

Scanner Overview

This section explains the main features of this product, the names of parts and their functions.

Main Features

The scanner is equipped with the following features:

High speed scanning

The scanner has achieved a scanning speed of 60 ppm/120 ipm (*1).

Furthermore, up to 80 sheets of documents (*2) can be loaded for continuous scanning which enables you to quickly digitize a large volume of documents.

Network connection

The scanner can be connected via Wi-Fi or a wired LAN.

Even with a network connection, a scanning speed of 60 ppm/120 ipm (*1) is possible.

A USB cable is not required to connect the scanner and a computer so that the scanner can be placed anywhere.

Touch screen

The scanner has a 4.3-inch TFT color touch screen which enables you to operate the scanner with simple actions such as seeing and touching.

The touch screen also enables you to specify various operational settings for scanning documents and check the number of sheets scanned or the error status with ease.

Contactless smart card reader

The scanner has a contactless smart card reader which enables you to easily log into the scanner by holding a smart card over the scanner.

Capable of scanning documents folded in half, envelopes, multi-layered transfer paper

In order to scan documents folded in half, envelopes, and multi-layered transfer paper, the scanner is equipped with a feed mode switch that is used to switch the mode to Manual Single Mode.

Manual Single Mode reduces the load on documents being fed so that documents are fed and scanned successfully.

Improved efficiency for pre-scan work

The scanner can perform "mixed batch scanning" which allows you to scan documents with different paper weights and sizes at once.

This simplifies the process of sorting the documents before scanning.

Reduced work loss caused by multifeeds

The scanner has ultrasonic multifeed sensors that accurately detect "multifeed" errors where two or more sheets are fed through the scanner at once.

This detection for overlapped documents is reliable even when scanning a mixed batch of documents with different paper weights and sizes, avoiding potential work loss.

Intelligent multifeed detection function

When there is paper of the same size attached to a designated location on the page, the intelligent multifeed detection function enables the scanner to recognize the location of the attachment.

The scanner does not detect the recognized area where the attachment is on as overlapping of documents so that scanning can continue.

Paper protection function by detecting paper jam noise

This function reduces the risk of having the valuable documents damaged by stopping the scan when the scanner detects paper jam noise.

Advanced image processing function

The automatic color detection function outputs images in color or monochrome depending on the document content.

Capable of scanning photographs and clippings

The Carrier Sheet is available as an option in order to scan photographs and clippings. Multiple Carrier Sheets can be scanned in one go, and can be mixed with regular documents in the same batch.

Centralized operation of multiple scanners

With PaperStream NX Manager, multiple scanners can be operated together.

For example, you can specify users who can use the scanners and specify scanning menus that are customized for each user, and distribute them to the scanners.

You can also save images in a specified linked destination, and monitor the processing status of images. For details, refer to the PaperStream NX Manager User's Guide.

Centralized management of multiple scanners

With Scanner Central Admin Server, multiple scanners can be managed together.

For example, the application can be used to update the setting information and the firmware update module for all scanners at once, and check the operating status of each scanner.

When PaperStream NX Manager is not used, you can use Scanner Central Admin Agent to link with Scanner Central Admin Server (*3).



Operating with a Computer

This operating method is a method that uses a USB cable or network to connect the scanner and the computer to manage images on the computer.




• Operating with PaperStream NX Manager

This operating method is a method that uses a network to connect the scanner to PaperStream NX Manager, and uses PaperStream NX Manager to process images sent from the scanner.

You can monitor the processing status of images and save images in a specified linked destination.



Parts and Functions

This section shows the names of the scanner parts.


Front



No.	Name	Function
1	Contactless Smart Card Reader	Reads the information of the smart card.
2	ADF (Automatic Document Feeder)	Pulls and feeds the documents one sheet at a time from the ADF paper chute (feeder). Open this to replace consumables or to clean the inside of the scanner.
3	Chute extension	Pull out to adjust to the document length.
4	ADF paper chute (feeder)	Holds the documents to be scanned.
5	Side guide	Positions the documents in place when the documents are loaded in the ADF paper chute (feeder) as they are fed into the scanner.
6	Feed mode switch	Slide the feed mode switch to the left to switch the feed mode to Manual Single Mode.


No.	Name	Function
7	ADF release tab	Pull this tab to open the ADF.
8	Touch screen	Used to operate the scanner or check the status.
9	[Power] button	Turns on or off the scanner.
10	Stacker	Stacks up the ejected documents.
11	Stacker extension	Slide out to adjust to the document length.
12	Stopper	Lift up to adjust to the document length.


No.	Name	Function
1	Ventilation port	Holes for ventilating hot air from inside the scanner.
2	Power connector	Used to connect a power cable. "Power cable" refers to the AC cable and AC adapter connected together.
3	USB connector	Used to connect a USB cable.
4	LAN connector	Used to connect a LAN cable.
5	Security cable slot	Used to connect an anti-theft security cable (commercially available).

No.	Name	Function
1	Pick roller	A set of rollers which feeds documents on the ADF paper chute (feeder) into the ADF.
2	ADF paper chute (feeder)	Holds the documents to be scanned.
3	Brake roller	A roller that prevents more than one sheet of documents to be fed into the ADF at once.


No.	Name	Function
1	Microphone (× 2)	Detects paper jam noises.
2	Ultrasonic sensor (× 2)	A sensor that detects overlapped documents by ultrasonic soundwave.

No.	Name	Function
		It detects overlapped documents by monitoring the difference in the amount of ultrasonic waves transmitted through the documents.
3	Brake roller (× 2)	A roller that prevents more than one sheet of documents to be fed into the ADF at once.
4	Document sensor (× 8)	A sensor which detects whether there is a document.
5	Glass (× 2)	The surface which scans documents.
6	Feed roller (× 2)	A roller that feeds the document through the ADF.
7	Eject roller (× 2)	Rollers that feed documents from the ADF onto the stacker.
8	Pick roller (× 2)	A set of rollers which separates one sheet off the documents loaded in the ADF paper chute (feeder), and feeds the document into the ADF.

Entering and Resuming from Power Saving Mode

The scanner enters power saving mode when it is left on without being used for a certain period of time. Power saving mode keeps the power consumption low when the scanner has not been used for a certain period of time.

Power saving mode has two types of settings.

Power Save

If the scanner is left powered on for 15 minutes (factory default setting) or longer without being used, it automatically enters power saving mode.

When the scanner enters power saving mode, the touch screen switches off. The [Power] button flashes in green.

To resume from power saving mode, perform one of the following:

- Load a document in the ADF paper chute (feeder).
- Press the touch screen.
- Scans a document with the image scanning application.
- Auto Shutdown

The scanner is turned off automatically if it is left on without being used for a certain period of time (4 hours for the factory default setting).

To turn the power back on after the power is turned off automatically, press the [Power] button on the scanner. For details, refer to How to Turn the Power ON (page 55).

ATTENTION

- If there is a document that remains on the paper path, the scanner may not enter power saving mode. Remove the documents by referring to When a Paper Jam Occurs (page 140).
- For some image scanning applications, the scanner may not be turned off even if [Auto Shutdown hours] is specified.
- If the scanner is automatically turned off while you are using the image scanning application, exit the application, and then turn the scanner back on.
- For the operation of the power saving mode when [Fast] is selected for [Startup mode], refer to Power Management (page 220).

HINT

• To change the waiting time for the scanner to enter power saving mode Specify [Power Save minutes] in the [Power Save Mode] screen on the touch screen. The [Power Save Mode] screen can be displayed in the following procedure:



Ways to load documents differ depending on whether the documents are of the same width or not. If the documents are of different width, refer to Conditions for Mixed Batch Scanning (page 87) or Scanning Documents with Different Widths (page 94).

b Check the number of sheets.


Up to 80 sheets can be loaded (with paper weight of 80 g/m 2 [20 lb] and thickness of the document stack under 8 mm).

2 Fan the documents.

a Grab a stack of documents, which should be 8 mm or less.


b Hold both ends of the documents and fan them a few times.



- c Rotate the documents by 90 degrees and fan them in the same manner.
- d Perform steps a to c for all documents.
- e Align the top of the documents.

How to Load Documents


- 1 Pull out the chute extension according to the length of the documents. For details, refer to Setting Up the ADF Paper Chute (Feeder) (page 64).

ATTENTION

- Remove all paper clips and staples.
- Reduce the number of documents when documents are not fed into the scanner or overlapped documents are fed.
- 4 Adjust the side guides to the width of the documents.

Move the side guides so that there is no space between the side guides and the documents. When there is a space between the side guides and the documents, the documents may be fed skewed.

^{*1:}Depending on the image scanning application or the scan setting of the scanner driver, the memory may be insufficient to perform scanning.

Long page scanning supports documents with a length up to 5,588 mm (220 in.) when the resolution is set to 200 dpi or lower.

Paper Type

The following paper types are recommended:

- Wood-free paper
- Wood-containing paper
- PPC paper (recycled)
- Plastic card

When using paper types other than the above, make sure you test with the same type of paper first to check if the document can be scanned.

Paper Weight (Thickness)

Documents with the following paper weights can be scanned:

- 27 to 413 g/m² (7.2 to 110 lb)
- For A8 size or smaller, 128 to 209 g/m²(34 to 56 lb)
- For plastic cards, 1.4 mm or less

Documents That May Not Be Scanned Successfully

The following types of documents may not be scanned successfully:

- Documents of non-uniform thickness (such as envelopes or documents with attachments)
- Wrinkled or curled documents
- Folded or torn documents
- Tracing paper
- Coated paper
- Carbon paper
- Photosensitive paper
- Perforated documents
- Documents that are not square or rectangular
- Very thin paper
- Very thick paper
- Photographs (photographic paper)

Documents That Must Not Be Scanned

The following types of documents must not be scanned:

- Paper-clipped or stapled documents
- Documents on which the ink is still wet
- Documents smaller than A8 size
- Documents wider than 216 mm (8.5 in.)
- Documents other than paper/plastic card (such as fabric, metal foil and OHP film)
- Important documents that must not be damaged or smeared

Precautions


Notes on the documents to be scanned

Depending on the documents to be scanned, take note of the following.

- Since carbonless paper contains chemical substances that may harm the rollers such as the brake roller and pick roller, take note of the following:
 - Cleaning
 If paper jams occur frequently, clean the brake roller and pick roller.

