Kamaaina discounts easier to get

Military personnel and their dependents living in Hawaii will soon be able to conveniently claim special "Kamaaina" discount rates offered by many island commercial firms.

The Hawaii Chamber of Commerce Armed Services Committee and the Hawaii Visitors Bureau developed the program, which will identify eligible people with a logo placed on the back of their military ID cards. The logo will be a purple orchid less than a half-inch in diameter.

Starting May 15, Hawaii-based military members and their dependents will have the purple flower affixed to their cards. "Transient or temporary duty personnel will not be included in the program."

During the Hawaii Military Week opening ceremonies on May 15, Governor John Waihee will attach the first sticker to Adm. Huntington Hardisty's military ID card. Adm. Hardisty, Commander in Chief, U.S. Pacific Command, said that the military services appreciate this "unique and imaginative program."

While many firms generally extend "Kamaaina" privileges to local military families, various identification documents were required, such as local addresses on checks, state ID cards, and letters from unit commanders.

This single ID recognition program is designed to eliminate any confusion over established residency. It is not an effort to extend the number of businesses now offering local rates, nor will it give special treatment to military residents.

'Big guns' clash

Marines, soldiers shoot for 'arty' honors

The artillery Marines of 1st Bn., 12th Marines tasted a bit of "be all you can be," when they competed with the soldiers of 1st Bn., 8th Field Artillery, in the 1st Army/Marine Howitzer Section Competition last week.

Schofield Army Barracks was the site of "the clash of the Pacific's big guns," which was held April 19-20.

Four of 1/8's best sections were the opponents of three 1/12 sections, one each from Alpha, Bravo, and Fox batteries. An eighth section was comprised of four soldiers and four Marines, including a Marine section chief.

"The purpose of this competition is not only to prove which is the best section," said MG/Sgt. Roy

MAGTF heads for Alaskan oil spill

MCB CAMP PENDLETON, Calif. — A detachment of Marines left San Diego Tuesday aboard a Navy ship headed for Alaska to support the clean-up operations of the Alaskan oil spill.

The Alaskan Marine Air Ground Task Force of 85 Marines from the 1st Marine Division, 1st Force Service Support Group and 3rd Marine Aircraft Wing are bound for Valdez aboard the amphibious transport ship *USS Juneau*.

The Navy/Marine team is providing logistical support for the oil clean-up with two CH-46 Sea Knight helicopters, combat rubber raid crafts, and support personnel and equipment.

The Alaskan MAGTF is expected to remain in the area from 30 to 60 days. The ships will be used to billet clean-up crews already in the area and the helicopters and rubber raid crafts will transport the crews to and from the ships.

All military personnel are prohibited from entering any establishment listed above unless required by competent authority. Service personnel, whether in uniform or civilian clothing, found entering or leaving any of these establishments, may be subject to disciplinary action. Additionally, service personnel are warned that it is illegal to enter into a contract with any business establishment that has been declared off-limits.

V-neck undershirt optional

Starting April 1, all male Marines were required to possess

white crew-neck undershirts.

However, the white V-neck undershirt is still authorized for optional purchase and wear, according to ALMAR 072/89.

Commanders may require the wearing of the white crew-neck undershirt with the short-sleeve shirt when uniformity is considered essential (for ceremonies, formations, inspections, etc.).

Hawaii to recognize military community

Hawaii Military Week, an annual event sponsored by the Hawaii Chamber of Commerce Armed Services Committee, will be held May 15-21.

The week is aimed at providing community recognition and appreciation to members of the Armed Services and their dependents. Now in its fourth year, it is designed not only to express gratitude to the military and their dependents assigned here, but also to promote an increased awareness within the community of the military's economic and social contributions.

Hawaii Military Week will begin May 15 at the State Capitol Rotunda at 2 p.m. with opening ceremonies and a proclamation by the governor for May 15-21 as Hawaii Military Week. Other events open to the public include:

* Hawaii Combined Military Band Concert — May 17 at the Waikiki Shell, 7-9 p.m.

The concert will feature FM/Fac, Army, Navy, and Air Force bands.

* Paradise Cove Luau — May 19 at the Campbell Estate, 6-9 p.m. Live Hawaiian music, arts and crafts demonstrations and a buffet dinner will be offered.

Admission is \$15 for active duty and dependents, and \$10 for children under 12 years old.

* Armed Forces Day — May 20. On-base events are scheduled at several installations around Oahu. Hickam Air Force Base will have a display open from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Admission is free.

