ACTA NATIONAL SPORTING CLAYS, 2002

The 9th National Sporting Clays were held at the ACTA National Ground in Wagga Wagga on the 18th and 19th May. Participation at this year Nationals increased significantly on last year and visitors were attracted from many states within Australia. Members from the ACTA, SSAA and Field & Game were again represented at these Nationals.

The format at this year Sporting Clays Nationals was unchanged from the previous year with the ACTA Sporting Clays Championship being conducted on the Saturday and the Commonwealth Sporting Clays Championship being conducted on the Sunday. The National Sporting Clays Champion was again to be decided over both days.

Saturday saw 67 competitors contest the ACTA Sporting Clays Championship on an overcast cool autumn day. The overall winner of this event was Marty Seymour with a score of 94/100. The grade placings for this event were as follows: 1st AA John Younger 91/100, 2nd AA Soc Pilipasidis 90/100; 1st A Brenton Irons 81/100, 2nd A Laurie Bahr; 1st B Shane O'Brien 86/120, 2nd B Richie Tupp 95/120; 1st C Gary Gray 78/100, 2nd C Robert Machul. Ashley Matuch won junior section with a score of 76/100, Women's section by Christine O'Brien 59/100 and Wilson Ronald won the Veteran section on a score of 76/100.

Sunday and another cool autumn day greeted 58 competitors for the Commonwealth Sporting Clays Championship. The overall winner of this event was Peter Tobin with a score of 95/100. The grade placings for this event were as follows: 1st AA Grade Soc Pilipasidis 94/100, 2nd AA Grade John Younger 92/100; 1st A Grade Richie Tupp 90/100, 2nd A Grade Brenton Irons 89/100; 1st B Grade Shane O'Brien 85/100, 2nd B Grade Brad Henshall 81/100; 1st C Grade Daryl Hunt 82/100, 2nd C Grade Andrew Tink 77/100. Ashley Matuch won junior section with a score of 68/100, Women's section by Toni Henshall 61/100 and Hugh Fairfield-Smith won the Veteran section on a score of 57/100.

NATIONAL SPORTING CLAYS CHAMPION

With Juniors and Veterans well represented these sections were keenly contested. Field & Game member Ashley Matuch secured victory in the Juniors division with a score of 138/200. Peter Whyte from Wagga GC was successful in the Veterans division with a score of 115/200 and Christine O'Brien won the Women's section with a score of 114/200.

Walmer club member Andrew Tink claimed third in C Grade with 144/200, second in C Grade went to Robert Machul with a score of 148/200, and the winner of C Grade was Gary Gray from the Bendigo club with a score of 149/200.

Wangaratta club member Brad Henshall with a score of 158/200 took out third place in B Grade. Shane O'Brien from Bendigo placed second in B Grade with a score of 165/200 and Richie Tupp from Geelong claimed first place with a score of 170/200.

Robert Matuch took out third place in A Grade with a score of 162/200. Second place went to Bendigo club member Greg O'Shanassy with a score of 166/200 and first place in A grade went to Melbourne club member Brenton Irons with a score of 170/200.

In AA grade, third place went to Peter Tobin from the Mildura club on 176/200. Second place went to Field & Game shooter John Younger with a score of 183/200 from first place winner Soc Pilipasidis from the Abruzzo club on a score of 184/200.

The overall winner and National Sporting Clays Champion for 2002 with a score over the two days of 185/200 was Marty Seymour from Field & Game in Victoria. Marty received the Royal Blue Sash and silver belt buckle for his efforts.

The ACTA would like to thank the Wagga Gun Club for their continued assistance with these Championships and in particular David Coleman who spent most of his time ensuring that the carnival ran smoothly.

The 2003 Sporting Clays National is scheduled to be held 17th and 18th May at the ACTA National Shooting Ground. All are most welcome to attend.

Frank Musumeci, John Bacchetti, Michael Bertinazzi, Fil Lofaro, Wayne Cosmo and Gary Williams all shot particularly well, picking up places in their respective grades.

Wes Humphries continued on his winning way, taking out the Granite Belt Nolans 25T Continental event. Humphries fought a tough battle with local favourite Frank Musumeci in a shoot off for the event. John Bacchetti together with Geoff Patti held the Ballandean banner high collecting places in the event.

