He received a bachelor degree in theology from Baylor University and a master of divinity from Southwestern Baptist Seminary in Fort Worth, Texas.



Andarko, Okla. - Rev. David Forester, 61, died April 5, 1994, at home.

He was a native of Andarko, son of the late Fred and Ellen Forester, and husband of the late Billye Ruth Prestridge. He was raised in Drexel and Bessemer City, where his father, the Rev. Fred Forester, served as pastor of First Baptist Church. He received a bachelor's degree from Baylor University in 1954 and a Master of Divinity from Southwestern Baptist Seminary in Fort Worth, Texas. While in seminary, he was minister of youth and music at Forney Avenue Baptist Church. His first pastorate was at the First Baptist Church, Allen, Oklahoma. He served as pastor at First Baptist Church, Cyril, Oklahoma from 1968 to 1976.

He served as Director of Missions for the Caddo Baptist Association from April 15, 1976 until his death. He had been a member of the state board of directors of the Baptist General Convention of Oklahoma, and chairman of the Child Care committee and Baptist Student Union Committee.
