# The 2002 London Household Survey

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## 1. Introduction

The Greater London Authority (GLA) commissioned Taylor Nelson Sofres (TNS) to carry out a London population survey in 2002. The survey was required to assist the GLA in policy development across a wide range of policy areas, including quantifying the linkages between different aspects of needs - for example, housing affordability, poverty, employment, health, etc.

A pilot study was conducted in January 2002. The fieldwork for the main survey took place in a six-month period between February and August 2002, with interim data files delivered in June and final data files delivered in October 2002.

There was a target of 8,000 household interviews ( 8,158 interviews were achieved), which is adequate for analysis at London wide, sub-regional and GLA constituency levels, with a target of 260 interviews per borough.

The household selection was based on a 'pre-selected addresses' method (rather than a quota sample), with a minimum number of calls to each address at different times of day and different days of the week. Further details of the method, the response rate and the outcomes of the visits to the preselected addresses are provided later in this report. The average interview length was around 45 minutes. Interview length varied from around 35 to 55 minutes; the main factors determining the interview length were household size and whether there were children present in the household. The interview was conducted with 'head of household' or partner i.e. an adult household member who was responsible or jointly responsible for the mortgage or rent on the household's accommodation.

The survey provides new reliable information at London wide, sub-regional and GLA constituency level on key housing, household characteristics and income data.

The survey provides:

- vital baseline information for a number of the Mayor's strategies and policy priorities spatial planning, transport, economic development, health, diversity and social inclusion
- a comparative framework for local Borough surveys and studies
- highlights the needs of particular household groups
- Standard housing needs questions such as tenure, housing costs and affordability, preferences/aspirations, extent of sharing and potential households, aspects of unsatisfactory housing
- Specific issues such as vehicle ownership and parking, energy efficiency, household formation, social exclusion/poverty, disability, income, employment, age and ethnicity.
- Wherever possible, questions are compatible with government surveys and the Census. In general, the survey covers a broad range of issues, rather than a few in great depth, in order to examine linkages between different types of housing needs.
- A summary of questions is included in Appendix 1.


## The datasets

The LHS comprises a mixture of household-level data (for example, the respondent's views on the local area) and individual-level data (for example, the age, sex, ethnicity etc of each individual in the household). All the individuals in the Household file are also in the Person file.

- The Household File - containing household-level data plus some key individual data usually for respondent or partner only (such as incomes). The File contains 773 variables and 8,158 cases
- The Person File - containing all the household data and all the individual data. The File contains 20,910 cases and 685 variables


## Weighting

A number of weights are included in each dataset. For the household file the weight titled "MAIN WEIGHT PLUS GROSSING", corrects the sampling and response errors in the datasets and grosses the data to the GLA population as recorded in the 2001 Census. See section 5 for further discussion of person file weights.

## Data validation

The datasets have been subject to cross-checking against other reliable data sources, in terms of key 'high-level' variables such as income, tenure, household type and numbers, ethnicity, etc. A full description of the tests, and our conclusions, is given in the Appendices.

In summary, we are satisfied that the profile of data is fairly close to expectations from other sources, with few exceptions for example, the number of single-parent families appears to differ significantly.

## 2. Sampling

### 2.1 Overview

The survey design was based on a random sample of pre-selected addresses in the Greater London area, but with the following adjustments:

- the survey was 'weighted' towards 'deprived' areas (at the sampling stage, rather than analysis stage)
- an equal number of interviews per Borough was required (32 Boroughs $=250$ interviews per Borough with total sample size of 8,000 interviews), even though the Boroughs vary in size and population. Although there are 33 boroughs in London, it was agreed that City of London would be combined with City of Westminster due to the small amount of residential housing in City of London.


## Sample Frame

The sample frame is defined as all residential addresses in 'Greater London’; Greater London is the 33 London Boroughs (but treated as 32 boroughs because City of London and City of Westminster combined).

## Sampling Methodology

The survey was based on a multi-stage clustered stratified sample. Ideally, the survey would have been based on a pure random sample of addresses spread across Greater London; however, in practice this would be impractical (costly and time-consuming), so a clustered approach was adopted, where TNS selected a series of interviewing locations and then selected a sample of addresses within each location. This is a standard approach to interviewing in large areas.

### 2.2 Selection of Wards as interviewing locations within Boroughs

The first stage was designed to select a sample of Wards within each Borough as interviewing locations (each location would become an individual interviewer assignment). We decided (based on experience) that interviewer assignments should each contain around 36 addresses and we estimated that each assignment should yield around 20 interviews, allowing for refusals, noncontacts, empty properties and other reasons for non-interview. This meant that 13 assignments (interviewing locations), each containing 36 addresses, would be required per Borough in order to reach the target of 260 interviews.

Before selecting certain Wards as interviewing locations, we needed to take into account: the relative size of the Ward (population) and the requirement to 'over-sample' deprived areas within each Borough.