Guyra Veteran shooter Noel Campion held out Wes Humphries to take out the Overall in the Ralph Johns Pty Ltd 20T Double Rise.

Humphries was proving a force to be reckoned with, putting him in contention for the Overall High Gun for the weekend. John Bacchetti and Gary Williams were again on the winners dais in event 3, this time Tim Bonner joined them in sharing the spoils of successful shooting.

The number of shooters for Day 2 of competition increased all vying for the \$1,800 on offer for the 6th event on the program, the Grow Force 1000. Shooters were also busy organising their teams for the Qld v NSW teams match, with Qld seeking revenge after NSW pipped them at the post last year.

Graham Smith of Warwick held out the in-form Wes Humphries to take overall in the Shamrock Marketing 25T Point Score event. Frank Musumeci, John Bacchetti and Paul Rapisarda all collected places in their grades in this difficult event.

Wes Humphries was again the places in the 50T Combination sponsored by John Vichie Firearms. Michael Hickey blitzed the field to take Overall in this event. Milco Volpato and Steven Baronio picked up places in their grades in one of the more difficult events on the program.

The much anticipated Grow Force 1000 25T Double Barrel Grade meterage event saw the hotshots of the field dropping off one after the other in the cool blustery conditions. Steven Baronio and Wayne Murray of Sunshine Coast both scored the possible, forcing them to shoot off for the \$1,000 up for grabs for 1st place. Both shooters shot particularly well considering the conditions, smoking target after target. Unfortunately for Baronio, the wind, inexperience and nerves played havoc on this concentration, Murray went on to clench

1st place. To the delight of shooters and spectators Wayne Cosmo representing Grow Force and Suppliers handed over prize money to the 4 highest scores, Wayne Murray 1st, Steven Baronio 2nd, Greg Newey 3rd (Warwick), A Futter 4th (Glen Innes). Shooters from Qld and NSW teams were eagerly awaiting their chance to do battle in the Teams Match, Qld shooters carrying the scars of last years defeat were keen to turn the tables, but this was not to be. The NSW team with a fine score of 574 went on to carry the cup again, blowing the Qld team off the lanes.

Wes Humphreys proved he was too hard to beat over the weekend, he took home the AA Grade High Gun. A Grade High Gun went to Mt Isa shooter Jim Edmonds. All the way from Collarenebri Tim Burke won B Grade High Gun with Gold Coast shooter Sharon Tunney taking out the C Grade High Gun. Noel Campion

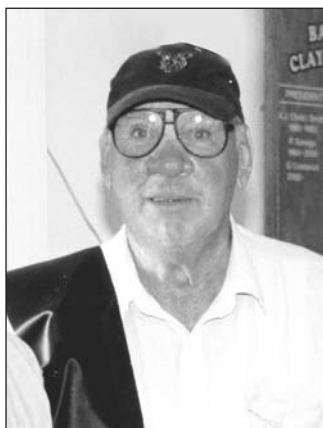

SOUTH EAST ZONE COACHING SEMINAR:

A Level 1 Coaching Seminar was held at the Gold Coast Club on 29th and 30th June. Eleven aspiring Level 1 Coaches attended the 2 day program which consisted of presentations on gun fit, vision, motivation as well as the standard coaching texts. This was combined with practical coaching on the tracks. This initiative of the South East Zone was possible due to funding from the Queensland Department of Sport and Recreation.

NORMANTON CONTINUES TO GROW:

The most isolated ISSF venue in Australia received a welcome boost recently in the form of a grant in the Minor Facilities Funding section from the Queensland Department of Sport and Recreation. CLAY TARGET SHOOTING - THE FUTURE

The stimulus for this document derived from a plea in a copy of the Clay Target Shooting News for shooters to support a particular carnival, or else face the prospect of it being the last time the event would be conducted. That the organisers of the event were motivated to do this should prompt all clay target shooters to give some thought as to whether this reflects an isolated problem or whether it is symptomatic of a general trend that has profound implications for the future of the sport. It is my contention that this situation is an indicator of a more widespread trend which should receive some urgent attention. I have no particular qualifications to comment on this issue but with many years experience in the sport as a both a competitor and club administrator, I feel I can credibly identify some areas of concern and make a few suggestions as to how they might be redressed.

