AWARD AND HONORS Henry S. '71 and Carol Andrus Scholarship from the HCC Foundation (Spring 2016); Edwin Perez Award for Outstanding Character, Initiative and Service to Others (Spring 2016); Lorraine Hansberry Award for Academic Excellence and Outstanding Contributions Towards the Development of Ethnic Awareness; Student Activities Rising Star Award (Spring 2016).

FAVORITE COURSE OR TEACHER My Learning Community and my honors classes, both because of my English professors. The LC (Learning Community) I took my first semester was Nutrition and English 101 ("All About Food"). My professors were Elizabeth Trobaugh and Laura Christoph, and it was amazing. Last spring I took English 102 with Fred Cooksey, and that class just blew my mind. It was literature and writing, but it was at an advanced level. We analyzed poetry, short stories, and we read two novels. We would sit in a circle and just share our opinions on what we read and have group discussions and debates. I've never had a class like that before. And just that whole new concept of the classroom, the dynamics, how it's set up – the approach from the professor to the student was very friendly and very professional too.

WHAT CLASSES DID YOU TAKE THIS SUMMER? Inorganic chemistry I and II

WHAT WILL YOU BE TAKING NEXT SEMESTER? Honors Colloquium ("Punks, Queers, Freaks"), microbiology, pre-calculus.

WHAT BROUGHT YOU TO HCC? It was really

funny. I went to a college symposium back home in Puerto Rico at the Hotel San Juan in August 2014, and there were all these big colleges there like UConn, Syracuse, Cornell, Harvard. I was like, these are big schools and these are expensive schools too. My mom was standing near the HCC table, and she asked the guy from Admissions, Harold Santiago, where are you guys located? And he said, oh, we're in Holyoke, Mass. My sister and brother-in-law were living in West Springfield. And my mom immediately called my sister and asked her where HCC was. And she told them it's like 10 minutes away from here. I got in contact with Harold, and he told me about HCC, how long they've been here and the philosophy and methods of HCC. And I really liked it. By September, I was already out here to go on a college tour with my sister and brother-in-law. I went and saw Bay Path, Syracuse, UConn, UMass, and Smith College, and then I came here to HCC. I saw HCC, and I loved it because it was very similar to a college I was going to go to if I stayed in Puerto Rico, and I liked it because it wasn't too big. I didn't feel overwhelmed with the campus. It turns out that Harold's uncle and my grandpa are cousins, so we're family.

WHAT'S BEEN YOUR MOST MEANINGFUL EXPERIENCE AT HCC? Joining Student Senate has been amazing, and I thought the Senate was going to be mostly like a student council, but it's way much more than that. We have more involvement on campus and with students, faculty and staff. They actually want to hear our opinions and know what we think, even when we were interviewing candidates for the VP of Academic affairs. We went to all of the interviews with all of the candidates, and they were looking for our feedback to see what we like because that was the person who was going to deal with students too. I've been pretty impressed by how much faculty and staff value what we have to say and how much they depend on our work, because this campus is pro student, and that's what I love about it.

WHAT IS YOUR FAVORITE THING ABOUT HCC? I've got to say I like walking around here

a lot. I like just going down all the hallways, going through every staircase, just to get familiarized with the school and the campus. I find it peaceful. I walk around on the campus road when I want to do some exercise, and go into the woods too and walk around the trails. I think that's one of the things that I most like about here. I'm an exercise junkie so I love to walk wherever I go.

WHAT'S THE BIGGEST CHALLENGE YOU'VE HAD TO OVERCOME? Coming here was a bit of a culture shock. Sometimes when people talk to me, they ask, oh, do you have a visa? I'm like, no, I'm from Puerto Rico. I'm an American citizen. I understand that to a certain extent it's just ignorance. I dealt with a lot of that at the beginning but then I got over it. That's why I turned to giving people lessons about the history of Puerto Rico. I take my culture with me wherever I go. Anybody I sit with, I give them a lesson in Puerto Rican history. I just love talking about Puerto Rico.

WHAT'S THE MOST IMPORTANT THING YOU'VE LEARNED AT HCC? I figured out how to walk around to all the buildings on campus without going outside. It gets cold up here.

WHY IS EDUCATION IMPORTANT TO YOU? Education is the key to growing, and it's key to achieving greatness. Without education, you don't know your past, you don't know your present, and you don't know your future. You need education to achieve goals in life.

WHAT ARE YOU LOOKING FORWARD TO THIS YEAR AT HCC? I'm looking forward to getting more involved with Student Senate activities around campus and organizing activities related to Hispanic Heritage Month and Black History Month.

