## ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

March 1971

March 20, 1971

The annual town meeting was called to order by the Moderator, Horace C. Weston at 10:07 A.M. By unanimous approval of the meeting, the warrant was not read.

The Moderator appointed the following persons as tellers and administered the oath of office to them:

Article 2. On the motion of Lawrence B. Westgate voted: that the reports of the town officers as printed in the 1970 town report be accepted.

Article 3. Manuel P. Souza moved that the salaries of the several elected officers of the town be retroactive to January 1, 1971 and be fixed as follows:

(f) One non-flashing sign for each family residing on the premises indicating the name of the owner or occupant or pertaining to a permitted accessory use, provided that each such sign does not exceed one square foot in area.

(g) One non-flashing sign not over nine square feet in area pertaining to permitted buildings, structures, and uses of the premises other than dwellings and their accessory uses.

(h) Unlighted directional signs not exceeding five square feet in area pertaining to churches, schools, institutions, and other public or non-profit uses.

and to further amend Article XVII by adding the following Sections 7 and 8 and renumbering the existing and remaining paragraphs accordingly:

Section 8. One exterior sign with an area not exceeding twelve square feet shall be erected on any non-conforming building or use.

## Report of the Board of Selectmen

It is with a deep appreciation of the dedication of the many people who make our Town operate successfully that we write this report of our activities for 1971. We would like to thank them all. We hope, too, they and many others will continue to be interested and active in Town affairs.

During 1971 it was necessary for the Board to call one Special Town Meeting at the request of the Planning Board. It was voted at this meeting on June 21, 1971 to accept a new Zoning By-Law which became effective on October 14, 1971. We expect this By-Law will be helpful in promoting a healthy and orderly growth of our Town.

The population in Kingston has increased by some 20 per cent within a five-year period and would appear to grow at this rate during the next few years. With this growth comes the added obligation to provide the necessary services which our people expect. This condition requires more personnel and money for Town Government to do its job properly.

We are faced with proposals to provide more school space at both the elementary and secondary school levels. We are very well aware of the needs. The question is to find the best solution. On the elementary level we think a new school is necessary. The Elementary School Building Committee hopes to have a concrete proposal ready early in 1972.

The need for more space at the regional level is recognized by all. However, a permanent solution is much more difficult to find. We feel the best answer is for the Town of Pembroke to withdraw and provide its own junior and senior high school. This would allow the remaining towns to continue as a region which would be less cumbersome. Hopefully, this solution will be a reality in the near future.

The Board is in the process of trying to withdraw from the Southeastern Regional Planning and Economic Development District because we do not feel that the District is doing anything for the Town. We are grouped with the cities of Taunton, Fall River, New Bedford and Attleboro, along with some 26 other towns with whom we have no common interests. To us it seems the State Legislature needed quantity rather than quality in its mandate to form this District.

We have this year, been able to secure insurance on all Town Buildings from a company outside the Fair Plan. The coverage is better, and the cost is less. This policy became effective on December 27, 1971. We wish to thank Mr. Orfeo Sgarzi and Mr. Edward Warnsman for their assistance in helping us in this endeavor.

During the latter part of 1971 funds under the Emergency Employment Act became available to the Town. This is a federal program to provide employment for unemployed and underemployed workers. It is funded for two years by the Federal Government. The Board felt the best use for our share of these funds would be in the areas of youth services and public works. Accordingly, we have hired a Director of Youth Programs to work with our Youth Commission and an additional employee to work with the Highway Department.

The Selectmen have been in contact with the Division of Waterways who are working on a program to develop the mooring area and channel of Jones River. The Waterfront Committee will work out the best program and will present their recommendations in the near future. We think this valuable natural resource should be improved to the fullest extent.

Problems of many kinds were encountered by your Board. Many hearings were held, and many meetings were attended either individually or in a group. We have been involved in a variety of interesting situations. We feel we have done our best to represent the Town and to help solve the Town's problems. Our primary objective has been to act for the best interests of all our Townspeople.

The Board would like to extend its gratitude to all who have been most helpful and cooperative during the year 1971.

**GENERAL REPORT FOR 1971**

His keeping of the records over those years will always show by their quality of the great interest that he had for his town. We feel the citizens of the town join with us in saying "thanks, Francis, for a job well done!" The Board of Assessors met with the Selectmen on April 20th and appointed Mr. Robert R. Barbieri to fill the vacancy until the next annual town election in March, 1972.

With the submission of this report, your Assessors would like to call the attention of all of our townspeople that this year in the annual town meeting warrant, will be an article (by petition) for the revaluation of the town to so-called 100 per cent or Full and Fair Market Value. We have spent many hours talking over this project and after receiving bids we find that we must have the amount of \$ 42,000.00 to do a complete revaluation the way it should be done. At the time of this report the board plans to hold a public meeting so that those who wish to have the town revalued may present their views and those who do not may also express their views. The board will present the facts at this meeting as to what it means to the town and to the homeowners. We urge all citizens to study revaluation so that at the town meeting you will be ready to vote for what you will believe to be for the best interest of the town.

We wish, further, to call your attention to this fact: your Assessors set the tax rate, but they are only acting as your agents. If large expenditures are made, your taxes must necessarily be high. You determine what your taxes must be by your votes at town meeting. Please bear these facts in mind.

Our thanks to all departments within the town for their help and consideration during the past year.

## Report of the Planning Board

The year of 1971 could be termed as one of change and increased activity as far as the Planning Board was concerned.

The change was two-fold as the Board began working with a completely revised and up-dated set of Planning Board Regulations adopted in November, 1970 and Zoning By-laws adopted in mid-1971. These changes were a direct result of recommendations made in the Comprehensive Plan for Kingston, better known as the "Master Plan," which was completed in late 1970.

A physical change also occurred in the Board with the appointment of Herbert F. Macy, Jr. and Robert D. Sgarzi to fill vacancies created by the resignations of Roger C. Sturtevant and Harvey C. LeSueur, respectively. Mrs. Sandra Boermeester was hired as recording secretary.

The activities of the Planning Board increased to some degree over and above the usual town meeting associated business (street acceptance and zoning change hearings and recommendations), and membership on various committees (Town Government Study Committee, Southeastern Planning District, etc).

Lot approval and subdivision activity was also on the upswing with the following results:

51 Lots Approved under "subdivision control not required".

124 Lots Approved in subdivisions;

88 Lots under consideration.

There were approximately 358 lots in subdivisions either under construction, approved or under consideration by the Board as of the end of 1971. The figures above represent the largest number of lots ever considered by the Kingston Planning Board in one calendar year.

Our annual thanks go to Town Clerk, George W. Cushman who continues as our agent and is available between meetings to assist those who have business with the Board.

## Report of Ad Hoc Committee

December 13, 1971

To the Honorable Boards of Selectmen and the townspeople of Halifax, Kingston, Pembroke and Plympton:

### REPORT OF AD HOC COMMITTEE

The Ad Hoc Committee was established in March 1971 and composed of members of the boards of selectmen, finance committees and school committees of the towns in the Silver Lake Regional School District — Halifax, Kingston, Pembroke and Plympton. Each of the four towns voted at town meeting to authorize its selectmen, school committee and other appropriate officials to develop and present at a later date specific proposals to effect Pembroke's withdrawal from the regional school district, said plans to include tentative agreements for distribution of the capital assets of the district.

The committee held many meetings during the spring, summer and fall of 1971 to explore differing points of view, to study the educational report of Dr. George J. Collins, and to arrive at mutual agreements.

It was the unanimous consensus of the committee that Pembroke, already comprising over 50 per cent of the student enrollment in the regional district, would continue to enroll more students than the three other towns combined. Since Pembroke's per-pupil population has doubled in the past 10 years and projected to double in the next 10 years, this growing town would be able to support its own school system equal to the district's and, at the same time, through withdrawal, relieve the pressure to build additional facilities in the remaining region. It was also felt that the regional school system was growing too large, and that the individual student in such an extensive system loses his identity.

A tremendous amount of work and negotiations are required to develop acceptable agreements for withdrawal. None of this time for study, preparation, negotiation and approval should prolong the planning and construction of needed school facilities. The Ad Hoc Committee agreed with Dr. Collins' recommendations to proceed with Phase One of the building program to construct an addition to the senior high school in Kingston and to build a new high school in Pembroke. In the meantime, the committee recommended that the Silver Lake Regional School Committee study the feasibility and long-range educational, sociological and economic benefits from

organizing the Silver Lake Regional School District with Halifax, Kingston and Plympton and organizing a separate district for Pembroke. It will be necessary for the school committee to take 22 legal steps to implement this withdrawal.

Tentative agreements for distribution of the capital assets, as well as proposals to rectify past inequities, should be postponed until Phase One of the building program has been initiated. Such a distribution will be part of the overall agreement on withdrawal.

The Ad Hoc Committee made formal recommendations to the Regional School Committee and to the townspeople of the four regional towns. These recommendations follow:

1. **RECOMMENDED:** That the Silver Lake Regional School Committee take the 22 steps necessary for withdrawal of a town from the region, as outlined in Dr. Collins' report, Cost Models Recommendations Part II, pp. 32-34, to prepare for the future withdrawal of Pembroke, and in the meantime, to proceed with Phase One of the building program regarding an addition to the present senior high school in Kingston and the construction of a new senior high school in Pembroke.

This recommendation was voted unanimously.

2. **RECOMMENDED:** That there should be no set figure in the regional school agreement regarding a radius within which a school construction project must be built. The radius figure of a mile and a half should be deleted from the agreement.

This recommendation was voted unanimously.

3. **RECOMMENDED:** That the Silver Lake Regional School District agreement be amended to provide a more equitable proportion on the Regional School Committee. Composition of the committee should be based on the following, with each town entitled to:

- a. A minimum of two members;
- b. one additional member in any year, provided the town has more than 200 pupils enrolled in the district;
- c. one additional elected member in any year, provided the town has more than 1000 pupils enrolled in the district;
- d. one additional elected member in any year, provided

the town has more than 2000 pupils enrolled in the district.

This recommendation was voted in favor, 9-1.

4. RECOMMENDED: That future construction assessment be based on an average of the following two factors:

a. the increase of per cent of students from the last construction program to the current year (i.e. 1966-71, 1966-72, etc.);

b. the per cent of students enrolled annually.

This recommendation was voted in favor, 8-0, with one member abstaining.

Averaging the current enrollment percentages with the percentage increase since 1966, our figures show the following proportions: Halifax 18.3, Kingston 28.8, Pembroke 43.7 and Plympton 4.2.

The Ad Hoc Committee would like to thank Dr. George J. Collins, educational consultant, for the many hours he met with the committee to discuss various problems, and to thank the Halifax Board of Selectmen for providing facilities for the meetings.

## Report of the Chief of Police

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Honorable Board of Selectmen

Gentlemen:

The report of the activities of the Police Department is respectfully submitted for the year ending December 31, 1971.

You will observe in the statistics that follow, that this department answered 7,091 complaints in 1971. It is interesting to note that there were 5,000 more complaints answered than in any previous year. Having the station manned 24 hours a day has been responsible for the increase. I am sure it is a great satisfaction for our citizens to know that when they have occasion to call this station, that an officer is available to assist and tend to their needs.