 For details, refer to Daily Care (page 112).
 - Replacing the consumables

 The life of the brake roller and pick roller may end sooner compared to scanning wood-free papers.
- When scanning wood containing papers, the life of the brake roller and pick roller may end sooner compared to scanning wood-free papers.
- The brake roller and pick roller may be damaged when a photo/sticky note on a document comes into contact with these parts during scanning.
- The surface of the document may be damaged when gloss papers such as photographs are scanned.
- The light of the LED may reflect brightly when gloss papers are scanned.
- When scanning semi-transparent documents, set [Brightness] higher in the scanner driver to avoid bleedthrough.
- When you scan documents written in lead pencil, make sure you clean the rollers frequently. For details about cleaning, refer to Daily Care (page 112).
- If documents are not fed, or documents are fed overlapped or jammed frequently, refer to Troubleshooting (page 159).
- All documents must be flat on the leading edge.
 Make sure that curls on the leading edge of the documents are kept within the following range.



Notes on plastic cards

When you scan plastic cards, take note of the following.

- Make sure you use a card that contains the following specifications, and check if the card can be fed before scanning it.
 - Type: Compliant with the ISO7810 ID-1 type
 - Size: 85.6 × 53.98 mm

- Thickness: 1.4 mm or less
- PVC (polyvinyl chloride) or PVCA (polyvinyl chloride acetate)
- Up to three plastic cards can be loaded in the ADF paper chute (feeder).
 Note that you can only load one card at a time if the plastic card is embossed.




- It is recommended that the card should be placed face-down in the ADF paper chute.
- Thick or rigid cards that are difficult to bend may be fed skewed.
- If there is dirt on the surface of the card, such as grease marks (fingerprints), perform scanning after wiping the dirt off.
- Scanning a thick document such as a plastic card will always be falsely detected as overlapped documents. In that case, specify one of the following settings and try scanning again.
 - Use the intelligent multifeed detection function.
 - Disable the setting to detect overlapped documents by the ultrasonic sensor.
 - Scan with Manual Single Mode.

Loading Capacity

The number of sheets that can be loaded in the ADF paper chute (feeder) is determined by the paper size and paper weight.



Area Not to Be Perforated

An error may occur when there are punched holes in the area colored in light pink in the Figure 1. Fig. 1



ATTENTION

The above condition applies when the document is set to the center of the pick roller width.

HINT

If there are any holes in the 35 mm-wide central column, you can move the document to the left or right to avoid an error.

Conditions Required to Accurately Detect Overlapped Documents (Multifeed)

Multifeed is an error that occurs when two or more sheets are overlapped and fed at once.

Overlapped documents are detected with the ultrasonic sensor or according to the difference in length of the documents.

The following conditions are required for an accurate detection.

Detecting Overlapped Documents with the Ultrasonic Sensor

- Paper weight: 27 to 413 g/m² (7.2 to 110 lb)
- Do not punch holes within 35 mm (1.38 in.) over the center of the document. Refer to Fig. 1 in Area Not to Be Perforated (page 84).
- Do not attach other documents with glue or other adhesive within 35 mm (1.38 in.) over the center of the document.

Refer to Fig. 1 in Area Not to Be Perforated (page 84).

Detecting Overlapped Documents according to the Difference in Length

- Load the documents of the same length in the ADF paper chute (feeder).
- Variation in document lengths: 1% or less
- Do not punch holes within 35 mm (1.38 in.) over the center of the document. Refer to Fig. 1 in Area Not to Be Perforated (page 84).

Detecting Overlapped Documents with the Ultrasonic Sensor and According to the Difference in Length

- Load the documents of the same length in the ADF paper chute (feeder).
- Paper weight: 27 to 413 g/m² (7.2 to 110 lb)
- Variation in document lengths: 1% or less
- Do not punch holes within 35 mm (1.38 in.) over the center of the document. Refer to Fig. 1 in Area Not to Be Perforated (page 84).
- Do not attach other documents with glue or other adhesive within 35 mm (1.38 in.) over the center of the document.

Refer to Fig. 1 in Area Not to Be Perforated (page 84).

ATTENTION

- The above condition applies when the document is set to the center of the pick roller width.
- When an option to detect overlapping with the ultrasonic sensor is selected, scanning a thick document such as a plastic card will be falsely detected as overlapping of documents.

In that case, specify one of the following settings and try scanning again.

- Use the intelligent multifeed detection function.
- Disable the setting to detect overlapped documents by the ultrasonic sensor.
- Scan with Manual Single Mode.

HINT

- The accuracy of detection for overlapped documents may drop depending on the document type.

 Overlapping cannot be detected for the top 30 mm (1.18 in.) of a document in the feeding direction.
- On the [Multifeed Detection Area] screen, you can specify an area not to detect overlapping of documents within the area described in Fig. 1 in Area Not to Be Perforated (page 84).

 The [Multifeed Detection Area] screen can be displayed in the following procedure:

→ [Scanner Settings] → [Paper Source/Feeding] → [Multifeed Detection Area]
When using the Software Operation Panel, refer to Settings Related to the Detection for Overlapped Documents (Multifeed) (page 283).

Conditions for Mixed Batch Scanning

The following conditions apply when a mixed batch of documents with different paper weights/friction coefficients/sizes is scanned.

Make sure to test a few sheets first to check if the mixed batch of documents can be fed.

Paper Direction

Align the direction of the paper fiber with the feed direction.

Paper Weight (Thickness)

Documents with the following paper weights can be scanned when scanning a mixed batch of documents with different paper weights:

27 to 413 g/m² (7.2 to 110 lb)

Friction Coefficient

It is recommended that the same paper brand from the same manufacturer is used for documents.

When different paper manufacturers/brands are mixed in documents to be scanned, it affects the feeding performance as the difference in friction coefficient increases.


The following friction coefficients are recommended:


0.35 to 0.60 (reference value for paper friction coefficient)

Document Position

Load all documents covering the width of the pick roller.


For a guideline for mixed batch scanning, refer to Combinations of Standard Paper Sizes in a Mixed Batch (page 89) in Paper Size (page 88).





HINT

When the smallest document covers the width of the pick roller even when it is loaded towards one side as shown in the image below, load documents aligned on one side. So that it prevents documents from skewing when being fed.



Paper Size

When a mixed batch with different sizes is scanned, not feeding the documents straight may cause troubles such as paper jams or part of the image to appear missing.


It is recommended that you check the scanned images if the documents were fed skewed.

ATTENTION

- When a mixed batch with different sizes is scanned, documents are more likely to skew because the side guides do not contact every sheet.
- Do not specify the detection method by document length when scanning a mixed batch of documents with different lengths and detecting overlapped documents.

Combinations of Standard Paper Sizes in a Mixed Batch

Refer to the table below for a quideline of the range available for mixed batch scanning.

ATTENTION

B8 (portrait) and A8 (portrait) documents cannot be mixed with other sizes in the same batch.

- Carbonless paper
- Bond paper
- Perforated documents
- Thermal paper
- Carbon-backed paper
- OHP film

• Tracing paper

Conditions for Automatic Page Size Detection

[Automatic Page Size Detection] does not work with the following type of documents:

- Non-rectangular documents [Automatic Page Size Detection] may not work with the following types of documents:
- Thin paper (52 g/m² [14 lb] or less)
- White documents with glossy edges
- Documents with darkish (gray) edges

Paper Type

The following paper type is recommended:

• Standard office paper

Paper Weight (Thickness)

Documents with the following paper weight can be scanned:

- Up to 209 g/m² (56 lb)
- Documents with the following paper weight can be scanned when folded in half:
- Up to 105 g/m² (28 lb)

Precautions

Take note of the following:

• Up to three Carrier Sheets can be loaded at once.

^{*1:}Fold in half for scanning.

^{*2:}Available when scanning with PaperStream IP (ISIS) Bundle.

- Depending on the image scanning application, there may be insufficient memory to perform a [Double-page spread] scan using the Carrier Sheet in high resolution.
 In that case, specify a lower resolution and try scanning again.
- Do not write on, color, stain, or cut the end with a black and white pattern on the Carrier Sheet. Otherwise, the Carrier Sheet may not be recognized correctly.
- Do not load the Carrier Sheet upside down.
 Otherwise, a paper jam may occur and damage the Carrier Sheet and the document inside.
- Do not leave a document inside the Carrier Sheet for a long time.
 Otherwise, the ink on the document may be transferred onto the Carrier Sheet.
- Do not leave the Carrier Sheet in high temperature places such as under direct sunlight or near a heating apparatus for a long time.
 - Also, do not use the Carrier Sheet in such environments. Otherwise, the Carrier Sheet may deform.
- Do not fold or pull the Carrier Sheet.
- Do not use a damaged Carrier Sheet.
 Doing so may damage or cause the scanner to malfunction.
- To avoid deformation, keep the Carrier Sheet on a flat surface without any weight on it.
- Do not slide your finger on the edge of the Carrier Sheet.
 Doing so may cut your finger.
- If paper jams occur frequently, feed about 50 sheets of PPC paper (recycled paper) before scanning with the Carrier Sheet.
 - The PPC paper can either be blank or printed.
- Paper jams may occur when several small documents (such as photos or postcards) are placed in the Carrier Sheet for scanning.
 - It is recommended to place only one document at a time in the Carrier Sheet.

Various Ways to Scan

This section explains how to configure the scanner settings and scan different types of documents with the image scanning application.

For information on other ways to scan which are not explained here, refer to the image scanning application or scanner driver's Help.

Scanning Documents with Different Widths

ATTENTION


When you scan a mixed batch with different widths, some of the narrower documents may be skewed or not fed into the ADF.

In that case, separate the documents by their widths, and scan them in different batches.

HINT

For details about document requirements for scanning a mixed batch of documents, refer to Conditions for Mixed Batch Scanning (page 87).


1 Align the top of the documents.



2 Place the documents at the center of the ADF paper chute (feeder), and adjust the side guides to the widest document in the batch.

ATTENTION

Load all documents above the center of the pick roller. If documents are loaded outside of the pick roller width, they may be fed skewed or not fed into the ADF.



3 Adjust the stacker to fit the longest document. For details, refer to Setting Up the Stacker (page 65).

- **4** In the scanner driver, configure the scan settings to detect the paper size automatically. For details, refer to the help for the scanner driver.
- **5 Scan documents with the image scanning application.** For details, refer to the help for the image scanning application.

Scanning Documents Folded in Half

Sliding the feed mode switch to the left to switch the feed mode to Manual Single Mode allows you to scan a document folded in half (a document of A3 or Double Letter size that is folded in half) as it is.