I am aware that I might be viewed a pessimist and that my opinions regarding perceived problems would be subject to debate, but regardless of the validity or otherwise of what I believe, it would do no harm to conduct a review to identify any concerns and develop strategies to deal with them. Indeed, any organisation worth its salt should objectively scrutinise its policies and activities on a cyclic basis irrespective of how well things are going. What I am alluding to here is a proactive rather than the reactive ad hoc approach to the way shooters and their representative organisations often seem to deal with issues affecting them. Whether this is a valid observation is moot, but it is indisputable that a proactive approach is always to be preferred in that it is more likely to bring about desired outcomes.

The first task in any review of the status quo is to determine just what are the problems. In this regard I have little doubt that the major issue confronting the sport is participation, or rather the lack of it, and of course participation is the key determinant in whether the sport can remain viable. What is apparent from my observations, and conversations with shooters from elsewhere, is that declining attendances at shoots is not an uncommon phenomenon. You don't necessarily need statistical data to support such a contention. Take a look around your own club and note if membership and shoot attendances are down, then look to see how many new faces, and particularly young faces you can see. Certainly it is normal in any sport for there to be a turnover of participants but when they are not being replaced and the average age of shooters is increasing then there is cause for concern. Quite clearly, the sports survival necessitates attracting new blood and maintaining their enthusiasm. Remember, declining participation not only impacts on the viability of a club but it can also translate into difficulties in attracting sufficient personnel to run its affairs and conduct shoots. I am of course unable to say whether this situation prevails generally, and there are examples of highly successful clubs that contradict the trend. Such examples of success could be useful models in that they must have something that might be effectively utilised to advantage elsewhere. If as I assert, the primary problem for clay target shooting is to stimulate interest in the sport, then it is essential to identify those factors militating against that objective. The reasons why interest appears to be declining is I feel a consequence of factors that are economic, demographic and socio-cultural in nature.

Why then is it apparently problematic to foster interest in a sport that we all know is challenging and stimulating? Certainly for the potential younger shooter times are tough and with relatively high unemployment or unstable employment in this age group, participation in a whole range of activities regardless of interest is perhaps hard to finance. Contradictorily, all this is occurring at a time when clay target shooting is cheaper in real terms than it has ever been. Some might also be deterred by the sport having an expensive image, but this is a perception that is far

less relevant than in times past. While of course the sport is as expensive as one wants to make it, for the average shooter, it is, in relative terms no more expensive than a lot of other leisure activities. The perception of expensive, however, lingers and efforts need to be made to counter what might be discouraging in its effect.

When enquiring into the causes of any decline in appeal we should not underrate the impact of demographic changes in the equation. Rural populations have diminished in recent decades and with many young people residing now in cities they have tended to become isolated from the environments that are generally more conducive to the fostering of an interest in shooting. Whereas more of earlier generations had a closer proximity to areas where game was plentiful, started shooting in the field, and graduated to competition later on, this sort of opportunity is less available today. The reality for many potential shooters who are urban based, is that the logistics of accessing game areas is somewhat difficult and their best route into shooting it is likely to be viacompetition. Comparisons between rural and city based clubs in terms of their members age structure and whether they maintain membership levels, should give an indication as to if where you live is a significant factor in the level of interest in shooting sports.

Social and cultural influences within our society, have and are, continuing to have a negative impact on shooters and their activities. Media tendencies to sensationalise firearms misuse has cultivated an irrational attitude in the minds of some of the population that frequently borders on hysteria. Some I know see the media as part of a conspiracy against shooters but I am inclined to construe this as something that has more do with enhancing ratings and circulation. What is particularly galling is that journalists are largely ignorant of firearms matters and seem to source their information from the distorted propaganda of anti firearms zealots and idiot fringe environmental groups. I find it hard to understand the attitude of some environmentalists towards shooters in that most shooting in this country is directed against vertebrate pests and inanimate targets.

Potential shooters are of course not immune to all this negativity and some must be put off to some extent by it. Just as worrying is that politicians are subject to the same biased influences and the prejudices so created manifest themselves in legislation. Observations spanning a long time have convinced me that much of restrictive regulations now imposed on shooters have their roots in the negative reporting by the media. It is unjust of course, but regrettably the tendency of journalists to vilify shooters is fact of life that has not been adequately countered. The "antis" seem to get their message over so why can't shooters?

