Chairman's Column

As we hopefully begin to emerge from the awful effects of the Covid 19 pandemic we all want to "The know what New Normal" is going to look like. It is great to see local businesses and hostelries opening up again and those that have been able to remain open have provided a brilliant service to the village.

It is clear, however, that things will probably never return to how they were in 2019 and local authorities and public alike are having to readjust. In an area that, thankfully has so far, not been hit particularly hard, this is sometimes hard to accept but if we want to stay safe we have to follow all the guidelines.

A case in point are the three play areas in Wheatley; whilst the government says that these can be opened if it is SAFE to do so, it is generally less understood what is actually involved in achieving this. Regular deep sanitisation of equipment is mandatory and users should following social he distancing rules as well as washing hands before and after using play equipment

and even using antibacterial wipes to clean specific pieces of equipment after use. Every council in the country is trying to implement these conditions so it will take a little while to organise. Sadly, it is not simply a case of opening the gates and Wheatley parish council urges everyone to be patient and continue to apply common sense when allowing children to use the play areas. Incidentally, the basket swing in Church Road play area has recently been replaced at a cost to the village approaching £5000, so this provides an indication of the importance we attach to these areas and how much they cost the village to maintain.

On an entirely different note, I wanted to give a public vote of thanks to one of our outside workers, Steve Wensley. Steve has decided to retire after working for the Parish and helping look after the village for the last 25 years or so. Thank you Steve and I am sure all will want to offer their best wishes for the future.

Clerk's Column

As lockdown continues the parish council have embraced changes in legislation and technology and have continued to hold their meetings online. The full council calendar of meetings has resumed, and members of the public are welcome to join these meetings. The agendas published on the council website

(www.wheatleyparishcouncil.gov.uk) include a hyperlink or phone number that you can use to attend. This will continue for the foreseeable future.

At the council's meeting in July it debated whether to re-open the play areas. This was agreed, once the council was satisfied that is could meet the range of guidelines set out by the government and could do its best to keep the community safe. Work included putting together a cleaning regime for all three play areas, additional site-specific risk assessments, new signage and equipment checks. The council is grateful for a £600 grant from SODC Cllr Kantor that will go towards the costs of additional cleaning,

with any remaining costs being born by the council. I would like to thank everyone for their patience and co-operation during this time.

I do ask that visitors to the play areas follow the information on the signs at each location, clean and sanitise your hands, refrain from taking food and drink into the park and to keep the sites clean. This may mean you have to take your litter home with you, including any masks or gloves that you have used.

We have finally secured over £20,000 of funding towards delivering improvements to Farm Close Road Rec. COVID-19 has delayed the start date, which will now be sometime in September/October.

I would also like to welcome Daniel Lawrence to the council, having been coopted at the June meeting of the parish council. The council now has councillors filling all 15 seats.

system". As the weeks wore on how apparent this became.



Community Mask Tree Blooms in Wheatley!

A band of volunteers have come together to provide cloth face coverings to the Wheatley community. Helen Flight and Michelle Qume set up the 'Community Mask Tree' outside The Merry Bells/Parish Council office to help ensure that everyone who needs a face covering can access one. We have since been joined by several



other volunteers who have generously given their time to help protect our community.

Everyone is welcome to take a face covering if they need one. Different sizes, styles and colours are available. They are available free of charge, although we welcome donations to our collection for Oxford Hospitals Charity. At the time of writing we have so far given out 450 face coverings and raised approximately £600 for our local NHS hospitals.

The History File

That late winter 'monsoon' and semi-tropical Lockdown reemphasised our trees. In the 1970s *Church Waye* (Cuddesdon Rd.) was planted with poplars.

They mark when Wheatley couples, new-borns and coffins took the *Waye* from Wheatley medieval chapel (Bell Lane) to Cuddesdon church to marry, be baptised or be buried. In tricky religious times (the Reformation), sharing new love, new life and bereavement with neighbours on that journey, whatever your 'label', helped heal communities.

