FROM THE ARCHBISHOP'S DESK

One of the hazards of being tall is that I look up more than I should. Inevitably, I trip over things from time to time, which brings me down to earth with a bump. Sometimes people think that I'm being rude because I don't acknowledge them if they are below my line of sight, and that can get me in trouble too. Of course, there are some advantages to being tall too, such as being able to see over the heads of people in a crowd, or lifting luggage onto the rack in train. But being able to look over and beyond our past and present experience and see further, is something that everyone can do.

During the Christmas season we were encouraged to look up by the shepherds who, in seeing the night sky filled with angels glorifying and praising God, were led to someone who was very down to earth – to God's Son, Jesus. The wise men also looked up and saw a star which led them to the true King. They prostrated themselves on the ground before him and offered the homage due to a king.

Throughout the year ahead, we should keep looking up: Because, by broadening our vision and taking in the magnificence of creation, even if it is likely that sooner or later we may trip over and find ourselves humbled, it is there that we will surely encounter the Lord.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

Wednesday: Saint Francis de Sales

Born in Savoy (France) in 1567, Francis died in Lyons in 1622. As Bishop of Geneva, he played a major part in the renewal of French Catholicism in the seventeenth century and is seen by many as an early proponent of ecumenical dialogue. With Saint Jane Frances de Chantal he founded the Visitation order, and his writings promoted a spirituality for laypeople. Francis de Sales is remembered as a preacher, writer, and spiritual director, who combined firmness with patience and gentleness.

Thursday: The Conversion of Saint Paul

This feast celebrates the work of God's grace at a major turning point in the life of Paul himself and in the history of the infant Church.

Friday: Saints Timothy and Titus

Disciples and associates of Apostle Paul who attended the Council of Jerusalem with him, and to whom the pastoral letters of the New Testament are addressed. Timothy represented Paul to various communities and, according to tradition, was eventually placed in charge of the Church at Ephesus. Titus was asked to organise the Church in Crete, where he died at the end of the first century.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

Monday – Saint Agatha

Agatha was a virgin martyred in Sicily, perhaps during the persecutions of the third century. She has been venerated in Rome on this day since the sixth century. In legend she is remembered for her faith and for remaining resolute under torture.

Tuesday – Saints Paul Miki and Companions

This group of twenty-six martyrs was crucified at Nagasaki (Japan) on 5 February 1597. Most were Japanese and laypeople, some still youths. They were the first of many martyrs in a young Church. Paul Miki, aged thirty-five years at his death, was a Jesuit from an aristocratic Japanese family. He is remembered as a notable preacher who inspired the local Church of his time and in the centuries that followed to be strong in faith during persecution and isolation.

Saturday - Saint Scholastica

Scholastica was born at Norcia (Italy) about 480 and died near Monte Cassino in the 540s. Like Saint Benedict, her brother and by tradition her twin, she dedicated herself to God through the monastic life and is remembered for the part she played in establishing Benedictine monasticism.

LENT MESSAGE FROM POPE FRANCIS

The Lord, who overcame the deceptions of the Tempter during the forty days in the desert, shows us the path we must take. May the Holy Spirit lead us on a true journey of conversion, so that we can rediscover the gift of God's word, be purified of the sin that blinds us, and serve Christ present in our brothers and sisters in need. I encourage all the faithful to express this spiritual renewal also by sharing in the various Lenten Campaigns promoted by many Church organizations in different parts of the world, and thus to favour the culture of encounter in our one human family. Let us pray for one another so that, by sharing in the victory of Christ, we may open our doors to the weak and poor. Then we will be able to experience and share to the full the joy of Easter.

Above all, I urge the members of the Church to take up the Lenten journey with enthusiasm, sustained by almsgiving, fasting and prayer. If, at times, the flame of charity seems to die in our own hearts, know that this is never the case in the heart of God! He constantly gives us a chance to begin loving anew.

With affection and the promise of my prayers for all of you, I send you my blessing. And, please, do not forget to pray for me.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

Thursday - The Chair of Saint Peter

The chair ("cathedra") of a bishop is a sign of his teaching authority and pastoral oversight of a local Church. This feast, which was first observed in fourth century Rome, celebrates Peter, first among the apostles, as the focus of unity for all in the communion of one faith.

Friday - Saint Polycarp

Born about the year 69, Polycarp died on this day about 155 at Smyrna (Turkey), where he had been the beloved and respected bishop. He was a disciple of Saint John the apostle and wrote to the Philippians to strengthen their faith and to defend the Church against heresy. Because of the account of his martyrdom he is remembered for his fearless acknowledgement of Christ. Polycarp is honoured as one of the apostolic fathers of the Church.

NEXT FRIDAY: PRAY AND FAST FOR PEACE

Pope Francis has invited Christians, together with members of all faiths, and all women and men of goodwill, to join him in praying for an end to violence and conflict, especially in South Sudan and in the Democratic Republic of Congo. He has called a Day of Prayer and Fasting for next Friday, the 23rd of February, which falls during the first full week of Lent, when fasting from food and extra acts of charity are encouraged as a sign of penitence. He specifically asks members of other faiths to join in the initiative in any way they can and has highlighted the vital role that religions play in achieving and consolidating peace. He urges members of all faith communities to take up the appeal and to join in "moments of prayer, fasting and reflection, according to their own traditions and in their own places of worship Everyone, in their own conscience, before God, should ask: What can I do for peace? We certainly can pray, but we can act too: Each one of us can say concretely "no" in our own way to violence in any form."