By the time this report is distributed to the residents of our Town, all of the new officers of this department will have been trained at the various Police Academies in accordance with the General Laws. All of the regular, full-time police officers on this department have had the advantage of the Police Academy Training School. While on the subject of schools, I am pleased to announce that several officers of this department are attending schools on their own time to further their education in Law Enforcement and related subjects, thereby accumulating credits toward an Associate Degree in Law. Their attendance at these schools has in no way interfered with their regularly scheduled police assignments. I have sent officers of this department to specialized training schools in the subjects of: Safety, Narcotics, Fingerprinting, Prosecution and Juvenile Prevention, and feel that the training that they have received has been an asset to the function of this department. It is my intention, as these specialized training programs are announced, to continue to send officers to these most important training courses.

It is planned this year to have a K-9 dog as a "member" of this department. This dog on occasion will work in the cruisers with an officer specially trained to handle this type of dog. The value of such an animal to any police department is difficult to measure. This dog has been trained by one man and will be used to aid in search and rescue work along with the ever important duty of "flushing out" would-be suspects at burglary scenes. The addition of this dog to the Kingston Police Department should be an important deterrent to crime in this community.

The number of "housebreaks" in our town has increased this past year and it is interesting to note that most of these "breaks" have occurred during the daylight hours. With this knowledge, it is more important than ever to alert this department and your neighbor when you will be away for any period of time, in order that we may check any unusual activities in or around your home or business. Note the registration numbers of cars or trucks that may be in your neighbor's yard. Observe the clothing, and description of so-called salesmen and repairmen who are calling on these unoccupied homes. I cannot stress the importance of calling the police when something unusual is observed rather than waiting until the following morning, or after you have learned of a "housebreak" at your neighbor's home. When going on vacation, advise this department when you are leaving and when you expect to return, and we will be most happy to check your home and property while you are gone.

The Kingston Police Officers Association has purchased from their own funds, an electric engraving instrument, for the use of our residents free of charge. This instrument can be used for identification in marking radios, TVs, lawnmowers, power tools, bicycles and many other appliances or pieces of equipment desired and should be of material aid in the identification of any item stolen from your home. It is available at this station and may be used by anyone at anytime by calling for it here. It is most surprising how many people are unable to identify their own property after a recovery of stolen merchandise. Your own identification mark on your personal property will make our job easier and most helpful in the prosecution of cases in court. Avail yourself of the use of this instrument.

The use of the Radar equipment purchased this past year has been used on the speed-zoned roads in town very effectively. I feel sure that once the word gets around that Kingston is Radar patrolled, that the traffic will slow down considerably and make our town a safer place in which to live.

The two walkie-talkie Portable Radios purchased from Federal Funds have been used successfully in surveillance work and "stakeouts." The value of this equipment cannot be over-emphasized.

In 1971, this department investigated 122 motor vehicle accidents. Of these, two were fatal accidents, one victim was a pedestrian, the other a driver, and both occurred on Rte. 3 Expressway. In the investigation of these accidents, excessive speed, inattention or the use of liquor was determined to have been the cause in most cases. It is my opinion that the recent installation of the overhead flashing warning lights at the intersection of Rtes. 106,

71 and Evergreen Street will be helpful in reducing accidents at this ever dangerous intersection.

I have made an earnest effort, to no avail, at two recent Town Meetings for the appropriation of funds to purchase an additional cruiser with radio equipment for the use of this department. I am once again seeking funds to purchase this vehicle at the Annual Town Meeting, and hope that I will have the support of the Finance Committee and our citizens in this effort. If and when either of the two vehicles we now have are for some reason out of service for any length of time, our patrols are reduced and our coverage limited.

My sincere thanks to Mrs. Jean Donovan, the School Traffic Supervisor for the effective job that she is doing taking care of our young people at the Elementary School Crossing; to Mr. Robert Mulliken our Civil Defense Director and to Mrs. Irma Ruffini, the Town Accountant and her staff for the help they have given me in the year past.

My thanks and appreciation to the Board of Selectmen for their support, understanding and cooperation during the past year, and I anticipate that 1972 will find a continuation of that same support, cooperation and understanding.

## Report of the Fire Engineers

The following is the report of the Board of Fire Engineers for the year 1971.

The ever-increasing traffic on the expressway is causing more and more problems with accidents and automobile fires.

A tropical storm in August gave the department several busy hours as the Rescue Boat was called twice to remove persons from overturned boats in the bay. Also, trucks had to stand by as there were many fallen wires on various town highways.

What seemed to be a good year in regard to structural fires soon changed when an early morning fire levelled a large building on Brookdale Avenue owned by Robert Davison, and operated as a baling plant for wood shavings by the Bridgewater Farm Supply Company. Due to the type of contents many truck and man hours were used to achieve complete extinguishment.

Inasmuch as Bomb Scares are continuing to show in our reports this might be a good time to print the new act of legislation that took effect December 15, 1971:

"Section 14, Chapter 269 of the General Laws as amended: Whoever knowing the same to be false, transmits or causes to be transmitted to any person by telephone or other means, a communication falsely reporting the location of an explosive or other dangerous substance or contrivance thereby causing anxiety, fear or personal discomfort to a person or group of persons, shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison for not more than twenty years, or by imprisonment in a jail or house of correction for not more than two and one-half years, or by a fine of not more than ten thousand dollars, or by both such fine or imprisonment in a jail or house of correction."

To help protect the apartment dweller, legislation is now pending to require the owners of such buildings to install sprinkler and heat detection systems.

During the year Amelio E. Ruffini, a willing and interested member of the call company, retired after serving the town for twenty-nine years.

Station and apparatus appear to be in condition for another year, but much thought should be given to the possibility of a sub-station in the westerly part of the town to afford that fast-growing

area better fire protection; also, thought should be given to the replacement of the 1954 International pumping engine.

## Report of the Forest Fires Department

The number of woods and brush fires increased sharply, partially due to a problem with children in a certain area of the town. However, through the assistance of the Police Department, this situation appears to be under control.

The new Dodge Brushbreaker was put into service in October. The installation of a fiber-glass tank eliminated the rust problem and the water capacity was increased by 100 gallons.

Several overgrown woods roads were cleared, the most important being West of the Monks Hill Tower from Camp Ne-Kon at Smelt Pond to the Nicks Rock Road at the Plymouth Line.

As more and more dwellings are being built in or near wooded areas, it would be a good policy for those owners to cut the lower limbs of their trees to a height of four feet to slow down any fire that might occur.

During the early part of the year there were some problems at the Town Dump. This condition has been corrected by the Board of Health and the Highway Department to a point where we only have fires when someone is careless with matches or smoking material in the paper pile.

When the burning laws went into effect the townspeople were very cooperative but there are still a few cases of illegal burning. When the observer in the Monks Hill Tower spots smoke, a truck must be sent to investigate, causing the taxpayer additional expense.

## Report of the Director of Civil Defense

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The direction shown by Civil Defense during 1971, nationally, has been as in the past several years, toward a greater assistance to local populations hit by disasters, both natural and man-made. However, judging from directives and information sent from national headquarters, the idea of nuclear attack upon the United States remains in the picture. Major planning to reduce casualties in such an event goes on, even if not widely known to the general public.

In Kingston during 1971, six official trips were made to the Taunton surplus warehouse. To date, since a CD director was first appointed, this office has acquired a wide variety of items, valued at over \$31,000. Many of these items have proved useful to the Highway Department; others have been assigned to the Police and Fire Departments as well as to our own CD organization. All represent substantial savings to the taxpayers of Kingston. We are hoping to obtain a 2½-ton truck for the Highway Department this year, under a new Federal Loan Agreement.

The auxiliary police unit under Captain Louis W. Nogueira has given over 600 hours of volunteer duty. We feel that the present auxiliary unit is able to assist our regular force whenever called. We are always most appreciative of assistance given us by Chief Goonan and his men.

We are in the process of improving our local radio communications, chiefly by servicing three FM transceivers purchased at greatly reduced prices. These sets can operate as emergency units on the town municipal frequency, thus eliminating much of the heavy interference from citizen's band operations over which we have no control. We thank Loren St. Onge and Paul Tura for their assistance in readying these transceivers.

The Sectors 2A and 2B radio net continues to operate a monthly drill, and Vernon Cushman handles Kingston's assignments most effectively. This monthly warning test of CD alertness initiated by the state agency has finally got on the right track, and is being forwarded correctly to the Kingston Fire Department, our local warning point. We thank Chief West and his men for this assistance.

Actually, one of the pleasing observations noted over several years in this office is the willingness of those in our town government to provide assistance to us when possible, and we hope that even with the rapid growth of the town such friendly atmosphere will continue.

## Report of the Conservation Commission

The Conservation Commission, during 1971, has considered possible areas for future acquisition in its desire to provide open space for the different geographical areas of Kingston. Consideration has been given to growth projections as suggested by the professional planners in considering areas both suitable and available.

We feel that with Sampson Common and Memorial Forest near the geographical center and Patuxet Park near the South end we have good advantage. To all intents and purposes the 150 acres in the State Forest adjacent to Route 80 provides good open space for the southwest areas of town, assuming of course that the Commonwealth never disposes of the land for purposes other than the present forest.

Kingston, through the legacy of Edna B. Maglathlin, has been given 22 acres off Lake Street in the northwest section of town. This area certainly would be valuable open space, and it is hoped that future plans for the area, notably in fulfilling the income-producing stipulations in the Will, do not wipe out the already built-in space advantage.

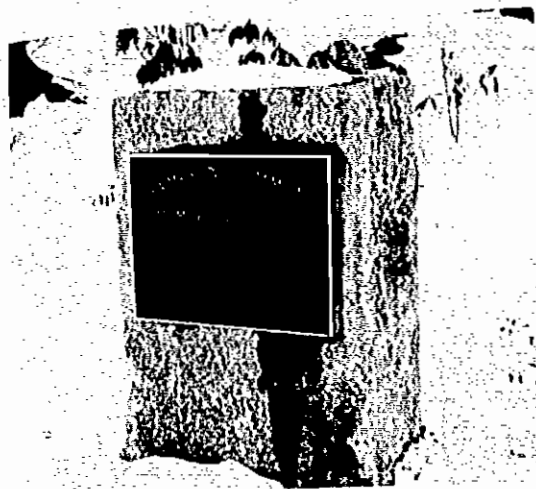
During the past year the Commonwealth of Massachusetts has been putting great emphasis on acquisition and preservation of wetlands, both coastal and inland. In this direction the Commission has acquired 10 acres in Blackwater Swamp, and hopes to acquire an additional 15 acres adjoining, to give Kingston this ecologically important open space.

In 1971 we had hoped to give serious consideration to acquiring approximately 30 acres in the Bay Farm property adjacent to the waterfront. However, in consideration of the high dollar cost, this project was shelved.

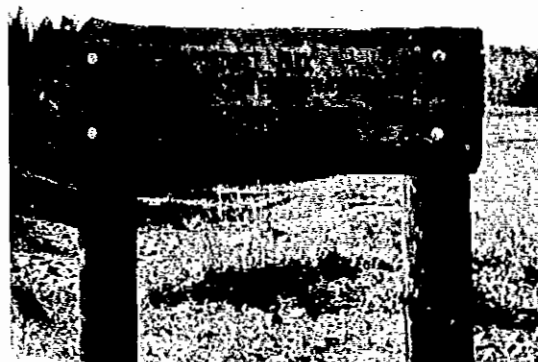
We give sincere thanks to all those townspeople who have supported the Commission's efforts and hope we can continue to justify such support.