The structure of much of industry and commerce has changed significantly over recent years and this factor is perhaps overlooked in terms of the impact it has on many sporting and social activities. Long gone are the days when many had the entire weekend to devote to leisure activities. Remember when businesses shut at noon on Saturday? Now, more and more, those employed in retail and service industries are obliged to work over weekends and certainly with regard to Saturday, this is beginning to look just like any other trading day. While these changes benefit the public in some respects, the downside is that these work practices detract from the ability of weekend workers to participate in sport. The only consolation for clay target shooters is that extended trading impacts similarly on other activities.

Much of the foregoing relates to factors that are largely extraneous, and as such lie beyond the capacity to be dealt with in other than a reactive way, but of course any meaningful evaluation of where the sport is at, must also look inwardly at any inherent deficiencies which detract from its appeal to keep participants. On the issue of drop-outs it should be acknowledged that natural attrition is to a point a fact of life that occurs in all spheres of activity, but what should be of real concern is where a shooter drops out of the sport because of some reason or problem that is directly within the power of the sports administrators to rectify.

While the national and state associations have an important role

in maintaining the well being of the sport the clubs are the most important focus from the shooters standpoint. It is difficult to perhaps be prescriptive of just what it is that makes for a good facility that can keep shooters keen but there are in my experience two extremes in the type of club and either can be equally successful. There is on one hand the small regionally based club with perhaps a couple of DTL traps, which conducts a monthly shoot that is popular because of its informal picnic atmosphere. Often the competitors know one another as neighbours and are also by their locale and occupations likely to be field shooters which in itself may engender a more favourable environment for competitive shooting. An operation of this type has a relatively low capital investment, ongoing overheads are small and its management is not overly complex.

Contrast this situation with that of a large metropolitan club. Here is a facility that may cater for several clay target disciplines, have many shooting layouts and be supported by good amenities and catering services. Competition is likely held every weekend and opportunities for practice and coaching available at various times throughout the week. Such an operation is a far cry from the example I described above. The capital investment in land, machinery, buildings and contents is considerable and obviously maintenance and other overhead costs are going to be very high. Far from being simple to control, such an outfit is a business by any definition and as such its committee of management would ideally contain a wide spectrum of skills if the entity is to function efficiently and effectively. The demands on the time of such a committee will be very much greater than for their counterparts in the smaller example mentioned and as such the complexity of things may oblige the engagement of varying degrees of professional help.

The expectations of shooters also tend to be different in regard to larger and smaller clubs. As suggested, a small club will have limitations that are acceptable in that context, whereas a large club in addition to the variety of shooting disciplines it caters to, will be expected to be more professionally run and provide a much higher standard of amenities and service. Metropolitan shooters also seem to identify less with a club in a social sense compared to regional people and their attitude to the sport more business like. Many urban shooters merely pay their nominations, shoot and depart with little of the commitment than might be evident in members of a smaller club where the spirit of camaraderie is probably much stronger. This attitude of detachment that is evident in some shooters is all very well, but it does unfortunately mean that getting workers to keep things functioning in what has been a traditionally voluntary structure gets more and more difficult. I often wonder if some shooters are aware of the fact that they enjoy relatively cheap clay target shooting and that this to a significant extent is due to the efforts of the few.

Notwithstanding the differences of between clubs that may have an influence on someone maintaining an interest and an involvement in clay target shooting, there are other factors that have a role as well. There needs to be a recognition that a welcoming attitude, help for beginners and those shooters who experience problems in the sport, value for money and competent organisation of shoots are major factors in sustaining interest. These are primary functions that are clearly the responsibility of the individual club.

Any discussion of the sport in terms of what serves to encourage or discourage shooters would never be complete without a reference to the issue of structure and rules.

In my thirty years association with the sport, perhaps the most contentious and perennial topic concerns the grading and handicapping of shooters. Various modifications have been made over the years to try to improve equity and fairness and thwart the cheats, yet there is always something to gripe about. I know for a fact that some shooters feel the system works against them and the consequential disaffection can result in a loss of interest. Certainly no system however well contrived can be entirely free of flaws and contradictions, but if the structure is perceived to be open to abuse as some indeed seem to believe, then things should be subject to a review and changed if necessary. Problems should not be allowed to fester.

