given whatsoever. (Therefore, SFSD violated SFAC 67.27).

Did SFSD mask any part of the records without keying by footnote or clear reference to a specific justification? Yes, both requesters' names and contact info. (Therefore, SFSD violated SFAC 67.26).

Did SFSD mask any part of the record that cannot actually be lawfully withheld? Yes, the requesters' names. (Therefore, SFSD violated SFAC 67.26 again).

This case is among the simplest of all that I have brought to your Task Force. Respondents should take their loss and use it as a lesson to learn from.

Respondents have the choice of having the Sheriff as department head sign and publish a consent letter addressed to me and SOTF, acknowledging the violations of 67.26 and 67.27 in this case, accepting responsibility for them, and committing in writing that SFSD will going forward comply with SFAC 67.26 and 67.27 for all requests.

PRESENTATION - JUNE 30, 2021 Please combine the below two cases into one hearing.

SOTF 19143

This is an IDR made on Dec 7, 2019 (received Dec 9) for sent/received emails and future and past calendars of the Sheriff. They initially responded untimely on Dec 18, 2019. SFSO listed essentially all of the PRA's exemptions in a blanket fashion, instead of actually reviewing the records and citing specific exemptions that applied to the specific withholding. All issues pre-date COVID orders.

Violations:

- <u>67.27 citation to written justifications that do not apply to responsive records.</u> This law requires that written justification be provided for withholding; instead, SFSO appears to simply cite all (or nearly all) PRA exemptions regardless of whether they actually apply in the specific records request (as proven in SOTF 20009 below, they were doing the same to everyone, not just my request). This would also violate Gov Code 6253(c) which requires an "explanation" whether or not records are disclosable. Citing exemptions that do not apply (and in one case, literally do not exist they cited a Gov Code 6256) cannot be such an explanation or written justification.
- <u>67.25 Untimely IDR.</u> Admitted by respondent.
- <u>67.24(h) unlawful use of deliberative process privilege.</u> Admitted by respondent. Response stated "Moreover, we will not produce documents exempt from disclosure under the deliberative process privilege. See Times Mirror Co. V. Superior Court (1991) 53 Cal.3d 1325."
- <u>67.24(g AND i) unlawful citation to Gov Code 6255 and impermissible balancing test.</u> Their responses stated "No documents will be produced where "the public interest served by not disclosing the record clearly outweighs the public interest by the disclosure of the record" under California Government Code section 6255." Not admitted by respondent but it's unclear what the debate is, their citation is prohibited by both (g) and (i). - <u>67.24(a) unlawful citation to CPRA draft exemption</u>. Not admitted by respondent. Sunshine
 Ordinance prohibits use of the CPRA draft exemption except for a certain portion of drafts.
 SFSO incorrectly claims *all* drafts are exempt (which is a CPRA rule, not a Sunshine rule).
 They claimed "No preliminary drafts or memorandum not normally kept in the ordinary
 course of business will be produced pursuant to California Government Code section 6254(a)."

After realizing SFPD's unlawful citations, I wanted to find out if they were doing the same to others....

This was an IDR for a few months of responses to other requesters' requests to test whether SFSO was violating the above laws consistently (yes, they were). The timeliness of the request is not relevant. By this time, they had stopped providing a "blanket" exemption letter as they did in 19143, and SFSO instead switched to providing no written justifications for withholding or redaction keys at all.

Violation of Administrative Code 67.27

On Saturday, January 11, 2020, Anonymous sent an immediate disclosure request to the Sheriff's office, requesting all response letters/emails/mailings provided by the Sheriff's office to any member of the public for a request pursuant to the CPRA or Sunshine Ordinance sent from November 1, 2019 to December 19, 2019.

On January 14, 2020, the Sheriff's office responded by email to Anonymous. This email response attached the initial response letters requested by Anonymous, which redacted the requestor's name and contact information. - 2) Attached you will find the San Francisco Sheriff's Department (SFSD) policies for electronic monitoring. It is important to identify the legal distinction for individuals who are released by the SFSD to electronic monitoring pursuant to California Penal Code § 1203.016 as an alternative to a county jail sentence versus those individuals released on their own recognize (OR) as ordered by a judicial officer, with a condition of electronic monitoring. Please note that for the policy titled, *APD 04-01 Alternative Programs Eligibility*, redactions were made to protect the security procedures associated with high scrutiny electronic monitoring.

While the SFSD has authority over individuals released as an alternative to a jail sentence, we do not have authority for individuals released to OR. In the first example, the department conducts a public safety assessment for every person sentenced to a term of confinement in the county jail. Based on the safety assessment, individuals may be placed in the electronic monitoring program. In the latter, the department follows the instruction of the court. I am attaching a form which provides different levels of monitoring as a condition of OR release.

3) The department attempts to prevent violations from occurring by preparing the prospective clients with information regarding the equipment, rules and expectations as well as consequences for violations, during the enrollment process which includes outfitting with the electronic monitoring device.