The first stage was to stratify all the Wards within each Borough by the 'DETR ward index of deprivation' (2000), with the Ward 'population' (population = number of addresses, rather than number of people). The second stage was to calculate a sampling interval and apply it to the list of Wards in order to select 13 of them as interviewing locations. However, this process itself does not result in over-sampling the deprived wards; in order to achieve this, we needed to 'weight' or 'over-sample' the deprived Wards in order to increase their chance of selection. We applied these 'weights' by artificially boosting the population counts for the deprived Wards so that they were more likely to be selected when the sampling interval was applied. In order to illustrate this, we
have given a two-stage example (Tables 1 and 2 below), based on a (fictional) Borough with 22 Wards. Table 1 illustrates the process, without the weighting/over-sampling of deprived Wards, whereas Table 2 includes this process. The result is that without the weighting/over-sampling, we would have selected only 4 of the 9 most deprived Wards in this Borough, whereas with the weighting/over-sampling we would have actually selected 6 of the 9 most deprived Wards in that Borough.

Table 1 below shows the Borough containing 22 Wards, stratified (ranked) by deprivation score with Ward population. A sampling interval was then calculated to ensure that the Wards with every ' $n$th address' were selected, where ' $n$ ' (the sampling interval) = total population $(60,000)$ / number of interviewing locations required $(13)=4615$. However, this table illustrates the effect of selecting Wards with probability proportionate to size (population), but without allowing for any 'over-sampling' of deprived areas.

Table 2 illustrates the same selection procedure, but taking into account the weighting / oversampling of the most deprived Wards. In this example, the population counts of the 9 most deprived wards (containing $33 \%$ of the Ward population) are given a weight of 2 , whereas the remaining 13 Wards have their true population counts (i.e. a weight of 1). To select 13 Wards from the weighted population, we need a sampling interval of $13 / 80,000$ (weighted population) $=6153$.

The effect of weighting the Wards where the 'most deprived third' of the population live is that 6 Wards are selected in this deprived sector (i.e. Wards $1,2,4,5,8,9$ ), so 6 of our 13 Wards are 'deprived' (46\%). Without any Ward weighting, only 4 'deprived’ Wards were selected (30\%) in our example. Therefore, in this example, we are 'boosting' the deprived Wards by 33\% (from 4 to 6) and giving the residents in those Wards twice the chance of selection compared with residents of other Wards.

However, we also implemented a further variation: Having studied the Deprivation Index by Ward and Borough, we identified a huge difference between Boroughs with the highest and lowest scores. For example, Richmond's average Ward deprivation score was 8, and the most deprived Ward in Richmond has a score of only 15. However, for Tower Hamlets, even the least deprived Ward had a score of 36 and the worst Ward had a score of 73.

With this in mind, we decided to vary the sampling approach for those Boroughs at the extremes of the Deprivation Index.

For the most deprived location, our rationale is that Tower Hamlets has such a high level of deprivation across all Wards (compared to other Boroughs), that there was little benefit in overrepresenting the 'poorest' Wards; we decided instead that the weighting is removed for the sampling within this Borough, so that every resident had an equal chance of selection.

As Hackney, Newham and Islington have similar profiles, we applied the same procedure to these Boroughs. (We included Islington because the least deprived Ward still had a score of 37, which is very high compared to other Boroughs, and there was less variation between the minimum and maximum scores).

At the other end of the scale, we decided that Boroughs like Richmond need a higher representation of relatively deprived Wards than proposed in our 'standard' model. Here, we proposed that a weight of 3 is given to the Wards where the most deprived third of the population live. Therefore, residents living in these Wards in these Boroughs are 3 times more likely to be selected to take part in the survey.

We decided that this variation should be applied to the Boroughs in the following table. It was clear that Richmond and Kingston should be included as they represented the extremes of the Index. After this, we also included a selection of 'prosperous' Boroughs where over half the Wards had very low deprivation scores (1-10); the exception is Harrow, which is included because it is relatively prosperous across all Wards (the 'worst' Ward only has a score of 24).

The effect of a weight of 3 in the 'example Borough illustration' shown in Tables 1 and 2 would be that 7 Wards are selected from the most deprived Wards, rather than the 6 Wards shown in Table 2 (where a weight of 2 was applied) or the 4 Wards shown in Table 1 (where no weights were applied).

The overall result of this sample design was that large, 'deprived’ Wards were deliberately oversampled and small, prosperous Wards were under-sampled.

### 2.2 Selection of sampling points within Wards

At this stage, TNS statisticians liaised with Business Geographics, an agency specialising in the provision random samples of addresses from the Post Office Address File. Ideally, the survey would be based on a pure random sample of addresses spread across each of the selected Wards; however, even within a Ward, the addresses would have been too geographically dispersed for efficient fieldwork. Instead, Business Geographics stratified the Enumeration Districts (ED) according to their deprivation score (using the SAD Index: Small Area Deprivation Index, based on the Census 1991, as this had not been updated).

Within each Ward, 4 EDs (and one separate ED) was selected with probability proportionate to population (number of residential addresses).