In the foregoing I have alluded to some external factors of a social

or economic nature which have, and continue to have a negative impact on our sport. Many other activities are also similarly affected by what is irrevocable change but shooters are virtually alone in terms of the legislative restrictions that are imposed on them. Regrettably, the worst aspects of legislation will not be changed but there are absurdities within the existing framework of regulations that are illogical and should be vigorously opposed. Sadly the kind of regulations now in place are precipitated by events beyond the control of honest shooters, but they can assist to counter future threats by at all times presenting to the public an image of responsibility and exemplary conduct with regard to firearms use. We should remember that many restrictions are the resultant of the actions of individuals.

The aspect of image is critical for the future of sport shooting in this country and like it or not the public view of shooters is as mentioned one created by the media. We have seen how during the Sydney Olympics our shooters became the heroes of the hour and the sport gained a degree of favourable publicity that would be impossible to buy. This is indicative of how things could be, but sadly, this kind of exposure occurs only infrequently. Realistically though, a relatively minor sport like clay target shooting will battle to command the kind of coverage from the sporting media that cultivates a greater interest amongst the public. However, it is not impossible to do better and efforts should be maintained to ensure to at least get major competitive events more adequately reported. Bringing the achievements of high profile shooters before the public creates a strong favourable impression that enhances acceptance of the sport as a legitimate and worthwhile pursuit. Greater acceptance is also more likely to result in journalists treating firearms issues more fairly and objectively but this can only be realised by building a better rapport with the media. Remember also, that a good public attitude toward shooting sports is likely to rub off on the politicians and this could only be beneficial.

I have made reference to the difficulties in getting volunteers to manage clubs (at least in some cases) and this is a phenomenon which could have a profound influence on whether the traditional structure under which clubs have operated can continue to exist. Smaller regionally based clubs may have an advantage here in that they exist in an environment that seems more conducive in attracting volunteers and as such they will be able to survive in the traditional form. Metropolitan clubs seem to exist within a culture which is less disposed to volunteering and it is no secret that as the pool of volunteer workers diminishes then the ability to operate successfully becomes increasingly compromised. Quite clearly then, if the staffing of club committees becomes too difficult and the structure ceases to be effective then it must adopt another mode of operation in order to survive. The extreme alternative to a volunteer basis for a club management is one that is professionally run with all that implies in terms of greatly increased shooting costs. It could also result in some existing facilities being amalgamated and branching out into supplementary income generating activities. All shooters who value the benefits of the present structure should give thought to actively participating in the management of their club if they want it to continue in that form. If clay target shooting goes down the road towards being professionally run then it will be shooters themselves who bring it about.

I have pointed out the necessity for shooters to strive for a better public image but given the entrenched antipathy towards firearms within many sections of society this will not be an easy task. Certainly it will be a task that involves shooters and all levels of the sport's administration in a coordinated programme of promotion. While I recognise that clubs have resource limitations for promotional activities there are nevertheless things that can be which are not overly demanding of effort. An invitation can be extended to local politicians to visit a clay target club. That personal contact may be worth more than you might imagine. Schools and youth organisations can be similarly approached and some clubs have been successful in getting juniors involved in the sport. What about approaching social clubs/groups to come and try out the sport? Apart from the potential to attract some new members, exposing more people to the sport in a positive first hand way renders them less susceptible to the distortions perpetrated by the media. The downside of these sorts of activities is that they are labour intensive, time

consuming and as such may be limited by the availability suitable volunteers.

While certain things can be done at the club level to promote clay target shooting the real impetus must I feel start at the national level. I am firm in the view that if the sport is to prosper and grow this will be an outcome of how well it is promoted and marketed. This should not be construed as a criticism of the present administration and the Olympics successes of our shooters and other initiatives can be cited as examples of good management. However, more needs to be done promotionally. If anyone doubts the power of promotion they should consider how clever marketing has endowed certain well known products with a degree of commercial success that is out of all proportion to their quality. The responsibility for marketing and promotion logically resides with ACTA, although who actually devises and implements any strategies could be debatable. To express a personal view, I feel that such a function is highly skilled and as such should be carried out by professionals. Those skills may already exist within the structure of ACTA or they may have to be sourced externally. Either way, good promotion requires commensurate investment and shooters should be prepared to pay more in ACTA affiliation fees to achieve the desired results.