Cherokee-named Sequoias

A California police chief visited in 2004. I showed her Giant and Coastal Sequoias from her State. Rival US and UK botanists (1850s) called the Giants Washingtonea or Wellingtonea. Ninety years later they agreed on 'Big' (Gigantea)! Britain failed to take California in 1846, which increased S. Gigantea prices to two gold guineas a seed. One grows in Old Holton Park, 135 feet high, 15 foot girth. A Coastal S. 65 feet, grows on WPA site; a dangerous Gigantea in Templar Close, 1-200 years old, was felled, 2014.

Remote Learning

The coronavirus pandemic has presented challenges to schools like none before, but Wheatley Park School has continued to operate throughout, with learning and pastoral care taking on a very different flavour.

A small but growing minority of students have been in school, but the majority of our wonderful young people have had to get used to their new 'classroom at home'.

We have benefited immensely from our forward-thinking approach to technology, and the fact that all students already had use of a Chromebook - a lightweight laptop gave us a real head start when it came to remote learning.

We adhered to the school timetable, so when French came round during Period 2, students would just log in to a learning platform called Google Classroom and access the work, or even a live-streamed lesson on some occasions, instead of walking down to the Modern Foreign Languages building.

As part of trying to maintain the best possible sense of

connectedness throughout the school community, we have tried to maintain many of our usual events in an adapted format with virtual assemblies, lots of pastoral support via phone calls, and even a virtual campfire to replace our end of Year 7 camp. We have also introduced new initiatives such as an extensive foodbank to support the families hardest hit by the pandemic.

Students, with great support from their parents/carers, have responded magnificently, and we are very proud that the vast majority have continued to engage well with their learning ever since went into lockdown.

That said, everyone is looking forward to returning to school in September and, in line with government guidance, we have plans to do this while minimising the risk of transmission.

On behalf of the school community, we would like to thank everyone who has supported us in some way, shape or form this year, and wish everyone a safe and healthy summer.

Musical Pupils

We have been welcoming pupils back into school since 3rd June as part of a phased reopening, adhering closely to government guidelines with regard to social distancing and group sizes. By the end of this term, we will have had Reception, Y1 and Y6 back in school full time, and most recently Y5 for mornings. Outdoor activities offered to the remaining year groups have included class picnics on the field, forest school sessions and a week of Sports Day activities for all year groups, both virtual and in person. Our Y6 leavers will celebrate the end of primary school with an outdoor assembly followed by a water fight – possibly the first time ever that water pistols have been allowed in school!

Music has helped us to keep a sense of community and belonging despite the many weeks of separation caused by Covid-19. Our recent Ofsted inspection noted that "the teaching of music is a strength in the school" and we have reaped the benefit of that in so many ways during lockdown. Early on, the school staff recorded individual videos of themselves singing a song called 'Smile' and Mrs Cave, our music teacher, combined them into a single heartfelt message sent out to children and families to remind them of the power of the smile and that they were missed and loved.

More recently she taught pupils sing 'Looking To Rainbow', a song with lyrics "though in we Lockdown. won't we knocked down"! Children learned the song together in virtual singing assemblies and then sent in their videos which, when combined. created



YOUR Wheatley Village Archive

"I had no idea there was so much information on the website and shall now spend hours browsing, when I'm not in the garden!"

What a fantastic quote about the website from a long time Wheatley resident to start our article in this summer issue. Have you looked at the website yet?

Many new records have been recently added, from research and kind donation, during the lockdown weeks, including the early history of the Merry Bells, built as a Temperance Hotel, which has recently come to light. We now know that it ceased to be an hotel in 1932, 44 years after its opening and, of course, in 2020 it's 50 years since it was acquired for the village. A volunteer at the archive has been busy looking at the Kelly's Directory and has added where nearly all those listed in 1911, 1920 and 1939 lived in the village to the website. An account of living in Wheatley during the COVID-19 shutdown has also been created and added for future generations to know what life was like here in 2020.