Within each of the selected EDs, 9 addresses were randomly selected, using a random start and a 1 in ' $n$ ' interval.

Postcode to ED matching files were used to generate the addresses needed for each interviewer assignment. Only residential addresses as flagged on the latest version of Post Office Address File (final quarter, 2001) were used.

## 3. Fieldwork

### 3.1 Fieldwork period

The fieldwork for the main survey started on February $15^{\text {th }} 2002$ and finished on $9^{\text {th }}$ September 2002. There were three Bank Holidays during the fieldwork period: Easter, May Bank Holiday and the Jubilee Bank Holiday in June. Although interviewing continued over these holidays, they were not very productive as some interviewers chose to take a break and many respondents were away.

### 3.2 Pilot

A pilot study was carried out in January 2002. A separate report was produced which described the detailed findings of the pilot study and made recommendations for the main stage; therefore, the pilot process and results are only briefly summarised in this section.

The original intention was to carry out the pilot with 5 interviewers working in 5 different areas, each producing 20 interviews i.e. 100 interviews in total. However, for a number of reasons, the pilot was expanded and extended (but without affecting the schedule for the main stage).

Over 200 interviews were achieved in the pilot study, carried out by a team of around 20 interviewers. The pilot briefings were held in the first week of January. Clearly, the pilot findings were enhanced by this revised approach as it has provided greater variety of different geographical areas and included the experience of a larger number of different interviewers. The pilot fieldwork included interviews in the following areas: Northolt, Greenford, Twickenham, Sheen, Southgate, Hampstead, Stoke Newington, Muswell Hill, Camden, Bayswater, Wanstead, Ilford, Vauxhall, Tulse Hill.

After the pilot fieldwork was completed, most of the pilot interviewers attended a half-day debriefing session on $30^{\text {th }}$ January, attended by the 4 members of the TNS project team, the GLA contract manager and supervisor. At this debriefing, we went through the questionnaire, question by question, inviting comments from the interviewers and discussing possible changes. The general conclusion was that the interview worked well, reflecting the considerable work and consultation undertaken by the GLA and TNS in preparing the pilot interview.

The average interview length allowed for in the Contract was 45 minutes. The average interview length in the pilot was 50 minutes. Interview lengths are recorded on the 'real-time' clocks inside the personal computers used to conduct the interviews (rather than relying on interviewers to keep a record of their interview lengths).

In terms of the overall flow and structure of the interview, interviewers had few significant comments about this. Extensive testing at the design stage indicated that the interview flowed reasonably, with one topic leading to another without 'jarring’ and the pilot appears to have confirmed this. However, there was perceived to be a problem with the 'poverty indicator' section, where all interviewers agreed that it was often difficult to keep the respondent interested - especially where the respondent had to go through both the adult and child poverty questions. This section of the interview was substantially reduced for the main stage.

There were only very minor suggestions for question order changes. Interviewers felt that the majority of questions worked well i.e. they were understood immediately by respondents, who were able to give answers without requesting further clarification.

Some respondents interrupted the interview at certain points wanting clarification about why the GLA was asking certain questions; this usually applied to the financial and home ownership questions. Inevitably, some respondents refused to answer certain questions and there were higher than average levels of ‘don’t know’ at certain questions.

Following the pilot, it was agreed that the interview would be reduced in length to 45 minutes (to conform to the TNS / GLA contract and to minimise respondent burden). TNS proposed some changes to wording and question order aimed at reducing amount of time spent on some questions. However, there were also a small number of questions where additional information or extra questioning was required to enhance the accuracy of responses, for example, in the 'energy efficiency' section and the 'rental costs' section. There were two significant proposals for change:

- to delete certain items from the 'poverty' questions to shorten this section
- to confine the information collected about place of work, job description and individual income to two members of the household, rather than every working adult (due to the time that this takes to collect and the high levels of 'don't know' at these questions)


### 3.3 Interviewer training and briefing

Comprehensive training and detailed briefing for all interviewers working on the project was absolutely essential to the success of the survey. This was followed up with a high level of support, supervision and accompaniment in the first few days, to get interviewers off to the best possible start.

### 3.4 Initial contact and selection of respondent

Initial contact was made through a brief letter introducing the survey, delivered by the interviewers by hand to the selected addresses in their assignments. The letter explained the background and purpose of the survey, stating that an interviewer would be working in the area in the next few weeks and would visit the address to interview the household. TNS produced the letters for each assignment on GLA headed paper, with the address 'mail-merged' individually and addressed as 'Dear Resident'. The exact distribution method varied slightly; some interviewers preferred to deliver all letters before revisiting the addresses to make personal contact, but others preferred to deliver the letters and make contact where possible at the same time, explaining the survey in person to the respondent.

