

Therefore be it Resolved, That it is the sense of this Council, that the adoption of said amendment to section 2606, is both dangerous and inimical to the public interests of this City, and subversive of the inherent powers and prerogatives legally and properly belonging to the people of this city; that the delegation of these powers prerogatives to a Board of Commissioners is both injudicious and unsafe, because susceptible of unjust and unlimited action both in extent, and the manner in which they may be exercised in the creation of monopolies and injurious discriminations alike destructive to the marine and general commercial interests of the City, and be it further,

Resolved, That as the legal representatives of the people

Said section being known, numbered and designated as Sections 2575 to 2608 inclusive, all relating to the establishing of a Board of Harbor Commissioners for the Bay of San Diego, approved March 18th 1889, relative to the salaries and pay of the officers and employes of the Harbor Commissions of the Bay of San Diego, in which said bill it is provided among other things that section 2607 of the above entitled act is hereby amended to read as follows: Section 2607. The monthly salaries of the officers shall be as follows: Each of the three Commissioners twentyfive dollars. the Secretary, who shall be elected by the Commissioners from their own number, one hundred dollars in addition to his salary as Commissioner; the salaries and compensation of all officers and employes when appointed shall be fixed by the majority of the Board of Harbor Commissioners, and all salaries shall be paid monthly, on warrants drawn by the San Diego Harbor improvement fund. and shall be signed by the President and Secretary of the Board provided that in no event shall the State be liable for the salaries of the members of said Board of Commissioners or of the Secretary thereof, or for the salary or compensation of any officer or employe elected or appointed by said Board, or upon any contract made or entered into by said Board, and it is hereby expressly provided that said Board of Commissioners shall not create any liability or indebtedness against the State in any manner or form whatever, and any liability or indebtedness so created or attempted to be created, shall be absolutely null and void. And whereas, the passage of said bill contemplates that said Harbor Commissioners must of necessity create a fund from which their own and the salaries of a Secretary, Attorney, Engineer Harbor Master, Mappinger, and numerous other employes are to be paid at such rates of compensation as may by them be fixed, and whereas, to create such fund it will be necessary to levy port charges which said Board alone has the power

to fix and determine, and which may be levied, to such an exorbitant extent as to greatly injure our Ocean Commerce and local property connected therewith, therefore, be it resolved, that it is the sense of this Council that in view of the advantages now offered by the very low rates of wharfage, dockage and other port dues charged in this Harbor, which have inured to our benefit in the past and which important advantages may be greatly injured, if not partially destroyed by an excessive increase of such charges to defray the expenses of a possible extravagant Board of Commissioners, Be it further resolved, that acting as the representatives of the people of this City, we are unalterably opposed to the enactment of said bill and do respectfully request our Senator and Assemblyman to use all honorable efforts to defeat the same, And be it also resolved, that it is the sense of this Council that the people of San Diego do not desire a continuance of the Board of Harbor Commissioners preferring as they do, that the Control of our Maritime interests should in the future as in the past be vested in the Common Council subject in its action to the requirements of Commerce as directed and guided by the business interests of this port, and further that copies of these resolutions be forwarded at once to our Senator and Assemblyman, after proper certification by the President of each Board and the City Clerk.

Whereas, the parties of the first part herein after named have leased from the

San Diego Water Company, a Corporation, the entire plant of said Water Company, together with the purchase of three million (3,000,000) gallons of water, and more if required, which said contract bears date the day of April, 1891, and certain conditions, stipulations or agreements upon which it may be terminated.

Now, therefore this agreement is made on the express condition that in case the contract above referred to shall be terminated under any of the conditions, stipulations and agreements, in said contract contained, then and in that case this contract shall at once cease and determine and the parties hereto shall each be released by the other from all liability or damage hereunder by reason of the termination of this contract.