## Report of the Board of Health

The activities of your local Board of Health for the year 1971 again show an increase in all areas under its jurisdiction.

The Board has maintained an active and diligent approach to all applications for new dwellings, viewing the sites, reviewing the various Tests, and contracting soil analyses and engineering studies as deemed necessary prior to granting approval for the applications as pertains to the Board. A request will be made at the annual Town Meeting for the purchase of a soil survey service of the Town of Kingston. This survey will be a valuable asset to the Town. Your support for this article is requested at Town Meeting.

Bacteriological analyses of the bathing areas in the town were made periodically during the summer months. Samples collected were tested by the State Department of Public Health, and in all cases the areas tested were considered safe for bathing purposes.

The services of the Plymouth Community Nurse Association were contracted again this year; a report in detail of the services provided will be found as a separate item of this Town Report.

The citizens of the town are reminded that communicable diseases and dog bites are reported to the local Board of Health who, in accordance with the General Laws, must submit the information to the State Department of Public Health. We ask your cooperation in submitting the required information as soon as possible whenever applicable.

Site preparation is still in progress at the town dump. This operation is now 100 per cent sanitary landfill. Fortunately, the present site of the dump affords ample fill for many future years. The dump has been inspected periodically by the Department of Public Health. Deficiencies as brought to our attention have been corrected with the exception of having a heavy piece of equipment on site at all times, and having available a detailed engineering study of our plan of operation at the dump site. The engineering study is under way and should be completed soon. The heavy piece of equipment will be the subject of an article at the annual Town Meeting again this year.

The hours of the Town Dump are:

Summer — April 25 to Nov. 8 — Mon.-Fri. 10-6.

Winter — Nov. 8 to April 25 — 8-5 everyday.

Dump stickers are available at all times from the caretaker at the dump at no charge.

We extend to all Town officials, department personnel and citizens our appreciation for their assistance and cooperation.

## Report of the Inspector of Animals

Recent years have witnessed a profound change in the makeup of our animal population. There has been a marked decrease in the number of cattle, with a corresponding rise in the number of riding horses in town. This reflects a change in the basic makeup of our community from what was formerly semi-rural, to exurbanite.

Twenty-nine dogs were quarantined, during the year, on suspicion of rabies because of bites imposed. However, all of these dogs were released after the customary ten days observation period, inasmuch as no signs of rabies appeared. Reports of the foregoing cases were forwarded to the State authorities.

The annual census of animals within the town was completed and the report forwarded to the Division of Animal Health.

I wish to thank Mrs. Irma Ruffini and the members of the Board of Health for their cooperation in organizing these inspections.

## Report of the Plymouth Community Nurse Association

To the Honorable Boards of Selectmen  
and Health

Town of Kingston

The Annual Nursing Service Report of the Plymouth Community Nurse Association, for the year 1971, is herewith submitted.

The PCNA continues to serve the residents of Plymouth, Kingston and Duxbury, by providing skilled nursing care in the home, under the direction of a physician. A contract with the Easter Seal Society enables our patients to have physical therapy, speech therapy and occupational therapy at home. The Plymouth-Brockton Homemaker Service has been most cooperative in supplying Home Health Aides and Homemakers when needed. We encourage patients to come to our office for treatments if they are able.

An active plan of health promotion and communicable disease control is carried out by the PCNA, in each of the three communities served. Our maternal and child health program includes antepartum classes, postpartum and newborn classes at the Jordan Hospital, home visits to mothers of first babies, and continuing follow-up home visits if necessary. A Well Child Conference, staffed by a pediatrician, three nurses and three volunteers, is conducted every month but August, in each of the three towns. Immunizations and TB skin tests are offered at these conferences.

Tuberculosis control is effected by skin testing programs. Those persons with a positive reaction, are followed at the monthly Chest X-ray Clinic, which is staffed by the physicians at Plymouth County Hospital and our nurses. Other communicable diseases are referred to our agency by the local health departments; the PCNA nurses then make home visits to follow through.

The PCNA participates actively in the coordinated care program at the Jordan Hospital. This discharge planning is a cooperative effort of the physicians, Medical Social Worker, nursing staff, physiotherapy department of the hospital, the Easter Seal therapist who would see the patient at home, and the public health nurse. These daily visits by the PCNA nurse to the hospital, help to promote a smooth transition of the patient, from hospital to home.

During the year a total of 1,737 visits were made to patients in Kingston, by the PCNA nurses. 387 of these were made in behalf of the Kingston Board of Health. The nursing service breakdown is as follows:

Eleven Well Child Conferences were held in Kingston in 1971. A total of 291 infants and preschool children were seen and examined by our WCC pediatrician; 110 TB skin tests were applied, and 369 various immunizations were given at these conferences.

Ten Chest X-ray Clinics were held at the Jordan Hospital. Of the 274 persons X-rayed and examined, eight were Kingston residents.

On November 3, in cooperation with the Kingston School Department, our nurses assisted with the Heaf testing (TB skin-testing) program, held at the Kingston Elementary Schools. Approximately 200 students received the skin test.

In addition to the above statistics, sixty-two physical therapy, two occupational therapy and 278 Home Health Aide visits were made to patients in Kingston.



We continue to be certified as a Home Health Agency by the State Department of Public Health and HEW, and comply with the regulations under Medicare as set by the Social Security Administration.

We wish to thank the Kingston Board of Selectmen, the Kingston Board of Health, Board of Public Welfare and the many friends and members of the PCNA, for their cooperation and support.

## Report of the Plymouth County Mosquito Control Project

Concern for the environment has again been a factor in the Project's activities this past year. Our continued efforts will be to consider the problems of pollution and ecology while carrying out an effective mosquito control program. Obviously, indiscriminate mass applications of hard pesticides by aircraft or ground equipment is a thing of the past. By carefully following control outlines, provided by the entomologist for the State Reclamation Board, as well as the University of Massachusetts, the Project has been able to provide adequate mosquito control in almost every area of the county.

Logically, reduction in mosquito population can best be accomplished before the mosquito becomes a flying adult. We, therefore, direct a substantial amount of monies into eliminating or controlling breeding areas. This is carried out by water management, trenching and clearing waterways, especially those that have become polluted or stagnant.

This past year throughout the county, approximately 14,505 man hours were spent working in the field. Included in this were 5,028 hours in spraying, applying a total of 20,173 gallons of spray material. 1,464 hours were given to pre-hatch, larviciding and inspection work. In addition, 4,320 catch basins were treated.

As indicated, water management is an important part of the Project's work. With attention being given to problem areas, our two backhoes worked 1,504 hours with a total of 29,755 feet of trenching. Field crews spent 5,099 hours clearing 36,345 feet of clogged streams and ditches.

Prime consideration is always given to those areas prone to Eastern equine encephalitis. Three cases were reported in the county last year. Secondly, those sections known to have a high mosquito producing potential are considered.

The following is a brief summary of the Project's activities in your town: 166 hours were spent applying 655 gallons of spray material, 100 hours in pre-hatch and inspection, 96 hours clearing and cleaning 300 feet of ditches, primarily in the Gray's Beach and Rocky Nook section. The Project also supervised the aerial spray for greenhead fly control.

We have attempted to come close to the actual assessment of 2.900 per cent, which is Kingston's share of the Project's appropriation.

We express our appreciation for the assistance of the various town departments.

Free bulletins are available to the Plymouth County residents, and visitors are welcome to avail themselves of the literature on display between the hours of eight a.m. and four p.m., Monday through Friday. A few of the most popular bulletins are: Lawn Care, Backyard Gardening, Insect Control, Nutrition and Home Canning.

Soil samples tested this year tripled in number over those examined last year, and in order to improve this free service it is hopefully anticipated that new equipment will be acquired next spring.

In 1972, an advisory council composed of all town directors will be formed and their purpose will be to improve our educational services to the residents of Plymouth County.

Our 4-H program is part of the Extension Service that is familiar to most people in this area. In Kingston we have one of the most active 4-H programs in the county, and we have enthusiastically participated in many events and activities. These included Achievement Night, Fishing Derby, Roller Skating Party, 4-H Sunday, Kingston Fair, County Fairs, Camp Farley, County Workshops, Leaders' Supper, Window Exhibit Contest, County Demonstration Day and Auction.

The following town committee members and leaders should be commended for their assistance in participating and supervising the local 4-H Club activities. These are: Shirley Cavacco, Chairman; Viola Cretinon, Co-Chairman; Vicky Heath, Secretary; William Heath, Treasurer.

## Report of the Highway Department

Early Spring signals the beginning of sweeping the town-accepted roads of the winter sand and debris. Unsuccessful attempts in previous years to have the town purchase their own sweeper, necessitates the use of rented equipment in this work. Following this, patching was done on the various streets wherever necessary. The following roads were sealed: Winter Street, Brookdale Avenue, Pine Street and part of South Street and a portion of Wapping Road.

Resurfacing applications of Type I Bituminous Concrete paver mix were placed on Nelson Street, Mayflower Street, Brightside Avenue and May Avenue. The following streets required rebuilding: Joseph Street, Peters Lane and Holmes Avenue.

Drainage systems were installed on Jones River Drive, Pembroke Street, South Street, Indian Pond Road, Winthrop Street, West Street and Elm Street.

Under the annual Chapter 90 programs, Type I Bituminous Concrete paver mix was placed on Brook Street and Pembroke Street.

Sidewalks were installed on portions of Landing Road, Green Street, Evergreen Street and Howland's Lane.

The time element at the Town Dump continues to increase. Again this year the Board of Health accepted a bid for rental of supplemental equipment in an honest attempt to comply with State regulations regarding land-filled dumps. The no-burning law has increased the use of the rented equipment to properly cover the rubbish which is daily brought to the dump.

In October the town lost the capable services of the custodian of the dump, Antone S. Cavacco, who very suddenly passed away. The Board of Health subsequently filled the vacancy with the permanent appointment of Elmir C. Margeson, who previously ably covered the position during days off and vacations of Mr. Cavacco.

I wish to express my appreciation to those owners of trucks and equipment who have faithfully assisted this department during snowstorms. The town is fortunate to have these men who are capable and willing to render service when called upon.

Late this year the Highway Department was able to hire a much-needed employee. The salary for this laborer and light equipment operator is funded by the Federal Government under the Emergency Employment Act.

A special note of appreciation is extended to the men of my department for their loyalty, cooperation and assistance, and to all departments and citizens of the town for their support.

## Report of the Frederic C. Adams Public Library

With the addition of 1,831 new books, the number of volumes in the Library has increased to 26,134. The Recording Collection has been expanded by 33 new discs, making a total number of 372.

Many new residents are moving into the community, and 513 of them have registered as borrowers at the Library during the year.

"Friday at four" has been reserved as time for the Pre-School Story Hour conducted by Nancy Faunce Haslett. Since July, when this program began, through December, 129 children have attended. All children between the ages three through five are invited to come to this weekly gathering.