Interviews were conducted with a 'head of household or partner', defined as a household member who was responsible or jointly responsible for the rent or mortgage at that address - or the partner of the person responsible or jointly responsible. In 52 of the 8,158 households, the partner was interviewed; although this seems low, it is due to several factors:

- a third of household are one-person households
- many households have more than one person responsible for the rent or mortgage
- many households were owner-occupied, where 'the person responsible for the rent or mortgage’ was not applicable


### 3.5 Data capture method

CAPI (Computer Assisted Personal Interviewing) was used for this survey, where interviewers administered the interview on handheld PC's. Interview data was sent daily by the interviewers directly to a PC server; avoiding the use of email, file attachments etc.

### 3.6 Survey helpline

TNS offered a telephone helpline for respondents participating in the survey, which was staffed by the TNS executives working on the GLA project (and other colleagues in the department). The helpline hours were 9 am and 7 pm weekdays (minimum), with an answerphone message outside these hours and at weekends. About 5 calls per week came from people who had received the letter saying that they did not want to take part in the survey. About 2-3 people per week phoned to rearrange their interview appointment with the interviewer and a similar number came from elderly people, or their relatives, to check that the interviewer was bona fide.

There was about 1 call per week from 'annoyed' respondents who had been interviewed and were complaining about the content of the interview (too much personal, financial, private and confidential information etc.) - about 5 of these asked for their interviews to be deleted from our records (which we did). A similar number of calls came from people who were seeking reassurance about the survey, wanting further explanation of why there were so many personal (especially financial) questions (but not necessarily complaining) and/or enquiring how the survey results would be used. A few of these enquirers were referred to the GLA when they requested to speak to a GLA representative.

### 3.7 Language difficulties

We made every reasonable effort to include non-English speaking households of any ethnic group or nationality in the survey. A ‘language barrier’ was reported as a reason for non-interview in 70 cases (from a total of 16,752 addresses). Interviewers were asked to establish, wherever possible, which language was spoken and throughout the survey we monitored the situation. We succeeded in covering most of the assignments in high density Asian areas (e.g. Southall) through recruitment of interviewers with Asian language skills and achieved good response rates in these areas.

Other languages were more diverse, reflecting the new trends in the origins of asylum-seekers; for example, eastern European, Afghanistan, former Yugoslavia etc. Here we were not as successful in conducting interviews where there was a language barrier which could not be overcome. As these tended to be individual cases, rather than clusters, it was difficult to justify employing a translator to follow these cases up. Our recent experience in working for the Home Office interviewing asylum-seekers who are learning English reveals that translators charge around $£ 60$ per hour, plus travel time and expenses.

### 3.8 Questionnaire design

The interview length was around 45 minutes on average. The first part of the interview established key demographics for all household members, including relationship to respondent. Although it was logical to place these questions at the start of the interview and it helped the interviewer to understand the household composition from the start (which was useful later in the interview), there were some problems with respondents objecting to the personal nature of the questions when they were expecting to be asked for their opinions. This required interviewers to skilfully explain that some personal and demographic information was needed initially.

A large proportion of the interview was about housing; this covered both previous and current homes (tenure, size, amenities, cost, affordability, ${ }^{\text {nd }}$ home ownership), whether anyone in the household was likely to move in the next five years and what type of accommodation they would be seeking. Some home-owners questioned the relevance of this information to the GLA, which required interviewers to explain that the future demand (and affordability) for housing in London needs to be measured and monitored. Other topics included opinions of the local environment and attitudes to crime. The GLA provided much of the question wording (from previous social surveys) to ensure that survey results could be compared with other sources.

## 4. Response Rates

### 4.1 Overview

As described in Section 2 the survey was designed using a standard random sampling method, which involved issuing interviewers with assignments, each containing 36 addresses, grouped geographically to minimise travelling between each address. Interviewers were instructed to visit each address in their sample and record the outcome for every visit to every address.

The GLA set an overall target response rate of $60 \%$ and stipulated that 'at least 3 visits to each address should be made (at least 2 in the evening or at weekends)'.

The final response rate was $52 \%$ and the average number of visits to each address was 6 .

### 4.2 Recording outcomes of visits

In any survey based on pre-selected addresses, it is important that interviewers are 'forced' to visit addresses on a number of occasions in order to make contact with residents who are 'hard to contact'. If not, there is a risk that the survey will underestimate certain households, for example, couples where both household members work full-time. This approach will ensure that the selection of households finally interviewed maintains the statistical integrity of the sampling framework employed.

Ideally, a representative from every household in the sample of addresses would be interviewed. However, in practice, a $100 \%$ response rate is not realistic for the following reasons:

- $\quad$ some addresses will be empty during the entire fieldwork period
- $\quad$ some addresses will turn out to be non-residential
- $\quad$ some addresses will be impossible to find (although this is quite rare)
- $\quad$ some residents will be away for the fieldwork period (on holiday, in hospital)
- $\quad$ some residents will be not capable of taking part (e.g. too elderly / sick / dementia)
- some residents will refuse
- $\quad$ some residents will remain uncontactable despite repeated visits

The outcomes that interviewers recorded for each visit to each address were compiled by assignment (and by Borough and overall). The exact number of visits made to each address was recorded by the interviewers on their PC's and could be reviewed during fieldwork, however, the final outcome reports compiled by the CAPI system were only based on the last (most recent) visit. The average number of visits was around 6 per address.