* Paniolo day at Waimea Falls — May 21 from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.

Tickets are \$10 for active duty people and their dependents, and \$7.50 for children 3-12 years old.

Montgomery, 1/12's field artillery chief. "We are here to cross-train with our sister artillery units. You never know when a Marine unit might have to work with soldiers, or vice-versa."

A written test was the first phase of the competition. Every member of all eight sections was required to answer 80 general knowledge questions about artillery procedures, ammunition, and duties.

Since there are differences between Army and Marine artillery operations, some compromising was necessary.

"We ironed-out the differences when we compiled the test several months ago," said Sergeant First Class C.T. Levitt.

While the results of the tests were being tabulated, the hands-on portion began. Each section performed an actual occupation of a firing point at Schofield's range, with a handful of evaluators constantly watching. While the evaluators acted as scorekeepers for the competition, they also kept their eyes alert for safety hazards.

During the occupation, the sections fired three live projectiles. Operations during firing, such as handling of ammunition and usage of on-board fire control devices, were constantly observed.

"Everything must be checked by the senior evaluator. If any data is wrong, or if there is any unsafe condition, the section at fault is going to lose points," said SFC Brent Scott, an evaluator.

Disassembly/assembly was also observed and graded. The teams were required to take down and put together certain parts of the howitzer while being timed. Section members were also tested in

various duties pertaining to the guns, such as elevation and direction.

Ammunition identification was another stage of testing. In order make the competition more difficult, evaluators asked oral questions at random.

In the end, it was two Army sections in first and second place, followed by Marine battery "F" in third.

"The Army does this type

of program at least once a year," said Cpl. Raymond Acevedo, a Fox battery cannoneer. "Now we know how this program works, so the Army had better watch out next year."

"This competition, which will be an on-going event, gives these Marines and soldiers something to strive for; it brings out the best in them and improves combat readiness," said MGySgt. Montgomery.

Glasnost gunners?

3rd Marines send Soviet rounds down range

What's the difference between the North Korean and Chinese versions of the Soviet-made AK-47?

What about the maximum range of the World War II vintage bolt-activated M-1944

sniper rifle?

These are questions infantrymen from 3rd Marines can now answer in some detail. A precedent was set last week when Army intelligence instructors from Schofield Barracks made the 35-mile trip to the Air Station with

14 Soviet-made weapons to conduct their Soviet Small Arms Familiarization Course.

Twenty-seven Marines from 1st Bn., 3rd Marines and 3rd Bn., 3rd Marines took the week-long course.

"Normally, we would have about two quotas a month to

go to Schofield," said 1st Lt. Richard Barbon of Headquarters, 3rd Marines. "But the battalion took the initiative and actually had the instructors come out here, so we didn't have to worry about billeting or transportation."

During the first 48 hours of the course, the Marines received class instruction, where they disassembled and reassembled weapons ranging from the Soviet pistol to the heavy machine gun. They fired the weapons on the third day, got more hands-on training in the classroom on the fourth, and completed a 63-question written test with practical application Friday.

According to SSgt. Andrew Ferandez, NCOIC of the three-man detachment of Army instructors, the weapons used were four AK-47 (two versions North Korean and two Chinese), four from the AKMS family from Romania, four from the modified AKM family, a PKM machine gun (modified ver-

sion of the RPK light machine gun, (similar to the SAW) and two M-1944 sniper rifles.

"I'm pretty sure we're going to want to keep this thing going," said 1st Lt. Barbon. "It's a real good class and the troops loved it. No one fell asleep, and no one got bored. In fact, when the

instructors gave five-minute breaks, they went up to the weapons and toyed around with them."

With the course complete, the Marines who scored 70 percent or above on the written test will get the go-ahead to check out the weapons from the Schofield armory and conduct their own classes.

Legally Speaking

The 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade and the Air Station operate a Legal Services Center to serve commanders, Marines, and their dependents in Hawaii.

Created in 1970, the Legal Services Center combines the Staff Judge Advocate (SJA) and legal personnel from Headquarters and Service Co., 1st MEB, with Legal Services Support Team A from Brigade Service Support Group-1 and Air Station judge advocates and legal clerks to form a joint legal organization.

The Legal Services Center provides a full spectrum of services from legislative affairs to legal assistance. Its mission is to support the 1st MEB, the Air Station, 1st Radio Bn., and HQSvCBn., FMFPac, at Camp Smith. In addition, it is the "home port" of the Circuit Military Judge, Island Judicial Circuit of the independent Navy-Marine Trial Judiciary.