During 1971, total circulation of materials was 50,988. Over the last five years, the total annual circulation of Library materials has increased by more than 13,000.

## Report of the Youth Commission

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This being the first year that the Commission has been established, it was difficult for us to develop an effective program for the town. After several Commission meetings, and also meeting with the Rockland Youth Commission and the Kingston Selectmen, we developed some insight as to what programs and activities we should pioneer. It was our decision to hire a Youth Director and meet with the Fresh Start group and its advisor, Mr. James Fortini. At a joint meeting with several members of Fresh Start and Mr. Fortini, the organization of the group was discussed together with their programs and the development of a proposed Drop-In Center. Also discussed were plans for raising funds for renovation of the former Patuxet School, privately owned by Charles M. McAndrews, who very generously offered the group the use of the building. It was concluded that approximately \$1,800.00 would be required for the necessary renovations. Also needed are funds for the purchase of insurance. At this writing the Fresh Start group has started to obtain funds for the foregoing purpose.

After interviewing several applicants for the position of Youth Director, our Commission accepted the application of Mr. David J. Britton from Plymouth. It was our feeling that Mr. Britton had the best qualifications for the position. He has already started his duties and has many projects planned. Mr. Britton is employed under the Emergency Employment Act and his salary is being funded by Federal monies. Following this report is that of the Youth Director.

We look forward to the New Year and anticipate many new things to assist the youth in the town to become good citizens. The Commission extends their thanks to the town officials and personnel, together with the youth and adults of Kingston, for their help and support.

## Report of the Director of the Youth Program

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I am very pleased with the opportunity given to me by this position. Coordinating the youth activities of the town, assessing the needs of the young people and developing youth programs which will meet those needs in ways appropriate to our changing times, are challenging tasks ahead.

On the plus side I have the willingness of the young people to work to raise the quality of their lives in Kingston and the necessary funds from the voters of the town to help them to do this. On the debit side, finding space and facilities for activities may present problems. All facilities are already in considerable demand, and any new youth programs will have to work hard to make or find space for themselves.

Concrete programs I anticipate in the next year, subject to finding interested youth, are a regular film series on weekends, various group trips to places of interest such as skiing, concerts, sports events and swimming; regular arts and crafts workshops, educational programs of various types including drug education, and a variety of sports activities for all ages. It is my hope to begin mailing out a news bulletin of youth activities to facilitate cooperation and smooth relations between groups.

I am confident that creative productive activities involving the young people in the life of their town, will serve a preventative function as well as making the youth happier and enriching them. Delinquency, drug abuse and the other youth problems chronic in our culture are the symptoms of boredom, alienation and lack of values. In meaningful "relevant" involvement, these latter are not possible, and as they go, they take their symptoms with them.

It will not be an easy task, however, with support of the community I believe the Kingston Youth Program can become a model of their kind for towns facing similar youth problems.

## Partial Report of the Kingston Elementary School Building Committee

Your committee has continued to meet weekly to develop the most economical proposal to meet the total educational needs of our community. During 1971 we thoroughly explored the many possible ways of fulfilling the two site options in the educational specifications of the Kingston School Committee; Option II, to provide space for total educational needs at the present Elementary School site, and Option I, to build at a separate site.

In summary, the committee, under the able leadership of Warren M. Axford, investigated three major types of construction and voted to hire as architects David M. Crawley Associates because of their familiarity with the "Systems" building components which create a flexible, modular building quickly erected on site and readily adaptable to changes in educational needs and philosophy. (The inside partitions, light, heat, and ventilation units are movable and arrive at the site pre-assembled). Possible sites were narrowed down to three, which were tested for drainage and analyzed by the architects. The MacFarlane farm between Pembroke Street and Wapping Road was favorably voted upon.

In June, 1971, Chairman Axford, Janet I. Wojtowicz and Hadley R. LeClair resigned. Re-appointments were not completed until October when Richard V. Humphrey, Manuel F. Pacheco and Robert R. Raimondi joined Lilius F. Cingolani and Raymond R. Chaves on the committee.

After an intensive review of site, development, construction and renovation costs, the committee reversed itself and voted to resume eminent domain proceedings, as permitted by vote of the town in 1967, to acquire land adjacent to the Kingston Elementary School.

The new school will house Grades 4, 5, and 6 and will also contain a cafeteria and library learning center which would serve Grades 1, 2 and 3. State required kindergarten and special class spaces will be provided. A special town meeting during the latter part of February will be called so that approval of the plans will insure relief from the over-crowded conditions by early 1973.

It is indeed unfortunate that it is the children of Kingston who have had to bear the burden forced upon them while committees and citizens ponder.

## Report of the Playground Commission

The Kingston Playground Commission this past year was very active and progressive.

The eight-week summer program records showed the largest enrollment ever. A total of 192 children registered, and the summer attendance reached a new high of 4,500. Our summer was one of the sunniest in years which added to the enjoyment of the children.

The small children's play area was given a new "face" of brightly splashed colors on the swings, merry-go-round and seesaws. Plans are being made to add new animals and a spin-around to the children's playground. The Reed Community Building was very active all year, not only during the days but also in the evenings, being used by various charitable and rental groups. The inside of the building was painted, including the ceiling which had not been painted for sixteen years. The building superintendent, William E. Cadwell, did all the painting below ceiling level.

The new Pottle Field is progressing on schedule although the poor Spring weather caused a delay in commencing as early as had been hoped. We expect the field to be in use in 1972 for the first time. Home plate and the pitcher's mound are in place and the foul lines surveyed. The dimensions measure 275 feet down the left and right field lines and 300 feet to center. The backstop should be in place in the early spring and the infield rolled and carpeted with a mixture of two parts loam and one part gravel.

Due to bids received in excess of the appropriation voted last March, the Commission was not able to repair and re-shingle the Reed Community building roof. An article will appear in the warrant for the 1972 annual town meeting requesting additional funds for this work, for which we ask your support.

Again the Commission wishes to acknowledge the fine cooperation from the Town officials and the extended help from Town Accountant Irma Ruffini and her staff.

## Report of the Fish Committee

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The responsibility of the Fish Committee is to maintain favorable conditions for the spawning of smelt and alewives, a variety of the herring family.

There were good runs of both types of fish this year.

All spawning is in mid-spring, with the smelt spawning in the brackish waters of the Jones River below the Elm Street dam. The alewives continue up the river to spawn, following the tributary Trout Brook to Sylvia Place and Russell Ponds.

Again this year the natural run of the alewives was supplemented with the help of Arthur Dupuis, foreman of the Massachusetts Division of Marine Fisheries, Department of Natural Resources, who placed into two ponds a few tank-truck loads of spawning alewives obtained from the Cape Cod Canal.

The loads were necessary because again this year difficulty was experienced in the operation of the Elm Street fish ladder. It is hoped through modifications to be carried out on ladder steps that effective operation will be restored in 1972.

Several large shad were observed this past spring in the lower Jones River.

## Water Commissioners' Report

Directing the destinies of the Kingston Water Department this past year has been a source of great satisfaction to the Water Commissioners. But it has also instilled in us a profound respect and admiration for the many loyal and dedicated citizens who give unselfishly of their time, talents and support. We must humbly confess to the fact that without their cooperation we could not function effectively. So to the citizens of Kingston, we wish to express our heartfelt gratitude for their help, advice and cooperation.

We are confident that the Kingston Water Department is on the threshold of many bright and new horizons.

The success or failure of your department in a fast-growing town such as Kingston, must hinge upon the work of your Water Commissioners and the support of the citizens.

This past year we have studied many projects for the improvement of your water system. We want to mention them to you for your action at the 1972 Annual Town Meeting.

1. We will again have an article in the 1972 warrant for an appropriation for the construction of a two million gallon prestressed concrete tank at Pine Hill, with a pipeline on Elm Street to connect it into the system. This will increase the total storage of the system to meet the needs of the Town for many years to come. The estimated cost is \$600,000, an increase of \$55,000 over last year's estimate — an increase of \$100,000 from the estimated cost made to you in 1969.

2. The forecast of building in the immediate future requires us to recommend a new well. There will be an article for another gravel-packed well, concrete block pumping station, pumping equipment, power line, discharge piping and appurtenances, at an estimated cost of \$180,000.

3. The tank on Smith's Lane was last painted in 1963. To preserve the tank from further rust and corrosion, we are recommending an article for the painting of this tank at an estimated cost of \$3,000.

4. Your pumping station on Winthrop Street is electrically operated. If the power should fail for many reasons, we would have serious problems during a catastrophe; therefore, an article will be in the 1972 warrant for the purchase and installation of a stand-by

engine for the Winthrop Street pumping station, at an estimated cost of \$7,000.

5. Your Water Commissioners must go forward to make further study for additional well sites. We now have \$5,000 available for this purpose, but due to the high cost for exploring for wells, deem it advisable to ask for an additional sum of \$5,000 at the Annual Town Meeting.

6. At the Annual Town Meeting in March, 1971, it was suggested that the Town give consideration for installing meters in Kingston to preserve the water supply. Your Water Commissioners made a complete study, talked with several meter companies, and there is no question that with meters, the water consumption will be reduced. However, the cost for installing meters will be approximately \$275,000. After the meters have been installed, the maintenance cost for the operation of the department will be increased. We would be required to add at least another man to the department, an extra truck, bookkeeping costs would increase, and it would be necessary to accept the lien law. The first year the meters are in operation, the income will be reduced fifty per cent. Water bills are now payable in advance — the operation of meters will make it necessary to bill for water actually used. With all this additional cost, it would require the Water Commissioners to increase the water rates substantially. In order for the voters to take action, we have inserted an article for an appropriation of \$275,000 for this purpose. Your Water Commissioners do not recommend favorable action at this time.

### THE WATER BAN

During the summer of 1971, your Water Commissioners found it necessary to restrict use of sprinklers from 4:00 P.M. to 8:00 P.M. during the months of July and August. This reduced the quantity used and kept our water supply in a position where it was much safer in case of fire. The cooperation we received from the water-takers was excellent, for which we extend to you our sincere thanks. Until we have an additional water supply, more storage and pumping facilities, the ban will be necessary. We will notify you through the press and radio.

Forty-one hundred feet of Transite Pipe was installed by developers in the Hawthorne area and School Street.

Sixteen services were renewed by the Department during the year. The department now has 2,363 services.

As we again approach the destinies of the 1972's, we extend to you our sincere thanks — to our employees for their continued diligence and loyalty; to our town officials — the Finance Committee, the Wage and Personnel Board for their guidance and friendship, and to our citizens who have cooperated with us during 1971 in order that your Water Department may continue to give you the supply of water that you use — the water that we feel is "the best."

## REPORT OF THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE

1971

To the Board of Selectmen and  
the Citizens of Kingston:

We have mentioned in the past several reports to the town that the Kingston Elementary School and the Maple Avenue School are extremely overcrowded. This situation still exists. It is difficult to measure, in concrete terms, the effects of this overcrowding. We are indeed fortunate that the morale of our staff has remained high, for the inconveniences are many, and could have produced many problems had the spirit of tolerance and cooperation not been predominant. Perhaps this spirit has helped to minimize the visibility of that which should otherwise be all too obvious — that we have not kept pace with a building program as our school population has grown. If we are to provide, as we as a town have done for many years, adequate education for our children we must come to grips with the situation and build more classrooms without further delay.