'Bygone Wheatley' a new history of Wheatley written by Michael Heaton on behalf of the Archive is on sale on Friday and Saturday mornings from 10-12 outside the Merry Bells, weather permitting. It is a 160page full-colour book which covers almost every aspect of Wheatley's history for the last 2000 years, and sets itself apart from the specialist publications. which have previously been published, as the only complete history of our village. The first two

chapters are dedicated to an overall history and to the age and evolution of Wheatley's buildings and enterprises including its shops. The other chapters describe our industrial businesses, stone, brick, and the milling of wheat and ochre, which created the wealth in the village, and on farming and the railway. There is much new history never before revealed! The book ends with a nostalgic chapter on our entertainments and sports. The book is very fully indexed for ease of reference. It sells for £12 and credit card payment is preferred, but cash is fine too.

The website has had a thorough review over the last few weeks during the lockdown and the website www.wheatleyarchive.org.uk is even easier to use. The search process has been much enhanced and is now better than Google! It is no longer necessary to put a search such as Hughes Bakery in double inverted commas as the search engine will find any document which has Hughes and Bakery in it. Try it out!

The History Group talk in September has been cancelled, but the one on 22nd November by Liz Woolley will be streamed at no cost to members.

Finally, the Wheatley Village Archive wishes to pay tribute to the late Martin Tims who devised the original database for all the artefacts in the Village Archive nearly 20 years ago and upon which the new website is based. Thank you, Martin, for all your work.

Words from The VPA

The weather in June and July was very changeable, more like April showers than summer — even the weather is full of uncertainty! Let's hope that August and September bring more settled, warm days.

We can rely on our gardens and allotments to keep our minds occupied and surround us with all the that the pleasure natural brings. I have now added to my collection of pots with three different varieties of blueberry bushes, a small cherry tree (Stella) and a mulberry (Charlotte Russe)! With seeds for cucamelon, wasabi-flavoured mustard and green radish, I think I am doing my bit to support nurseries and growers! I am continuing to sow vegetable seeds to extend the harvest period, particularly carrots as they are a staple for me. Broad beans and sugar snap peas continued to produce small amounts with regular feed and Μv Gardener's Delight water. tomatoes in the kitchen window produced several trusses but with not many fruits in each so I am wondering if pollination was reduced by being indoors? I kept them in to reduce the risk of blight, but all of my first early remained wonderfully potatoes healthy, probably because of the hot spell earlier in the year, so I could

probably have put them outside. Having said that, the high winds knocked over my potatoes so perhaps the tomatoes were better off indoors! If you have larger fruit trees than my pot-dwelling ones, now is a good time to prune them if not done in July. Wisteria, too, will need cutting back asap if not done already. I like the 2 and 7 rule which is easier to remember — cut back to two buds in February and back to 7 buds in July. Hedges trimmed now will keep them looking crisp through winter.

'continuing'. all Now is about Continue to water, to top up ponds, to deadhead flowers and keep picking vegetables. Ponds may also need blanket weed removed to keep them looking good. Whilst continuing to water, where necessary, it's good to be waterwise and only water pots and recently planted perennials and trees. Lawns really don't need watering and will soon recover from dry spells when rain returns. Continue sowing salad vegetables such as lettuce, rocket and radish. I keep sowing lettuce but they disappear overnight! Any tips much appreciated.

Now is also a good time to be looking forward, too. Broad beans can be sown in September for next year with a view to avoiding black fly on their tender tops in spring. Views vary on this! Spring cabbage and pak choi can be started too. Bulbs such as Paperwhite narcissus can be planted up for Christmas indoor display or as presents. Collect seed from hardy annuals and perennials for sowing later. I am very fond of Welsh poppies and tend to just shake the seeds around when ripping out the old plants. You can see the result in the picture (top right).

Unfortunately, I can offer no news on when meetings will restart at present. The current restrictions/guidelines

Howe Trust & Allotment Association

Although many of Wheatley's Clubs and Societies have been unable to meet during the shutdown, the Howe and the associated allotments have been busier than ever. The footpaths have been well used by joggers, dog walkers, family outings etc.. In addition to the exercise and fresh air the site affords splendid views across Otmoor towards Brill. In the spring, the lambs were an added attraction and the wildlife, not all of it welcomed by the allotment holders, includes deer, badgers, foxes and rabbits. For the more eagle eyed there are slowworms, grass snakes, toads, and field mice together with at least 25 bird species.