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Thursday - Saint David, Patron of Wales

The only native-born patron saint of the countries of Britain and Ireland. Born around the year 500, David became a renowned preacher, founding monastic settlements and churches in Wales, Brittany and southwest England. He and his monks followed a simple, austere life. They ploughed the fields by hand, rather than using oxen, and refrained from eating meat or drinking beer. David himself was reputed to have consumed only leeks and water — which is perhaps why the leek became a national symbol of Wales. David died on the 1st March 589 and was buried at the site of St. David's Cathedral, where his shrine was a popular place of pilgrimage throughout the Middle Ages. His last words to his followers came from a sermon he gave on the previous Sunday: 'Be joyful, keep the faith, and do the little things that you have heard and seen me do.'

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saturday

Saint Patrick, Patron of Ireland

The dates of Patrick's life cannot be fixed with certainty, but there is broad agreement that he was active as a missionary in Ireland during the second half of the 5th century. Early medieval tradition credits him with being the founder of Christianity in Ireland, converting a society practising a form of Celtic polytheism. He has been generally so regarded ever since, despite evidence of some earlier Christian presence in Ireland. According to the *Confessio* of Patrick, when he was about 16 he was captured by Irish pirates from his home in Britain and taken as a slave to Ireland, looking after animals; he lived there for six years before escaping and returning to his family. After becoming a priest, he returned to northern and western Ireland. In later life, as a missionary bishop in Ireland, he faced hardship and opposition even from his friends and fellow Christians. Yet he worked to conciliate, to evangelise, and to educate local chieftains and their families. Patrick is remembered for his simplicity and pastoral care, for his humble trust in God, and for his fearless preaching of the Gospel to those who had enslaved him in his youth. By the seventh century, he had already come to be revered as the Patron Saint of Ireland.

"Truth on my tongue, his way to guide my walking – and I shall live, not I but Christ in me." Those of us of a certain age may recognise these words as being part of the hymn specially composed for the National Pastoral Congress hosted by the Archdiocese in 1980, and they sum up well the attitude of an Easter People whose song today and in this great 50-day season of Eastertide is "Alleluia!"

The reason the Church's liturgy 'fasted' from the use of this familiar word during the days of Lent was precisely so that when it did make its return at the proclamation of the Resurrection in the great Vigil and First Mass of Easter Day it had all the more impact. The singing of the great triple "Alleluia" of Easter Day allowed the church to burst into song almost as Christs bursts into the upper room with the words 'Peace be with you'. The Alleluia (the 'Praise God') of the Church on Easter Day is as if we are saying to the world, 'You can be assured, be at peace, be confident that even that which is most feared, that which is most perturbing, that which is seemingly the final end to all your hopes and expectations is itself conquered by the One who has died and is now Risen.'

The Paschal Candle which now stands in church next to the Lectern, the place of the Proclamation of the Word of God in the liturgy, enlightens not only our hearing and understanding of the Scriptures but also the reality of our own stories, our own everyday experiences and lives. It is literally 'in the light of Christ' that we are brought to understand and appreciate the working of God's Holy Spirit in our world, in our parish, in our family and community.

Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord

The date of this feast is usually the 25th of March but, since that date fell on Palm Sunday this year, the celebration is transferred to the first available free date after Easter Week. It is a feast of the Lord, commemorating the Incarnation, the announcement to the Virgin Mary of the Word made flesh, Mary's acceptance of God's will, and the conception of Christ nine months before Christmas. Its occurrence close to Easter links the incarnation with the whole mystery of redemption in Christ.

If you would like to begin Gift-Aiding just pop a note with your name, address and phone number into the offertory collection basket saying "I want to Gift Aid!" and someone will contact you. Our deepest thanks to Kath Morris at Sacred Heart and Elizabeth Fairhurst at Holy Family who do all the paperwork and administer the Gift Aid Scheme for us in our two parishes to make it all possible.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

Monday: Saint George

George was martyred at Lydda (Israel) around 303 during the persecution of Christians by the emperor Diocletian. Devotion to him spread quickly. During the crusades, George was seen to personify the ideals of Christian chivalry, and he was adopted as patron of several countries, including England.

Wednesday: Saint Mark

Mark died about the year 74. He is usually identified with the John Mark whose mother's house in Jerusalem was a meeting place for the apostles, and with the young man who followed Christ after his arrest (Mark 14:51). A cousin of Saint Barnabas, Mark accompanied Apostle Paul on his first missionary journey and later went with him to Rome. A companion of Apostle Peter, he is traditionally credited with the gospel which reflects Peter's teaching and memoirs. Mark is honoured as the founder of the Church in Alexandria.

Ultimately, belief in the resurrection asks us to believe that, despite a strong experience to the contrary, reality is gracious, light does triumph over darkness, love over selfinterest, justice over oppression, peace over chaos, fulfilment over hunger. Faith in the resurrection is the trust that, in the end, everything is good."

COMMEMORATING THE ENGLISH MARTYRS

Next Friday we keep the Feast of the English Martyrs. Mass will be celebrated in their honour at 7.00pm in Sacred Heart Church followed by a Presentation on the Lancaster Martyrs given by Christopher Robson, representative for Aid to the Church in Need (ACN) in the Lancaster Diocese. All are welcome and we hope many will come along - bring your Catholic friends from other parishes too! A retiring collection will be taken after the Presentation for the work of ACN which supports Christians who are being persecuted for their faith today.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

Tuesday – Saint Joseph the Worker

This commemoration, instituted by Pope Pius XII in 1955, proposes the example and intercession of Joseph as worker and provider for the family of Nazareth. On this date many countries celebrate the dignity and cause of human labour.

Wednesday - Saint Athanasius

Athanasius was born in 295 and died in 373 at Alexandria (Egypt). He attended the first ecumenical Council of Nicaea as a deacon. Later, as bishop of Alexandria, he upheld that council's doctrine in the face of great opposition from Arians, including several emperors. Athanasius was sent into exile a number of times. He is venerated as the "Father of Orthodoxy" for championing the true and equal divinity of the incarnate Son of God.