ATTENTION


When a document folded in half is scanned, the document may be fed skewed if the folded part is too thick.

1 Fold the document in half so that the sides to be scanned are facing out.

Fold it firmly and smooth out any creases.


Otherwise, it may cause the document to skew while feeding is in progress and result in a skewed image.




2 Load the document folded in half in the ADF paper chute (feeder).

3 Slide the feed mode switch to the left to switch the feed mode to Manual Single Mode.



On the top of the touch screen, [Manual Single Mode] is displayed.

4 Scan documents with the image scanning application.

For details, refer to the help for the image scanning application.

ATTENTION

- Moving the feed mode switch during a scan causes an error.
- If the feed mode switch is in Manual Single Mode, overlapped documents cannot be detected by the ultrasonic sensor.

HINT

The scanner will wait for the next document to be loaded until the time specified for [Timeout seconds] in the [Manual Feeding] screen on the touch screen, even if there is no document in the ADF paper chute (feeder).

The [Manual Feeding] screen can be displayed in the following procedure:



→ [Scanner Settings] → [Paper Source/Feeding] → [Manual Feeding]

→ [Scanner Settings] → [Paper Source/Feeding] → [Manual Feeding] When using the Software Operation Panel, refer to Waiting Time in Manual Feeding [Manual Feeding] (page 294).

Scanning Documents such as Envelopes or Multi-Layered Transfer Paper


Sliding the feed mode switch to the left to switch the feed mode to Manual Single Mode allows you to scan documents such as envelopes and multi-layered transfer paper.

ATTENTION


For details about the paper weights of the documents that can be scanned, refer to Documents for Scanning (page 79).

1 Load a document in the ADF paper chute (feeder).

To scan a multi-layered transfer paper, position the bound edge first when loading the paper. For details, refer to How to Load Documents (page 78).



2 Slide the feed mode switch to the left to switch the feed mode to Manual Single Mode.



On the top of the touch screen, [Manual Single Mode] is displayed.

3 Scan documents with the image scanning application.

For details, refer to the help for the image scanning application.

ATTENTION

- Moving the feed mode switch during a scan causes an error.
- If the feed mode switch is in Manual Single Mode, overlapped documents cannot be detected by the ultrasonic sensor.

HINT

The scanner will wait for the next document to be loaded until the time specified for [Timeout seconds] in the [Manual Feeding] screen on the touch screen, even if there is no document in the ADF paper chute (feeder).

The [Manual Feeding] screen can be displayed in the following procedure:



→ [Scanner Settings] → [Paper Source/Feeding] → [Manual Feeding]



Scanning Photographs and Clippings

Using the Carrier Sheet allows you to scan documents that can be damaged quite easily such as photographs, or documents that are difficult to load directly such as newspaper clippings.


1 Place the document inside the Carrier Sheet.

Open the Carrier Sheet and place the document against the top center of the Carrier Sheet.



2 Load the Carrier Sheet with the end with the black and white pattern as the leading edge and with the scanning side facing the ADF paper chute (feeder) (face-down).

Secure the Carrier Sheet with the side guides to avoid skewing.



3 Configure the scan settings in the scanner driver to use the Carrier Sheet.

For details, refer to the help for the scanner driver.

4 Scan documents with the image scanning application.

For details, refer to the help for the image scanning application.

ATTENTION

• The image is output at the center of the page in the size specified for [Paper Size] in the scanner driver.

• When [Automatic] is specified for [Paper Size] in the scanner driver, the most suitable size is selected from standard sizes which can be specified for [Paper Size]. Note that the size of the image may become smaller than the original document depending on the document scanned, or part of the image may appear missing.

Example

When an A5 size image is printed in the center of an A4 size document


→ The image is output in A5 size.

To output the scanned image in the actual size of the document, specify the document size for [Paper size].

HINT

In the following cases, place a blank (white) sheet of paper behind the document when scanning.

- The scanned image is not output in the actual size of the document when [Automatic] is specified for [Paper size] in the scanner driver.
- Shadows appear around the edges of the scanned image.
- Black lines appear around the edges of a uniquely shaped cutting.
- Image outside the document appears on the scanned image.



Scanning Long Page Documents

Documents with a length up to 5,588 mm (220 in.) can be scanned by long page scanning.

Depending on the resolution setting or the image scanning application, the document sizes that can be scanned may differ.

For details, refer to the help for the scanner driver and the image scanning application.

1 Load a document in the ADF paper chute (feeder).

For details, refer to How to Load Documents (page 78).


ATTENTION

- Long page documents should be loaded one sheet at a time in the ADF paper chute (feeder).
- When you scan long pages, take note of the following:
 - When loading a document Hold the document down with your hand so it does not fall out of the ADF paper chute (feeder).



- When the document is ejected

Secure enough space around the stacker and catch the ejected sheet so that it does not fall off the stacker.



HINT

To scan long pages, perform the following:

- Pull out the chute extension.
 For details, refer to Setting Up the ADF Paper Chute (Feeder) (page 64).
- Pull out the stacker extension all the way.

- 2 In the scanner driver, configure the scan settings to scan the paper size of the long page. For details, refer to the help for the scanner driver.

Feeding Documents Manually

Documents can also be loaded manually one sheet at a time in the ADF paper chute (feeder).

The scanner waits for the next document to be loaded within a specified time. Scanning will continue as long as another document is loaded within the set time, and stops if no document is loaded.


By using this method, you can perform scanning as you check the documents one by one. Manual feeding is effective in the following cases:

- To scan documents as you check the contents of each sheet
- To scan documents that are fed overlapped or jammed when the documents are loaded together in a batch
- To continue scanning documents such as magazines or newspaper clippings that cannot be loaded together, one at a time
- To scan a document folded in half, an envelope, or a multi-layered transfer paper one at a time

1 Configure the settings for the scanner.

- When scanning more than one document manually
 - **a** In the [Manual Feeding] screen on the touch screen, set [Continuous Feed Mode] to on and specify [Timeout seconds].

The [Manual Feeding] screen can be displayed in the following procedure:



- When scanning a document folded in half, an envelope, or a multi-layered transfer paper manually
 - **a** Slide the feed mode switch to the left to switch the feed mode to Manual Single Mode.
 - **b** In the [Manual Feeding] screen on the touch screen, specify [Timeout seconds].

 The [Continuous Feed Mode] setting is ignored, and the [Timeout seconds] setting is enabled.

 The [Manual Feeding] screen can be displayed in the following procedure:

→ [Scanner Settings] → [Paper Source/Feeding] → [Manual Feeding]
When using the Software Operation Panel, refer to Waiting Time in Manual Feeding
[Manual Feeding] (page 294).

ATTENTION


For details about the paper weights of the documents that can be scanned, refer to Documents for Scanning (page 79).

When a document folded in half is scanned, the document may be fed skewed if the folded part is too thick.

2 Load a document in the ADF paper chute (feeder).

Load the document face-down in the ADF paper chute (feeder).

To scan a multi-layered transfer paper, position the bound edge first when loading the paper.



3 Scan documents with the image scanning application.

For details, refer to the help for the image scanning application.

After the document is scanned, the rollers inside the ADF keep rotating, waiting for the next document to be loaded until the timeout time specified in the touch screen or Software Operation Panel.

When the Scanner is in Manual Single Mode, it waits for the next document to be loaded without having the rollers inside the ADF rotate.

4 Load the next document in the ADF paper chute (feeder).

5 Repeat step 4 until all documents are scanned.

Scanning will stop if no document is loaded in the ADF paper chute (feeder) within the timeout time specified in the touch screen or Software Operation Panel.

HINT

- Pressing the [Stop] button on the touch screen while the scanner is waiting for the next document to be loaded will stop the scan immediately.
- The scanner will wait for documents to be loaded until the specified timeout time elapses even if you start scanning with no document in the ADF paper chute (feeder).
- If you use manual feeding frequently, the replacement cycle of the consumables may be shortened.


Configuring Not to Detect Certain Overlap Patterns

If detecting overlapped documents during a scan is set, when you scan a document with a paper attachment such as a sticky note, receipt, or photo, it is detected as overlapped documents, and the scan may stop. Use the intelligent multifeed detection function not to detect these types of documents.

This function has two modes, a mode that is used to configure the settings manually by a user every time the scanner detects overlapped documents, and a mode that is used to configure the settings automatically by the scanner based on the overlap patterns (length and location) for paper attachments such as sticky notes, receipts, or photos that the scanner has memorized.

To use this setting, detecting overlapped documents needs to be set in advance.

- [Multifeed Detection] in the scanner driver
 For details, refer to the help for the scanner driver.
- [Multifeed Detection] on the touch screen or [Multifeed] on the Software Operation Panel
 For details about the settings on the touch screen, refer to Multifeed Detection (page 227).
 For details about the settings on the Software Operation Panel, refer to Specifying a Method to Detect
 Overlapped Documents [Multifeed] (page 283).



The following three operation modes are available.

When using the Software Operation Panel, refer to Setting to Ignore Certain Overlap Patterns [Intelligent Multifeed Function] (page 292).

Operational Procedure

1 If [Multifeed detected (Overlap)] (error code: "J2:55") is displayed on the touch screen, either press the [Eject Document] button to eject the document from the paper path or open the ADF to remove the document.

For details, refer to How to Open the ADF (page 62).



When the ADF is open, it might close accidentally. Be careful not to get your fingers caught.

2 If you open the ADF to remove the document, close it.

For details, refer to How to Close the ADF (page 63).



Be careful not to get your fingers caught when closing the ADF.

ATTENTION

Confirm that the ADF is closed properly. Otherwise, documents may not be fed into the ADF.

- 3 Load the removed document back in the ADF paper chute (feeder).
- 4 Respond to a message that is displayed in the touch screen.

The following settings can be configured depending on the operation mode that is set in the [Intelligent Multifeed Detection] screen.

- For [Manually Bypass]
 - [Disable the multifeed detection for the next document]
 Select whether to detect overlapped documents for the next scan.
 - [Keep Multifeed Images]
 - Select whether to save the image when overlapped documents are detected.

This may not be displayed depending on the scanner driver settings.

- For [Automatically Bypass (combination of length and position)]
 - [Memorize Patterns]

Select whether you set the scanner to memorize the paper overlapping patterns.

- [Keep Multifeed Images]
 - Select whether to save the image when overlapped documents are detected.

This may not be displayed depending on the scanner driver settings.