WHAT ARE YOUR PLANS AFTER HCC? My first choice for transfer is Mount Holyoke. I want to study stem cell research and microbiology. After that, medical school. I want to be an orthopedic surgeon. And there's a lot of research done using stem cells to help fix and reproduce bones.

For 18 years Ileana Vasu, professor of mathematics and chair of Holyoke Community College's engineering program, has dedicated herself to educating the students of HCC. As the recipient of the 2016 Elaine Marieb Faculty Chair for Teaching Excellence, Ileana will receive a modest stipend to support activities to enhance her professional skills. The award was established by HCC professor emeritus Elaine Marieb '80 to recognize a member of the HCC faculty who exemplifies the characteristics associated with outstanding classroom teaching. Vasu, who earned her bachelor's degree at Stanford University and her master's degree at Yale University, immigrated to the United States from Transylvania when she was 17 years old. Ileana can relate to many students who have overcome

obstacles to attend college. Her parents were political refugees and she and her sister had to wait for three years until they could join them in the United States. Ileana has been a key figure in the development of the HCC STEM Scholars program and played a vital role in securing funding from the National Science Foundation to support students in this exciting and important field.

At the 2016 commencement exercises, she shared these words with the graduates: "There is a quote that many of you may be familiar with. It goes like this: 'If I have seen farther, it is by standing on the shoulders of giants.' This is actually from the mathematician, Isaac Newton in a letter to one of his friends. In it, he acknowledged that his accomplishments were not possible without the contributions of thinkers like Galileo, Descartes, and many others who preceded him."

Amador was recognized with the inaugural Rising Star Award, which celebrates alumni who have received their undergraduate degrees within the last 12 years and have demonstrated achievement, leadership and promising futures in their field of discipline. 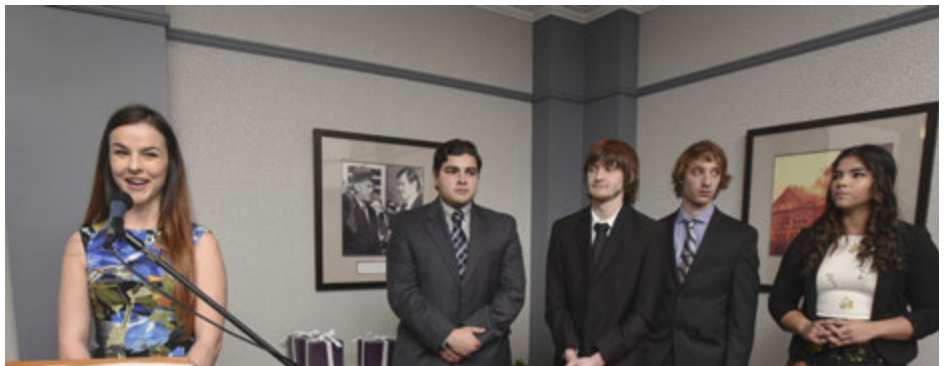

11 New Scholarships Established

The following scholarship funds were established within the HCC Foundation and awarded in fiscal year 2016.

JOHN E. BERGER (JEB) PHOTOGRAPHY SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established by the family of John E. Berger to celebrate the life of a Holyoke High School graduate and a man who loved Holyoke dearly. John is best remembered for his magnificent sunsets, photographed in both Massachusetts and Florida, which he sold and shared with many. The scholarship is given to a deserving full-time liberal arts student, first preference for a photography major.

RAYMOND J. AND HELEN T. DESHAIES SCHOLARSHIP

In 1982, life-long Holyoke resident and firefighter, Raymond J. Deshaies, died in the line of duty. His wife, Helen T. Deshaies, passed away in 2011. Knowing the transformative power of higher education—and their parents' commitment to the local community—their children established the Raymond J. and Helen T. Deshaies Scholarship, which is given annually to a deserving Holyoke Community College student, with preference given to a child of a current or retired Holyoke firefighter, regardless of his or her major or academic interests. The scholarship advances the higher education ambitions of talented local students who have a deep desire to improve their lives and the world at large.

JOLAYNE HINKEL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established by friends and family of Jolayne Hinkel, a well-respected and longtime member of HCC's English faculty. She was admired by students and faculty alike for her ability to bring her passion and expertise into the classroom. Additionally, Jolayne had a very active life outside of the college and was equally well known as an author, entrepreneur, musician and activist. This scholarship is given to a

woman from Amherst or Holyoke who has been accepted or enrolled in any education curricula.

DORIS RATHBUN KNIGHT SCHOLARSHIP

Doris Rathbun Knight established this scholarship for a student majoring in history or government, the humanities or social sciences. Professor Doris Rathbun Knight taught history and government at Holyoke Community College for more than 30 years. She helped found the faculty senate and served on every major committee at the college. In addition, Doris began and served as advisor to the Green Key Honor Society. She was chair of the social sciences division briefly before returning to her real love, teaching. It is her connection to students that she is most noted for, offering guidance and support for academic and career opportunities while maintaining contact long after graduation.