Thursday - Saints Philip and James

Philip, from Bethsaida in Galilee, became a disciple of Jesus and one of the twelve. He is recorded in the Fourth Gospel as recognising in Jesus the one foretold by Moses and the prophets (John 1:45) and as introducing Gentiles to the Lord (John 12:20-22). According to Acts 8:5, he was the first to preach the gospel to non-Jews. James, son of Alphaeus, was also one of the twelve called by Jesus (Mark 3:18ff.). Known as James the Less, he has been venerated traditionally as the author of the letter of James and as leader of the Church in Jerusalem, where he died in the year 62. The joint feast of Philip and James has been celebrated in Rome since at least the sixth century.

Friday - The English Martyrs

This feast commemorates the many who gave their lives during the years of the English Reformation in the 16th and 17th Centuries. They came from every walk of life: There are among them rich and poor, married and single, women and men, old and young, ordained and lay. They are remembered for the example they gave of constancy in their faith and courage in the face of persecution.

THURSDAY IS THE SOLEMNITY OF THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD AND A HOLYDAY OF OBLIGATION FOR ALL CATHOLICS

The Ascension has always been an important part of the joyful celebration of the fifty days from Easter to Pentecost but was singled out for commemoration on the fortieth day (see Acts 1:3) toward the end of the 4th century. The feast develops the glory of the resurrection by acclaiming the exaltation of Christ as Lord of heaven and earth. It serves to prepare the Church, toward the end of the season of Easter, for the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.



For a number of years this feast lost its significance as the Fortieth Day of Easter by being transferred to the following Sunday in England and Wales. But, as from this year, the bishops have returned it to its original place in the calendar. So the feast is now restored as a Holyday of Obligation for all Catholics, to be observed by gathering as a community to celebrate Mass together on that day

Mass for the Holyday in our two parishes will be a Vigil Mass at 7.00pm on Wednesday evening in Sacred Heart Church and Mass on the Thursday itself at 10.00am in Holy Family Church.

Today concludes the Easter season, the fifty days following Jesus' resurrection that are marked in a particular way by the presence of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit is in fact the Easter Gift *par excellence*. He is the Creator Spirit, who constantly brings about new things. Today's Mass readings show us two of those new things: In the first reading, the Spirit makes of the disciples *a new people*; in the Gospel, he creates in the disciples *a new heart*. The Holy Spirit is the fire of love burning in the heart of the Church and in our hearts, even though we often cover him with the ash of our sins.

"I will not leave you orphans" says the Lord. Today, on the Feast of Pentecost, Jesus' words remind us also of the maternal presence of Mary in the Upper Room. The Mother of Jesus is with the community of disciples gathered in prayer: She is the Mother of the Church. We entrust to her intercession, in a particular way, all Christians, families and communities that at this moment are most in need of the Spirit, the Paraclete, the Defender and Comforter, the Spirit of truth, freedom and peace.

So today let us pray, through Mary's intercession: "Spirit of God, Lord, who dwell in my heart and in the heart of the Church, guiding and shaping her in diversity, come! Like water, we need you to live. Come down upon us anew, teach us unity, renew our hearts and teach us to love as you love us, to forgive as you forgive us."

FEASTS OF THE WEEK

Monday - Mary, Mother of the Church

This is a new Memorial in the calendar, to be observed from this year on the day following Pentecost Sunday, and instituted by Pope Francis at the beginning of this year. The title of "Mother of the Church" was given to Mary by Pope Paul VI in 1967 following the end of the Second Vatican Council since when the devotion to her under this title has grown in popularity

Friday – Saint Bede the Venerable

Born at Wearmouth in the North East of England in 673, Bede died at Jarrow on this day in 735. He was a monk and a historian of the early English Church. Known for his scholarly writings, especially on the scriptures and the writings of the Fathers of the Church, he is venerated as the "Light of the Church" in the period called the Dark Ages and as a forerunner of the eighth and ninth century renaissance of the Western Church.

Saturday - Saint Philip Neri

Philip was born in Florence, Italy in 1515, and died at Rome on this day in 1595. An outstanding proponent of Church reform after the Council of Trent, he worked among the young and the poor in Rome and founded the Congregation of the Oratory (Oratorians). He is remembered for his practical pastoral initiatives, and for his great humour, simplicity, and charity.



RETIRING COLLECTION THIS WEEKEND FOR THE SUPPORT OF OUR RETIRED PRIESTS

The Eucharist speaks the Lord's love for us, a love so great that it nourishes us with Himself; a love freely-given, and always available to every person who hungers to be Loved. To live the experience of faith means to allow oneself to be nourished by the Lord and to build one's own existence, not with material goods, but with the reality that does not perish: the gifts of God, his Word and his Body.

If we look around, we realise that there are so many offers of food which do not come from the Lord and which may at first appear to be more satisfying. So, some nourish themselves with money, others with success and vanity, others with power and pride. But the food that truly nourishes us and satisfies our real hunger is that which only the Lord gives us!

The food the Lord offers us is different from other food, and perhaps it doesn't seem as flavourful to us as may certain other dishes the world offers us. So, we, today, may ask ourselves: What about me? Where do I want to eat? At which table do I want to be nourished? At the Lord's table? Or do I dream about eating flavourful foods, but which do not nourish? We may ask ourselves: Which really satiates my soul? Let us learn to recognise the false bread that deceives and corrupts, because it comes from selfishness, from self-reliance and from sin. And let us be nourished with Jesus, the true Bread of God, come down from heaven to give Life to the world.

FEASTS OF THE WEEK

Tuesday - Saint Boniface

Born in Devon in England about 675, Boniface was killed in the Netherlands on this day in 754. As a monk and teacher, Boniface went to evangelise the Germanic peoples. Ordained bishop, he was given wide-ranging papal commissions throughout Germany and Gaul. He founded monasteries and established dioceses. Boniface is remembered as a determined missionary and as a Church organiser and reformer whose work shaped the future of Europe. He is buried at his abbey of Fulda and is honoured as The Apostle of Germany.