- For [Automatically Bypass (length)]
 - [Memorize Patterns]

Select whether you set the scanner to memorize the paper overlapping patterns.

[Keep Multifeed Images]
 Select whether to save the image when overlapped documents are detected.
 This may not be displayed depending on the scanner driver settings.

With the above procedure complete, the scanner operates as follows depending on the operation mode that is set in the [Intelligent Multifeed Detection] screen.

- For [Manually Bypass]
 - The scanner scans the next sheet without detecting overlapped documents, and from the second sheet onwards, detects overlapped documents based on the setting configured in the scanner driver, on the touch screen, or on the Software Operation Panel.
- For [Automatically Bypass (combination of length and position)]
 The scanner memorizes the length and location of the paper attachment that was detected as overlapped documents, and continues scanning. After that, documents with the same overlap pattern are not detected as overlapped documents (*1) (*2).
- For [Automatically Bypass (length)]
 The scanner memorizes the length of the longest paper attachment that was detected as overlapped documents, and continues scanning. After that, documents with the same overlap pattern or with a shorter overlap pattern are not detected as overlapped documents (*2).
- *1:Eight of the most recent overlap patterns can be memorized when [When powering off] in [Memorize overlap pattern] is enabled.
- *2:The memorized overlap patterns can be erased in the [Intelligent Multifeed Detection] screen on the touch screen, or the Software Operation Panel. You can erase overlap patterns that were not supposed to be memorized, but be careful with this operation because all memorized patterns will be erased.

Disabling the Paper Protection Function

If you attempt to scan a wrinkled document with the paper protection function set to enabled, the scanner may mistake it as a paper jam even though paper is fed normally, which causes paper protection to be performed and forces a scan to be stopped. In this case, you can disable paper protection only for the protected document to be scanned again.

Operational Procedure

1 When [Paper protection (feeding noise)] (error code: "J0:37") or [Paper protection (feeding accuracy)] (error code: "J0:51") is displayed on the touch screen, open the ADF and remove the document. For details, refer to How to Open the ADF (page 62).



When the ADF is open, it might close accidentally. Be careful not to get your fingers caught.

2 Close the ADF.

For details, refer to How to Close the ADF (page 63).



Be careful not to get your fingers caught when closing the ADF.

ATTENTION

Confirm that the ADF is closed properly. Otherwise, documents may not be fed into the ADF.

- 3 Load the removed document back in the ADF paper chute (feeder).
- 4 Respond to a message that is displayed in the touch screen.

The following setting can be configured.

Disable the paper protection for the next document

Select whether to disable the paper protection to scan the protected document again.

5 Press the [Scan] button.

Starts scanning documents.

The paper protection function is disabled for the first sheet of documents. From the second sheet onwards, the paper protection function is enabled.

HINT

If errors to protect documents are frequently displayed on the touch screen, refer to Paper Protection Is Set Off Frequently (page 203).

Counting the Number of Documents

The number of documents can be counted without outputting images of the documents.

This operation is useful for checking the number of documents when you scan a large number of documents.

1 Turn on the scanner.

For details, refer to How to Turn the Power ON (page 55).

2 Check that the feed mode switch is positioned to the right.

The number cannot be counted when the feed mode switch is in Manual Single Mode.

3 On the touch screen, press → [Paper Source/Feeding] → [Document Count].

The [Document Count] screen is displayed.

4 Load documents in the ADF paper chute (feeder).

For details, refer to How to Load Documents (page 78).

5 Press the [Start] button on the touch screen.

The number of documents that are loaded in the scanner is counted. The number of documents is displayed in the [Document Count] screen.

ATTENTION

Documents may not be counted correctly if overlapped documents are fed.

Daily Care

This section describes how to clean the scanner.



• Do not use aerosol spray or spray that contains alcohol. Paper dust blown up by strong air from the spray may enter inside the scanner which may cause the scanner to fail or malfunction.

Also note that sparks generated by static electricity may cause a fire.

• The inside of the ADF becomes very hot when the scanner is being used.

Before you start cleaning the inside of the ADF, make sure to turn off the power, unplug the power cable and wait for at least 15 minutes for the inside of the ADF to cool down.

The inside of the scanner (ADF) needs to be cleaned regularly for every certain number of sheets scanned. The scanner records the number of sheets scanned so that you can check the number of sheets scanned after you cleaned it last.

The procedure to check the number of sheets scanned is as follows.

- 1 On the touch screen, press → [Cleaning & Maintenance] → [Consumable counters].
- **2** On the [Consumable counters] screen, check the value for [After cleaning].
 - When the background color of the counter is yellow It is about time to clean the scanner.
 - When the background color of the counter is red
 It is time to clean the scanner. Clean the scanner.

To use the Software Operation Panel in order to check the value, refer to Settings Related to Sheet Counters (page 259).

ATTENTION

Cleaning cycles may vary depending on the condition of the documents. Also, cleaning must be performed more frequently when the following types of documents are scanned:

- Smooth-faced documents such as coated paper
- Documents with printed text/graphics that almost cover the entire surface
- Chemically-treated documents such as carbonless paper
- Documents containing a large amount of calcium carbonate
- Documents written in lead pencil

• Documents on which the toner is not sufficiently fused


Cleaning the Outside of the Scanner

The scanner including the ADF paper chute (feeder) and the stacker should be cleaned with either a piece of dry cloth, a cloth moistened with Cleaner F1/mild detergent, or a sheet of Cleaning Wipe.

ATTENTION

- To avoid deformation and discoloration, never use paint thinner or any other organic solvents.
- Be careful not to let any moisture or water inside the scanner during cleaning.
- It may take a long time to dry if an excessive amount of Cleaner F1/mild detergent is used. Use only a small amount. Wipe off the cleaner completely to leave no residue on the cleaned parts.



Touch screen

To avoid the surface of the touch screen becoming dirty, clean it regularly by gently wiping dirt and dust off with a soft, dry cloth.

Clean the touch screen with care. Do not rub or tap the surface with hard objects as doing so may damage the surface.

ATTENTION

Do not wipe the touch screen with a damp cloth.

Dust on the surface may become stuck between the touch screen and the scanner, causing the touch screen to malfunction.

Cleaning the Inside of the Scanner (ADF) with Cleaning Paper

The inside of the ADF can be cleaned with a sheet of Cleaning Paper moistened with Cleaner F1. As the scanner continues to feed the documents, paper dust will accumulate inside the ADF and it may cause scanning errors. Cleaning should be performed approximately every 5,000 sheets scanned. Note that this guideline varies depending on the types of documents you scan. For instance, it may be necessary to clean the scanner more frequently when you scan documents on which the toner is not sufficiently fused.

ATTENTION

- Do not use water or mild detergent to clean the ADF.
- It may take a long time to dry if an excessive amount of Cleaner F1 is used. Use only a small amount.
 - 1 Turn on the scanner.





Move the side guides so that there is no space between the side guides and the Cleaning Paper. Otherwise, the Cleaning Paper may be fed skewed.

Cleaning the Inside of the Scanner (ADF) with a Cloth





Pick Roller (× 2)

Gently wipe off any dirt or dust along the grooves as you rotate the roller manually, taking care not to damage the roller surface. Make sure that it is wiped properly because black residue on the rollers will affect the feeding performance.

Plastic Idler Roller (× 4)

Gently wipe dirt and dust off the roller, taking care not to damage the roller surface. Make sure that it is wiped properly because black residue on the rollers will affect the feeding performance. Be careful not to damage the sponge that is attached to the plastic idler roller.

Glass (× 2)

Gently wipe dirt and dust off the surface of the glass sections.

ATTENTION


Vertical streaks may appear on images if the glass is dirty.

Ultrasonic Sensor (× 2)/Document Sensor (× 8)

Gently wipe dirt and dust off the surface of the ultrasonic and document sensors.

HINT

If it is difficult to clean, use a cotton swab.



Feed Roller (x 2)/Eject Roller (x 2)

The power must be turned on to rotate the feed/eject rollers for cleaning.

- a Plug in the power cable and turn on the scanner.For details, refer to How to Turn the Power ON (page 55).
- b On the touch screen, press → [Cleaning & Maintenance] → [Cleaning] → [Cleaning Wipe].
 The [Cleaning Wipe] screen is displayed.

ATTENTION

Do not start scanning with an image scanning application during cleaning.

c Open the ADF. For details, refer to How to Open the ADF (page 62).



When the ADF is open, it might close accidentally. Be careful not to get your fingers caught.

d On the touch screen, press the [Start] button on the [Cleaning Wipe] screen. The feed/eject rollers rotate a certain amount simultaneously. If you press and hold the [Start] button, the feed/eject rollers rotate continuously.



Be careful not to touch the rollers with your hand while they are rotating.

e Put a piece of cloth moistened with Cleaner F1 or a sheet of Cleaning Wipe against the surface of the rotating feed/eject roller, and wipe horizontally to clean dirt and dust off the whole surface.

Make sure that it is wiped properly because black residue on the rollers will affect the feeding performance.

4 Close the ADF.

Cleaning the Carrier Sheet

The Carrier Sheet should be cleaned with either a piece of dry cloth, a cloth moistened with Cleaner F1/mild detergent, or a sheet of Cleaning Wipe.

Gently wipe dirt and dust off the surface and the inside of the Carrier Sheet.

As you keep using the Carrier Sheet, dirt and dust will accumulate on the surface and the inside.

Clean it regularly because it may result in scanning errors.

ATTENTION

- Make sure that the Carrier Sheet is not creased.
- To avoid deformation and discoloration, never use paint thinner or any other organic solvents.
- Do not use force to rub against the Carrier Sheet because it may be damaged or deformed.
- After cleaning the inside of the Carrier Sheet with a cloth moistened with Cleaner F1/mild detergent or a sheet of Cleaning Wipe, do not close the Carrier Sheet until it is completely dry.
- The Carrier Sheet should be replaced approximately every 500 scans.

 For information on purchasing the Carrier Sheets, contact the distributor/dealer where you purchased this product. Or, make an inquiry by referring to the contact information at the Contact for Inquiries section in Safety Precautions bundled with this product.

Replacing the Consumables

This section explains how to replace the consumables for the scanner.



The inside of the ADF becomes very hot when the scanner is being used. Before you replace the consumables, make sure to turn off the power, unplug the power cable and wait for at least 15 minutes for the inside of the ADF to cool down.