### 4.3 Overall response rate (achieved) and sample breakdown

In total, we issued 16,750 addresses. This yielded an overall response rate of $52 \%$ after the exclusion of 'deadwood' (e.g. empty or non-residential properties, residents too sick or elderly to take part).

### 4.4 Response rates by Borough

As might be expected, even with a minimum of 4 visits per address, the response rate varied considerably by Borough. In general, response rates were higher in the Outer Boroughs compared to Inner Boroughs. Where response rates were low, it became clear during fieldwork that more addresses would need to be issued in order to achieve the target number of interviews per Borough. This is taken into account in the table below which shows the number of interviews achieved and the corresponding response rates:

The table below shows the overall response rate and also the main factors influencing the response rate: non-contact, refusals and 'deadwood', within each Borough. Although 'refusals' are included in 'other non-response', they account for at least $80 \%$ of this category. The figures shown here relate to the final outcome at each address (i.e. the outcome of the final visit); this is particularly relevant for 'non-contact' which means there was no contact on the final visit, but there may have been contact on previous visits.

## 5. Data Coding, Weighting and Checking

### 5.1 Outputs

There were two key outputs:

- $\quad$ An initial interim data file delivered on $7^{\text {th }}$ June 2002, covering results based on 3,110 interviews divided into two files: as household-based file and a person-based file.
- Final data files were delivered during 2003 (following the release of the Census data, which necessitated reweighting the data) and in 2004 (when additional coding was carried out) based on 8,158 interviews. The final file was delivered in July 2004.


### 5.2 Coding of information collected during the interview

As interviews were conducted on CAPI PCs, interviewers typed in the verbatim responses at certain questions and these required coding separately after the interview. These questions were only asked about the respondent or 'person 2' in the household (rather than other household members) and related to their working status.

The questions where information was typed in are shown below:

Coding was carried out by our experienced team of coders, who were personally briefed by the research executive team; there was close liaison between coders and our survey team. Our coding supervisor checked a $10 \%$ sample of coding on the open questions.

### 5.3 Weighting

The final dataset was weighted and grossed up using 2001 Census data, provided by the GLA. However, because of the delay in this data becoming available, temporary weights were applied to the interim and initial data sets. The following section describes the final weights which were applied to the final dataset after the Census data was supplied to TNS by the GLA in 2003.

There were a number of stages in the weighting process, described below. The base for the SPSS file, after grossing up, is 3,048,019 households (from our sample of 8,158 households).

The weights were applied in the following order. The priority weight was considered to be the borough grossing, so this was applied as the final weight.

1st stage: A new weight was introduced for the December 2002 SPSS data re-run to correct for over-representation of multiple households. The weight was derived from information collected in the survey about the number of households sharing bathrooms and/or kitchens at each address. This weight now becomes the $1^{\text {st }}$ weight to be applied to the data.

2nd stage: This is the deprivation score 'correction'. This is applied by assignment, which corresponds to Ward based on data provided by TNS (from DETR). At the sampling stage, Wards were given a score of 1,2 or 3 according to their deprivation score. This score determined their chance of selection for the survey. This weight ( $1,0.5$ or 0.3 ) corrects the 'oversampling' of Wards with scores 2 and 3.
$3^{\text {rd }}$ stage: A new weight applied to the dataset in May 2003 using the tenure figures based on Census data provided by GLA. This was applied at borough level. The following categories were used:

1. Own outright
2. Own with mortgage inc. part rent / part buy
3. LA/Council/HAT
4. HA/co-op
5. Private rented sector (remainder)

Tenure is defined from the responses to QA5 and B12 in the questionnaire, shown below:

$4^{\text {th }}$ stage: This is the household composition weight, applied by borough. This weight ensures that the different types of household in London are represented in each borough in their correct proportions.

This weight was based on the following household definitions, which were defined in priority order, shown below (as some households could qualify for more than one category). Therefore, each household is classified according to the first category that applies, regardless of whether they would also fit into other categories.

$5^{\text {th }}$ stage: This was the final weight to gross up the number of households in the sample to the total number of households in Greater London, by borough. This weight ensures that each borough is represented correctly in the survey in terms of number of households. As the survey design was based on a similar number of interviews being achieved in each borough (around 250), regardless of size (population/number of households), it was important to restore the true proportions at the analysis stage.

### 5.4 Data checking / cleaning / data processing

The survey data is provided in SPSS format. Weighting or grossing variables were presented as separate variables in the SPSS file.

All data processing was carried out in-house by TNS. The SPSS file was finally checked by the TNS project managers for completion, logic and clear labelling.

