

## Visit to **Tate Britain** Van Gogh and Britain Exhibition

Thursday 28<sup>th</sup> March 2019

Our March visit is to Tate Britain where their Van Gogh and Britain Exhibition, which opens on March 27<sup>th</sup>, will feature 45 Van Gogh works borrowed from private and public collections and is Tate's first celebration of the Dutch artist for over 70 years.

The exhibition will be the first to focus on the artist's years in the 1870s working as an art dealer and teacher in London, a period which was formative in Van Gogh's decision to become an artist. Exhibitions in Britain in 1910 and 1923 began the country's love affair with his work.

The influence of Vincent van Gogh's Sunflowers on British art in the 20th century will be studied. One of the artist's famed Sunflowers paintings is being lent by the National Gallery. It will be hung alongside works by British artists who were inspired by Van Gogh to use flowers as "a vehicle for avant garde ideas". It is only the fourth time the National has lent out one of its most popular works.

As well as visiting this special Exhibition we will have plenty of time to go round Tate Britain.

The cost of **£44** includes entrance fee to Exhibition, coach journey and driver's tip.