Consumables and Replacement Cycles

Consumables need to be replaced periodically. It is recommended that you keep a stock of new consumables and replace them before it reaches the end of the consumable life. Also, the scanner records the number of sheets scanned for each consumable (brake roller and pick roller), which allows you to determine when to replace the consumables.

The procedure to check the number of sheets scanned is as follows.

- 1 On the touch screen, press → [Cleaning & Maintenance] → [Consumable counters].
- **2** On the [Consumable counters] screen, check the [After Replacing the Brake Roller] and [After Replacing the Pick Roller] counters.
 - When the background color of the counter is yellow It is about time to replace the brake roller or pick roller.
 - When the background color of the counter is red
 It is time to replace the brake roller or pick roller. Replace the brake roller or pick roller.

To use the Software Operation Panel in order to check the value, refer to Settings Related to Sheet Counters (page 259).

Note that the suggested replacement cycles are guidelines for using A4 (80 g/m² [20 lb]) wood-free or wood-containing paper, as these cycles vary depending on the type of documents scanned and how often the scanner is used and cleaned.

Only use the specified consumables.

When a Paper Jam Occurs

Remove the documents that are left in the ADF in the following procedure:



- Do not use force to pull out jammed documents, and make sure to open the ADF first.
- Be careful not to touch any sharp parts upon removing jammed documents.
- Be careful not to get things such as hair, a tie or necklaces caught inside the scanner when removing jammed documents.
- The inside of the ADF may become extremely hot during operation. Be careful not to burn yourself.
- 1 Remove all documents from the ADF paper chute (feeder).

2 Open the ADF.

When the ADF is open, it might close accidentally. Be careful not to get your fingers caught.

3 Remove the jammed document.





When [Configure manually] is selected, specify the following items:

Enable

When you set an IP address manually, specify a DNS server.

[Enable] is set to off as the factory default.

When [Enable] is set to on, specify the following items:

- Primary DNS
- Secondary DNS

Server

Configure the settings for a server, which is to be connected to the scanner.

PaperStream NX Manager

Configure the settings for PaperStream NX Manager.
Set this item to use PaperStream NX Manager.

PaperStream NX Manager

Enable

Specify whether to use PaperStream NX Manager.
[Enable] is set to off as the factory default.
When [Enable] is set to on, specify the following items:

- Host Name/IP address
- Port Number
 The factory default setting is "20447".

[Check connection] button

Check if the scanner is connected to PaperStream NX Manager.

Auto Login/Logout

Specify an auto login method or set the auto logout time for PaperStream NX Manager.

Auto Logout minutes

Specify a time (minutes) to automatically log out from PaperStream NX Manager if the scanner is left on for a certain period of time without being used.

 This is the factory default setting.

Auto Login

Specify an auto login method for PaperStream NX Manager.

- Disabled
 This is the factory default setting.
- Username/Password
- Job Group Code

Scanner Central Admin Server

Configure the settings for Scanner Central Admin Server to use PaperStream NX Manager. Set this item to monitor the scanners or perform a single operation on them at the same time with Scanner Central Admin Server.

Enable

Specify whether to use Scanner Central Admin Server.

[Enable] is set to off as the factory default. When [Enable] is set to on, specify the following items:

- Host Name/IP address
- Port Number
 The factory default setting is "20444".

[Check connection] button

Check if the scanner is connected to Scanner Central Admin Server.

Network Encryption

Specify whether to encrypt network communications.

Encryption Off (HTTP)
 This is a transmission method prioritizing the scanning speed.
 This is the factory default setting.

• Encryption On (HTTPS)

This is a transmission method prioritizing the security. The scanning speed is slow with this setting.

Check connection (Ping)

Check the communication status between the scanner and the connected computer.

Host Name/IP address

Enter a host name or an IP address.

[Run] button.

A ping test is performed.

Paper Source/Feeding

Pre-Pick

Enable this to shorten the scanning time when scanning continuously.

"Pre-pick" refers to feeding the next document into the ADF before ejecting the current document being scanned when scanning documents continuously.

Enable

[Enable] is set to on as the factory default.

HINT

- If you cancel in the middle of scanning while pre-pick is enabled, you have to remove the pre-picked document, then load the document again.
- This setting can also be configured in the scanner driver.
 Note that priority is given to the scanner driver setting.

Retry Paper Feeding

Specify the number of feeding retries when a document is not fed from the ADF paper chute (feeder).

Number of paper feeding retries

The factory default setting is "3".

Multifeed Detection

Multifeed is an error that occurs when two or more sheets are overlapped and fed at once.

Configure the settings to detect overlapped documents during a scan.

Overlapped documents are detected with the ultrasonic sensor or according to the difference in length of the documents.

When overlapped documents are detected, an error message is displayed and the scan stops. If documents are overlapped within 30 mm from the leading edge, they are not detected as overlapped.

Detection Method

Specify a method to detect overlapped documents.

- Do not detect
 - Does not detect overlapped documents.

This is the factory default setting.

Check Overlapping (Ultrasonic)

Detects overlapped documents with the ultrasonic sensor.

When this is selected, you can specify the following two options:

- Specify an area to detect overlapped documents by the length from the leading edge of the document in the feeding direction.

Set it in [Multifeed Detection Area].

 When a piece of paper is attached on a document, the length and position of the paper can be memorized, and set to ignore overlapping of documents.
 Set it in [Intelligent Multifeed Detection].

Check Length

Detects overlapped documents according to the difference in length.

Select this to scan documents of the same length.

Note that overlapped documents cannot be detected accurately when a mixed batch of different lengths are scanned.

• Check Overlapping and Length

Detects overlapped documents by the combination of [Check Overlapping (Ultrasonic)] and [Check Length].

When this is selected, you can specify the following two options:

 Specify an area to detect overlapped documents by the length from the leading edge of the document in the feeding direction.

Set it in [Multifeed Detection Area].

- When a piece of paper is attached on a document, the length and position of the paper can be memorized, and set to ignore overlapping of documents.

Set it in [Intelligent Multifeed Detection].

Note that overlapped documents cannot be detected accurately when a mixed batch of different lengths are scanned.

Threshold (Length)

Specify the difference in length of documents to be detected as overlapped documents.

Overlapped documents are detected when the the difference in length of documents is longer than the specified value.

Specify this item when [Check Length] or [Check Overlapping and Length] is selected for [Detection Method].

Any length under the specified value is tolerated as a slight error and not detected as overlapped documents.

- 10 mm or less is not detected
 This is the factory default setting.
- 15 mm or less is not detected
- 20 mm or less is not detected

ATTENTION

- To scan documents with different lengths, select [Check Overlapping (Ultrasonic)].
- When an attachment such as a sticky note, receipt, or photo is attached on the document, the
 attachment part of the document may be detected as overlapping of documents if
 [Check Overlapping (Ultrasonic)] is selected. In that case, select [Check Length].
 Otherwise, detect overlapping of documents by specifying an area on the document that does not
 include an area attached with paper in order to ignore the overlapping of documents for that area.

HINT

This setting can also be configured in the scanner driver.

Note that priority is given to the scanner driver setting.

Multifeed Detection Area

Specify an area to detect overlapped documents.

Specify this item when [Check Overlapping (Ultrasonic)] or [Check Overlapping and Length] is selected for [Multifeed Detection].

Enable

Specify whether to set an area to detect overlapped documents.

[Enable] is set to off as the factory default.

How to set the detection area

Specify whether to set a disabled area or enabled area to detect overlapped documents.

- Set the disabled area
 This is the factory default setting.
- Set the enabled area

Start (mm)

Specify the start position of the detection area by the length from the leading edge of the document in the feeding direction.

The factory default setting is "0".

End (mm)

Specify the end position of the detection area by the length from the leading edge of the document in the feeding direction.

The factory default setting is "0".

HINT

- When the start and end positions are both "0", overlapped documents are detected in the whole document regardless of the setting for [How to set the detection area].
- To disable the detection of overlapped documents for the whole document, select [Set the disabled area] for [How to set the detection area], and set the start position to "0" and the end position to equal the document length or longer.
- If the start position is set at the length that is longer than the document length, overlapped documents are detected in the whole document when [Set the disabled area] is selected for [How to set the detection area], and overlapped documents are not detected anywhere in the whole document when [Set the enabled area] is selected for [How to set the detection area].
- To detect overlapped documents, the area must be at least 5 mm in length.

 Configure the setting so that the value of the end position minus the start position is 6 mm or more.

• For examples of the overlapping detection area settings, refer to Examples of the Settings for the Area to Detect the Overlapping of Documents (page 289).

Intelligent Multifeed Detection

Configure the setting to automatically ignore certain patterns of overlapped documents when the setting to detect overlapped documents is enabled.

Note that you first need to specify [Check Overlapping (Ultrasonic)] or [Check Overlapping and Length] in the scanner driver and "Multifeed Detection (page 227)" on the touch screen before setting this item.

Operation mode

Set the operation mode.

Manually Bypass

Specify whether overlapped documents are detected when re-scanning documents detected as overlapped documents.

Does not memorize the size or location of the paper attachment.

This is the factory default setting.

Automatically Bypass (combination of length and position)

Specify whether the length and position of a piece of paper attached on a document detected as overlapped documents are memorized as an overlap pattern.

If the overlap pattern is memorized, documents with the same overlap pattern are not detected as overlapped documents from the next scan.

HINT

Eight of the most recent overlap patterns can be memorized when [When powering off] in [Memorize overlap pattern] is enabled.

Automatically Bypass (length)

Specify whether the length of the longest piece of paper attached on a document detected as overlapped documents is memorized as an overlap pattern.

If the overlap pattern is memorized, a document with a piece of paper in the same length or shorter attached is not detected as overlapped documents from the next scan.

Memorize overlap pattern

When confirming image

Specify whether or not to memorize overlap patterns automatically when the window is displayed to check images for documents that were detected as overlapped documents. [When confirming image] is set to off as the factory default.

When powering off

Specify whether or not to keep overlap patterns upon turning the power off.

When [When powering off] is set to on, keep overlap patterns upon turning the power off. Set this to on to use the same overlap patterns after turning the power on again. [When powering off] is set to off as the factory default.

Overlap pattern

[Clear] button

Delete all the overlap patterns that have been memorized in the scanner.

Manual Feeding

Configure the settings when manually loading and scanning one sheet at a time.

When you scan by manually loading one sheet at a time, you can specify the waiting time (interval) for loading the next document in the ADF paper chute (feeder). This enables continuous scanning as long as you load a document within the specified time.

If the specified time is exceeded, the scan is finished automatically.

