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

## 1. SUMMARY

## a. Period 1 - 31 December 1953

(1) This battalion continued the development of defensive positions of the right battalion, right regimental sector. Improvement of camp site was continued.

(2) A routine day consisted of work on the Main Battle Position by all hands of the letter and weapons companies. The Main Battle Position was manned on a 24 hour basis with one-third (1/3) of the personnel.

(3) Training was conducted with one (1) of the three (3) rifle companies training each day. Thus, in a seven (7) day week each company trained two (2) eight (8) hour days, in addition to time utilized by company commanders and time devoted to organized athletics. Weapons company trained simultaneously with the rifle companies and accomplished the same amount of training. H&S Company trained four (4) hours each week in basic infantry subjects, in addition to on-the-job training conducted in each section. Officers and Staff Non-Commissioned Officers Schools were conducted twice weekly. On 10 December 1953 all training was discontinued on order of the Regimental Commander to allow maximum effort to be expended on completing the Main Battle Position. Thirty-nine (39) selected enlisted personnel were assigned to such Division Schools as NCO School, Mine Warfare School and Machine Gun School. It is considered that valuable on-the-job training resulted from the construction and improvements of fortifications carried out on the Main Battle Position.

NUMBER . . . . . 22-53) : Schedule for Replacement Firing for 13Dec53

Ref: (a) Regimental Training Memorandum 12-53  
(b) Special Regulations No. 385-310-1, Sections I,II,III,VI and VII

1. In accordance with the provisions of reference (a) small arms firing and familiarization firing of automatic weapons will be conducted on 13 December 1953 at Range D-7.

2. Reference (b) will serve to compliment existing regulations for Range procedure and safety precautions.

3. The Battalion Medical Officer is directed to provide one (1) ambulance, 1/4 ton, 4X4, with one (1) corpsman in attendance at the range at all times during the scheduled exercise. The Communications Officer is directed to provide one (1) 1/4 ton, 4X4, with TCS radio, to permit direct radio communications to Base Camp. This will be on station and guarded throughout the exercise. These vehicles will report to the parade ground in accordance with the schedule of movement.

4. All firing will be in accordance with the following provisions.

- a. All replacements will zero their respective TO weapons.
- b. Only those replacements who will be BAR men or assistant BAR men will fire the BAR.
- c. Each company will furnish an appropriate number of BAR's for their replacements to fire.
- d. Only those replacements who will be machine gunners will fire the machine gun.
- e. All replacements will be instructed in the causes of stoppages and procedure for immediate action for both the BAR and Machine Gun.
- f. Demonstration teams will be organized and instructed prior to arrival at the range.
- g. Companies will provide one (1) qualified NCO to coach the replacements in the familiarization firing.
- h. The HMG Platoon of Weapons Company will provide the required Machine guns and MG instructors.
- i. Ammunition allowance is as follows:
  - (1) M-1 - - - - - -24 rds (3 Clips)
  - (2) BAR - - - - - -40 rds (2 Magazines)
  - (3) .45 - - - - - -10 rds
  - (4) MG. - - - - - -250 rds (1 Box)

5. The following schedule will govern movement to and from the range.  
13Dec53 0715 - All personnel involved will muster at the Parade Ground with their equipment.  
0730 - Embarkation aboard trucks will commence and trucks will be dispatched to the range.  
1600 - Secure from firing, return to Battalion Area.

6. Companies concerned will issue assault rations for the noon meal. Hot coffee will be provided at the range by the general mess.

7. The uniform for firing will be utilities, field boots, field jacket, cartridge belt (with first aid pouch & canteen) utility caps, and helmets (brown side out).

1. MISSION

a. In accordance with reference (a) enclosures (1) and (2) are published for compliance.

b. Training will place emphasis on tactics and techniques applicable to platoon size units. Training in basic ground warfare subjects will be continued to insure proficiency levels commensurate with the mission of the battalion. In addition, increased emphasis will be placed upon the training of the supporting weapons of the company and battalion.