Military Justice

In 1988, the military justice officer and his two prosecutors, known as trial counsel, prosecuted 40 general courts-martial and 63 special courts-martial. 36 other SPCMs were resolved by separations in lieu of trial. The 40 GCMs was a record number as reflected in the table below:

Higher Marine Corps standards, assertion of "jurisdiction" over off-base offenses, and more aggressive drug suppression efforts by the Naval Investigative Service and military police account for most of the increase.

Higher standards were also reflected in courts-martial sentences illustrated in this table:

The military justice section also recovered approximately \$15,000 in restitution to the Government or crime victims.

Despite jokes to the contrary, military justice does not seek to convict the innocent and, indeed, five trials resulted in the acquittal of accused Marines.

In keeping with prosecutorial trends, trial counsel completed a special child abuse prosecution course and maintain close liaison with Honolulu's prosecuting attorney and Child Protective Services.

Defense counsel

Defense counsel are under the operational and administrative control of the legal services director, but receive fitness reports and professional supervision from the Regional Defense Counsel located in Okinawa. Defense counsel work for the Marine Corps and are required to zealously represent Marines entitled to representation or consultation. They are not an independent law firm and may only serve Marines in specified categories of cases.

In 1988, defense counsel counseled 988 clients in connection with office hours, summary courts-martial, and administrative discharges and appeared in court just as often as trial counsel. The Pacific defense bar also sponsored a week-long National Institute of Trial Advocacy course for Marine, Navy, and Army lawyers in Hawaii.

Special Assistant, U.S. Attorney Program

LEGAL SERVICES

The Special Assistant, U.S. Attorney (SPAUSA) prosecutes civilians, including civilian employees and dependents, for traffic offenses, misdemeanors, and felonies committed on the Air Station. Managing 1,000 citations and 50 misdemeanors and felonies requires careful case management and the assistance of the Military Police Department.

In 1988, the center secured permission to handle its own felony cases from the U.S. Attorney. In January 1989, our SPAUSA obtained a felony conviction of an MCX employee for embezzling approximately \$10,000.

Administration section

While the administration section, of course, provides general administration to the center, it also oversees administrative discharges, claims, and JAG Manual investigations. In 1988, the section's Military Personnel Law Action Officer (MilPersActO), acted on 307 administrative discharges, including 40 administrative discharge boards, 40 claims against the Government for money damages, and 138 JAG Manual investigations.

The MilPersActO also oversees a comprehensive system for motor vehicle accident investigations. In general administration, excellent progress has been made in modernizing the center.

The library was overhauled, and "Westlaw," a legal computer data base, including Supreme Court decisions only five hours old. In addition, new com-

puters, four new telephone lines, and a computer enhancement for generating records of trial are now available for procurement.

Administrative Law

The administrative law officer provides administrative law, "installation" law, and international law advice and reviews courts-martial under the unique system of post trial review required by the Uniform Code of Military Justice.

In 1988, the admin law officer successfully defended several labor claims, an environmental lawsuit brought by the State Department of Health regarding the Station's waste water treatment plant, and a series of Privacy Act lawsuits.

Admin Law was also instrumental in evicting 43 civilian communications users from the Ulupau Crater Ordnance Area and retaining the Defensive Sea Area declared by President Roosevelt in World War II to protect Kaneohe Bay for military use. Currently, the Admin Law

Officer and the Station Morale, Welfare, and Recreation director are negotiating a cable TV contract which could provide up to \$100,000 for Morale, Welfare, and Recreation (MWR) programs. This section also reviewed 146 courts-martial and NJP appeals.

Legal Assistance

Legal Assistance served 7,856 clients and prepared 10,010 documents in 1988. The sole point of contact for service of individual civil process, it arranged for the service of 137 penal summons and reviewed 16 auto repossessions.

The Expanded Legal Assistance Program hit full stride providing 180 uncontested divorces and 72 adoptions per year. In addition to personal legal counseling for private, civil law problems, legal assistance provides predeployment briefings, the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program, and notary service. Through the efforts of legal assistance attorneys, the Legal Services Center received a Public Service Award from the American Bar Association.