Continuous Feed Mode

Specify whether or not to enable the continuous feed mode.

Set [Continuous Feed Mode] to on to scan more than one document in succession manually.

[Continuous Feed Mode] is set to off as the factory default.

When Manual Single Mode is used, the setting for [Continuous Feed Mode] is ignored.

Timeout seconds

Specify the time period until which the scanner confirms that no documents are loaded in the ADF paper chute (feeder) (the interval between the last scan and the detection of whether the next document is loaded or not).

The factory default setting is "10".

HINT

- When [Continuous Feed Mode] is set to on, the scanner will wait for documents to be loaded until the specified timeout time elapses even if you start scanning with no document in the ADF paper chute (feeder).
- When the feed mode switch is set to Manual Single Mode, the scanner will wait for documents to be loaded until the specified timeout time elapses regardless of the setting for [Continuous Feed Mode].

High Altitude Mode

Enable this mode to use the scanner at an altitude of 2,000 m or higher.

Low atmospheric pressure at high altitudes may lower the accuracy in detections for overlapped documents with the ultrasonic sensor.

Enable

Setting [Enable] to on for this item improves the accuracy to detect overlapped documents. [Enable] is set to off as the factory default.

Paper Protection

Paper Protection

Configure the setting to detect feeding errors.

This function detects feeding errors in the following cases:

- When the scanner detects a warped document caused by a feeding error
- When the scanner detects paper jam noise

Paper jams due to feeding errors could damage or tear valuable documents.

Detecting a feeding error and stopping the scan can prevent damage to documents.

This function is effective when you scan documents which are difficult to feed such as thin paper documents.

Detect

Specify a method to detect feeding errors.

Disable

Does not detect feeding errors.

• Feeding Accuracy

Stops the scan when the scanner detects a warped document caused by a feeding error. This is the factory default setting.

• Feeding Noise

Stops the scan when the scanner detects paper jam noise.

• Feeding Accuracy & Noise

Stops the scan when the scanner detects a warped document caused by a feeding error, or when the scanner detects paper jam noise.

Feeding Accuracy Sensitivity

Specify the sensitivity level for detecting warped documents.

Low

Decreases the sensitivity level to detect warped documents. Specify this to detect a warped document only if it is highly deformed.

Normal

Detects warped documents with the optimum sensitivity level.

This is the factory default setting.

High

Increases the sensitivity level to detect warped documents.

Specify this to detect a warped document even if it is slightly deformed.

Feeding Noise Sensitivity

Specify the sensitivity level for detecting feeding noise.

Low

Decreases the sensitivity level to detect paper jam noise.

Specify this to detect only loud paper jam noise.

Normal

Detects paper jam noise with the optimum sensitivity level.

This is the factory default setting.

High

Increases the sensitivity level to detect paper jam noise.

Specify this to detect even slight paper jam noise.

ATTENTION

- Note that the paper protection function is to prevent damages to documents, but the protection of all documents is not guaranteed.
- When you use the paper protection function, make sure to load the documents with their top edges aligned (especially for a mixed batch of documents with different lengths).
 If the top edges are not aligned properly, the scan may stop even when the documents are being fed correctly.

HINT

• If you scan a wrinkled document, the scan may stop even when the document is being fed correctly. In that case, the paper protection function can be disabled only for the document on the touch screen.

For details, refer to Disabling the Paper Protection Function (page 110).

• If the paper protection function stops scans frequently, refer to Paper Protection Is Set Off Frequently (page 203).

Paper Protection (Touch Screen Settings)

Configure the setting to detect feeding errors.

Specify this when [Prioritize the touch screen settings] is set to on.

Specify the following items:

- Detect
- Feeding Accuracy Sensitivity
- Feeding Noise Sensitivity

For details about the setting items, refer to Detect (page 232).

Prioritize the touch screen settings

Enable this option when you want some settings to be prioritized over the settings for [Paper Protection] and the Software Operation Panel.

[Prioritize the touch screen settings] is set to off as the factory default.

HINT

When the setting for paper protection is configured in the scanner driver, priority is given to the scanner driver setting.

Image

Automatic Page Size Detection

When the scanner is set to detect the paper size automatically, specify whether or not to optimize (round up/down) the fractional part of the scanned image.

When the paper size is detected, there may be a fractional part of the scanned image compared to the standard paper size.

Output image size varies depending on how the fractional part is processed.

Optimize

Prevents loss of information.

However, a shadow may appear around the edges of images.

This is the factory default setting.

• Round Down

The image size becomes the standard paper size.

However, when you scan a document with text around the edges, a part of the information may be missing in the output image.

ATTENTION

For details about setting automatic page size detection, refer to the help for the scanner driver.

HINT

This setting is effective only for scanning images in black & white.

Page Edge Filler Area

Configure the settings to fill in the shadow or streaks around the edge of the scanned image.

Depending on the condition of the documents that you scan, the shadow of a document may appear as black streaks on the edges of the scanned image.

In this case, remove the black streaks by filling in the edges of the scanned image.

The specified area is filled in white or black, according to the background color.

Top (mm)

Specify the width of the top margin to fill in. The factory default setting is "0".

Bottom (mm)


Specify the width of the bottom margin to fill in. The factory default setting is "0".

Right (mm)

Specify the width of the right margin to fill in. The factory default setting is "0".

Left (mm)

Specify the width of the left margin to fill in. The factory default setting is "0".



- (1): Top = 0 to 15 mm
- (2): Bottom = -7 to 7 mm
- (3): Right = 0 to 15 mm
- (4): Left = 0 to 15 mm
- (in 1 mm increments)

ATTENTION

Note that if the target range of page edge filler is too wide, some characters near the edge may appear missing.

HINT

- You can change the background color to black or white in the scanner driver. For details, refer to the help for the scanner driver.
- Depending on the value you specify for the bottom margin of the page edge filler, the page edge filler function operates as follows:
 - 1 to 7 mm
 Fills in the specified area with the background color from the bottom edge of the image towards the inside.
 - 1 to -7 mm
 Outputs the image without filling in the specified area with the background color from the bottom edge of the image towards the outside. (Outputs the image with the specified area added when [Page End Detection] is set in the scanner driver.)
- This setting can also be configured in the scanner driver.
 In such a case, the page edge filler of the scanner driver is used on the image which the scanner already filled in the edges.

Dropout Color

You can exclude a color from being scanned by selecting either red, green, or blue (three primary colors).

Documents can be scanned without excluding any colors.

For example, when scanning a document with black characters and a green frame, if you select green for the dropout color, only the black characters of the document are scanned.

- Red
- Green
 This is the factory default setting.
- Blue
- None

ATTENTION

- This function works the best with light (low intensity) colors, and dark colors may not be excluded.
- You cannot specify a color other than Red, Green, and Blue.
 To drop out other colors, configure the setting in the scanner driver.
 For details, refer to the help for the scanner driver.

HINT

- This is only available in black & white or grayscale mode.
- This setting can also be configured in the scanner driver. Note that priority is given to the scanner driver setting.

Offset

Specify a starting position for scanning.

The specified value can range from -2 to +2 mm (in increments of 0.5).

The factory default setting is "0".

Main-scan ADF front (mm)

Specify the horizontal position (widthways) for the ADF front.

Sub-scan ADF front (mm)

Specify the vertical position (lengthways) for the ADF front.

Main-scan ADF back (mm)

Specify the horizontal position (widthways) for the ADF back.

Sub-scan ADF back (mm)

Specify the vertical position (lengthways) for the ADF back.

ATTENTION

Normally, you should not have to modify anything as the factory default settings already use adjusted values.

Magnification

Magnification (%)

Specify the magnification level for the feed direction.

The specified value can range from -3.1 to +3.1% (in increments of 0.1).

The factory default setting is "0.0".

ATTENTION

Normally, you should not have to modify anything as the factory default settings already use adjusted values.

Image Quality Mode

To obtain an image quality that is close to the image quality for scanning with fi-6130Z, set the image quality mode.

- Disable
 This is the factory default setting.
- fi-6130Z

Cleaning & Maintenance

Cleaning cycle

Specify the cleaning cycle for the scanner inside.

The background color of the [After cleaning] counter in the [Consumable counters] screen changes to yellow when the counter reaches 95% of the specified value for this item, and to red when the counter reaches 100%.

Cycle (x1000 Sheets)

Specify the cleaning cycle in increments of 1000 sheets.

The factory default setting is "5".

Issue a cleaning time notification

Specify whether or not to display the cleaning instruction message.

When [Issue a cleaning time notification] is set to on, a notification can be displayed on the touch screen when the time for cleaning approaches.

[Issue a cleaning time notification] is set to off as the factory default.

Replacement of the Pick Roller

Specify the replacement cycle for the pick roller.

The background color of the [After Replacing the Pick Roller] counter in the [Consumable counters] screen changes to yellow when the sheet count after replacing the pick roller reaches 95% of the specified value for this item, and to red when the counter reaches 100%.

In addition, a notification can be displayed on on the touch screen when the time for replacing the pick roller approaches.

Cycle (x 10000 Sheets)

Specify the replacement cycle for the pick roller in increments of 10,000 sheets. The factory default setting is "20".

Replacement of the Brake Roller

Specify the replacement cycle for the brake roller

The background color of the [After Replacing the Brake Roller] counter in the [Consumable counters] screen changes to yellow when the sheet count after replacing the brake roller reaches 95% of the specified value for this item, and to red when the counter reaches 100%.

In addition, a notification can be displayed on on the touch screen when the time for replacing the brake roller approaches.

Cycle (x 10000 Sheets)

Specify the replacement cycle for the brake roller in increments of 10,000 sheets.

The factory default setting is "20".

Maintenance cycle

Specify the maintenance and inspection cycle for the scanner that is performed by a service engineer. If the specified period has passed after the last maintenance and inspection date, the touch screen

displays a notification on

when you receive a [Maintenance] message.

For regular maintenance and inspection on the scanner by a service engineer, contact the distributor/ dealer where you purchased this product. Or, make an inquiry by referring to the contact information at the Contact for Inquiries section in Safety Precautions bundled with this product.

Enable

Specify whether or not to get a notification on the touch screen when the time for maintenance approaches.

[Enable] is set to off as the factory default.

Cycle (months)

Specify a cycle for receiving notifications on maintenance.

The factory default setting is "12".

USB

USB

Specify how the USB function operates.

After the setting is changed, the scanner is restarted.