I am well aware that the views I have expressed above derive largely from anecdotal evidence and personal experience that is geographically limited. As such, my perceptions of problems may be atypical of the wider context and it will be pleasing if the hard data contradicts my assessment of the situation. Whether I am right or wrong is obviously debatable but it is nevertheless undeniable that society is into an era of change and that clay target shooting along with many other pursuits can not avoid being affected in some way. I can also say with confidence that within this new milieu the formula for success requires a commercial approach, a capacity to anticipate contingencies, and an ability to adapt rapidly and appropriately to new circumstances. Above all else, clay target shooters, club, state and national administrators of the sport need to realise that they can not afford to make assumptions or be complacent about the future.

Issue of Temporary Permit - Western Australia

At the moment Western Australia does not recognise firearm licences issued in another State or Territory. A change of legislation to recognise an interstate licence, for a temporary period, has been mooted; but until that law has been changed you will require a temporary permit (free) to bring a firearm into this State.

In order to issue you with a temporary permit to possess and use a firearm in the State of Western Australia the following firearm details are required:

- Category of Firearm
- Description
- Make
- Serial number
- Calibre

You will also need to supply the following additional information:

- * Period of time required for permit (e.g. between date and date)
- * Reason for requiring your firearm in your possession (e.g. competition or a property to shoot on, in which case supply telephone number contact and name and whereabouts of the property)
- * Copy of your states firearm licence showing number and expiry date
- * Your date of birth

There is no defined legislation in Western Australia to cover security of your firearms whilst travelling in Western Australia. The safe storage of your firearm whilst travelling will be your responsibility and all precautions should be taken to keep the firearm as secure as possible at all times.

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS

August 2002

This year marks the tenth anniversary of the fulfillment of my ultimate ambition: standing in the middle of the dais at the end of the week of the World Skeet Championships. People often ask me how I was able to take that "giant step" from being an amateur shooter in Australia to being a professional shooter in the US, which ultimately led to my becoming the World Skeet Champion. The answer is quite easy and can be summed up in two simple words: Wayne Mayes! To explain that I need to back up about twenty years and walk you through a little history.

Back in 1983, the ACTA selected the first ever Australian Team to represent our country at the World Skeet Shooting Championships, the following year. That fact alone would be enough to make 1983 a monumental year in Australian Skeet history. However it was also the first year that a separate Skeet Nationals was held. Prior to 1983, the National Skeet Championship had been shot at the Trap Nationals as a single 50-target event.

It was usually conducted on the day before the Nationals started, and sometimes even over two days, shooting 25 targets each day, because many of the venues selected for the Trap Nationals did not have sufficient Skeet layouts to adequately handle the event. This problem was worsened by the fact that, in those days, many more people competed in the National Skeet Championship than do now.

Although that sounds good, it actually wasn't, because most of the people who wanted to be in the event weren't, and most of the people who were, wished they weren't. That's because a single 50-target Skeet competition will not attract many Skeet shooters, no matter how important that event may be. It's just not a big enough incentive to cause most people to travel great distances and lay out the amount of time and money that would be required.

Thus, apart from a few real die-hards, only the Skeet shooters from the local area usually attended, and the bulk of Australia's serious Skeet shooters sat at home and wondered "what if". So where did all the entrants materialise from? Well, because the Skeet was included in the Overall High Gun, and because it was shot first, most of the Trap shooters were more or less forced to shoot it "just in case".

Anyway, getting back to 1983, I was fortunate enough to make the team that year, and so in July of 1984, got my first taste of "real" Skeet Shooting. Unfortunately that taste turned out to be bitter/sweet, as it was somewhat humbling to be the reigning National Champion, National High-Gun and National Record Holder, yet be unceremoniously flogged by the ladies and the little kids. However, once I adjusted to the reality of that situation, I tried to take it in my stride and draw upon its positive aspect.

Although it was being made painfully obvious to me that I had no idea at all of how to shoot correctly, it was also becoming equally obvious why shooting lessons were an integral part of the learning process in that country. So I immediately sought out some shooting lessons and for these I chose the aforementioned gentleman, namely Wayne Mayes. I did this for several reasons, not the least of which is the fact that he is unquestionably the greatest Skeet shooter to ever walk on the face of the Earth.