Violations are activities which are against the rules of the program, for example, not charging the device or leaving home when on home detention. Violations can also be violations of court ordered restrictions, such as initiating contact with a protected person or possession of a weapon.

The monitoring and supervision of clients occurs in real time, 24-hours a day, seven days a week.

Deputy sheriffs respond to violations based upon the seriousness of the violation, and the response is different based on the mechanism of release. In a case where there is a known risk to public safety, and for sentenced individuals, the SFSD may return a person to secure detention without judicial review. For pre-sentenced individuals released by the court deputy sheriffs must author an affidavit and present that information to a judicial officer for review and determination for the issuance of a warrant of arrest. The level and speed of responses to violations is limited by time, distance, resources and legal authority.

4) This department does not impose terms of probation. The imposition of sentencing is the determination of the San Francisco Superior Court.

As noted before, the following data for drug charges is for any bookings that had at least one of the statues listed in the attached excel file "Drug Codes". This could have been from an on-view booking or a warrant. We cannot confirm if they were in custody for the drug charge solely, only that a booking had a drug charge contained on it. In many cases, the drug charge could have been dispositioned (dropped or dismissed) and the person remained in custody for a more serious offense that could range from burglary, embezzlement or rape.

I write in response to your records request dated April 10, 2019. My responses are enumerated below.

- Attached you will find the contract for the current provider: Leaders in Community Alternatives, Inc. (LCA).
- 2) Attached you will find the San Francisco Sheriff's Department (SFSD) policies for electronic monitoring. It is important to identify the legal distinction for individuals who are released by the SFSD to electronic monitoring pursuant to California Penal Code § 1203.016 as an alternative to a county jail sentence versus those individuals released on their own recognize (OR) as ordered by a judicial officer, with a condition of electronic monitoring. Please note that for the policy titled, APD 04-01 Alternative Programs Eligibility, redactions were made to protect the security procedures associated with high scrutiny electronic monitoring.

While the SFSD has authority over individuals released as an alternative to a jail sentence, we do not have authority for individuals released to OR. In the first example, the department conducts a public safety assessment for every person sentenced to a term of confinement in the county jail. Based on the safety assessment, individuals may be placed in the electronic monitoring program. In the latter, the department follows the instruction of the court. I am attaching a form which provides different levels of monitoring as a condition of OR release.

3) The department attempts to prevent violations from occurring by preparing the prospective clients with information regarding the equipment, rules and expectations as well as consequences for violations, during the enrollment process which includes outfitting with the electronic monitoring device.

Violations are activities which are against the rules of the program, for example, not charging the device or leaving home when on home detention. Violations can also be violations of court ordered restrictions, such as initiating contact with a protected person or possession of a weapon.

The monitoring and supervision of clients occurs in real time, 24-hours a day, seven days a week.

Deputy sheriffs respond to violations based upon the seriousness of the violation, and the response is different based on the mechanism of release. In a case where there is a known risk to public safety, and for sentenced individuals, the SFSD may return a person to secure detention without judicial review. For pre-sentenced individuals released by the court deputy sheriffs must author an affidavit and present that information to a judicial officer for review and determination for the issuance of a warrant of arrest. The level and speed of responses to violations is limited by time, distance, resources and legal authority.

4) This department does not impose terms of probation. The imposition of sentencing is the determination of the San Francisco Superior Court.



We are responding to your request for a response to a complaint lodged by Anonymous against the Sheriff's office for violating Administrative Code (Sunshine Ordinance) 67.26 and 67.27 by failing to justify withholding/keep withholding to a minimum, and for not keying by footnote reference to an exemption statute or case law.

Violation of Administrative Code 67.27

The Sheriff's Office is named in this complaint alleging that the Sheriff's office did not justify in writing the withholding of redacted information.

On Saturday, January 11, 2020, Anonymous sent an immediate disclosure request to the Sheriff's Office, requesting all response letters/emails/mailings provided by the Sheriff's Office to any member of the public for a request pursuant to the CPRA or Sunshine Ordinance sent from November 1, 2019 to December 19, 2019.

On January 14, 2020, the Sheriff's Office responded by email to Anonymous. This email response attached the initial response letters requested by Anonymous, which redacted the requestor's name and contact information. The requestor's name and contact information were redacted to protect the privacy of the requestor (Gov. Code section 6254 (c) and California Constitution Article I). The response letters attached were as follows: 006, 012, 015, 025, 028, 032, 035, 037, 038, 045, 047, 048, 049, 051, 054, 057, 058, 059, 060, 061, 064, 065, 066, 068, 069, 071, 075, 077, 078, 079, 080, 081, 082, 083, 084, 085, 086, 087, 091, 092, 093, 094, 097, 098, and 099.

The Sheriff's Office performed a thorough search and contacted the staff members who handled responding to CPRA and Sunshine requests for the time period of November 1, 2019 to December 19, 2019.