And, further, that subject to the foregoing agreement, this Indenture is made and entered into this day of April, 1891, by and between, Bryant Howard, J. M. Collins, A. E. Norton Charles S. Hamilton and M. A. Gilmore, parties of the first part, of the City of San Diego, and the City of San Diego, a Municipal Corporation party of the second part, and witnesseth:

That the parties of the first part hereby agree to, and do lease and sub-let to the party of the second part for and during the period of twenty (20) years from and after the first day of June 1891, all and every portion of the Water Plant now owned by the San Diego Water Company, including all pipes, pipelines, hydrants, wells, pumps and pumping machinery, and the real estate upon which said well and machinery are situated, and the buildings thereon, standpipes, reservoirs, meters and everything now connected with the supplying of water to the City of San Diego under the present system of the said San Diego Water Company, with the right to use said pipes and all things above-mentioned for the purpose of distributing

water to the party of the second part and its citizens: and also convey and sell to the party of the second part three million (3,000,000) gallons of water from what is now known as the San Diego flume for each and every twenty-four (24) hours during the said period of twenty (20) years: said water to be delivered to the said party of the second part at the present point of diversion of water from the San Diego Alum Company's pipe to the pipe of the said San Diego Water Company, and if any person over which the parties of the first part have no control the said supply of water cannot be had from the said Alum Company's system, then they agree to furnish the said amount of water from the San Diego ^{River} by the pumps hereinbefore mentioned, the possession of which pumps they shall be entitled to during any period of time it may be necessary to pump said water, but should the parties of the first part fail for more than sixty (60) days to furnish said flume water, the party of the second part shall have the option to terminate this lease.

The party of the second part agrees to pay the parties of the first part, or their assigns, monthly during said period of time, the sum of nine thousand one hundred sixty six dollars and sixty six cents (\$9166⁶⁶) as rental for said plant, and for the right to use three millions (3,000,000) gallons of water per day of twenty-four (24) hours, whether said three million gallons of water is used or not. all of said water shall be used within the present limits of the City of San Diego, or if used outside of said City of San Diego, the parties of the first part shall be entitled to receive therefor whatever rate shall be fixed by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego therefor in addition to the amount which they are entitled to in this contract.

The parties of the first part further agree to furnish to the party of the second part all the water that it may desire to use in said City of San Diego over said three million (3,000,000) gallons per day, at the rate of (5) cents

per one thousand (1000) gallons, to be paid for monthly.

It is further agreed that should any extension of the pipelines or plant hereby sub-let to the party of the second part be necessary during the term of this lease the party of the second part shall have the option to put in such extensions, the same to be of the kind and quality now being put in and used by the said San Diego Water Company, or the said party of the second part may require such extensions to be made by the parties of the first part, and in such case the parties of the first part shall be allowed for the amount actually invested in such extensions the sum of six (6) per centum per annum as interest payable at the time of paying the monthly amounts called for by this lease and in case said parties of the first part shall fail or refuse to make such extensions when required so to do by the parties of the second part then the said second party may cause such necessary extensions to be made and deduct the cost thereof from the subsequent rentals falling due.

The parties of the first part agree to keep in good repair and look after and care for the system and plant hereby sub-let, free of all expenses to the party of the second part, in case of failure to make such repairs on demand the said party of the second part shall have the right to make such repairs as shall be necessary and deduct the cost of such repairs, and any loss occasioned by failure to repair, from any subsequent installments of rent. But if the party of the second part order larger or different pipes to be laid in place of pipe already laid, or any change or addition in the system or plant hereby sub-let, any increase of expenses incurred thereby will be considered as new construction: provided, that whenever it shall be necessary to enlarge the pipe connecting the Alume

Company's pipe with the head of Fifth Street, in order to carry the three millions (3,000,000) gallons of water per day, the same shall be enlarged, by and at the expense of the parties of the first part, or if the party of the second part should prefer new pipe laid in any direction to accommodate the overflow instead of the above change, then an amount in valuation in new pipe shall be laid by the parties of the first part equal to the amount required to make the above change.

