Seniors stood at the end of one part of their lives facing the beginning of another. The sense of finality seemed real as their feelings about everything intensified.

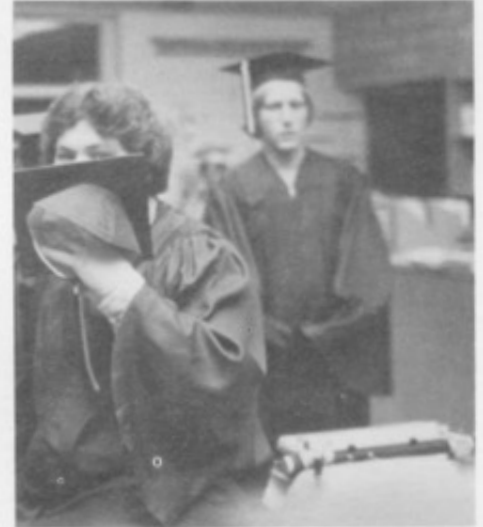
As graduation approached, Seniors looked back nostalgically on their years of school and growing up together and wondered where it all went to.