The levels of item non-response and refusals were generally very low. As might be expected, the highest levels were observed at the financial questions, but these were still relatively low and the GLA expressed their satisfaction with the response rates at these questions. For household income, we achieved a response rate of $73 \%$ (i.e. $73 \%$ of respondents told us which income band corresponded to their household income, $15 \%$ refused and $12 \%$ were unable to give a response). When the respondents were asked for their personal income, we achieved a response rate of $82 \%$.

Two data files were produced: a file based on households and a separate file based on household members (the 'person' file).

### 5.5 Calculation of Statistical error

Calculations of statistical error are based on UNWEIGHTED data i.e. 8,158 households (rather than $3,109,730$ households). TNS statisticians have estimated a design effect (1.6) for this survey, which is taken into account in the following sampling error calculations. The design effect takes account of the survey design and method, the response rate, sample (geographical location) clustering and the results of empirical investigations from previous surveys.

Sampling error can be expressed at a $90 \%$, $95 \%$ or $99 \%$ confidence level; $95 \%$ is most commonly used.

Overall, the sampling error (at 95\% confidence level) for the total sample of 8,158 households is $1.73 \%$ (at $50 \%$, which is the highest level of error). This means that if the survey reports that $50 \%$ of households own their homes, the true proportion is between $48.27 \%$ and $51.73 \%$. However, if the survey reports that $75 \%$ of household own their homes, the sampling error is reduced to $1.50 \%$, and the true proportion is between $73.5 \%$ and $76.5 \%$. (In fact, the results show that $55 \%$ own their homes, with an error of $1.72 \%$ - this figure was the same unweighted and weighted).

# Appendix 2. Definitions and Derived Variables 

## Family

A family is either:
a married or cohabiting couple (including same-sex couples) without children
a married or cohabiting couple or a lone parent with their (including step etc) child(ren) providing that these children have no partner or children of their own living in the household exceptionally, grandparent(s) and grandchild(ren) where no parent is living in the household

There is no age limit on the children in this definition. This definition is based solely on the relationship matrix.

## Family Unit

A family unit is either a family or an individual not living as part of a family. A household consisting of a couple family with children together with the children's grandparent, for example would be two family units.

## Dependent Child

A dependent child is:
any person aged 0-15 in a household or
any person aged 16-18 living in a family with his/her parent(s) who is in full-time education

## Adult

An adult is any person who is not a dependent child

## Student

A student is any household member in full-time education

## Pensioner

A pensioner is either a male aged 65 or over or a female aged 60 or over

## Family Reference Person (FRP)

In a lone parent family, the lone parent is the FRP. In a couple family, the FRP is one of the couple selected on the basis of economic activity from the following priority order:

Working full-time
Working part-time
Unemployed
Retired
Other
If the economic status of both members of the couple is the same, the FRP is the elder of the two, or, if they are also the same age, the first member on the form.

## Household Reference Person (HRP)

For a person living alone, that person is the HRP. For households containing one family (with or without other family units), the HRP is the FRP of the family. If there is more than one family or there are several individuals, but no families, the HRP is chosen from the FRPs/individuals using
the same criteria as for selecting the FRP, ie economic position, then age, then position on the form.

## Demographic Household Type

The basis of this classification is defining a priority order for family units. A household is classified according to the first category that applies, regardless of whether it would also fit into other categories. The priority order is as follows:

Married couple with dependent children household - any household containing at least one family type 2

Married couple with no dependent children - any household containing at least one family type 1 or 3 (but not 2)

Cohabiting couple with dependent children household - any household containing at least one family type 5 (but not family type 1,2 or 3 ) unless the couple are same-sex

Cohabiting couple with no dependent children - any household containing at least one family type 4 or 6 (but not family type $1,2,3$ or 5 ) unless the couple are same-sex

Lone parent household - any household containing at least one family type 7 and no opposite sex couples (a same sex couple, where dependent child(ren) of one of the couple lived with them would also be included in this category)

One person household - a household with only one resident

Other multi-person households - a household with no couples and no lone parents with dependent children

## Demographic household representative

This is based on the demographic household type and tries to take the eldest male from the family type defining the household, eg the eldest husband with dependent child(ren) in a married couple with dependent children household, not the eldest husband with no dependent children. Only if there is no male in the upper generation of the defining family type, is the eldest female taken as the representative, so a male lone parent takes precedence over a female lone parent, even if she is older, but a female lone parent takes precedence over a male not in a family. A male in a household of six unrelated females and one male would be the household representative.

## Appendix 3. Data Validation

This report summarises the analysis that was carried out to inform the validation of the London Household Survey (LHS). The LHS is a large sample survey that has been weighted and grossed up to reflect London's population. To ensure that the weighting and grossing is working well and that results are representative of London's population, the GLA have carried out a series of validation checks. These have involved comparing LHS survey estimates to those from official data sources (eg 2001 Census).