Friday - The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus

This devotion, which dates back to the Middle Ages, flowered in France in the seventeenth century as a result of the visions of Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque. The feast recalls the mystery of God, who is love, and honours the heart of Jesus as the source and centre of the incarnate love of God.

Saturday - The Immaculate Heart of Mary

This commemoration celebrates Mary as the model of ready acceptance of God's will in all life's circumstances. It was instituted by Pius XII for the octave day of the Assumption and was moved by Paul VI in 1969 to the Saturday after the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Monday – Saint Barnabas

Barnabas was a Jew from Cyprus and one of the first converts in Jerusalem. He was a leading member of the Church there, though not one of the twelve. He introduced Saint Paul to the twelve and worked with him in Antioch and on missionary work in the Mediterranean world. Barnabas championed the Gentiles at the Council of Jerusalem and is remembered as "a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and of faith" (Acts 11:21).

Wednesday – Saint Anthony of Padua

Anthony (whose baptismal name was Ferdinand) was born in Lisbon (Portugal) in 1195 and died at Padua (Italy) on this day in 1231. At first an Augustinian presbyter and scholar, he joined the Franciscans to be a missionary in north Africa but was thwarted by illness. Instead, he became a teacher of theology and a brilliant popular preacher in southern France and Italy. He is remembered and loved as an inspired preacher, a servant of the poor, and a worker of miracles.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

Monday - Saint John Rigby

John Rigby is one of the Forty Martyrs of England and Wales. Born in 1570 at Harrock Hall, near Wigan, Lancashire, the fifth or sixth son of Nicholas and Mary Rigby. In 1600, while working for Sir Edmund Huddleston, whose daughter Mrs. Fortescue was summoned to the Old Bailey for recusancy, John Rigby appeared for her because she was ill, was compelled to confess his Catholicism, and sent to Newgate. The next day he signed a confession that he had been reconciled to the Catholic faith. He was twice given the chance to recant, but twice refused. His sentence of execution was carried out and he was executed on the 21st of June 1600.

Wednesday - Saint Alban

Alban is venerated as the first-recorded British Christian martyr. He is believed to have been beheaded in the Roman city of Verulanium (modern St Albans) sometime during the 3rd or 4th century, and he has been venerated there since ancient times.

Thursday - Saint Aloysius Gonzaga

Born into an Italian noble family in 1568, devout and ascetical from the time of his childhood, Aloysius pursued a religious vocation as a Jesuit against enormous family opposition. He died of the plague at the age of only 23, contracted while caring for its victims. He is remembered for his youthful ideal of perfection and for his determination to achieve it. He is a patron saint of young people.

Friday - Saints John Fisher & Thomas More

Made famous by his holiness of life and featured in the movie "A Man for All Seasons," Saint Thomas More is the patron of those in the law profession. Husband, father, chancellor, and lawyer, Thomas More stands out as a leading figure in British history. He was martyred by King Henry VIII in 1535.

John Fisher's name is usually associated with Thomas More and their difficulty with King Henry VIII. Saint John Fisher, a bishop and cardinal, refused to agree with Henry VIII's divorce and remarriage as well as the idea that the king, rather than the pope, was the head of the Church in England. He was imprisoned and eventually martyred.

CELEBRATING THE SAINTS THIS WEEK

Sunday 24th June

The Birth of Saint John the Baptist

The Church holds John the Baptist in such great esteem that the feast of his birth replaces the normal Sunday in Ordinary Time this year. John is one of the few saints who has two feast days: His martyrdom (which we celebrate on the 29th of August) and also his birth, which Luke tells of in his Gospel, where a connection is drawn between the births of Jesus and of John, pointing to the vital supporting-role which John would play in the history of salvation.

Thursday 28th June

Saint Irenaeus

While we know little about Irenaeus, we do know that his life's work of fighting Gnosticism had a tremendous influence on the theology of the Church. A man of learning and high passions, Irenaeus refuted the Gnostic claims of "secret knowledge" and supported the teachings of the Apostles and Scripture. Irenaeus is remembered for his fidelity to apostolic tradition and is venerated as a martyr.

Friday 29th June

Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles

This pre-eminent feast day of the city of Rome has been observed on this date since the mid-third century. It commemorates the martyrdoms at Rome under Nero, between 64-67, of Peter the "chief of the apostles" and Paul the "Apostle to the Gentiles." It recalls their faith, their courage, and their leadership during the difficult days of the birth of the Church.



Archbishop Malcolm has announced a number of appointments of clergy and mergers of parishes becoming effective during the summer months within the Archdiocese of Liverpool:

- Fr. Gordon Abbs will take up appointment as parish priest at Saint Catherine & All Saints (Golborne & Lowton) and Saint Lewis, Croft. (English Martyrs, Haydock, will begin to be administered from the St. Helens Pastoral Area.)
- Fr. Simon Cadwallader, after several years in Peru, will be assistant priest at Saints Peter & Paul, Crosby.
- Fr. Ron Johnson will be going on sabbatical.
- Fr. Jean Paul Ilunga will take up appointment as parish priest at Saint Anne & Blessed Dominic, St. Helens.
- Fr. Ged Callacher will take up appointment as parish priest at Saint Monica & Saint Richard, Bootle, in addition to his responsibility at Saint Francis de Sales, Walton.
- Fr. Roy Cooper will move to Penwortham as parish priest at Saint Teresa & Saint Mary Magdalen.
- Fr. Michael Barrett will become parish priest of Saint Oswald's, Longton.
- Fr, Matthew Jolley will go to Rome for further studies and reside at the Beda College.
- Fr. Dominic Risley will move to Saint Matthew & Saint Cecilia, Liverpool, as assistant priest.