2. TRAINING PLANS

a. Training will be conducted on the basis of a six and a half ( $6\frac{1}{2}$ ) day week and an eight (8) hour day during the period 2-31 January, 1954.

b. Each company, with the exception of H&S Company, will receive a minimum of two days training per week in addition to the allocation of Sunday afternoon to organized athletics.

c. H&S Company will conduct training four (4) hours per week in basic infantry subjects in addition to the prescribed specialist and "on the job" training. Sunday afternoon will be utilized for organized athletics.

d. Intelligence personnel will receive training as prescribed by reference (b).

e. Communications Personnel will be trained as directed by the Battalion Communications Officer.

f. The training of the Naval Gunfire Liaison Team will be conducted by the Battalion Naval Gunfire Liaison Officer in accordance with schedule published by separate order.

g. Officer and Staff NCO Schools will be conducted as listed in enclosure (2).

3. TRAINING AIDS

a. Training Manuals listed as references in the training schedules are available on request from the S-3 office.

b. All films and graphic aids which are relevant and obtainable will be provided by the S-3 office as available.

c. Instructors are directed to comply with pertinent parts of FM 21-8 (Military Training Aids) and FM 21-5 (Military Training) in preparing instruction.

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d. It is expected that this battalion will receive ammunition for field firing during the month of January. The date, time of firing and logistical data will be published when plans are coordinated and approved.

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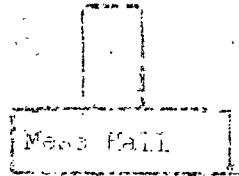