Early validation exercises were carried out to inform the development of weighting and grossing factors. More recently, the survey was re-grossed to be consistent with new population estimates based on 2001 Census data. The final validation assesses this dataset (supplied in May 2003). Validation was carried out on three sets of variables that were felt to be key with regard to assessing representativeness of the sample. These were:

Demographic variables
Income and economic variables
Housing tenure variable
The conclusions of the final validation process were that the LHS was robust and generally representative of London households. However, the analysis also highlighted that the survey data did have some limitations and in view of this, it was felt important that health warnings be attached to the data to ensure users made 'appropriate use' of the survey.

This report provides the technical detail behind the validations across each of the three key areas and discusses the strengths and limitations of selected variables.

## A) Demographic Validation (London Household Survey)

## Introduction

The final survey validation is being carried out using variables based upon the 2001 Census. Some have been reconfigured so as to relate to mid-2002 using the GLA 2002 Round of demographic projections. This includes total households, private household population, population by gender and population by age. The distribution of households by type and population by ethnic group draw directly on the 2001 Census.

## Households

The weighted survey results show a difference of only 676 with the target validation total for London, equivalent to a trivial difference of $0.022 \%$. At borough level there are differences greater than 50 for only 5 boroughs. The main differences are in Hackney (164, $0.19 \%$ ), Tower Hamlets (163, 0.20\%) and Lambeth (141, 0.12\%). See Table 1.

## Households by Type

The resulting household type distribution may be compared to that for mid-2002, based on the 2001 census:

The only differences are trivial, the LHS having about 8 thousand more lone parent households and 7 thousand fewer other multi-person households.

## Private Household Population

The weighted survey results show an overall private household population of London of 7.279 million. This is about $1.9 \%$ higher than the estimated mid- 2002 population of 7.144 million. Since the number of households and the household type structure were both very close to the validation targets it would seem that the average number of Person in multi-person households was inflated. Looking at overall average household size the survey shows 2.388 compared to the validation target of 2.344. The average household size of multi-person households is 3.126 in the LHS and 3.059 in the validation data. This is consistent with the overstatement of children (see next Section).

Of more concern are those boroughs where the LHS estimates of the total private household population are significantly greater (or, in a few cases, lower) than the validation targets. The results are shown in Table 2, which also highlights those boroughs with populations more than 10 thousand different to the validation targets. The most significant differences are found in Lambeth (34 thousand), Haringey (15 thousand), Ealing (12 thousand), Islington (11 thousand), Hounslow
(11 thousand) and Croydon (10 thousand). The boroughs showing the most deficient populations are Enfield ( -8 thousand) and Kingston upon Thames ( -4 thousand).

Table 2 also shows the borough average household sizes and highlights those where the difference is greater than $3 \%$ from the validation targets. The most extreme case is again Lambeth at $+12 \%$ ).

## Age and Gender Structure

The LHS shows $49.0 \%$ of the population as being male compared to $48.4 \%$ in the mid-2002 validation targets.

The resulting LHS age structure has been compared with the GLA mid-2002 estimate of the total population (ie both private household and communal establishment residents). It should be noted that about 154 thousand Person are not classified by age. Looking initially at five-year age groups the LHS appears to have too many Person aged 5-14 and 25-29. There are too few Person aged 0-$4,40-49,55-74$ and $80+$. The picture clarifies a little when single-year of age data are inspected. Of most significance is the very low number of infants - only about $40 \%$ of the expected number - and an extension of the age range of overestimated children to between 1 and 17. The low number of infants is a common feature of household surveys and censuses. The high number of young children might be expected from any household survey when it is more likely to make contact with couples with children than those without. Looking at broad age bands, the LHS may be about 68 thousand too high across the main working ages (20-59). Chart 1 shows the main differences by five-year age groups.

## Ethnic Group

The only significant deviations from the distribution of the total population at the 2001 Census are that the representation of the White group is low by $2.53 \%$ and that of the Black group is high by $1.61 \%$. Within the Black group the Black African's are the most over-represented (6.75\% compared with $5.28 \%$ ). When the distribution is converted to show differences for the total population of these groups it is apparent that the following differences emerge, ignoring the $1.06 \%$ of the LHS sample that were coded as Refused, Don't Know or Not Stated:

While all groups (except White and Asian) appear to have been significantly over or underestimated it is not possible to be categorical as to why or how this happened. As has been shown above, although most boroughs had correct estimates for households the resulting household populations were more deviant, leading to overall higher estimates of average household size. This is consistent with the much higher number of children and a younger age-structure of adults.

The pattern of boroughs in which the population was overestimated implies that it may have been easier to contact families with children, rather than childless couples. Thus the overstatement of the Black population and the understatement of the White population are feasible outcomes if there was such a bias in contacts at borough level.

