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## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1270) to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to repeal the amendments made by the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act which disqualify expenses for over-the-counter drugs under health savings accounts and health flexible spending arrangements.

- 1       *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it
- 2 shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R.
- 3 1270) to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to

1 repeal the amendments made by the Patient Protection  
2 and Affordable Care Act which disqualify expenses for  
3 over-the-counter drugs under health savings accounts and  
4 health flexible spending arrangements. All points of order  
5 against consideration of the bill are waived. In lieu of the  
6 amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by  
7 the Committee on Ways and Means now printed in the  
8 bill, an amendment in the nature of a substitute consisting  
9 of the text of Rules Committee Print 114-60 shall be con-  
10 sidered as adopted. The bill, as amended, shall be consid-  
11 ered as read. All points of order against provisions in the  
12 bill, as amended, are waived. The previous question shall  
13 be considered as ordered on the bill, as amended, and on  
14 any further amendment thereto, to final passage without  
15 intervening motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally  
16 divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority  
17 member of the Committee on Ways and Means; and (2)  
18 one motion to recommit with or without instructions.



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