The party of the second part agrees to permit the said San Diego Alumed Company to use said system of pipes for carrying and conducting water to parties outside the city limits of the City of San Diego, the compensation to the party of the second part for the use of said system being fixed by said second party and the San Diego Alumed Company; it being understood, however, that such use shall not in any way interfere with the City service.

It is also agreed that the party of the second part shall pay to the parties of the first part for the deterioration of the extensions of the pipelines on any part of the system three (3) per centum per annum, on the cost of such extensions. Said party of the second part to have the option of purchasing such extensions and the entire plant at any time during the term of this lease, at the actual first cost thereof less the amount paid for deterioration.

Should the party of the second part at any time require an excess of three million (3,000,000) gallons of water daily, it shall pay for such excess at the rate of five (5) cents per one thousand (1,000) gallons, and the parties of the first part agree to furnish any excess over said three million (3,000,000) gallons that may be required by said second party.

And it is expressly understood and agreed that the party of the second part has the option

to terminate this lease in case any of the Conditions, stipulations or agreements above mentioned shall not be complied with, by giving notice of such option to the parties of the first part of one (1) month, and upon returning to the parties of the first part in as good condition as when this lease is executed ordinary wear and tear and damages by the elements excepted, of the property above described: or in case of a failure to return any part or piece thereof, to pay said parties of the first part the value of all property not returned as aforesaid, and from the time of such notice and surrender the parties of the first part shall be restored to all of their rights and privileges they now have: and in the case of the termination of this contract the first parties shall be released from all liability for damages or otherwise by reason of such termination or failure of conditions, terms, or agreements.

In witness whereof, the parties of the first part have hereunto set their hands, and the party of the second part has caused its name to be subscribed and its corporate seal affixed, hereto the day and year in this agreement first above written.

Whereas the people of the State of California, represented in the Senate and Assembly, did, by an Act of the Legislature approved March 15th 1883, enact a law entitled "An Act to authorize the Common Council, Board of Trustees, or other governing body of any incorporated City or town, other than cities of the first class, to refund its indebtedness, to issue bonds therefor, and provide for the payment of the same" and

Whereas the City of San Diego is an incorporated City other than a city of the first class, duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the provisions of Section 8 of Article XI of the Constitution of the State of California, and

Whereas the City of San Diego did in conformity with an ordinance duly passed by the Board of Trustees of the City of San Diego on the 14th day of March, 1887, and under authority conferred upon said Board by the provisions of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, entitled

"An Act to provide for work upon the streets, alleys, courts, plazas and sidewalks, and for the construction of sewers within municipalities," approved March 11th, 1885, duly and legally issued its bonds for the construction of a sewer system for said City, in the amount of seven hundred thousand dollars bearing interest at the rate of five per cent per annum; and

Whereas, the City of San Diego, by its Board of Trustees, under the authority conferred upon said Board by the provisions of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, entitled "An Act authorizing the incurring of indebtedness by cities, towns, or municipal corporations incorporated under the laws of this State," duly and legally issued its Municipal School Bonds in the amount of seventy six thousand dollars, bearing interest at the rate of five per cent per annum; and

Whereas, the Common Council of the City of San Diego, at a meeting thereof duly and legally called and held, and by and upon a vote of four-fifths of all the members thereof, do now deem it for the public interest to refund and fund a portion of the bonded indebtedness of said City in the amount of three hundred and eighty thousand dollars. Now, therefore:

Be it Resolved by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the said City of San Diego now has an outstanding bonded indebtedness in the amount of three hundred and forty four thousand dollars; that all of the said bonded indebtedness was and still is evidenced by the bonds of said City of San Diego outstanding and unpaid, all of which bonds were duly and legally issued by said City.