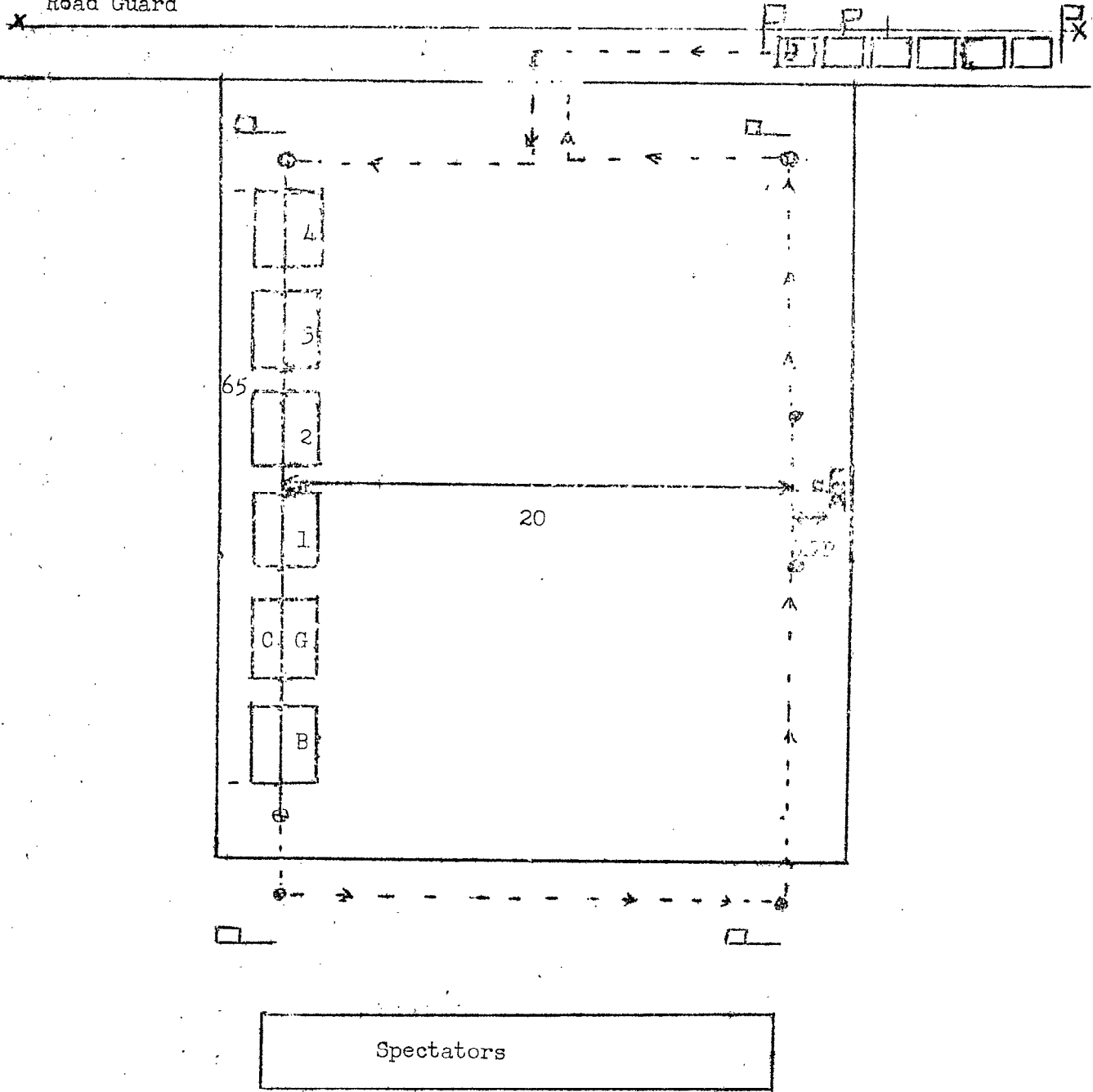

 b. The 7th Marines, in the event the non-repatriates make an unsupervised mass exodus from the DMZ, exercise minimum force necessary to collect and conduct non-repatriates to designated collecting points. Insure protection of UN personnel, facilities, and installations in Regimental Sector.
2. a. The 3d Battalion, 7th Marines collects non-repatriates in zone of responsibility and conducts to collecting points. Insure protection of UN personnel, facilities, and installations in Battalion Sector. Prepares on Order to establish check points and motorized patrols as designated in Annex BAKER (Opn. Overlay).  
 b. For check points, motorized patrol routes and collecting point see Annex BAKER.
3. a. "G" Company  
 (1) Prepare on order to mount motorized patrol number 3 and establish check point number 3.  
 b. "H" Company  
 (1) Prepare on order to mount motorized patrol number 4.  
 c. "I" Company  
 (1) Prepare on order to establish check point number 4.  
 d. Weapons Company  
 (1) Prepare on order to establish check point number 5. Man check point with a machine gun squad of not less than five (5) men with one (1) machine gun. Equip one (1) MG platoon as part of battalion reserve.  
 e. M&S Company  
 (1) Prepare on order to double camp guard to provide maximum security.  
 x. (1) All units establish maximum security to prevent theft of weapons, ammunition, transportation and other supplies and equipment.  
 (2) Each rifle company provide one standby rifle platoon for the purpose of apprehending, controlling and moving large groups of non-repatriates to collecting points. Prepare to return immediately to company when delivery is made.  
 (3) Each check point and motorized patrol, with the exception of check point number 5 will consist of a minimum of one (1) T/O fire team.

(4) Patrols and check points will apprehend all non-repatriates and immediately notify operations bunker by telephone or radio requesting instructions.

(5) Motorized patrols will report by telephone at each end of their patrol routes (see Annex BAKER). Check points will report hourly on the hour.

(6) Exercise minimum force necessary to control non-repatriates. No firing is authorized, except to protect UN personnel and property. Measures short of firing will be used to prevent escape or to recapture escapes.

(7) Non-Toxic chemicals may be used when authorized by the Battalion Commander.

(8) This operations plan effective for planning upon receipt; execution on receipt of code word "RECOVER".

(9) Personnel manning MBP continue to comply with present instructions on apprehending and reporting unauthorized Orientals within the MBP.

4. a. The Battalion Supply Officer will, on order, issue the following to designated standby platoon (s).

- (1) Non-Toxic chemical-irritant grenades.
- (2) Gas Mask.

b. Each Company be prepared on order to issue the below listed ammunition to standby platoon's, motorized patrols and check points. Ammunition already on hand in the Company may be used.

- (1) Each rifleman a basic load (114 rds of 30 Caliber).
- (2) Each automatic rifleman a basic load (740 rds of 30 Caliber).
- (3) Each man armed with a 45 cal. pistol a basic load (28 rds of 45 Caliber).
- (4) Each Machine Gun (3 boxes of 30 Caliber).

c. (1) Two trucks (personnel carriers) will be furnished by Regimental Motor Transport for use by motorized patrols number 3 and 4.