This summer's newly-ordained priests will become assistants as follows: Fr. Philip Carr at the Metropolitan Cathedral; Fr. Anthony Kelly at Saint Julie & Saint Teresa, St. Helens; Fr. Carl Mugan at Saint Wilfrid, Widnes.

Fr. George Joseph, a priest of the Diocese of Palai who is currently at Holy Rosary, Old Roan, will take up appointment as priest-in-charge at Saint Bede, Clayton-le-Woods. He will also administer Saint Chad's, South Hill, for the foreseeable future.

Fr. Silviu Climent has returned to the Archdiocese to take up an appointment at the Cathedral.

The three Deacons who were ordained for the service of the Archdiocese on the 10th of June at the Metropolitan Cathedral have been given the following parish appointments: Deacon Tony Downes to Christ the King and Our Lady, Liverpool; Deacon Chris Housbey to Our Lady, Queen of Martyrs and Saint Swithin, Croxteth; Deacon Anil Lukose to Saint Edward, Wigan.

On the 1st of May 2018 there were three mergers of parishes across the Archdiocese. The parishes of Our Lady, Queen of Peace and English Martyrs in Litherland were merged to form the new parish of Our Lady and the English Martyrs. Our Lady's and Saint Gregory's in Lydiate were merged to form the new parish of Saint Catherine of Alexandria (the dedication of the medieval chapel whose remains lie within the parish). The three Warrington parishes of Saint Benedict, Saint Mary and Saint Oswald were merged to form a new parish under the title of Blessed James Bell (a local martyr). CELEBRATING THE SAINTS

Monday

Saint Bridget of Sweden

Bridget of Sweden was a married mother of eight and, after being widowed, the foundress of a monastery for men and women. She spent her final days in Rome seeking to correct Church abuses for which she received much opposition.

Wednesday

Saint James, Apostle

Two of the apostles were named James. This James, the brother of John, was a fisherman and one of the three who spent time with the Lord on significant occasions. Most likely, he was the first to be martyred. He and John were nicknamed "Sons of Thunder" by Jesus.

Thursday

Saints Joachim and Anne

Jesus is truly God and truly human, and this feast of his grandparents is a testimony to that. While the names of Joachim and Anne may be legendary (they are named as Mary's parents in a late second century tradition) we know that Jesus had grandparents, the parents of Mary (as well as those of Joseph). Our God truly became human and lived among us.

CELEBRATING THE SAINTS

Tuesday - Saint Ignatius of Loyola (1491-1556)

Founder of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits), Ignatius of Loyola, like Francis of Assisi, had a conversion experience while recuperating from a serious illness. Being a military man, the Rule of Life that Saint Ignatius wrote for his followers shows the discipline and rigour of a soldier, but a soldier of faith with the mercy and compassion of the Gospel. The method of discernment developed by Saint Ignatius is used to this day by many in the Church.

Wednesday - Saint Alphonsus Liguori (1696-1787)

Alphonsus Liguori was a great moral theologian as well as the founder of the Redemptorists. He wrote many works of spirituality. He also suffered at the hands of some Redemptorists who betrayed his dream - even saints have it tough!

Saturday - Saint John Vianney (1786-1859)

John Vianney is best known as the Curé d'Ars, the little French town where he was pastor. John had great trouble with his studies and almost wasn't ordained. After he became the pastor in Ars however, he gained great fame for his love for Jesus in the Eucharist, and as a much sought-after confessor, hearing confessions sometimes for twelve hours a day. He is patron saint of parish priests.

CELEBRATING THE SAINTS

Wednesday – Saint Dominic

Dominic became aware that the preacher had to practice what he preached and connect with the people of God. He and a few others formed what was the beginning of the Order of Preachers, better known as the Dominicans. Living a life of simplicity, the Dominicans were committed to contemplative action - the combination of two ways of life.

Thursday - Saint Edith Stein

The story of Edith Stein begins with her life as a noted philosopher, raised in the Jewish faith, and ends as a Catholic Carmelite nun with the name Sister Teresa Benedicta of the Cross. She died in the gas chambers of Auschwitz in 1942. A life involving two faiths and many political events which swirled around her.

Friday - Saint Lawrence

Devotion to Lawrence dates back to the earliest days of the Church. While we do not have many facts about his life, his courageous witness to the faith through his martyrdom is well known. He is a patron saint of deacons.

Saturday – Saint Clare

Clare referred to herself as a little plant, but in many ways she was a strong oak. A contemporary of Saint Francis of Assisi, she formed a community, now known as the Poor Clares, and insisted on the privilege of poverty until her dying breath. A model of humility, Clare cared for her sisters even through her own years of illness. Her devotion to Jesus was extraordinary.

CELEBRATING THE SAINTS

Tuesday - Saint Maximilian Kolbe

Maximilian Mary Kolbe, a Conventual Franciscan, is best known for volunteering to take the place of a condemned prisoner in the Nazi death camp at Auschwitz in 1941. But he also worked tirelessly for the spiritual welfare of people through a deep devotion to the Blessed Mother. His whole life seemed to revolve around Mary as the sure path to Jesus.

Wednesday – The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

The doctrine of the Assumption of Mary was formally defined only fairly recently in 1950 by Pope Pius XII. But the belief that Mary was assumed body and soul into heaven at end of her earthly life, dates back to the earliest days of the Church. What happened to Mary at the close of her earthly existence is the sure and certain hope held out to all God's children. Our destiny is to share life fully with Christ in the presence of the Father. And if, like Mary, we are open to the prompting of the Spirit in our lives, that is where the Spirit will bring us.