Because of my geographic difficulties, Wayne was gracious enough to give me all the time that he could spare that week, and by the end of it I had enough raw material to come home and begin totally rebuilding my entire shooting method. The magnitude of the required changes was such that initially my scores dropped off dramatically. At the Nationals that year, instead of winning the High Gun and about half of the events, which I was used to doing around that time, I considered myself very fortunate to win just one event.

By July of the following year (1985), even with twelve months of evolution behind me, I knew that I was still a long way off World standard, and gave no thought to going to America. However, another American trip was up for grabs at the Nationals that year, and by November I was more than ready, winning the High-Gun again and cementing my place in the Team for the following year.

Another eight months of rigorous training ensued and by July of 1986, although not expecting to "set the World on fire", I was quietly confident that I would at least be competitive and not have to endure the indignity that the women and children had inflicted upon me on the previous occasion. And so it was. I shot all ten rounds of the 12-gauge qualifying without incident and got ready to go out and do battle with all the other people who had shot 250 straight.

However, another unforeseen problem lay in store for me. Due to the fact that the shoot-offs at the World Championships had been getting longer and longer, sometimes going 50 rounds or more, 1984 had marked the last year that the events were shot-off to finality with regular Skeet. Starting in 1985, and in our absence, the shoot-off procedure had changed to doubles at all stations. Thus it came as a great shock to arrive back there in 1986, blissfully ignorant of this fact, and to be confronted with the reality of it.

This was worsened by the fact that we were not shooting any doubles in Australia at that time, let alone utilizing them in shoot-offs. Anyway, remembering the bird and the frog, I prevailed upon Wayne to help out once again. Upon reflection, it must have been a strange sight. Imagine the National Gun Club in San Antonio on 12-Gauge day at about 6.30 in the evening. Qualifying has long since finished and all 37 regular fields are quiet and deserted.

Over a thousand people are milling around on the hill behind Field number one, the Shoot-off Field, waiting for the action to start. (The Stadium Field had not yet been built at that time). Suddenly shooting is heard on Field Two and the crowd looks over to see the sport's most recognizable person coaching some total stranger. I'm sure the question on everyone's mind was: "What in the hell does Wayne think he's up to, giving Skeet lessons at a time and place like this?"

Fortunately I was far enough away and far too deep in concentration to hear the remarks and the laughter that I'm sure ensued when the word spread that it was some foreigner from Australia, where they didn't shoot doubles, who had made the shoot-off and Wayne was trying to give him a last minute, crash course in doubles shooting. However, several hours later, when the Chief Referee called a halt to the shooting, due to impending darkness (no lights back in those days either) only the great Bobby Uknalis and I remained and the laughter had long since died away.

History shows that Bobby became the 12-gauge World Champion a couple of rounds into the continuation of the shoot-off the next morning, when I short stroked a high four. But we went on to do battle many more times over the next seven or eight years and became the best of friends and shared a lot of great times together.

Anyway, getting back to the 1986 World Shoot, I guess that "lucky near miss", combined with my insatiable hunger for Skeet knowledge, were the catalysts for Wayne and I forming a very close relationship that year. Although I did not realize it then, this was to become the cornerstone of all my future shooting achievements. The following year, in 1987, Wayne did two things, which were to have a major impact on my entire shooting career.

He convinced Deiter Kreighoff to give me a brand new K80 (complete with two sets of barrels, a tube set and an aluminium carry case) and he convinced me that there was only one way to make

the quantum leap required to raise the level of my shooting to a stage where I could genuinely and consistently match it with the top ten or a dozen shooters in the world. And that was to spend the whole six months of each shooting season in the US every year for the next three or four years, instead of flying in each year for a couple of weeks and trying to win on a wing and a prayer with a wild card.

Upon returning home at the end of October, I spent the next three or four months fine tuning and interfacing with my new gun. But I also did a lot of research and homework along the lines of Wayne's suggestion and calculated that even if I could reach a "break even" point within three years (ie generate enough prize money each week to cover all the expenses of a six month visit to the US), that three year exercise would cost about \$100,000, with half of it being consumed in the first year.

