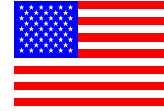

BOY'S BASKETBALL SIGNUP

The signup for boys' basketball will be **open until Friday, November 17th** thru Skyward Family Access. You will need your login and password.

Follow these directions:

- **After logging in to Skyward Family Access, click on Fee Management on the left side of screen**
- **Under your son's name, click on Make a Payment**
- **Under your son's name, click next to Fee Management Payment, then click Update Payment Amount**
- **Click on Display Fee**
- **Check the box Display Unenrolled Activity Fees, and Save**
- **Find, Click on, and Add your son's grade level basketball fee**
- **Proceed to pay fee thru our vendor RevTrack**

NOTE: 4th grade basketball does not have a fee HOWEVER; you still need to add it to your account to get on the basketball roster.

KEEPING YOUR CHILD HEALTHY THIS SCHOOL SEASON

Q: Why should my child get vaccinated against influenza (flu)?

A: Influenza (flu) is a contagious respiratory disease that can lead to serious complications, hospitalization, or even death. Anyone can get the flu, and vaccination is the single best way to protect against influenza. Even healthy children and adults can get very sick from the flu and spread it to family and friends.

Q: Why should my child get vaccinated against influenza every year?

A: There are two reasons for getting a yearly flu vaccine.

- 1) The first reason is that because flu viruses are constantly changing, flu vaccines may be updated from one season to the next to protect against the most recent and most commonly circulating viruses.
- 2) The second reason that annual vaccination is recommended is that a person's immune protection from vaccination declines over time and annual vaccination is needed for optimal protection.

Q: How can I protect my child from Eboli, should it continue to spread across the United States?

A: The one way to protect your child from Eboli is to have your child have a flu shot. The reasoning behind this is that part of the diagnosing of any disease is through the process of elimination. If your child has been vaccinated against influenza, then that will aid your child's physician toward other possibility causes for illness, such as Enterovirus D68 or Eboli.

Please note that at this time there are no cases of Eboli in the State of Wisconsin. Should the situation change, Lake Country School District will work with the State and County to establish procedures and protocols.

Q: What is the Enterovirus D68 and how can I protect my child?

A: Enteroviruses are very common viruses. D68 Enterovirus is only one type. They cause about 10 to 15 million infections in the United States each year. Infants, children, and teenagers are more likely to get infected and become sick. That's because they do not yet have immunity (protection) from previous exposures to the viruses.

Symptoms include: fever, runny nose, sneezing cough, skin rash, mouth blisters, body aches.

Prevention: Good hygiene and hand washing with soap and water or a hand sanitizer. Avoid contact with people who are sick. Cleaning and disinfection frequently touched areas.



ATTENTION DEER HUNTERS!

The eighth grade will be dissecting deer hearts in science class and we need your help. We are asking for heart donations throughout the season. Hearts that are whole and not damaged will be accepted. Please put a gallon size zipper style bag in your pocket when hunting this fall. Place the heart in the bag and freeze it until you or your child can bring it in to school. If possible, please label the bag buck or doe. 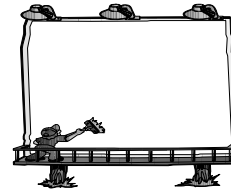

Welcome to Arrowhead High School. This letter contains meeting dates to explain choices in English, Social Studies, and Science for next year's freshmen students. Freshmen options include the following:

- English 9 aligned with Social Studies 9
- Integrated Learning Experience (ILE)
- Advanced Placement (AP) Human Geography connected with English 9 Honors
- Science 9/Biology Honors Block

Students who are highly able or highly motivated should plan on attending these meetings with their parents. However, other interested students and parents are welcome to attend as well. This meeting does not replace freshmen orientation scheduled for January 20 and 21, 2015.

There will be a media presentation with handouts, followed by a question/answer format, so parents and students can learn about the options and make an informed choice for 9th grade.

It should be noted that students who are considering the English 9 Honors connected with AP Human Geography or Science 9/Biology Honors Block will be expected to take an online ACT at Arrowhead High School. We are offering the ACT at Arrowhead on two dates: January 10, 2015 and January 17, 2015. A score of 430 or higher on the ASPIRE reading test is an indicator that students should consider taking the ACT in January. More specific information will be provided at the informational meetings.

The meetings will be held at the Arrowhead High School North Campus Theater on **December 1** and **December 3**. You may choose to attend either meeting, which will begin promptly at **6:30 p.m.** and last for one hour.

Again, please remember that these meetings are not to replace the annual freshmen orientation which will be held the evenings of January 20 and January 21, 2015. If you have any questions, please contact your school representative as follows:

A Leaf of Spinach History
North Americans began growing spinach in the early 19th century. In the 20th century, spinach was popularized by the cartoon character, Popeye, who gained amazing strength whenever he ate a can of spinach.

One cup of fresh spinach provides:

An excellent source of vitamin A and Vitamin K*.

A good source of vitamin C and folate.

A ½ cup of cooked spinach provides:

An excellent source of vitamin A, vitamin K, folate, and magnesium.

A good source of vitamin C, vitamin B6 calcium, iron, potassium, and riboflavin

A Slice of Sweet Potato History

Sweet potatoes are believed to have been domesticated in Central and South America nearly 5,000 years ago. They then spread to Mexico, the Caribbean, the West Indies, and parts of North America. When Christopher Columbus landed on America's shores

in 1492, the Native Americans were growing sweet potatoes. Columbus and his men loved the tasty sweet potatoes so much that they brought them back to Europe to grow their own, where they continued to increase in popularity.

Reasons to Eat Sweet Potatoes

A ½ cup of sweet potatoes is: An excellent source of vitamin A* and vitamin C. A good source of fiber, vitamin B6 (pyridoxine), and potassium.