(2) Two trucks (2 1/2 ton 6X6) will be furnished by Regimental Motor Transport and will report to Battalion Motor Transport Officer to be used as required.

5. a. 1st Mar Div Communications SOP-1 and effective indices SCI and COI.

b. Wire.

(1) Battalion wire section will install and maintain wire lines from the battalion switch board to check points "3, #4, "5 and OP"3.

(2) Companies concerned will be responsible for the installation of (1) WE-8 at each of the four points.

c. Radio.

(1) Companies responsible for motorized patrols will be prepared to provide, upon order, (1) PRC-10 and (1) operator for each patrol.

(2) Motorized patrols will maintain continuous watch on the Regimental tactical net.

Instructions for Check Point Number 5

1. Check Point #5 will be manned, on order, by personnel of Weapons Company. It will consist of one (1) Machine Gun squad of not less than five (5) men.
2. Check Point #5 will be located on highway LX midway between road junction highway 23, and entrance to Battalion area.
3. The squad leader will report to the battalion operations bunker by telephone upon effective establishment of the Check Point, and hourly on the hour thereafter.
4. The check point will apprehend any non-repatriates or unauthorized Orientals encountered or observed, reporting immediately by telephone to battalion for instructions. The check point will intercept all vehicles attempting to move on to or leave LX in this area, and search them for Orientals, and to determine the authority for the vehicles presence in the area. If proper authority is not possessed by the driver or senior present in the vehicle, report by telephone for instructions as to disposition. In the event large groups are seen, a request for instructions will be made before apprehension is attempted.
5. Each Check Point member will carry his normal arm. M-1 rifles will be carried unloaded, bolt to rear, bayonets fixed. Pistols will be carried with slide forward, but chamber empty and hammer forward. Magazines will not be inserted. Machine guns will be cleared and ammunition will be in box. Each check point member will carry one (1) basic load of ammunition. The Machine Gun will be supplied with three (3) boxes of 30 Caliber Ammunition.
6. Exercise minimum force necessary to control non-repatriates. No firing is authorized, except to protect UN personnel and property. Measures short of firing will be used to prevent escape or to recapture escapes.

Instructions for Operations Watch

1. Immediately upon receipt of code word "RECOVER" the operations watch will awaken or notify the Operations Watch Officer. If the Operations Watch Officer is not immediately available notify the S-3 or Executive Officer, requesting instructions.
2. After receipt of code word a log will be maintained, listing time of receipt of code word, action taken and reports from check points and motorized patrols.
3. Check Points #3, 4 and 5 are directed to submit reports hourly on the hour after initial check-in. The Operations Watch Officer or S-3 will be notified immediately of the failure of check points or patrols to comply.
4. Motorized Patrols are directed to report by telephone upon reaching each limit of their patrol route. The Operations Watch Officer or S-3 will be notified immediately when patrols fail to report within a reasonable length of time.
5. All radio messages received from Motorized Patrols will be obtained from Radio Operators and recorded in the log after action as outlined in paragraphs 2, 3 and 4 above has been completed.

Instructions for Radio Operators

1. Battalion radio section will have one (1) radio operator available 24hrs daily to man the Regimental Tac Net. Upon order the remote for this net will be moved from the radio station to the Operations bunker. Radio operator assigned to this watch will have effective copies of prearranged numeral code, authentication table, radio call signs, and frequency. Check into Regimental Tac Net and maintain continuous watch as directed by Senior Officer present.
2. Company radio operators assigned to the motorized patrols will have effective copies of prearranged numeral code, authentication table, radio call signs, and frequency necessary for continuous operation on the Regimental Tac Net. Operator will mount (1) PRC-10 in truck provided for the patrol. Operator will check into net upon order.

b. During the month of December 1953, the medical department rendered routine medical and dental treatment to the 3d Battalion. Periodic sanitation inspections were conducted in the Battalion area and all areas were found adequate.

Proven cases are as specified, and the cases which were reported as negative smears for gonorrhea or were not returned from the Regimental laboratory were classified as non-specific urethritis for statistical purposes.