At this juncture, this committee wishes not to become overly involved in philosophical arguments regarding open classrooms, team teaching, upgraded classes, etc. It is apparent to us that the style of teaching changes with the times and apparently without too much regard to the shape of the individual classroom.

We need space — as flexible as possible, to cope with the numbers of children now living in our town. Then we must recognize that it is the children and the teachers that give any school its particular character. We strive, as a committee, to seek out the finest teachers available, and rely on them to provide the kind of education needed by our children so that they will be prepared to cope with an ever more complex and demanding world.

It is fit to mention here the retirement in March, 1971, of Mr. John Durgin after 15 years of service on this committee. In addition to his years on this committee, Jack served for 4 years as its representative to the Silver Lake Committee and on the Building Committee for the 1959 addition to the Kingston Elementary School. Jack spent countless hours in dedicated service to Kingston trying

to provide quality schools. The many of us who have had the privilege to serve with him will attest to his devotion as a schoolman. His ability to delve to the core of an issue, his wise counsel, and the rare ability to find the compromise where none seemed possible will be missed by this committee and by the town he served so well.

## REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

1971

To the School Committee  
and the Citizens of Kingston:

I submit my ninth annual report as Superintendent of Schools for the Silver Lake Regional School District and the Union No. 31 elementary schools of Halifax, Kingston, Pembroke and Plympton.

The Silver Lake School District has completed one of the most unusual years in its 19-year history. Every town in the District has a building committee at work preparing elementary school proposals for special or annual town meetings in 1972. The Regional School Committee is also preparing to present a substantial secondary school project at approximately the same time. It is unfortunate that the burden of these decisions come so close together but the principal cause can be attributed to the inability of our town and regional committees to agree to, and town meetings approve of, the necessary expansion of our school plants. Our elementary pupil population has increased 27 per cent in the past five years: Grades 7-12 have increased 35 per cent. These kinds of numbers cannot continue to be absorbed without serious disruption of the educational program.

The Silver Lake communities have been the object of a most extensive survey during the past year. Dr. George J. Collins, of Collins Associates, has completed a study of school needs, with particular emphasis on the secondary schools. Working closely with Dr. Collins and the Silver Lake School Committee has been the "Ad Hoc" Committee authorized at the March, 1971 town meeting. As the year 1971 ended both groups made their reports. Without going into too much detail the following recommendations are voted as having been agreed upon:

1. That a new 1600 pupil high school (Gr. 9-12) be built in Pembroke.
2. That the present high school be enlarged to accommodate 450 more pupils.
3. That the vocational school be enlarged for 144 additional pupils.

4. That the Regional Agreement be changed to provide a more equitable and acceptable sharing of the costs of new construction, and that there be an amendment increasing membership on the committee in accordance with a new formula.

5. That immediate steps be taken to appoint a committee to prepare for the possibility of Pembroke's ultimate withdrawal from the Region.

The last recommendation recognizes the unequal growth that has occurred in the Region and carries the unanimous recommendation of the Ad Hoc Committee. Such a process takes several years to complete.

Working concurrently with Regional and Ad Hoc Committees has been the Silver Lake Building Committee, which will assume the task of building the proposed school projects.

Of very special importance to both Regional and Local school planning is recent legislation providing for a substantial increase in state aid for new school buildings. This change increased state aid to 65 per cent of both capital and interest costs. The previous formula did not include interest costs, and, except for the Region, was limited to 50 per cent of the capital costs. Each committee recognizes the importance of this development and is hopeful that the towns will take advantage of the opportunity.

### SILVER LAKE HIGH SCHOOL

The Regional High School is in the middle of its first year of over-lapping sessions. The school day is literally dawn to darkness. Early buses arrive at 7:30 a.m.; — late buses leave school for home at 4:45 p.m. The extended school day is a device to accommodate the overcrowded conditions at the high school. This year it effects grade nine. In 1973 it will include grade nine and ten, probably on double sessions. The only relief from this situation lies in the new school proposal now being prepared for town meeting action.

A by-product of an expanded school day is the need for more staff and administrative support. The Principal's office has been reorganized and an assistant principal added. Ten teachers, including a guidance counselor, have been added to accommodate departmental needs, as well as to cover the demands on staff from the longer school day. The response of staff and pupils to the new program has been most gratifying.

Overcrowding creates a whole new set of problems which require the understanding and support of all concerned.



There still remains the unfulfilled requirements of the accreditation report of last year. Much depends on the progress of the building program. The two-year probationary certification expires in the fall of 1972. Preparations are being made by the staff for an intensive curriculum review, but this is dependent on a Regional commitment to additional classroom spaces and special facilities in library, laboratories, and shops.

Curriculum development has been limited this past year to reassessing the role of department heads. Principal Paul Squarcia reports steady progress in this direction, though much remains to be done. Of special interest is the planned and budgeted expansion of the business program in computer programming. This has added benefits in science and mathematics, as well as administration, class scheduling, and central office business functions. Progress has also been noted in the new Reading Program started this fall. This is an extension of, and is coordinated with, the program started last year in the Junior High School.

#### VOCATIONAL PROGRAM

Last year the evaluation team from NEACSS (New England Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools) recommended closer integration of the vocational curriculum with the academic section. This has progressed in two-ways — the extension of the administrative function of the Director, Ralph H. Binns, into the total high school, and most important, the integration of the vocational schedule with the regular school, allowing greater choice of curriculum selections for all students. Here also the future of occupational education is dependent upon new space availability. Our current vocational offering is limited by space to eight departments, serving 394 students. Proposed expansion of vocational facilities would provide for an additional 144 pupils.

Evening programs for the adults of our four communities continues to expand and adjust to the expressed needs. Director Ralph Binns reports the renewal of several discontinued courses, as well as several new ones. The vocational school also hosted its sixth MDTA (Manpower Development Training Act) program in Auto Body. This provides job training for those needing retraining and placement in new jobs. This program is in cooperation with the Division of Employment Security and the State Department of Education.

#### JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL

Now in its fourth year the Junior High School has far outgrown its rated capacity of 800 pupils. The 1971-72 enrollment of 970 represents a 30 per cent increase over its entering enrollment of 749 in 1968-69. More important this growth continues at the same rate, causing concern for the immediate future of Junior High School.

Principal Arthur T. Hand reports that space needs have caused a reduction in program electives, extra-curricular activities, and increased use of non-classroom areas such as auditorium, cafeteria, library, for academic classes. He sees only one more year before the Junior High School joins the High School in the extended school day.

Curriculum development is being directed toward the assessment of its adequacy and correlation with the elementary and high school programs.

Mr. Hand reports continued growth in the Reading Program, as well as some interesting developments in Theatre and communication skills in the Language arts.

#### SUPERINTENDENCY UNION NO. 31

The future of Union No. 31 is tied irrevocably to the Regional School District. Concern has been expressed that unequal growth has caused unequal staff and need requirements amongst our four towns. This past year we saw the first major change in Union organization — the separation of elementary supervision. In fact, the largest town, Pembroke, will operate separately from the other three towns. The future may bring further changes in the traditional Union services. Currently our four towns share administrative services, as well as music, art, physical education, speech, and pupil personnel services.

The educational value of Union organization still obtains. The development of programs and services can more economically be accomplished by this method. In addition, services not financially feasible because of limited size or facilities are made possible. Our Union has developed a most effective curriculum structure. It has stability, but yet is sensitive to change and adjustment as needs indicate.

#### KINGSTON ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

As predicted the Kingston Elementary enrollment has changed very little for the past two years. This condition has made it possible for the Elementary School to operate without any extension of the school day. We continue to house about 800 pupils in spaces designed for 700. This is accomplished by the system of helping teachers, and the use of space at the Maple Avenue School. We now employ nine regular teachers to assist with over-crowded classrooms, a most inefficient use of professional talent, but allowed to continue as an alternative to double sessions or the extended school day. Much credit is due to the willingness of the staff to perform under such conditions, as well as to the Principal, Esther DiMarzio, for her leadership in keeping the system operating.

Miss DiMarzio reports increasing concern for the lack of space to carry on the out-of-classroom programs available to our pupils. Sessions in closets and corridors for speech therapy and instrumental instruction, lack of privacy for guidance conferences are but a few of the problems.

September, 1973 is the critical date when mandatory kindergartens will make all present adaptations inadequate. Fortunately the Elementary Building Committee has progressed very rapidly and is preparing proposals for an early town meeting in 1972. The financial climate for such a proposal has also been improved by a substantial increase in state aid for school construction. This could save the town over a half million dollars over the previous formula.

### CONCLUSION

This report seems to have been occupied mostly with building and space problems at all levels of our school system. But this is what it is all about as we close out 1971. Our District is in serious trouble which can only be solved by providing sufficient school space and facilities to do the job of providing quality education for our children. Postponement of school needs has exacted a heavy toll on the taxpayer, but most of all on the children we are committed to serve.

I should like to commend the many teachers, administrators, and school committee members who have assisted in making this past year successful and worthwhile. Only through their dedication was it made possible.

**REPORT OF THE  
REGIONAL SCHOOL DISTRICT COMMITTEE**

1971

To the Citizens of the Silver Lake  
Regional School District:

The year 1971 could best be described as the year of overcrowdedness. At both the senior and junior high schools our total enrollment of 2,462 students well exceeds the physical limits of our buildings.

The opening of school marked the beginning of staggered sessions for freshmen. In the 1972-1973 school year more severe staggering and eventual double sessions seem unavoidable.

In order to alleviate the overcrowding, the Committee has been working with Dr. George Collins, an Educational Consultant, to ascertain the building and educational needs for Silver Lake. A building committee is presently working with Dr. Collins and their recommendations will be forthcoming.

The Committee, in conjunction with the Ad Hoc Committee, has reached mutual agreement on changes to the Silver Lake agreement. These proposed changes will be brought before the town meetings for consideration.

The Committee has given its approval for an "open campus" program, which allows students that are in study hall to remain in school, leave for a job, or gain experience in activities outside of school.

The Committee has established a better communications system with the students. Meetings between the Committee and student leaders have and will be held to help involve the students in their school. The Committee has sought the students' aid in promoting our need for space. Since the students live in the overcrowdedness it is they who can best describe present conditions due to lack of space.

The Committee has engaged in three lengthy studies of our needs. The time for study has passed, the time for building is at hand.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or transfer from unappropriated available funds in the treasury, the sum of \$150,000.00 for the purchase of approximately 30 acres of land for conservation purposes, in the area known as the Bay Farm, or take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 28. To see if the Town will vote to accept recommendations for the purpose of appropriating from the income of the Elizabeth B. Sampson Memorial Fund for various purposes, or take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 29. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or transfer from unappropriated available funds in the treasury, a sum of money for the purchase and installation of a stand-by engine for the Winthrop Street Pumping Station, or take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 31. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or transfer from unappropriated available funds in the treasury, a sum of money for the purpose of cleaning and painting the water tank on Smith's Lane, or take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 42. To see if the Town will vote to adopt a town by-law for the establishment of a council on aging, pursuant to General Laws, Chapter 40, Section 8B, and that a sum of money be raised and appropriated, or transferred from unappropriated available funds in the treasury for council expenses, or take any other action relative thereto.