- Automatic
 Operates in accordance with the connection environment This is the factory default setting.
- USB 2.0 Operates with USB 2.0.

Admin Password

Admin Password

Change or disable the administrator password.

Specify whether or not to disable the administrator password depending on the operation.

Change the administrator password regularly.

Enable

[Enable] is set to on as the factory default.

Current Password

Enter the current password.

The factory default of the password is "password".

New Password

Enter a new password to change the current password.

Confirm New Password

Re-enter the password entered for [New Password] for confirmation to change the current password.

Restore Factory Defaults

Restore Factory Defaults

Restore the scanner settings to the factory default.

[Start] button

Restore factory defaults.

The scanner is restarted and the setup window appears.

Scanner Settings (Software Operation Panel)

This section explains how to use the Software Operation Panel to configure the scanner settings.

Starting Up the Software Operation Panel

The Software Operation Panel is installed together with the PaperStream IP driver.

With this application, you can configure settings for operations of the scanner and management of the consumable parts.

ATTENTION

- Do not start up the Software Operation Panel during scanning.
- If you change the Software Operation Panel settings while the scanner driver window is displayed, the changes may not be applied immediately. In that case, close the scanner driver window and open it again.
- Do not use the touch screen while the Software Operation Panel is running.





You can configure settings that are related to counting the number of sheets scanned and managing consumable parts. You can also configure settings that are related to managing the power of a scanner and adjusting the position to start the scan.







HINT

- The Software Operation Panel settings can be restored to the factory default.

 - Note that the settings you have configured will be cleared.
- The Software Operation Panel settings can be backed up.

 To back up the settings, click the [Save] button, then specify the file name and click the [Save] button in the displayed window.

Settings Related to Sheet Counters

Checking the Sheet Counter

The status of each consumable part can be viewed to determine when to replace or clean the consumables. The background color of the counter changes as it gets closer to the time to replace the consumables or to clean the scanner.


The color of each counter changes as follows:

 This counter turns yellow when the sheet count after cleaning reaches the value specified in Scanner Cleaning

ATTENTION


If you turned off the scanner by unplugging the power cable, or selected [Disable power switch], the number of scanned sheets may not be counted in [Total Count].



Unit

The unit for a vertical magnification adjustment is fixed to [ADF].

Vertical magnification Adjustment

Specify the vertical (length) magnification.

The specified value can range from -3.1 to +3.1% (in increments of 0.1).

The factory default setting is "0.0".


Removing Shadows/Streaks that Appear around Edges of Images [Page Edge Filler (ADF)]

Configure the settings to fill in the shadow or streaks around the edge of the scanned image.

Depending on the condition of the documents that you scan, the shadow of a document may appear as black streaks on the edges of the scanned image.

In this case, remove the black streaks by filling in the edges of the scanned image.



(1): Top = 0 to 15 mm

(2): Bottom = -7 to 7 mm

(3): Right = 0 to 15 mm

(4): Left = 0 to 15 mm

(in 1 mm increments)

ATTENTION

Note that if the target range of page edge filler is too wide, some characters near the edge may appear missing.

HINT

- You can change the background color to black or white in the scanner driver.
 For details, refer to the help for the scanner driver.
- Depending on the value you specify for the bottom margin of the page edge filler, the page edge filler function operates as follows:
 - 1 to 7 mm
 Fills in the specified area with the background color from the bottom edge of the image towards the inside.
 - 1 to -7 mm
 Outputs the image without filling in the specified area with the background color from the bottom edge of the image towards the outside. (Outputs the image with the specified area added when [Page End Detection] is set in the scanner driver.)
- This setting can also be configured in the scanner driver.
 In such a case, the page edge filler of the scanner driver is used on the image which the scanner already filled in the edges.

Configuring the Scan Setting to Drop Out Specified Colors When Scanning [Dropout color]


You can exclude a color from being scanned by selecting either red, green, or blue (three primary colors). Documents can be scanned without excluding any colors.

For example, when scanning a document with black characters and a green frame, if you select green for the dropout color, only the black characters of the document are scanned.

Red, Green, Blue

ATTENTION

- This function works the best with light (low intensity) colors, and dark colors may not be excluded.
- You cannot specify a color other than Red, Green, and Blue.

To drop out other colors, configure the setting in the scanner driver. For details, refer to the help for the scanner driver.

HINT

- This is only available in black & white or grayscale mode.
- This setting can also be configured in the scanner driver. Note that priority is given to the scanner driver setting.

Shortening the Scanning Intervals [Pre-Pick]


Enable this to shorten the scanning time when scanning continuously.

"Pre-pick" refers to feeding the next document into the ADF before ejecting the current document being scanned when scanning documents continuously.



- If you cancel in the middle of scanning while pre-pick is enabled, you have to remove the pre-picked document, then load the document again.
- This setting can also be configured in the scanner driver.
 Note that priority is given to the scanner driver setting.

Specifying the Number of Retries for Paper Feeding [Number of Paper Feeding Retries]

Specify the number of feeding retries when a document is not fed from the ADF paper chute (feeder).

- Start up the Software Operation Panel.
 For details, refer to Starting Up the Software Operation Panel (page 241).
- 2 From the list on the left, select [Device Setting 2] \rightarrow [Number of paper feeding retries].



3 Specify the number of paper feeding retries.

The value can range from 1 to 12 times.

The factory default setting is "3 times".

Feeding [Pick Speed]

You can specify the timing of when document feeding is started.


When overlapped documents or paper jams occur frequently, delaying the timing of document feeding may improve the performance.

This setting is effective when you scan thin paper.

1 Start up the Software Operation Panel.

For details, refer to Starting Up the Software Operation Panel (page 241).

2 From the list on the left, select [Device Setting 2] → [Pick Speed].



3 Select the feeding speed.

Normal

This is the optimum feeding speed.

This is the factory default setting.

Slower

The timing of document feeding is delayed more than [Normal].

ATTENTION

The total time for scanning is longer because the timing of document feeding is delayed.

Cropping the Image Boundary [AutoCrop Boundary]

When the scanner is set to detect the paper size automatically, specify whether or not to optimize (round up/down) the fractional part of the scanned image.


When the paper size is detected, there may be a fractional part of the scanned image compared to the standard paper size.

Output image size varies depending on how the fractional part is processed.

1 Start up the Software Operation Panel.

For details, refer to Starting Up the Software Operation Panel (page 241).

2 From the list on the left, select [Device Setting 2] \rightarrow [AutoCrop Boundary].



3 Select whether to include or exclude the fractional data.

Select [Optimize] to prevent information from missing a part. The factory default setting is [Optimize].

ATTENTION

- While selecting [Optimize] can prevent information from missing a part, a shadow may appear around the edges.
- When you scan a document with text around the edges while [Round Down] is selected, a part of the information may be missing in the output image.
- For details about setting automatic page size detection, refer to the help for the scanner driver.

HINT

This setting is effective only for scanning images in black & white.

Protecting the Documents from Being Damaged [Paper Protection]

Configure the setting to detect feeding errors.

This function detects feeding errors in the following cases:

- When the scanner detects a warped document caused by a feeding error
- When the scanner detects paper jam noise

Paper jams due to feeding errors could damage or tear valuable documents.


Detecting a feeding error and stopping the scan can prevent damage to documents.

This function is effective when you scan documents which are difficult to feed such as thin paper documents.

1 Start up the Software Operation Panel.

For details, refer to Starting Up the Software Operation Panel (page 241).

2 From the listing on the left, select [Device Setting 2] \rightarrow [Paper Protection].



3 Select a detection method.

Disable

Does not detect feeding errors.

Feeding Accuracy

Stops the scan when the scanner detects a warped document caused by a feeding error. This is the factory default setting.

Feeding Noise

Stops the scan when the scanner detects paper jam noise.

Feeding Accuracy & Noise

Stops the scan when the scanner detects a warped document caused by a feeding error, or when the scanner detects paper jam noise.

ATTENTION

- Note that the paper protection function is to prevent damages to documents, but the protection of all documents is not quaranteed.
- When you use the paper protection function, make sure to load the documents with their top edges aligned (especially for a mixed batch of documents with different lengths).
 If the top edges are not aligned properly, the scan may stop even when the documents are being fed correctly.

HINT

- If you scan a wrinkled document, the scan may stop even when the document is being fed correctly. In that case, the paper protection function can be disabled only for the document on the touch screen. For details, refer to Disabling the Paper Protection Function (page 110).
- If the paper protection function stops scans frequently, refer to Paper Protection Is Set Off Frequently (page 203).
- This setting can also be configured in the scanner driver.
 When the setting is to prioritize the touch screen setting, the touch screen setting is prioritized over the Software Operation Panel setting.
 - Note that even if the touch screen setting is prioritized, the scanner driver setting has the highest priority.


Specifying the Sensitivity Level for Paper Protection [Paper Protection Sensitivity]

Specify the sensitivity level for detecting feeding errors when the paper protection function is enabled. Documents are warped and deformed or paper jam noise is made when documents are not being fed properly. Specify the sensitivity level for detecting deformed documents by warpage or feeding noise.

1 Start up the Software Operation Panel.

For details, refer to Starting Up the Software Operation Panel (page 241).

2 From the list on the left, select [Device Setting 2] → [Paper Protection Sensitivity].



3 Select a detection method.

Feeding Accuracy

This is available when [Detect] for [Paper Protection] is either [Feeding Accuracy] or [Feeding Accuracy & Noise].

Feeding Noise

This is available when [Detect] for [Paper Protection] is either [Feeding Noise] or [Feeding Accuracy & Noise].

4 Select the sensitivity level.

Low

Decreases the sensitivity level to detect warped documents or paper jam noise. Specify this to only detect highly deformed documents by warpage or loud paper noise.

Normal

Detects warped documents and paper jam noise with the optimum sensitivity. This is the factory default setting.

High

Increases the sensitivity level to detect warped documents or paper jam noise. Specify this to detect even slightly deformed documents by warpage or slight paper jam noise.

HINT

- To detect warped documents or paper jam noise immediately and stop the scan, select [High].
- If scanning stops frequently due to the paper protection function, select [Low].
- When the setting is to prioritize the touch screen setting, the touch screen setting is prioritized over the Software Operation Panel setting.


Scanning at High Altitude [High Altitude Mode]

Enable this mode to use the scanner at an altitude of 2,000 m or higher.

Low atmospheric pressure at high altitudes may lower the accuracy in detections for overlapped documents with the ultrasonic sensor.