The finest hours in Legal Assistance, however, were the

successful battles to get Hawaii banks to permit servicemembers to remove autos financed in the state if they maintain satisfactory payment records ("Car Wars") and to roll up a predatory photo club operation ("Photocam"). In an Armed Forces Disciplinary Board case brought by a legal assistance attorney, United Laboratories of America, Inc., recently agreed not to solicit or accept photo club contracts with Hawaii servicemembers and make restitution. Legal Assistance is currently developing mediation services through the Armed Services, YMCA and Neighborhood Justice Center of Honolulu as an alternative to going to court.

Civil Affairs

The Legal Services Center provides a five-officer, five-enlisted civil affairs section to reduce civilian interference with 1st MEB combat and related operations and, where necessary, provide the minimum humanitarian support required by international law.

During Gallant Knight, two 1st MEB civil affairs officers helped coordinate the civil affairs tasks of 174 Army, Navy Marine, Air Force, and Coast Guard units.

Fly away

For Marines stationed on an island, such as Oahu, there are two basic ways to cross the geographical boundary of the coast line. One is in a boat, the other is not a whole lot different and like water, involves man leaving his nat-

ural element.

Two years ago, Ray Gerkas decided to quit putting something off that was burning in the back of his mind. He had dreamed of entering a new element, of leaving the ground behind him: he wanted to learn to fly and he did it.

Today, he is an accomplished private pilot, a skill and passion that allows him the right of passage over geographical and mental boundaries. To most people stationed here, the coast of Oahu is the edge of their world, to him it marks the point of departure to anywhere in the Hawaiian Islands he wants to go.

"There is a feeling that is hard to explain when that engine starts to turn and you leave the ground," says Gerkas. "I learned to fly at my

last duty station. The first time I flew, here, I got an unbelievable feeling of freedom when I crossed the coastline and looked back. Flying is where it's at."

And, according to Gerkas, it's not that far-out of an idea. A lot of people spend their whole lives looking at planes and saying, "Some day I'd like to fly." He was one of the ones who went out and did it. The initial investment is more than some sports, but the lifetime of unlimited voyages to anywhere a plane will go makes up the difference.

A pilot's license is all Ger-

kas needs to head to the Wheeler Aero Club and sign out a two or four seat plane. From there he can cruise around Oahu's coastline or take off for a trip around Molokai or even a weekend trip to the Big Island. Aside from the freedom of movement, he describes flying as one of the biggest thrills to experience, and a new challenge everytime you leave the ground.

"Humans are land animals," he says. "Whenever you leave your element, there is a risk, but knowledge, skill and confidence in what you and your equipment can do, can overcome the risk."

The Wheeler Aero Club is a military flying club at Wheeler Air Force Base, and offers a good deal to military people through flying charges that are as much as half of what a civilian outfit would charge, and safety standards that exceed Federal Aviation Administration requirements. They have two-seater and four-seater plans to rent and instructors to qualify pilots in everything from basic flying to advanced instrument flying. And it's the best deal in town.

"There are places to go in

town to get your license," said Gerkas as he cleared Coco Head on his way to a trip around Molokai. "It can cost as much as a thousand dollars more than if you go through the club. If you start now, in five months you could have your license and be flying around the islands."

The steps to getting a pilot's license are simple. First you must be at least 15 years old and be coordinated enough to drive a car. The FAA requires you attend a certified ground school, offered by the Aero Club, and pass a written test covering everything you need to know to get a plane from point A to B and back on the ground safely. Last is getting 50 hours of flying time and pass a practical flying exam and oral test from an instructor.

"The cost for all of this is around \$2,000," said Gerkas. "But if you look at it, that includes 50 hours of plane rentals to go flying around. If you can drive a car, you can fly a plane."

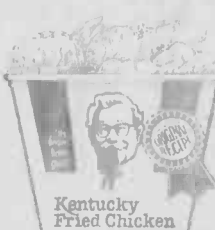

Medically Speaking

From the February 1989 issue of the Food and Drug Administration Drug Bulletin comes a "Safety Alert on Homemade Solutions for Contact Lens Care." Specifically, there are significant hazards when homemade saline solutions are improperly used when caring for

contact lenses.

The solutions in question are generally prepared by dissolving salt tablets or salt capsules in distilled water. These solutions are not sterile.

Homemade saline solutions can be used when heat disinfecting contact lenses, because the high temperatures are sufficient to kill organisms which might con-

taminate the solutions.

Improper use of the homemade saline solutions — such as a rinse or eye drop after disinfection, or with chemical disinfection of the lenses — can result in serious infection. If you are a contact lens wearer who uses homemade saline solutions and have any additional questions, contact your optometrist or physician.