**Recommendation to be made at Town Meeting.**

ARTICLE 43. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the appointment of a permanent Elementary School Building Committee of five members, one member to be appointed by the Moderator, two members to be appointed by the Selectmen, and two members to be appointed by the School Committee; the five members of the Committee shall be appointed for terms of one year, two years and three years respectively, and upon the normal expirations of these terms their successor shall be appointed by the same appointing authority for terms of three years, and that any vacancies occurring in said committee be filled in the manner of the original appointments, or take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 44. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell a small strip of land, which land is adjacent to the land of Gerard F. Murphy, 14 Kennedy Road, or take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 45. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at private sale the former railroad station and a certain portion of the land surrounding the building, or take any other action relative thereto.

To see if the Town will vote to increase the present Waterfront Committee from three to seven members; three of the additional members to be appointed by the Finance Committee and one additional member to be appointed by the Selectmen, or take any other action relative thereto. (BY PETITION)

**Recommend favorable action with three additional members to be appointed by the Moderator instead of Finance Committee.**

ARTICLE 47. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Protective Zoning By-Law and the official Zoning Map of the Town of Kingston, so as to change the following described land from residential zoning to business zoning; said two parcels are described as follows: the easterly side of Summer Street and Tarkiln Road, a distance of 700 feet, more or less and northwesterly of Route 3A, a distance of 1,350 feet, more or less, and is shown as Lots 33A, 36A, 36A1, 36F, 38Z1 and 38M19, said parcel containing 12.20 acres, more or less, and owned by Mario D. and Amedeo P. Tassinari and also the parcel of land on the easterly side of Summer Street, a distance of 350 feet, more or less and southeasterly of Route 3A, a distance of 1,050 feet, more or less, and is shown as Lots 36D, 36E, 37 and 38A, said parcel containing 6.70 acres, more or less, and owned by Mario D. and Amedeo P. Tassinari; all of aforementioned two parcels of land and lots being shown on Block 3 of the Assessors Plans of the Town of Kingston, or take any other action relative thereto. (BY PETITION).

**Recommendation to be made at Town Meeting.**

ARTICLE 48. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or transfer from unappropriated available funds in the treasury, the sum of \$36,000.00, or any other sum necessary to obtain an expert appraisal of taxable real estate in the town for the purpose of re-assessing the town at 100 per cent valuation, or take any other action relative thereto. (BY PETITION)

**Recommend no action.**

ARTICLE 49. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or transfer from unappropriated available funds in the treasury, a sum of money for the revaluation of the Town, pursuant to Chapter 59, Section 38, General Laws, or take any other action relative thereto.

**Recommendation to be made at Town Meeting.**

ARTICLE 50. To see if the Town will vote to accept the way known as Lee Circle, from a point on the northerly side of May Avenue and running in a northwesterly direction for a distance of approximately 360 feet, more or less, to land of Marion C. Dries and Elizabeth A. Brock, and that a sum of money be raised and appropriated, or transferred from unappropriated available funds in



the treasury, for the construction thereof, including engineering services and for acquiring titles, or take any other action relative thereto. (BY PETITION)

**Recommendation to be made at Town Meeting.**

ARTICLE 51. To see if the Town will vote to accept that portion of Country Way, from a point on Country Way now accepted and shown on the town map and extending on Country Way for approximately 1,727 feet, more or less, to a point ending on Station Street, and that a sum of money be raised and appropriated, or transferred from unappropriated available funds in the treasury, for the construction thereof, including engineering services and for acquiring titles, or take any other action relative thereto.

(BY PETITION)

**Recommendation to be made at Town Meeting.**

ARTICLE 52. To see if the Town will vote to accept the way now known as "off River Street" and to be known as Bay Farm Road, beginning at a point on the northerly side of River Street and running in a northerly direction for a distance of 460 feet, more or less, thence turning and running westerly a distance of 470 feet, more or less, and that a sum of money be raised and appropriated or transferred from unappropriated available funds in the treasury, for the construction thereof, including engineering services and for acquiring titles, or take any other action relative thereto.

(BY PETITION)

**Recommendation to be made at Town Meeting.**

ARTICLE 53. To see if the Town will vote that a sum of money now available in Free Cash be appropriated for the use of the Assessors in the reduction of the tax levy.

## Report of the Wage & Personnel Board January 1, 1972

Wage and Personnel Boards are established by Chapter 41 of the General Laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. In 1969 the Town of Kingston first voted to adopt a number of Wage and Personnel By-Laws together with class and compensation schedules. Since 1969, several amendments have been made at Town Meetings and at the present time we have Personnel By-Laws that are available at the Town House for all Town employees and residents of Kingston.

In 1971 the Town had 108 full-time employees, approximately 30 part-time employees and other appointed officials that are covered by our Personnel By-Laws. This is exclusive of the School Department employees who are not subject to the Wage and Personnel By-Laws.

During the past year this Board has continued its function of administration of Town Personnel, working closely with the Selectmen and Town Department Heads. Board meetings are informal and are usually scheduled. This allows more flexibility to render prompt discussions and recommendations to problems as they occur on a day-to-day basis.

In addition to this, negotiations have been conducted with recognized employee associations as well as with Department Heads and individual employees as provided under Sections 6 and 7 of the By-Laws. We have maintained records and investigated the salaries and positions of other Cities and Towns to render comparisons for evaluation with our own schedules, classifications and benefits.

Kingston is a member of the Massachusetts League of Cities and Towns as well as the Massachusetts Municipal Personnel Association. Members of our Board have attended regional meetings held by these associations which are both informative and constructive.

We are looking forward to 1972 with the hope that the Federal Economic Controls passed during 1971 will benefit the Town, but equally important, our many loyal Town employees who, in our opinion, are deserving of the full support of all those who live in Kingston.

## PERSONNEL BY-LAW

### Section 1. Authorization

Pursuant to the authority contained in Sections 108A and 108C of Chapter 41 of the General Laws, there shall be established plans, which may be amended from time to time by vote of the Town at a Town Meeting; (a) classifying positions in the service of the Town, other than those filled by popular election, those under the direction and control of the School Committee, the position of Town Counsel, certain positions for which the compensation is on a fee basis or the incumbents of which render intermittent or casual service and which do not appear in Schedule A of Section 8 following, into groups and classes doing substantially similar work or having substantially equal responsibilities; (b) authorizing a compensation plan for positions in the classification plan; (c) providing for the administration of said classification and compensation plans; and (d) establishing certain working conditions and fringe benefits for employees occupying positions in the classification plan.

### Section 2. Definitions

As used in this by-law, the following words and phrases shall have the following meanings unless a different construction is clearly required by the context or by the laws of the Commonwealth:

"Town," the Town of Kingston.

"Civil Service Law," Chapter 31 of the General Laws of the Commonwealth, as amended and all rules and regulations made thereunder; and any special law enacted by the General Court regulating the classification, compensation and conditions of employment of officers and employees of the Town under Chapter 31;

"Classification Plan," class titles of Schedule A of Section 8 of this by-law plus class specifications which are on file with the Personnel Board and which are hereby incorporated by reference;

"Class," a group of positions in the Town service sufficiently similar in respect to duties and responsibilities so that the same descriptive title may be used to designate each position allocated to the class, that the same qualifications shall be required of the incumbents, that the same tests of fitness may be used to choose qualified employees and that the same scale of compensation can be made to apply with equity;

"Position Class," same as class (a class may include only one position, in which event it is defined as a "single position class");

"Group," an occupational group of classes appearing in Schedule A of Section 8;

"Department Head," the officer, board or other body having immediate supervision and control of a department;

"Employee," an employee of the Town occupying a position in the classification plan;

"Department," any department, board, committee, commission or other agency of the Town subject to this by-law;

"Administrative Authority," the elected official or board, or the appointed official having jurisdiction over a function or activity;

"Full-time employment," employment for not less than seven hours per diem for five days a week for fifty-two weeks per annum, minus legal holidays and authorized vacation leave, sick leave, bereavement leave, and other leave of absence;

"Part-time employment," employment for less than full-time employment, as defined above;

"Continuous employment," employment, uninterrupted except for required military service and for authorized vacation leave, sick leave, bereavement leave, or other leave of absence;

"Full-time employee," an employee retained in full-time employment;

"Part-time employee," an employee retained in part-time employment;

"Position," an office or post of employment in the Town service with duties and responsibilities calling for the full-time or part-time employment of one person in the performance and exercise thereof;

"Permanent position," any position in the Town service which has required or which is likely to require the services of an incumbent without interruption for a period of more than six calendar months, either on a full-time or part-time employment basis;

"Permanent employee," (1) any employee retained on a continuing basis in a permanent position, as defined above; (2) any employee holding a permanent appointment under Civil Service Law to a position deemed permanent within the meaning of said law;

"Temporary position," or "seasonal position," any position in the Town service which requires or which is likely to require the services of one incumbent for a period not exceeding six calendar months; a seasonal position requiring less than the work week of its occupation group shall be considered as part-time;

"Temporary employee," (1) any employee retained in a temporary or seasonal position as defined above; (2) any employee holding a temporary appointment under Civil Service Law who does not also have permanent status thereunder;

"Intermittent service," personal service rendered by an employee in a position calling for part-time employment, which service although constituting continuous employment is not rendered during prescribed working hours, daily, weekly or annually, but is rendered as required, according to the demands for such service;

"Casual service," personal service rendered by an employee in a position calling for part-time employment, which service does not constitute continuous employment; this service is rendered occasionally and without regularity according to the demands therefor;

"Compensation Plan," Schedules B through C in Section 8;

"Compensation Grade," a range of salary or wage rates appearing on Schedule B and B-1 and B-2 of Section 8;

"Rate," a sum of money designated as compensation for hourly, weekly, semi-monthly, monthly or annual personal services;

"Minimum Rate," the rate in a range which is normally the hiring rate of a new employee;

"Maximum Rate," the highest rate in a range which an employee normally is entitled to attain;

"Range," the dollar differences between minimum and maximum rates;

"Personal Rate," a rate above the maximum rate applicable only to a designated employee;

"Step Rate," a rate in a range of a compensation grade;

"Increment," the dollar difference between step rates;

"Promotion," a change from a position of lower class and compensation grade to a position with greater responsibilities in a higher class and compensation grade;

"Board," the Personnel Board as defined in Section 3.

### Section 3. Personnel Board

(a) There shall be a Personnel Board to be known as the Wage and Personnel Board, composed of three (3) unpaid members, who shall not be employees or elected officials of the Town, responsible for the administration and maintenance of classification and compensation plans. One member of the Board shall be appointed by the Moderator, one member by the Finance Committee and one member by the Board of Selectmen. The three members of the Board shall be appointed for terms of one year, two and three years respectively and upon the normal expiration of these terms their successors shall be appointed by the same appointing authorities for terms of three years.

Original appointments to the Wage and Personnel Board under this by-law shall be made not later than thirty days following the effective date of the by-law; and subsequent appointments shall be made within thirty days following the expiration of the term of the Board member who is to be replaced.

The Board shall draw up and recommend to the Town a proposal for classification and compensation plans for consideration as a Town by-law, and shall from time to time recommend to the Town any action deemed necessary to maintain a fair and equitable pay level.