CELEBRATING THE SAINTS

Monday – Saint Bernard Wanting to live just as a simple monk in the quiet of a monastery, Saint Bernard of Clairvaux was called upon to be a very active member of the Church in his day. Preacher, reconciler, adviser, healer—just a few of the roles which the Lord called Bernard to play. A man of many talents, he used his abilities generously and freely for the service of the People of God.

Tuesday – Saint Pius the Tenth A man of humble background, and wanting to maintain a simple lifestyle, Saint Pius the Tenth endured the trappings of the papacy as best he could. Known for encouraging frequent reception of Holy Communion, and concerned about world affairs, he led the Church in holiness and grace. He was undoubtedly one of the greatest popes of the 20th century.

Wednesday – The Queenship of Mary Coming exactly a week after the celebration of her Assumption, this feast of Mary recognises her role in the Kingdom of her Son, Jesus. If Jesus is king, Mary is certainly queen. And the title or its surrogate - goes back centuries in the Church, as Mary has been praised for her position in the Church among the People of God.

Friday – Saint Bartholomew We know nothing about today's saint, Saint Bartholomew, except that he was one of the original twelve apostles. If he is the man called Nathanael, then we know he is from Cana in Galilee - but that still doesn't tell us much. But knowing that he gave his life in the service of the Gospel is enough.

CELEBRATING THE SAINTS

Monday – Saint Monica Monica is perhaps best known as the mother of Saint Augustine who we celebrate tomorrow. But Monica was also the mother of two other children, and is known as a woman of great prayer. We know that she prayed for the conversion of her son, and her prayers were heard. She also prayed for and obtained the conversion of her husband and mother-in-law.

Tuesday – Saint Augustine Augustine is a giant in many ways. He had a powerful and forceful personality which he used both before and after his conversion. He had a passion for whatever he did, and this shows in his theological teachings. Yet he also was a man of great love, as is evident in his sermons. And he had a deep love for the Lord.

Wednesday – The Martyrdom of Saint John the Baptist The martyrdom of John is one of the most gruesome stories in the New Testament. Yet it is the story of the victory of faith and courage over cowardice and hate. A king makes a careless promise and does not have the integrity to do the right thing when his jealous wife takes advantage. This is a blunt stories of what living faithfully is all about.

Thursday – Saint Edmund Arrowsmith A local lad, Brian Arrowsmith (although he always used Edmund which was his Confirmation name) was born at Haydock in 1585, a member of the Lancashire Catholic Gerard Family through his mother. He studied and was ordained priest abroad before returning to the English Mission where he was cruelly martyred, one of the Forty Martyrs of England and Wales. His Holy Hand can be venerated at Saint Oswald's Church in Ashton.

6. EUCHARIST IS ... FOOD FOR THE JOURNEY

We might do well to take a moment to thank God for all that we have received. All that we have faced in our lives we did not face alone. But we can pray too that God's strength and love will be at work in our hearts to make us bread broken for others, bringing the nourishment of God's love to the weary and downcast.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNIONS IN 2019

CELEBRATING THE SAINTS

Monday - Saint Gregory the Great Gregory is one of only two popes ever to have been given the title "The Great". (The other is Pope Leo the First). Gregory came from a wealthy family and was Prefect of Rome. He resigned that position to became a monk and was later elected pope at the age of 50. In his new role, he had much to do, both within and outside the Church. Gregory proved to be a capable shepherd, addressing many ecclesial and civil issues with a firm, steady resolve. He reorganised Church life and administration in a time of crisis and sponsored liturgical reform. He initiated the evangelisation of the English by sending Augustine on his mission to England. Gregory is remembered also for his extensive writings on pastoral care, spirituality, and morals, for his care of the poor, and for his self-designation as "Servant of the Servants of God", a title still used by the pope today.

Saturday - The Birth of Mary In affirming the humanity of Jesus, the Word of God made flesh, the Church celebrates the birth of Mary, his mother. Although Scripture does not record the birth of Mary, some other early apocryphal writings note the development of Christian piety around Mary's parents and her birth. Usually, a saint's feast day is celebrated on the date of the anniversary of their death (the day they were born into eternal life) but, because of her importance in salvation history, Mary's earthly birthday is celebrated each year, as well as those of her Son, the Lord, on the 25th of December, and of Saint John the Baptist on the 24th of June.

No doubt to the great delight of their parents, our children end their summer break and will return to school during this week. We pray for all who learn or who work in our schools, a very successful and blessed new academic year.

CELEBRATING THE SAINTS

Thursday – Saint John Chrysostom This great preacher of the Church at Antioch ("Chrysostom" means "The One with the Golden Tongue") was a victim of his own success. Called to be a bishop, this simple monk soon found himself embroiled in the politics of the empire. John, however, managed to stay focused. He once preached: "It's a blasphemy to worship the presence of Christ in the Mass if you don't reverence his presence in his poorest brothers and sisters on the streets".

Friday – The Triumph of the Cross Saint Helena, the mother of Emperor Constantine, is credited with having found the cross on which Jesus was crucified. From once being an instrument of shame and death, the cross quickly became the boast of Christians and a symbol of the triumph of life over death, of good over evil, of love over hatred.

Saturday – Our Lady of Sorrows The principal references in the gospels to Mary's sorrows are Simeon's prediction at the Presentation of the child Jesus, about a sword piercing Mary's soul in the Gospel according to Luke, and Jesus' words from the cross to Mary and to the Beloved Disciple in the Gospel according to John. The two passages are brought together as prediction and fulfilment. From the crib to the Cross, the sorrowful Mother shares in her Son's work of redemption.

The Pharisees viewed all tax collectors as sinners. So it was a real shock to hear that Jesus had called such a person to be one of his followers. But that's the kind of thing that Jesus did – and still does!

AFTER THE NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS: WHAT NOW?