After a tremendous amount of agonizing and soul searching, I finally decided that this was too high a price to pay for a "dream", and so immediately after the Trap Nationals that year (1988), I sold my old Browning Trap gun, put my new Kreighoff in moth balls and quit shooting for good. However, shortly afterwards, Wayne rang to monitor my progress. Upon hearing of my decision, he asked if, as a personal favour to him, I would shoot practice every day for the next fortnight and keep an open mind on the whole issue, while he considered the matter.

Punctually two weeks later he rang back with a proposal which still brings tears to my eyes to this very day, when I think back about it. He suggested that if I would invest six months of my time and the cost of an airline ticket, he would personally pay all my expenses for the entire shooting season. Everything! The whole

nine yards! During the week I would live at his house and on the week-ends he would pay my travel and accommodation costs, feed me, supply my shells and make room for me to shoot on his squad. (In the shooting world that's about the equivalent of going to Italy on holidays and staying with the Pope). No commitments, no conditions and no strings attached.

Four years later, when I shot 650 straight and won the High Over All at the World Skeet Championships and Wayne stood beside me on the dais as runner-up, you couldn't tell who was the happiest or the proudest. And when they inducted Wayne into the Skeet Shooting Hall of Fame in 1994, by simply listing the vast expanse of all his shooting achievements, they did not even come close to indicating the real magnitude of this truly great man.

Winchester School Championships in Queensland

Winchester began its association with School shooting in Western Victoria at the Rainbow State High School. This school had its own trap in the school ground. The first shoot was run by Mr Ken Lowry (State Manager of Winchester) assisted by Mr Bob Dupuy. The shoot was open to both girls and boys.

It proved so popular that a School State Championship was introduced in 1979 at the Jeparit Gun Club with over 100 students competing. Unfortunately, Bob Dupuy was not there to witness the event as he had transferred to Queensland as State Sales Manager. The Victorian Championships have gone from strength to strength with attendance growing to 704 in 1999 with participants from 93 schools.

Victoria's loss was Queensland's gain as Bob Dupuy became involved with Junior and School shooting in Queensland. Due to the vast distances between major population centres in Queensland, it was seen as impossible to get a large number of schools together for shoulder to shoulder competition. Therefore a postal shoot was implemented.

The number of schools competing depends on a number of factors. These include shooting being a school sport, the School Principal not being anti Fire Arms and the Parents and Citizens Committee also being agreeable.

The Postal Shoot is a 20 target single barrel event for obvious safety reasons. The winners of the various postal teams' matches are shown in the table at the end of this article.

Winchester in Queensland also sponsor a State School Championship held at Toowoomba Clay Target Club in November each year. Generally more than 5 squads compete in this event which is shot as a 20 target event of 10T DB and 10T Point Score.

Bob Dupuy retired from Winchester Australia in December 2001 but his successor, Greg Mitchell has indicated his willingness to continue Winchester's Sponsorship of these events as in Bob Dupuy's words "We have to keep the Juniors coming along as they are our future".

Winchester Australia are to be congratulated for their proactive approach to growing the clay target shooting sports in Queensland.

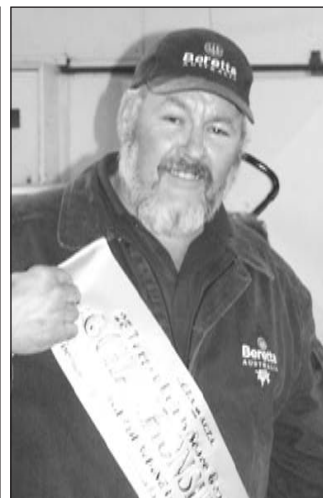

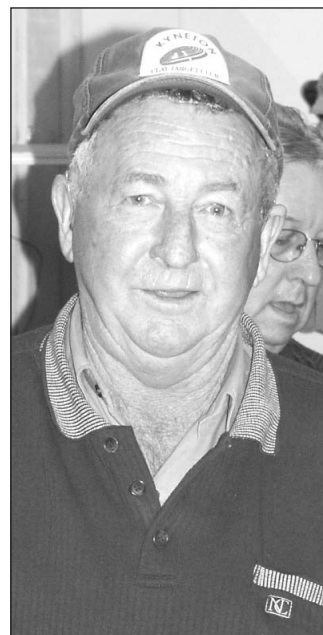

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