The Board shall make an annual report in writing to the Finance Committee and the Board of Selectmen on or before October first of each year.

(b) The Board shall be invested with all the powers and duties specified in Section 108C of Chapter 41 of the General Laws.

(c) The Board shall administer the plans and shall establish such procedures as it deems necessary for the proper administration thereof.

(d) Forthwith after its appointment and annually, the Board shall meet and organize by electing a chairman and appointing a secretary and clerk. A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. A majority vote of the Board shall determine the action the Board must take in all matters upon which it is authorized or required to pass under this by-law.

(e) The Board may employ assistance and incur expenses as it deems necessary subject to the appropriation of funds thereof.

(f) The Board shall maintain adequate personnel records of all employees occupying positions subject to the classification and compensation plans, said records to be kept in its custody. Department Heads shall provide such information as the Board may request.

(g) The Board shall maintain written job descriptions or specifications of the classes in the classification plan, each consisting of a statement describing the essential nature of the work and the characteristics that distinguish the class from other classes. The description for any class shall be construed solely as a means of identification and not as prescribing what the duties or responsibilities of any position shall be, or as modifying, or in any way affecting, the power of any administrative authority, as otherwise existing, to appoint, to assign duties to, or to direct and control the work of any employee under the jurisdiction of such authority.

(h) Upon recommendation of a department head, supported by evidence in writing of special reasons and exceptional circumstances satisfactory to the Board, the Board may authorize an entrance rate higher than the minimum rate for a position, and or such other variance in the compensation plan as it may deem necessary for the proper functioning of the services of the Town. No variance shall become effective unless, or until, the necessary funds have been appropriated therefor.

#### Section 4. Classification Plan

(a) All positions in the service of the Town except those excluded in Section 1 are hereby classified by titles appearing in Schedule A of Section 8 which is made a part hereof. These classes of positions shall constitute the Classification Plan for the paid Town service, within the meaning of Section 108A of Chapter 41 of the General Laws, as amended.

(b) Whenever a new position is established, or the duties of an existing position are so changed that in effect a new position is created, upon presentation of substantiating data satisfactory to the Personnel Board, the Board shall allocate such new or changed position to its appropriate class, as hereinafter provided.

(c) The title of each class, as established by the Classification Plan, shall be the official title of every position allocated to the class and the official title of each incumbent of a position so allocated, and shall be used to the exclusion of all others on payrolls, budget estimates and other official records and reports pertaining to the position.

(d) No position may be reclassified or no class may be assigned to a different compensation grade, until the Personnel Board shall have determined such reclassification and compensation plans.

#### Section 5. Compensation Plan

(a) The Compensation Plan shall consist of Schedules B through C in Section 8 which provide minimum and maximum salaries or wages for certain of the classes in the Classification Plan. The salary range of a position class shall be the salary range of all positions allocated to the class.

(b) All employees shall continue to be paid on an hourly, weekly, semimonthly, annual or other basis, as at present, except as provided in the compensation plan, unless otherwise authorized by the Personnel Board.

(c) No department head shall fix the salary of any employee in a position so classified except in accordance with the compensation plan.

(d) No person shall be appointed, employed or paid as an employee in any position subject to the provisions of the classification plan under any title other than those appearing on Schedule A of Section 8.

(e) An employee in continuous full-time or part-time employment shall receive the increment between his present rate and the next higher step rate as follows:

1. On January first or July first provided he has completed thirty weeks service at the minimum or other rate if a rate other than the minimum is authorized as the entrance rate.

2. Thereafter one year from the date of his previous increase until he attains the maximum rate of the range of the compensation grade to which his position class is assigned.

3. Employees in continuous part-time employment eligible for increments under the provisions of this sub-section shall be those occupying positions in classes for which compensation is provided in Schedule B, or B-1 or B-2 of Section 8.

(f) An employee occupying a seasonal position in a class for which compensation is provided in Schedule B, or B-1 or B-2 of Section 8 shall receive increments as provided in the preceding sub-section on the basis of thirty weeks employment constituting one year.

(g) An employee receiving a promotion to a vacant position or to a new position as defined in Section 4(b) shall, upon assignment resulting from such promotion, receive the rate in the compensation grade of the vacant or new position next above his existing rate. If the resulting adjustment does not equal \$100.00 for a position class assigned to Schedule B, or B-1 or B-2 the adjustment shall be to the second rate above the existing rate but within the compensation grade of the vacant or new position.

(h) The employee receiving a promotion and adjustment in rate pursuant to the provisions of the preceding sub-section shall receive the next increment of his compensation grade effective the next January or July first following completion of thirty weeks at the rate resulting from the promotion.

(i) If an employee's rate at the time of the adoption of this by-law is in excess of the maximum rate set forth in his appropriate compensation grade in Schedule B, or B-1 or B-2 of Section 8 this rate shall not be reduced, but shall become a personal rate applicable only to said employee as defined in Section 2.

(j) Each department head of a department to which is assigned an employee occupying a position in the classification plan shall include in his estimates required by the provisions of Section 59 of Chapter 41 of the General Laws a pay adjustment section setting forth in detail the amounts which will be required for anticipated pay adjustments during the ensuing year and shall furnish a copy thereof to the Board.

(k) The adjustments provided for in this section shall be subject to the availability of appropriated funds.

#### Section 6. Amendment of the Plans

(a) The classification Plan and/or the Compensation Plan and/or other provisions of this by-law may be amended by vote of the annual Town Meeting. Requests for such amendments shall be made to the Board in writing. All written requests of amendments of the Classification Plan and/or the Compensation Plan and/or other provisions of this by-law must be submitted to the Board no later than two months prior to the annual Town Meeting. Whenever such a petition is received, the Board shall promptly hold a hearing to consider such proposed amendment, and the petitioners and the heads of the departments affected shall be given at least three days written notice. Prior to the next annual Town Meeting the Board shall file with the Selectmen for insertion in the warrant for the next annual Town Meeting an article sufficiently stated to permit the Town to act upon the subject matter of any such petition. At the same time, the Board shall file with the Finance Committee a final report, with recommendations, pertaining to any such petition, provided that no recommendation in favor of a proposed amendment shall be made except by an affirmative vote of 2 of its 3 members.

(b) The Board may, from time to time of its own motion, hold a hearing to consider any proposed amendment. In the event said proposed amendment is supported by an affirmative vote of 2 of its members, the Board shall proceed according to the preceding sub-section to insert an article in the warrant and to report its recommendations to the Finance Committee.

#### Section 7. Continuing Review

The Board, from time to time of its own motion, shall investigate the work and standard rates of salaries or wages of any or all positions to the provisions of this by-law. Such reviews shall be made at such intervals as the Board deems necessary and, to the extent which the Board considers practicable, shall include all occupational groups in the classification plan.

#### Section 9. Work Week

The work week for full-time or seasonal employment in each occupational group shall be as follows:

Fire	56 Hours
Administrative	As Required (a)

(a) "As Required" shall mean the total number of hours in the week needed to perform the duties of the position, as determined by the appropriate administrative authority.

#### Section 10. Overtime Compensation

(a) Clerical Group — an employee shall be compensated at one and one half times his regular rate for hours in excess of thirty-five (35) hours per week.

(b) Library Group — an employee shall be compensated at one and one half times his regular hourly rate for hours worked in excess of thirty-five (35) hours weekly.

(c) Custodial and Labor Groups — an employee shall be compensated at one and one half times his regular hourly rate for hours worked in excess of forty (40) hours weekly. A minimum of two hours of overtime pay shall be guaranteed on call back.

(d) Police Department — as specified by a contract between the Town and the Police Association.

(e) Fire Department: As specified by contract between Town and Fire Association.

1. A uniformed employee in Compensation Grades PS-1 or PS-2 in full-time employment who is required to work beyond his normal tour of duty, responds to a box alarm when off duty, or is called back for standby duty, forest fire fighting, snow shovelling or forest fire patrols shall be compensated at one and one half (1½) times his regular rate of pay. A minimum of two hours of overtime pay shall be guaranteed on call back.

2. The hourly rate of overtime pay for personnel covered in Section 10 (e) (1) shall be one fifty-sixth (1/56) of the employee's regular week's pay times one and one half (1½).

#### (f) Administrative Group:

1. An employee normally is not entitled to overtime, but shall be granted compensatory time at the convenience of his department head for hours worked in excess of forty weekly.

#### (g) Supervisory Group:

An employee is not entitled to overtime, as he has the authority to approve overtime compensation for his subordinates. He is entitled to take compensatory time which he shall report to the proper administrative authority if requested. He shall also make adequate provision for the supervision of his department in his absence.

#### Section 11. Clothing Allowances

(a) Police Department — as agreed by contract, (see appendix A).

(b) Fire Department — as agreed by contract, (see appendix B)

(c) Highway, Tree and Water Department — a full-time member shall receive a clothing allowance to be paid by the town for rental of work clothes for members of the department as designated by department head and approved by Wage & Personnel Board.

(d) Rental Work clothes allowances to be made for other full-time employees on individual recommendation of Dept. heads to Wage & Personnel Board.

#### Section 12. Paid Holidays

The following days shall be recognized as legal holidays within the meaning of this by-law:

Independence Day	4th of July
Labor Day	First Monday of September

On which days employees shall be excused from all duty not required to maintain essential town services.



(a) Changes to State Law for long weekends (Monday) as required.

(b) Every employee in full-time or continuous part-time employment shall be entitled to these designated holidays on the following terms:

1. If paid on an hourly basis, he shall receive one day's pay at his regular rate based on the number of hours regularly worked on the day on which the designated holiday occurs:

2. If paid on a weekly, semi-monthly or annual basis, he shall be granted each designated holiday without loss in pay.

(c) Payment under the provisions of this section shall be made provided the eligible employee shall have worked on his last regularly scheduled working day prior to and his next regularly scheduled working day following such holiday, or was in full pay status on such preceding and following days in accordance with other provisions of this by-law.

(d) An employee in continuous employment occupying a position in other than the Public Safety or Supervisory Groups who performs work on one of the days designated in sub-section (a) shall be paid at his regular rate for such day or fraction thereof in addition to the amount to which he is entitled under sub-section (b).

(e) At the request of the employee, he may be granted compensatory time off at the convenience of the departments in lieu of payment provided under sub-section (d).

(f) An employee in continuous employment, in other than the Police or Fire Departments, who, because of a rotation of shifts, works different days in successive weeks shall be granted, in each year in which the number of holidays falling on his regular days off in excess of the number of holidays in that year falling on Saturday, additional days off equal to the excess.

(g) Whenever one of the holidays set forth in sub-section (a) falls on a Sunday, the following day shall be the legal holiday, and if on a Saturday, the preceding day shall be the legal holiday.

#### Section 13. Vacation Leave

(a) An employee in continuous service shall be granted two weeks vacation with pay provided he has completed thirty weeks of service prior to June first.

(b) An employee with less than thirty weeks of continuous employment as of June first shall be granted one day of vacation for each full month of continuous service completed prior to June first, but not to exceed one week of vacation.

(c) An employee who has completed eight (8) years of service shall, in the year during which this length of service has been completed be granted three (3) weeks fifteen (15) days of vacation with pay.