"LIVING THE EUCHARIST" - A Reflection by Father Chris Thomas

In the aftermath of the National Eucharistic Congress, I have been reflecting on my own experience of the Eucharist. When I used to take young people to Lourdes over 30 years ago, there was a tent on the prairie where 24-hour exposition of the Blessed Sacrament took place. It was the most simple, beautiful place you can imagine. I loved going there and sitting before the Lord in the midst of a busy pilgrimage.

While I was there one day I got a sense that the Lord was speaking to me deeply within. Inside myself I heard the words 'Don't just worship me, follow me'. I remember being profoundly moved by this and all sorts of pictures went through my mind of people that I ministered too. I realised that whenever I gave of myself through loving service I was being Eucharist to others. It has affected my whole life. I have realised that we are to become what we receive, rather than just worship the Lord present in the Eucharist, as wonderful as that can be.

Maybe the invitation we are all being given is to recognise the presence of the risen Lord in our Eucharistic gathering. We are being encouraged to know that He is there in the people who gather, He is there in the Word that is proclaimed, and He is there too in the food we receive. If we can recognise Him in elements so ordinary as bread and wine, then maybe we will have the courage to recognise Him everywhere else too.

Saint Augustine said that we who are the body of Christ receive the body of Christ to become the body of Christ. What we have received we are to become so that we can feed the world with this Jesus who brings life. Eucharist was never meant to be simply about adoration. It is meant to draw us deeply into relationship with Jesus and with others.

Every time we break the bread, we identify with every brother and sister who is broken. Every time we drink from the cup, we identify with everyone who shares themselves with another. If this gift forces us into relationship with our brothers and sisters, then we can't stand by and let them suffer. We can't judge the poor and the broken. Eucharist binds us together and draws us into community.

CELEBRATING THE SAINTS

Monday - Our Lady of Walsingham

This is England's National Feast of Our Lady. Devotion to Our Lady of Walsingham dates back to an 11th Century apparition of Mary who desired a copy of the Holy House of Nazareth to be built and venerated at Walsingham. The original Norfolk shrine was destroyed at the Reformation but restored in the 19th Century. A long-time place of prayer and pilgrimage for both Catholics and Anglicans (there is now also an Orthodox Church there) Walsingham celebrates Mary as Mother of the Lord, with prayer and hope of a deeper reconciliation and unity among all Christians.

Thursday - Saint Vincent de Paul

The experience and needs of the poor turned Vincent de Paul's heart and energy to a life of care and compassion. A grumpy man by nature (by his own admission) Vincent became a gentle and loving servant of the oppressed. The Saint Vincent de Paul Society carries on his work in his name in many parishes today.

Saturday - Michael, Gabriel, Raphael and All Angels

The role and ministry of angels appears frequently in Scripture, but only Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael are named. Each of these archangels performs a different mission in God's work of our salvation: Michael protects; Gabriel announces; Raphael guides. Through today's feast we honour God the Creator of all life, visible and invisible.

► FORTHCOMING DEANERY AND PARISH CHANGES ◀

Many years ago, when the two former deaneries of Ashton-in-Makerfield and Newton-le-Willows were amalgamated, the linking of the thirteen parishes within them into one new and much larger Pastoral Area made very little sense, either geographically or pastorally, and we have been struggling with this tension ever since. With the recent move of Father Ron Johnson, the position of Dean became vacant and, after consultation with the deanery clergy, with the local deans, and with the members of the Archbishop's Council, Archbishop Malcolm has decided not to appoint a new dean but to suppress the Ashton-in-Makerfield Pastoral Area and to allocate the parishes within it to the care of the neighbouring Pastoral Areas.

With effect from the 1st of October the following changes will therefore take effect:

The parishes of The Holy Family (Platt Bridge), Saint Benedict (Hindley), Our Lady Immaculate (Bryn), Saint Wilfrid (Ashton) and Saint Oswald & Saint Edmund Arrowsmith (Ashton) will move into the Wigan Pastoral Area;

The parishes of The Sacred Heart (Hindley Green), Saint Catherine of Sienna and All Saints (Golborne and Lowton) and Saint Lewis (Croft) will move into the Leigh Pastoral Area;

The three Newton-le-Willows parishes and English Martyrs (Haydock) will move into the St. Helens Pastoral Area.

For our two parishes this will mean that Father Tony remains as Parish Priest at Holy Family but, as from the 1st of October, he will cease to be Parish Priest of Sacred Heart, Hindley Green, which will move to the priests of the Leigh Pastoral Area. Deacon Ken and Father Strowbridge will continue to provide interim pastoral care for Sacred Heart Parish over the coming weeks, but inevitably there will be some changes at Sacred Heart in the near future.


Thursday - Our Guardian Angels







ARCHDIOCESE OF LIVERPOOL SYNOD 2020 - LATEST UPDATE -

Every parish in the Archdiocese will be represented at the Synod in October 2020. Each parish priest will be a member of the Synod, together with one member of each parish. In the case of Holy Family Parish, Father Tony has invited Pearse McDonagh to serve as our delegate. Pearse will consult with parishioners, take their views and comments to the synod preparation meetings, and provide feedback to the parish from these meetings. He has already begun to get involved by attending one of the preliminary meetings held in the past few weeks.

There will also be eight additional delegates from each of the deaneries of the Archdiocese. Our delegates from the Wigan Deanery have yet to be nominated and/or chosen but will include two young people aged between 15 and 25 years, two delegates from the area of Catholic Education (Teacher Classroom Assistant, etc), one Deacon, someone involved in the Caring Services, someone with a background in Social Action (Justice and Peace, charitable outreach work, etc), and a further delegate to represent what is unique to the deanery, taking account of its ethnic and gender balance. All the delegates will be formally registered as such during December.