No documents were excluded in the January 14, 2020 production to Anonymous, and only requestor's name and contact information were redacted to protect the privacy of the requestor (Gov. Code section 6254 (c) and California Constitution Article I).

In mid-December, 2020, the Sheriff's Office Central Records and Warrants Unit (CRWU) was newly assigned the duty as the Sheriff's Office custodian and respondent to the department's public records requests. The CRWU was being organized to process and respond to public records requests in an efficient and consistent manner when Anonymous' public records request was received. Staff was being trained in relevant laws and in the public records request process, including the specific requirements of the Sunshine Ordinance. The CRWU is complying with S.F. Administrative Code section 67.27, and is referencing the appropriate justification for withholding any information.

Anonymous was provided all relevant and responsive records pursuant to their public records request on January 14, 2020 (Attachments 1 and 2), along with a revised records production on February 20, 2020. The revised production showed each requestor's name, and each redaction has a corresponding legal citation justifying each redaction.

Violation of Administrative Code 67.26

Anonymous alleges that the Sheriff's Office did not key by footnote or clear reference the redactions to justifications.

In mid-December, 2020, the Sheriff's Office Central Records and Warrants Unit (CRWU) was newly assigned the duty as the Sheriff's Office custodian and respondent to the department's public records requests. The CRWU was being organized to process and respond to public records requests in an efficient and consistent manner when Anonymous' public records request was received. Staff was being trained in relevant laws and in the public records request process, including the specific requirements of the Sunshine Ordinance. The CRWU is complying with S.F. Administrative Code section 67.27, and is referencing the appropriate justification for withholding any information.

Anonymous was provided all relevant and responsive records pursuant to their public records request on January 14, 2020 (Attachments 1 and 2), along with a revised records production on February 20, 2020. The revised production showed each requestor's name, and each redaction has a corresponding legal citation justifying each redaction.

Conclusion

The Sheriff's Office provided Anonymous with all relevant and responsive records pursuant to Anonymous' public records request on January 14, 2020 and on February 11, 2020, the Sheriff's Office offered to provide a revised production to Anonymous, which would show the requestor's name and reference the justification for redacting the requestor's contact information, Gov. Code section 6254(c) and California Constitution Article I. No response was received from Anonymous regarding whether they wanted a revised production. Therefore, on

February 20, 2020, the Sheriff's Office provided a revised production the records Anonymous requested in their January 11, 2020 request. The revised production showed each requestor's name, and each redaction has a corresponding legal citation justifying each redaction. Each redaction was based on the privacy of the requestor's personal address information, or in some instances, a Sheriff's office employee's cellular phone number (Gov. Code section 6254 (c) and California Constitution Article I). One letter redacted criminal record offender information, which is exempt from disclosure (Gov. Code section 6276.12 and Penal code section 11075-117076).

For the reasons stated above, we respectfully request that the complaint be dismissed.



I write in response to your records request dated April 10, 2019. My responses are enumerated below.

- 1) Attached you will find the contract for the current provider: Leaders in Community Alternatives, Inc. (LCA).
- 2) Attached you will find the San Francisco Sheriff's Department (SFSD) policies for electronic monitoring. It is important to identify the legal distinction for individuals who are released by the SFSD to electronic monitoring pursuant to California Penal Code § 1203.016 as an alternative to a county jail sentence versus those individuals released on their own recognize (OR) as ordered by a judicial officer, with a condition of electronic monitoring. Please note that for the policy titled, *APD 04-01 Alternative Programs Eligibility*, redactions were made to protect the security procedures associated with high scrutiny electronic monitoring.

While the SFSD has authority over individuals released as an alternative to a jail sentence, we do not have authority for individuals released to OR. In the first example, the department conducts a public safety assessment for every person sentenced to a term of confinement in the county jail. Based on the safety assessment, individuals may be placed in the electronic monitoring program. In the latter, the department follows the instruction of the court. I am attaching a form which provides different levels of monitoring as a condition of OR release.

3) The department attempts to prevent violations from occurring by preparing the prospective clients with information regarding the equipment, rules and expectations as well as consequences for violations, during the enrollment process which includes outfitting with the electronic monitoring device.

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Violations are activities which are against the rules of the program, for example, not charging the device or leaving home when on home detention. Violations can also be violations of court ordered restrictions, such as initiating contact with a protected person or possession of a weapon.

The monitoring and supervision of clients occurs in real time, 24-hours a day, seven days a week.

Deputy sheriffs respond to violations based upon the seriousness of the violation, and the response is different based on the mechanism of release. In a case where there is a known risk to public safety, and for sentenced individuals, the SFSD may return a person to secure detention without judicial review. For pre-sentenced individuals released by the court deputy sheriffs must author an affidavit and present that information to a judicial officer for review and determination for the issuance of a warrant of arrest. The level and speed of responses to violations is limited by time, distance, resources and legal authority.

4) This department does not impose terms of probation. The imposition of sentencing is the determination of the San Francisco Superior Court.