(d) An employee who has completed fifteen (15) years of service shall, in the year during which this length of service has been completed be granted four (4) weeks (20) days of vacation with pay.

(e) Upon the death of an employee who is eligible for vacation under these rules, payment shall be made to the estate of the deceased in an amount equal to the vacation allowance as accrued in the vacation year prior to the employee's death but which had not been granted. In addition, payment shall be made for that portion of the vacation allowance earned in the vacation year during which the employee died up to the time of his separation from the payroll.

(f) Employees who are eligible for vacation under these rules and whose services are terminated by dismissal through no faults or delinquency of their own, or by retirement, or by entrance into the armed forces, shall be paid an amount equal to the vacation allowance as earned, and not granted, in the vacation year prior to such dismissal, retirement, or entrance into the armed forces. In addition, payment shall be made for that portion of the vacation allowance earned in the vacation year during which such dismissal, retirement or entrance into the armed forces occurred up to the time of the employee's separation from the payroll.

(g) Absences on account of sickness in excess of that authorized under the rules therefore or for personal reasons as provided for under other leave may, at the discretion of the department head, be charged to vacation leave.

(h) An employee, unless receiving pay for such a day or date under the provisions of Section 17A of Chapter 147 or Section 57A of Chapter 48 of the General Laws, shall be granted an additional day of vacation if, while on vacation leave, a designated holiday occurs which falls on or is legally observed on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday or Friday.

(i) Vacation allowances provided under the terms of this section will be calculated on a 12-month period commencing on June first and ending on May thirty-first and these allowances must be taken in the 12 months period that immediately follows. In unusual circumstances, exceptions may be granted by the Personnel Board upon recommendations of department heads. Such vacation shall be granted by the head of the respective department of the Town at such time as, in his opinion, will cause the least interference with the performance of the regular work of the Town.

(j) An employee shall not be allowed to work during his vacation leave and be compensated with extra pay without approval of the department head and the Personnel Board.

#### Section 14. Sick Leave

(a) An employee in continuous employment who has completed thirty weeks of service following original employment shall be allowed 12 days leave with pay each calendar year or one day for each month thereof if in any year his employment is less than thirty weeks, provided such leave is caused by sickness or injury or by exposure to contagious disease.

(b) An employee in continuous employment shall be credited with the unused portion of leave granted under sub-section (a) without limit and may be accumulated as additional sick leave benefit.

(c) An employee occupying a temporary or seasonal position shall not be credited with unused sick leave beyond his current period of employment.



(d) If the amount of leave credit provided under sub-section (b) has been or is about to be exhausted, an employee may make application for additional allowances to that provided under sub-section (a). Such application shall be made to the Board which is authorized to grant such additional allowances as it may determine to be equitable after reviewing all circumstances including the employees' attendance and performance record prior to conditions supporting his request for the additional allowance.

(e) Sick leave must be authorized by the department head and must be reported on forms as provided. These records will be maintained by the Town Accountant for the Wage & Personnel Board and Town Accountant's use.

(f) A physician's certificate of illness shall be submitted by the employee after three days absence to his department head before leave is granted under the provisions of this section. This certificate shall be forwarded by the department head to the Board.

(g) The Board may, of its own motion, require a medical examination of any employee who reports his inability to report for duty because of illness. This examination shall be at the expense of the Town by a physician appointed by the Board.

(h) Injury, illness or disability self-imposed, or resulting from the abuse of alcohol or the use of drugs that are classified under the Federal Narcotics Act or Drug Abuse Control Act, shall not be considered a proper claim for leave under this section.

(i) Payments made under the provisions of this section shall be limited to an employee who is receiving Workmen's Compensation payments to the difference between the amount paid in Workman's Compensation and the employee's regular rate.

(j) In the event of payments made to an employee under the preceding sub-section, the Board may debit the employee's sick leave accrual by such amounts as it determines to be equitable in relation to such payments.

(k) Nothing in this section shall be construed to conflict with Section 100 of Chapter 41 of the General Laws.

#### Section 15. Bereavement Leave

Emergency leave up to three days may be allowed for death in an employee's immediate family (wife, husband, mother, father, child, brother or sister), mother-in-law and father-in-law.

#### Section 16. Other Leave

(a) Absences for personal reasons may be charged to vacation leave upon application by the employee and approval by his department head. Such absences, however, may not be charged to vacation leave beyond that which the employee has earned by the time of such application.

(b) Members of the military reserves on brief tours of military duty such as the annual two-week tour of duty shall be compensated by the Town for the difference between the employee's regular pay and that received on military duty. Such tours of duty shall not be counted against vacation allowance.

(c) Two (2) personal days are allowed each year to full-time employees on request to, and approval of, supervisor and department head. Personal days are defined as days needed to attend weddings, funerals of relatives, family needs, etc., not otherwise provided for by the by-laws.

#### Section 17. Longevity Compensation

The Town agrees to reward faithful service by full-time town employees by providing additional compensation each year on the basis of length of service as follows:

A — After Twenty-five (25) years service	\$500.00
B — After Thirty (30) years service	\$1,000.00
C — After Thirty-five (35) years service	\$1,500.00

#### Section 18. Physical Examination

Before appointment to a position in the classification plan requiring continuous service, or to a seasonal position designated by the Board, a candidate shall have passed a physical examination satisfactory to the Board. The examining physician shall be appointed by the Board and the examination shall be at the expense of the Town. The examining physician shall advise the Board as to whether, in his opinion, the applicant is physically qualified to perform the duties of the position for which application has been made, and the applicant shall complete a questionnaire which the Board will design. The examining physician's report shall be confidential and shall be deposited with the Board.

#### Section 19. Operation of By-Law — Grievance Procedures

(a) This by-law shall be operative only as to employees whose positions are classified hereunder and for which positions minimum and maximum salaries, or single-rated miscellaneous salaries as established under section 8.

(b) PERSONNEL BOARD TO ADMINISTER — The Personnel Board of the Town shall constitute the Personnel Relations Review Board of the Town, and in that connection shall have the powers and duties, and perform the functions, assigned to such Personnel Relations Review Boards by Section 21B of Chapter 40 of the General Laws; and said Board shall, in the performance of its duties as Personnel Relations Review Board, be subject to the limitations imposed by said Section 21B and by the by-laws of the Town.

(c) GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE — There shall be a grievance procedure available to those employees of the town whose rights under the wage and personnel classification plan have, in their opinion, been prejudiced and covering all other grievances except those that would properly be under the jurisdiction of the Civil Service Commission or other duly established appeal board. As used in this section, the word "grievance" shall be construed to mean dispute between an employee and his supervisors arising out of an exercise of administrative discretion by such supervisor or supervisors.

STEP 1. The employee shall take up his grievance orally with his immediate supervisor who shall reach a decision and communicate it orally to the employee within two (2) working days.

STEP II. If the grievance is not settled at Step I, the employee shall within five (5) working days present his grievance in writing to his supervisor who shall forward it to the department head who shall hold a hearing within five (5) working days. At this hearing there shall be present the employee and one representative if he requests it, his supervisor and/or the department head.

STEP III. If the grievance is not settled at Step II, all records and facts in the case shall be referred to the Grievance Review Board for adjudication. Those present at Step II shall appear at this hearing. Within twenty (20) working days of the hearing, which shall be the next regular meeting of the Board except in cases of emergency, the employee shall be notified in writing through the department head as to the decision of the Board which will be final.

#### Section 20. Civil Service Law

Nothing in this By-Law shall be construed to conflict with Chapter 31 of the General Laws.

#### Section 21. Effect of Partial Invalidity

The invalidity of any section of this By-Law shall not invalidate any other section or provision thereof.

#### Section 22. Publication of Personnel By-Law

The Personnel Board hereby is authorized and directed to compile and publish Personnel By-Law to be known as the Town of Kingston Wage and Personnel By-Law. Corrections to be made as necessary with amendments subject to authorization as stated in Section 1 herein. Authorized changes will be published and added to this Wage and Personnel By-Law as endorsements to the section, page or paragraph. Last dated endorsement becomes the effective correction or amendment of these By-Laws.

#### RECOGNITION AND BARGAINING UNIT

The Town hereby recognizes the Association as the exclusive representative and bargaining agent for the following bargaining unit — All Regular Members of the Police Department except the Chief.

#### COMPENSATION

Compensation schedules for regular members of the Police Department, yearly shall be as follows:

Assignments to steps to be in accordance with the provisions of Section 5 of the Wage and Personnel By-Law, as amended.

#### OVERTIME — CALLBACK

Police Officers called back to duty on an assigned day after having left his place of employment, or on an unassigned day shall be compensated a minimum of two (2) hours pay at one and one-half his regular hourly rate, except for Court time.

#### AUTHORIZED SCHOOLING

Association members who are required and authorized by the Chief to pursue certain specific courses of instruction in police work shall be paid time and one-half pay or shall be allowed compensatory time off for any time spent in classroom instruction in excess of the regular work week of forty (40) hours.

#### LONGEVITY COMPENSATION

The Town agrees to reward faithful service by regular police officers by providing additional compensation each year on the basis of length of service as follows:

A — After Twenty-five (25) years service	\$500.00
B — After Thirty (30) years service	\$1,000.00
C — After Thirty-five (35) years service	\$1,500.00

#### SICK LEAVE

Unused sick leave days shall be credited and shall accumulate from year-to-year without limit. (See Section 14 of the Wage and Personnel By-Law, as amended).

#### PERSONAL LEAVE

Each regular officer shall be allowed two (2) personal days off each year, such days off being subject to the needs of the Department, and after at least twenty-four (24) hours notice to the Chief of Police or his replacement.

#### VACATIONS

Vacations shall be granted on a seniority basis and shall be awarded as follows:

- A — Three Weeks (15 scheduled days) after eight (8) years of service.
- B. — Four weeks (20 scheduled days) after fifteen (15) years of service.

## GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

See Section 18 of Wage and Personnel By-Law, or Grievance Procedure of March 16, 1970 Agreement Between Town of Kingston and Kingston Police Department.

## MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

A. Except in an emergency regular officers shall have preference in assignments where vacancies occur in the regularly scheduled duty shifts providing that no officer shall work more than two (2) consecutive tours.

B. Any conditions not covered by this contract shall be in accordance with the existing Wage and Personnel By-Law, as amended.

C. Effective date of this agreement shall be January 1, 1972.

D. The Bargaining Representatives for the Town, the Chairman — Board of Selectmen and the Chairman — Wage and Personnel, Board, shall cause the above-listed items of agreement to be placed before the 1972 Annual Town Meeting.

All other job benefits now enjoyed by the uniformed firefighters which are not specifically provided for or abridged in this agreement, are hereby protected by this agreement.

## INDIVIDUAL AGREEMENTS

The Collective Bargaining Team agrees that it will not enter into any individual or collective agreement with any firefighter covered by this agreement, which is contrary to this agreement.

## MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

A. Any conditions not covered by this Agreement shall be in accordance with the existing Wage and Personnel By-Law, as amended.

B. Effective date of this agreement shall be January 1, 1972.

C. The Chairman of the Board of Selectmen and the Chairman of the Wage and Personnel Board, respectively, as bargaining representatives for the Town shall cause the above-listed items of agreement to be placed before the 1972 Annual Town Meeting.