Section 2. That the Common Council of said City of San Diego deem it for the public interest to refund and fund a portion of said bonded indebtedness in the amount of three hundred and eighty thousand dollars; and to issue

bonds of the said City of San Diego therefor, each bond to be issued in the sum of five hundred dollars, and to run for the period of twenty years from the date thereof unless paid before the expiration of that period; that said bonds shall draw interest at the rate of four and one half per cent per annum, payable annually; that the bonds and interest coupons shall be in the form prescribed by an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, entitled "An Act to authorize the Common Council, Board of Trustees, or other governing body of any incorporated City or town, other than cities of the first class, to refund indebtedness, to issue bonds therefor, and provide for the payment of the same" approved March 15th 1883. (Statutes of California, 1883, page 370.) that the blanks therein shall be filled in conformity with this resolution; that said bonds shall be signed by the Mayor of the City of San Diego and attested by the City Clerk, and sealed with the seal of said City, and shall be numbered consecutively beginning with number one (1); that the coupons shall each be for the interest accruing annually upon the bond to which it is attached, and three attached to each bond shall be numbered consecutively from number one (1) to number twenty (20), and shall contain the number of the bond to which it is attached; the bonds shall be dated on the 1st day of January, 1883; and the coupons shall be payable on the 1st day of January, in the years of their respective maturities.

Section 3. That the Clerk of the Common Council of the City of San Diego shall cause to be prepared and printed eight hundred bonds, with coupons attached, in the form in this resolution prescribed; that the same be signed by the Mayor of the City of San Diego, and attested by the City Clerk, and that thereupon said bonds shall be delivered to the Treasurer of the City of San Diego and his receipt taken therefor.

Section 4. That the City Treasurer, upon the receipt of said bonds, shall advertise for sealed proposals for the sale or exchange of said bonds. The advertisement shall be published in the San Diego Union and Daily Review, daily edition, a newspaper printed and published and in general circulation in the City of San Diego, and in the San Diegoan-Evening, a daily newspaper printed and published in the City of San Diego, for the period of four weeks. The advertisement shall state the time when the sealed proposals will be opened at the office of said City Treasurer, and that no proposals will be accepted either for the purchase or exchange of said bonds for a less sum than the face value of said bonds and the accrued interest thereon, and that the right is reserved to reject any and all proposals and bids.

Section 5. That any proposals for such purchase or exchange of bonds which may be accepted by said City Treasurer, shall be accepted subject to the approval of the Common Council of the City of San Diego, and that all of the money that may be received upon or for the sale of said bonds shall be applied to the payment of the bonds mentioned in Section 1 of this resolution, aforesaid, until the same shall be satisfied and paid.

To the Honorable the Members of the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States, in congress assembled:

GENTLEMEN—The citizens of Southern California, in a representative meeting assembled, would respectfully ask your attention to the following facts in the matter of the deep-water harbor for Southern California, as recommended in the recent report of the board of government engineers:

First

That this is not a matter of mere local importance, but owing to the contour of the continent, and the lines of easy grades and low mountain passes, the proposed deep-water harbor at San Pedro, like that of Galveston, of which it is the natural and necessary complement, is of national importance.

Second

That the line between this harbor and the proposed deep-water harbor at Galveston is the shortest and most available for transcontinental commerce of all the possible routes within American territory.

Third

That two transcontinental lines of railroad now reach the sea at this point, besides a number of local roads, and are forced for lack of a deep-water harbor to handle their freight through unsheltered roadsteads, exposed to all the dangers of the open sea.

Fourth

That with the completion of the Nicaragua canal, the traffic of these railroads and the new roads centering at this point will be vastly increased, as this must then, by the law of shorter lines and lighter grades, become the supply port of the southwest interior, and of the great inland plateau embracing that vast territory which lies between the Rocky mountains and the Sierras.

Fifth

That while the Atlantic seaboard of the United States is even lavishly supplied by nature with good harbors, the Pacific coast is singularly destitute of them, and the people of this coast must appeal to the general government to help them in securing an outlet to the sea.