We'll keep you informed of further progress as it's made. But in the meantime, please hold Synod 2020 in prayer, asking for the inspiration of the Holy Spirit for its preparations, on its deliberations and in its future decisions.

FROM THE ARCHBISHOP'S DESK

There is a new and very welcome mood in Rome. It seemed that every one of the cardinals and archbishops we met, during the recent *Ad Limina* visit of the Bishops of England and Wales to Rome, shared something of themselves which we had never seen before.

One cardinal filled up with emotion when the recent canonisation of Pope St Paul VI was mentioned. Another shared something of his deep personal spirituality when talking about the celebration of Mass, and yet another revealed his powerful intellect when talking about moral and political situations that the church often finds itself in. No issues were avoided, and we were able to speak openly about the turmoil affecting the Church. There was a recognition that we can only overcome the present crisis in the Church if we leave ourselves open to each other and to the grace of the Holy Spirit. We asked for their help and they asked for ours. There was no sense of an 'us' and 'them' – we are all workers in the same vineyard, and a successful harvest depends on each of us pulling our weight.

When we met the Holy Father towards the end of our visit it became obvious that he was the source of this new way of working together. He likes to call it synodality. We were with Pope Francis for over two hours without an agenda. Conversation flowed, and he revealed his heart to us. What did we find? We encountered a man at peace. He said that this peace had been with him since his election as Pope, and it supported him through every moment of every day. It was always with him. May the Peace of Christ be with you too.

PRAYER INTENTIONS DURING ADVENT

Throughout the course of the year, the Church recommends particular intentions for us to remember in prayer. During the Season of Advent these are:

For Migrants and those forced to flee in fear of their lives from their home due to war or persecution (especially on World Migrants Day, Monday the 3rd of December); For a greater openness among Christians to the Word of God (especially on Bible Sunday, the Second Sunday of Advent, the 9th of December); For Expectant Parents (especially on the Fourth Sunday of Advent, the 23rd of December)

THE LITURGY OF ADVENT

Advent has a two-fold character, and this is reflected in the two stages of Advent, each with its own special "mood". From the First Sunday of Advent until the 16th of December, the liturgy expresses the eschatological expectation of Advent, the watchfulness of God's people looking forward to the time when Christ will come again "in glory and majesty," and "the salvation promised us will be ours." From the 17th of December until Christmas Eve, the liturgy prepares us more directly to celebrate the Lord's birth, "our hearts filled with wonder and praise."

The Christian community lives in an "interim" time between two historical events: the coming of Christ in the flesh and his coming in glory at the end of time. The Church is called to be strong in faith "as we wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ."

A CHRISTMAS MESSAGE FROM ARCHBISHOP MALCOLM

This Christmas many people are living with uncertainty. But this is nothing new. People have lived with worry and insecurity for centuries. Yet for over two thousand years we have also lived with the truth which we celebrate each Christmas Day; the truth that God became flesh for us, and for each and every one of us. The Christ child born in Bethlehem is our anchor, and our saviour. His coming brings us confidence so that we can face the future with hope.

We celebrate Christmas at the darkest time of the year. The days are short, and the nights long. But our celebrations bring light to our darkness and hope to our lives. In these days we see incredible generosity, as people reach out to others, especially to those in need. In a time of political instability, of financial worries, of foodbanks and poverty, so many are daily supporting those who most need our help. In recent weeks, donations to local foodbanks have increased as people give help to those most in need at this time of year; those who have plenty, supporting those with so little.

Jesus was born in poverty, in a stable, in the dark, open to the cold. His first visitors were not friends and family, or people that Mary and Joseph knew; they were strangers - shepherds from the surrounding hillside summoned by angels, and wise men from the east who followed a star, bringing gifts for the new-born king. Stars don't just lead us, but remind us of the creative power of God and his presence in our lives. God is with us in the star that shines in our hearts. God became one of us because we matter. Jesus, the true Light, has come into our lives to give us real hope, because each one of us matters. This is not just wishful thinking.

Jesus, the Light of the World, shows us the way out of the despair of poverty, and of instability, and of the gloom of the seasons, to a brighter future ahead. We believe that the child born in Bethlehem will guide us and support us, and that makes our festivities worthwhile.

We buy presents for our families and friends; we decorate our homes and offices and churches; and we travel long distances so that we can be with the people whom we love most, reminding us of God's love for us.

Let us, then, pray for peace in our world, and in our lives, echoing the song of the angels: 'Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to people of goodwill.'

BLESS YOUR CHRISTMAS CRIB AND BEGIN CHRISTMAS AT HOME

All of us, but maybe especially children, love the trappings of Christmas, with its brightly decorated tree and layers of decorations around the house. But do you also have a nativity scene in your home? If so, you may wish to gather round it, maybe on Christmas Eve, to begin the Christmas Feast at home before later coming to church to celebrate the Mass of Christmas. The following short Service of Blessing a Nativity Scene, taken from *Catholic Household Blessings and Prayers*, could be used on that occasion.

One of those present, maybe one of the children, reads a passage from Scripture, for example, the Christmas Gospel (Luke 2:1-14) or the promise of the birth of Emmanuel, God-With-Us (Isaiah 7:10-14) or even the richly theological opening prologue of Saint John's Gospel (John 1:1-14).

Following the scripture reading, one of the adults prays the following Prayer of Blessing: "God of every nation and people, from the very beginning of creation you have made manifest your love for us: When our need for a Saviour was great, you sent your Son to be born of the Virgin Mary. To our lives he brings joy and peace, justice, mercy, and love. Lord, bless all who look upon this nativity scene; may it remind us of the humble birth of Jesus, and raise our thoughts to him, who is God-with-us and Saviour of all, and who lives and reigns forever and ever. R/. Amen."

The Service of Blessing could conclude with the whole family joining in singing, or listening to, a Christmas Carol.