MASSACHUSETTS MORTGAGE BANKERS ASSOCIATION (MMBA) SCHOLARSHIP

The Massachusetts Mortgage Bankers Association (MMBA) established this scholarship with the contributions of the association's membership, general, associate, and corporate. The scholarship will be awarded to a student, or students, who are in their final year of enrollment and majoring in accounting, business, business administration, economics, finance or math.

JORGE NEVES MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Made possible through the generosity of the John DiNapoli Golf Tournament, this award is given in memory of former Holyoke City Councilor and attorney Jorge Neves. This award is given to a student majoring in education, human services or business and who is a

resident of Holyoke.

PANITCH FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

In the spirit of family philanthropy, this scholarship is made possible by the Panitch family of Holyoke, Mass., and given to a deserving student in any program. Sue Ellen Panitch is a recognized community leader and volunteer while her husband Victor is a prominent orthopedic surgeon. Their children include Deborah, a surgeon; Mimi, an attorney and member of numerous city boards; Alyssa, associate head of Biomedical Engineering at Purdue; and Jack, an attorney in Ann Arbor, Mich.

AL PERUSSE SCHOLARSHIP

Created by Cindy Esposito Schneider and Greg Schneider '90, this scholarship is in memory of Al Perusse, a father, husband, friend, grandfather, entrepreneur, weather fan, nature lover and dreamer. This award supports working students, veterans and students raising families.

JOHN SULLIVAN SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established with the support of family, friends, colleagues and alumni to commemorate John Sullivan's life by helping an HCC student who is studying math, physics or engineering and earns a GPA of 3.0 or higher. Sullivan was a beloved and respected HCC mathematics professor for 49 years. He also served as long-time chair of the Math Department.

BOBBY WRIGHT SCHOLARSHIP

This award was established by friends of Bobby Wright, an outstanding local jazz performer, to support a music student who will be attending a four-year institution.

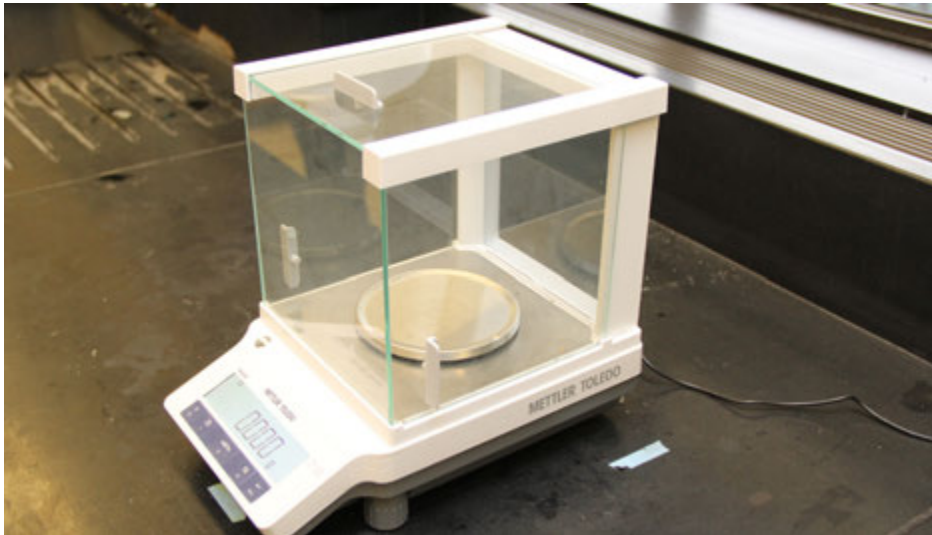

Honoring a Legacy: Erica Broman



This past June, the HCC Foundation's longtime executive director, Erica Broman, presided over her last Foundation board meeting. For many in attendance, it was a celebration of her over 17 years of hard work and dedication on behalf of the students of Holyoke Community College. In 2002, the HCC Foundation held nearly \$3 million in total assets and liabilities. By 2016, that total was more than \$12 million, an increase of almost \$10 million dollars.

In addition, the number of scholarships increased from 58 to nearly 200.

Through Erica's focus on growth of funds, relationships and giving, the Foundation has become one of the largest in the country.