The allotments have proved increasingly popular with over 100 allotments most of which have been well tended and productive. There is now a waiting list, for further information contact the allotment secretary, Taff Morgan Jones. Gradual progress is being made on the communal plot which has a series of raised beds for those folk with disabilities which make it difficult to manage a normal plot. Horticulture has been shown to be very therapeutic for those with physical mental and

problems. Just before the lockdown the association received an award of £2,000 from the National Gardens Scheme to create 6 more raised beds in addition to the existing 8. The work is undertaken by volunteers and we hope to resume work in the autumn. Unfortunately the pupils from the Mabel Prichard school, which caters for children with special needs, have been unable to visit this year but produce is still being grown and then distributed at the school.

As usual we would like to thank all who have helped in the day to management of the site. Additional help with fences, maintaining clearing footpaths, tree planting and maintenance on an occasional and ad hoc basis is always welcome. Wheatley Playing Field Trust is still asking everyone to stay away from the playing field at Holton, other than those groups registered to use the field. At present these include Wheatley Park School, Wheatley FC and Wheatley Rugby Club only. Discussions have taken place with both clubs and a limited return to training has already begun following strict observance of FA and RFU guidelines. The clubhouse is remaining shut for the time being as are the changing rooms.

The Trust will be putting up three tennis court nets towards the end of July. These will be available, free of charge as in previous years, to residents of Wheatley and Holton. Please be aware of others users though, keep observing social distancing and be patient if there are no courts available. One of the intended activities is Walking Football and discussions have taken place with SODC to promote and develop this. More information will be sent out when it becomes safe to participate.

It is with some degree of uncertainty that this contribution is written. Most of us have now become accustomed to the everyday changes the coronavirus has made to our lives. Many of us have welcomed the lifting of lockdown and the ability to meet family and friends again albeit whilst abiding to social distancing and other precautions. The smell of the bar-b-que, the chat in pub gardens and the sight of children going to school shows life is showing signs of returning to "normal".

When we look back on 2020 for many it will be the year when long outstanding odd jobs were done, walls painted, unread books finally started and gardens bloomed, often with vegetables as well as flowers. The range of programmes available on TV and radio has been almost overwhelming. New walks have been found and formerly wobbly cyclists are much more proficient. The Wheatley Society will keep members informed of developments and ways to contribute to the wider debate which will also include the opportunities the development presents and the identification of appropriate ways for it to be integrated into the village.

When we are up and running again do consider coming along and joining us. In the meanwhile, please continue to take care.



The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you; the Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace.

We often say 'Bless you' when someone sneezes (into their elbow of course) or 'Bless him' to a child who's being particularly cute (it happens!). Perhaps we might even abbreviate it to just 'Bless' these days. But what does it mean to bless someone? The Oxford English dictionary says that when we bless someone we are "asking God to protect them". It's a simple form of prayer.

So. when friends from Wheatley Area Churches were looking for a way to tangibly express our concern and love for our village community in the midst of the pandemic lockdown, it was natural to turn to words of blessing. Our food bank has been present in the store throughout the pandemic and we would like to thank everyone who has continued to support this during difficult I would especially like to thank Wheatley residents Jane and Dick who have been collecting the food to take for the Community Emergency Food bank throughout the lockdown period. There has also been a local gentleman called John that has been donating every week since March to the food bank who I wanted to give a public recognition.

During this time, we have also supported a couple of local food banks; including a special one set up during the pandemic by

Wheatley Park School helping families in need of some extra support.

Our monthly donation budget has been increased every month since the pandemic to help support more local groups, and remit has been widened to help our local community such as providing donations to the NHS wards and departments. ASDA store with a community champion has been part of a bigger initiative to donate 250,000 masks to care homes, of which we divided our store allocation to 3 different local care homes including Triangle in Wheatley along with some toiletry and sanitary items to residents in their home, whilst they were not able to have visitors.

In June, we have donated to a number of local schools, including Wheatley Primary School and John Watson School to provide some heathy snacks to enjoy during their break times, as children have not been able to take in their own.