Setting [Enable] to on for High Altitude Mode improves the accuracy to detect overlapped documents.

- 2 From the list on the left, select [Device Setting 2] \rightarrow [High Altitude Mode].





To obtain an image quality that is close to the image quality for scanning with fi-6130Z, set the image quality mode.

- 2 From the list on the left, select [Device Setting 2] \rightarrow [Image Quality Mode].

Settings Related to the Detection for Overlapped Documents (Multifeed)

Specifying a Method to Detect Overlapped Documents [Multifeed]

Multifeed is an error that occurs when two or more sheets are overlapped and fed at once.

Configure the settings to detect overlapped documents during a scan.


Overlapped documents are detected with the ultrasonic sensor or according to the difference in length of the documents.

When overlapped documents are detected, an error message is displayed and the scan stops. If documents are overlapped within 30 mm from the leading edge, they are not detected as overlapped.

1 Start up the Software Operation Panel.

For details, refer to Starting Up the Software Operation Panel (page 241).

2 From the list on the left, select [Device Setting 2] \rightarrow [Multifeed].



3 Select a detection method.

None

Does not detect overlapped documents.

This is the factory default setting.

Check Overlapping (Ultrasonic)

Detects overlapped documents with the ultrasonic sensor.

When this is selected, you can specify the following two options:

• Specify an area to detect overlapped documents by the length from the leading edge of the document in the feeding direction.

For details, refer to Specifying the Area to Detect Overlapped Documents [Document check area specification for Multifeed Detection] (page 286).

 When a piece of paper is attached on a document, the length and position of the paper can be memorized, and set to ignore overlapping of documents.

For details, refer to Configuring Not to Detect Certain Overlap Patterns (page 107).

Check Length

Detects overlapped documents according to the difference in length.

Select this to scan documents of the same length.

Note that overlapped documents cannot be detected accurately when a mixed batch of different lengths are scanned.

Check Overlapping and Length

Detects overlapped documents by the combination of [Check Overlapping (Ultrasonic)] and [Check Length].

When this is selected, you can specify the following two options:

• Specify an area to detect overlapped documents by the length from the leading edge of the document in the feeding direction.

For details, refer to Specifying the Area to Detect Overlapped Documents [Document check area specification for Multifeed Detection] (page 286).

• When a piece of paper is attached on a document, the length and position of the paper can be memorized, and set to ignore overlapping of documents.

For details, refer to Configuring Not to Detect Certain Overlap Patterns (page 107).

Note that overlapped documents cannot be detected accurately when a mixed batch of different length are scanned.

Length

Specify the difference in length of documents to be detected as overlapped documents.

Overlapped documents are detected when the the difference in length of documents is longer than the specified value.

Specify this item when [Check Length] or [Check Overlapping and Length] is selected.

Any length under the specified value is tolerated as a slight error and not detected as overlapped documents.

Select from 10/15/20 mm. The factory default setting is "10".

ATTENTION

- To scan documents with different lengths, select [Check Overlapping (Ultrasonic)].
- When an attachment such as a sticky note, receipt, or photo is attached on the document, the attachment part of the document may be detected as overlapping of documents if [Check Overlapping (Ultrasonic)] is selected. In that case, select [Check Length].

Otherwise, detect overlapping of documents by specifying an area on the document that does not include an area attached with paper in order to ignore the overlapping of documents for that area.

HINT


This setting can also be configured in the scanner driver. Note that priority is given to the scanner driver setting.

Specifying the Area to Detect Overlapped Documents [Document check area specification for Multifeed Detection]

Specify an area to detect overlapped documents.

Specify this item when [Check Overlapping (Ultrasonic)] or [Check Overlapping and Length] is selected for [Multifeed].



Select the check box to specify the detection range (colored in light pink) in the figure below.



The check box is cleared for the factory default settings.

Clearing this check box sets both start and end positions to "0", and overlapped documents are detected within the whole document.

The above condition applies when the document is set to the center of the pick roller width.

If documents are overlapped within 30 mm from the leading edge, they are not detected as overlapped.

Disable (Middle)

This can be selected when the [Selected range] check box is selected.

Overlapped documents are not detected within the specified area.

This is the factory default setting.

Enable (Middle)

This can be selected when the [Selected range] check box is selected.

Overlapped documents are detected within the specified area.

Start (Middle)

Specify the start position of the detection area by the length from the leading edge of the document in the feeding direction.

Range: 0 to 510 mm, in 2 mm increments, Start < End

The factory default setting is "0".

End (Middle)

Specify the end position of the detection area by the length from the leading edge of the document in the feeding direction.

Range: 0 to 510 mm, in 2 mm increments, Start < End

The factory default setting is "0".

HINT

- When the start and end positions are both "0", overlapped documents are detected in the whole
 document regardless of the setting for [Selected range].
- To disable the detection of overlapped documents for the whole document, select [Disable] for [Selected range], and set the start position to "0" and the end position to equal the document length or longer.
- If the start position is set at a length longer than the document length, overlapped documents are detected in the whole document when [Disable] is selected for [Selected range], and overlapped documents are not detected anywhere in the whole document when [Enable] is selected for [Selected range].
- To detect overlapped documents, the area must be at least 5 mm in length.


 Configure the setting so that the value of the end position minus the start position is 6 mm or more.
- You can also set the start position and the end position by the following methods:
 - On the window for specifying the detection area, draw a square by dragging the mouse pointer.
 - On the window for specifying the detection area, drag the handles that indicate the start position and the end position.
- For examples of the overlapping detection area settings, refer to Examples of the Settings for the Area to Detect the Overlapping of Documents (page 289).






Overlapping of documents is detected only within the light pink area.

Setting details are as follows.






Overlapping of documents is detected only within the light pink area.

Since the detection area (length) is less than 5 mm, overlapped documents cannot be detected accurately.

Setting to Ignore Certain Overlap Patterns [Intelligent Multifeed Function]


Configure the setting to automatically ignore certain patterns of overlapped documents when the setting to detect overlapped documents is enabled.

Note that you first need to specify [Check Overlapping (Ultrasonic)] or [Check Overlapping and Length] in the scanner driver and Specifying a Method to Detect Overlapped Documents [Multifeed] (page 283) on the Software Operation Panel before setting this item.

1 Start up the Software Operation Panel.

2 From the list on the left, select [Device Setting 2] \rightarrow [Intelligent Multifeed Function].



3 Select a operation mode.

Manual mode

Specify whether overlapped documents are detected when re-scanning documents detected as overlapped documents.

Does not memorize the size or location of the paper attachment.

This is the factory default setting.

Auto mode 1

Specify whether the length and position of a piece of paper attached on a document detected as overlapped documents are memorized as an overlap pattern.

If the overlap pattern is memorized, documents with the same overlap pattern are not detected as overlapped documents from the next scan.

HINT

Eight of the most recent overlap patterns can be memorized when [Remember] in [Remember multifeed pattern at power-off] is enabled.

Auto mode 2

Specify whether the length of the longest piece of paper attached on a document detected as overlapped documents is memorized as an overlap pattern.

If the overlap pattern is memorized, a document with a piece of paper in the same length or shorter attached is not detected as overlapped documents from the next scan.

HINT

• By selecting the [Clear overlap pattern] check box, you can erase the overlap patterns that were memorized in Auto mode.

You can erase overlap patterns that were not supposed to be memorized, but be careful with this operation because all memorized patterns will be erased.

The check box is cleared for the factory default settings.

 By selecting the [Auto-Memorize MF Pattern (only when MF images are displayed)] check box, you can record overlap patterns in the window to check images for documents that were detected as overlapped documents.

The check box is cleared for the factory default settings.

• In [Remember multifeed pattern at power-off], you can specify whether or not to keep the overlap pattern upon turning the power off.

When [Remember] is specified, you can use eight of the most recent overlap patterns the next time the scanner is powered on.

The factory default setting is [Do not remember].

Settings Related to Waiting Time

Waiting Time in Manual Feeding [Manual Feeding]

Configure the settings when manually loading and scanning one sheet at a time.


When you scan by manually loading one sheet at a time, you can specify the waiting time (interval) for loading the next document in the ADF paper chute (feeder). This enables continuous scanning as long as you load a document within the specified time.

If the specified time is exceeded, the scan is finished automatically.

1 Start up the Software Operation Panel.

2 From the list on the left, select [Device Setting 2] \rightarrow [Manual Feeding].



3 Set [Timeout Time].

For [Timeout Time], specify the time period until which the scanner confirms that no documents are loaded in the ADF paper chute (feeder) (the interval between the last scan and the detection of whether the next document is loaded or not).

The factory default setting is "10 seconds".

- When scanning more than one document in succession manually
 - 1. Select [Enable] for [Continuous Feed Mode].
 - 2. Select the time for [Timeout Time].

- When scanning a document folded in half, an envelope, or a multi-layered transfer paper one at a time manually
 - 1. Slide the feed mode switch to the left to switch the feed mode to Manual Single Mode.
 - 2. Select the time for [Timeout Time].

HINT

- When [Enable] is selected for [Continuous Feed Mode], the scanner will wait for documents to be loaded until the specified timeout time elapses even if you start scanning with no document in the ADF paper chute (feeder).
- When the feed mode switch is set to Manual Single Mode, the scanner will wait for documents to be loaded until the specified timeout time elapses regardless of the setting for [Continuous Feed Mode].


Waiting Time for the Scanner to Enter Power Saving Mode [Power saving]

Specify the waiting time before the scanner enters power saving mode.

1 Start up the Software Operation Panel.

For details, refer to Starting Up the Software Operation Panel (page 241).

2 From the list on the left, select [Device Setting].



3 Use the slider to specify the waiting time for the scanner to enter power saving mode.

The value can range from 5 to 235 minutes (in increments of 5).

The factory default setting is "15" minutes.

HINT

Selecting the [Power off after a certain period of time] check box turns the power off automatically if the scanner is left on for a certain period of time without being used.

The check box is selected for the factory default setting.







If [Enable] is selected for the vertical streak detection setting, the touch screen displays a notification on when you receive a [Clean glass!] message. When you receive a message, clean the glass to prevent vertical streaks from appearing on images.



Normal

Detects dirt on the glass with the optimum sensitivity. This is the factory default setting.

High

Increases the sensitivity level to detect dirt on the glass. Specify this to detect dirt even when the glass is slightly dirty.



Specify the maintenance and inspection cycle for the scanner that is performed by a service engineer. If the specified period has passed after the last maintenance and inspection date, the touch screen displays a