## Summary

The following are the key outcomes of the demographic validation of the LHS weighted estimates:

- The numbers of households in all boroughs are extremely close to the validation targets for mid-2002
- The distribution of households by type for London is consistent with the 2001 Census distribution
- The private household population for London is about $1.9 \%$ too high with an extreme value in Lambeth of over $12 \%$ inflation
- The age distribution of London shows only about $40 \%$ of expected infants, while children aged $1-17$ are generally over estimated.
- While there are too few Person aged $40-49$ and over 55 those in the working ages are about 68 thousand to high
- The distribution of the London population into 5 broad categories of ethnic group appears to show too few Person in the White group (184 thousand) and Mixed group (37 thousand) and too many in the Black group (117 thousand) and the Other group (33 thousand)
- The Black African population has been overestimated by over $25 \%$

The overestimation of the total population, particularly children and Black ethnic groups at the expense of older people and White groups, is consistent with contacting too many households, particularly in inner boroughs, that had families with children rather than childless couples.

Overall this does not detract from the success of the LHS, but there need to be health warnings about using the data as a source of population estimates and, generally, at borough level. Users will note that - with an average sample of around 250 achieved interviews per borough - the survey is intended primarily for regional and sub-regional analysis.

## B) Income and economic validation (London Household Survey)

The analysis that follows summarises the final validation of LHS results and covers selected variables on income and economic position. The overall verdict is: While the data are acceptable and provide a reasonably good overview of the differing economic circumstances of Londoners, health warnings need to be attached to their use.

There are significant differences between validation and LHS data on certain income and economic position variables. However, many of these differences are not unexpected and are due - at least in part - to methodological issues. For this reason, these variables should really only be used to filter out groups of interest (eg low income households, full-time workers) and for crosstabulations. They should not be seen as authoritative counts of Londoners by economic position or on different incomes. Other data sources such as the LFS, the 2001 Census and DWP administrative data are better suited to this.

Key findings:

- The broad composition of the sample in terms of economic position is 'reasonably' close to that of the Census, but there are significant differences for certain groups within the population. The LHS overcounts the number unemployed and the number economically inactive, at the same time it undercounts the number in part-time employment. Further the LHS picks up more students. While some of this may be due to sample bias, it is also likely to be reflecting a methodological issue with the LHS question. As the LHS collects information on economic position using only one question, there is scope for confusion with the mixing of economic activity questions with student status. Also there is no 'other category' on the LHS question suggesting interviewers would have to push respondents on this one, unlike the Census option. Considering the limitations of the question, the overall bias isn't too bad, but it does mean the LHS should not be used to generate accurate estimates of employment or unemployment. LFS \& Census would be better for this (See table 3 and charts 2 a and 2 b ).
- The LHS appears to be undercounting those on certain means tested benefits (CTB/IS/WFTC). This may be highlighting the benefits unit issue as well as poor provision of data by respondents. Benefits data is difficult to collect via surveys and administrative sources are usually better. (See table 3)
- The income validation suggests that the LHS income distribution is skewed towards the bottom of the income distribution. Comparisons with FRS suggest LHS over-represents households on incomes below $£ 5 \mathrm{k}$ pa and under represents those on incomes of $£ 5 \mathrm{k}-£ 15 \mathrm{k}$. At levels above $£ 15 \mathrm{k}$, the LHS distribution is similar to that of the FRS. The extent and profile of refusals/don't knows on the income question could be playing a part here (ie are low income households more likely to provide information?). It is also possible that some individuals could be understating their earnings. Evidence from the Labour Force Survey (also a household survey) suggests that income and earnings data collected at household level on behalf of other individuals in the household tend to lead to an under estimation of levels of earnings. This is consistent with the under-reporting of benefits receipt. (See chart 3)

## C) Housing tenure validation (London Household Survey)

## Summary

This note provides comparisons on the tenure profile of the May 2003 (Census-calibrated) household file, in terms of (a) May profile, (b) profile from interim dataset (November 2002), and (c) expectations from other data sources.

Overall conclusion - much better fit than achieved in interim dataset, and we can live with the differences.

The best evidence we have from other data sources (other than 2001 Census, to which of course the data have been calibrated) is:

- LA stock - April 2002 HIP gives 512,766 dwellings of which 9,971 were empty. Assuming little or no multi-occupation (ie one household per occupied dwelling), this implies 502,795 households. Ignoring Refused/DK above, the May 2003 profile is very much closer to expectation
- RSL stock - April 2002 HIP gives 291,910 dwellings of which 6,149 were empty. Probably some multi-occupation - but assuming nil, this implies 285,761 households. Again, the May profile is closer to expectation
- Private rented (equivalent to 'other rented' above) - no reliable data on split between privately rented and privately owned. The SEH 2000/01 estimated that private renting accounted for around $14 \%$ of London households, compared to $16.8 \%$ above (and two years later). Acceptable in my view.

Overall, the figures are in my view close enough to be acceptable. The LA and RSL estimates from HIP are likely to be much more accurate than Census (in part because they are based on rent payments, and in part because occupiers can be confused at Census time as to who their landlord is - especially if, for example, they are ex-homeless households placed in private rented accommodation by a local authority and managed by a RSL). But the Census is probably more likely to be accurate on private sector sub-divisions than a high-quality but small-sample survey like the SEH, so it is easier to stick with one source - 2001 Census - as the key determinant for this and other variables.