Erica presided over three fundraising campaigns during her tenure, with the Building Healthy Communities campaign being the largest in the college's 70 year history, reaching \$5.5 million in contributions. Most notably was a \$1 million challenge gift from alumna and retired faculty member, Elaine Marieb '80. Mission: Marieb was an exciting way to engage alumni and friends in philanthropy. The Mission Impossible-themed challenge was so successful that the campaign was able to wrap up six months early and nearly \$200,000 in excess of its goal.

There is not enough room on these pages to describe the impact of Erica's work on the HCC Foundation and college, but here are some highlights. We are ever grateful for her leadership and guidance and wish her the best.

DOYLE DRIVE

In 2015 under Erica's leadership, Doyle Drive was officially opened for traffic. This access road for the college connects the main campus with Westfield Road (Route 202). Doyle Drive was constructed following strict conservation regulations to have the least impact on the land and species living beside the road.



THE KITTREDGE CENTER FOR BUSINESS AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

The Gift of Opportunity Campaign raised \$5.3 million. Through a generous donation of \$1 million by Michael Kittredge '73, the Kittredge Center of Business and Workforce Development was named and constructed on campus. At that time, it was the largest gift given to the HCC Foundation.

THE PICKNELLY ADULT AND FAMILY EDUCATION CENTER

The Embrace Education Campaign raised \$500,000 to support the Picknelly Adult and Family Education Center. Located in downtown Holyoke within the new transportation center, adult basic education and related services are provided to residents of Holyoke and neighboring cities and towns.





THE CENTER FOR HEALTH EDUCATION

The Building Healthy Communities Campaign raised \$5.5 million to support the Center for Health Education (2015) and the Center for Life Sciences (2017). Alumna and longtime

benefactor, Elaine Marieb'80, donated \$1 million to the campaign. This state-of-the-art teaching and learning center is for healthcare students, with an emphasis on nursing, and radiological technology.



THE CUBIT BUILDING

Prior to her "transfer" to Westfield State University, Erica negotiated the agreements to allow for the construction of the MGM Resorts HCC Center for Hospitality and Culinary Arts at Holyoke within the downtown Holyoke Innovation District. The center will not only allow HCC to meet the workforce needs of the MGM Springfield, but will act as a regional center for training and entrepreneurship for the region. Once completed (Fall 2017), the center will occupy the first and second floors of the Cubit building, located at the corner of Appleton and Race streets. We look forward to hosting Foundation events in the new dining room.

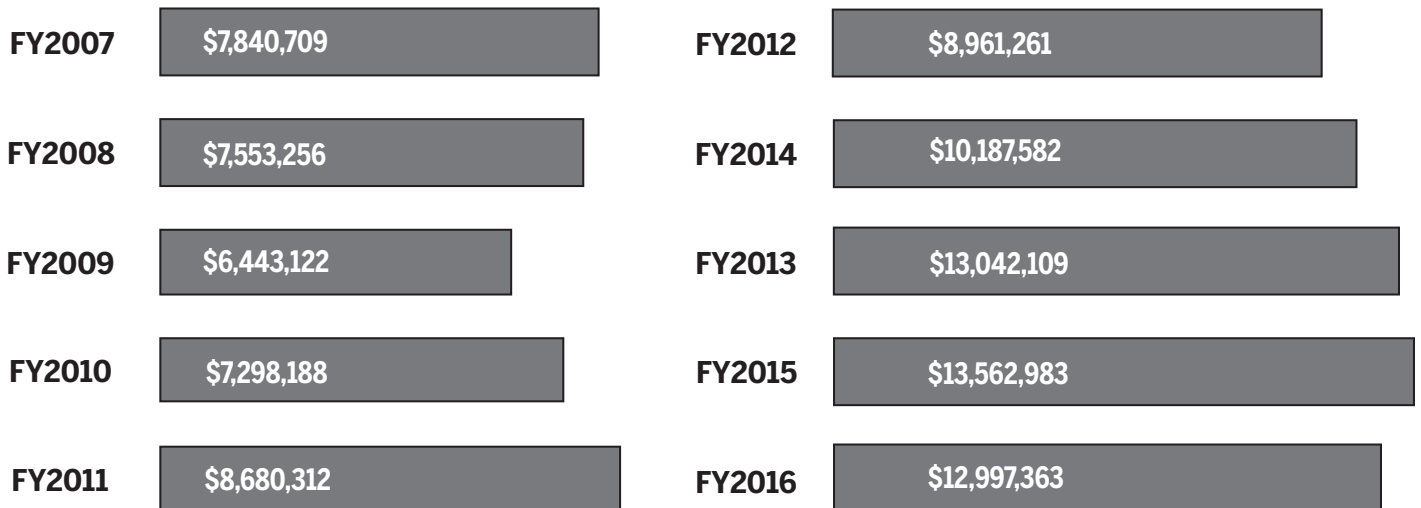