Sixth

That the mountain chains and the natural passes of the Pacific coast have fixed three great transcontinental outlets to the sea westward: One at the mouth of the Columbia at Puget sound; one at the bay of San Francisco; one through Southern California. At the first two named outlets nature has furnished good harbors; for Southern California only open roadsteads. It is to correct this defect that we ask the aid of the general government.

Seventh

That the population now seeking the sea at this point is only a small fraction of the numbers which must within a few years hence seek commercial outlet. The territory immediately tributary to this point has a capacity of supporting and making wealthy a population numbering into the millions. This territory is rapidly filling with people, and already their sea traffic is checked and strangled for lack of adequate harbor facilities.

twenty-five

The facts with regard to the proposed deep-water harbor are placed before you in the report of the board of government engineers. We would only add that this is the fifth survey made officially by officers of the government during a period of some years, and that all have concurred in the same judgment as to the location and importance of the work.

The government has already expended some \$80,000 upon the inner harbor, but even before its completion, the needs of commerce have far outgrown its capacity.

In consideration of the foregoing facts we earnestly pray that you will order the appropriation of such sum of money as in the judgment of the department may be necessary to at once begin and vigorously push the work upon the outer or deep-sea harbor at San Pedro, that we may equally with our brethren upon the Atlantic coast have opportunity to share in the great possibilities of development of this our common land.



Whereas it is the opinion and desire of a large majority of the people of this City, that the Council should, as soon as possible take decisive steps toward securing the ownership of an ample ^{water} supply, and provide for its distribution for domestic use and irrigating purposes, and

Whereas most of the members of the Council, having their own business to attend to, and not being paid for their services rendered the City, can not devote sufficient time to fully investigate the different sources of water supply, and prepare and submit plans and specifications for water works, it appears necessary to place the whole matter in the hands of a few impartial, trusty and competent persons, who shall make it a business and devote all the time necessary for such investigation and work to be done and report upon the same to the Council, now therefore

Be it Resolved by the Common Council of the City of San Diego as follows:

Section 1. That C. C. Brandt and Geo. W. Havice be and are hereby appointed a Special Committee who together with the City Engineer or an Assistant Engineer of his Department

shall investigate and examine into the source and ownership of Water supply available for the use of the City. Examine into the propositions for Jurisdiction, a Water supply and water rights, that have been submitted by its owners to the Council, and others that may hereafter be submitted; make estimates of cost of Water Systems that may be available, and make plans and specifications for such as they may deem advisable to recommend to the Council as suitable for the City. Examine into the quantity & quality of water that can be obtained at various sites, dams, reservoirs, flumes and pipe lines, ditches, distributing pipes with necessary appliances, and other kinds of Water works and means necessary to carry out the purposes of obtaining and distributing water for the use of the City and its inhabitants, and irrigating purposes along the line of water works or systems.

Section 2. The Committee shall receive no salary for services rendered, but shall be allowed for expenses \$3.⁰⁰ per day while in the City & \$5.⁰⁰ per day while out of the City for each day actually engaged. The Engineer shall be allowed actual expenses for transportation in addition to his salary.

Section 3. The City Engineer is hereby authorized and empowered to continue as assessor and Engineer the services of T. W. Shary, who has nearly finished the Survey of the City Lands, if he finds that he can not alone attend to the duties required of him under this Resolution, in addition to the other regular duties of his office; and also make use of two chainmen now employed in his Department, when actual survey has to be made; provided however that when work by any assistant or help is done, which is not continuous for a full month, twenty six

days of actual service or work, shall be deemed a month. pay for any part of it shall be ~~for~~ no pay in addition to the salary now allowed an Assistant and Chairman, shall be allowed except as otherwise especially provided for in this Resolution, and their services & the services of this committee may be dispensed with at the pleasure of the Council.

Section 4. The committee and the Engineer shall report progress to the Council at least once a month.
